WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. – The Wake Forest football team opened the 2021 season with a convincing 42-10 victory over Old Dominion on Friday night at Truist Field.

The Demon Deacons (1-0) put up six touchdowns en route to a 42-10 victory over the Monarchs (0-1), pushing their home winning streak to four games.

Quarterback Sam Hartman tossed three touchdowns and threw for 184 yards for the Deacs. Christian Beal-Smith led Wake Forest on the ground with 74 yards rushing and two touchdowns. Meanwhile, Jaquarii Roberson pulled in six receptions and one touchdown and A.T. Perry tallied 81 yards with four catches and a touchdown to lead Wake Forest in the air.

Defensive back Ja'Sir Taylor had a career night as he caught his fifth-career interception and returned his first ever kickoff 99 yards to the endzone. He is the first FBS player to return a kickoff for a touchdown this season.

Traveon Redd also picked off a pass in the second quarter. Jasheen Davis led the Demon Deacons up front as he tallied nine tackles. The true freshman registered his first collegiate sack and added 2.5 tackles for a loss in his first career start.

The Demon Deacons staunch defense held the Monarchs to just three completed passes for 10 yards in the first half as the Deacs held a commanding 28-3 lead heading into the locker room. Wake Forest brought the Winston-Salem community together on Friday night as Winston-Salem

State's Red Sea of Sound performed at halftime with the Spirit of the Old Gold & Black. Additionally, Friday marked President Susan R. Wente's first football game of her tenure. Along with being the Opening the Gate honoree, Dr. Wente was given the game ball by Coach Dave Clawson after the team sung the alma mater with the marching band.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. – The Wake Forest football team picked up its second victory of the 2021 season, defeating Norfolk State 41-16 Saturday afternoon at Truist Field.

The Demon Deacons (2-0) relied on a balanced offensive attack to control the non-conference matchup with the Spartans (0-2), notching 252 yards through the air and 161 yards on the ground.

For the second-straight game, Wake Forest's special teams made an impact as Rondell Bothroyd blocked and recovered a punt in the third quarter. The redshirt sophomore end also registered a sack, his first since the 2019 season.

Nine Wake Forest receivers caught a pass, led by Jaquarii Roberson with four catches for 97 yards and a touchdown. Donald Stewart also snagged four catches, tallying a career-high 61 yards.

Sam Hartman finished the game 17-of-25 with 244 yards and a passing touchdown after opening the game a perfect seven-of-seven, the best start of his career.

On the ground, the Deacs found the end zone a total of four times, highlighted by Christain Turner's first multi-touchdown game of his career. Christian Beal-Smith and Hartman also added rushing touchdowns.

Redshirt junior wide receiver Jaquarii Roberson caught a touchdown for the sixth-straight game with a 64-yard touchdown catch from Sam Hartman in the opening drive of the second half. The streak is second-longest in school history, matching Wake Forest great Desmond Clark (1998)

and the longest since Sage Surratt, who tallied a TD catch in eight-straight contests between 2018-19. Over his last six games, Roberson has a total of nine touchdown receptions, tied for the highest total in a six-game stretch in the Dave Clawson era along with Surratt.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. -- The Wake Forest football team opened up the ACC slate in style, defeating the Florida State Seminoles, 35-14, Saturday at Truist Field.

The Demon Deacons (3-0, 1-0 ACC) outgained Florida State (0-3, 0-1 ACC) by an overall tally of 484 to 318 yards, including 225 on the ground compared to the Seminoles' 92 yards. Additionally, Wake Forest had double the amount of first downs FSU had.

The Wake Forest defense was stifling throughout the entire game, forcing six turnovers (three interceptions and three forced fumbles), the most in the Dave Clawson era.

The Deacons jumped out to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter on scores by AT Perry (49-yard pass from Sam Hartman) and Christian Beal-Smith (seven-yard run). Following Florida State's first score, the Deacs responded with a 12 play, 75-yard drive that was capped off by a 12-yard touchdown pass from Hartman to Donald Stewart and gave Wake Forest a 21-7 lead.

Wake Forest has now started its season 3-0 for the sixth-time this century (2019, 2017, 2016, 2008, 2006) and the fourth time in the Dave Clawson era. Finally, Saturday's win marks the Demon Deacons second-straight win over Florida State, with their last coming in 2019. This is the first time Wake Forest has defeated the Seminoles in back-to-back contests since it won three-straight from 2006-08.

Nick Sciba could not only be on his way to becoming the best kicker in program history, but potentially the best kicker in the history of the ACC and NCAA. Sciba connected on two first half field goals from 42 yards and 22 yards, which marked his 15th and 16th-straight successful try, the longest-active streak in the NCAA.

In his career, Sciba owns a .897 field goal percentage (61-of-68), which ranks second in NCAA history, first in ACC history (min. 50 att.) and is a Wake Forest program record. Sciba now needs just 13 points to break the Wake Forest record for career points currently held by Sam Swank with 337 career points.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. -- Led by an outstanding and efficient offensive performance and a strong pass rush, the Wake Forest football team captured its first road victory of the season on Friday night as it defeated Virginia in Charlottesville, 37-17.

The Demon Deacons (4-0, 2-0 ACC) offense proved again to be one of the most potent in the country as they scored on their first seven possessions of the game before Wake Forest registered its first punt of the game with 8:30 left in the fourth quarter and a 20-point lead.

Kicker Nick Sciba had a night to remember against the Cavaliers (2-2, 0-2 ACC) as the junior from Clover, S.C. marked his place in the Wake Forest and NCAA record books. Sciba, who has converted on an FBS best 19-straight field goal attempts, now holds the NCAA record for field goal percentage with a career mark of 64-of-71 (90.1 percent).

Additionally, he now holds the program record in points with 338, passing Wake Forest Sports Hall of Famer Sam Swank with his third field goal of the game in the fourth quarter. Defensively, the Demon Deacons registered a Dave Clawson-era best six sacks on Friday night. That mark is the second-best total for a single game in program history. Individually, Wake Forest was led by captain Luke Masterson as he totaled nine tackles, three tackles-for-loss and two sacks.

Finally, for the fourth time in as many games, the Demon Deacons grabbed the lead early and claimed a sizable advantage at halftime. Wake Forest has combined to outscore its opponents this season in the opening half, 99-29.

Meanwhile, Wake Forest's offense has tallied a school-record 155 combined points in the first four games of the season.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. -- The Wake Forest football team earned its fourth-consecutive home victory on Saturday afternoon as the Demon Deacons took down Louisville at Truist Field, 37-34.

A field goal by the most accurate kicker in NCAA history, Nick Sciba, in the final minute of the game pushed the Deacons (5-0, 3-0 ACC) past the Cardinals (3-2, 1-1 ACC).

Offensively, Wake Forest logged 324 yards in the air and 177 yards on the ground. Quarterback Sam Hartman threw for a season-high 324 yards and two touchdowns. Meanwhile, kicker Nick Sciba continued to shatter records as he tallied 13 points with three field goals and four extra points on Saturday to move into 13th place on the ACC all-time scoring list.

After scoring 37 points on Saturday, Wake Forest has now tallied 192 combined points this season which is the most in school history through the first five games.

Saturday marked the ninth meeting between both programs and the Deacons snapped the Cardinals two-game winning streak. Also from an offensive standpoint, Wake Forest has scored 30-plus points in four out of their last five wins against Louisville.

Defensively, Wake Forest forced a pair of fumbles, tallied two sacks and only allowed the Cardinals to convert four of their 12 third downs.

Wake Forest moved to 5-0 to open the season for the third time this century (2019, 2006) and have won their first three Atlantic Coast Conference games for just the second time in program history (2011 season).

The Demon Deacons (6-0, 4-0 ACC) were led by a three-touchdown performance from redshirt sophomore wide receiver A.T. Perry. He scored on all three catches he had in the game and finished the day with a career-best 137 yards.

The final reception lifted the Deacs past the Orange (3-3, 0-2 ACC) as he grabbed a 22-yard pass from quarterback Sam Hartman in the left side of the end zone in overtime. It was his seventh touchdown of the season, the most of any Wake Forest player and it ranks among the top three in the conference.

WEST POINT, N.Y. -- The Wake Forest football team captured its third road victory of the season on Saturday afternoon, 70-56, behind a career passing performance from redshirt sophomore quarterback Sam Hartman.

It marked the third-highest scoring game in Demon Deacons (7-0, 4-0 ACC) history and is the highest in a road performance.

Hartman had a career day through the air against the Black Knights (4-3) finishing with a career-high 458 yards on 23-of-29 passing. It is the sixth-most passing yards in Wake Forest history and ranks second in the Dave Clawson era, trailing just John Wolford's 461-yard performance against Louisville in 2017.

Additionally, his five passing touchdowns ties the program record and is a career high for Hartman. Riley Skinner (2009), John Wolford (2017) and Jamie Newman (2019) are the only other Demon Deacon quarterbacks to find the endzone five times through the air.

On defense, redshirt senior defensive back Traveon Redd intercepted a third quarter pass, returning it 83 yards for a touchdown to put the Demon Deacons up by two scores. It marked the longest interception return since 2007 and is the seventh longest interception return in program history.

From that point, the Deacs led the rest of the way, scoring on the remainder of their offensive possession until the final one when Wake Forest took a knee to end the game.

Additionally this marks just the second time in program history that Wake Forest did not attempt a punt. The only other came in the Deacs' 66-14 victory over Campbell on Oct. 2, 2020. In total, the Demon Deacons 63 points on offense came in just 17:17 minutes, the Deacs lowest time of possession this season.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. -- In front of a sellout crowd (31,613) and the largest number of students to ever attend a football game (4,233) at Truist Field, No. 13 Wake Forest defeated Duke on Saturday afternoon, 45-7.

In a complete team performance on Saturday, Wake Forest (8-0, 5-0 ACC) totaled 677 yards of total offense on Saturday and limited the Blue Devils (3-5, 0-4 ACC) to just 315 yards of offense. Additionally, the Demon Deacons won the turnover battle and possessed the ball on Saturday for 36:05.

Individually, quarterback Sam Hartman finished the contest 24-of-37 for 402 yards and three touchdowns. Additionally, Hartman added a pair of touchdowns on the ground, setting a new career high. The Charlotte, N.C. native is the first quarterback in Wake Forest history to have four consecutive 300-plus yard passing games and the second quarterback in program history to post back-to-back 400-plus yard passing games.

Hartman, who now ranks fifth in career passing yards and third in career touchdown passes in program history, completed passes to 11 different athletes on Saturday. Wideout A.T. Perry went over 100-yards receiving for the third-straight game and is now just one game away from the program record.

Defensively, Wake Forest tallied seven tackles for loss, two sacks, two forced fumbles and had one fumble recovery in a dominant performance. Nick Andersen led the Deacons with six tackles and five defenders had five stops each, respectively.

Wake Forest is 8-0 for the first time in program history. Additionally, the Demon Deacons are off to their first 5-0 start in conference play for the first time in program history.

In the 109th meeting between the teams, Wake Forest (8-1, 5-0 ACC) was led by Sam Hartman as the redshirt sophomore quarterback went 25-of-51 for 398 yards and five passing and two rushing touchdowns, respectively.

The seven total touchdowns Hartman was responsible for on Saturday set a program record and also broke the North Carolina (5-4, 3-3 ACC) opponent record of six touchdowns. The previous opponent record was held by the likes of Doug Flutie (Boston College), Deshaun Watson (Clemson), Tajh Boyd (Clemson) and Lamar Jackson (Louisville).

Hartman has now thrown 60 career touchdowns, which ties Riley Skinner for the most touchdown passes in Wake Forest history.

The wide receiver duo of A.T. Perry and Jaquarii Roberson each tallied over 100 yards and reeled in a pair of touchdown passes, while Taylor Morin grabbed a 37-yard score just before halftime.

Wake Forest will look to bounce back next week in its final home game of the 2021 regular season against N.C. State on Saturday, Nov. 13. Tickets are available at GoDeacs.com/Tickets.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. -- In front of the 11th-largest crowd in program lore (34,503) and the highest student attendance in Wake Forest history (4,584), the No. 12 Demon Deacons earned a hard-fought victory on Saturday night over No. 16 NC State inside Truist Field, 45-42.

Wake Forest is an astounding 15-2 at home since the start of the 2019 season and the Deacs have now won a program record nine-straight contests dating back to last season. Wake Forest's perfect 6-0 mark in 2021 is the program's first undefeated home record since 1979 and it is just the third time that this feat has been accomplished since its 1970 ACC Championship team.

The Wake Forest (9-1, 5-0 ACC) offense was fueled by a three-touchdown effort from Justice Ellison, while Sam Hartman set the new program record for career (63) and single-season (30) passing touchdowns. Meanwhile on Senior Day, tight end Brandon Chapman caught his first-career touchdown in the third quarter.

Defensively, Wake Forest collected a trio of turnovers as Nick Andersen and J.J. Roberts each recorded an interception while Traveon Redd collected a 47-yard fumble recovery that led to a five-yard rushing touchdown from Hartman.

Wake Forest has now had 14 different student-athletes record a turnover this season.

While Saturday marked the 115th meeting between both programs, it was just the second when each institution was ranked. Saturday's win over the No. 16 NC State Wolfpack marked Wake Forest's first win over a ranked opponent since Oct. 24, 2020 when the Deacs downed No. 19 Virginia Tech.

The last time Wake Forest defeated a team ranked higher than No. 16 was in 2018, when Dave Clawson's Demon Deacons downed No. 14 NC State on Nov. 8, 2018.

CLEMSON, S.C. -- Wake Forest suffered its second loss of the season to Clemson Saturday at Memorial Stadium, 48-27. The No. 10 Demon Deacons fell to 9-2 overall and 6-1 in the ACC with the loss, while the Tigers improved to 8-3 overall and finished ACC play at 6-2.

The Demon Deacons set a new season scoring record with 474 points through 11 games.

Wake Forest was led offensively by WR A.T. Perry with 113 receiving yards on five catches. The Lake Worth, Fla. native crossed the 1,000-yard mark for the season becoming just the eighth player in school history to accomplish that feat.

Defensively, the Deacons forced a pair of turnovers of forced fumbles by linebacker Chase Jones and defensive end Rondell Bothroyd, respectively. Wake Forest has now had 15 different student-athletes force a turnover this season with a forced fumble and fumble recovery. Additionally, Wake Forest has now recovered 13 fumbles this season, which would tie the Demon Deacons for second among all FBS schools.

Wake Forest remains atop the Atlantic Division entering its regular season finale at Boston College next week.

With Nick Sciba's third quarter field goal, Wake Forest broke its all-time scoring record for a single season (2017: 459). The Demon Deacons are now up to 474 combined points this season.

Wake Forest is currently averaging 43.1 points per game, which would be another school-record setting season. Coach Dave Clawson and Warren Ruggiero averaged 36.0 ppg. in 2020, 35.3 ppg. in 2017, 32.8 ppg. in 2018 and 31.8 ppg. in 2019.

Wake Forest and Clemson are the only schools in the Atlantic Coast Conference to average over 30 ppg. over the past four years. The Demon Deacons are well on pace to achieve this mark again.

CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. -- Coach Dave Clawson, his staff and Wake Forest's student-athletes earned a tough road win in the Demon Deacons regular season finale against Boston College on Saturday, 41-10. The victory clinched the program's second Atlantic Division title and first since 2006.

Turnovers, stifling defense and excellent offensive execution led No. 18 Wake Forest (10-2, 7-1 ACC) to its fourth road win, seventh Atlantic Coast Conference victory and 10th overall victory this season. Boston College (6-6, 2-6 ACC) was limited to just 19 passing yards, converted just 1-of-10 third downs and the Demon Deacon defense forced three turnovers on Saturday.

Wake Forest earned its trip to Charlotte on Dec. 4 offensively by quarterback Sam Hartman throwing three touchdown passes and rushing for another. Additionally, wide receiver A.T. Perry broke the school record for touchdown receptions in season with 13 as he hauled in a pair on Saturday.

Finally, Wake Forest's historic offensive season continued on Saturday as the Demon Deacons crossed the 500-point mark for the season. The Demon Deacons are now just the third ACC member institution to achieve that mark in a single season and just the second in the College Football Playoff Era.

CHARLOTTE, N.C. -- Wake Forest's 2021 season will be remembered following a 10-win regular season and an Atlantic Division Championship. The Demon Deacons' (10-3, 7-1 ACC) bid to bring home the ACC Championship fell short on Saturday, Dec. 4 as Pitt (11-2, 7-1 ACC) defeated Wake Forest, 45-21.

It was an exciting week for the Wake Forest program since claiming its second division crown at Boston College last Saturday, as All-ACC left tackle Zach Tom was announced as the league's 2021 Jim Tatum Award recipient and head coach Dave Clawson earned the league's Coach of the Year honor. Additionally, a program record 15 players were named to the league's All-ACC team.

Despite the loss on Saturday in the ACC Championship to Pitt, Wake Forest's 10-3 record this season marks the second time in program history that it has won double-digit games. With that, Coach Clawson is the only active Power 5 head coach in the country to win double-digit games in a single season at four different Division I institutions.

The Deacs earned their 10 victories against a difficult schedule that featured nine bowl-eligible programs. Wake Forest was the first school in the ACC to become bowl eligible with a perfect mark of 6-0 and the Deacs 8-0 start to the season was the best in school history in addition to having the longest winning streak in school history.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. -- The 2021 Wake Forest football team capped off its historic season on New Year's Eve, defeating Big Ten foe Rutgers in the 77th annual TaxSlayer Gator Bowl 38-10 inside TIAA Bank Field on Friday.

No. 17 Wake Forest (11-3, 7-1 ACC) became just the second team in program history to win double-digit games and tied the program record with 11 victories while also setting a program record with seven conference victories and finished the home season with a perfect 6-0 mark.

Head Coach Dave Clawson became the first coach in program history to win four bowl games as all four titles have come during the Deacs current six-game bowl appearance streak. This run ranks as the second-longest in the ACC, trailing just Clemson.

The Deacs forced Rutgers (5-8, 2-7 Big Ten) to turn the ball over twice as Zion Keith and Gavin Holmes snared their first interceptions of the season. The Deacs limited the Scarlet Knights to just 271 total yards in the game, including 106 yards rushing.

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Sam Hartman ended his historic single-season campaign with Gator Bowl MVP honors. The Charlotte, N.C. native tossed three touchdown passes in the game and threw for 304 yards.

Fellow redshirt sophomore A.T. Perry collected 10 of Hartman's passes for 127 yards and pulled in his 15th touchdown reception of the season, tied for the fifth most in conference history.

Seniors Traveon Redd and Luke Masterson led Wake Forest's defense with seven tackles apiece in their final game in the Old Gold & Black.
