What To Look For

- Washington's 3-0 start is the best since 2005 when the Dawgs started 5-0.
- The Huskies are averaging 95.0 points per game, which is second in the Pac-12.
- The Huskies are not ranked, but did receive a vote in the AP Poll this week for the first time this year.
- Kelsey Plum was named the No. 10 player in the country in the ESPNW preseason rankings.
- Plum was also named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top 30.
- The Huskies were picked sixth by both the coaches and the media in the Pac-12 preseason polls.
- Plum was chosen as preseason All-Pac-12 by the media.
- Chantel Osahor became the fourth player in program history with a 20-rebound game vs. Seattle U.
- It's early, but the Pac-12 is 31-5 to start the season.
- Chantel Osahor (17), Katie Collier (16) and Brianna Ruiz (15) scored career highs against Fresno State.
- Talia Walton's 33 pts in the opener were a career high, while her eight 3's were second-most in UW history.
- Plum became the 12th player in program history to score 1,500 points vs. Seattle U. (She now has 1,541).
- Hannah Johnson and Deja Strother made their Husky debuts against Santa Clara.
- Dating back to last year, the Dawgs have won 13 of their last 15 home games.

Previous Matchups With Fresno State

Washington is 2-1 all-time against San Diego State with all three matchups coming in the last five years. The Aztecs won in San Diego in 2011, before the Dawgs won on a Talia Walton buzzer beater at Alaska Airlines Arena in 2012. Last season, the two teams met in San Diego with UW winning, 69-48.

Entering the Year

Washington enters the 2015-16 season coming off four-straight 20-win seasons and a return trip to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2007. Head coach Mike Neighbors has built the program into a nationally relevant squad and the Dawgs will look to carry the positive momentum to even greater heights this season. Much of the excitement revolves around All-America candidate Kelsey Plum who is coming off a Wooden Top-15 nomination last season and a summer playing with the best the United States had to offer at the Pan-American Games. She will be joined by returning starters Talia Walton and Brianna Ruiz, along with key reserve Chantel Osahor. Walton is coming off her best season at Washington and will be asked to take on an even bigger role in 2015-16. The Huskies will play a difficult non-conference schedule that includes neutral-site matchups with Syracuse and Texas Tech at the South Point Shootout in Las Vegas, a road game at South Dakota and a home game against Oklahoma. That combined with the always difficult Pac-12 conference should set up the Huskies with plenty of competition for the results needed to get back to the NCAA Tournament.

Scouting San Diego State

San Diego State has started the season 0-3 with losses to Long Beach State, UC Riverside and UC Davis. The Aztecs are coming off a season when they went 12-19, including 8-10 in the Mountain West Conference. This year, they are led by McKynzie Fort who is scoring 14.0 points per game and Geena Gomez who is averaging 13.0. The main reason for the struggles of San Diego State so far this season is the Aztecs are shooting just 35.5 percent as a team.

Plum's Preseason Honors

Kelsey Plum in an All-America candidate and piled up some honors preseason. She was named the No. 10 player in the country on the list compiled by ESPNW. Plum was also named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top 30 and the preseason All-Pac-12 Team.

Dawgs Come Back To Beat Fresno State

The Huskies trailed by as many as seven points in the second half, but rallied to beat Fresno State, 89-79. Kelsey Plum led the way with 32 points and six assists, scoring 21 in the second half to lead the Dawgs back. Chantel Osahor (17), Katie Collier (16) and Brianna Ruiz (15) also had career highs.

UW Claims City Rivalry

UW claimed the city rivalry game, beating Seattle U., 96-55. Kelsey Plum led all scorers with 26 points and added six assists, but it was Chantel Osahor who posted the most impressive numbers. Osahor had 12 points, 20 boards, four assists and three steals. She became the fourth UW player with a 20-rebound game.

Dawgs Rout SCU In Opener

Washington blew out Santa Clara 100-55 in the opener behind a career-best 33 points from Talia Walton. The senior made 8-9 from behind the 3-point line, while adding nine rebounds, six steals and four assists. As a team the Dawgs shot over 50 percent from the field and Kelsey Plum added 25 points and eight assists.

2014-15 In Review

Washington returned to the NCAA Tournament last year off the strength of a 11-1 non-conference record and fifth-place finish in the Pac-12. Washington picked up some signature wins along the way, defeating Florida State at the Cancun Challenge, then upsetting No. 5 Texas A&M and No. 7 Oregon State at Alaska Airlines Arena. Overall, Washington now has three-straight wins over top-10 teams at home, having also upset No. 3 Stanford in 2014. For the season, the Huskies finished 23-10, falling to Miami (Fla.) in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Washington was selected as a top-20 team during the midseason look by the NCAA and earned a No. 6 seed in the Big Dance. The Dawgs finished 11-7 in conference and beat Utah in the first round of the Pac-12 Tournament. The Huskies also led the conference in scoring at 75.0 ppg and led the nation in free-throw shooting at 78.0 percent.

Kelsey Plum

The Huskies return one of the top players in the country in junior guard Kelsey Plum. The native of Poway, Calif., was a Wooden Top-15 nominee and WBCA All-Regional selection last season. Her 746 points and 22.6 ppg scoring average both led the Pac-12 and were Washington records. Plum also set Husky records with 45 points against Oklahoma and with 207 made free throws. She returns to UW with 1,458 points career points after becoming the seventh-fastest to 1,000 in NCAA history. A veteran of the U-19 World Championship Gold Medal winning Team USA in 2013, Plum won silver for Team USA at the Pan-American Games this past summer.

Other Returning Starters

Washington returns two other starters in senior Talia Walton and redshirt sophomore Brianna Ruiz. Walto also surpassed 1,000 career points last year, while becoming the Huskies all-time leader in blocked shots with 149. She earned All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention after averaging 13.0 ppg on a career-best 46 percent shooting. Ruiz started 28 games as a redshirt freshman, connecting on 34 3-pointers and will play an even larger role in 2015-16.

Other Returners

The Huskies return perhaps the best bench player in the conference last season in junior Chantel Osahor. Likely to be elevated to a starter this year, Osahor was a key weapon off the bench last year, averaging 5.1 points and 6.4 rebounds in just 21.1 minutes per game. The multi-talented post also had an assist/turnover ratio of 53/26, which was among the best in the nation for a frontcourt player. Also returning in the post and looking for a bigger role this year is redshirt junior Katie Collier. The Huskies best shot blocker is now two seasons removed from her ACL injury and ready for her best season at UW. In the backcourt, the Dawgs return a pair of sophomores in Khalia Lark and Kelli Kingma, along with senior Alexis Atchley. Lark came on towards the end of last season with her slashing and scoring ability from the wing, while Kingma is probably the Huskies' best ball-handler outside of Plum. Atchley is a former walk-on that earned a scholarship and will be one of the team captains this season. Other returners are post Mathilde Gilling and guard Mackenzie Wieburg, both capable of helping the Huskies this season as well.

Incoming All-American

The Huskies have just one freshman this year, but she is a McDonald's All-American in 6-5 post player Deja Strother. Strother will make an immediate impact along the Washington frontline with her rebounding, defense and post scoring. In her senior season at Inglemoor HS in Bothell, Wash., Strother averaged 17.2 points, 11.6 rebounds and 1.9 blocks. She was rated as high as No. 35 in the country by Prospects Nation and is now the third McDonald's All-American on the Washington team, joining Katie Collier and Kelsey Plum.

Graduated Greats

Washington lost two of the program's all-time great players to graduation in guard Jazmine Davis and forward Aminah Williams. Davis left as the Huskies all-time leading scorer, while Williams is the all-time leading rebounder. Both players will be missed, but the Huskies believe they have the depth to overcome the losses of two greats that helped rebuild the program from a Pac-12 afterthought to a NCAA Tournament team. The duo won 84 games at Washington, never less than 20 in a season. Davis scored 2,277 points in her Husky career, leaving as the all-time leading scorer, but also sixth in Pac-12 history. She also holds the Husky record for free throws, 3-pointers, field goals attempted, 3-pointers attempted and free throws attempted. Davis is also the only four-time All-Pac-12 Player in Washington history. Williams was probably the best rebounder in the country for her size, measuring at 6-0, but averaging 10.8 rpg as a sophomore, 10.4 as a junior and 9.3 as a senior. Her 1,142 total rebounds are a UW record, but she also holds the school record for games played at 132.

2014-15 Pac-12 Honors

Jazmine Davis and Kelsey Plum earned All-Pac-12 honors with Davis becoming the first four-time recipient in Washington history. Talia Walton was also named Honorable Mention All-Pac-12, while Aminah Williams was Honorable Mention All-Defensive Team.

2014-15 Pac-12 All-Academic

Washington had two players honored as Pac-12 All-Academic as Kelsey Plum and Aminah Williams were named honorable mention. Williams was nominated for the Pac-12 Scholar Athlete of the Year after graduating with a double major in Medical Anthropology/Global Health and Sociology.

Pac-12 Tourney In Seattle

Seattle will once again be an epicenter of women's basketball as the Dawgs have a great home schedule this season, while the Pac-12 Tournament will be played at KeyArena for a fourth-straight year. The Pac-12 Tournament is set to begin on March 3 and will continue until the final on March 6. Washington hopes 2015 will be the year they can make a deep run in the tournament in front of their home fans.

HEAD COACH MIKE NEIGHBORS - @coachneighbors

Mike Neighbors enters his third season as the head coach at Washington and fifth with the Huskies overall. He was promoted to head coach on April 21, 2013. He had previously worked as the top assistant coach for two seasons with the Huskies.

Neighbors has overseen the resurgence of the Husky program, including the Dawgs first trip to the NCAA tournament in eight seasons. Last year, Washington won 23 games, the most since 1995 and defeated five teams ranked in the top-25 at some point during the season. Those wins included beating No. 5 Texas A&M, No. 7 Oregon State and Florida State who finished with a No. 7 ranking and made the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament.

Neighbors record now includes wins over 10 ranked teams in two seasons, while owning a career Pac-12 winning percentage of .583 (21-15), which ranks third among active conference coaches behind only Tara Vanderveer and Lindsay Gottlieb.

In 2015, the Dawgs also earned their first national ranking since 2003 when they earned a spot in the top-25 of the Coaches Poll. The Huskies were named midseason as one of the top-20 teams in the country in the NCAA Tournament Early Look. The Dawgs would go onto earn a No. 6 seed in the NCAA's, traveling to Iowa City where they were upset by No. 11 Miami in an exciting up-tempo game that went down to the final possessions.

In his first year at the helm of the Husky program, Neighbors led the Dawgs to a third-straight 20-win season and trip to the quarterfinals of the WNIT. Washington finished 20-14, including 10-8 in the Pac-12. The Dawgs defeated five teams that were ranked at some point during the season, including an upset of then-No. 3 Stanford at Alaska Airlines Arena in front of a nationally televised audience. The win ended the 58-game road conference winning streak of the Cardinal.

Neighbors has overseen the development of several individuals, including Jazmine Davis who was named All-Pac-12 First Team all four seasons, becoming the first player in Washington history to achieve that distinction. Under Neighbors' tutelage, Davis would also become the Dawgs all-time leading scorer, while breaking nearly every school offensive record in the process. Neighbors also has continued to develop two other players that would break major school records with Aminah Williams and Talia Walton taking down the school's all-time rebounding and blocked shots records.

In addition to the continued development of the veteran players, Neighbors two seasons have overseen the best start to a career of any Husky player ever. As a freshman, Kelsey Plum set the single-season scoring record at UW with 712 points, while also earning Pac-12 Freshman of the Year and Freshman All-America honors from several news outlets. This past season, Plum surpassed her scoring record with 746 points, while leading the Pac-12 in scoring at 22.8 points per game. She was named to nearly every watch list, including being named a finalist for the Wooden Award, being named WNCA All-Region and once again to the All-Pac-12 First Team.

Previously as an assistant, Neighbors worked with the team's guards, including Davis who through two seasons has scored more points than any Husky in school history. He was regarded as one of the country's best defensive and player-development specialists.

In 2013, Neighbors helped the Huskies to a second-straight 20-win season and a return trip to the WNIT. Washington finished 21-12, including 11-7 in the Pac-12, good for a fifth-place finish.

In his first year at UW, Neighbors assisted the Husky women to a 20-14 season and trip to the quarterfinals of the WNIT. It was the first 20-win season for UW since 2002-03. Neighbors also saw the development of guard Jazmine Davis, who was named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year after averaging 15.7 points for the season.

Neighbors' accomplishments in women's basketball speak for themselves. He's helped sign nine McDonald's All-Americans, including incoming freshman Deja Strother who joins Katie Collier and Plum as McDonald's All-Americans on the Huskies roster. He has seen eight of his players drafted in the WNBA, including three who have won WNBA Championships. Everywhere Neighbors has coached, he's overseen the development of either the No. 1 or No. 2 all-time leading scorer in program history, most recently with Davis at UW. Neighbors is a regular speaker at coaching conventions and clinics around the nation, and his weekly newsletter is popular with coaches at all levels.

Neighbors came to Seattle after four seasons at Xavier, where he worked with former Huskies coach Kevin McGuff. During Neighbors' tenure in Cincinnati, he helped mold a Musketeers program that established itself as one of the best in the nation. Neighbors was named one of basketballscout.com's "Rising Stars" in 2009, an award that recognizes assistant coaches who are some of the best in the business.

While at Xavier, Neighbors was a part of a coaching staff that produced some of the best seasons in school history. During the 2009-10 season, the Musketeers posted a 30-4 record, including a flawless 14-0 season in Atlantic-10 Conference play. Xavier ended the season ranked No. 5 in the polls. In addition, Xavier advanced to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament.

In his final year at Xavier, Neighbors helped lead the program to a 29-3 record and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament's Second Round. During his tenure at Xavier, Neighbors was part of a staff that compiled a 61-5 non-conference record (108-22 overall), captured three A-10 Tournaments, three A-10 Regular Season Champs, and competed in four straight NCAA Tournaments.

Neighbors is also considered an excellent recruiter, and helped the Musketeers ink the No. 18 rated class of 2010 according to ESPN Hoopgurlz.

As the coach responsible for developing post players, Neighbors was instrumental in the growth of Amber Harris and Ta'Shia Phillips, two of the best players in Musketeer history. Harris, a 6-5 forward, was a two-time State Farm All-America selection and was drafted fourth overall by the WNBA's Minnesota Lynx. Meanwhile, Phillips was noted as one of the premier defensive players in the nation. The 6-6 center was the leading rebounder in XU history, in addition to her numerous national accolades.

Neighbors came to XU from the University of Arkansas, where he was an assistant coach for a season, his second stint in Fayetteville. Prior to returning to his alma mater, Neighbors was an assistant coach at the University of Colorado and the University of Tulsa, both under Kathy McConnell-Miller. In Boulder, Neighbors helped develop the school's all-time leading scorer in Brittany Spears, a 2011 WNBA draft selection. At Tulsa, Neighbors was an assistant on the up-and-coming Hurricane's program that enjoyed back-to-back postseason appearances.

A native of Greenwood, Ark., Neighbors received his bachelor's degree from the University of Arkansas in 1993. Following his graduation, Neighbors was a director of basketball operations for the women's basketball program, serving under legendary coach Gary Blair, who won the NCAA Championship in 2011 with Texas A&M. Before moving into the collegiate ranks, Neighbors was a highly successful head coach in the Arkansas girls' high school ranks. His most notable achievement was taking a 1-24 Bentonville team to the State Championships two years later.

Neighbors has two children, one daughter Abby (18) and a son Alec (12). He lives in Seattle.
