

## Washington Post-Game Notes

### Husky Stadium

#### Washington Notes

- The captains for today's game were: **Deontae Cooper, Jeff Lindquist, Darrell Daniels** and **Darren Gardenhire**.
- **Myles Gaskin** became the first UW true freshman to reach 1,000 yards rushing, doing so in the second quarter. He now has 1,121 yards for the season and passed **Chris Polk**, who rushed for 1,113 yards as a redshirt-freshman in 2009, as the only other "freshman" to surpass 1,000 yards on the ground.
- The Huskies have won three-straight Apple Cup games. It is the 10th time in UW history they have won three-straight in the series, while the Cougars have never done it.
- With his second quarter touchdown, **Myles Gaskin** tied **Rich Alexis** (2000) for the freshman record with 9 rushing TDs and early in the fourth quarter he passed him with No. 10 on the season.
- The Huskies are bowl eligible for a sixth-straight season. It is the third longest streak in team history.
- The five fumbles recovered by the Huskies tied the record for most in school history, done nine other times, last time done in 1999 vs. Oregon State.
- The Huskies had previously returned two interceptions for TD's in a game six other times, last done in 2002 at Oregon State.
- **Myles Gaskin** surpassed 100 yards on the ground for the seventh time this season. It is the seventh time in UW history a running back has went over 100-yards seven or more times in a season. The record is 10 times in a year by **Greg Lewis** (1990) and **Chris Polk** (2011).
- **Gaskin** carried the ball a career-high 32 times. He finished with 138 yards, his third highest total this season.
- **Sidney Jones'** pick-six was the first of the season by the Huskies. The last one was by Travis Feeney at Colorado in 2014. It was the 4th longest interception return by a Husky in the Apple Cup and tied for 15th longest all-time. The ones longer in Apple Cup history were: **Al Burleson** (1975), 93 yds; **George Wilson** (1925), 90 yds; **Tommie Smith** (1991), 86 yds.
- The Huskies held Washington State to a season-low 3 first half points. Portland State and Arizona State each held the Cougars to 10 first half points earlier this season. The Huskies held WSU scoreless in last year's Apple Cup and lead 14-0.
- **Chico McClatcher** recorded his third rushing touchdown of the year. The freshman wide receiver also has one receiving TD on the year.
- **Jaydon Mickens** further cemented his place as the No. 2 receiver in UW history with five catches and now has 195 receptions in his career. He also ends the regular season with 2,092 career receiving yards, which ranks fifth all-time in UW history.
- **Joshua Perkins** moved up the single-season and career lists for receptions and yards by a tight end. He passed **Dave Williams** for career receptions and into sixth all-time and has 63 for his career.
- The Huskies have 15 interceptions on the season. The 15th, by linebacker Azeem Victor, was the first by a non-Husky defensive back.
- Today's crowd of 70,438 was a season high and the largest home crowd since the 2013 Apple Cup when 71,753 fans showed up. It is the 4th largest crowd since Husky Stadium was renovated.
