Huskies Say Aloha For First Time Since 2008

THIS WEEK: After opening the season with a long flight east, the Huskies are now taking to the skies for another long flight, this time to the west, touching down in Honolulu, one of college volleyball's hotbeds. Sixth-ranked Washington (5-0) will be taking part in the Outrigger Resorts Challenge, hosted by the University of Hawaii at the Stan Sheriff Center, annually filled with some of the biggest crowds in the NCAA. The Dawgs will take on Utah Valley on Friday, Sept. 9, then face Northern Illinois on Saturday, before facing 14th-ranked Hawaii on Sunday.

While several of the Huskies were in Hawaii just this past spring for a beach volleyball tournament, this is the first trip to the islands for the Husky indoor volleyball program since 2008. Since then, Hawaii has been sent to Seattle three different times in the NCAA tournament, in 2010, 2012, and 2014, all with UW coming out on top. The last trip to Honolulu was a five-set win, 16-14 in the fifth set, for the Rainbow Wahine. In 2005, the Huskies had back-to-back 3-0 wins over then-No. 6 Hawaii in the year UW won the national title.

UW's first opponent, Utah Valley, lost its first four matches but has since won three in a row. The Wolverines have been a very good blocking team, averaing 2.98 per set, but their opponents have averaged 14.33 kills compared to 11.54 for UVU. Madison Dennison has been the standout blocker with 1.46 per set and her 59 kills share the team lead. It will be a battle of the Huskies on Saturday, as the Huskies of Northern Illinois come in with a 5-1 record, their one loss against lowa, and wins over DePaul, Loyola Chicago, Bradley, and North and South Dakota States. NIU is hitting .251 as a team and holding opponents to .149. Mary Grace Kelly averages a team-high 3.38 kills per set. Senior Jenna Radtke was named Mid-American Conference West Division Offensive Player of the Week this week after averaging 3.50 kills and hitting .444 in three wins last week.

Hawaii was an Elite Eight team last season, dethroning 2014 NCAA Champion Penn State in the round of 16. The Rainbow Wahine have played a very challenging preseason schedule, losing to Wisconsin and Kansas State in the opening weekend but beating Arizona in five sets. Last week, Hawaii had wins over Missouri State and Pacific but fell to No. 8 UCLA in straight sets to sit at 3-3. Second Team All-American opposite hitter Nikki Taylor, the Big West Player of the Year, did not play in the first week but was back in action last weekend. Legendary Hawaii Head Coach Dave Shoji is in his 42nd season and is second in NCAA history with over 1,100 victories and won national titles at Hawaii in 1979, 1982, 1983, and 1987.

KEEGAN COOK



Keegan Cook's first season as Head Coach of Husky Volleyball continued the tremendous success UW had enjoyed in his previous two years as assistant coach ... the first time Head Coach guided Washington to a 31-3 record, a Pac-12 Champion-

ship, and a trip to the Elite Eight in 2015, and he was named AVCA Pacific North Region Coach of the Year in the summer of 2016, was head coach of the USA Collegiate National Team on a tour of China ... since Cook joined UW as an assistant in 2013, UW has won 30+ matches each year, won two Pac-12 titles, and gone to the Final Four, Elite Eight, and Sweet 16 ... Cook officially took the reins as the Head Coach of Husky Volleyball in January of 2015, following two seasons as an assistant that produced two of the best years in Washington history ... in a whirlwind first year on staff as an assistant coach, Cook helped the Huskies advance to the 2013 Final Four indoors and then was named Head Coach of the new Beach Volleyball program which played its inaugural matches in April of 2014 ... Cook's second season saw the Huskies roll to a 25-0 record to start the season, the longest win streak in program history. The Huskies went 31-3 and made the NCAA round of 16 ... working with the Husky offense, specifically the setters and middles, Cook helped produce big improvements, going from .251 the year before Cook's arrival to .274 and 14th in the NCAA in 2013, to .311 and a fourth-place national ranking in 2014, then to No. 2 in the nation at .305 in 2015 ... got his start in collegiate coaching at St. Mary's, going from a volunteer assistant up to the top assistant coach ... over Cook's final five years at St. Mary's, the Gaels advanced to the NCAA Championships three times, including a trip to the second round in his last season in 2012 ... helped lead the Gaels to their first West Coast Conference title in program history in 2009 and another NCAA second round appearance ... Cook's teams have consistently been among the best serving teams in the nation. Washington led the Pac-12 in aces per set in 2013 and 2014 and ranked second in 2015, and the Gaels led the West Coast Conference at the service line every year from 2009-12.




