2017-18 HUSKY BASKETBALL

UW (10-3) vs. USC (9-4)

UW opens conference play with three-straight Pac-12 road games on Friday as it heads to USC on Friday, Dec. 29 at the Galen Center. The game will be televised on the Pac-12 Networks with Ted Robinson and Matt Muehlebach on the call. Additionally fans can tune into KOMO 1000AM and 97.7 FM to hear the official UW radio broadcast from Tony Castricone and Jason Hamilton. This is the first season for UW to open conference play on the road since 2014-15.

THE COACH

Head Coach Mike Hopkins is in his first year at Washington, and first as a head coach becoming the 19th head coach in UW history. After spending 22 years as an assistant at Syracuse, Hopkins oversaw teams that reached the NCAA Tournament 16 times including the 2003 National Championship, four Final Fours, five Elite Eights and 10 Sweet 16s along with four NIT berths. Syracuse never dipped below a 55.0 percent record while Hopkins was on staff.

QUICK HITTERS

- Washington posted back-to-back games with 10+ steals and blocks for the first time since ... in 2015-16, UW had two games with 10 or more in both categories ... the last time UW had back-to-back games with 10 or more blocks was EWU/Grambling in 2014-15
- Washington is the only team in the NCAA to record 16 steals and 15 blocks in the same game this season after doing so against BCU ... since the 2011-12 season only one other school has recorded those numbers in a single game ... Syracuse (12/28/2011 - 17 steals, 15 blocks - v. Seton Hall)
- UW held Montana to just 63 points, marking the second-straight game holding its opponent to 65 or less points
- Washington's 10 wins in non-conference play tie the third most since 2005-06 ... UW had 11 wins in 2014-15, 10 in 2006-07 and 10 in 2005-06
- The Huskies tied their single-game blocks record with 15 against Bethune-Cookman ... it previously happened vs. Yale (11/13/16) and vs. Colorado (1/20/16)
- Washington is one of two schools nationally averaging at least 6.0 blocks and 9.1 steals per game joining Penn State (6.5b/9.4s)
- UW's 62.7 percent shooting from the field against BCU is its best in the last 15 years and is close to the single-game record (min. 60 attempts) of .676 (48-71) vs. Chico State, 12/1/92
- Freshman **Jaylen Nowell** has scored six of his 13 total career threes over the last three games
- Junior **Matisse Thybulle** currently has 76 career blocks, which is eight shy of cracking the top five on UW's all-time career list (10th - 84, Patrick Femerling, 1996-98)
- UW will retire Isaiah Thomas' No. 2 jersey in a ceremony at the Feb. 15 game against Utah
- UW is outscoring its opponents on average 44.5 to 37.7 in the second half
- Washington's win over No. 2 Kansas was its first win away from Seattle over a top 2 team in program history
- Junior **Matisse Thybulle** is creating scoring on the direct next possession of 67.4 percent (29 of 43) of his 43 steals this year ... over the last two years he is creating scoring on 57.4 percent (62 of 108) of the next possession and for his career he is at 57.1 percent (84 of 147 steals)
- Via Stats Inc., Thybulle is the only player this season to have season highs of 19 points, 7 steals, 5 blocks, 7 assists, 6 rebounds and 5 made FGs from 3 ... and no other Pac-12 player has done it in Stats Inc. data (since 1996-97).
- Sophomore **Sam Timmins** recorded 11 boards against LMU, one shy of his career high ... he has pulled down eight or more boards four times this season through 13 games ... last season, he only had four games with eight or more in 31 outings
- Junior **Noah Dickerson** recorded his third double double of the season at #2 Kansas with 14 rebounds and 13 points ... he now has nine for his career which have all come over his last 35 games
- UW is shooting 80.3 percent from the FT line in final five minutes of its 13 games and that goes up to 83.7 percent in the final two minutes ... UW has not been that efficient from the FT line during those two spans since at least 2002-03 (stats not kept as well before that)
- Junior **Noah Dickerson** has been more efficient from the field this season as he is second on the team in FG percentage at 61.3 (65-106) ... as a sophomore Dickerson shot 54.7 percent (93-199) and as a freshman he shot 46.7 (146-267)

#'S VS. BETHUNE-COOKMAN

Washington's squad set some outstanding numbers as a team against Bethune-Cookman in its 106-55 win on Dec. 19.

- UW had 6 players in double figures, first time since Jan. 28, 2016 at UCLA with 6 in double figures
- UW's 51 point victory was its biggest since a 54-point win over McNeese State on Nov. 13, 2010
- UW's 106 points tie for the 21st most in UW history
- UW's 15 blocks tie the single-game Husky record
- UW's 15 3-pointers made are the most since 17 against California on Feb. 10, 2011
- BCU had 17 TOs and just six FGs in the second half

DEFENSE DEFENSE DEFENSE

BLOCK PARTY

The Dawgs have brought the block party to Hec Ed this season with 66 of their 78 blocks coming at home ... **additionally 39 have come over the last four games (9.8/g avg. up from 7.4/g)** ... UW recently tied the Washington single-game record for blocks in a game with 15 against Bethune-Cookman.

STEALING THE SHOW

Washington's 121 steals lead the league by 38 and a 2.4/g average. Should UW keep up its 9.3 per game average, it will set the UW record that is currently at 288 from the 2004-05 season. **The Huskies are ranked 15th nationally in steals per game.**

#2 THE RAFTERS

Washington will retire the No. 2 jersey of two-time NBA All-Star, Pac-12 Freshman of the Year and Honorable Mention All-American Isaiah Thomas on Feb. 15, 2018 vs. Utah. Thomas becomes the third Husky in program history to have his number retired joining Bob Houbregs (No. 25) and Brandon Roy (No. 3). Here's a look at some of IT's highlights:

- Eighth all-time in scoring at UW - 1,721 points
- Three of the top 25 single-season scoring #'s and is the only player with three seasons of at least 541 points
- Fourth all-time in assists at UW - 415 assists
- Fifth all-time in career 3-pointers made at UW - 164
- 10th all-time in steals at UW - 122
- 2011 Honorable Mention All-American
- 2009 Pac-12 Freshman of the Year
- Three-time All-Pac-12 Selection
- Two-time Most Outstanding Player at Pac-12 Tournament
- 60th (last) pick in the 2011 NBA Draft
- Owns Celtics record for 245 made 3-pointers
- 2017 NBA Cares Community Assist Award winner
- Third leading scorer in the NBA in 2016-17 with 28.9 pts
- Scored at least 20 points in 71 games, including a stretch of 43-straight which is the longest in Celtics history

SWISS ARMY STYLE

Junior Matisse Thybulle could be called the Swiss Army Knife of the UW basketball squad as he has put together nights with each of the following stats

19 points	(vs. #2 Kansas)
7 steals	(vs. Belmont and Seattle U)
5 blocks	(vs. Omaha)
7 assists	(vs. Virginia Tech, NYC)
6 rebounds	(vs. Omaha)
5 3-FGs Made	(vs. #2 Kansas)

No Washington player in the last 15 years has had season highs with those numbers over a single season.

MR. VERSATILE

Thybulle is also the only player this season to record those margins with 19 points, 7 steals, 5 blocks, 7 assists, 6 rebounds and 5 made from 3-point land. Thybulle is the only such player in Division I this season, and that's true even if you remove the points minimum (the three-point minimum means at least 15 points in any case). Only one player did this all of last season - William Lee of UAB. And no other Pac-12 player has done it in STATS INC data (since 1996-97).

20 x 2

Washington had two 20+ scorers against Loyola Marymount as Jaylen Nowell had 21 and Noah Dickerson scored 20 ... it was the first time since Dec. 11, 2016 that UW had two players score at least 20 (vs. Nevada - Fultz and Crisp)

DICKERSON FROM 3

Junior Noah Dickerson went 2-for-2 from long distance against No. 12 Gonzaga marking career highs and pushing his career total of made 3's to three.

THAT #2 KANSAS WIN THO

The Huskies shocked the collegiate basketball world on Dec. 6, 2017, as they took down No. 2 Kansas, 74-65, at the Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo. Here's a look at some of the notes from that historic win:

- Washington defeated its first top-2 opponent away from Seattle for the first time in UW history ... UW was 0-23 prior to that game
- It was the sixth win over a top 2 opponent in UW history as well - home, away or neutral
- UW's win was the biggest upset so far of the collegiate season according to ESPN's BPI
- Washington had a season high 17 assists
- UW held Kansas to just 5 made from long distance after the Jayhawks entered the game averaging 11.6 per game
- UW's 36 points in the paint were the most given up by Kansas all season
- Kansas' 45.2 percent shooting from the field was its second lowest all season and its 25.0 percent shooting from 3-point land was its lowest of the year

FINAL 5 MINUTES

Freshman Jaylen Nowell is shooting 80.0 percent from the field during the final five minutes of Washington's first 13 games, going 16-of-20. Additionally he is 18-of-21 from the FT line (85.7 percent) during the final five minutes.

NOAH'S DOUBLE DOUBLES

Junior Noah Dickerson has recorded three double-doubles in 13 games this season after recording six over his first 64 games. He's nearly averaging a double-double with 15.4 points and 7.9 rebounds per outing this year.

FOUR IN DOUBLE FIGURES

Washington currently has four players averaging double-digit scoring in freshman Jaylen Nowell and juniors Noah Dickerson, David Crisp and Matisse Thybulle. All but Thybulle have had a 20+scoring effort as well. If you look at their numbers during UW's nine wins compared to all 13 games, you see improvements in almost all of their's PPG, FG% and FT%.

2017-18 WASHINGTON MEN'S BASKETBALL – HUSKY NOTES

STEALS FOR DAYS

Washington is averaging 9.3 steals per game which currently leads the Pac-12 and ranks 15th in the NCAA. The Huskies are on pace to set the UW school record for steals per game, which is currently 8.2 set during the 2004-05 season.

DICKERSON'S CAREER NIGHT

Junior **Noah Dickerson's** solid 28 pts/22 rebounding night against Eastern Washington not only set career highs for the forward but also etched his name in the UW record book. His 22 rebounds were the most by a Husky since Feb. 26, 1972 (Steve Hawes vs. Stanford) and **are currently the most in a Division I game this season.** Additionally no player has recorded 25+ points and 20+ rebounds in a game this season in the NCAA.

THYBULLE'S STREAK

Junior Matisse Thybulle has started every game of his UW career which now spans 78 games. Up next on the list is Todd MacCulluch who started 83 straight from 1993-97.

GETTING TO THE LINE

The Huskies are averaging 26.0 free throw attempts through their first 13 games while only allowing the other team to get there on average 19.2 times.

TIMMINS' IMPROVEMENT

Sophomore **Sam Timmins** has seen an improvement in his efficiency this year as he is averaging 5.5 rebounds and 6.2 points in just 19.0 minutes per game while also shooting 61.3 percent from the field. In comparison to a year ago, Timmins was at 3.8r/3.2p in 14 minutes per outing.

2017-18 UW Men's BASKETBALL – COACH MIKE HOPKINS

COACH MIKE HOPKINS (1ST YEAR)

Mike Hopkins took over the helm of the University of Washington men's basketball program, UW Director of Athletics Jennifer Cohen announced on March 19, 2017. Hopkins comes to Washington from Syracuse University, where he spent 22 seasons alongside Hall of Fame coach Jim Boeheim. In 2015 Syracuse named him head coach designate, set to take over the Orange program after Boeheim's retirement following the 2017-18 season.

"I'm extremely excited to welcome Mike and his family to Seattle," Cohen said. "His resume and reputation within the basketball community made him stand out to us, but ultimately it was his vision for Washington, his passion for teaching and developing student-athletes and his close alignment with the core values of our institution and department that made it more than clear that he was the right fit for us."

Hopkins, 47, had been a member of the Syracuse Orange coaching staff since 1995 and will be the 19th head coach in Washington Basketball history.

"The University of Washington is such a unique place, with a world-class University, an exciting basketball history and unbelievable fan support," Hopkins said. "Together, I believe we can build something very special in Seattle, and I can't wait to get started."

During his time in New York, Syracuse advanced to postseason play in all but one year. He was a part of 16 NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2003 National Championship, four Final Fours, five Elite Eights and 10 Sweet 16s, along with four NIT berths. Additionally, Syracuse never dipped below a .550 record while Hopkins was on staff.

"I can't express enough thanks to Coach Boeheim for so many years of mentorship and guidance," Hopkins said. "The timing is right for me and my family to make this move."

With the Orange, Hopkins spent his time in New York heavily involved in recruiting and overseeing the development of the SU guards before switching to overseeing the posts during the last four years. He played a key role in the recruitment and success of Carmelo Anthony, Rakeem Christmas, Johnny Flynn, Jason Hart, Gerry McNamara, Andy Rautins and many more who all were able to pursue professional basketball careers either in the NBA or overseas. Additionally, six players earned consensus All-American honors while Hopkins was on staff.

The Syracuse alum not only made an impact with the Orange, but he also played a major role in the success of Team USA Basketball. Hopkins has been a court coach for nine various Team USA staffs which have gone on to win six championships.

He first started with the 21-and-under team in 2000 and 2001 helping with player evaluation for the club that went on to win gold. In 2006, he was with the Senior Men's team before rejoining the staff in 2010 where he travelled with the team en route to their World Championship Title in Turkey.
