1	David Crisp (G, 6-0, Jr.)	Is the leading returning scorer from last year averaging 13.8 points in 31 games ... helped lead Brewster Academy to the 2015 National Prep Championship
2	Dan Kingma (G, 5-10, Sr.)	Walk-on turned scholarship player before the 2015-16 season ... twin sister Kelli played for the UW women's basketball team before medically retiring
4	Matisse Thybulle (G, 6-5, Jr.)	Is the only player to return that started every game last season ... has started 81-straight games, every game of his career
5	Jaylen Nowell (G, 6-4.5, Fr.)	One of eight players from the state of Washington ... is an active member of the USA Basketball organization ... earned all-state honors at Garfield
11	Nahziah Carter (F, 6-6, Fr.)	One of two players from New York to come to UW ... was teammates with Hameir Wright during the summer of 2016 ... averaged 19.1 ppg as a senior at Bishop Kearney
12	Jason Crandall (G, 6-0, So.)	Started as a manager, moved to a practice player and became a full time team member under Coach Hopkins.
13	Hameir Wright (F, 6-9, Fr.)	One of two players from New York to come to UW ... was teammates with Nahziah Carter during the summer of 2016 ... NY Gatorade Player of the Year in 2017
14	Michael Carter III (G, 6-4.5, Fr.)	Another player from Seattle ... spent two years at O'Dea as a point guard ... is out 6-8 weeks (as of Nov. 24) due to a fractured left hand
15	Noah Dickerson (F, 6-8, Jr.)	The leading returning rebounder after averaging 8.2 a year ago and started in 27 of 31 games played ... helped Montverde Academy win back-to-back Dick's Sporting Goods National HS Titles
22	Dominic Green (F, 6-6, Jr.)	Is one of four juniors on the squad ... started in the exhibition against Saint Martin's ... set career high's in every category last season
23	Carlos Johnson (G, 6-4, So.)	Sophomore out of Findlay Prep ... over the final six games last season, averaged 9.3 points and 3.8 rebounds
32	Greg Bowman (F, 6-7, Sr.)	Is one of two players to have been on the team longer than three years ... walk-on that joined the team in 2014-15 ... one of eight players from Washington on the roster

## 2017-18 HUSKY BASKETBALL

## UW (12-4, 2-1) vs. CALIFORNIA (7-9, 1-2)

UW returns to the friendly confines of Alaska Airlines Arena as it hosts California on Thursday, Jan. 11 at 8 p.m. The game will be televised on the Pac-12 Networks with Guy Haberman and El-dridge Recasner on the call. Additionally, fans can tune into KOMO 1000AM and 97.7 FM to hear the official UW radio broadcast from Tony Castricone and Jason Hamilton. Cal has won six straight but the last four games in Seattle have been decided by an average of 5.3 points. Three of those have been decided by 3 or less points.

### THE COACH

Head Coach Mike Hopkins is in his first year at Washington, and first as a head coach becoming the 19th head coach in UW history. After spending 22 years as an assistant at Syracuse, Hopkins over-saw teams that reached the NCAA Tournament 16 times including the 2003 National Championship, four Final Fours, five Elite Eights and 10 Sweet 16s along with four NIT berths. Syracuse never dipped below a 55.0 percent record while Hopkins was on staff.

### QUICK HITTERS

- In Pac-12 play, the Huskies are getting 63 percent of their scoring from inside the paint, compared to 43 percent during non-conference action ... Washington has scored at least 50 points in the paint in three of its last six games
- Washington has overcome 10 point deficits three times this season in wins over Belmont, USC and Washington State .. additionally, UW has trailed by at least five in six of its 12 wins
- UW shot 73.9 percent from the field (17-of-23) in the second half of its win at WSU to mark the third time in five games UW has shot over 70 percent from the second half
- Washington had five players score in double figures for the third time in the last five games
- After WSU hit four 3's in the first five minutes on Saturday, the Huskies held the Cougs to just three more from long distance as WSU finished 7-of-27 after entering the game leading the nation at 12.1 made from 3 per game
- Junior **Matisse Thybulle** is the only active player in NCAA Division 1 to have over 150 steals and 75 blocks in their career ... his 156 steals rank tied for 18th amongst the NCAA active career leaders in that category ... additionally he is the only player in Husky history to have 150+ career steals (156) and 75+ career blocks (79)
- Washington has had fewer turnovers than its opponents in 11 of its 16 games and are 9-2 in those outings
- Junior **Noah Dickerson** is one of two Pac-12 players averaging at least 15.1 points and 7.7 rebounds while also shooting at least 60 percent from the field (60.4FG%), joining Arizona's Deandre Ayton (20.4 ppg/11.6 rpg/62.5FG%)
- UW shot 67.3 percent from the field (37-of-55) against USC ... it's highest shooting percentage since at least 2002-03 .. it's the second time UW has shot over 62 percent from the field this season (62.7 percent vs. BCU) and was the second time in a three-game span
- Starting with the Kansas game, sophomore **Sam Timmins** has been 22-of-32 from the field, shooting at a 68.8 percent clip with 10 blocks. **Fourteen of his 22 made FGs (63.6 percent) in that span have come from dunks.**
- UW is the only team in the NCAA to record 16 steals and 15 blocks in the same game this season after doing so against BCU ... since the 2011-12 season only one other school has recorded those numbers in a single game ... Syracuse (12/28/2011 - 17 steals, 15 blocks - v. Seton Hall)
- UW's 10 wins in non-conference play tied for the second most since 2005-06 ... UW had 11 wins in 2014-15, 10 in 2006-07 and 10 in 2005-06
- Freshman **Jaylen Nowell** has scored seven of his 14 total career threes over the last six games
- Since moving into the point guard position, junior **David Crisp** has dished out 55 assists which is up from his 44 over the first 16 games a year ago and 29 over the first 16 games as a freshman ... he is also leading the team in minutes at 35.3 per game
- Junior **Matisse Thybulle** is creating scoring on the direct next possession of 65.4 percent (34 of 52) of his 52 steals this year ... over the last two years he is creating scoring on 57.2 percent (67 of 117) of the next possession and for his career he is at 57.1 percent (89 of 156 steals)
- UW is shooting 79.3 percent from the FT line in final five minutes of its 16 games and that goes up to 81.6 percent in the final two minutes ... UW has not been that efficient from the FT line during those two spans since at least 2002-03 (stats not kept as well before that)

**THE USC WIN IN LA**

Washington put up some outstanding numbers in its 88-81 win at the Galen Center in Los Angeles. Take a look:

- UW got its first win vs. USC on the road since March 1, 2012 (80-58)
- UW's 67.3 percent shooting from the field against USC is its best in the last 15 years ... additionally, UW's 73.1 shooting in the second half is the second time the Huskies have shot 73 percent or better in the second half this season (73.5 vs. BCU, 25-34).
- UW held USC to just 3-of-20 shooting from 3-point range, it's lowest percentage of the year (.150) ... additionally its the lowest 3FG percentage a UW opponent has had since UW held Stanford to 3-of-21 (.143) in Palo Alto on March 9, 2016
- Over half of UW's scoring against USC (52 of 88 - 59.1 percent) came in the paint ... it's the highest percentage of points in the paint this season for UW and the 52 tie the most this season UW has had in a game

**10+STEALS x 10+BLOCKS**

Washington posted back-to-back games with 10+ steals and blocks for the first time since at least the 2002-03 season... in 2015-16, UW had two games during the season with 10 or more in both categories ... the last time UW had back-to-back games with 10 or more blocks was EWU/Grambling in 2014-15.

**TIMMINS' IMPROVEMENT**

Sophomore **Sam Timmins** has seen an improvement in his efficiency this year as he is averaging 5.4 rebounds and 6.0 points in just 19.8 minutes per game while also shooting 64.3 percent from the field. In comparison to a year ago, Timmins was at 3.8r/3.2p in 14 minutes per outing. Additionally, he has pulled down eight or more boards five times this season through 16 games ... last season, he only had four games with eight or more in 31 outings

**TIMMINS LAST SEVEN**

Starting with the Kansas game, Timmins has been 22-of-32 from the field, shooting at a 68.8 percent clip with 10 blocks. **Fourteen of his 22 made FGs (61 percent) in that span have come from dunks.**

**#'s vs. BETHUNE-COOKMAN**

Washington's squad set some outstanding numbers as a team against Bethune-Cookman in its 106-55 win on Dec. 19.

- UW had 6 players in double figures, first time since Jan. 28, 2016 at UCLA with 6 in double figures
- UW's 51 point victory was its biggest since a 54-point win over McNeese State on Nov. 13, 2010
- UW's 106 points tie for the 21st most in UW history
- UW's 15 blocks tie the single-game Husky record
- UW's 15 3-pointers made are the most since 17 against California on Feb. 10, 2011
- BCU had 17 TOs and just six FGs in the second half

**DEFENSE DEFENSE DEFENSE**

**BLOCK PARTY**

The Dawgs have brought the block party to Hec Ed this season with 66 of their 85 blocks coming at home ... **additionally 46 have come over the last seven games** -road or home... UW recently tied the Washington single-game record for blocks in a game with 15 against Bethune-Cookman.

**STEALING THE SHOW**

Washington's 144 steals lead the league by 34 and a 1.7/g average. Should UW keep up its 9.0 per game average, it will set the UW record that is currently at 288 from the 2004-05 season. **The Huskies are ranked 17th nationally in steals per game.**

**#2THERAFTERS**

Washington will retire the No. 2 jersey of two-time NBA All-Star, Pac-12 Freshman of the Year and Honorable Mention All-American Isaiah Thomas on Feb. 15, 2018 vs. Utah. Thomas becomes the third Husky in program history to have his number retired joining Bob Houbregs (No. 25) and Brandon Roy (No. 3). Here's a look at some of IT's highlights:

- Eighth all-time in scoring at UW - 1,721 points
- Three of the top 25 single-season scoring #s and is the only player with three seasons of at least 541 points
- Fourth all-time in assists at UW - 415 assists

**SECOND HALF SUCCESS**

UW has upped it's game in the second half outscoring opponents 42.9 to 38.6. Additionally, UW has shot over 73 percent in the second half three this season (BCU and at USC). Since 2002-03, the Huskies have only shot over 70 percent from the field in the second half (min 20 attempts) eight times.

Thybulle is the only such player in Division I this season, and that's true even if you remove the points minimum (the three-point minimum means at least 15 points in any case). Only one player did this all of last season - William Lee of UAB. And no other Pac-12 player has done it in STATS INC data (since 1996-97).

# 2017-18 WASHINGTON MEN'S BASKETBALL – HUSKY NOTES

## THAT #2 KANSAS WIN THO

The Huskies shocked the collegiate basketball world on Dec. 6, 2017, as they took down No. 2 Kansas, 74-65, at the Sprint Center in Kansas City, Mo. Here's a look at some of the notes from that historic win:

- Washington defeated its first top-2 opponent away from Seattle for the first time in UW history ... UW was 0-23 prior to that game
- It was the sixth win over a top 2 opponent in UW history as well - home, away or neutral
- UW's win was the biggest upset so far of the collegiate season according to ESPN's BPI
- Washington had a season high 17 assists
- UW held Kansas to just 5 made from long distance after the Jayhawks entered the game averaging 11.6 per game
- UW's 36 points in the paint were the most given up by Kansas all season
- Kansas' 45.2 percent shooting from the field was its second lowest all season and its 25.0 percent shooting from 3-point land was its lowest of the year

## FINAL 5 MINUTES

Freshman Jaylen Nowell is shooting 72.0 percent from the field during the final five minutes of Washington's first 16 games, going 18-of-25. Additionally he is 18-of-21 from the FT line (85.7 percent) during the final five minutes.

## NOAH'S DOUBLE DOUBLES

Junior Noah Dickerson has recorded three double-doubles in 16 games this season after recording six over his first 64 games. He's nearly averaging a double-double with 15.1 points and 7.7 rebounds per outing this year.

## FOUR IN DOUBLE FIGURES

Washington currently has four players averaging double-digit scoring in freshman Jaylen Nowell and juniors Noah Dickerson, David Crisp and Matisse Thybulle. All but Thybulle have had a 20+scoring effort as well. If you look at their numbers during UW's 12 wins compared to all 16 games, you see improvements in almost all of their's PPG, FG% and FT%.

## STEALS FOR DAYS

Washington is averaging 9.0 steals per game which currently leads the Pac-12 and ranks 17th in the NCAA. The Huskies are on pace to set the UW school record for steals per game, which is currently 8.2 set during the 2004-05 season.

## DICKERSON'S CAREER NIGHT

Junior **Noah Dickerson's** solid 28 pts/22 rebounding night against Eastern Washington not only set career highs for the forward but also etched his name in the UW record book. His 22 rebounds were the most by a Husky since Feb. 26, 1972 (Steve Hawes vs. Stanford) and **are currently the most in a Division I game this season.** Additionally, just one other player has posted 25 points and 20 rebounds in a game this season nationally (Baylor's Jo Acuil-Lual, Jr. - 30 pts/21 rebs vs. Savannah State, 12/17/17).

## THYBULLE'S STREAK

Junior Matisse Thybulle has started every game of his UW career which now spans 81 games. Up next on the list is Todd MacCulluch who started 83 straight from 1993-97.

## GETTING TO THE LINE

The Huskies are averaging 23.8 free throw attempts through their first 16 games while only allowing the other team to get there on average 19.8 times.

## 2017-18 UW Men's BASKETBALL – COACH MIKE HOPKINS

### COACH MIKE HOPKINS (1ST YEAR)

Mike Hopkins took over the helm of the University of Washington men's basketball program, UW Director of Athletics Jennifer Cohen announced on March 19, 2017. Hopkins comes to Washington from Syracuse University, where he spent 22 seasons alongside Hall of Fame coach Jim Boeheim. In 2015 Syracuse named him head coach designate, set to take over the Orange program after Boeheim's retirement following the 2017-18 season.

"I'm extremely excited to welcome Mike and his family to Seattle," Cohen said. "His resume and reputation within the basketball community made him stand out to us, but ultimately it was his vision for Washington, his passion for teaching and developing student-athletes and his close alignment with the core values of our institution and department that made it more than clear that he was the right fit for us."

Hopkins, 47, had been a member of the Syracuse Orange coaching staff since 1995 and will be the 19th head coach in Washington Basketball history.

"The University of Washington is such a unique place, with a world-class University, an exciting basketball history and unbelievable fan support," Hopkins said. "Together, I believe we can build something very special in Seattle, and I can't wait to get started."

During his time in New York, Syracuse advanced to postseason play in all but one year. He was a part of 16 NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2003 National Championship, four Final Fours, five Elite Eights and 10 Sweet 16s, along with four NIT berths. Additionally, Syracuse never dipped below a .550 record while Hopkins was on staff.

"I can't express enough thanks to Coach Boeheim for so many years of mentorship and guidance," Hopkins said. "The timing is right for me and my family to make this move."

With the Orange, Hopkins spent his time in New York heavily involved in recruiting and overseeing the development of the SU guards before switching to overseeing the posts during the last four years. He played a key role in the recruitment and success of Carmelo Anthony, Rakeem Christmas, Johnny Flynn, Jason Hart, Gerry McNamara, Andy Rautins and many more who all were able to pursue professional basketball careers either in the NBA or overseas. Additionally, six players earned consensus All-American honors while Hopkins was on staff.

The Syracuse alum not only made an impact with the Orange, but he also played a major role in the success of Team USA Basketball. Hopkins has been a court coach for nine various Team USA staffs which have gone on to win six championships.

He first started with the 21-and-under team in 2000 and 2001 helping with player evaluation for the club that went on to win gold. In 2006, he was with the Senior Men's team before rejoining the staff in 2010 where he travelled with the team en route to their World Championship Title in Turkey.
