COUGARS SET TO FACE WASHINGTON IN BOEING APPLE CUP SERIES

Washington State will make the trip to Seattle to face Washington 1 p.m., Friday on FOX.

SERIES HISTORY - 112TH MEETING, 57TH APPLE CUP

Washington leads the all-time series 73-32-6 against Cougars including the last six matchups. WSU's last win in the series came in 2012, a 31-28 overtime win in Pullman. The Huskies own a 41-15-3 record in the series when playing in Seattle including the last five meetings with WSU's last road win in the series coming in 2007.

ABOUT WASHINGTON STATE

Washington State enters the regular season finale with a 6-5 overall record and 3-5 in Pac-12 Conference play after scoring the go-ahead touchdown with two seconds remaining in a 54-53 home win over Oregon State last Saturday. The Air Raid leads the nation in the passing (456.7), fifth in total offense (533.0) and ninth in scoring (41.5). The Cougar defense entered the week tied for fourth in the Pac-12 in takeaways (17). Head coach Mike Leach is in his eighth season at Washington State, owns a 55-45 record with the Cougars and last week saw WSU become bowl eligible for a program-record fifth-straight season.

COLLEGE GAMEDAY RECORD

Dating back to the middle of the 2003 season, ESPN's College GameDay has had the WSU flag appear throughout the show. The streak reached **239** last Saturday after appearing in Columbus, Ohio. The first appearance came in Austin, Texas (10/4/03) and the streak began two weeks later in Madison, Wisc. (10/18/03). Two flags – Ol' Crimson and Gray – have been flown in the background of the GameDay set by dozens of friends and alumni. The Gray flag was added in 2014 after Whitey was retired in honor of Steve Gleason's "No White Flags." Appearance No. 217 was its first in Pullman (10/20/18), a 34-20 win over Oregon.

Cougar football broadcasts begin two hours before kickoff, carry through the game and conclude with post-game interviews with players and coaches.

COUGARS IN THE RANKINGS

Washington State reached No. 19 in the week four Associated Press Top-25 Poll after starting the season ranked No. 23 in the preseason poll, just the second time in the last three seasons appearing in the preseason poll and just the fourth time since 1952. The Cougars finished 2018 ranked No. 10 in both the Associated Press Poll and Coaches Poll, their highest ranking to finish a season since finishing the 2003 season ninth in the AP poll. The No. 10 ranking was the highest by any Pac-12 Conference team, the first time that happened in conference history.

COUGARS FEATURED ON HBO'S 24/7 COLLEGE FOOTBALL

HBO Sports' landmark franchise 24/7 broke new ground this October with an all-access college football series chronicling four programs in-season; Florida, Penn State, Arizona State and Washington State. Narrated by Liev Schreiber, the voice of HBO Sports' Emmy award winning documentaries and HARD KNOCKS franchises, the series documented the head coach, players, assistant coaches and more over one week during the regular season. WSU was featured with an hour-long special highlighting the home game against Colorado.

AIR RAID

The Air Raid has continued to put up big numbers in 2019.

- WSU leads the country in passing (456.7), 5th in total offense (533.0), 9th in scoring (41.5) • WSU has tied the Pac-12 single-season record for team TD passes (47, Washington - 2016) • WSU has 3 players on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List (nation's top receiver); Brandon Arconado, Dezmon Patmon and Easop Winston Jr., the most in the Pac-12 and second nationally only to Alabama's 4 • WSU has seen Max Borghi post 4 100-yard rushing games (New Mexico State, UCLA, Colorado, Stanford) • vs. New Mexico State, 6 passing TD to 5 different WR, 618 yards of total offense, Max Borghi 128 rushing yards • vs. UCLA, 63 points, 720 yards of total offense, 570 passing yards, 9 passing TDs, 150 rushing yards • vs. UCLA, the 2 teams combined to set a Pac-12 single-game record with 130 points, WSU's 720 yards of total offense is 2nd-most in WSU single-game history, Anthony Gordon's 9 TD passes was a WSU/Pac-12 record • vs. Colorado, recorded 497 yards of total offense, 4 different players caught TD, combined to rush for 128 yards • at Oregon, 406 pass yards, 3 passing TD, 6.9 yards-per-play • vs. Stanford, 520 passing yards, 5 TD passes, 8 receivers caught a pass, 624 yards of total offense • vs. Oregon State, 606 passing yards, 6 TD passes, 2 rush TD, 641 yards of total offense • WSU has led the Pac-12 in passing in 6 of Mike Leach's 7 seasons, finishing 2nd to Cal (Jared Goff) in 2013 • WSU has led the nation in passing three times under Mike Leach (2014, 2015, 2018)

MIKE LEACH AMONG NATION'S BEST

Now in his 18th season as a head coach and 8th in Pullman, Mike Leach owns a 139-88 career record including a 55-45 mark at WSU • his 55 wins at WSU are 3rd-most in school history, O.E. Hollingberry (93, 1926-42), Mike Price (83, 1989-2002) • is the 1st Cougar head coach in school history to lead WSU to 4 straight bowl games • is the 1st Cougar head coach in school history to lead WSU earn bowl eligibility 5 straight seasons • is tied with Mike Price for the most bowl appearances with 5 • 2nd Cougar Head Coach to be named National Coach of the Year (2018 AFCA), Mike Price in 1997 • Named a George Munger Coach of the Year semifinalist (2016, 2017, 2018) • 2015 Pac-12 Co-Coach of the Year and 2018 Pac-12 Coach of the Year • WSU has sold out Martin Stadium 18 times since Mike Leach arrived in 2012, twice in 2019 (Colorado, Stanford) • under Leach, WSU has recorded 14 4th-quarter comebacks in his 8 seasons (Oregon State last week)

FRIENDLY CONFINES OF MARTIN STADIUM

Washington State went 7-0 at home in 2017, 6-1 in 2018 and 5-1 mark this season to push it's Martin Stadium record to 18-2 over the past three seasons. WSU saw it's 13-game home winning streak snapped in the 2018 Apple Cup.

COUGARS IN CLOSE GAMES

Since 2012, the Cougars have played a number of close games under head coach Mike Leach and own a 25-18 mark in games decided by one possession including a 11-9 mark in games decided by three points. Since Mike Leach arrived for the 2012 season, WSU has recorded 14 4th-quarter comebacks in his eight seasons, the last coming last week against Oregon State. Last season, the Cougars went 4-1 in games decided by one possession while this season, WSU has gone 2-3.

Not much was known about redshirt-senior quarterback Anthony Gordon outside of the program prior to the 2019 season but he put on a show in his first career start in the opener against New Mexico State. The Pacifica, Calif. native opened the game by completing his first 15 passes and led WSU to points on all nine of the drives he started including the first six that resulted in touchdowns. Gordon finished the night 29-of-35 for 420 yards and five touchdowns, tying Luke Falk (2014 at OSU) for the most touchdown passes in a Cougar starting debut.

Washington def. WASHINGTON STATE, 28-15

PULLMAN, Wash. — Myles Gaskin broke free for an 80-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter, and No. 16 Washington won its second Pac-12 North Division title in three years, beating No. 7 Washington State 28-15 on a snowy Friday night. On a blustery cold night with snow blanketing the turf at Martin Stadium, Gaskin found enough traction to carry the Huskies into the Pac-12 championship game and ruin yet again the title hopes of Washington State. It was Washington's sixth straight win over the Cougars and the third straight year the Huskies denied Washington State the North crown. Gaskin rushed for 170 yards and three touchdowns, a year after running for 192 and four scores against the Cougars. He was the best player on the field on a night Washington needed its senior ball carrier to be just that. The Huskies (9-3, 7-2 Pac-12) will face Utah in the conference title game next Friday in Santa Clara, California. The winner will earn a spot in the Rose Bowl. Washington State (10-2, 7-2) carried the Pac-12's last remaining hope of finding a way into the College Football Playoff, but the Air Raid was mostly grounded by a combo of blowing snow and Washington's sticky secondary. Gardner Minshew was 26 of 35 for 152 yards, but his longest pass to a wide receiver went for 11 yards. James Williams rushed for two touchdowns and the Cougars trailed 20-15 going to the fourth quarter, the first time since 2008 the game had been within five points going to the final quarter. Gaskin made sure that didn't last long. Facing third-and-1 at the Washington 20, Gaskin broke through the line of scrimmage and found no one in crimson there to make the stop. He outraced Marcus Strong, getting to the goal line just in time and putting him over 1,000 yards for the season. Gaskin became the first Pac-12 running back to top 1,000 yards rushing in all four seasons. Gaskin also scored on a pair of 5-yard runs in the first half and finished his career against Washington State with 10 rushing touchdowns. Jake Browning threw for 207 yards, overcoming an interception and fumble to finish his career 4-0 as the Huskies starting QB against their rivals. He made a key third-down conversion early in the third quarter, hitting Hunter Bryant for a 59-yard gain, and on the next play a double-pass had Aaron Fuller hit Bryant for a 22-yard touchdown and a 20-9 lead after the extra point was blocked and returned for a Washington State score. The Cougars' pulled within 20-15 on Williams' 1-yard TD run late in the third quarter but that was as close as Washington State would get. **THE TAKEAWAY** Washington: The Huskies rushed for 258 yards in the snow and have 533 yards rushing in the past two games. Washington State: The Cougars have struggled with Washington's pass defense in recent years and the slick conditions made it even more challenging. No Washington State wide receiver had more than four catches. **WASHINGTON BAND** The Washington band did not perform, a day after one of its three charter buses rolled onto its side while traveling from Seattle. The Washington State band performed the Washington fight song "Bow Down to Washington" during a pregame performance on the field. The section of Martin Stadium where the Washington band would have sat was roped off and left empty. The bus crashed Thursday evening on an icy stretch of Interstate 90 in central Washington. Of the 56 people on board, 47 were taken to hospitals for evaluation or treatment.

LAST MEETING IN SEATTLE

Nov. 25, 2017

No. 15 WASHINGTON def. No. 14 Washington State, 41-14

SEATTLE — Given the chance to ruin their rivals' hopes at a conference championship, Washington did more than simply cost Washington State a chance at the Pac-12 North. The Huskies reasserted that for the fifth straight season the Apple Cup would remain decorated in purple with yet another rout of the Cougars. Myles Gaskin ran for 192 yards and four touchdowns, Washington forced four turnovers, and the No. 15 Huskies ended No. 14 Washington State's hopes for a division title with a 41-14 thumping Saturday night. Washington (10-2, 8-2 Pac-12, No. 17 CFP) suffocating defense made life miserable for Luke Falk in the final regular season game of his career and the performance by Washington's defense was punctuated by Gaskin running wild through the Cougars. Gaskin had 25 carries and averaged nearly 8 yards per touch. He had 114 yards rushing in the first half. The Huskies pummeled Washington State on the line of scrimmage, finishing with 328 yards rushing, the second-highest total this season. Gaskin had three short TD runs and a memorable 26-yard scoring run in the third quarter that will rank among the best of his career. Gaskin shook Sean Harper at the line of scrimmage, sprinted to the sideline and kept his balance enough while being pushed by Hunter Dale to leap for the pylon and finish off the TD. While Washington celebrated in the cold Seattle rain, the Cougars (9-3, 6-3, No. 13 CFP) were left to

accept their flop. Washington State needed only a victory to win its first Pac-12 North title and earn a spot in the conference title game Friday against Southern California. Washington State had memorable Apple Cup wins over the Huskies in 1997 and 2007 in Seattle. This is one the Cougars would like to immediately forget. Falk, the Pac-12 record-holder in a number of passing categories, threw three interceptions and had a costly fumble. He was under pressure all night as Vita Vea and the rest of defensive front was able to get pressure while rushing just three defenders and closed off gaps in the secondary. Falk was 37-of-55 passing for 369 yards and a late TD to Tay Martin, helping continue Leach's streak of never being shut out. But it was a hollow accomplishment in the scope of being overmatched by their rivals. What was a matchup of the top two defenses in the Pac-12 was completely one-sided. Washington dominated. Washington State was bullied. The Cougars were allowing just 130 yards per game rushing and led the Pac-12 in sacks. The Huskies averaged 7.3 yards per carry and quarterback Jake Browning never was sacked until the first play of the fourth quarter. Meanwhile, Falk was constantly under duress. Falk was sacked five times and his mistakes came at critical points when Washington State had opportunities to remain in touch with the Huskies. His fumble may have been the most critical as he was hit by Keishawn Bierria and fumbled at the Cougars 28. Two plays later, Browning plowed in from the 1 to give Washington a 14-0 lead. **FIRST-HALF FINISH** For the fourth straight season, Washington put the Apple Cup away in the first half. Washington led 24-0 at halftime and has outscored the Cougars 90-13 in the first half of the past four meetings since coach Chris Petersen arrived. **INJURIES** Washington dominated despite playing most of the night without leading receiver Dante Pettis and running back Lavon Coleman. Pettis suffered a left leg injury on a punt return in the first quarter and Coleman appeared to hurt his lower left leg later in the quarter. Both players were on the sideline but did not return. Petersen said the medical staff does not believe either has any broken bones. **THE TAKEAWAY** Washington State: The undersized defensive line for the Cougars was overmatched, constantly getting pushed off the ball. It was only the second time this season the Cougars allowed an opponent to rush for more than 165 yards. Arizona had 310 yards rushing. It didn't help that defensive standout Hercules Mata'afa was flagged for targeting on the first drive of the second half and was ejected Washington: Vea, a junior, wasn't announced with Washington's seniors but likely played his last home game for the Huskies. The junior showed why the NFL can't wait to get their hands on his combination of athleticism and power as he overmatched the Cougars' offensive line.

NEW MEXICO STATE AT NO. 23 WASHINGTON STATE

PULLMAN, Wash. — Anthony Gordon completed his first 15 passes, threw for 330 yards and four touchdowns in the first half, and No. 23 Washington State rolled past New Mexico State 58-7 on Saturday night. Gordon made his first college start memorable throwing touchdowns of 41, 48, 19 and 54 yards in the first half as the Cougars (1-0) built a 35-7 lead and coasted to an easy opening victory. Gordon finished 29 of 35 for 420 yards and five TD passes before checking out late in the third quarter. Gordon, who had just five career passes coming into the season, beat out Eastern Washington transfer Gage Gubrud for the starting job with a stellar fall camp and his performance in camp continued into the start of the season. Gordon hit Rodrick Fisher on a 41-yard TD on the opening drive of the game and the passing onslaught was only getting started. Gordon added a 48-yard catch-and-run TD to Dezmon Patmon, hit Easop Winston Jr. on a 19-yard score and capped his big half with a 54-yard touchdown toss to Travell Harris. Gordon hit 22 of 23 passes in the first half. The only incompleteness was a drop by Brandon Arconado midway through the second quarter. Harris added a 20-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter, breaking a couple of tackles and traversing from one side of the field to the other to complete the run after catch. Max Borghi added 128 yards rushing on 10 carries, including a 12-yard touchdown. Borghi became the first Washington State running back to rush for 100 yards since Gerard Wicks against California in 2016. New Mexico State quarterback Josh Adkins scored on a 3-yard touchdown run in the first quarter when he recovered a fumble and took the loose ball into the end zone to tie the game at 7-7. That was the highlight of the night for the Aggies (0-1) who were limited to 317 total yards, a big chunk coming in the fourth quarter. Adkins was 28 of 42 for 221 yards and two interceptions. QB TRIO The night wasn't just about Gordon. Gubrud entered late in the third quarter and threw a 9-yard touchdown to Renard Bell. And, Trey Tinsley got some time in the fourth quarter going 1-of-3 passing in his limited action. **THE TAKEAWAY** New Mexico State: The Aggies knew it was going to be a challenging start to the season beginning with the Cougars and No. 2 Alabama next week. New Mexico State must cut down on the miscues after committing three turnovers and was just 5 of 15 on third downs. Washington State: Part of Gordon's big debut was distributing the wealth to his pass catchers. Ten Cougars caught at least one pass, showing the depth of Washington State's receiver group. Patmon led the way with seven catches for 103 yards.

NORTHERN COLORADO AT NO. 22 WASHINGTON STATE

PULLMAN, Wash. — In two games as a starter, Washington State quarterback Anthony Gordon is averaging better than 50 points and 400 passing yards. He isn't doing it alone. "The offensive line is always great," Gordon said after throwing for 464 yards and four touchdowns to help No. 22 Washington State pound FCS school Northern Colorado 59-17 on Saturday. "There were no sacks," said Gordon, who completed 31 of 39 passes, with one interception. "They work hard up front." Max Borghi scored three touchdowns and Easop Winston Jr. caught two scoring passes for Washington State (2-0). Brandon Arconado caught eight passes for 127 yards and a touchdown. "It's awesome seeing Arconado have a career day," Gordon said. "He's gotten better and better," coach Mike Leach said about Arconado, a former walk-on. "His body has changed physically as far as speed and strength." Leach said Gordon also had a good game. "I thought he was quick and sharp," Leach said. "Obviously, he forced one ball." Washington State had 649 yards of total offense, to 355 for Northern Colorado. Jacob Knipp completed 8 of 15 passes for 128 yards for Northern Colorado (0-2) of the Big Sky Conference. Milo Hall rushed 31 times for 113 yards and a touchdown. Northern Colorado coach Earnest Collins Jr. pointed to turnovers as a key. "We turned the ball over five times," Collins said. "Turnovers will kill you. You can't have five turnovers and expect to win a game or be close in a game." Washington State linebacker Jahad Woods said the turnovers were by design. "This is what we practice all the time, taking the ball away," he said. Winston caught a 7-yard touchdown pass from Gordon on the Cougars' first possession for a 7-0 lead. Hall ran up the middle on the ensuing possession for an 11-yard touchdown to tie it. Gordon replied with a 4-yard touchdown pass to Borghi for a 14-7 lead. The Bears drove into Washington State territory, but running back Julien Ison fumbled and the Cougars' Ron Stone recovered at the 29. Gordon's 39-yard pass to Arconado set up Borghi's 2-yard touchdown run for a 21-7 lead. Collin Root kicked a 50-yard field goal to cut the deficit to 21-10 late in the first half. Blake Mazza kicked a 20-yard field goal as time expired for a 24-10 halftime lead for Washington State. Winston caught a 7-yard touchdown pass on the opening drive of the second half as Washington State took a 31-10 lead. Borghi ran over the goal line from the 3 midway through the third quarter for a 38-10 Washington State lead. Washington State linebacker Ron Stone was ejected from the game for targeting Knipp in the third. Gordon is the current Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week after leading the Cougars to a 58-7 win over New Mexico State in his starting debut. "We can't get caught up in two good games we've had," Gordon said. "We can't get complacent." **TIME OF POSSESSION** Northern Colorado had the ball for 36 minutes, to 33 minutes for Washington State. That's a big reason Leach doesn't put much stock in that statistic. "We did a good job of shutting down drives at key times," Leach said of his defense. **THE TAKEAWAY** Northern Colorado: The Bears were predicted to finish last in the Big Sky this season. Washington State: The Cougars have pounded two overmatched opponents and need to face tougher competition to get a better picture of their abilities.

NO. 20 WASHINGTON STATE AT HOUSTON

HOUSTON – After No. 20 Washington State struggled to get going early on Friday night against Houston before pulling away in the second half for a win, coach Mike Leach lamented that his team didn't have more time to play. "I almost wish we had a fifth quarter because I thought we had more work to do and we could have grown a little bit more," he said. "I thought we were playing our best football at the end." Anthony Gordon threw for 440 yards and three touchdowns for his third straight 400-yard game as Washington State got the 31-24 victory. Gordon threw a 7-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter and had two 39-yard scoring throws, including one in the third quarter that gave Washington State (3-0) the lead for good. "I thought we were frantic the first half both offensively and defensively," Leach said. "Then when we settled in I thought we played well the second half." It was the first meeting as head coaches for Leach and Houston's Dana Holgorsen, who first met almost 30 years ago when Holgorsen played at Iowa Wesleyan, where Leach was an assistant. The two coached together at both Valdosta State and Texas Tech and have remained close since that time, adding some familiarity to this game between teams meeting for just the fourth time. D'Eriq King had 128 yards passing and a score and added 94 yards rushing and two touchdowns on a night Houston (1-2) led 14-7 at halftime. But Houston struggled to move the ball in the second half, lost two fumbles and didn't get in the end zone after halftime until King's 12-yard run with 2:21 left cut the lead to 31-24. Brandon Arconado had nine receptions for 115 yards and Max Borghi added 61 yards receiving and ran for a touchdown in the third quarter to help Washington State to the victory. Houston went for it on fourth-and-1 on its first drive of the second half and fumbled the snap. Washington State recovered and Borghi caught a 17-yard pass on the ensuing drive and tied it at 14-all with a 1-yard scoring run. Gordon used a perfect throw to deposit the ball between two defenders to Dezmon Patmon for a 39-yard touchdown midway through the third to give Washington State its first lead of the game 21-14. King looked to have scored on a 72-yard run late in the third quarter, but Jeremy Singleton was called for holding and it was brought back. Houston's drive stalled after that and the team had to punt. There were about 11 minutes left when Houston got within 21-17 with a 42-yard field goal. Another touchdown pass by Gordon, this one a 7-yard strike to Travell Harris, pushed Washington State's lead to 28-17 with about seven minutes remaining. Houston took a 7-0 lead midway through the second quarter when King capped a 15-play, 82-yard drive with a 13-yard TD pass to Marquez Stevenson. Washington State tied it up on the next drive when Easop Winston got in front of the defense to grab a 39-yard touchdown reception from Gordon. King put Houston back on top 14-7 when he sneaked on from 1-yard out on the next drive. King has at least one TD pass and one scoring run in 14 straight games to tie the FBS record for consecutive games with a TD run and passing touchdown set by Tim Tebow. Washington State put together a nice drive after that, but Gleson Sprewell made an acrobatic interception in the end zone to allow Houston to keep the lead heading into halftime. The play extended Houston's streak of games with a takeaway to 20, which is the longest active streak in the nation. It was also Houston's 103rd interception since 2013, which is the most in the country in that span. **THE TAKEAWAY** These teams combined for 209 yards of penalties on Friday night, something they'll need to clean up before the two schools open conference play next week.

PULLMAN, Wash. – Dorian Thompson-Robinson threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Demetric Felton with 1:07 left in the game as winless UCLA overcame a 32-point second-half deficit and a record nine TD passes by Washington State's Anthony Gordon and claimed a wild 67-63 victory over the No. 19-ranked Cougars on Saturday night. Gordon was sacked and fumbled – the team's sixth turnover of the game – on the next possession with about a minute remaining and UCLA recovered and ran out the clock. Thompson-Robinson threw for 507 yards and five touchdowns for UCLA (1-3, 1-0 Pac-12). Gordon threw for 570 yards and broke the school record with nine TD passes for Washington State (3-1, 0-1). Jacksonville Jaguars' starting QB Gardner Minshew, a sixth round draft pick who was on the WSU sidelines Saturday's game, held the school record of seven TD passes in a game, set in November 2018 against Arizona. Easop Winston Jr. was Gordon's favorite target. He caught four touchdown passes for Washington State. Washington State jumped to a 35-17 lead at halftime, and pushed that to 49-17 early in the third quarter. But UCLA, which had failed to score more than 14 points in each of its three losses, stormed back, erupting for three touchdowns in the final 4 minutes of the third. Thompson-Robinson ran for one touchdown and threw scoring passes to Chase Cota and Demetric Felton to bring the Bruins within 49-38. In the fourth, Thompson-Robinson hit Devin Asiasi with a 7-yard touchdown pass and then found Cota for a two-point conversion pass to bring UCLA within 49-46 with 14:28 left in the game. Gordon broke the WSU touchdown record with his eighth, this time a 33-yarder to Winston, for a 56-46 lead with 10:08 left. Thompson-Robinson ran over from the 3 to cut WSU's lead to 56-53 with 8:10 left. Washington State was forced to punt and Kyle Phillips returned it 69 yards for a touchdown, putting the Bruins ahead 60-56 with 7:31 left. But Borghi caught a short pass from Gordon and ran 65 yards for a touchdown and a 63-60 lead with 6:11 left. That set the stage for the winning touchdown. On the first series of the game, UCLA linebacker Josh Woods intercepted a Gordon pass. Thompson-Robinson hit Joshua Kelley on a 14-yard touchdown pass for a 7-0 lead. Gordon replied by finding Winston with a 4-yard touchdown pass. The Bruins replied with a 31-yard field goal by JJ Molson for a 10-7 lead. Washington State scored four touchdowns in the second quarter, beginning with Gordon's 28-yard pass to Winston, to take control. Gordon found Travell Harris for a 10-yard touchdown pass and a 21-10 lead. Felton returned the ensuing kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown as the Bruins pulled within 21-17. Gordon replied with short touchdown passes to Winston and Tay Martin for a 24-17 lead that stood at halftime. In the third, Gordon hit Renard Bell and Dezmon Patmon for touchdowns and a 49-17 lead. **STAT LINE** UCLA had 657 yards of total offense, to 720 yards for Washington State. **MAD MAX** Washington State's Max Borghi rushed for 123 yards and caught two passes for 80 yards. **THE TAKEAWAY** UCLA: The Bruins came in as the only Pac-12 team averaging less than 300 yards of offense per game (263), but finally put some points on the scoreboard.

WASHINGTON STATE AT NO. 19 UTAH

SALT LAKE CITY – A week after limping off the Los Angeles Coliseum field defeated and hurt, Tyler Huntley felt as if he was walking on air as he skipped off the wet turf at Rice-Eccles Stadium. Huntley, who was rumored to be a game-time decision, passed for two touchdowns and ran for two more, powering No. 19 Utah over Washington State 38-13 in the rain on Saturday night. Meanwhile, WSU coach Mike Leach was more focused on his own team's deficiencies than any of Huntley's brilliance. Huntley completed 21 of 30 passes for 334 yards. He didn't attempt a pass in the fourth quarter as Utah (4-1 overall, 1-1 Pac-12) went conservative to claim its first win against the Cougars (3-2, 0-2) since 2012. Anthony Gordon may have set a conference-record nine touchdown passes last week, but it was Huntley who stood out from the get-go. He completed eight of his first 10 passes for two TDs, notwithstanding a wide-open drop in the end zone. Utah followed the axiom that the best defense against a high-powered offense is to just keep the ball away. The Utes spent 7:40 on the opening drive of the second half and reached the 1-yard-line before settling for a Jadon Redding 28-yard field goal. After Jaylon Johnson's interception, Derrick Vickers rushed for a seven-yard touchdown, giving Utah a 31-13 lead. The Cougars already seemed to have run out of time. The Cougars only managed seven plays for 26 yards in the third quarter as the Utes took control. Then WSU embarked on their own long drive (7:06) in the fourth, but was stopped at the 2-yard-line when Julian Blackmon tackled Max Borghi on fourth down. After becoming the first WSU quarterback to top 400 yards passing in his first four starts, Gordon threw for 252 yards but had two interceptions, including Francis Bernard's pick with 5:26 to play. Utah's defense only allowed one play over 20 yards the entire game. Utah had 325 yards in first half - averaging 9 yards a play - which was more than the Cougars managed all game. WSU came in with the No. 1 passing attack in the nation at nearly 500 yards a game, but had just 252 yards through the air and just 313 yards of total offense. Samson Nacua, filling in for leading receiver Britain Covey, had five catches for 90 yards, and Bryan Thompson had four receptions for 111 yards. There were whispers that Covey may wear redshirt as he hasn't healed fully from offseason knee surgery and has played the maximum of four games. Whittingham said his future is in the air and he just wasn't feeling well in the days leading up to the game. Borghi had 51 yards rushing and nine catches for 70 yards for the Cougars. **POLL IMPLICATIONS** The Utes fell nine places after losing to USC, but their stout defense re-emerged to accompany a potent offense. There were many upsets, so Utah doesn't figure to rise too far. **THE TAKEAWAY** Washington State: After the astounding collapse against UCLA last week, the defense wasn't much better Saturday as Utah romped to 526 yards. In addition, Gordon and the offense could never get rolling to try and outscore the Utes. Utah: Behind the masterful play of Huntley, the Utes didn't miss Moss much and the defense was sturdy and kept everything in front of them throughout the game. Utah only punted once and played it safe with yet another game ending turnover-free.

WASHINGTON STATE AT NO. 18 ARIZONA STATE

Oct. 12, 2019 • Sun Devil Stadium • Att.: 48,536 • TV: Pac-12 Networks

TEMPE, Ariz. – Arizona State's defense limited the damage of a late shanked punt, holding Washington State to a field goal and a three-point lead. That set the stage for Jayden Daniels. The unflappable freshman quarterback has thrived in late moments like these through his first season and added another highlight to his resume, capping a calm-and-collected drive by spinning off a defender into the end zone for the winning touchdown. Daniels scored on a 17-yard scramble with 34 seconds left and threw three touchdown passes to ailing Brandon Aiyuk, leading No. 18 Arizona State to a 38-34 comeback victory on Saturday. Arizona State (5-1, 2-1 Pac-12) trailed by three after Blake Mazza made a 31-yard field goal with 2 1/2 minutes left. Taking over at their own 25-yard line, the Sun Devils moved quickly down the field behind Daniels' pinpoint passing. The freshman who led similar drives in wins against Michigan State and Cal capped it with his scramble, helicoptering off a defender into the end zone. Daniels threw for 363 yards on 26-of-36 passing. Aiyuk had seven catches for 196 yards despite an illness that kept him out for portions of the game. Anthony Gordon threw for 466 yards and three touchdowns, but Washington State (3-3, 0-3) was again let down by its defense. The Cougars allowed 498 yards and folded when they needed to stiffen the most, allowing Daniels to hit 6 of 8 passes for 52 yards on the winning drive. "I thought it was a team we let slip through our fingers too many times," Washington State coach Mike Leach said. "We need to trust each other better." The Cougars lead the nation in passing yards per game, are fourth in total offense and eighth in scoring. Washington State was good against Arizona State from the start. Gordon took advantage of blown coverages by Arizona State to hit Travell Harris on a 35-yard touchdown and Dezmon Patmon on a 2-yard score to put the Cougars up 17-7. Where Washington State has struggled is on defense, so much that defensive coordinator Tracy Claeys abruptly resigned this week. Washington State's defense was solid early under interim coordinator Roc Bellantoni, sacking Daniels three times in the first nine plays while holding Arizona State to 23 yards in the first quarter. The Sun Devils came alive behind the Daniels-Aiyuk connection. The pair hooked up on a 40-yard touchdown early in the second quarter, then Aiyuk broke a tackle to turn a short completion into an 86-yard score. Cristian Zendejas' 31-yard field goal on the final play of the first half tied the game at 17-all. Arizona State took a 24-17 lead to open the second half when Eno Benjamin turned a fourth-and-1 into a 32-yard touchdown run. Washington State responded with drives of 91 and 92 yards, scoring on a 2-yard pass from Gordon to Eason Winston Jr. and Max Borghi's 2-yard run. Daniels and Aiyuk connected for a third score, a 33-yarder to tie it at 31-all. Washington State took a late lead, but left too much time on the clock for Daniels and the Sun Devils. "We let a couple of things slip and that's what cost us the game," Washington State defensive lineman Dallas Hobbs said. **THE TAKEAWAY** Another huge offensive game (532 total yards) by Washington State, another defensive letdown leaves the Cougars winless in Pac-12 play. The calm, cool play of Daniels has the Sun Devils rising, likely up a few spots in next week's AP Top 25.

COLORADO AT WASHINGTON STATE

PULLMAN, Wash. – After a few frustrating weeks, Washington State coach Mike Leach was pleased to see the Cougars play with a level of consistency that has been absent. “Consistency and the mental toughness to stay focused from one play to the next,” Leach said. “Everyone wants to get ahead of themselves but all you have is that one play in the present moment and you better focus on that one and I thought we did a better job of keeping track of that tonight.” Anthony Gordon passed for 369 yards and four touchdowns and Washington State rolled over Colorado 41-10 on Saturday, snapping the Cougars’ three-game losing streak. Gordon threw a 4-yard TD pass to Max Borghi and a 22-yarder to Dezmon Patmon in the first quarter as the Cougars (4-3, 1-3 Pac-12) jumped to a 14-0 lead, scored touchdowns on their first three drives and cruised to a needed victory. Gordon was 35-of-51 passing and connected with eight different receivers. The WSU defense was excellent after weeks of getting shredded. Colorado was limited to 320 total yards and quarterback Steven Montez was intercepted twice. “I think we are emerging defensively,” Leach said. “We simplified some things but we are still kind of coming together there a little bit, honestly. I think the defense has some of its best football ahead of us.” Borghi was also outstanding on the ground, rushing for 105 yards, including a 47-yard touchdown run late in the first quarter that gave the Cougars a 21-3 lead. Montez was 16-of-30 passing for 129 yards. Alex Fontenot had 11 carries for 105 yards, but the Buffaloes’ only touchdown came on Laviska Shenault Jr.’s 6-yard TD run in the third quarter that pulled Colorado (3-4, 1-3) within 24-10. But Gordon responded with a 44-yard TD pass to Brandon Arconado and hit Tay Martin for a 1-yard TD early in the fourth quarter. Colorado Coach Mel Tucker was frustrated with turnovers and the inability to finish drives. “We need to be able to score touchdowns, especially against a team like this who can move the ball and score,” Tucker said. “That has been an issue for us the past couple of weeks. Obviously, we are moving the ball but we can’t finish drives and we missed a couple field goals. Those are things that we have to get cleaned up.”

TURNOVERS Washington State recorded three takeaways, improving to 28-5 since 2015 when forcing multiple turnovers. It was the first time the Cougars intercepted three passes in a game since its win over Eastern Washington last season. **GROUND GAME** Borghi posted his third 100-yard rushing game of the season. Borghi is the first Cougar with three 100-yard games in a season since Jerome Harrison had eight in 2005. Borghi also had nine catches, tying a career-high. **ROUGH DEBUT** Montez was replaced in the fourth quarter by Tyler Lytle, but he was injured on his first play. Freshman Blake Stenstrom stepped in for the first action of his career and his first pass attempt was intercepted. **THE TAKEAWAY** Colorado: The Buffaloes lost their third straight and could not get off the field on third downs, continuing a season-long issue. Washington State converted 7-of-14 third downs. The Buffaloes were giving up 49% on third down entering the game. Washington State: The Cougars were giving up 47.7 points per game in conference play, but didn’t allow Colorado out of its own territory on seven of its final nine drives. The Buffaloes have five drives of three plays or less.

WASHINGTON STATE AT NO. 11 OREGON

EUGENE, Wash. – Freshman kicker Camden Lewis flexed his muscles with a holler as teammates raised him on their shoulders. He had just nailed a 26-yard field goal as time expired, extending No. 11 Oregon’s winning streak to seven games with a 37-35 victory over Washington State on Saturday night. He deserved that flex. CJ Verdell ran for a career-high 257 yards and three touchdowns for the Ducks (7-1, 5-0 Pac-12), who haven’t lost since the season opener against Auburn. Anthony Gordon’s 5-yard touchdown pass on fourth down to Brandon Arconado with a minute remaining gave Washington State a 35-34 lead. But then Justin Herbert completed four straight passes on the ensuing drive to get the Ducks close for Lewis’ kick. The loss snapped Washington State’s four-game winning streak over Oregon. Gordon threw for 406 yards and three touchdowns for the Cougars (4-4, 1-4), while Arconado caught nine passes for 130 yards and two scores. Gordon went into the game leading the nation in yards passing (425.9) and completions (35.14) per game. He has 32 touchdowns this season, including the four he threw last week in a 41-10 victory over Colorado. Herbert threw for 222 yards but his streak of 35 straight games with a touchdown pass - the longest active run in the nation - was snapped. He threw for 280 yards and four touchdowns last week in a comeback victory over Washington to earn Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week honors. The Ducks were without senior linebacker Troy Dye, who broke his thumb last week against Washington. Dye has 351 career tackles, most among current Power 5 players, and has led the Ducks in tackles for three straight seasons. Dru Mathis started in his place. The Cougars got to the Oregon 19 on their opening drive, but Gordon twice failed to connect with Rodrick Fisher and the team settled for Blake Mazza’s 36-yard field goal. The Ducks answered with Lewis’ 40-yard field goal. Verdell ran untouched for an 89-yard touchdown to put the Ducks up 9-3 midway through the first half. The extra point attempt by Lewis went wide right. Gordon was intercepted in the end zone by Verone McKinley III, who snagged the ball when Arconado bobbled it. It was McKinley’s third interception this season. But the Ducks failed to capitalize on the turnover. Dru Mathis’s 1-yard touchdown run pulled Washington State in front 10-9. Jevon Holland intercepted Gordon and ran it back 19 yards for a touchdown, and the 2-point conversion was good to give the Ducks a 17-10 lead. The Cougars tied it with 47 seconds left before the break when Gordon found Renard Bell with a 15-yard touchdown pass. Verdell’s 2-yard scoring run put Oregon back in front before Mazza’s 23-yard field goal closed the gap to 24-20 going into the fourth quarter. Verdell added a 1-yard TD early in the period. The Cougars trimmed the margin with Gordon’s 19-yard pass to Arconado, and the conversion was good to make it 31-28. Lewis made a 30-yard field goal with 6:29 left to give the Ducks some cushion, but a pass interference call and Gordon’s 48-yard pass play to Tay Martin got the Cougars to the Oregon 12 with less than two minutes to go. On third-and-5, Gordon’s pass to Arconado was incomplete, but Washington State went for it on fourth down and this time Arconado pulled down the TD. **THE TAKEAWAY** Washington State: Mazza has not missed a field goal this season. The Cougars got a scare in the first half when Borghi gingerly limped off the field after a 14-yard run, but he returned. Washington State’s four-game winning streak over Oregon was the longest by a Pac-12 opponent since Washington won five straight meetings from 1989-93.

WASHINGTON STATE AT CALIFORNIA

BERKELEY, Calif. – A Devon Modster wasn't too impressed with the best game of his career. That it helped stop California's four-game losing streak was much more important to the Golden Bears quarterback. Modster passed for a career-high three touchdowns and rushed for a fourth in his first game back from injury. California's defense made a pivotal stop late in the fourth quarter, and the Golden Bears beat the Cougars 33-20 on Saturday night to end a four-game losing streak. Modster did not play in Cal's 35-0 loss to No. 8 Utah on Oct. 26 because of an unspecified injury but was cleared earlier this week. He completed 16 of 24 passes for 230 yards and had a pivotal 26-yard scramble prior to his 52-yard touchdown pass to Makai Polk. Modster also had scoring throws of 9 and 13 yards, then sealed the game with a 13-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. Chris Brown Jr. rushed for 95 yards and scored twice to help California (5-4, 2-4 Pac-12) win for the first time since Sept. 21. The Bears outgained the Cougars 196-16 on the ground. The win keeps California on track to become bowl eligible for the third time in three seasons under coach Justin Wilcox. Washington State quarterback Anthony Gordon was 45 of 58 for 407 yards passing and threw two touchdown passes and one interception. Gordon, who entered the game leading the nation in passing yards and touchdowns, completed 19 consecutive throws during one stretch to help make up for a rocky start when his first throw of the night was picked off. Coach Mike Leach's team came unraveled in the fourth quarter. Safety Tyrese Ross was called for a late hit out of bounds on Cal's Ben Skinner. On the same play, a member of the Cougars coaching staff was called for unsportsmanlike conduct, giving the Bears 30 yards in penalties. Washington State (4-5, 1-5) never led and lost for the fifth time in six games. THE TAKEAWAY Washington State: The Cougars were comfortable throwing the majority of the time, which made it easier for the Bears to defend. Gordon was sharp most of the game and found a nice rhythm with wide receiver Brandon Arconado (12 catches, 130 yards, one touchdown). Washington State still has a shot at a postseason bowl but cannot afford another loss. California: Modster finally looked like a capable quarterback. He completed three long passes and effectively danced out of trouble for most of the game. Brown's running allowed the Bears to be balanced offensively for one of the few times this season. Major credit goes to the defense, which has held 15 of its last 16 opponents to under 25 points. NO GIMMES HERE Both teams struggled to convert extra point attempts. Cal's Greg Tomas had his PAT blocked in the first half while Modster's pass on a 2-point try in the fourth quarter fell incomplete. Washington State also came up empty on a pair of 2-point conversion attempts.

STANFORD AT WASHINGTON STATE

PULLMAN, Wash. – Washington State quarterback Anthony Gordon threw for 520 yards and five touchdowns in a victory over Stanford, and coach Mike Leach was full of praise for the senior on Saturday. Washington State scored the final 24 points of the game in beating Stanford 49-22, to move within one win of becoming bowl eligible. It was their first victory in almost a month. Gordon completed 44 of 60 passes and was intercepted once. He now has 39 touchdown passes on the season, which leads the nation and is a team record. Easop Winston Jr. caught 11 passes for 107 yards and a pair of touchdowns for Washington State (5-5, 2-5 Pac-12), which has a four-game winning streak against the Cardinal. Max Borghi rushed for 111 yards and scored a pair of touchdowns. Brandon Arconado caught nine passes for 148 yards for the Cougars. Davis Mills, starting in place of injured K.J. Costello, threw for a team record 494 yards for Stanford (4-6, 3-5). Mills completed 32 of 49 passes for three touchdowns and a pair of interceptions. Connor Weddington caught seven passes for 109 yards and Michael Wilson had five catches for 114 yards. Stanford played without Costello and All-Pac-12 defensive back Paulson Adebode, who were out with injuries. In the opening series, Winston caught a short pass from Gordon, the nation's leading passer, and turned it into a 29-yard touchdown reception. The kick by Blake Mazza was blocked for a 6-0 lead. Mazza had made all 41 of his previous conversion attempts this season. After a Stanford punt, Washington State drove 96 yards, with Gordon hitting Tay Martin for a 16-yard touchdown pass and a 13-0 lead. After a Stanford punt, Washington State drove 97 yards for its third touchdown. Gordon fired a 15-yard scoring pass to Winston, who split three defenders in the end zone and made a diving catch. Mazza's kick failed and the Cougars led 19-0. Stanford replied with a 28-yard touchdown pass from Mills to Simi Fehoko. Gordon was intercepted at the Stanford goal line on the next series by Jonathan McGill. Davis drove the Cardinal 99 yards, culminating in a 23-yard touchdown pass to Michael Wilson that cut WSU's lead to 19-14. Mazza kicked a 35-yard field goal to give WSU a 22-14 lead at halftime. Mazza's 38-yard field goal late in the third gave WSU a 25-14 lead. Stanford replied with a 10-yard touchdown pass from Mills to Fehoko, and Cameron Scarlett ran over the 2-point conversion to bring the Cardinal within 25-22. But the Cougars blew the game open, scoring three touchdowns and a field goal in the final 18 minutes. Travell Harris returned the ensuing kickoff 83 yards to the Stanford 10, and Gordon threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to Arconado. Mazza added a 35-yard field goal on the next possession for a 35-22 lead. WSU's Skyler Thomas intercepted Mills at midfield, and Borghi caught a short touchdown pass from Gordon for a 42-22 lead midway through the fourth. Borghi added a late running touchdown. Washington State did not punt in the game.

OREGON STATE AT WASHINGTON STATE

PULLMAN, Wash. — Max Borghi predicted that Washington State would beat Oregon State to become bowl eligible. On Saturday night, Borghi made his prediction come true with a 2-yard touchdown run with 2 seconds left to lift Washington State to a wild 54-53 victory. The final drive of the game came after the Washington State defense stopped Oregon State on a fourth-and-6 with 1:10 left in the game. Anthony Gordon then led Washington State on a 10-play, 58-yard drive, capped by Borghi's touchdown. The win makes Washington State (6-5, 3-5 Pac-12) bowl eligible for the fifth consecutive year. Gordon went 50 of 70 for 606 yards, six touchdowns and three interceptions. He broke the Pac-12 single season passing touchdown record formerly held by Jake Browning and Jared Goff when he hit Renard Bell in the end zone with 1:44 left in the third quarter. Gordon has 45 passing touchdowns for the season. Renard Bell had 108 receiving yards and two touchdowns and Dezmon Patmon added 75 yards and two touchdowns for the Cougars. Both Deon McIntosh and Calvin Jackson also caught touchdown passes and had 93 and 76 yards receiving for the Cougars. Borghi rushed for 44 yards and two touchdowns. Oregon State (5-6, 4-4) recovered an onside kick on their 49, down three with 7:30 left in the fourth quarter and converted it into a touchdown on the ensuing drive. The Beavers were up 53-42 with 4:17 left in the game before Washington State closed out the game with two consecutive touchdowns. Jake Luton was 22 for 40 for 408 yards passing, five touchdowns and one interception for Oregon State. Jermar Jefferson rushed for 132 yards and two touchdowns. He had two receiving touchdowns as well. Champ Flemmings had 110 yards receiving and a touchdown. **THE TAKEAWAY** Washington State: The Cougars victory over Oregon State makes them bowl eligible for a fifth consecutive season. Oregon State: The Beavers remain one victory away from becoming bowl eligible for the first time since 2013. They will have to beat in-state rival No. 6 Oregon in Eugene. **HONORING HIKINSKI** The Cougars honored their deceased teammate Tyler Hilinski before kickoff. This would have been the QB's final home game. Hilinski took his own life in January 2018 at the age of 21. **BREAKING RECORDS** Anthony Gordon broke Jake Browning and Jared Goff's record of 43 touchdown passes in a season and Gardner Minshew's conference record of 4,779 passing yards.

Mike Leach, the 2018 AFCA National Coach of the Year and Pac-12 Coach of the Year, is set to begin his eighth season leading the Washington State Cougar football program after being named the Cougars' head football coach, Nov. 30, 2011. Leach has guided WSU to five bowl appearances in his first seven years, including each of the last four years, a program first.

Last season Leach was recognized for one of his finest jobs coaching, leading the Cougars to a school record 11-2 record, including seven-straight wins at one point. The Cougars were ranked in the top 13 of each College Football Playoff Ranking, including four-straight weeks at No. 8, while also leading the nation in passing for the third time in the past five years. The Cougars capped the season with a win over Iowa State in the Alamo Bowl. Senior quarterback Gardner Minshew II, led the nation in passing yards per game and total offense. The most notable improvement came from the offensive line, which allowed 44 sacks in 2017 (124th nationally) and only 11 (7th) in 2018. In the spring of 2019 Leach taught a five-week course at WSU on Insurgent Warfare and Football Strategies, along with former Washington State Senator Michael Baumgartner. Leach saw three more Cougars selected in the NFL Draft as left tackle Andre Dillard went in the first round to the Eagles, safety Jalen Thompson went in the fifth round to Cardinals and Minshew went in the sixth round to the Jaguars.

In 2017, Leach guided WSU to a 9-4 record, 6-3 in conference play, and a second-straight Holiday Bowl appearance and third-straight bowl game overall. The Cougars opened the seasons with six-straight victories and posted wins over No. 5 USC and No. 18 Stanford. Once again, the Cougar offense ranked among the national leaders in passing offense (2nd) while the defense ranked in the national top 25 in seven categories, including four in the top 10. Senior offensive lineman Cody O'Connell repeated as a First-Team All-American while junior Hercules Mata'afa also earned First-Team All-American honors.

In 2016, the Cougars posted an 8-5 mark, including a 7-2 record in Pac-12 play, along with an appearance in the Holiday Bowl. Leach guided a WSU offense that led the Pac-12 and finished third nationally in passing (362.5 ypg), and also led the Pac-12 in completion percentage, second nationally, at .703 percent. WSU won eight-straight games midway through the season, the most since the 1930 campaign. WSU had 10 players earn All-Pac-12 honors, five were named to the Pac-12 All-Academic teams, and redshirt junior offensive lineman Cody O'Connell was a unanimous All-American and finalist for the Outland Trophy.

The Cougars ended the 2015 season with a 9-4 record, 6-3 in the Pac-12 Conference, capped by a 20-14 Sun Bowl victory over Miami. After starting the season 2-2, the Cougars went 7-2 over the final nine games, posting last-minute victories at Oregon and No. 18 UCLA, and rallying from a fourth-quarter deficit in a 38-24 victory against Arizona State. For the second-straight season WSU led the nation in passing at 389.5 ypg, while also finishing second in the nation in red zone offense, converting 94.5 percent of their opportunities. WSU concluded the regular season by having 11 student-athletes named to All-Pac-12 teams and five to Pac-12 All-Academic teams. Senior offensive lineman Joe Dahl earned Second-Team All-America honors while defensive lineman Hercules Mata'afa garnered First-Team Freshman All-American honors by USA Today.

In 2014 Leach's offense led the nation in passing at 477.7 yards per game, the second-highest total in FBS history, trailing only Houston's 511.3 in 1989. WSU set or tied 42 school, conference or NCAA records during the season, including quarterback Connor Halliday who threw for an NCAA single-game record 734 yards against California. WSU also placed five student-athletes on Pac-12 All-Academic teams and five on All-Pac-12 teams during the season.

In 2013, Leach's second season at the helm of the Cougars, he guided Washington State to the Gildan New Mexico Bowl, the first bowl game for the Cougars in a decade. Last season the Cougars ranked fourth in the nation in passing offense, setting a school-record at 368.00 yards per game, eclipsing the previous mark of 343.3 ypg in 1997. The Cougar offense threw for more than 400 yards five times, including a 2013 NCAA FBS-best 557 yards at Oregon. Quarterback Connor Halliday set WSU single-season records for passing yards (4,587), attempts (714) and completions (449), the first WSU quarterback to surpass the 4,000-yard mark. The Cougars

picked up more national recognition as safety Deone Bucannon became WSU's first All-America first-team selection since 2005 and was later selected as the No. 27 overall pick in NFL Draft by the Arizona Cardinals, the first Cougar taken in the first round since 2003. The Cougars also placed eight student-athletes on Pac-12 All-Academic teams during the season.

In his first season in Pullman, Leach's high-powered offense led the Pac-12 Conference in passing, averaging 330.42 yards per game. That figure ranked ninth nationally and marked the second-highest average in school history. Academically, nine Cougars received Pac-12 All-Academic honors while the 2012 fall semester football GPA of 2.66 marked the first time the football team had been over a 2.60 GPA for fall semester.

Leach brought a proven record of winning to Pullman. In 10 seasons as a head coach, all at Texas Tech (2000-09) his program earned 10 bowl bids. In addition, the Susanville, Calif., native who was raised in Cody, Wyo., recorded a school-record 84 victories during his tenure.

Leading the most prolific passing offense in the country, Leach received three national coach of the year awards in 2008 - the Woody Hayes Award, Howie Long/Fieldturf Coach of the Year, and George Munger Award. His offense spreads the field with his exciting brand of football and guided Texas Tech to six NCAA passing titles and three total offense titles during his 10 seasons in Lubbock. Leach's offense produced school records in nearly every passing category in 2000, his first season with the Red Raiders, but surpassed those numbers in each of his next nine seasons.

During Leach's time in Lubbock, Texas, the Red Raiders increased their yards per game by more than 150 and averaged nearly 20 points more per outing. In the passing game, Texas Tech threw for about 300 yards more per game in the decade Leach was at the helm.

Leach led Texas Tech to one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2008 as the team set a program record with 11 regular-season wins en route to an 11-2 record. The win total tied the mark, set previously by the 1953 and 1973 Red Raider squads. Numerous accolades poured in from across the country as an unprecedented four players earned first-team All-America status, in addition to Leach's three coach of the year honors. Quarterback Graham Harrell, offensive tackle Rylan Reed and offensive guard Brandon Carter each garnered first-team honors, while wide receiver Michael Crabtree was honored as a unanimous All-American for the second-straight season.

On the field in 2008, the Red Raiders led the nation in passing for the sixth time in Leach's ten seasons and ranked among the top five in total offense. Harrell finished his storied career second on the NCAA career passing yardage list with 15,793 yards. Harrell also broke the career NCAA passing touchdowns mark with 134.

The Texas Tech program has established itself as one of the nation's leading producers of productive quarterbacks since the 2000 season. Harrell threw for 4,555 yards in his debut as the starter in 2006 and became the sixth player and third Red Raider in NCAA history to throw for 5,000 yards in a season with his 5,705-yard effort in 2007 and 5,111 yards last season. He also is the third quarterback under Leach to win nine games in a season and the first Red Raider in history to win 11 in a regular season. Former quarterback Kliff Kingsbury in 2002 and Cody Hodges in 2005 each posted nine-win seasons during their careers, while 2003 and 2004 signal callers B.J. Symons and Sonny Cumbie each won eight games in their respective seasons as the starter.

The running game flourished under Leach as well. Former Red Raider Taurean Henderson holds the NCAA career record for receptions by a running back. The Red Raiders' 28 total rushing scores in 2008 were the most for a Tech team since the 1993 team scored 30. Despite Tech's offense revolving around the pass, Leach did a tremendous job of incorporating the running back position into the mix. Henderson finished his career with 303 receptions, which ranks first in NCAA history among running backs and fourth overall.

Leach has coached several players who have gone on to the NFL. While at Tech, 18 players have been drafted and 21 others have signed free agent contracts. In the spring of 2009, four players were selected among the first four rounds of the NFL Draft, marking the most successful draft for Texas Tech in the Leach era.

Safety Darcel McBath was selected by the Denver Broncos in the second round, while offensive lineman Louis Vasquez was taken in the third by San Diego. Defensive end Brandon Williams went to the Dallas Cowboys in the fourth.

The program made strides academically as well under Leach. During his 10 years, Tech was recognized as one of the nation's top institutions for consistently being above a 70 percent graduation rate, according to the American Football Coaches Association.

Prior to coming on board at Texas Tech, Leach, in just one season at Oklahoma, directed a Sooner offense that went from one of the worst in the Big 12 Conference

to one of the best. Leach guided an Oklahoma offense that went from 11th in the Big 12 in 1998 to first in 1999 and 101st in the nation to 11th. In just one year, OU's total offense numbers improved from 293.3 to 427.2 yards per game. Under Leach, the Oklahoma offense set six Big 12 Conference and 17 OU records.

Prior to joining Bob Stoops' Oklahoma staff, Leach served as offensive coordinator for Hal Mumme at the University of Kentucky and Valdosta (Ga.) State University. Under Mumme and Leach, the Kentucky offense set six NCAA records, 41 Southeastern Conference records and 116 school records in 22 games.

Named 1996 Division II Offensive Coordinator of the Year by American Football Quarterly magazine, Leach helped Mumme lead Valdosta State to a 40-17-1 record. The 1993 Blazer offense smashed 66 school records, 22 conference records and seven national records. In 1994, Valdosta State advanced to the Division II playoffs with Leach's offense shattering 80 school records, 35 conference records and seven more national marks.

Leach and Mumme first teamed up at Iowa Wesleyan College in 1989. From 1989 to 1991 Leach served as offensive coordinator and line coach for an offense that led the NAIA in passing yardage one season and finished second the other two. Iowa Wesleyan quarterbacks passed for more than 11,000 yards in Leach's three seasons and broke 26 national records.

Leach also has made coaching stops in Pori, Finland, where he served as a head coach in the European Football League (1989), as well as one-year stints at College of the Desert (1988) and Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo (1987).

After graduating with honors from BYU in 1983, Leach earned a master's degree from the U.S. Sports Academy and his law degree from Pepperdine University, where he graduated in the top one-third of his class.

The oldest of six siblings, Leach and his wife, Sharon, are the parents of four children; Janeen, Kim, Cody and Kiersten, along with four grandchildren.

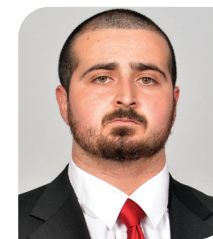

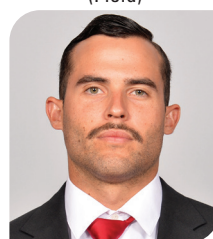
