The last meet of the regular season will be Washington's second road quad meet of the year as the GymDawgs head to California. Washington will face off with Illinois, Yale, and host UC Davis in the meet before the postseason begins next week.

The GymDawgs finished the home season strong last weekend, picking up two wins in two meets. In all, the GymDawgs earned ten outright or shared event titles in the two meets.

Event Previews

Vault – Washington's vault squad is peaking at the right time, with three straight meets earning scores over 49.000. That included a season-high 49.300, coming two weeks ago at Boise State. That was the highest vault score from the GymDawgs since 2017.

Geneva Thompson earned her fourth vault event title of the season last weekend, against Southern Utah. She has recorded a vault score of 9.800 or higher every meet she has competed in in her career and now has four straight with scores of 9.825 or higher.

Madison Copiak shared the vault title with Thompson, giving her two vault event titles this year. She had a season-best 9.875 on vault against Sacramento State and Iowa, then followed that with her second-best score of the year, a 9.850 against Southern Utah.

Thompson and Copiak are the only GymDawgs averaging over 9.800 on vault, at 9.828 and 9.803.

Bars – Washington's top-ranked event nationally, the GymDawgs moved up to 14th in the country on bars after two strong performances last week.

Monica Riley, Madison Copiak, and Michaela Nelson lead the way, with Riley averaging a 9.818, Copiak a 9.807, and Nelson a 9.800. Riley was an All-Pac-12 selection last year on bars.

Copiak matched her career best last week with a 9.925, earning the event title. That made it two weeks in a row that Copiak had earned a 9.925. Maya Washington would win the event title just two days later with her season-best 9.875.

Beam – Madison Copiak and Malory Rose shared the beam title against Sacramento State and Iowa, the first beam event titles of the year for each. For Rose, it was her fourth career event title.

Copiak averages a 9.827 on beam and has earned

a 9.800 or higher in every meet since earning a 9.750 in the season's first meet. Maya Washington is averaging a 9.800 on beam and has had a 9.800 or higher in five of the last six meets.

Floor – Kristyn Hoffa set a new career high against Sacramento State and Iowa and matched it next meet, earning 9.925s in each. Maya Washington also earned a 9.925 against Southern Utah, setting a new career high and tying for the event title with Hoffa.

Hoffa averages a 9.873 to lead the GymDawgs and rank 46th in the country. She hasn't had a score under 9.850 in eight meets and hasn't been under 9.800 since 2018.

Washington has been over 9.800 in all but one meet this year and now has had a 9.900 or higher in back-to-back meets.

Monica Riley has earned scores of 9.850 in back-to-back meets, setting a career high and matching it two days later.

Newcomers – Washington welcomes six newcomers to the team this season: Brenna Brooks, Talia Brovedani, Amara Cunningham, Madeline McLellan, Meaghan Ruttan, and Hannah Vandenkolk. Brooks and Cunningham each made their collegiate debuts at Nebraska, Geneva Thompson, a sophomore, also made her competitive debut this year in the season opener. Brooks, Cunningham, and Thompson have all competed in every meet so far. Ruttan has competed as an exhibition in the last two meets.

Head Coach

Elise Ray-Statz Head Coach | 3rd Season

Elise Ray-Statz enters her third season as head coach looking to make NCAA Nationals for the third consecutive time, something that has never happened in UW history. She has already brought the GymDawgs to Nationals in both of her years as head coach, just the second time in school history that the team has made back-to-back Nationals.

In her first year leading the program, Ray-Statz led Washington to an eighth-place finish at Nationals, just barely missing out on Super Six. Ray-Statz was named the Pac-12 Conference's Coach of the Year for her work with the GymDawgs. Last year, the GymDawgs finished the regular season ranked eighth in the country, its highest regular-season finish ever en route to another Nationals appearance.

"I have loved Washington from the day I first interviewed for the assistant job five years ago. There is something extremely special about the people and culture here on Montlake," said Ray-Statz about the program she now leads.

Ray-Statz, who was elevated to associate head coach prior to the 2015-16 season, has been influential in the growth of the UW Gymnastics program, both on and off the mat. While on staff, the Dawgs advanced to the NCAA Regional meet every year and sent three individuals to the NCAA Championships as well as 2017's team trip to Nationals.

Most recently, Ray-Statz coached Joslyn Goings to an All-American honor on beam, the third All-American Ray-Statz has coached in her three seasons. She helped the GymDawgs earn four All-Pac-12 awards in 2018 to go along with seven All-Academic honors.

"Elise has experienced success at every level of gymnastics competition, and embodies so many of the things we stand for as a University, and an athletic department. It's hard to imagine someone better positioned to inspire our team to achieve greatness in every area of their lives than Elise," said Director of Athletics Jennifer Cohen.

Ray-Statz has also played a key role in landing high-profile recruits for the Huskies including the class of 2016 which features the 2016 Junior

Olympics National Bar Champion in Evanni Roberson and Madison Copiak, who is currently competing for a chance to represent Canada at the 2016 Summer Olympics. 2017's recruiting class was just as impressive, featuring Hannah Willmarth, who finished in the top three on bars and floor at the state championships, and Geneva Thompson, who swept the 2017 Region 2 Championships.

As an acclaimed gymnast herself, Ray-Statz was an Olympic bronze medalist for team USA at the 2000 Sydney Olympics and also competed at the 1999 World Championships in Tianjin, China.

In 2000, Ray-Statz won both the U.S. National Championships and the Olympic Trials. She was the only American to qualify for an event final in the Olympics. After the Olympics, Ray-Statz competed under former Washington Head Coach Joanne Bowers at the University of Michigan, majoring in English. She led her team to the NCAA Super Six finals and was a three-time NCAA National Champion on the bars (2004), the beam (2002) and tied for the all-around title in 2001.

Ray-Statz graduated from Michigan with the most All-American honors in program history with 14 and was inducted into Michigan's Hall of Fame in October of 2015.

She was born in Tallahassee, Florida, but grew up in Maryland where she attended high school and last lived. Ray-Statz trained at Hill's Gymnastics in Maryland, under Kelli Hill.

After graduating, she performed in Las Vegas for Cirque de Soleil's O and LOVE. Occasionally she would work as a color commentator for the Big 10 Network during broadcasts of women's gymnastics meets. On Aug. 19, 2012, Ray was inducted into the USA Gymnastics Hall of Fame.

Ralph Rosso

Assistant Coach | 2nd Season

Ralph Rosso joined the Washington gymnastics coaching staff in June of 2017. Before UW, Rosso was an assistant at George Washington University. He is in his second stint in the Pac-12 Conference, having spent the previous two seasons at Arizona State, as an assistant coach and interim head coach.

In his first year with the GymDawgs, Rosso helped the team win four bars event titles, including a 9.950 score from Monica Riley that was the highest by a GymDawg all last season. Washington put up a bars team score over 49.000 in each of the last 12 meets and, in March, had a score of 49.375, its highest bars score since 2011.


In 2017 at GW, Rosso helped the Colonials to the East Atlantic Gymnastics League championship and a berth in the NCAA Regionals, where a GW gymnast won the program's first-ever NCAA Regional individual title, on the vault. Two individuals earned individual berths to nationals, the most ever at GW. A total of eight gymnasts earned All-EAGL honors.

At Arizona State, Rosso aided in the development of nine Academic All-Pac-12 gymnasts, three All-Pac-12 selections and five NCAA qualifiers, including an individual regional champion.

He spent the 2013-14 season as an assistant at Western Michigan, after having spent two seasons at Arkansas, serving as team manager while working on a master's degree. In his two seasons with the Razorbacks, the team finished 10th and sixth in the nation.

A standout gymnast at the University of Michigan, Rosso lettered from 2006-09, helping the Wolverines to the Big Ten title as a senior. He competed at NCAA Championships all four years and finished ninth on still rings in 2007. He also made it to the Big Ten finals on pommel horse and rings in 2007, and to two more finals in 2009, on rings and floor.

Following his collegiate career, he helped coach the Michi-



gan men's gymnastics team as a volunteer assistant in 2010, when the Wolverines won the NCAA Championship. Rosso is also a two-time member of the U.S. Junior National Team. He graduated from the University of Michigan in 2009.



Assistant Coach

Chad Wiest

Assistant Coach | 3rd Season

Wiest enters his third season with the GymDawgs having helped the team to a number of successes, including multiple NCAA Nationals trips. Last season, Wiest helped Washington win seven vault event titles and ten floor titles, including the NCAA Regionals championship on floor.

In his first year with the GymDawgs, Wiest helped Washington reach the NCAA Championships, where they finished eighth. That was the second-highest finish ever by the Huskies as the NCAAs and highest since 1998. The second-place finish at the Regional Championships in 2017 was also the highest finish by the Huskies since 1998. Wiest also helped four Huskies make the All-Pac-12 team, with Joslyn Goings making the First Team and Hailey Burleson, Kaitlyn Duranczyk, and Alexandra Yacalis making the Second Team.

Wiest joined the Huskies following three years as an assistant at the University of Illinois where he was focused on coaching the vault and floor lineups. Most recently, Wiest helped freshman Lizzy LeDuc advance to the NCAA Championships after she claimed the floor title at the Salt Lake City Regional with her career-high score of 9.950, which also ranked third in Illinois history. During his time at Illinois, he helped coach vault and floor lineups that ranked in the top 30 nationally along with posting some of the best marks in program history. The Illini's 49.400 performance at the 2015 Big Ten Championships was the second-best vault score at Illinois.

"I want to thank head coach Elise Ray, Senior Associate Athletic Director, Stephanie Rempe, and Athletic Director, Jennifer Cohen, for the opportunity to join the University of Washington staff," said Wiest. "I am beyond grateful and ecstatic to be entering this program at such an exciting time. As a new era of the program begins, I have full confidence in Elise as a leader and the coaching staff's abilities to take this team to the next level."

Wiest, graduated from Illinois in 2011 with a Recreation, Sport



and Tourism degree and then headed to Bowling Green where he spent two seasons as the vault and floor exercise coach at Bowling Green prior to joining Illinois in 2013. At Illinois, Wiest was a two-time All-American on floor (2007, 2010), finishing in third place at the NCAA Championships both times. In 2011, the Butler, Pa. native was First-Team All-Big Ten and the floor Big Ten Champion. In addition, Wiest was Academic All-Big Ten in his final two seasons. Wiest will reside in Seattle with his wife Jaclyn. They have one child.
