#9 HUSKIES (26-8) vs #8 UTAH STATE (28-6)

UW returns to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since the 2010-11 season as it earned the No. 9 seed in the Midwest Region. Washington will face No. 8 seed Utah State out of the Mountain West Conference on Friday, March 22 at 3:50 p.m. PT in Columbus, Ohio at Nationwide Arena. The game will be televised by TNT with Brian Anderson, Chris Webber and Allie LaForce on the call. Additionally, Craig Way and Will Perdue will host the Westwood One Broadcast while fans can always tune in to Tony Castricone and Jason Hamilton on the official Husky Radio Broadcast on KOMO 1000 AM/97.7 FM. The two programs have met eight times with Utah State having a 5-3 mark ... the last meeting also occurred in the NCAA Tournament on March 16, 2006 with UW taking a 75-61 win.

THE COACH - MIKE HOPKINS (4-7-21)

Mike Hopkins is in his second year at UW, and second as a head coach after becoming the 19th head coach in UW history. In two years with the Huskies, Hopkins has led the Dawgs to back-to-back 20-win seasons becoming just the second coach in program history to do so in his first two years. He repeated as Pac-12 Coach of the Year after winning it during his first campaign and is one of just three coaches in Pac-12 history to repeat on that award. After spending 22 years as an assistant at Syracuse, he oversaw teams that reached the NCAA Tournament 16 times including the 2003 National Championship, four Final Fours, five Elite Eights and 10 Sweet 16s along with four NIT berths. Syracuse never dipped below a 55.0 percent record while Hopkins was on staff.

QUICK HITTERS

- **Thybulle** is the all-time leader in the Pac-12 for career steals record as he passed Gary Payton (321, 1986-90) with his one against Oregon, moving him to 322 ... additionally, his 117 steals are the Pac-12 single-season record, as he passed Jason Kidd of Cal (1992-93), earlier last week.
- **Thybulle** is one of four finalists for the Naismith Defensive Player of the Year award, joining Duke's Zion Williamson, Gonzaga's Brandon Clarke and Virginia's De'Andre Hunter
- Washington swept the Pac-12 Player of the Year (Nowell), Coach of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year (Thybulle) Awards becoming the first team in league history to do so.
- Both Hopkins and Thybulle won their award for the second-straight year making them the first duo to win both COY and DPOY in back-to-back seasons
- Nowell became the youngest Husky in program history to be named Player of the Year and is just the third Dawg to earn the honor joining Brandon Roy and Christian Welp
- **Nowell** recorded his 10th 20-point scoring night of the season with 24 against USC and has now reached double-figures in 18 of the last 19 games
- Nowell has 106 assists on the season ... he has recorded the 41st 100 assist-season in UW history and joins teammate **Crisp** who posted a 100-assist year in 2017-18 with 106
- UW's 26 wins are its most since the 2009-10 season ... additionally, UW tied its most wins in Pac-12 Conference play as it finished at 15-3 ... UW also reached 15 conference wins in 1983-84, 1952-52 and 1943-44
- Washington is ranked second nationally in blocks per game (5.7) and ninth in steals per game (9.0), joining only Duke as the two teams to be ranked nationally in the top 10 in both categories
- **Thybulle** is averaging 5.7 takeaways per game this season between steals and blocks combined ... that number did jump to 6.5 during Pac-12 action.
- UW has four 1,000 point scorers on its roster at the same time for the first time in program history ... Dickerson (1,579), Crisp (1,491), Thybulle (1,230) and Nowell (1,096) ... UW is the only team in the nation with four 1K scorers that have reached those points at their current school (no transfers), Nevada has seven 1K scorers on its roster with only one scoring all 1,000 points at Nevada
- **Crisp** has reached double-digit scoring in 18 of the last 22 games
- **Nowell** has led the team in rebounding in 10 times this year and has seen his rebounding numbers jump to 5.4 per game from 4.0 a year ago ... in league action he averaged 5.9 rebounds
- **Thybulle** is the only player since 1992-93 to record both at least 110 steals and 70 blocks in the same season (via SportsReference).
- **Dickerson's** 5 rebounds at Stanford pushed him to 900 career boards ... he is now just the sixth player at UW to post 1,500 points and 900 rebounds in their career
- Washington ranks 15th in the nation in turnovers forced per game, averaging 16.2 per outing
- UW is holding opponents to just 64.4 points per game overall
- Hopkins has led UW to back-to-back 20 win seasons in his first two years ... the last UW coach to record 20 wins in their first two seasons was Tippy Dye (1951-52, 1952-53)

1 - Thybulle is the only player in the NCAA averaging at least 3.4 steals and 2.3 blocks

2 - The number of 100-steal seasons Thybulle has recorded, he is the only player in Pac-12 history with two 100-steal seasons as he has posted 101 as a junior and a UW record 117 as a senior

194 - Number of combined takeaways this season (blocks and steals), which leads all candidates on the Naismith DPOY Finalist list

322 - Career steals, first on both the Pac-12 and UW's all-time list and most by any active player in Division I this season

1,230 - Career points, which ranks 28th all time, he was the 41st player in UW history to reach 1,000 career points

1 - Nowell is the only Pac-12 representative on the top 10 finalist list for the Jerry West Award

1 - Nowell is the only player in the country and on the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award finalist list to be shooting over 50 percent (50.0), averaging over five rebounds (5.3) and 3 assists (3.1) and scoring at least 16 points a night (16.2)

3 - Nowell is also the only player in college basketball this season to post such an efficient stat line (16 ppg/5 rpg/3 apg/50% FG/40% 3FG) and would be one of **three** Pac-12 players – along with Brandon Roy in 2005-06 and Arizona State's James Harden in 2007-08 - to record the line over the past 25 seasons.

3 - One of three Huskies in program history to be named the Pac-12 Player of the Year joining Brandon Roy and Christian Welp and is the youngest to do so

20 - Number of 20+ career scoring outings... had 10 as a freshman, which led the team

16.2 - Points he is averaging to lead UW this season ... also led the Huskies as a freshman with 16.0 ppg in 34 outings

32 - Career high single-game points which he has done twice, most recently vs. Santa Clara (11/18/18)... also the freshman record for points in a debut (Belmont, 11/10/17)

60 - Number of double-figure scoring games in 68 outings ... reaches double-figure scoring 88.2 percent of the time he steps on the court

106 - Number of assists Nowell has recorded this season, which is the 41st 100-assist season in UW history ... his 106 lead the team ... Nowell had 92 a year ago, averaging 2.7 ... this year he is averaging 3.1

50.0 - FG percentage this season through 34 games, going 208-of-416 ... is shooting at a 47.8 percent clip for his career (411-of-859).

196 - Career assists in 68 games

1,096 - Career points in 68 career games ... he is the quickest player in UW history to get to 600, 700, 800, 900 and 1,000 career points

PAC-12 AWARDS SWEEP

The Huskies became the first team in league history to sweep Coach of the Year, Player of the Year (Nowell) and Defensive Player of the Year (Thybulle).

-Hopkins became just the fourth league coach in history to repeat as Coach of the Year and the first to do so in his first two seasons

-Nowell is third and youngest Husky to earn league Player of the Year joining Brandon Roy (2006) and Christian Welp (1986)

-Thybulle is the second player in Pac-12 history to repeat as Defensive Player of the Year joining Gary Payton II (OSU)

-It is the fifth time in Pac-12 history Washington has had three selections to the All-Conference teams.

NOAH'S DOUBLE-DOUBLES

Senior Noah Dickerson has recorded 23 double-doubles in his career, with 10 coming during last season's 34 games. He only posted six over his first 64 games. Dickerson nearly averaged a double-double with 15.5 points and 8.4 rebounds per outing last year ... his 10 were the most in a season by a Husky since Aziz N'Diaye had 11 during the 2012-13 campaign.

FORCING TURNOVERS

Washington has now forced at least 10 turnovers in 24-straight games including a season high 24 committed by Arizona State. On the season UW has forced 10 or more turnovers in all but one game (at Gonzaga - 9). **Additionally, Washington has forced a Pac-12 high 552 turnovers this season and its 16.2 turnovers forced per game rank 15th nationally.**

FOUR 1K SCORERS

UW now has four 1,000 point scorers on its roster as senior Noah Dickerson is at 1,579 while senior David Crisp is at 1,491. Senior Matisse Thybulle joined the 1K club following his 16 points against #13 Virginia Tech as he now has 1,230 career points and most recently sophomore Jaylen Nowell recorded his 1,000th point at California becoming the 42nd player at UW to reach 1K and currently has 1,096 points. In UW history, no roster has ever had four 1,000 point scorers. Two other rosters had three, listed below:

SENIOR ROAD WINS

Following their last road trip in the Bay Area, Washington's seniors have now recorded a win at each Pac-12 school during their career. Entering the season, they had not won at Arizona, Utah, Stanford, Oregon State or Oregon.

TAKEAWAYS - BLOCKS+STEALS

Matisse Thybulle has been a menace when it comes to defensive takeaways as he has 499 on his career (322 steals and 177 blocks). **This season he is averaging 5.7 takeaways per game and that number was upped to 6.5 during Pac-12 play.**

PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK - MT

Thybulle earned his first career Pac-12 Player of the Week award on Feb. 25 as he averaged 13.5 points, 6.0 steals, 5.0 rebounds and 4.5 blocks in two UW wins over Utah and Colorado ... he joined Jaylen Nowell in getting the weekly league honor this season as Nowell received it three times.

NOT JUST A STEAL THIEF

Thybulle has shown he can do more than just steal the ball, as he has recorded 180 blocks in his career as a guard. He is just 6 blocks away from tying 1st all-time at UW. Christian Welp holds the record at 186 (1984-87).

SWISS ARMY KNIFE NUMBERS

Thybulle is the only player in the country this season that has produced a single-game stat line of at least 10 points, 7 rebounds, 6 steals and 4 blocks, which he did against Utah while only having one turnover. Additionally, **Thybulle is the only player since 1992-93 to record 1,200 career points, 400 rebounds, 300 steals and 150 blocks as he currently has 1,230 pts, 410 rebs, 322 steals and 180 blocks.**

300 STEALS + 170 BLOCKS

Senior **Matisse Thybulle** is the only active player in NCAA Division 1 to have over 300 steals and 170 blocks in their career ... **his 322 steals are first amongst the NCAA active career leaders in that category.** No player since 1992-93 has recorded those numbers.

20/10's

Senior Noah Dickerson has posted eight 20/10 double doubles in his career against the following opponents. He is the first player to do so since Matthew Bryan-Amaning who posted eight in his career (2007-11).

524 GAMES PLAYED

Between UW's four seniors, David Crisp, Noah Dickerson, Dominic Green and Matisse Thybulle, they have played 524 career games with 356 career starts. The 524 career games is the most by a current senior class **(that has been at the same institution all four years)** amongst any team in the Power 5 Conferences.

2018-19 WASHINGTON MEN'S BASKETBALL – HUSKY NOTES

ROAD SWEEPS

UW recorded back-to-back road sweeps for the first time since the 2005-06 season following the wins at Oregon and Oregon State. Washington's two road sweeps marked just the sixth league road sweep by the Dawgvs in the last 10 seasons. **The last time UW recorded at least two Pac-12 road sweeps in the same season was the 2005-06 season when it won three.**

7 P-12 ROAD WINS...

-UW recorded seven conference road wins ... UW last had seven road wins in conference play during the 1956-57 season
 -UW held teams to 62.7 points per game and all seven shot below their season average with Utah being held 22.6 points lower and Oregon being held 16.1 points below its average
 -UW shot 49.1 percent from the field and 39.1 percent from 3-point range
 -Opponents shot just 32.4 percent from 3-point range
 -Three players averaged double-figures in Nowell (15.6), Crisp (13.9) and Dickerson (11.1)

ROAD STREAK

UW won five-straight Pac-12 road games for the first time since winning six over two seasons, 2/13/10 – 1/13/11, at Stanford, at WSU, at Oregon, at OSU, at USC, at UCLA.

18 IN 18

In 18 minutes at Arizona State, **Dickerson** scored a team-high 18 points, going 5-of-7 from the field and hitting 8-of-12 from the FT line ... he also added a team-high eight rebounds ... Dickerson followed that with 18 points at Washington State.

20 WIN SEASONS

With its win at Washington State, UW recorded its 20th victory of the season to post back-to-back 20 win seasons for the first time since 2010-11 and 2011-12. Washington went 21-13 a year ago en route to a second round appearance in the NIT. Additionally, UW has now posted 29 20-win seasons in program history.

HOT START IN LEAGUE PLAY

The Huskies' 10-0 start in conference play was their best start since the 1952-53 season when it started 14-0 and advanced to the Final Four. Additionally, the 10-straight league wins mark the longest winning streak in conference play since UW won 10-straight during the 1958-59 season. UW was also perfect in January for just the eighth time in the last 100 years (2018-19, 1952-53, 1935-36, 1933-34, 1928-29, 1923-24, 1922-23, 1921-22).

1,005 WINS AT AAA

The Dawgvs have 1,005 wins inside Alaska Airlines Arena. Washington's 1,005 wins are the most by any Division I team at its current home arena. The Huskies started playing in their arena on Dec. 27, 1927.

PROTECT HOME COURT

Washington finished its home campaign with a 15-1 record, its best mark through the regular season since the 2008-09 season when it went 18-1 overall in Alaska Airlines Arena.

600, 700, 800, 900, 1000

Following his 22 points at California, **Nowell** became the fastest player in UW history to reach 1,000 career points ... he now has 1,050 points in just 65 games played ... NBA All-Star Isaiah Thomas was next, as he reached 600 in 40 games, 700 in 46, 800 in 52, 900 in 58 and 1,000 in 64. **It took Nowell 38 games to get to 600, 43 to get to 700, 50 to get to 800, 56 to get to 900 and 62 to get to 1,000.**

CARTER ON THE RISE

• 13 of sophomore Naz **Carter's** career 20 10+scoring efforts have come in the last 31 games
 • **Carter** has surpassed his season totals from 17-18 in points, rebounds and upped his FG and FT percentage

PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK X3

Sophomore Jaylen Nowell earned three Pac-12 Player of the Week honors making him the first UW player since Isaiah Thomas in 2011-12 to earn the award three times in the same season. Nowell picked up the honor on Nov. 19, Dec. 28 and Jan. 28.

NOWELL'S SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

Nowell has shot at least 50 percent from the field in 33 of his 67 career games (49.2 percent). **In those 33 games, UW has a 27-6 record.**

TOP 15 AWAY FROM HOME

The Huskies faced their third top 15 team of the season in No. 13 Virginia Tech (Dec. 15), all of which have been away from home with two true road contests at No. 1 Gonzaga and No. 11 Auburn and this matchup with the Hokies being at a neutral site. UW is one of three teams nationally to play one three top 15 teams away from home joining Duke (all three neutral site) and Gonzaga (two neutral, one true road).

TOUGH SCHEDULING

Washington's 2018-19 schedule has featured two non-conference road tests against teams ranked in the AP top 25 (at #11 Auburn, which resulted in an 88-66 loss and at #1 Gonzaga, an 81-79 loss) and a neutral site loss to No. 13 Virginia Tech. Additionally, throughout the course of the season, Washington will face eight teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament a year ago. UW opened with a 73-55 victory over Conference USA favorite to win the league, Western Kentucky.

GREEN FROM 3

Over the last two seasons under Mike Hopkins, when senior Dominic **Green** hits at least 2 from 3-point range, the Dawgvs are 21-4 ... they are 13-3 this year when Green knocks in at least 2 from distance ... when he hits 3 from behind the arc UW is 11-0 over the last two seasons.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

UW recorded a season-low six turnovers against Stanford ... it was the second time in a three-game stretch that the Huskies posted 10 or less turnovers (also had eight against Utah) ... UW's six TOs against Stanford were its fewest since the 2015-16 season when it had four against WSU on March 2, 2016.

NOWELL'S ASSISTS

Nowell posted four-straight games with at least five assists against Cal State Fullerton (6), Washington State (5), Utah (5) and Colorado (5)... he's just the first player since No. 1 NBA draft pick Markelle Fultz to post at least five assists in four straight games as he did so in 2016-17 twice that season... Dejounte Murray did so as well his freshman campaign.

THYBULLE'S STREAK

Senior Matisse Thybulle has started every game of his UW career which now spans 133 games which is the most in program history passing Christian Welp who started 121-straight games from 1983-87.

NOWELL + DICKERSON COMBO

It's fair to say either Jaylen Nowell or Noah Dickerson will reach double figure scoring in a game ... **since Nowell joined the Huskies last year there has only been two games in 67 outings where neither reached double-figure scoring.**

2018-19 WASHINGTON MEN'S BASKETBALL – HUSKY NOTES

THYBULLE'S BLOCKS UP

Thybulle is averaging 2.3 blocks over 33 games ... that's up from 1.4 as a junior, 0.7 as a sophomore and 0.9 as a freshman ... **his career total of 180 blocks is second all-time at UW and the most by a guard in program history.**

MULTIPLE THREATS FROM 3

With his career-high tying 5 made from 3-point range at Utah and at California, David Crisp became the third Husky to knock down at least 5 from distance this season joining Dominic Green, who hit 7 against Eastern Washington (Nov. 27) and Matisse Thybulle who hit 5 vs. Virginia Tech (Dec. 15).

THYBULLE IN RARE COMPANY

When Matisse Thybulle surpassed 1,000 career points against Virginia Tech, he became the only player in Pac-12 history to reach the 1,000 points, 300 rebounds, 200 assists, 200 steals and 100 blocks thresholds. Donnie Boyce (1992-95 - 1995p/644r/405a/245s/114b) accomplished the feat during Colorado's membership in the Big 8, the only other player from current Pac-12 membership to do so.

4X - 100 CAREER GAMES

Against UCSB, senior Dominic Green played in his 100th career game and is now at 126, joining seniors Matisse Thybulle (133), David Crisp (133) and Noah Dickerson (132) in the 100 career game club.

DAWGS ADD QUADE GREEN

Quade (KWAH-day) Green announced he would be transferring to Washington from Kentucky and has joined the team as of January 2019. Green, originally from Philadelphia, was a 5-star recruit coming out of the class of 2017. In his first season with the Wildcats, Green averaged 9.3 points and 2.7 assists in 34 games while shooting 45.1 percent from the field. This most recent season before making the decision to transfer, Green was putting up 8.0 points and 2.3 assists in eight games. Green was a McDonald's All-American, participated in the Jordan Brand Classic and was the MVP of the HoopHall Classic. He averaged 20.8 points and 8.0 assists in leading Neumann-Goretti High school in his senior season as well. He was named the 2016 and 2017 Pennsylvania Class 3A Player of the Year and was part of the 2016 FIBA Americas U18 Championship Team that won the gold medal in Chile.

VANCOUVER SHOWCASE RECAP

Over the three Vancouver Showcase games, senior Noah **Dickerson** nearly averaged a 20/10 double double as he averaged 21.0 points and 9.7 rebounds while shooting 51.4 percent from the field ... additionally sophomore Jaylen **Nowell** averaged 22.7 points on 61.5 percent shooting.

Against Minnesota, Washington had two players reach 20 points for the first time since Feb. 10, 2018. Senior Noah Dickerson (28) and sophomore Jaylen Nowell (22) were also the two last season as they scored 28 and 23, respectively, at Oregon State.

BACK-TO-BACK 20'S

Senior Noah Dickerson recorded his back-to-back 20-point games against Texas A&M and Minnesota as he scored a career-high tying 28 points vs the Gophers. He previously posted 24 points against the Aggies. It is the third time in his career that he has recorded back-to-back 20-point outings:

-2018: Nov. 20 and Nov. 21 vs. Texas A&M (24) and Minn (28) - Vancouver Showcase
-2018: Feb. 1 and Feb. 3 vs. ASU (21) and Arizona (28)
-2017: March 1 and March 4 at UCLA (23) and USC (27)

GATORADE PLAYER OF THE YEAR X2

Washington boasts two players on its roster that earned their state's Gatorade Player of the Year award as seniors before coming to Washington. Sophomore Hameir Wright (Albany Academy) earned New York's honor in 2017 while freshman Jamal Bey (Bishop Gorman) was Nevada's Player of the Year in 2018.

LENGTH, LENGTH, LENGTH

Washington's roster is quite lengthy and not because of quantity. Six of the key players have wingspans that are at least four inches longer than their actual height. Senior guard Matisse Thybulle's wingspan is seven inches bigger than his 6-5 frame at 7-0 while freshman Bryan Penn-Johnson brings a 7-7 wingspan on his 7-0 body. Take a look:

2018 PAC-12 COACH OF THE YEAR

In just his first year as a head coach in his career, Washington's Mike Hopkins was named the 2018 Pac-12 Coach of the Year in a vote done by the league's coaches. He was the fourth Husky coach to earn the honor and first since 2012. Hopkins was also just the sixth Pac-12 Coach to earn the honor in their first year at their university joining Stanford's Dick DiBiasi (1976), UCLA's Gary Cunningham (1978), Oregon State's Jim Anderson (1990), California's Ben Braun (1997) and Washington State's Tony Bennett (2007).

2018 PAC-12 DEFENSIVE POY

Senior Matisse Thybulle made history last season as he was named the 2018 Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year becoming the first Husky to earn the honor. He was also named to the Pac-12 All-Defensive Team.

2018 PAC-12 ALL-CONFERENCE

A trio of Huskies also earned Pac-12 All-Conference Honors last season in Noah Dickerson who picked up Pac-12 First Team All-Conference honors along with Jaylen Nowell who was an All-Conference honorable mention. Nowell was also named to the All-Pac-12 freshman team while Thybulle was on the All-Defensive Team.

HUSKIES IN THE NBA

UW's presence in the NBA remains strong as the Dawgs boast seven former players holding spots on rosters this season - 2017 No. 1 pick Markelle Fultz (Philadelphia 76ers), Marquese Chriss (Houston Rockets), Justin Holiday (Chicago Bulls), Dejounte Murray (San Antonio Spurs), Terrence Ross (Orlando Magic), Quincy Pondexter (San Antonio Spurs) and Isaiah Thomas (Denver Nuggets).

FROM 2-16 TO 10-8

After going 2-16 in Pac-12 play during the 2016-17 season, the Huskies finished 10-8 in league action last year. Via Elias Stats/Pac-12 Conference, **over the last 40 seasons, only two league schools began its conference slate 6-3 or better the season after having no more than two conference victories. Stanford started 1993-94 with a 6-3 record after going 2-16 in 1992-93.**

WIN JUMP

Not only did UW have a huge change in their record during conference play a year ago, but its jump from a 9-22 record to 21-13 was the biggest since the difference between the 1936-37 and 1937-38 seasons when the Huskies went from 15-11 to 29-7.

2018-19 UW MEN'S BASKETBALL – COACH MIKE HOPKINS - RECORD: 47-21 (2Y)

COACH MIKE HOPKINS (2ND YEAR)

Mike Hopkins took over the helm of the University of Washington men's basketball program prior to the 2017-18 season and immediately made his mark. He led the Huskies to their first 20-win season since 2011-12 as the Dawgs went 21-13 and 10-8 in Pac-12 play.

In his first year, Hop was named the Pac-12 Coach of the Year becoming just the sixth coach in league history to earn the honor in their first year at their institution and first since 2006-07. He also picked up NABC District 21 Coach of the Year honors.

Hopkins led a team that went from 9-22 to 21-13 with almost entirely the same roster and helped guide Matisse Thybulle to Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year honors, the first Dawg to earn the award. Noah Dickerson was named to the All-Pac-12 First Team while freshman Jaylen Nowell picked up All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention and All-Pac-12 freshman team accolades. Thybulle was also named to the All-Pac-12 Defensive Team.

Washington made history in Hopkins' first year as the Huskies defeated No. 2 Kansas in Kansas City marking their first-ever win over a top-2 team away from Seattle in program history. Additionally, it was the sixth win over a top-2 opponent in UW history, regardless of place. During the season, Washington also picked up a road win at USC, its first since 2012.

On the weekend of Feb 1-3, Washington knocked off back-to-back ranked opponents in No. 25 Arizona State and No. 9 Arizona at home, making it the first time since the 2006-07 season that the Dawgs defeated ranked teams at home in back-to-back games.

The Huskies also started Pac-12 play at 7-3 after going 2-16 in 2016-17. Over the last 40 seasons, only two league schools began its conference slate 7-3 or better the season after having no more than two conference victories. Stanford started 1993-94 with a 6-3 record after going 2-16 in 1992-93.

In year one for Hop, Washington also saw two student-athletes reach 1,000 career points in Noah Dickerson and David Crisp and witnessed Matisse Thybulle set the single-season and career record for steals.

Hopkins came to Washington from Syracuse University, where he spent 22 seasons alongside Hall of Fame coach Jim Boeheim. In 2015 Syracuse named him head coach designate, set to take over the Orange program after Boeheim's retirement following the 2017-18 season.

"I'm extremely excited to welcome Mike and his family to Seattle," UW Athletic Director Jennifer Cohen said. "His resume and reputation within the basketball community made him stand out to us, but ultimately it was his vision for Washington, his passion for teaching and developing student-athletes and his close alignment with the core values of our institution and department that made it more than clear that he was the right fit for us."

Hopkins, 49, had been a member of the Syracuse Orange coaching staff since 1995 and will be the 19th head coach in Washington Basketball history.

"The University of Washington is such a unique place, with a world-class University, an exciting basketball history and unbelievable fan support," Hopkins said. "Together, I believe we can build something very special in Seattle, and I can't wait to get started."

During his time in New York, Syracuse advanced to postseason play in all but one year. He was a part of 16 NCAA Tournament appearances, including the 2003 National Championship, four Final Fours, five Elite Eights and 10 Sweet 16s, along with four NIT berths. Additionally, Syracuse never dipped below a .550 record while Hopkins was on staff.

"I can't express enough thanks to Coach Boeheim for so many years of mentorship and guidance," Hopkins said. "The timing is right for me and my family to make this move."

With the Orange, Hopkins spent his time in New York heavily involved in recruiting and overseeing the development of the SU guards before switching to overseeing the posts during the last four years. He played a key role in the recruitment and success of Carmelo Anthony, Rakeem Christmas, Johnny Flynn, Jason Hart, Gerry McNamara, Andy Rautins and many more who all were able to pursue professional basketball careers either in the NBA or overseas. Additionally, six players earned consensus All-American honors while Hopkins was on staff.

The Syracuse alum not only made an impact with the Orange, but he also played a major role in the success of Team USA Basketball. Hopkins has been a court coach for nine various Team USA staffs which have gone on to win six championships.

He first started with the 21-and-under team in 2000 and 2001 helping with player evaluation for the club that went on to win gold. In 2006, he was with the Senior Men's team before rejoining the staff in 2010 where he travelled with the team en route to their World Championship Title in Turkey.

Hopkins was named the co-coach of the USA Basketball Select Team in 2012 and helped the squad prepare for the Olympics in London, where he served as a court coach as USA won gold. Most recently he played a role in gold medal finishes at the 2014 World Championships and the 2016 Summer Olympics.

As a student-athlete himself, Hopkins became the Orange's starting shooting guard his junior year en route to the team winning the 1992 Big East Championship. Outside of playing 111 career games in the Carrier Dome, he was also named team captain as a senior en route to averaging 9.2 points and 3.7 rebounds.

Hopkins went on to play in the Continental Basketball Association before ending his professional career after stints in the Netherlands and Turkey. Prior to his collegiate experience. The San Mateo, California native, was a member of the 1987 California State Championship team with Mater Dei High School where he played alongside LeRon Ellis.

Hopkins earned his undergraduate degree in speech communications from Syracuse in 1993. He is joined in Seattle by his wife Tricia, and their sons, Michael Griffith Jr. and Grant Richard, and their daughter, Ella Grace.
