THE WEEKEND AHEAD

Washington (14-6, 5-1 Pac-12) puts their home unbeaten streak on the line, but it won't be the only significant streak they will try to continue when defending National Champions and currently ranked 7th **Oregon State** (16-5-1, 3-3) come to Seattle this weekend. The Huskies have the longest active streak of winning seven-straight Pac-12 series' dating back to 2018. The next longest streak is two. The Beavers have been a thorn in the Huskies' sides as OSU has won the last five season series'. All three games this weekend will be carried by the Pac-12 Network and its streaming platforms.

SERIES HISTORY VS. OREGON STATE

Oregon State holds the all-time series advantage over Washington 241-190-1. Last year, UW was 1-3 against the Beavs. They dropped two of three in Corvallis and were eliminated from the College World Series by OSU. UW dropped a double header, 16-1, 5-2, before winning game three, 8-4, in Corvallis. In the CWS, UW led 3-0 and 5-4 before a 4 hour, 31 minute rain delay. OSU returned from the delay on fire and ended up with a 14-5 win. The last series win for the Huskies was 2013 in Seattle. UW won a doubleheader vs. No. 5 OSU to start the series, before dropping the series finale. Lindsay Meggs is 10-19 in nine years against the Beavs, winning at least one game each year.

NOTEWORTHY

- **UW Rankings:** Collegiate Baseball News (26th); also receiving votes in USA Today Coaches Poll (31st)
- **Pac-12 Streak:** UW has won each of their last seven Pac-12 series, dating back to 2018. It is the longest current streak in the Conference. The next longest streak: two by UCLA and ASU. The last time UW dropped a Pac-12 series: April 20-22 at Cal.
- **Home Sweet Home:** The Huskies are a perfect 6-0 at Husky Ballpark after sweeping USC last weekend. It marks the third-straight year that UW has swept its Pac-12 home-opening series.
- **Kahle Tough To K:** Junior **Nick Kahle** ranks third in the Pac-12 with 23 walks (6 intentionally) and has struck out only 8 times. Kahle struck out Tuesday at Gonzaga after going the previous 8 games without any K's. During that same eight-game stretch, he walked 12 times.
- **Iron Man Kahle:** **Nick Kahle** has started 81 straight games, which is even more amazing considering his main position is catcher. He's made 77 of those starts at catcher, two in left field and two at designated hitter.
- **UW Pitchers In Control:** UW pitcher's are once again showing remarkable control on the mound. The Huskies lead the Pac-12 in fewest walks allowed (53), fewest wild pitches (6) and are tied for second lowest total of hit batters (10). They led the Pac-12 in all three of those categories in 2018, despite 8 extra post-season games.
- **Micheles Going K-rasy** **Chris Micheles** has been dominant out of the bullpen with 28 K's in 17 IP. His 14.8 strikeouts per 9 innings would rank 4th nationally if he qualified. He has struck out at least two batters in 9 of 13 appearances.
- **Pays To Steal:** The Huskies are 25-of-27 (93% success) in stolen base attempts this season, thanks in large part to Pac-12 leader **Braiden Ward** (17-for-19). Conversely, opponents are 5-for-10 (50% success) in stolen bases against the Huskies. **Chris Magruder** had a school record 43 in 1997 over 66 games. Ward led the entire Pac-12 as a freshman with 19 stolen bases, which broke Magruder's UW freshman record of 17 stolen bases.
- **Big Run Differentials:** In UW's 14 wins, they are averaging 9.1 runs per game, but in their six losses the Huskies are averaging 1.9 runs (+7.2). UW has scored nine or more runs seven times but conversely have been shutout twice, 1-0. They are averaging 6.7 runs in 20 games, holding opponents to 3.3 runs (+3.4).
- **Jones Milestones:** Junior **Jordan Jones** has passed the 150 strikeout and 200 inning plateaus for his career. He is just outside of the Huskies top-10 lists in both categories. He is 34 K's away from becoming the sixth player in UW history to go 200/200 in both categories.

MORE NOTES

- **Oh, Canada:** Not surprisingly since it's just over a 90 minute drive from Seattle to Canada, but two of three UW weekend starters hail from neighboring British Columbia. Freshman **David Rhodes** hails from White Rock, B.C., while Sunday starter **Josh Burgmann** is from Nanaimo, B.C. Additionally, midweek starter **Jack DeCooman** is from North Vancouver, B.C.
- **900th Conference Win:** With their win on March 16 vs. the Ducks, the Huskies secured their 900th win in conference action (dating back to 1916). They are the seventh current Pac-12 team to win 900 conference games.
- **Players of the Week:** The Huskies swept Pac-12 Player of the Week honors on March 5, marking the first time UW has done that since 2006. CF **Braiden Ward** was named Player of the Week after hitting .455 and stealing six bases in UW's sweep of Cal Poly, while RHP **Josh Burgmann** was Pitcher of the Week after striking out 10 in eight shutout innings on Sunday. The last Husky duo to sweep the awards were **Tim Lincecum** and **Zach Clem** (April 11, 2006).
- **Homer 'House:** Senior **Joe Wainhouse** had a streak of hitting a home run in 13-straight series, dating back to 2018, snapped March 8-10 at T-Mobile Park.
- **10K Run:** **Josh Burgmann** had at least 10 strikeouts in back-to-back games on March 3 (10 vs. Cal Poly) and Feb. 23 (11 vs. N. Colo). He is the first Husky to have consecutive 10-strikeout starts since **Tyler Davis** in 2015.
- **1-2 Punch:** **Braiden Ward** and **Ramon Bramasco** provided quite a 1-2 punch at the top of the order in UW's 25-8 win over N. Colorado on Feb. 20. The duo combined to go 8-for-11 at the plate, each collecting four hits, and nine runs. Ward scored five times and stole three bases, while Bramasco scored four runs and stole two bases.
- **Milestone Wins:** The 2019 season is the 119th year of Husky Baseball. The Huskies enter the year needing 32 wins to reach 2,000 in program history. With two wins in Pac-12 play, the Huskies will reach 900 in Conference action.
- **Season Of Firsts:** Washington had never been to a Super Regional, nor had they ever advanced to the Men's College World Series before 2018. In 1994 and 1997, before Super Regionals existed, the Huskies were one win away from advancing to the MCWS.
- **Five-Year Run:** Over the previous five years, the Huskies are 86-64-1, the second best record among Pac-12 teams, trailing only Oregon State. UW's three postseason appearances during that span are tied for second most in the Conference. The Huskies' run of success coincides with the opening of their new home field: Husky Ballpark, which houses state-of-the-art training facilities, a spacious locker room, coaches offices and team meeting rooms.
- **Iron Man:** **Nick Kahle** caught 536 out of a possible 553 innings (96.9%) behind the plate in 2018.
- **Steady Starter:** **Jordan Jones** tied a UW record in 2018 by making 18 starts on the hill. He equaled **Tim Lincecum's** total from 2004.
- **Mr. Dependable:** In his freshman season, **Stevie Emanuels** pitched in 34 games, the second most appearances on the hill by any Husky all-time.
- **Pac-12 Recognition:** Five Huskies earned All-Pac-12 honors in 2018, the most by UW since six earned honors in 1998. **Joe DeMers** (P), **Alex Hardy** (P), **Levi Jordan** (INF), **Nick Kahle** (C) and **Joe Wainhouse** (DH) were all named first team while **Mason Cerrillo** (OF) and **Jordan Jones** (P) earned honorable mention recognition.

WHO ARE THESE HUSKIES:

- The Huskies return 23 players who were on the 2018 roster and welcome in 10 newcomers.
- **Fielders:** Washington returns two All-Pac-12 players in senior designated hitter **Joe Wainhouse** and junior catcher **Nick Kahle**. Outfielder **Mason Cerrillo**, was honorable mention All-Pac-12. The Huskies return all three starting outfielders - Cerrillo, **Braiden Ward** and **Christian Jones** - plus their top option off the bench in **Kaiser Weiss**. Only one starter from their College World Series infield, first baseman **Jonathan Schiffer**, returns but there are still plenty of experienced options. **Ben Baird** made 31 starts mostly at third base, in 2018 and **Noah Hsue** made 26 starts at second base. Junior college transfer **Ramon Bramasco** will be the starter at shortstop.
- **Pitchers:** **Jordan Jones** was honorable mention All-Pac-12 and will be certainly joined in the rotation by **Josh Burgmann**. Sophomore **Jack DeCooman** and freshman **David Rhodes** will get the first shot to hammer down the third spot in the rotation. **Stevie Emanuels** is another option as a starter, but might prove to be too valuable in the bullpen after appearing in 34 games as a freshman and picking up eight wins. The Huskies have three other experienced bullpen arms in lefty **Chris Micheles** and righties **Dylan Lamb** and **Leo Nierenberg**, who will set the table for sophomore closer, **Jack Enger**, who was electric in summer ball and fall camp.

PAC-12 COACHES POLL:

The Huskies were picked to finish fifth out of 11 teams by the Pac-12 coaches in the pre-season poll. The Huskies have exceeded expectations lately. They finished third last year after being chosen seventh. In 2016, the Huskies were picked eighth and ended up second, while in 2014 they were picked 10th and also ended up second. UCLA was the pick to win the conference, garnering 8 first-place votes, while Stanford was picked second and received the other two first-place vote. Here is the complete order of finish predicted by the coaches: 1. UCLA, 2. Stanford, 3. Oregon State, 4. Arizona, 5. Washington, 6. Arizona State, 7. Oregon, 8. California, 9. USC, 10. Washington State and 11. Utah.

PRESEASON RECOGNITION:

The Huskies two returning All-Pac-12 players each garnered some preseason All-America recognition. Senior **Joe Wainhouse** was picked as second team All-American designated hitter by NCBWA, while junior catcher **Nick Kahle** was selected third team All-American by Collegiate Baseball.

SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM: Prior to Coach **Lindsay Meggs** arriving on campus, the grade point average of the baseball program rarely, if ever, reached 3.0 or higher. But the team has now accomplished a GPA of 3.0 or higher in 18 of the last 20 main session quarters (fall, winter, spring). They once again had another stellar quarter in the classroom, combining for a 3.16 grade point average during the fall and earning Most Improved Team among the department's 22 teams. In all, 22 baseball student-athletes recorded a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Six players -- **Riley Benedetti, Blake Burton, Mason Cerrillo, Albert Hsiao, Noah Hsue** and **Dylan Lamb** -- made the Dean's List for obtaining a GPA of 3.5 or higher. Cerrillo, a senior majoring in public and environmental health, led all Huskies with a 3.85 GPA during the fall quarter.

MAJOR LEAGUE CONNECTIONS: **Joe Wainhouse** is the son of former Major Leaguer, Dave Wainhouse, who spent seven seasons (spanning 1991-2000) as a pitcher with five different teams in the Majors. He broke in with Montreal in 1991 and ended his career with St. Louis. **Dylan Lamb** is the brother of former Husky and current Arizona Diamondbacks' All-Star third baseman, **Jake Lamb**.

DRAFT DAWGS: Since **Lindsay Meggs** took over at Washington in 2010, a total of 33 Huskies have heard their names called in the Draft. In 2018, the Huskies saw four picked: **AJ Graffanino** (8th Rd, Braves), **Willie MacIver** (9th, Rockies), **Joe DeMers** (11th, A's) and **Levi Jordan** (29th, Cubs). On the current roster, four Huskies were drafted prior to arriving on campus at Washington. Most recently, **David Rhodes** was picked in the 40th round of the 2018 draft by the Mariners. In 2016, three heard their names called during the draft: **Ben Baird** (20th, Indians), **Josh Burgmann** (30th, Cardinals) and **Christian Jones** (31st, Red Sox).

SQUAD BREAKDOWN: Among the 33 players on the 2019 Husky roster, there are 2 seniors, 13 juniors, 11 sophomores and 6 freshmen. The squad includes 23 returners and 10 newcomers (5 true freshmen, 1 redshirt-freshmen and 4 JC transfers). The roster includes players from four different states and Canada: 15 are from Washington, 13 are from California, 3 from British Columbia and one each from Arizona and Oregon. Washington's baseball roster has traditionally been heavily dominated by in-state players. In Meggs first season in 2010, 34 of 35 players hailed from Washington. Fourteen players from Washington come from west of the Cascade Mountains, (the western half of the state). Only **Riley Benedetti** (Yakima) comes from Eastern Washington.

In 2018, Meggs guided the Huskies to one of the most momentous years in the program's 118-year history. Under his leadership, the Huskies overcame numerous injuries and setbacks to come within three outs of winning the Pac-12 regular season title. UW would finish 35-26 and third in the Pac-12 at 20-10. The 20 wins in Conference action were the second most by a Husky team since 1997 and tied for third most in school history.

The team earned its third NCAA Regional bid over the last five seasons and Meggs would navigate the Huskies to their first-ever Super Regional, followed by the team's inaugural College World Series appearance.

He was awarded a two-year contract extension in January, 2019 that will keep him at UW through the 2025 season.

Meggs was instrumental in getting Husky Ballpark built and since moving into their new home five years ago, Washington has the second most wins and post-season appearances among Pac-12 schools. In his first nine years at UW, Meggs compiled a 265-239-1 (.526) record and earned Pac-12 Coach of the Year in 2014. Eighteen Huskies have been named to the Pac-12 All-Conference team and 33 have heard their names called during the Major League Baseball Draft.

Off the field, Meggs has helped the Huskies make perhaps their greatest strides in the classroom. Since his arrival, the UW Baseball team has consistently posted a 3.0 or higher grade point average, doing so in 18 of the last 20 quarters. In the most recent quarter this past fall, the baseball team earned the UW athletic department's most improved team with a 3.16 GPA and had 22 student-athletes obtain 3.0 or higher – six of which made the Dean's List.

In 2017, the Huskies were 28-26 overall and contended for a post-season berth until the very end. Meggs' Huskies were ranked as high as 10th during the year and were once again one of the nation's best defensive teams. The Huskies had a .982 fielding percentage to lead the Pac-12 and rank third nationally. They committed 36 errors during the season, the fewest by a Husky squad in the 40 years that defensive stats have been archived.

Meggs led the Huskies to the NCAA Regionals for the second time in 2016. The Huskies were picked eighth in the pre-season coaches poll, but exceeded expectations by finishing second in the Pac-12 with a 33-23 overall record, 17-13 in Conference action. They were the No. 3 seed at Vanderbilt and went 1-2, beating and eliminating the host Commodores in the tournament. Four Huskies earned All-Conference honors, including Pac-12 Pitcher of the Year, Troy Rallings, who was also a first team All-American and a Golden Spikes Award semifinalist.

Washington finished with a 29-25 overall record in 2015, one year after Meggs led the Huskies to one of their best seasons in school history. The team finished with a record of 41-17-1, 21-9 in Pac-12 play in 2014. It was the fifth time in UW history the Huskies achieved 40 or more wins, the first time since 2003. The team reached its highest rankings in school history, checking in at fifth in the Baseball America, Perfect Game and Collegiate Baseball polls during the season. For his efforts, Meggs was named the 2014 Pac-12 Coach of the Year. After being picked 10th out of 11 teams in the Pac-12 pre-season coaches poll, Meggs guided the Huskies to a second-place finish in the Conference, their best Pac-12 finish since 2004. It was the second most league wins in school history and most since the north and south merged in 1999. UW returned to the NCAA post-season for the first time in a decade.

In 2013, Washington finished 6th in the Pac-12 Conference with a 15-15 record and were 24-32 overall. They finished the season by winning 15 of 22, including series wins over World Series participant Oregon St., defending national champion Arizona, NCAA participant Arizona St. and a sweep over Washington St.

The 2012 season saw the Huskies make another big step forward, finishing the season with a 30-25 overall record, their best finish in half a decade.

In his first season, Meggs improved the Huskies' wins total over the prior year by five, finishing the season 28-28 overall. In his time in charge at the UW, Meggs has begun a turnaround with aggressive recruiting and in his efforts to make major improvements to the Huskies' facilities.

Meggs served as the Indiana State head coach from 2007-09. In 2009, he was named Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year after leading Indiana State to a 33-21 overall record and a 15-7 mark in MVC play, good enough to earn the No. 2 seed in the conference tournament.

After being picked to finish sixth in the league's preseason poll, Indiana State's second-place finish was its highest since 1998. Meggs' 2009 squad boasted nine players who earned some level of all-conference honors, including four first-team selections.

Prior to his three years in Terre Haute, Meggs spent 13 seasons (1994-2006) as the head coach at Chico State, where he posted a 538-228-4 overall record and won two NCAA Division II national championships, in 1997 and 1999. While at Chico State, Meggs' teams made it to the D-II World Series seven times and won eight conference crowns. Meggs was named the NCAA Division II Coach of the Year twice and was the regional coach and conference coach of the year seven times each.

Prior to his 13 seasons in Chico, Meggs was head coach at Long Beach City College for three seasons, going 75-51-1 with three trips to the playoffs during his term with the Vikings. He was also head coach at Oxnard College (1989-90) and was an assistant at Cal Lutheran (1988-89) and De Anza Junior College (1987-88).

Born in San Jose, Calif., and graduate of Saratoga (Calif.) High School, Meggs attended UCLA, where he played four seasons as a starting third baseman on the baseball team. He earned honorable mention All-Pac-10 in 1983, was drafted by the Brewers in 1983 and was signed by the Royals after being taken in the 15th round of the 1984 draft. Meggs earned his bachelor's degree from UCLA in 1985 and his master's in education-physical education from Asuza Pacific in 1992.

He and his wife, Teresa, have three children: Joe, Kelly and Jack. Joe wrapped up his UW baseball career in 2013 and is the team's Director of Operations, while Jack graduated in 2017 and was selected in the 10th round of the MLB Draft by the Oakland A's. Kelly completed a four-year basketball career at UC Irvine in 2014 and played on Washington's softball team in 2015.



The Huskies' amazing run to their first College World Series started at the NCAA Conway Regional, where they ran the table to reach their first-ever Super Regional. UW opened with a 7-1 win over UConn, followed by an 11-6 win over host Coastal Carolina and capped the tourney with a 9-6 win over UConn again.

In game one, Joe Wainhouse broke a 1-1 tie in the sixth inning with a home run and the Huskies put the game away with five runs in the eighth. Joe DeMers allowed a first inning run, but allowed just four hits over the next seven innings to earn the win.

Against the host Chanticleers, UW had a six-run second inning, capped by a Nick Kahle grand slam home run, and added two runs in the sixth and seventh innings to blow open a 7-6 advantage and advance to the winner's bracket.

They faced UConn for the right to move on and UConn jumped ahead 6-1 in the top of the third before UW scored five in the third to tie things up. Wainhouse, who was the MVP of the Regional, bashed his third home run of the weekend, to highlight the inning. AJ Graffanino broke a 6-6 tie in the 8th inning with a base-loaded, bases-clearing double that earned him the post-game Gatorade shower.

Washington traveled to Cal State Fullerton for its first ever endeavor into a Super Regional and by the end of the weekend, both teams were emotionally drained.

The Huskies drew first blood, pounding out 14 hits to win game one, 8-5. UW fell behind 2-0, but tied the game in the third and took the lead for good in the fifth with a pair of runs. They scored two more in the seventh, but Fullerton answered with three in its half of the inning to close the gap to one run, but Kaiser Weiss gave the Huskies some huge insurance with a two-run double in the ninth.

The Titans evened the score in game two, scoring a pair of runs in the second and never looking back.

Joe Wainhouse hit a pair of home runs, but they accounted for the Huskies' only two runs in a 5-2 loss, setting up a decisive game three.

Ace Joe DeMers was on the hill for the Huskies in the final game and he was dominant for eight innings. He was perfect until giving up a lead-off single in the seventh and he was backed offensively by solo home runs from Nick Kahle and Willie MacIver, plus another run in the sixth. He led 3-1 heading into the ninth when all kinds of craziness ensued.

Spinning a one-hitter, the Titans finally got to DeMers in the ninth. After a hit batter to start the inning, they would wedge four hits around a pair of out and score three times to take a 4-3 lead.

The Huskies would not roll over as a pair of freshmen teamed up to send the game to extra innings. Kaiser Weiss doubled and Jonathan Schiffer singled him home to send the game to the 10th.

With two outs in the 10th, Titans second baseman Hank LoForte would hit a solo home run to give his team the lead, but once again, the Huskies did not back down. Joe Wainhouse singled to start the inning, and pinch runner Jack Johnson moved all the way to third base when pitcher Brett Conine threw a bunt by Jordan into right field.

AJ Graffanino reached on an infield single that scored Johnson and after a fielding error at short by Sahid Valenzuela loaded the bases, Weiss calmly lifted a deep fly to left that scored Jordan, setting off a wild celebration between first and second base.

Mississippi State spoiled Washington's first-ever College World Series game, ending a thrilling, scoreless game with three, ninth-inning singles off Alex Hardy, the last of which, a drive from Luke Alexander that dropped beyond the UW's shallow outfield, scored Hunter Stovall, who had led off the ninth with a single.

The TD Ameritrade Park crowd of 24,758, the largest ever to watch a UW baseball game, was

treated to a top-class pitchers' duel that was heavy on tension and rock solid defense. Joe DeMers, the Husky ace, pitched seven and one-third innings, allowing seven hits and a walk with two strikeouts. He threw just 72 pitches, 55 of them strikes, and induced 14 groundouts (two of them double plays). MSU's Ethan Small also worked seven scoreless innings, allowing four hits and striking out five.

Washington's historic season came to end two days later as the Huskies were eliminated in a 14-5 loss to Pac-12 rival and eventual national champion Oregon State.

The game included a four-hour, 31-minute lightning and rain delay, which started suddenly in the top of the fifth with the Beavers batting. Prior to the delay, Washington led 3-0 and 5-4, but the Beavers (50-11-1) scored nine unanswered runs after the game restarted.
