PAC-12 FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

THE RANKINGS: Five Pac-12 teams are ranked in both the AP and Coaches preseason polls. It's the first time since 2016 that five Pac-12 teams were listed in the AP preseason Top 25 ... OREGON (11/13) has appeared in 11 of the last 12 AP preseason polls ... WASHINGTON (13/12) makes its fourth consecutive preseason appearance in the AP poll and 33rd overall ... UTAH (14/15) is making its first AP preseason poll since 2009 and third overall ... STANFORD (25/23) has appeared in the AP preseason Top 25 for the ninth consecutive year. The Cardinal are one of six teams to have appeared in the preseason AP poll in each of the last nine seasons, joining Alabama, Ohio State, Oklahoma, LSU and Georgia ... WASHINGTON STATE (23/21) makes its fourth appearance in the AP preseason poll and its second in the last three years.

THE RETURNEES: A total of 174 starters, who started at least half of his team's games or a majority of games at a specific position, return to Pac-12 football squads in 2019. That's out of a possible 288 (including placekickers and punters) for an average of 14.5 starters returning per team. OREGON returns the most with 19, followed by UCLA (18), ARIZONA (17) and ARIZONA STATE (17). STANFORD returns the fewest starters with nine. Among those returning starters are 11 first-team and 13 second-team All-Pac-12 performers. Eight of the 12 squads return at least seven starters on offense, and seven squads return at least seven starters on defense. Here are the numbers:

PAC-12 RUNNING BACKS LEAD THE WAY: The Pac-12 has six returning running backs that rushed for 1,000 or more yards last season. ARIZONA STATE's **Eno Benjamin** set a school single-season record with 1,642 yards. OREGON STATE's **Jermar Jefferson** posted the most rushing yards by a freshman during the 2018 season with 1,380 yards.

WHAT'S HIS TACKLING FUEL?: CALIFORNIA LB **Evan Weaver** posted 159 tackles last season, tops among all FBS returnees. He's played in 36 of a possible 37 games, including 17 starts, and has compiled 230 tackles in his career. He needs 29 tackles to crack Cal's all-time top 10 list.

OUR FEARLESS LEADER: COLORADO head coach **Mel Tucker** begins his first season with the Buffaloes. Tucker was the Defensive Coordinator at Georgia from 2016-18. While Tucker is the only first-year head coach in the Pac-12, eight coaches have been at the helm of their current programs in the Pac-12 for four or fewer seasons.

AUSSIE AUSSIE AUSSIE, OI OI OI: The Pac-12 will feel the impact of the Aussie invasion as six punters from Down Under will take the field - Colorado's **James Stefanou** (32 years old), UCLA's **Wade Lees** (31), USC's **Ben Griffiths** (27), Washington's **Joel Whitford** (26), Utah's **Ben Lennon** (24), Oregon's **Tom Snee** (20).

FWAA FRESHMAN ALL-AMERICA WATCH LIST: QB **Jayden Daniels** (Arizona State), WR **Jalen Curry** (Arizona), DE **Drake Jackson** (USC), OL **Sean Rhyen** (UCLA), WR **Dimitri Stanley** (Colorado), DB **Mark Perry** (Colorado), WR **Mycah Pittman** (Oregon), DE **Kayvon Thibodeaux** (Oregon), DB **Verone McKinley III** (Oregon), DB **Cameron Williams** (Washington), P **Ryan Sanborn** (Stanford) and P **Ben Lennon** (Utah) were named by the Football Writer's Association of America to its Freshman All-America Watch List.

HALL OF FAMERS: Two former Pac-12 student-athletes and one coach will be among the 15 inductees into the College Football Hall of Fame Class - Quarterback **Jake Plummer** (Arizona State), Safety **Troy Polamalu** (USC) and coach **Dennis Erickson** (Washington State, Oregon State and Arizona State).

AROUND THE PAC-12

UCLA (0-0) at Cincinnati (0-0)
Thurs., Aug. 29 • 7:00 pm ET • ESPN • #UCLAvsCIN

UCLA: UCLA will celebrate its 100th anniversary with a year-long university-wide Centennial Celebration ... UCLA racked up over 400 yards of offense in 6 of last 8 games, including last 4 straight of 2018 ... Senior RB **Joshua Kelley** ranked 9th in NCAA rushing yds/g (113.0 avg) - 5th straight season as head coach that Chip Kelly has produced a top 10-ranked rushing leader ... UCLA played 21 true freshmen in the 2018 season to set a new school record - the old mark was 18 in 2013 ... The Bruins have won their last three games played in the eastern time zone (2014 at Virginia, 2009 vs. Temple in EagleBank Bowl, 2009 at Tennessee).

Kent State (0-0) at ARIZONA STATE (0-0)
Thurs., Aug. 29 • 7:00 pm PT • P12N • #KSUvsASU

ARIZONA STATE: FR QB **Jayden Daniels** has been named to the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) Freshman All-American Watch List. A four-year varsity starter at Cajon High School, Daniels threw for a CIF-Southern Section record 14,007 yards and 170 TDs during a historic four-year career at Cajon High School, adding 3,645 rushing yards on 562 attempts and 41 rushing TDs showing off his unique athleticism. He finished the 2018 campaign completing 287-of-406 (70.7%) passes for 4,515 yards and 60 TDs compared to just four interceptions. Daniels will be the first true freshman to start a season-opener for the Sun Devils.

UTAH (0-0) at BYU (0-0)
Thurs., Aug. 29 • 8:15 pm PT • ESPN • #UTAHvsBYU

UTAH: The Utes open the season on the road at Holy War rival BYU. It's the first time in the 100-game series history that the two teams open the season against one another. Utah has won the last eight meetings ... FR P **Ben Lennon** is continuing the tradition of an Aussie punter donning uniform number 33 for the Utes. Previously, No. 33 was worn by All-Americans Tom Hackett (2012-15) and Mitch Wishnowsky (2016-18) ... SR RB **Zack Moss** amassed 1,096 yards and 11 TDs in just nine starts during an injury-shortened 2018 season. With 2,651 career rushing yards, Moss enters his final season ranked fourth in school history. Moss needs just 568 yards this season to set the Utah career mark (currently held by Eddie Johnson with 3,219 yards from 1984-88).

Colorado State (0-0) vs. COLORADO (0-0)
Fri., Aug. 30 • 8:00 pm MT • ESPN • #CSUvsCOLO

COLORADO: The Mel Tucker era gets underway Friday night ... CU's entire roster has just 179 total career starts. It's the fewest returning starts for any Colorado team since the advent of the 11-game regular season in 1971 ... QB **Steven Montez** has completed 43-of-54 passes for 540 yards with 5 TDs/3 INTs in two season openers against Colorado State ... Montez is fourth on CU's all-time passing list with 6,841 yards and third all-time in total offense with 7,648 yards ... JR P **James Stefanou** (32 years old) is the second-oldest collegian in the game. However, he may not be the oldest to see action on Friday night as that honor could belong to Colorado State DB Joshua Griffin (33).

Oklahoma State (0-0) at OREGON STATE (0-0)
Fri., Aug. 30 • 7:30 pm PT • FS1 • #OKSTvsOSU

OREGON STATE: It's just the second time in the last 28 years that Oregon State will open the season at home against a Power 5 opponent. The last time the Beavers did so was vs. Wisconsin to kick off the 2012 season, a 10-7 OSU win. Oregon State did open the 2007 slate at home against Utah, but the Utes were a member of the Mountain West Conference (Group of 5 conference) ... SR QB **Jake Lutton**, who gained a sixth-year by the NCAA, enters the 2019 season with 12 career games (9 starts) under his belt. He's completed 223-of-359 passes for 2,513 yards and 14 TDs ... SR OT **Blake Brandel** sits atop the depth chart at left tackle. It should be no surprise as he's started each of Oregon State's 36 games played during his career.

Eastern Washington (0-0) at WASHINGTON (0-0)
Sat., Aug. 31 • 12:00 pm PT • P12N • #EWUvsUW

WASHINGTON: Washington has won 14 consecutive home games, the fourth-longest such active streak in FBS. And has won 18 home, non-conference games in a row ... Washington has won 32 games over the last three years (32-9), the highest three-year wins total in UW history and the only time that the Huskies have posted double-digit wins in three straight seasons ... The Huskies have tabbed RS JR QB **Jacob Eason** as the season-opening starter. The transfer from Georgia where he played in all 13 games, starting 12, completing 204-of-370 passes for 2,430 yards and 16 TDs ... UW's defense has led the Pac-12 in both scoring defense and total defense each of the last four years, but will only have two returning starters on that side of the ball this season.

Northwestern (0-0) at STANFORD (0-0)
Sat., Aug. 31 • 1:00 pm PT • FOX • #NUvsSTAN

STANFORD: SR QB **K.J. Costello** is coming off a 2018 campaign where he completed 269-of-413 passes for 3,540 yards and 29 TDs. It was the second-most passing yards in a season in school history, as were his seven 300-yard passing games ... The Cardinal have what appears to be the nation's most challenging schedule. It opens with Big Ten West Champion Northwestern, then open league play at USC, followed by another road game at UCF, then back home vs. preseason No. 11 Oregon. Add in its third non-conference opponent in Notre Dame and Stanford's three non-league foes were a combined 33-7 last season ... Stanford has won eight or more games in each of the last 10 seasons, averaging 10.2 wins over that span.

UC Davis (0-0) at CALIFORNIA (0-0)
Sat., Aug. 31 • 3:30 pm PT • P12N • #UCDvsCAL

CALIFORNIA: The Golden Bears owns a 9-0 series record against opening day foe UC Davis. Davis enters the game ranked No. 5 in the FCS Coaches preseason Top 25 ... Cal has won its last five consecutive home openers and is 15-2 in its home openers dating back to 2002 ... SR LB **Evan Weaver** was named a 2019 preseason first team All-American (Athlon), and a second-team All-American (AP, The Athletic, PFF, Sports Illustrated). He is the first Cal player to earn first-team preseason honors since Jahvid Best in 2009 ... Cal's experienced defensive backfield has taken on the nickname of the "Takers" after the 2010 movie with the same name. A group of six players - SR NB/CB **Traveon Beck**, RS JR CB **Camryn Bynum**, RS SR S **Ashtyn Davis**, SR CB/NB **Josh Drayden**, JR CB **Elijah Hicks** and SR S **Jaylinn Hawkins** - have started 99 games in the defensive backfield over the past two seasons. The defensive backs played a huge role in Cal's defensive success in 2018 when the Bears led the Pac-12 and finished in the top 10 nationally in interceptions (21, No. 2), defensive touchdowns (5, No. T4), turnovers gained (28, No. T6) and passing yards allowed (175.1 ypg, No. 9).

Auburn (0-0) vs. OREGON (0-0)
Sat., Aug. 31 • 6:30 pm CT • ABC • #AUvsUO

OREGON: Oregon has won seven consecutive season openers ... It has won 12 of its last 15 meetings when opening the season against a Power 5 opponent ... During the 2018 campaign, SR QB **Justin Herbert** became the fifth player in program history to throw for 3,000 yards (3,151), while RB **CJ Verdell** was just the third freshman in program history to hit the 1,000-yard plateau (1,018) on the ground. The Ducks are one of four FBS teams (Clemson, Liberty, Memphis) that return a 3,000-yard passer and 1,000-yard rusher. Its the second time in program history Oregon has returned a 3,000-yard passer and 1,000-yard rusher (2014 - Marcus Mariota & Byron Marshall).

New Mexico State (0-0) at WASHINGTON STATE (0-0)
Sat., Aug. 31 • 7:00 pm P • P12N • #NMSUvsWSU

WASHINGTON STATE: The Cougars have won eight or more games in each of the last four seasons ... RS SR QB **Anthony Gordon** was tagged the season-opening starter for the Cougars. Gordon appeared in just two games last season, completing 3-of-5 passes for 17 yards. He'll have the benefit of throwing to four different receivers who each caught at least 50 passes last season - JR WR **Tay Martin** (69 rec/685 yds/8 TDs), SR WR **Dezmon Patmon** (61 rec/816 yds/5 TDs), SO RB **Max Borghi** (53 rec/374 yds/4 TDs) and RS SR WR **Easop Winston Jr.** (52 rec/654 yds/8 TDs) ... Four starters return along the offensive line where the Cougars have produced an All-American each of the last four years.

Fresno State (0-0) at USC (0-0)
Sat., Aug. 31 • 7:30 pm PT • ESPN • #FRESvsUSC

USC: This will be the first collegiate game in the historic and iconic Los Angeles stadium that just underwent a \$315-million renovation (including new seats and aisles and a new south-side tower) and has been renamed United Airlines Field at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum ... The Trojans are unranked to open the season for the first time in 18 years ... SO QB **JT Daniels** fended off 3 contenders to retain his starting job and he'll have one of the nation's best receiving corps at his disposal: WRs **Michael Pittman Jr.**, **Tyler Vaughns**, **Amon-Ra St. Brown**, **Velus Jones Jr.** and **Devon Williams**, who combined for 187 receptions and 17 TDs in 2018.

ARIZONA (0-1)
BYE

ARIZONA: Arizona has an open date following the week zero loss at Hawai'i. SR QB **Khalil Tate** threw for a career-high 361 yards and rushed for 108 yards in the 45-38 loss at Hawai'i. It was the fifth time he's thrown for 300+ yards and the seventh time he's rushed for 100+ yards (first since Nov. 11, 2017), but the first where he accomplished both in the same game.
