GAME STORYLINES

- **THE SERIES.** BYU and Washington are meeting for the 11th time in the series. The Cougars trail 4-6 but are 3-1 in Provo. Last year the Huskies rolled to a 35-7 win in Seattle. The last time the game was in Provo was 2010 when BYU defeated Washington 23-17, a team led by former Cougar quarterback and then head coach of the Huskies, Steve Sarkisian.
- **PAC-12.** The Cougars are facing the third of three Pac-12 teams on the schedule with No. 21/22 Washington this week. After falling to No. 15 Utah in the season opener, BYU bounced back to beat No. 24 USC last week. BYU is 74-128-6 against the current Pac-12.
- **RANKED TEAMS.** BYU is the only FBS team to play three ranked opponents in the first four games of the season in 2019, and 1 of just 16 to have played at least two ranked teams. Washington comes in ranked No. 21 in the Coaches Poll and 22 in the AP Poll. USC was ranked No. 24 when the Cougars knocked them off and lost to No. 15 Utah in the opener. BYU is 1 of only 9 teams with a win over a ranked opponent this season.
- **WEEKLY HONORS.** Offensive coordinator Jeff Grimes was named the Athlon Sports Offensive Coordinator of the Week while defensive lineman Lorenzo Fauatea was named to the Pro Football Focus National Team of the Week. Kicker Jake Oldroyd earned a Lou Groza Star of the Week honor and defensive back Dayan Ghanwoloku received two weekly awards following his performance against USC. The senior was named the College Sports Madness Defensive Player of the Week among the independent teams and also made the Paul Hornung Honor Roll, awarded to the most versatile player. - **COLLEGE FOOTBALL 150.** 2019 represents the 150th year of college football, celebrating the first game played between Rutgers and Princeton, Nov. 6, 1869. Throughout the 2019 season, watch for special ways college football programs honor the rich tradition that is college football, starting with a uniform patch the Cougars will wear each game and the CFB150 logo as the 50-yard markers on the field.

At the discretion of the visiting team, opponent interviews will be conducted in the Blue Zone, near the opponent's locker room located on northwest end of the stadium. Coach Sitake and select players will be available following the NCAA mandatory cooling off period. Members of the media are invited to move from the press box down to the field and to the press room four minutes prior to the ending of the game. A basic transcript of Sitake's comments from the postgame press conference will be provided with additional player quotes upon availability. For road games, BYU will conduct interviews outside the locker room or in a location designated by the host school.

EASON THROWS 3 TDS, NO. 23 UW BEATS HAWAII 52-20

SEATTLE (AP) Jacob Eason threw a 47-yard touchdown pass to Hunter Bryant on the third play of the game and added two more and No. 23 Washington rebounded from a loss with a 52-20 romp over Hawaii on Saturday night.

Eason and the Huskies (2-1) overwhelmed the Rainbow Warriors, taking a 21-0 lead in less than 9 minutes. Eason was 18 of 25 for 262 yards, Richard Newton had three short TD runs, and Washington quickly bounced back from last week's 20-19 home loss to California in its Pac-12 opener.

While the final numbers look impressive, Washington did what was expected. Other than showing it could respond to the adversity of last week's setback, answers about how good the Huskies are will come the next three weeks with games at BYU, vs. USC and at Stanford.

Hawaii (2-1) was looking to beat three Pac-12 opponents in a season for the first time in school history. The Warriors opened with wins over Arizona and Oregon State at home, but the first trip away from the island was a quick slap of reality.

Cole McDonald was 22 of 35 for 218 yards and a touchdown, but was also intercepted three times.

Hunter Bryant's TD catch was the beginning of Washington's early onslaught. Myles Bryant came up with Washington's first forced turnovers on Hawaii's second offensive play, stepping in front of McDonald's pass for the first of his two interceptions in the first half. Washington made it 14-0 moments later on Sean McGrew's 22-yard TD run, and it was 21-0 when Puka Nacua's first career catch was a 28-yard TD on a perfectly placed throw from Eason.

Eason's best TD throw was his last one, hitting Aaron Fuller on a 37-yard TD early in the second quarter, placing the deep post ball just out of the reach of the defensive back.

It wasn't until nearly halftime before Hawaii's offensive finally woke up. After going scoreless on their first six possessions, the Warriors scored on back-to-back series on either side of halftime. Miles Reed recovered his own fumble in the end zone shortly before half for Hawaii's first points. Reed scored on a 7-yard TD run on the opening drive of the second half.

McDonald hit Cedric Byrd II on a 4-yard TD pass late in the third quarter to pull Hawaii within 38-20 but that was as close as the Warriors would get. Newton's second TD run early in the fourth quarter pushed the Huskies lead back to 25.

THE TAKEAWAY

Hunter Bryant has quickly developed into Eason's favorite target. The tight end had five catches for 115 yards. His most important may have been a 20-yard reception on third-down late in the third quarter after Hawaii had scored 20 straight points.

UP NEXT

The Huskies hit the road for the first time this season, traveling to BYU next Saturday.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR NINE

The 12-game independent schedule for 2019 features seven teams that played in a bowl game in 2018. Three games are against Pac-12 opponents. BYU also takes on the SEC's Tennessee on the road and features games against Mountain West foes Utah State, Boise State and San Diego State. Independents UMass and Liberty also appear on the schedule along with Mid-American favorite Toledo, USF from the American and FCS level Idaho State.

The Cougars will host six home games including Utah, USC, Washington, Boise State, Liberty and Idaho State. BYU is on the road against Tennessee, Toledo, South Florida, Utah State, UMass and San Diego State.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 63,470 after various refurbishments. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands. BYU's winning percentage at LaVell Edwards Stadium is ranked No. 14 among teams playing in their current stadium.

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates more than 400 missions around the world in over 150 nations speaking more than 160 languages. More than 67,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours — seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples) — teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

About 65 percent of the current team has served a mission. Members of the team have served in 28 different countries and six of the seven continents around the globe. More than 30 members of the team (previous signees or on roster) are currently serving in the mission field.

The Polynesian Islands have become a hotbed for recruiting in recent years, but BYU has been one of the pioneers in bringing these players from Tonga, Samoa, the Hawaiian Islands and all of Polynesia to the forefront of college football since the early 1950s. About 40 members of the current roster are of Polynesian descent.

Some of BYU's most celebrated and decorated players have come from the Pacific islands, including All-Americans, national record holders, players who have gone on to compete in the NFL and now, several members of BYU's current coaching and support staff.

Kalani Sitake was named BYU's 14th head coach on Dec. 19, 2015, becoming the first Tongan head football coach in the NCAA. His staff includes Polynesians Ilaisa Tuiaki, Fesi Sitake, Nu'u Tafisi, Jack Damuni, Jasen Ah You, Alema Fitsemanu, Vince Feula, Matt Ah You and Harvey Unga.

BYU UPSETS NO. 24 USC 30-27 IN OVERTIME

PROVO, Utah – Dayan Ghanwoloku's interception in overtime sealed BYU football's 30-27 win over No. 24 USC at LaVell Edwards Stadium on Saturday.

In a game that was tied four different times and had four lead changes, both BYU (2-1) and USC (2-1) scored 10 points in the final 11 minutes of the game to force overtime at the end of regulation.

The Cougars started with the ball on offense to begin the overtime period. After a Trojan defender broke up a pass intended for Micah Simon in the end zone on third down, kicker Jake Oldroyd kicked a 43-yard field goal to give BYU the lead 30-27.

Facing a third down, USC quarterback Kedon Slovis threw a pass into coverage that was tipped into the air by linebacker Kavika Fonua and caught by a diving Ghanwoloku for the interception, BYU's third takeaway of the game to win it.

Zach Wilson completed 20 of his 33 pass attempts for 280 yards and a touchdown as he connected with 12 different receivers on the day. The quarterback also added a 16-yard rushing touchdown, his first of the season. Gunner Romney led all pass-catchers with 54 receiving yards, followed by Simon with 48 yards.

Ty'Son Williams recorded a career-high 99 yards on the ground on 19 rushing attempts. Oldroyd made three of four field goal attempts with a long of 43 yards while also averaging 48.2 yards per punt and placing two inside the 20-yard line and one 56-yarder.

Payton Wilgar, Isaiah Kaufusi and Ghanwoloku each recorded an interception. Fonua led the team with 13 total tackles, followed by Ghanwoloku and Wilgar with each posting nine stops apiece. Khyiris Tonga and Lorenzo Fauatea each recorded sacks.

3 The Cougars finished the game against USC with three interceptions. Linebackers Payton Wilgar and Isaiah Kaufusi and defensive back Dayan Ghanwoloku all grabbed interceptions in the game. Wilgar tallied the first of his career while Kaufusi recorded his third returning it 10-yards. Both were deep in USC territory and resulted in scoring drives for BYU. Ghanwoloku grabbed the third interception to end the game in overtime.

6 Six different players on BYU's defense recorded career tackling highs or tied their career high against USC. Kavika Fonua completed the game with a career high of 13 total tackles with nine solo stops, Payton Wilgar tallied a career high nine total tackles, five solo stops and four assisted tackles while Max Tooley had eight total tackles and six solo stops. THE BYU DEFENSE

- **NO FLY ZONE.** BYU's 2019 pass defense has allowed an average of 187.7 yards per game. USC came into the game against the Cougars averaging 324.5 in its first two games and BYU held them below that average, with 281 yards from the air raid squad. The Cougars also held Utah and Tennessee to below their season averages.
- **TOUGH SCORE.** The defense is making it tough for teams to put points on the board in the red zone, allowing just 72.43 percent of drives getting inside the 20s to score, ranking No. 35 nationally. Teams are scoring touchdowns at a rate of just 54.55 percent against the Cougars inside the red zone.
- **CONVERSION DEFENSE.** BYU's third down conversion defense has been off to a good start, allowing teams to convert just 31.82 percent on third down. The Cougars are ahead of their 2018 clip when they held teams to 37.37 percent on third down.

Kalani Sitake (pronounced kah-lah-nee see-tah-kay) enters his fourth season overseeing the BYU football program in 2019.

A former Cougar running back (1994, 1997-2000), Sitake is the 14th head coach in BYU history and just the fourth since 1972, when Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards took over the program. Sitake is the first former player under Edwards to be named head coach at BYU.

Named BYU's head coach on December 19, 2015, Sitake returned to his alma mater with 15 years of coaching experience, including seven seasons as a defensive coordinator and four years as an assistant head coach. He came to BYU from Oregon State, where he served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator in 2015 under head coach Gary Andersen. Sitake spent the prior 10 seasons at the University of Utah under head coach Kyle Whittingham. He started at Utah in 2005 as the linebackers coach and was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2009 before also being named assistant head coach in 2012. He coached 12 all-conference honorees at Utah, including Morris Trophy winners Star Lotulelei (2011) and Nate Orchard (2014).

During his career, Sitake has helped mentor 23 NFL Draft picks, including BYU linebackers Sione Takitaki and Fred Warner and running back Jamaal Williams. Takitaki was a third-round pick of the Cleveland Browns in this year's draft and Warner was one of the league's top rookies after being taken in the third round in 2018 by the San Francisco 49ers. Williams, who was selected in the fourth round by the Green Bay Packers in the 2017 NFL Draft, finished his BYU career as the school's all-time leading rusher after averaging the nation's fifth-best per-game totals at 137.5 yards per outing for Sitake's Cougars in 2016.

Sitake has coached in 10 bowl games during his career and has been on the winning side in nine of those 10 contests, including a 2-0 mark as a head coach. BYU is coming off a 49-18 victory over Western Michigan in last year's Famous Idaho Potato Bowl and defeated Wyoming 24-21 in the 2016 Poinsettia Bowl.

Sitake began his coaching career in 2001 as the defensive backs and special teams coach at Eastern Arizona before becoming a defensive graduate assistant at BYU in 2002 under Gary Crowton. Sitake then joined the staff at Southern Utah where he coached running backs, tight ends and offensive line during the 2003 and 2004 seasons.

He began his BYU playing career in 1994 prior to serving a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Oakland, California. After returning and redshirting in 1997, Sitake was a three-year starter at fullback for the Cougars from 1998-2000 under Edwards. A team captain as a senior, Sitake's last game as a player was also the last game coached by the legendary Edwards, who was a great mentor for Sitake.

Born in Nuku'alofa, Tonga, and raised in Laie, Hawai'i and Provo, Utah, Sitake is the nation's first FBS head football coach of Tongan descent. He graduated from BYU in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in English. Sitake and his wife Timberly have three children, Skye, Sadie and Kelaokalani (KK).

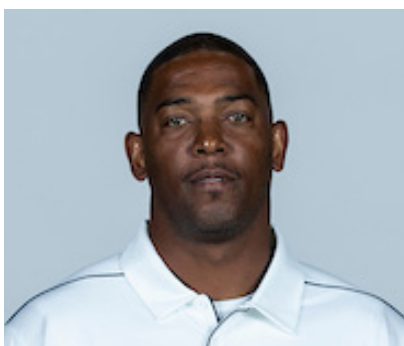
