WASHINGTON HUSKIES

CAL HEADS NORTH FOR PAC-12 OPENER

RECENT SUCCESS VS. THE HUSKIES

- Cal has enjoyed some success vs. Washington over the past four years, despite the fact that UW has ranked in the nation's top 15 heading into the game in three of the last four meetings.
- Cal enjoyed a 12-10 victory last season as the Bears pulled the upset over No. 15/13 Washington at California Memorial Stadium as Evan Weaver had the defining interception return for a touchdown, to give Cal its only touchdown.
- Cal's last win at Husky Stadium came in 2015, when the Bears won, 30-24. It was the first victory for Cal in Seattle since 2005.
- Cal has lost three straight Pac-12 openers, its most recent win was vs. Washington in 2015.
- Trey Turner III was the only current Bear to play in the 2015 game against Washington.

EARLY PAC-12 OPENER

- Cal is 11-4 in their past 15 openers away from California Memorial Stadium, including five straight wins. That five-game win streak has come against BYU, UNC, Hawaii (in Sydney, Australia), Texas and Northwestern.
- This is the earliest Pac-12 opener for Cal since they won a week two matchup with Pac-12 newcomer Colorado on Sept. 10, 2011, 36-33, in overtime.
- Cal is 3-0 in week two Pac-12 matchups in the past 15 years. They defeated Washington State, 66-3, on Sept. 6, 2008. The last time the Bears played Washington in week two was Cal's 56-17 win in Seattle on Sept. 10, 2005.

CAL OFFENSE GENERATES EXPLOSIVE PLAYS IN OPENER

- Cal opened the season with seven explosive plays of 20+ yards vs. UC Davis. That was more than the Bears had in all but one game during the 2018 season (Oregon State, 8).
- With an emphasis on creating more explosive plays, redshirt sophomore Chase Garbers responded to begin his second year at the helm of the Bears' offense.
- Garbers had a career-high 238 yards passing in the season-opener vs. UC Davis and notched three completions of 30+ yards. He had a total of five passes of 30+ yards throughout 2018.
- Garbers' five completions of 20+ yards vs. UC Davis was the most he's had in a game at Cal.
- He ranks 18th nationally in yards per completion at 14.88.
- Sophomore Christopher Brown Jr. rushed 36 times for 197 yards and a touchdown. He ranks third in the NCAA and first in the Pac-12 in rushing yards.
- The 197 yards was the most by a Cal player in their first start in recorded history and the 20th-best rushing performance in school history.
- Michigan transfer Keko Crawford debuted with a notable performance against UC Davis, catching three passes for 84 yards and two touchdowns.
- Crawford is tied for fifth in the NCAA and first in the Pac-12 with two receiving touchdowns. He ranks 26th in the NCAA and third in the Pac-12 with 12 points.
- Cal spread the ball around with 10 receivers catching a pass in the season opener.

EVAN WEAVER NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

- With 11 tackles vs. UC Davis, ILB Evan Weaver now has eight straight games with 10+ tackles.

- Weaver was named a 2019 preseason first-team All-American (Athlon), and a second-team All-American (AP, The Athletic, PFF, Sports Illustrated). He is the first Cal player to earn first-team preseason honors since Jahvid Best in 2009.

- He has been named to the preseason watch lists for the Lott IMPACT Trophy, Chuck Bednarik Award, Butkus Award and the Bronko Nagurski Trophy.

- Weaver is the nation's leading returning tackler after collecting 159 tackles in 2018. He ranked sixth in the country last season. He is also the nation's returning leader in solo tackles with 88 last season, a mark that ranked fourth in the country.

- Weaver's 159 tackles last season tied for second on Cal's all-time single-season list with David Ortega (1989). He only trailed Hardy Nickerson's 167 tackles in 1985.

- Weaver is Cal's active career leader in tackles (241) and is just 18 tackles shy of joining the school's all-time top 10 list after collecting 11 vs. UC Davis.

- He ranks 14th amongst all active NCAA student-athletes with 241 career tackles.

TAKERS HIGHLIGHT DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT

- Cal recorded eight pass breakups in the opener vs. UC Davis, with five of those coming from five different members of the secondary.

- The eight PBUs is the most for Cal since it had eight against Oregon State on Nov. 21, 2011.

- Cal held UC Davis well below its season averages from last year. In the opener Davis scored 13 points and had 264 yards of offense, after averaging 36.7 points and 488.9 yards per game in 2018.

- Cal's experienced defensive backfield has taken on the nickname of the "Takers" after the 2010 movie with the same name. A group of six players - senior NB/CB Traveon Beck, redshirt junior CB Camryn Bynum, redshirt senior S Ashtyn Davis, senior CB/NB Josh Drayden, junior CB Elijah Hicks and senior S Jaylinn Hawkins - have started 104 games in the defensive backfield since the start of 2017.

- Four members of the team - Bynum, Davis, Hawkins and Hicks - have garnered 2019 preseason recognition; Davis was named honorable mention preseason All-American by PFF, while both he and Bynum are preseason first-team All-Pac-12. Hawkins is a second-team All-Conference honoree by multiple publications while Hicks is a third-team member according to Phil Steele.

- Cal's secondary was ranked among the top eight in the nation in the preseason by three different media outlets. Phil Steele lists the unit second, while the Golden Bears are ranked fourth nationally according to Athlon and eighth by Lindy's.

- Hawkins is tied for sixth in the NCAA amongst all active players with seven career interceptions.

- Bynum has four interceptions and 19 PBU's in his career. The 23 passes defended is tied for 23rd amongst all active NCAA student-athletes.

- Davis tied for 16th in the country and third in the Pac-12 with four interceptions in 2018.

Davis is also a four-time All-American in the hurdles for Cal's track & field team and won a Pac-12 Championship in the 110m hurdles and two MPSF Championships in the 60m hurdles.

LINEBACKER UNIT STANDS OUT BEYOND WEAVER

- Cal's linebacker unit was ranked among the nation's best this preseason as Athlon rates them No. 7 and Phil Steele has them ranked eighth.
- OLB Tevin Paul and newcomer ILB Kuony Deng were the other players to join Evan Weaver in receiving preseason honors with Paul a second-team preseason All-Pac-12 pick of Lindy's and fourth-team selection of Athlon while Deng picked up a fourth-team nod from Phil Steele.
- Deng led the team with 12 tackles against UC Davis, while also notching two quarterback hurries and two pass breakups. The two pass breakups rank 15th in the country and third in the Pac-12. Deng also ranks 11th in solo tackles (9) and 21st in tackles in the country.
- OLB Cameron Goode played his first game in 364 days as he took the field against UC Davis and he made his presence felt off the edge with four tackles, one sack and one quarterback hurry. It was his first appearance since getting injured in Cal's opener vs. North Carolina last year.
- OLB Joseph Ogunbajo had a career-high two tackles in a reserve role vs. UC Davis.

DEFENSIVE LINE BLENDS YOUTH AND EXPERIENCE

- Cal returns three players that saw significant time last season on the defensive line. Luc Bequette has moved to nose guard in Cal's base and started 2019 strongly with five tackles, one sack, two TFLs and a forced fumble.
- Bequette was a second-team preseason All-Pac-12 selection by the Pac-12 media.
- Zeandae Johnson and Lone Toailoa combined for 27 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks last year as part of the defensive line rotation.
- Johnson had three tackles and a quarterback hurry vs. UC Davis while Toailoa picked up a tackle.
- The 2019 edition of the defensive line will also feature a good amount of youth as redshirt freshman JH Tevis, and true freshmen Brett Johnson and Braxten Croteau made the team's initial depth chart after impressing throughout fall camp. Johnson and Croteau debuted against UC Davis with Johnson tallying two tackles and a tackle for loss in the opener.

RETURN OF THE RETURN GAME

- In addition to playing safety, Ashtyn Davis is one of the nation's best kick returners. The redshirt senior is on the watch list for the Paul Hornung Award as the nation's most versatile player.
- Davis ranked 17th in the country and second in the Pac-12 in kick returns with an average of 26.2 yards per return. He also has two career touchdowns (1 interception, 1 kick return).
- He averaged 22.0 yards per return vs. UC Davis
- Nikko Remigio took over punt return duties last season.
- Remigio returned three punts for 42 yards in the season opener vs. UC Davis, including a long of 28 yards. That mark ranks 14th in the NCAA and third in the Pac-12.

KICKING GAME COHESION

- Steven Coutts was one of the best punters in the nation last year as he led the country in trapping opponents inside their own 20-yard line. Coutts pinned opponents 37 times with only two touchbacks. - He was named a honorable mention All-Pac-12 selection last year and is on the 2019 watch list for the Ray Guy Award as the nation's top punter.
- Coutts graduated from Louisiana in 2.5 years with a degree in economics and came to Cal as a graduate transfer. He earned a master's in education from UC Berkeley and is currently working on his second master's degree in public health.
- Coutts missed the season-opener vs. UC Davis, where he was replaced by Dario Longhetto. Longhetto had three punts for 140 yards (46.7 average). Longhetto had a long of 54 yards.
- Greg Thomas led Cal in scoring last season as he tallied 51 points. Thomas made all 27 of his extra point attempts and went 12 of 17 on field goals.
- Thomas opened the season hitting two of three field goals from 40+ yards away. His second kick of 47 yards was a career best.
- Gabe Siemieniec had six kickoffs in the opener, UC Davis did not start further up the field than their own 25-yard line after any kick. Siemieniec had two touchbacks, forced a fair catch and three other kicks that landed inside the one-yard line.
- Slater Zellers takes over as the team's long snapper after redshirting the 2018 season. Zellers was a Under Armour All-American as a high school senior.

OFFENSE STARTS EXPLOSIVELY

- Cal opened the season with seven explosive plays vs. UC Davis. That was more than the Bears had in all but one game during the 2018 season (Oregon State, 8).
- Cal notched 24 first downs vs. UC Davis, the most it has had since they secured 27 first downs vs. Oregon State last season. The team surpassed 24 first downs just three times in 2018.
- Cal was efficient in its only trip to the red zone, converting the trip into a touchdown with a 5-yard run by Christopher Brown Jr. Cal also scored twice on passes of 37 and 26 yards.
- However, late in the opener when Cal needed to kill the clock and ice the game, it held the ball for 11 minutes and 48 seconds in the fourth quarter to secure the game.

GARBERS IN CONTROL TO START SECOND YEAR

- With an emphasis on creating more explosive plays, redshirt sophomore Chase Garbers responded to begin his second year at the helm of the Bears' offense.
- Garbers had a career-high 238 yards passing in the season-opener vs. UC Davis.
- He notched three completions of 30+ yards in the season opener, after collecting only five passes of 30+ yards all of the 2018 season.
- Garbers' five completions of 20+ yards vs. UC Davis was the most he's had in a game at Cal.
- He ranks 18th nationally in yards per completion at 14.88.
- Garbers started slow, completing only three of his first eight passes. On his ninth pass, he hit Nikko Remigio on a 30-yard pass, that helped propel him to a 13-19 (68.4%) finish to the game.
- Garbers started the season opener after playing in 12 games with 10 starts during the 2018 season. He started each of the last seven contests for the Bears.

BROWN SHOULDERS OFFENSIVE LOAD

- Sophomore Christopher Brown Jr. carried the offensive load in the season opener vs. UC Davis as he had 36 carries for 197 yards and a touchdown.
- The 197 yards was the most by a Cal player in their first start in recorded history. The most recent running back to top 100 yards in their first career start was Jahvid Best, who had 111 yards in the 2008 season opener against Michigan State.
- Brown's 197 yards was the 20th-best rushing performance in school history.
- Brown's 36 carries were the most by a Cal running back since Shane Vereen had 42 in 2009 Big Game win at Stanford.
- He ranks third in the NCAA and first in the Pac-12 in rushing yards (197.0).
- Brown ranks seventh in the NCAA and first in the Pac-12 in all-purpose yards (206.0).

CRAWFORD EMERGES AMONGST BALANCED RECEIVING CORPS

- Michigan transfer Kekoa Crawford debuted with a notable performance against UC Davis. He caught three passes for 84 yards and two touchdowns.
- Crawford is tied for fifth in the NCAA and first in the Pac-12 with two receiving touchdowns.
- He ranks 26th in the NCAA and third in the Pac-12 in scoring with 12 points.
- Cal spread the ball around with seven wide receivers and three tight ends seeing significant time. Crawford was one of 10 receivers to catch a pass in the opener, with two more receiving targets.
- Nikko Remigio had a career-high 46 receiving yards on four catches vs. UC Davis.

OFFENSIVE LINE RETURNS EXPERIENCE

- The offensive line features three returnees who have combined to start 55 career games.
- Jake Curhan and Valentino Daltoso are both starters for the third straight season. Curhan has started 26 straight games, predominantly playing as the right tackle, while Daltoso has played in 24 games with 23 starts (10 at left guard, 10 at right guard, three at right tackle) since the start of 2017.
- Michael Saffell started his first career game at center vs. UC Davis, after previously starting eight games at right guard over the past two seasons.
- Will Craig earned his first start vs. UC Davis after appearing in nine games off the bench as a true freshman last season, playing predominantly at left tackle.
- Projected starter Gentle Williams was hurt towards the end of fall camp and will be out for the season. Williams started the final three contests of the 2018 campaign at left guard.



AARON RODGERS TEAM LOCKER ROOM OPENS

- Former Cal quarterback and Super Bowl XLV MVP Aaron Rodgers made a seven-figure gift to the football program this past June to renovate the football locker room and create the Aaron Rodgers Football Scholarship.
- The renovation of the Cal football locker room was performed this summer and the new locker room was unveiled to the team on August 27.
- The Aaron Rodgers Football Scholarship will be awarded each year to a junior college transfer. Rodgers himself came to Cal after one season at Butte College near his hometown of Chico following his prep career at nearby Pleasant Valley High School.
- Dr. Paul F. White '68 also generously contributed a six-figure gift to the project. White is the brother of former Cal football All-American and College Football Hall of Famer Ed White.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- Cal has one of the most difficult schedules in the country as it faces five teams ranked in both the AP and the Coaches' Poll and two more receiving votes. Four of those games will be on the road as the Bears take on Washington, Oregon, Utah and Stanford away from California Memorial Stadium. The Bears will also travel to SEC territory for a game against Ole Miss before closing the season vs. UCLA.
- The Bears home schedule features numerous tough tests including a battle with a ranked Washington State squad on Nov. 9. The Bears will also take on North Texas, who went 9-4 in 2018 and played in the New Mexico Bowl. Cal opened the year by defeating UC Davis, 27-13. UC Davis ranked sixth in the FCS during the 2018 season and made it the quarterfinals of the FCS championship.
- Cal will take on Arizona State, who is receiving votes in this week's poll, on Friday, Sept. 27 at home. The Bears will play the short week after returning from their longest trip of the season at Ole Miss.
- Cal's home slate also features matchups with Oregon State (Oct. 19) and RV/RV USC (Nov. 16).

WASHINGTON AND CHRIS PETERSEN CONNECTIONS

- Cal has four players on the squad from the state of Washington: Evan Weaver (Spokane), Matthew Cindric (Sammamish), Orin Patu (Seattle) and Ben Moos (Pullman).
- Justin Wilcox was the defensive coordinator at Washington during the 2012-13 seasons while Peter Sirmon served as the Huskies' linebackers coach for those same two years.
- Wilcox and Sirmon played at Oregon while Chris Petersen was the wide receivers coach for the Ducks. Wilcox was also Petersen's defensive coordinator at Boise State from 2006-09.
- Cal coaches Gerald Alexander and Andrew Browning played at Boise State from 2003-06 while Petersen was the offensive coordinator (2001-05) and head coach (2006-13).
- Peter Sirmon's son Jackson Sirmon is a redshirt freshman linebacker for Washington.
- Peter Sirmon's nephew, Jacob Sirmon, is a redshirt freshman quarterback with the Huskies.
- Marques Tuiasosopo was a star quarterback at Washington, leading the team to a 11-1 record as a senior as he was named Rose Bowl MVP. He was the Pac-10 Offensive Player of the Year and finished eighth in the Heisman voting.
- Tuiasosopo served as the quarterbacks coach at Washington in 2013, he took over as the interim head coach at the end of the season and led the Huskies to a victory in the Fight Hunger Bowl.
- Torre Becton served on the strength and conditioning staff at Washington from 2011-15 including two seasons with Chris Petersen.
- Beau Baldwin's entire coaching career came for schools based in Washington prior to being hired as Cal's offensive coordinator in 2017. He coached at both Central Washington and Eastern Washington.

LAST MEETING VS. WASHINGTON

Defense Leads Way As Bears Down No. 15/13 Washington Oct. 27, 2018

BERKELEY – With the wide range of ups and downs that accompany a college football season, the Cal coaching staff preaches a level of consistency that will enable the Bears to weather storms and celebrate big victories all the same.

So, in the aftermath of a 12-10 victory over No. 15/13-ranked Washington that brought plenty more highs than lows, head coach Justin Wilcox told his players that nobody should be surprised because the Bears have always been capable of competing with any opponent they face.

That said, the feeling that comes with a signature win over a top-15 team can still inspire one heck of a celebration inside California Memorial Stadium.

A 37-yard interception return for a touchdown by Evan Weaver provided the eventual game-winning points and capped a brilliant defensive performance as the Cal football team earned its biggest win of the season to date as the Bears knocked off the Huskies on an afternoon turned to night in Berkeley.

Cal (5-3, 2-3 Pac-12) held Washington to just 250 yards of total offense and Weaver was right in the middle of the action all evening, recording 11 tackles to go with his game-winning score. Cal forced two turnovers without allowing one of its own and limited Huskies quarterback Jake Browning to just 159 yards of passing. Offensively, Patrick Laird led the charge with 83 rushing yards.

Weaver's theatrics provided a jolt to the Cal faithful as the third quarter drew to a close. With Washington looking to backup quarterback Jake Haener to provide a spark, Weaver stepped in front of a third down pass on the Huskies 37-yard line and took off upfield. He cut outside and, once in reach of the goal line, extended his arm just far enough to tick the pylon and score his first career touchdown.

"I dropped back, he threw me the ball, I caught it and I just didn't want to fall down," Weaver said. "Maybe two or three more yards and I would've ran out of steam. They didn't get me this time."

The play put Cal ahead 12-7 with one second left in the quarter but the Bears' two-point attempt failed, leaving the margin at just five entering the fourth quarter. That's where the score stayed until the clock ran inside five minutes and a 26-yard field goal by Washington's Peyton Henry left Cal up 12-10 with 4:51 to play.

That was as close as Washington (6-3, 4-2) got because the Bears simply wouldn't give the ball back. Cal ran the final 4:51 off the clock thanks to an eight-play drive that spanned only 27 yards but picked up two critical first downs, the last of which came on a six-yard run by Laird.

"They're all big but (this win) is huge," Wilcox said. "It gives the guys validation and gives them confidence but we've got to build on it. That's what's most important. Everybody's really excited and it's a really great environment in the locker room, as you would expect, but I also don't think anyone's surprised. It's tough to win and our guys competed extremely hard and battled. I thought you saw a lot of toughness out there and grit and determination. We weren't perfect but we found a way to win the game and that's what's most I'm most proud of."

Offense proved hard to come by in the first half thanks in large part to quality defense from both teams. A 3-yard touchdown pass from Jake Browning to Ty Jones put Washington ahead 7-0 after two drives but the Bears cut into the lead by the end of the quarter thanks to a 23-yard field goal by Greg Thomas.

Thomas added a 35-yard field goal in the second quarter to leave the Bears down by just one at halftime but the high points of the first 30 minutes came mostly from a defense that limited Washington to its lowest first half point total of the season. Camryn Bynum made one such play, reeling in a pass from Browning and tapping his toe inbounds to secure an interception late in the first quarter.

CAMERON INSTITUTE FOR STUDENT-ATHLETE DEVELOPMENT

With a goal to prepare student-athletes for success after graduation by supporting their overall growth and development as undergraduates, Cal will form the Cameron Institute, an innovative program to support student-athlete development made possible through a \$12.5 million gift from C. Bryan Cameron. To help support the venture in perpetuity, \$12 million will be placed into an endowment with the balance designated for initial start-up costs. The Cameron Institute will be based upon three pillars - leadership and personal development, career development, and community engagement - and the organizational structure will be designed to connect with all student-athletes consistently and provide programming over the course of their entire student experience in Berkeley.

HEAD COACH JUSTIN WILCOX

Justin Wilcox is in his third season as the head football coach at Cal in 2019 and signed a new five-year contract in December 2018 that will extend through the 2023 campaign. Wilcox began his third season in charge with a 27-13 victory over UC Davis.

Wilcox guided the Golden Bears to the Cheez-It Bowl in his second campaign in 2018. The bowl appearance was Cal's first in three seasons and first in a Pac-12 affiliated bowl since 2011.

Cal posted a 7-6 overall record in 2018. The Bears won four out of five Pac-12 games over a tough stretch, highlighted by signature wins over eventual Pac-12 champion and then-No. 15/13 Washington as well as USC. The victory over the Trojans clinched bowl eligibility and marked Cal's first win against USC since 2003 and the first victory at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum since 2000. Cal also started the season with a 3-0 mark and in Week 5 made its first appearance since 2015 in the AP Top 25 at No. 24.

Cal's defense has been vastly improved under Wilcox and finished the 2018 campaign among national and Pac-12 leaders in nearly every category. Cal ranked in the top 10 nationally and paced the conference in interceptions (21, No. 2 NCAA), defensive touchdowns (5, No. 14 NCAA), turnovers gained (28, No. 6T NCAA) and passing yards allowed (175.1 ypg, No. 9 NCAA). The Bears also led the conference and ranked in the top 20 in the country in pass efficiency defense (107.26, No. 11 NCAA) and first downs allowed (227, No. 18 NCAA). Cal was also 15th nationally in total defense (317.2 ypg) and 22nd in scoring defense (20.4 ppg) while registering third in the Pac-12 in both areas.

The highlights of Wilcox's first season as the head coach in Berkeley in 2017 included a 3-0 start and non-conference wins over Power 5 programs North Carolina and Ole Miss, as well as a 37-3 victory over then No. 8/9 Washington State in an ESPN nationally-televised Friday night home game. The victory was the Bears' first against a top-10 team since 2003 and only its second top-10 win since 1977.

Cal finished 5-7 overall in his first season as the head coach at Cal. The Bears notched a Pac-12 victory over Oregon State but also took three conference opponents to the wire as they lost by a combined total of seven points to Arizona, UCLA and Stanford.

Much of the 2017 team's success came from its big-play ability on defense. Cal ranked among the nation's best, finishing tied for 21st in defensive touchdowns (4), tied for 27th in fumbles recovered (10), tied for 29th in turnovers gained (24) and tied for 32nd in passes intercepted (14). Cal's seven takeaways against WSU equaled the second-most by an FBS team in 2017 with the Bears' 9.0 sacks in the contest the most by a Cal team since 2005. The 2017 Cal defense had better total numbers and rankings than the 2016 squad in 14 of the primary 15 team defensive statistics tracked by the NCAA, improving by an average of just under 40 spots per category.

Prior to becoming Cal's head coach, Wilcox spent the previous 11 seasons as a defensive coordinator with stops at Boise State (2006-09), Tennessee (2010-11), Washington (2012-13), USC (2014-15) and Wisconsin (2016). Over his 18 seasons in collegiate coaching, Wilcox has been a member of staffs that have gone to 15 bowl games and five conference or division championships.

In his most recent position prior to his arrival at Cal, Wilcox helped a 2016 Wisconsin team to an 11-3 overall record, a No. 9 ranking in the final AP Top 25 and a Cotton Bowl win. The Badgers ranked among the country's top 10 in five key defensive categories - rushing defense (98.8 ypg, No. 3), third-down conversion defense (27.9%, No. 4), scoring defense (15.6 ppg, No. 4), total defense (301.4 ypg, No. 7) and passing efficiency defense (106.91, No. 10).

Wilcox also had a memorable tenure at Boise State as the Broncos went 49-4 and led the Western Athletic Conference in total defense and scoring defense each season. He helped Boise State to two Fiesta Bowl victories as the Broncos defeated TCU, 17-10, in 2009 and capped a perfect 13-0 season in 2006 with an overtime victory over Oklahoma.

Wilcox spent three seasons as Cal's linebackers coach from 2003-05 in his first position as a full-time coach following two campaigns as a graduate assistant at Boise State (2001-02). The Bears posted a 26-12 record during his first stint in Berkeley with trips to the Insight, Holiday and Las Vegas bowls.

A 1999 graduate of Oregon with a bachelor's degree in anthropology, Wilcox is the son of Dave Wilcox, a Pro Football Hall of Famer who played for the San Francisco 49ers from 1964-74. His uncle, John (Philadelphia Eagles, 1960), and brother, Josh (New Orleans Saints, 1998-99), also played in the NFL.

As a collegiate student-athlete, Wilcox was a safety and cornerback at Oregon (1996-99), helping the Ducks to three bowl games (1997 Las Vegas Bowl, 1998 Aloha Bowl, 1999 Sun Bowl). In 1999, he was named second-team All-Pac-10 and earned Pac-10 All-Academic honors.

**Beau Baldwin (Offensive Coordinator/
Quarterbacks)**

Baldwin is in his third season as the offensive coordinator at Cal in 2019 and his first campaign working with the team's quarterbacks. He returns to the position group he coached during his first 13 seasons of coaching before becoming Eastern Washington's head coach. During his first two years in Berkeley, Baldwin helped Patrick Laird finish his career with 2153 yards rushing and 14 touchdowns. Laird also caught more passes in his career than any running back in school history with 99 receptions.


Tim DeRuyter (Defensive Coordinator/Outside Linebackers)*

DeRuyter is in his third season as the defensive coordinator at Cal. DeRuyter was a semifinalist for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2018. Cal ranked in the top 10 nationally and paced the conference in interceptions (21, No. 2 NCAA), defensive touchdowns (5, No. T4 NCAA), turnovers gained (28, No. T6 NCAA) and passing yards allowed (175.1 ypg, No. 9 NCAA). He is in his 29th season as a collegiate coach and his 18th as a defensive coordinator. He's helped orchestrate dramatic improvements on defense in his first two seasons at Cal as the Golden Bears have cut opponents' scoring by 22.2 points per game to move up 105 spots in the national rankings from No. 127 the season before his arrival (42.6 ppg) to No. 22 in 2018 (20.4 ppg).


**Peter Sirmon (Associate Head Coach/Co-Defensive Coordinator/
Inside Linebackers/
Recruiting Coordinator)**

Sirmon is in his second season at Cal and has added co-defensive coordinator duties this year. Sirmon was instrumental to Cal's defensive success in his first year on the Bears' staff in 2018 that led to his seventh consecutive bowl appearance as a coach. Cal's defense finished the 2018 campaign among national and Pac-12 leaders in nearly every category. Sirmon was the defensive coordinator at Louisville (2017) and Mississippi State (2016) prior to Cal. He was a four-year collegiate teammate of Wilcox and a first-team All-Pac-10 selection at Oregon. Sirmon played seven years as a linebacker with the Tennessee Titans.


Charlie Ragle (Special Teams Coordinator)

Charlie Ragle is in his third season as Cal's special teams coordinator in 2019 and has been responsible for the development of the likes of punter Steven Coutts, placekicker Matt Anderson and kick returner Ashtyn Davis in his first two campaigns in the role. Coutts is on the Ray Guy Award watch list, after putting 37 punts inside the 20 last year, the most nation. Davis led the Pac-12 and ranked 17th in the nation in yards per kick return (26.2) in 2018.


Gerald Alexander (Defensive Backs)

Alexander is in his third year guiding the Cal secondary that grabbed 17 of the team's 21 interceptions last year. Cal ranked first in the Pac-12 and second nationally. Cal's secondary is ranked among the top eight in the nation in the preseason by three different media outlets. Phil Steele lists the unit second, while the Golden Bears are ranked fourth nationally according to Athlon and eighth by Lindy's.


Andrew Browning (Defensive Line)

Browning is in his first season as the Golden Bears' defensive line coach in 2019 after serving in a quality control role on the defensive side of the ball at Cal in 2018. Prior to his arrival at Cal, he was the defensive line coach at UTEP for five seasons (2013-17). He also spent three years on the football staff at his alma mater Boise State (2010-12).


Nicholas Edwards (Running Backs)

Edwards is in his third season at Cal in 2019 and his first as the Golden Bears' running backs coach. Edwards spent his first two campaigns at Cal working with the team's wide receivers including the duo of Vic Wharton III and Kanawai Noa, who combined for career totals of 241 receptions, 2933 yards receiving and 13 touchdown catches. Wharton's 67 receptions in 2017 were ninth in Cal's single-season school history.


Steve Greatwood (Offensive Line)

Greatwood is in his third season as the offensive line coach at Cal in 2019. The group helped the 2018 rushing offense improve by an average of 32.3 yards per contest from its final 2017 number including a season-best 305 yards rushing at Oregon State that was its most since a 2016 contest against Oregon. Greatwood has coached for 39 seasons including 32 years over three stints at his alma mater Oregon.


Burl Toler III (Wide Receivers)

Toler is in his second season as an assistant coach at his alma mater in 2019 and his first as the Golden Bears' wide receivers coach after spending his inaugural 2018 campaign with the running backs. Toler was a four-year letterwinner as a wide receiver at Cal from 2001-04, helping the Bears to an Insight Bowl victory in 2003. This is his second stint working at Cal after spending 2013-15 working in quality control. He was the wide receivers coach at Fresno State in 2016 and UC Davis in 2017.


Marques Tuiasosopo (Tight Ends)*

Tuiasosopo is in his third season at Cal and his first as the tight ends coach, taking on a position of emphasis in the Golden Bears' offense. He returns to the group he coached for three of his first four seasons as a collegiate coach at UCLA and USC. The former NFL player and collegiate standout was enshrined into the Polynesian Football Hall of Fame in January 2019.


Torre Becton (Head Athletic Performance Coach)

Becton is in his third season at Cal and ninth in the Pac-12. Becton spent the previous six campaigns prior to his arrival in Berkeley on the strength and conditioning staffs at USC (2016) and Washington (2011-15), guiding the programs to bowl games each season. He continued that trend by helping Cal to the Cheez-It Bowl in 2018.
