WASHINGTON vs. UTAH

With Apple Cup Called Off, Huskies Set To Take On Utes

THE GAME: The Washington football team (2-0 Pac-12, 2-0 overall) plays its third straight home game as Utah (0-1, 0-1) travels to Seattle for a 4:30 p.m. PT game Saturday night. The game, which will air on ABC, was arranged after the two teams' originally scheduled games were called off – UW's Friday at Washington State and Utah's Saturday at Arizona State – due to COVID-19 concerns. Following the Utah game, the Huskies are scheduled to remain home to face Stanford on Dec. 5, before traveling to Eugene to face Oregon on Dec. 12.

QUICK HITTERS: Washington went five quarters (last two of OSU game and first three of Arizona game) without allowing a point ... UW is the only team in the nation that has played a game this year and not committed any turnovers ... the Huskies have allowed just one sack, which was a one-yard loss on a run out of bounds ... 10 true freshmen have played this season: OL Roger Rosengarten; TB Javon Forward; DB Makell Esteen; LS Jaden Green; TE Mark Redman; OLBs Cooper McDonald and Sav'ell Smalls; and WRs Jalen McMillan, Sawyer Racanelli, and Rome Odunze ... UW RS-freshman Dylan Morris started at QB in the opener vs. OSU, joining Jake Locker (RS-freshman in 2007) and Jake Browning (true freshman in 2015) to start a season opener as a freshman, in the modern era ... of the 110 players on the UW football roster, just under half (54) are freshmen or redshirt freshmen, and an additional 33 are sophomores, meaning that 85 players have two or more years of eligibility remaining (not even taking into account this season's paused eligibility) ... the UW roster includes 11 juniors, 11 seniors and one graduate student ... UW has earned a bowl berth 10 years in a row, the longest such streak in the Pac-12, with the Huskies playing in nine different bowl games over that span ... the UW has gone 73 games in a row without allowing an opponent to score more than 35 points, the longest such streak in the nation.

TELEVISION: The UW-Utah game will air on ESPN, with Beth Mowins (play by play), Kirk Morrison (analyst) and Stormy Buonantony (reporter) calling the action. Fans can also watch via various ESPN platforms, including espn.com/watch.

RADIO: Radio coverage of the 2020 Husky Football team along the Washington Sports Network from Learfield IMG College is already underway. The Jimmy Lake Show is a one-hour weekly show featuring the Huskies' head coach, airing live on Wednesday nights from 6-7 p.m. PT. On game day, live coverage begins four hours before kickoff with Husky Gameday hosted by Dave 'Softy' Mahler, Dick Baird and others. Castricone, Huard and Elise Woodward will call the play-by-play of the games. All shows are available live on flagship station SportsRadio 950 KJR, the Washington Sports Network, and the Huskies Gameday mobile app, as well as available on demand on the GoHuskies Podcast. The UW broadcast of the game will also air on SiriusXM satellite radio.

FIRST SEASON AT UW



When former Husky head coach Chris Petersen surprised the UW community by announcing that he would step down following the 2019 football season, there was no hesitation as to who best to replace him. In fact, it took nearly no time for Jimmy Lake to be offered the job.

On Dec. 2, 2019, the announcement was made of the change, with Lake taking over the program immediately following Washington's victory in the 2019 Las Vegas Bowl.

While Lake will be a head coach for the first time, you'd be hard-pressed to find a better résumé for an incoming Husky head coach.

In his six prior seasons at Washington – two as defensive backs coach, two as co-defensive coordinator and the last two as defensive coordinator – Lake has earned a reputation as a teacher, recruiter and tactician, helping the UW become one of the strongest and most consistent defensive teams – and specifically one of the top secondaries – in the nation.

Year after year, the Huskies, who have five or more defensive backs on the field the majority of the time, play aggressive and precise defense and turn out highly-regarded professional prospects.

In 2019, his last as defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach, Lake molded another strong unit despite the loss of nine defensive starters from the previous year. Starting as many as three true freshmen in the secondary, his unit limited opponents to 19.4 points per game. Elijah Molden earned second-team All-America and first-team All-Pac-12, while Myles Bryant was a second-team all-conference pick. Freshman DBs Trent McDuffie and Cameron Williams each earned Freshman All-America.

In 2018, his first year as the UW's defensive coordinator, Lake continued the Huskies' reign as the top defense in the Pac-12 Conference. For the fourth year in a row, Washington led the league in both scoring (15.5 points per game) and total (301.8 yards per game) defense. The Huskies were also second in the conference in rushing defense, passing yards defense and pass efficiency defense.

Washington produced four, first-team All-Pac-12 players on Lake's side of the ball: All-America defensive backs Taylor Rapp and Byron Murphy, All-America linebacker Ben Burr-Kirven and nose tackle Greg Gaines. Burr-Kirven was named the Pat Tillman Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year (second year in a row for the UW) as well as the Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year for football, while Gaines was the second Husky in a row to win the Morris Trophy, given to the best offensive and defensive linemen in the conference, as voted by opposing players.

Along with Rapp and Murphy, who both earned first-team All-America from at least one outlet each, Rapp also coached three other All-Pac-12 honorees. Bryant was a second-team selection, alongside Molden, who was honored as a special teams player. Senior safety Jojo McIntosh also earned honorable mention All-Pac-12 in 2018.

In 2017, the Huskies led the Pac-12 in both total defense (eighth nationally) and scoring defense (fifth nationally) and were the national leader in fewest yards allowed per completion (9.42), thanks largely to the defensive backs unit coached by Lake. Rapp earned first-team All-Pac-12 honors. Another Husky DB, Zeke Turner, went on to sign with the Arizona Cardinals following the 2017 college season, and earned a spot on the NFL All-Rookie team.

In 2016, Lake helped coach a Husky defense that once again topped all Pac-12 defenses as the Dawgs went 12-2 and earned a trip to the College Football Playoff. The Dawgs led the conference in both total defense (316.9 yards per game, 12th in the nation) and scoring defense (17.7 points per game, eighth) in the nation, while also leading all FBS schools in turnover margin (1.29 per game) and takeaways (33). Washington was also first in the conference in first downs allowed and third down conversion defense, while finishing second in red zone defense, rushing defense and sacks.

The UW secondary helped the Dawgs lead the conference and finish eighth in the country in interceptions. Budda Baker and Sidney Jones both earned first-team All-Pac-12 while Kevin King earned honorable mention. Baker, who earned a trip to the Pro Bowl as a rookie with the Arizona Cardinals in 2017, was a consensus All-America pick while Jones was a scout.com first-team All-America and a second-team selection from the Football Writers and Sports Illustrated. Additionally, Rapp was the Pac-12's defensive freshman of the year, the MVP of the Pac-12 Championship Game and a freshman All-America.

In 2015, the Husky defense led the Pac-12 in scoring defense, total defense and red-zone defense and finished second in both pass efficiency defense and rushing defense. Two Husky sophomores Baker and Jones, both earned first-team All-Pac-12. Jones led the conference in passes defended and was in the top five in interceptions, fumbles forced and fumbles recovered.

In his first season at the UW as a member of Petersen's 2014 staff, Lake took on the challenge of coaching a secondary that frequently included three true freshmen and a true sophomore in the four starting spots. In the end, he helped Baker earn freshman All-America honors while helping the UW to a No. 9 national ranking in turnover margin and a top-40 marking scoring defense.

Lake joined Petersen's staff from Boise State where he was in charge of the secondary and was the defensive pass game coordinator in 2012 and 2013.

In 2013, the Broncos ranked second in the Mountain West in points allowed (24.8) and interceptions (16), third in total defense (413.4) and pass efficiency defense (129.7) and fourth in sacks (30). They also tied for the conference low allowing just 17 touchdown passes.

Lake mentored sophomore cornerback Donte Deayon, who earned 2013 second-team All-Conference honors after finishing second in the league with six interceptions and fourth with 15 passes defended.

In his debut season with the Broncos in 2012, Lake led a secondary that was fifth nationally in both pass defense (169.5) and pass efficiency defense (101.4). The team also ranked eighth nationally in scoring defense (15.8) and 12th nationally in total defense (315.6). The Broncos also picked off 18 passes to tie for the 12th-most nationally.

Three of his four starting defensive backs earned All-Mountain West honors following the season, including first-team selection Jamar Taylor at cornerback. Cornerback Jerrell Gavins was named second-team all-league, and safety Jeremy Ioane was honorable mention.

Taylor went on to become the second-highest drafted cornerback in school history, taken in the second round of the 2013 NFL Draft - No. 54 overall - by the Miami Dolphins.

Before joining Boise State, Lake worked in the National Football League. He spent 2010-11 as defensive backs coach for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and 2008 as DB coach for the Detroit Lions. He also served as the assistant defensive backs coach for Tampa Bay from 2006-07.

While with the Buccaneers, Lake's defensive backs finished seventh in the NFL in pass defense in 2012, a group that was anchored by five-time Pro Bowl selection Ronde Barber.

Prior to coaching in the professional ranks, Lake coached the secondary at Montana State in 2005. The Bobcats' defense finished the season ranked No. 1 in the Big Sky Conference, and his secondary allowed a conference-low 165.6 passing yards per game. Also on the Montana State staff in 2005 was UW defensive coordinator Pete Kwiatkowski.

Lake spent one season coaching defensive backs at Washington in 2004 under Keith Gilbertson. That Huskies' secondary helped the team rank first in the Pacific-10 Conference and 17th-nationally in pass defense.

From 2000-03, Lake coached the secondary at his alma mater Eastern Washington.

Lake was honorable mention All-Big Sky as a strong safety and was also an academic all-conference selection. He graduated with a business administration degree in 2000.

Lake was born in Walnut Creek, Calif., but moved around as a child thanks to his father's service in the U.S. Air Force. He also lived in Turkey and the Philippines, among others, before completing high school in Spokane, Wash., at North Central High. He and wife, Michele, are the parents of three children: Jimmy, Jr., Faith and Bronson.

COACHING STAFF: Even with a change in head coaches, most of Washington's coaching staff from 2019 is back for the 2020 season, with seven returnees and three newcomers among the 10, full-time assistant coaches. Three of those seven, plus new head coach Jimmy Lake, have been at Washington since former head coach Chris Petersen was hired prior to the 2014 season. Defensive coordinator Pete Kwiatkowski was on Petersen's staff in Boise in all eight seasons as head coach, including the last four as defensive coordinator. Kwiatkowski, a BSU Hall-of-Fame defensive lineman, also worked at his alma mater from 1988 to 1996. Running backs coach Keith Bhonapha was also on Petersen's Broncos staff during Petersen's entire eight seasons, though he started as director of operations. He coached running backs his last five years at BSU. Special teams coordinator and linebackers coach Bob Gregory came to Washington having spent the previous four seasons at Boise State. He was the defensive coordinator at California from 2002 to 2009 and, along with also having coached at Boise State in 2001, had also worked in the conference at Oregon. UW alum Ikaika Malloe, who lettered as a Husky from 1993 to 1996 and once worked as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, is back for his fifth season as UW's defensive line coach, and has added the title of co-defensive coordinator for 2020. He joined the staff after the 2015 season, coming to Seattle from Utah State. Fourth-year offensive line coach Scott Huff spent the previous 11 seasons at Boise State, his alma mater, where he played under Coach Petersen (when Petersen was an assistant) and coached for him for all eight years Petersen was head coach. Former USC safety Will Harris, in his third year on the UW staff, was elevated to defensive backs coach with Lake moving to head coach. Last year, Washington welcomed Will Harris to the staff. Back for a second season at the UW is wide receivers coach Junior Adams, who came to Seattle after two seasons as offensive coordinator at Western Kentucky. Only one of the three newcomers is truly "new," that being new offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach John Donovan. He was offensive coordinator at Vanderbilt and Penn State before spending the last four years in various roles with the Jacksonville Jaguars. The other two newcomers are tight ends coach Derham Cato and assistant defensive backs coach Terrence Brown. Cato, a former coordinator at Davidson, spent the last four years as an offensive analyst at UW. Brown is a Stanford alum who spent the last two years at Vanderbilt, was a graduate assistant at Washington from 2015 through 2017. Two of four UW graduate assistant coaches are returners to their position: Daniel Segal (offense) and Henry Fernandez (defense). They're joined by two new GAs, Jon Rowe (offense) and John Timu (defense), a former UW and Chicago Bears linebacker.

HUSKIES vs. UTES HISTORY: Owing to the fact that Utah was new to the Pac-12 Conference in 2011, the Huskies and Utes have a limited history against one another. In fact, Washington has played Utah only 14 times (12-2), winning the first eight before taking a loss in 2015, with each meeting prior to the 2011 conference matchup in Salt Lake City coming in Seattle.

Last season, the Utes beat the Huskies, 33-28, on Nov. 2 in Seattle. The No. 9-ranked Utes were led by quarterback Tyler Huntley, who passed for one touchdown and ran for another, and by DB Jaylon Johnson, who had a 39-yard interception return for a score.

In 2018, the Huskies faced the Utes twice: once in the regular season and again in the Pac-12 Championship Game. Sept. 15 in Salt Lake City, the Huskies beat the Utes, 21-7, in the Huskies' Pac-12 opener. Myles Gaskin rushed for 143 yards and one touchdown while Jake Browning was 14-for-24 for 155 yards and a TD. The Husky defense held the Utes to 261 yards of total offense. The Pac-12 title game was a defensive struggle that the Huskies won, 10-3. The game's only TD was a 66-yard interception return from Husky cornerback Byron Murphy. UW out-gained Utah, 306 yards to 188.

The 2016 UW-Utah game was only the second ever in Salt Lake City. In that one, a year after having their eight-game win streak in the series broken, the No. 4 Huskies won a thriller, 31-24, over the 17th-ranked Utes. With the score tied 24-24 with about 3:30 left in the fourth quarter, Dante Pettis returned a punt 58 yards for a touchdown. The Utes managed to get to the UW 35 on the ensuing drive before failing to convert a 4th-and-15 attempt.

The first game ever between the two came Sept. 26, 1931, as Washington edged the visitors, 7-6, in the opening game of the year. The Utes returned for another season opener in 1949, when the UW outgained Utah, 388-114, in a 14-7 victory.

Washington scored another seven-point win in 1953 with a 21-14 decision and then posted another 7-6 victory the following year in yet another opener. In 1959, a Husky team that ended the year 10-1 with a Rose Bowl win, beat the Utes, 51-6.

More recently, on Sept. 15, 1979, 14th-ranked Washington beat Utah, 41-7, on the way to a 10-2 season that was capped by a Sun Bowl win over Texas. The UW had an interception return for a TD from Bruce Harrell, and Kyle Stevens returned a kickoff 95 yards for a score in that game.

In 2011 in Salt Lake City in the Utes' first-ever home Pac-12 game, the Huskies picked up a 31-14 win. The Huskies got a quick start when Jamaal Kearshe recovered a fumble on the opening kickoff and returned it for a touchdown. Keith Price then threw three touchdowns and Chris Polk rushed for 189 yards as the Dawgs led nearly throughout. In 2012, at CenturyLink Field, Washington maintained its perfect record against Utah with a 34-15 win. Down 8-0 thanks to a John White 46-yard run, the Huskies scored two touchdowns in the second quarter (a Price pass to Kasen Williams and a Price run) and then to open the third (Price to DiAndre Campbell) to pull in front for good. Sankey rushed for 156 yards while the UW defense held the Utes to just 188 yards of total offense (despite 142 rushing yards from White).

Utah earned its first victory in the series in 2015 in Seattle as a 24-point outburst in the second quarter led to a 34-23 victory. In 2017 in Seattle, Washington tied the game with 1:05 to go and then kicked a field goal on the final play to win, 33-30. Jake Browning went 26-for-35 for 354 yards and two TDs.

TEAM NOTES

OPPONENTS 35-AND-UNDER: Washington hasn't allowed an opponent to score more than 35 points in a game since a 44-30 loss at UCLA in 2014. That's a streak of 73 games in a row that the Huskies' opponent has failed to score more than 35. In that 73-game stretch, Husky foes have scored 30 or more just 11 times (of those 11, five were exactly 30 points) and have been held to 14 or fewer points 31 times. In that same span of 73 games, the UW has scored more than 35 points on 30 occasions. No other team in the FBS has a current streak longer than 50 games.

RETURNING STARTERS: While the official number of "returning starters" this year for Washington includes just five defensive and two offensive players, a deeper look at the numbers reveals a lot more experience. In fact, not counting specialists (UW returns its starting placekicker and holder), Washington has 13 current players who have started at least one game on offense, and 11 who have started on defense – though obviously most of those were not the primary starter at any one position last season. Those 24 individuals had started 208 career games, collectively, at the start of the 2020 season.

YOUTH: Washington's roster remains on the young side. Of the 110 current active players, one less than half – 54 – are freshmen or redshirt freshmen. Washington's roster includes one graduate student, 11 seniors, 11 juniors, 33 sophomores, 21 redshirt freshmen and 33 true freshmen.

DEFENSE vs. BIG PLAYS: The UW allowed just seven scrimmage plays of 40 or more yards all of last season, the eighth-lowest total (tied) in the nation. The median for 40-plus yard plays was 14. The Huskies allowed just two plays over 50 yards, the third-lowest (tied) total (the median was seven). The year before, the Huskies gave up just ONE scrimmage play of 40 or more yards all season. No other FBS team allowed fewer than four and 102 teams allowed 10 or more that year. In 2017, the UW also led the nation with fewest 40-yard scrimmage plays allowed (3) and were second in fewest 30-yard plays (14). They were tied for 5th and 2nd, respectively, in 2016. In the UW opener vs. Oregon State, the longest OSU scrimmage play was 17 yards. Against Arizona, the UW allowed three plays of more than 20 yards and none more than 30.

THE PAC-12: Prior to the 2011 season, the Pac-10 Conference added Utah and Colorado to expand to the Pac-12. Washington, which along with California is one of two schools who have been in the conference since its founding in 1915, plays in the Pac-12 North, along with the other three Northwest schools (Oregon, OSU, WSU) and Stanford and Cal. Under the current system, each school plays all five division rivals, plus four of six teams in the other division each season. The first two seasons, the Huskies did not face UCLA or Arizona State. In 2013 and 14, the Huskies didn't play Utah or USC. In 2015 in 2016, neither UCLA nor Colorado were on the UW schedule, while the Huskies didn't face USC and Arizona in 2017 or 2018. The 2019 season marked the start of a new cycle, moving the rotation back to where it started. Therefore, the Huskies will not to have played UCLA and Arizona State in 2019 and 2020.

THE 100-YARD FACTOR: Since the 1947 season, Washington is 221-69-3 (.759) when a Husky player rushes for 100 yards in a game. The Huskies are 22-3 in such games dating back to the 2016 season, and 4-2 last year.

HISTORY LESSON: Successfully rushing the football and winning go hand-in-hand for the Huskies. Since 1990, UW has rushed for 200 yards in a game 122 times. The Huskies' record stands at 105-16-1 (.865) in those contests.

HUSKY STADIUM RENOVATION: Husky Stadium underwent a major renovation over from Nov., 2011, through Aug., 2013, as the entire lower bowl and south upper deck were demolished and replaced. The new facility features a new, state-of-the-art football operations center (weight room, training room, locker room, meeting rooms, coaches' offices) in the west end, much more premium seating options and a new playing surface. Husky Stadium had featured a track up until 2011, so seats that were once far from the field, particularly in the west end, are much closer to the action. UW is 40-11 at home since the re-opening of Husky Stadium.

ALASKA AIRLINES FIELD AT HUSKY STADIUM: The Oregon game on Nov. 5, 2011, marked the final game in Husky Stadium prior to major renovations that were completed in summer, 2013. The Huskies re-opened their home field with a 38-6 win over then-No. 19 Boise State on Aug. 31, 2013. The 2018 season marks the 99th season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium stands at 396-180-21 (.681).

HUSKY STADIUM CENTENNIAL 1920-2020

Husky Stadium hosted its first game on Nov. 27, 1920, the final game of the season, when Dartmouth traveled cross-country to take on Washington, beating the home team, 28-7. Since the, the "Greatest Setting in College Football" has seen innumerable great moments, both on the football field and otherwise.

Washington's gridiron home is the oldest, still-in-use stadium in the West, two years older than the Rose Bowl and three more than the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. Like those two storied stadiums, Husky Stadium has undergone many renovations, both major and minor. In 1950, the south upper deck was opened and, in 1987, a matching north deck was unveiled. At the end of the 2011 season, the stadium underwent its most thorough renovation, as the track was removed, the field lowered several feet and all but the north deck was completely demolished and re-built.

In addition to Husky football games, the stadium has played host to numerous graduation ceremonies, UW track meets and men's soccer matches, has hosted 12 NFL preseason games prior to the arrival of the Seahawks, and even served as the Seahawks home facility for two-plus seasons. It was also the place where U.S. President Warren G. Harding made his final public speech before dying, in office. It has played host to Charles Lindbergh, just a few months after his historic flight, and to the 1990 Goodwill Games.
