ABOUT THE SERIES

- Washington leads, 54-41-4.
- The Bears have won the last two games in the series by a combined three points – 12-10 on Oct. 27, 2018, in Berkeley and 20-19 on Sept. 7, 2019, in Seattle. The last time Cal won three in a row against Washington was from 2002-06, when the Bears posted a five-game winning streak. Cal has also won two of the past three contests between the schools in Seattle, picking up a 30-24 victory in 2015.
- Cal is 2-4 in its past six Pac-12 openers, with both wins coming against Washington (2015, 2019)

FANTASTIC FINISHES

- The last two games between Cal and Washington have featured some dramatic late-game moments. In 2018, Evan Weaver's 37-yard interception return for a touchdown with one second left in the third quarter proved to be the difference maker in Cal's 12-10 win over the No. 15 Huskies.
- A year later, Greg Thomas booted a 17-yard field goal with eight seconds remaining, as Cal upended No. 14 UW, 20-19. The game featured a 2-hour, 39-minute lightning delay that began with 9:46 left in the first quarter, with the contest finally ending at 1:22 a.m.

BEARS GETTING MORE FROM MOORE

- Sophomore running back Damien Moore leads the Golden Bears rushing attack with 79.0 yards per game (4th in the Pac-12), including an average of 5.8 yards per rush. He has scored at least one rushing touchdown in all three games this season with a total of five in 2021 to date (two scores at TCU and vs. Sac State).
- Moore's five rushing TDs are the most in the first three games of a season for Cal since Shane Vereen (who will serve as the Pac-12 Network analyst for this week's Washington game) posted six rushing TDs in the first three games of the 2010 season.
- Moore ranks third in the Pac-12 in both total touchdowns (No. 15 NCAA) and total points scored (No. 22 NCAA).
- Moore has rushed for at least 70 yards in all three games, with a high of 87 yards (plus a season-long 32-yard rush) vs. Sac State.

OFFENSE PRODUCING BIG PLAYS

- So far this season, Cal's offense is averaging 30.3 points per game and 435.3 yards per game, both highs during the Justin Wilcox era in Berkeley. Cal's total offense yards per game ranks third in the Pac-12 with the Bears fifth in both rushing ypg (177.3 rpg) and passing ypg (258.0 ypg).
- The Bears' yards per game rushing, if it held up for the year, would be Cal's highest in a season since averaging 183.0 ypg in 2012.
- Cal produced 13 plays of 15 yards or more against Sac State last weekend (6 pass, 7 rush) – the most in any game under Wilcox. Over their last two games, the Bears have had seven passing plays of at least 30 yards.
- Four Cal receivers are averaging 17.9 yards or more per reception – Kekoa Crawford (27.3 ypc), Trevon Clark (22.7 ypc), Jake Tonges (19.8 ypc) and Jeremiah Hunter (17.9 ypc).

WASHINGTON CONNECTIONS

- Four members of Cal's coaching staff were together at Washington during the 2012-13 seasons. Over that span, Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox served as the Huskies' defensive coordinator, while defensive coordinator/inside linebackers coach/recruiting coordinator Peter Sirmon was linebackers coach and outside linebackers coach Keith Heyward coached UW's defensive backs. In addition, Cal defensive backs coach Tre Watson was a member of the Husky team during those two seasons.
- Sirmon's son, Jackson, is a sophomore linebacker on the Washington roster.
- Five Golden Bears hail from the state of Washington – WR Justin Richard Baker (Bellevue), OL Matthew Cindric (Sammamish), OL Colin Hamilton (Edmonds), OL Dylan Jemtegaard (Yelm) and OLB Orin Patu (Seattle).

GARBERS PICKING UP THE PACE AT QUARTERBACK

- QB Chase Garbers has completed a combined 63-of-99 passes (63.6%) for 774 yards and five scores. He started out against Sac State by going 11-for-11 through the year for 124 yards. The completion percentage is the highest of his career and above his 61.4% entering this season.
- Garbers threw for 309 yards at TCU, marking the third time in his career he has surpassed 300 yards through the air with the other two feats also coming on the road. He passed for 315 yards last fall at Oregon State and for a career-high 357 yards in a win at Ole Miss in 2019.
- With 258.0 ypg passing Garbers ranks third in the Pac-12 this season. In addition, he is second in total offense (293.3 ypg).
- Over his past two games, Garbers has completed eight passes of at least 25 yards (5 at TCU, 3 vs. Sac State), including five of 40 yards or more. He tossed a career-long 68-yard pass to Trevon Clark at TCU.
- With a 16-yard rush for Cal's final TD against Sac State, Garbers now has eight rushing touchdowns for his career. The school record for most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback in nine by Brian Bedford and Dave Penhall (1969-70).
- Garbers has 824 yards rushing for his career and is closing in on the school record for rushing yards by a Cal quarterback (931, Joe Kapp).
- Garbers is 15-11 as a starters and Cal is 15-7 in games when he has played more than half the game, including 7-0 during the 2019 season.

GOODE PLAYING MUCH BETTER THAN GOOD

- Over his last 11 games, OLB Cameron Goode has accumulated 16.5 tackles for loss and 10.0 quarterback sacks.
- At TCU, Goode had his 15th and 16th career sacks for a combined minus-27 yards at TCU. The 2.0 sacks tied a career high (also at UCLA in 2019). Goode added another tackle for loss, giving him 3.0 TFLs (-30 yards) for the game. His 2.0 sacks and 3.0 TFLs tie for a single-game high in the Pac-12 this year.

9 SUPER SENIORS

- Nine members of the Cal roster are "super seniors" – student-athletes who took advantage of an extra year of eligibility granted by the NCAA due to COVID-19. All were set to finish their final seasons last fall, but decided to return for one additional year.
- The group includes Trevon Clark, Kekoa Crawford, Valentino Daltoso, Marcel Dancy, Kuony Deng, Josh Drayden, Cameron Goode, Elijah Hicks and Luc Bequette.
- Crawford, Daltoso, Dancy, Deng, Drayden and Goode are all in their sixth season of eligibility.
- Bequette was at Cal for five season, played at Boston College in 2020, then returned to Cal for 2021. He is a seventh-year senior.

XXXXXX

- Cal has a combined seven completions of 30 yards or more over the last two games at TCU and vs. Sac State. The last time the Bears had that many in back-to-back games was in 2016 vs. Arizona State and Utah when Davis Webb was the Cal quarterback.
- Garbers' 68-yard pass to Trevon Clark at TCU was the longest pass and catch for both players.

LONG DRIVES ON BEARS' OPENING TWO POSSESSIONS

- Through three games this season, Cal has shown a knack for long first-quarter drives, with the first two drives in every game going at least 63 yards and five of the six ending in touchdowns.
- Cal opened against Nevada by going 63 yards on 15 plays over 9:03, culminating with a 1-yard TD run by Damien Moore. The Bears followed with a seven-play, 72-yard drive over 4:08 and closed it out with a 2-yard TD pass from Chase Garbers to Nikko Remigio. The last time Cal scored touchdowns on its first two possessions came against Colorado in 2018.
- At TCU, the Bears drove 68 yards on their first possession only to be stopped on downs deep inside Horned Frog territory. But the next time they got the ball, they went 68 yards again, finishing with a 54-yard touchdown pass from Garbers to Trevon Clark.
- Against Sac State, Cal's first two drives went 85 and 69 yards, both ending in 4-yard TD runs by Damien Moore.
- The Bears have outscored opponents, 34-6, in the opening period.

REMIGIO BRINGS ONE BACK ALL THE WAY

- Nikko Remigio's 99-yard kickoff return for a TD vs. Sac State was the longest for a Golden Bear since Trevor Davis had a 100-yarder at Washington State in 2014 (one of two for Davis that night).
- Remigio's KOR was also the first brought back for a touchdown since Ashtyn Davis went 89 yards against Idaho State in 2018..
- After the game, Remigio said the return marked his first for a touchdown since playing Pop Warner football.

WELCOME TO FTX FIELD AT CALIFORNIA MEMORIAL STADIUM

- On Aug. 23, Cal Athletics and Learfield's Cal Bears Sports Properties, and West Realm Shires Services Inc., owners and operators of FTX.US, a leading U.S.-regulated cryptocurrency exchange, announced the first-ever collegiate cryptocurrency naming rights sponsorship.
- As part of the \$17.5 million, 10-year deal, Learfield will accept the full payment in cryptocurrency on behalf of the university.

'UNCLE LUC' BEQUETTE MAKES 51ST CAREER START

- Luc Bequette, now in his seventh collegiate season – five at Cal, one at Boston College last year, back to Cal for 2021 – continues to be a productive force along the defensive line. Through three games, he has 12

tackles, including a quarterback sack in the opener vs. Nevada.

— Over his career, he has played in 56 games (45 at Cal) and made 52 starts (41 at Cal). He is one of six active FBS players to have played in at least 55 games. He is also tied for second among active FBS players with 52 career starts and only one behind Thomas Hennigan of Appalachian State with 53 (Corey Dublin of Tulane also has 52).

— Bequette, whose first season in Berkeley came in 2015 when many of his current teammates were in middle school, has 12.0 career sacks and 16.5 career tackles for loss.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

— Through three games this year, Cal has only two turnovers (no fumbles), which is second in the Pac-12 and No. 22 nationally. Cal is one of only 22 teams without a lost fumble this season.

— Daniel Scott had 9-yard pick six in the second quarter at TCU to give Cal a 12-0 lead, his second career interception. The play marked Cal's first interception returned for a score since both Elijah Hicks and Ashtyn Davis accomplished the feat in the first quarter vs. Colorado in 2018.— Miles

— Josh Drayden and Cameron Goode, Cal's only two sixth-year seniors who have been teammates all six years, have been roommates since their first year in Berkeley.

— Cal ranks No. 2 in the Pac-12 and No. 28 nationally in fewest sacks allowed per game (1.33) - no sacks against Sacramento State - as well as leading the Pac-12 and ranking No. 8 nationally in fewest tackles for loss allowed (3.00 per game).

— ILB Evan Tattersall leads the Bears with 22 tackles, already a career season high.

— Lu-Magia Hearn and Jeremiah Hunter both had their first career starts vs. Sac State.

— Miles Williams had his first career interception in the fourth quarter vs. Nevada.

— Cal used the same starting lineup on offense and defense against both Nevada and TCU.

II BEARS MAKE CAL DEBUTS - 7 VS. NEVADA, 4 AT TCU

— Seven Golden Bears made their Cal debuts against Nevada: Marqez Bimage, Ricky Correia, Lu-Magia Hearn III, Jeremiah Hunter, Keleki Latu, Stanley McKenzie and Raymond Woodie III. Hearn and Latu were the only two true freshmen to play against the Wolf Pack, while Correia, Hunter and McKenzie did not see any game action last season. Bimage (Texas) and Woodie (Florida State) are transfers. Hunter caught a pair of passes for 35 yards, including a 28-yarder that was Cal's longest pass play, and McKenzie was in on two tackles.

— At TCU, four more players made their Golden Bear debuts - fifth-year senior OLB Matt Horwitz, junior DL Darius Long, true freshman ILB Femi Oladejo and freshman TE Jermaine Terry II.

EXPERIENCED GROUP OF BEARS

— Five student-athletes have started 25 or more games at Cal: Luc Bequette (41), Valentino Daltoso (37), Elijah Hicks (37), Cameron Goode (29) and Chase Garbers (26).

— Cal has 10 players who made at least nine starts during the team's last full season in 2019: C. Brooks, Cindric, Daltoso, Deng, Garbers, Goode, Hicks, Johnson, Mettauer and Tonges.

— The Bears have eight of 11 players who started all four games last season: Crawford, Deng, Drayden, Garbers, Goode, Hicks, Johnson and Mettauer.

— The offensive line is an experienced unit that includes 10 players who combined for 143 games played and 99 starts through 2020.

CAL ROSTER GROWS FOR 2021 SEASON

— After the NCAA allowed student-athletes to return for an additional year, nine Bears who were set to finish their final season of eligibility have decided to return for one additional year as "Super Seniors": Trevon Clark (WR), Kekoa Crawford (WR), Valentino Daltoso (OL), Marcel Dancy (RB), Kuony Deng (OLB), Josh Drayden (CB), Cameron Goode (OLB) and Elijah Hicks (S). Luc Bequette (DL) also returned to Cal after playing one season at Boston College. Crawford, Daltoso, Dancy, Deng, Drayden and Goode are all in their sixth years of eligibility; Bequette is in his seventh.

— Between nine seniors who returned for an additional year and another nine early enrollees, Cal had a large roster of 103 players available for spring ball and had 118 for fall camp.

— Cal signed 22 members to the team in the class of 2021. The recruiting class ranked No. 20 nationally according to ESPN, the highest the Bears have been ranked since 2011. The class included eight four-star recruits and seven who were ranked in the top 300 by at least one publication. Thirteen members of the class played their prep football in California, as the Bears emphasized recruiting the Bay Area.

— Cal has defeated a ranked team during every season of Justin Wilcox's tenure (2017 vs. No. 8/9 Washington State, 2018 vs. No. 15/13 Washington, 2019 vs. No. 14/12 Washington and 2020 vs. No. 23/21/20 Oregon).

TRAVERS FAMILY ENDOWS HEAD COACH POSITION

— The Travers made a \$10 million commitment from the Travers Family Foundation to UC Berkeley's Light the Way campaign, including a \$7.5 million commitment to endow the Travers Family Head Football Coach position, providing essential resources for Cal football to ensure a world-class program, an exceptional coaching staff and a continued positive impact on student-athletes. In addition, the Travers have also made a \$2.5 million commitment to augment their endowment for the Charles and Louise Travers Department of Political Science that supports this preeminent, nationally-ranked department.

VIRTUAL TOUR

— The NCAA instituted a dead period starting at the onset of the pandemic that extended to May 31, 2021. To combat the lack of on-campus recruiting, Cal created a virtual tour to highlight all of the aspects of attending the No. 1 public school in the country. The tour showcases a 360-degree 3D view of Cal facilities, including the Aaron Rodgers Locker Room, weight room, FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium and other aspects of Cal's world-class program.

GARBERS IN FOURTH YEAR AS CAL STARTER

- Chase Garbers has led the Bears to a 15-11 record as the starting quarterback, and Cal is 15-7 in games when Garbers has played more than half the game, including 7-0 in 2019. The Bears are also 7-5 when Garbers starts and plays more than a half on the road.
- Garbers has 40 career touchdown passes, now ranking tied for ninth in Cal history for most TD passes (also Mike Pawlawski, 1988-91). Next in line is Aaron Rodgers, who had 43 TD passes from 2003-04.
- Garbers had a career-high 28 completions in Cal's game at Oregon State (with 3 TDs) last year.
- Garbers has eight career rushing touchdowns and needs one more to tie the school record for most rushing TDs by a quarterback.
- Garbers is the Pac-12's active leader in quarterback wins (15) and starts (26).
- Garbers was named Offensive MVP of the 2019 Redbox Bowl after passing for 272 yards and recording five total touchdowns (4 passing, 1 rushing).
- Ryan Glover started 10 games at QB for Penn in 2018, finishing 122-for-205 for 1,482 yards and seven touchdowns. He also rushed for 300 yards and two touchdowns. He spent the 2020 season at Western Carolina, where he went 86-for-147 with 832 yards and 3 touchdowns.
- Robby Rowell played at Utah in 2019 and threw for 13 yards on three attempts.

DEEP STABLE OF BACKS

- Damien Moore has led Cal in rushing in all three games this season - 79 yards vs. Nevada (1 TD), 71 yards at TCU (2 TDs) and 87 yards (2 TDs) vs. Sac State.
- Moore set a career high with 121 yards rushing on only 10 carries vs. Stanford last fall. Moore had runs of 54 and 29 yards as he recorded Cal's only 100-yard game of 2020.
- It marked the first time a Cal freshman had rushed for 100+ yards since redshirt-freshman Shane Vereen ran for 101 yards vs. Michigan State on August 30, 2008. Moore was the first true freshman to run for 100+ yards since Marshawn Lynch ran for 122 yards vs. Stanford on November 20, 2004.
- Christopher Brooks scored 12 total touchdowns (8 rushing, 4 receiving) in 13 games during the 2019 season, including multi-score games vs. Washington State and UCLA in 2019.
- Brooks has 1,200 rushing yards and 241 receiving yards in his career.
- Marcel Dancy started and totaled 76 yards rushing on a career-high 17 carries vs. Oregon State in 2020.
- DeCarlos Brooks had a 38-yard run vs. Nevada in the season opener. He was named Arizona's Offensive Player of the Year during his senior year of high school in 2019.
- Chris Street was a four-star recruit who played in two games during his freshman season in 2020.
- Ashton Stredick rushed for 6,420 yards and 88 touchdowns in 32 career high school games.

- Cal moved to a pro-style offense under offensive coordinator Bill Musgrave in 2020 that incorporates more tight ends while asking them to do much more than they did in the spread offense during the first three years of Justin Wilcox's tenure.
- Nick Alftin moved to tight end in 2020 after previously playing at outside linebacker.
- Collin Moore had two catches for 28 yards, including Cal's longest play of the day, a 26-yard catch down the sideline, during the 2020 season opener at UCLA. He also caught a touchdown in Cal's Redbox Bowl win to end the 2019 season.
- Jake Tonges caught a career-high nine receptions and totaled 55 yards in Cal's game at Oregon State in 2020. He caught the go-ahead touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- Tonges had the longest play of the 2019 season as he had a 60-yard touchdown and 88 total yards in Cal's win at Ole Miss.
- Gavin Reinwald has 27 career catches for 260 yards while adding two touchdowns.
- Cal added Jake Muller in the class of 2020 and welcomed Keleki Latu and Jermaine Terry in the class of 2021.
- Terry was a consensus four-star recruit and was the top-ranked tight end in the class of 2021 according to ESPN. He decided to stay home and live up to his "Hometown Hero" nickname.

CAL RETURNS BALANCED RECEIVING CORPS

- Nikko Remigio leads the Bears with 11 receptions this season, including a pair of TDs. He had a team-high seven catches in the season opener vs. Nevada, including a 2-yard TD reception.
- Remigio had six catches for 81 yards and one touchdown vs. No. 23 Oregon last year. Remigio was Cal's leading receiver in 2019.
- Kekoa Crawford caught a career-high 10 balls for 141 yards and one touchdown in Cal's game vs. Oregon State in 2019. He was the first Cal receiver with 10 catches since Chad Hansen had 10 vs. UCLA on Nov. 26, 2016.
- Trevon Clark had two catches for 122 yards (44 yards after catch), including a career-long 68-yarder, and one TD at TCU, and has 10 receptions for 227 yards (2 TDs) through three games in 2021.
- Jeremiah Hunter missed the 2020 season after getting injured in fall camp. He had two catches for 35 yards vs. Nevada, including a 28-yarder for Cal's longest play of the game, then had two receptions for 48 yards (with a 42-yard reception) at TCU.
- Hunter led the Bears with five catches for 78 yards vs. Sac State, including a 45-yard TD reception.
- Tommy Christakos caught two touchdown passes in Cal's first scrimmage of spring ball on March 6 to help earn the nickname "Top Shelf Tommy" from wide receiver coach Burl Toler III.
- Justin Richard Baker came to Cal after a standout high school career in Washington, which also saw him lead a rally to support to LGBTQ+ teachers at his school who were being discriminated against.
- J.Michael Sturdivant arrived at Cal after an Under Armour All-American performance in high school, which had him ranked as one of the top wide receivers in the Class of 2021.

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OFFENSIVE LINE RETURNS EXPERIENCE. DEPTH

- Through three games in 2021, Cal's offensive line has allowed only four sacks.
- Cal ranks No. 2 in the Pac-12 and No. 28 nationally for fewest sacks allowed per game (1.33) - no sacks against Sacramento State - as well as atop the Pac-12 and ranking No. 8 nationally for fewest tackles for loss allowed (3.00 per game).
- The offensive line returns an experienced unit that features eight players who combined for 104 games and 74 starts entering the 2021 season.
- Valentino Daltoso is a starter for the fifth consecutive year after exercising his option on a sixth year of eligibility. Daltoso has 38 games and 37 starts — starting 12 times at left tackles, 12 times at left guard, 10 at right guard and three times at right tackle (all in 2021).
- After McKade Mettauwer and Matthew Cindric combined for 25 starts during their freshman seasons in 2019, the duo combined to start seven games at guard during the 2020 season.
- Will Craig played in two games at left tackle in 2020 after starting one game in 2019. He played nine games as a freshman in 2018, spelling current Baltimore Raven Patrick Mekari at left tackle.
- Due to a number of players being unavailable at Oregon State and vs. Stanford last year, Brayden Rohme made his first career start at offensive tackles for the Bears. Brian Driscoll also played a significant number of snaps at center against OSU after Michael Saffell left the game due to injury.
- Ben Coleman switched to offensive line last fall and has made an immediate impact earning reps at all of the interior positions on the line. He earned his first start (at left guard) vs. Nevada.
- Bastian Swinney and Ryan Lange enrolled in January.

- Luc Bequette returned to the team this fall. After spending five seasons at Cal, he played the 2020 season at Boston College after the Pac-12 announced it wouldn't play a season. He has transferred back to Cal for his seventh year of eligibility.
- Bequette played his 56th collegiate game (45th at Cal) and made his 52nd career start (41st at Cal) vs. Sac State. He had an 8-yard sack in Nevada opener and has 12 total tackles on the year.
- Aaron Maldonado returns after missing the entire 2020 season. In 2019, he recorded two sacks.
- Akili Calhoun enrolled in January to provide depth to the defensive line.
- Brett Johnson will miss the 2021 season after surgery to repair a broken hip sustained in an automobile accident during spring of 2021.

GOODE, DENG HIGHLIGHT CAL'S OUTSIDE LINEBACKING CORPS

- Cameron Goode notched at least 1.0 TFL in each game in 2020, ranking second in both the FBS and the Pac-12 in tackles per loss per game. He also ranked 30th in the FBS in sacks per game at 0.75.
- Goode is 3.5 sacks and 6.5 TFLs from entering Cal's all-time top 10 list in both categories.
- Goode had two sacks and three TFLs at TCU.
- Kuony Deng was named a team captain by his teammates in his second year in the program last fall after transferring to Cal from Independence CC (Kansas), which was the subject of the Netflix show "Last Chance U" during Deng's lone season at Independence. Deng did not see much screen time on the program.
- Deng, who led Cal with 31 tackles in 2020, missed the Sac State game last week with a lower body injury.
- Deng was named Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week when he forced fumbles on two critical fourth-quarter possessions to cause turnovers and help Cal preserve its upset over No. 23 Oregon in 2020.
- Deng has six career games with 10+ tackles and 10 games with 8+ tackles.
- Braxten Croteau set a career high with five tackles in Cal's season opener at UCLA last fall. He also had a crucial fourth-down tackle for loss on C.J. Verdell in Cal's upset of No. 23 Oregon.
- Orin Patu's father, Saul, played at Oregon alongside Justin Wilcox and Peter Sirmon.

- Miles Williams picked off his first career interception at the 1-yard line to stop a potential Nevada scoring drive in the fourth quarter.
- Florida State transfer Raymond Woodie III played in 19 games and recorded 34 tackles the past two years for the Seminoles, also contributing 4.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.

Justin Wilcox is in his fifth season as the Travers Family Head Football Coach at Cal and his 21st campaign in collegiate coaching in 2021. Wilcox compiled a long list of accomplishments and signature wins in his first four seasons as the Golden Bears' head coach, leading Cal to back-to-back winning seasons and bowl games in 2018 and 2019 for the first time since 2008 and 2009, as well as four victories that knocked off a combination of five reigning and current Pac-12 champions in 2018 at USC (2017 champion) and Washington (2018 champion), 2019 at Washington (2018 champion) and 2020 against Oregon (2019 and 2020 champion). His teams have also produced victories over all five schools in the Pac-12 North and been road winners at each of the Pac-12's other three California schools, ending droughts that dated back to 2000 at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, as well as 2009 at both the Rose Bowl and Stanford Stadium. The Bears have also taken down a top-20 team in each of Wilcox's first four seasons with victories over No. 8/9 Washington State, No. 15/13 Washington, No. 14/12 Washington and most recently in 2020 against No. 23/21/20 Oregon. In addition, Wilcox's teams have produced a 9-2 mark in non-conference regular-season games including a 4-1 record against Power 5 schools.

Wilcox's defense was just getting on track in 2020 when COVID-19 ended an often-delayed season after four games with its final performance a second-half shutout of eventual Pac-12 champion Oregon in a 21-17 home victory over the Ducks. Cal was the only team to blank the Ducks for a half in 2019 or 2020 and did it twice, adding a first-half shutout of the high-powered offense in Eugene in 2019.

Wilcox began the 2019 season with four straight wins to move the Bears into the No. 15 spot in the AP Top 25 and No. 16 in the Coaches Poll. The victories included road wins at then-No. 14/12 Washington and Ole Miss, with the latter the first road triumph by a Pac-12 school at an SEC foe since 2010. The two signature victories helped the Bears to a 4-2 mark in true road games to give Cal back-to-back winning seasons on the road for the first time since 2004. A strong defense led by consensus first-team All-American and Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year Evan Weaver defined the 2019 squad. Weaver led the nation in total tackles (school-record and career-high 182), total tackles per game (14.0), solo tackles (103) and solo tackles per game (7.9) for a defense that allowed only 21.9 points per game and ranked fourth in the Pac-12 in both scoring defense and total defense (389.9 ypg). On offense, Cal put together game-winning drives on its final possessions both at Washington and Stanford while committing only 13 turnovers, two less than the previous school record of 15 set in 2016. Cal also sported a 7-0 record in games that quarterback Chase Garbers started and finished.

Wilcox guided the Bears to the Cheez-It Bowl and a 7-6 record in his second campaign in 2018 with the bowl appearance Cal's first since 2015. The Bears won four of five Pac-12 games in one stretch, highlighted by signature wins over eventual Pac-12 champion and then-No. 15/13 Washington as well as at USC. The victory over the Trojans clinched bowl eligibility and marked Cal's first win against USC since 2003 and its first at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum since 2000. Cal also started the season with a 3-0 mark and in Week 5 made its first appearance since 2015 in the AP Top 25 at No. 24. Cal's defense finished the 2018 campaign among national and Pac-12 leaders in nearly every category. Cal ranked in the top 10 nationally and paced the conference in interceptions (21, No. 2 NCAA), defensive TD's (5, No. T4 NCAA), turnovers gained (28, No. T6 NCAA) and passing yards allowed (175.1 ypg, No. 9 NCAA). The Bears also led the league and ranked in the top 20 in the country in pass efficiency defense (107.26, No. 11 NCAA) and first downs allowed (227, No. 18 NCAA). In addition, Cal was 15th nationally in total defense (317.2 ypg) and 22nd in scoring defense (20.4 ypg).

The highlights of Wilcox's first season as the head coach in Berkeley in 2017 included a 3-0 start and non-conference wins over Power 5 programs North Carolina and Ole Miss, as well as a 37-3 victory over then No. 8/9 Washington State. The victory was the Bears' first against a top-10 team since 2003 and only its second top-10 win dating back to 1977. Cal finished 5-7 overall and also notched a Pac-12 victory over Oregon State while taking three conference opponents to the wire before falling by a combined total of seven points to Arizona, and on the road in its final two games at Stanford and UCLA.

Wilcox spent 11 seasons as a defensive coordinator at Boise State (2006-09), Tennessee (2010-11), Washington (2012-13), USC (2014-15) and Wisconsin (2016) before being hired as Cal's head coach in January of 2017. He has been a member of staffs that have gone to 15 bowl games and won five conference or division championships.

Wilcox spent three seasons as Cal's linebackers coach from 2003-05 in his first position as a full-time coach following two campaigns as a graduate assistant at Boise State (2001-02). The Bears posted a 26-12 record during his first stint in Berkeley with trips to the Insight, Holiday and Las Vegas bowls.

A 1999 graduate of Oregon with a bachelor's degree in anthropology, Wilcox is the son of Dave Wilcox, a Pro Football Hall of Famer who played for the San Francisco 49ers from 1964-74. His uncle, John (Philadelphia Eagles, 1960), and brother, Josh (New Orleans Saints, 1998-99) also played in the NFL.

As a collegiate student-athlete, Wilcox was a safety and cornerback at Oregon (1996-99), helping the Ducks to three bowl games (1997 Las Vegas Bowl, 1998 Aloha Bowl, 1999 Sun Bowl). In 1999, he was named second-team All-Pac-10 and earned Pac-10 All-Academic honors.

Bill Musgrave (OC/QB)

Musgrave is in his second season as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Cal in 2021. Musgrave has more than two decades of coaching experience in the NFL and collegiate ranks, including 13 seasons as an offensive coordinator. The long list of quarterbacks he has tutored includes Pro Bowlers Steve Beuerlein, Matt Ryan and Derek Carr. Musgrave's 20 NFL seasons have included stints with Oakland (1997, 2015-16), Philadelphia (1998, 2014), Carolina (1999-2000), Jacksonville (2003-04), Washington (2005), Atlanta (2006-10), Minnesota (2011-13) and Denver (2017-18). Musgrave had some of his biggest success in Cal's backyard with Oakland when he inherited an offense that had ranked last in the NFL in 2014 in total offense (282.2 ypg) and second to last in scoring (15.9 ppg). The Raiders made the biggest offensive improvement in the NFL in yards per game (+91.1 ypg) and scoring (+10.2 ppg) in two seasons under Musgrave, finishing sixth in the league in 2016 in total offense (373.3 ypg) and seventh in scoring (26.0 ppg).

**Peter Sirmon (DC/ILB/RC)**

Sirmon is in his fourth season at Cal in 2021 and has defensive coordinator duties for the second year after spending 2019 as the co-defensive coordinator. Sirmon was instrumental to Cal's success in his first two seasons on the Bears' staff in 2018 and 2019, leading to his seventh and eighth consecutive bowl appearances as a coach. Sirmon paired up with Tim DeRuyter to earn 2019 FootballScoop Linebackers Coaches of the Year presented by AstroTurf. Sirmon has coached All-American inside linebackers Jordan Kunaszyk and Evan Weaver at Cal with the two combining to record three of the five biggest total tackle seasons in school history in 2018 and 2019. Sirmon was the defensive coordinator at Louisville (2017) and Mississippi State (2016) prior to his Cal arrival. He was a four-year collegiate teammate of Wilcox and a first-team All-Pac-10 selection at Oregon. Sirmon also played seven NFL seasons as a linebacker with the Tennessee Titans.

**Charlie Ragle (STC)**

Ragle is in his fifth season as Cal's special teams coordinator in 2021. He coached placekicker Matt Anderson, Cal's all-time leading scorer, and has also helped Cal have one of the better punt return units in the country, as the Bears averaged 11.1 yards per return during the 2019 season.

**Andrew Browning (DL)**

Browning is in his third season as the Golden Bears' defensive line coach in 2021 and fourth year on staff. He helped coach Brett Johnson to a spot on the PFF Freshman All-American team in 2019, and another pupil Zeandae Johnson was named the Redbox Bowl MVP during Browning's first campaign as defensive line coach.

**Geep Chryst (TE)**

Chryst begins his Cal coaching career in 2021 after 25 seasons of NFL coaching experience including stints as the offensive coordinator for the San Diego Chargers and San Francisco 49ers. Chryst helped the 49ers to three straight NFC Championship games and a Super Bowl XLVII appearance. Chryst began his coaching career in college at Wisconsin-Platteville and Wyoming, including coaching in the 1990 Copper Bowl against Cal.

**Keith Heyward (OLB)**

Heyward joins the Cal staff in 2021 after helping his teams to 12 bowl games in the previous 16 seasons including the past nine in a row. Heyward has coached 19 players who have been selected in the NFL Draft including four first rounders. He's also coached for a team ranked in the AP Top 25 at some point in the season in 13 of his 16 campaigns. Heyward helped Oregon to back-to-back Pac-12 titles and appearances in the Rose Bowl and Fiesta Bowl the last two seasons.

**Angus McClure (OL)**

McClure is in his second season as the offensive line coach at Cal in 2021 and his 30th as a football coach, including 25 in the collegiate ranks at Buffalo, Cal, Nebraska, Nevada, Sacramento State and UCLA. McClure is also considered one of the elite recruiters in college football and has 29 seasons of coaching experience.

**Aristotle Thompson (RB)**

Thompson is in his second season as the running backs coach at Cal in 2021 after spending the previous 11 campaigns coaching the same position at Cal Poly. Under Thompson's tutelage, the Mustangs featured at least one 1000-yard rusher in his final nine years at Cal Poly.

**Burl Toler III (WR)**

Toler III is in his fourth season as an assistant coach at Cal in 2021 and his third working with the wide receivers after spending 2018 coaching the running backs. He was a four-year letterwinner as a player at Cal from 2001-04 at wide receiver and helped the Golden Bears to a 2003 Insight Bowl win.

**Tre Watson (DB)**

Watson is in his first season with the Golden Bears in 2021. He was named to 247Sports' "30Under30" list of the top 30 coaches under 30 in 2020 when he was the defensive backs coach at UNLV following two campaigns as a defensive graduate assistant at Oregon. The Ducks won a Pac-12 title (2019), a pair of bowl games and compiled a 21-6 record during his two seasons at Oregon.

**Brian Johnson (AP)**

Johnson is in his first season as the head football athletic performance coach with the Bears in 2021 after spending the past 11 seasons on strength and conditioning staffs at FBS schools and in the NFL, including the last three campaigns as the director of strength and conditioning at Arizona. Johnson has coached 76 players that have been selected in the NFL Draft including 11 first rounders.

LAST MEETING VS. WASHINGTON

Bears Edge No. 14 Huskies After Long Weather Delay

Sept. 14, 2019

SEATTLE - At 1:22 a.m. Sunday morning, the Cal football team culminated a wild late night and early morning with a 20-19 victory over No. 14 Washington at Alaska Airlines Field at Husky Stadium.

It marked the second consecutive season the Bears edged the Huskies in a defensive-minded battle of wills, but this one was far from conventional.

With 9:46 remaining in the first quarter and the game scoreless, both teams jogged back to their locker rooms after a lightning warning was issued. The delay took 2 hours, 39 minutes, and it was 10:30 p.m. by the time play resumed.

What followed was an expected showdown of two of the top defenses in the country, and Cal came out on top after senior Greg Thomas booted a 17-yard field goal with eight seconds remaining.

"We don't really have any control over the elements off the field so we're rolling with the punches there," Cal head coach Justin Wilcox said. "It's a little unique. I'm just really proud of the guys and how they battled. That was a gritty win. It wasn't the cleanest, but they just keep fighting. They are really a tough bunch of guys, and I really appreciate them for that."

After amassing just 90 total yards in the first half, the Bears (2-0, 1-0 Pac-12) began to figure some things out in the third quarter, especially on the ground. The combination of Christopher Brown Jr.'s bruising style and Marcel Dancy's quick feet helped Cal total 134 yards rushing in the second half, and Dancy reached the end zone twice. His second score from 8 yards out gave the Bears their first lead at 17-13 with 50 seconds remaining in the third quarter.

Washington's Peyton Henry connected on a pair of field goals in the fourth quarter - including a career-long 49-yarder with 2:05 to play - to put the Huskies back on top. But Cal quarterback Chase Garbers, who finished with modest numbers but also played a turnover-free game, engineered a late comeback. He completed a 19-yard pass to Jordan Duncan to move into Husky territory and later in the drive found Kekoa Crawford on a 27-yard catch-and-run to move the ball to the Washington 3-yard line with 1:25 left.

Thomas' second field goal of the night sent the Cal sideline into a frenzy, and the Bears were able to close it out.

Brown Jr. rushed for 80 yards on the ground on 16 carries and Dancy added 72 yards and the two touchdowns on seven rushes.

The Huskies moved the ball at times, but Cal's defense flexed its muscle when it needed to most, allowing just a single touchdown in the second quarter. Henry made four field goals for Washington.

Cal All-America candidate Evan Weaver was arguably the best player on the field on either side, tying a career-high with 18 tackles while recording two tackles for loss. He also forced the first fumble that was recovered by the Bears' Ben Hawk Schrider.

GAME 1 - BEARS FALL TO NEVADA IN SEASON-OPENER

BERKELEY - A season-opener that began with so much promise ended in disappointment for the Golden Bears, as Cal fell to Nevada 22-17 at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium.

Cal scored on each of its first two possessions of the game to establish a 14-0 advantage just before the end of the first quarter, but could only manage a 24-yard field goal by Dario Longhetto the rest of the way.

The Bears played their first game in front of their home fans since Nov. 16, 2019, and gave the crowd of 35,117 a reason to celebrate with two sustained drives early.

Cal took the opening kickoff and forged a 15-play, 63-yard drive that ate up over nine minutes of the clock and ended on Damien Moore's 1-yard touchdown run. The Wolf Pack promptly went three-and-out on its first possession of the game, and Cal's offense went right to work again. The Bears put together a nine-play, 72-yard drive, with Nikko Remigio scoring on a 2-yard pass from quarterback Chase Garbers.

But Cal's offense suddenly went silent, and Nevada started to climb back in it. The Wolf Pack cut it to 14-13 by halftime, and Nevada scored a touchdown on its first possession of the third quarter to take a 19-14 lead. The Wolf Pack added another field goal with 6:26 remaining in the third quarter.

Longhetto's field goal cut Nevada's advantage to 22-17 with 12:59 left, and after Cal safety Miles Williams recorded an interception at the Golden Bear 1-yard line, Cal put together a promising 77-yard drive that ultimately stalled at the Wolf Pack 22. Longhetto missed a 40-yard field goal attempt with 7:11 to play.

Cal had two late possessions with chances to come back, but Garbers was intercepted and the Bears ultimately turned the ball over on downs with 47 seconds remaining.

GAME 2 - TCU EDGES CAL IN TIGHT CONTEST, 34-32

FORT WORTH, Texas - Quentin Johnston caught two of Max Duggan's three touchdown passes, with the go-ahead score coming on a nifty catch-and-run as TCU beat Cal, 34-32, on Saturday.

Johnston put the Horned Frogs (2-0) ahead to stay with the 45-yard TD catch with 9:53 left, when he twisted around one defender who fell down near the 30 and then shed the attempted tackle by another inside the 10. Johnston finished with five catches for 95 yards.

Zach Evans ran for 183 yards on 22 carries, with a 51-yard TD just before halftime for the Horned Frogs. Duggan completed 17 of 31 passes for 234 yards and added 71 yards rushing on 19 carries with a 9-yard keeper for a TD with 5:47 left for a 34-26 lead.

Chase Garbers threw for 309 yards and two touchdowns for Cal (0-2). He had 235 yards passing in the first half - a career best for one half - with 199 of that coming on only four plays (49, 54, 28 and 68 yards).

Cal led 19-7 after Garbers threw a 7-yard TD to Nikko Remigio. That was a play after a 68-yard catch by Trevon Johnson, whose only other catch was a 54-yard TD.

But Evans scored with 11 seconds before halftime, and the Frogs opened the second half with a 15-play, 75-yard drive that ended with Johnston's 18-yard catch that gave them their first lead at 21-19.

NOTES:

-- Garbers finished 16-for-27 for 309 yards and 2 touchdowns. He was 11-for-14 for 235 yards and 2 touchdowns in the first half - his most yards ever in one half. He threw for 202 yards in the second half at Ole Miss in 2019.

-- Garbers had a career-long 68 completion to Trevon Clark in the second quarter. It marked Cal's longest pass play since Ross Bowers had a 75-yard TD pass to Kanawai Noa at Oregon on Sept. 30, 2017.

-- Damien Moore scored two touchdowns for the first time in his career (on runs of 12 and 1 yards). He finished the game with 71 yards on 14 carries.

-- Daniel Scott had 9-yard pick six in the second quarter to give Cal a 12-0 lead. It was his second career interception. The play marked Cal's first pick six since the Bears had two vs. Colorado on Nov. 24, 2018 (Elijah Hicks, Ashtyn Davis)

-- Cameron Goode had his 15th and 16th career sacks for a combined minus-27 yards. The two sacks tied a career high (also at UCLA in 2019).

GAME 3 - PROLIFIC OFFENSE CARRIES CAL PAST SACRAMENTO STATE

BERKELEY – The Cal football team had its most prolific offensive performance in three years Saturday as the Golden Bears notched their first win of the season, a 42-30 triumph over Sacramento State at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium.

The Bears racked up 534 yards of total offense, their highest output since amassing 539 yards in a 49-7 win over Oregon State in 2018. Quarterback Chase Garbers went 22-for-34 for 288 yards and two touchdowns while also rushing for 68 yards and a score.

"We know our potential as an offense," said Cal running back Damien Moore, who rushed for 87 yards and a pair of touchdowns. "This was just another way we were able to show it. I know we can do more, and we're going to need to go into Pac-12 play."

Nikko Remigio returned the second half kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown to put the Bears up 28-6 to give themselves some breathing room against the Hornets, who racked up 467 yards of offense themselves and kept pressure on Cal's defense the entire game.

Wide receivers Jeremiah Hunter and Trevon Clark caught touchdown passes from Garbers. Evan Tattersall led Cal's defensive effort with a career-high 10 tackles.

"You never minimize a win," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "It's hard to win in college football, regardless of who you are playing. Sac State has good players and they are as well-coached as any team we will play. It's good to get a win, but we all know we need to be much, much better."

NOTES:

-- Cal improved to 11-3 vs. non-conference opponents (10-2 regular season) under Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox since 2017.

-- Cal's 534 yards of total offense were a season best, and the most since posting 539 against Oregon State in 2018.

-- Chase Garbers completed 10-of-10 passes in the first quarter and his first 11 consecutive passes.

-- Jeremiah Hunter hauled in his first career touchdown on a career-long 45-yard reception in the second quarter. He ended the day with career highs in receptions (5) and receiving yards (78).

-- Nikko Remigio returned the second-half kickoff for a 99-yard touchdown. It was Cal's first kick return for a touchdown since Ashtyn Davis ran back an 89-yarder vs. Idaho State in 2018. The kick return TD was also the longest since Trevor Davis took one to the house for 100 yards at Washington State in 2014 and tied for sixth all-time in school history.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Field photographers/videographers must wear a photo vest at all times, in addition to a photo credential. Photo credentials are not distributed in advance and must be picked up on the day of the game at Media Will Call. Photo vests are also distributed at Media Will Call and should be returned following use to the receptacle on the field behind the visitor (west) bench and near the entrance to the photographers work room in front of Section EE.

NCAA rules limit photographers/videographers to shooting outside the restraining line surrounding the playing field and restrict photographers from entering the team areas inside the 20-yard lines.

In addition, photographers and videographers are welcome to use the photo deck located on level six of the Peter E. Haas Press Box and work from the main press area on level seven.
