WASHINGTON at MICHIGAN Huskies Head To Ann Arbor For First Time In 19 Years

THE GAME: The Washington football team (0-1) heads to Ann Arbor to face Michigan (1-0) this Saturday, Sept. 11, in the Huskies' first road game since Nov. 23, 2019. Washington played just four games in 2020, all of them in Seattle. Washington will be looking to bounce back from a 13-7 loss to Montana in the season opener last Saturday, while Michigan enters the game off of a season-opening, 47-14 win over Western Michigan. The Huskies and Wolverines will be playing one another for the 13th time, 19 years and 12 days since the previous meeting, Aug. 31, 2002, also at Michigan Stadium. The game kicks off at 8:00 p.m. ET/5:00 p.m. PT and will air on ABC television. Since new polls won't be released until Tuesday, Washington is currently ranked No. 21 in the preseason AP poll and No. 20 in the USA Today Sports ACFC Coaches Poll. Following the trip to Michigan, the Huskies will return home for their next two games: Sept. 18 vs. Arkansas State and Sept. 25 vs. California.

QUICK HITTERS: UW tight end Cade Otton currently ranks No. 6 in school history in career receptions by a tight end (71) and eighth in career receiving yards by a TE (858) ... Washington has won its last four consecutive regular-season games vs. Big Ten opponents ... just two true freshmen saw action in the UW-Montana game: DLs Kua'o Peihopa and Voi Tunuofi ... in total, 13 players saw their first action in a Husky uniform in the season-opener ... eight players made their first career UW start in the Montana game, which means that 37 members of the current roster have started at least one game for the Huskies ... 108 of the 125 players on the UW roster are freshmen or sophomores ... 77 are freshmen ... UW RS-freshman Dylan Morris started at QB in the opener last year, joining Jake Locker (RS-freshman in 2007) and Jake Browning (true freshman in 2015) as the only Huskies to start a season opener as a freshman in the modern era ... UW has gone 76 games in a row without allowing an opponent to score more than 35 points, easily the longest such streak in the nation.

TELEVISION: The Washington-Michigan game will air on ABC television, with Sean McDonough (play by play), Todd Blackledge (color), and Molly McGrath (sideline) calling the action. The TV broadcast can also be viewed at ESPN.com/watch.

RADIO: All Washington football games will air on the Washington Sports Network from Learfield, with Tony Castricone (play by play), former Husky tight end Cameron Cleeland (analyst) and former UW basketball player Elise Woodward (sidelines) on the call. Radio coverage begins four hours before kickoff on the network's flagship station: Seattle's SportsRadio 950 KJR with "Husky Gameday" live from The Zone for Husky home games. Statewide coverage on the 15-station Washington Sports Network begins two hours before kickoff. The entire broadcast is available worldwide on the Huskies Gameday mobile app and on GoHuskies.com. The UW broadcast of the game will also air on Sirius channel 111 and XM channel 197. There will also be a national radio broadcast on ESPN Radio with Sean Kelley, Barrett Jones and Ian Fitzsimmons. Additionally, the Jimmy Lake Show airs each Wednesday during the season (starting Sept. 1), at 6:00 p.m. PT.

JIMMY LAKE

HEAD COACH

SECOND SEASON AT UW



When former Husky head coach Chris Petersen surprised the UW community by announcing that he would step down following the 2019 football season, there was no hesitation as to who best to replace him. In fact, it took nearly no time for Jimmy Lake to be offered the job.

On Dec. 2, 2019, the announcement was made of the change, with Lake taking over the program immediately following Washington's victory in the 2019 Las Vegas Bowl.

In his first season, a tumultuous fall during which the sports world was affected from top to bottom by the worldwide pandemic, the Huskies went 3-1 and won the Pac-12 North Division title. Four Huskies – two each on offense and defense – earned first-team All-Pac-12 honors and the Huskies led the conference in total defense.

While Lake became head coach for the first time in 2020, you'd have been hard-pressed to find a better résumé for an new Husky head coach.

In his six prior seasons at Washington – two as defensive backs coach, two as co-defensive coordinator and the last two as defensive coordinator – Lake has earned a reputation as a teacher, recruiter and tactician, helping the UW become one of the strongest and most consistent defensive teams – and specifically one of the top secondaries – in the nation.

Year after year, the Huskies, who have five or more defensive backs on the field the majority of the time, play aggressive and precise defense and turn out highly-regarded professional prospects.

In 2019, his last as defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach, Lake molded another strong unit despite the loss of nine defensive starters from the previous year. Starting as many as three true freshmen in the secondary, his unit limited opponents to 19.4 points per game. Elijah Molden earned second-team All-America and first-team All-Pac-12, while Myles Bryant was a second-team all-conference pick. Freshman DBs Trent McDuffie and Cameron Williams each earned Freshman All-America.

In 2018, his first year as the UW's defensive coordinator, Lake continued the Huskies' reign as the top defense in the Pac-12 Conference. For the fourth year in a row, Washington led the league in both scoring (15.5 points per game) and total (301.8 yards per game) defense. The Huskies were also second in the conference in rushing defense, passing yards defense and pass efficiency defense.

Washington produced four, first-team All-Pac-12 players on Lake's side of the ball: All-America defensive backs Taylor Rapp and Byron Murphy, All-America linebacker Ben Burr-Kirven and nose tackle Greg Gaines. Burr-Kirven was named the Pat Tillman Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year (second year in a row for the UW) as well as the Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year for football, while Gaines was the second Husky in a row to win the Morris Trophy, given to the best offensive and defensive linemen in the conference, as voted by opposing players.

Along with Rapp and Murphy, who both earned first-team All-America from at least one outlet each, Rapp also coached three other All-Pac-12 honorees. Bryant was a second-team selection, alongside Molden, who was honored as a special teams player. Senior safety Jojo McIntosh also earned honorable mention All-Pac-12 in 2018.

In 2017, the Huskies led the Pac-12 in both total defense (eighth nationally) and scoring defense (fifth nationally) and were the national leader in fewest yards allowed per completion (9.42), thanks largely to the defensive backs unit coached by Lake. Rapp earned first-team All-Pac-12 honors. Another Husky DB, Zeke Turner, went on to sign with the Arizona Cardinals following the 2017 college season, and earned a spot on the NFL All-Rookie team.

In 2016, Lake helped coach a Husky defense that once again topped all Pac-12 defenses as the Dawgs went 12-2 and earned a trip to the College Football Playoff. The Dawgs led the conference in both total defense (316.9 yards per game, 12th in the nation) and scoring defense (17.7 points per game, eighth) in the nation, while also leading all FBS schools in turnover margin (1.29 per game) and takeaways (33). Washington was also first in the conference in first downs allowed and third down conversion defense, while finishing second in red zone defense, rushing defense and sacks.

The UW secondary helped the Dawgs lead the conference and finish eighth in the country in interceptions. Budda Baker and Sidney Jones both earned first-team All-Pac-12 while Kevin King earned honorable mention. Baker, who earned a trip to the Pro Bowl as a rookie

with the Arizona Cardinals in 2017, was a consensus All-America pick while Jones was a scout.com first-team All-America and a second-team selection from the Football Writers and Sports Illustrated. Additionally, Rapp was the Pac-12's defensive freshman of the year, the MVP of the Pac-12 Championship Game and a freshman All-America.

In 2015, the Husky defense led the Pac-12 in scoring defense, total defense and red-zone defense and finished second in both pass efficiency defense and rushing defense. Two Husky sophomores Baker and Jones, both earned first-team All-Pac-12. Jones led the conference in passes defended and was in the top five in interceptions, fumbles forced and fumbles recovered.

In his first season at the UW as a member of Petersen's 2014 staff, Lake took on the challenge of coaching a secondary that frequently included three true freshmen and a true sophomore in the four starting spots. In the end, he helped Baker earn freshman All-America honors while helping the UW to a No. 9 national ranking in turnover margin and a top-40 marking scoring defense.

Lake joined Petersen's staff from Boise State where he was in charge of the secondary and was the defensive pass game coordinator in 2012 and 2013.

In 2013, the Broncos ranked second in the Mountain West in points allowed (24.8) and interceptions (16), third in total defense (413.4) and pass efficiency defense (129.7) and fourth in sacks (30). They also tied for the conference low allowing just 17 touchdown passes.

Lake mentored sophomore cornerback Donte Deayon, who earned 2013 second-team All-Conference honors after finishing second in the league with six interceptions and fourth with 15 passes defended.

In his debut season with the Broncos in 2012, Lake led a secondary that was fifth nationally in both pass defense (169.5) and pass efficiency defense (101.4). The team also ranked eighth nationally in scoring defense (15.8) and 12th nationally in total defense (315.6). The Broncos also picked off 18 passes to tie for the 12th-most nationally.

Three of his four starting defensive backs earned All-Mountain West honors following the season, including first-team selection Jamar Taylor at cornerback. Cornerback Jerrell Gavins was named second-team all-league, and safety Jeremy Ioane was honorable mention.

Taylor went on to become the second-highest drafted cornerback in school history, taken in the second round of the 2013 NFL Draft - No. 54 overall - by the Miami Dolphins.

Before joining Boise State, Lake worked in the National Football League. He spent 2010-11 as defensive backs coach for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and 2008 as DB coach for the Detroit Lions. He also served as the assistant defensive backs coach for Tampa Bay from 2006-07.

While with the Buccaneers, Lake's defensive backs finished seventh in the NFL in pass defense in 2012, a group that was anchored by five-time Pro Bowl selection Ronde Barber.

Prior to coaching in the professional ranks, Lake coached the secondary at Montana State in 2005. The Bobcats' defense finished the season ranked No. 1 in the Big Sky Conference, and his secondary allowed a conference-low 165.6 passing yards per game. Also on the Montana State staff in 2005 was UW defensive coordinator Pete Kwiatkowski.

Lake spent one season coaching defensive backs at Washington in 2004 under Keith Gilbertson. That Huskies' secondary helped the team rank first in the Pacific-10 Conference and 17th-nationally in pass defense.

From 2000-03, Lake coached the secondary at his alma mater Eastern Washington.

Lake was honorable mention All-Big Sky as a strong safety and was also an academic all-conference selection. He graduated with a business administration degree in 2000.

Lake was born in Walnut Creek, Calif., but moved around as a child thanks to his father's service in the U.S. Air Force. He also lived in Turkey and the Philippines, among others, before completing high school in Spokane, Wash., at North Central High. He and wife, Michele, are the parents of three children: Jimmy, Jr., Faith and Bronson.

COACHING STAFF: Washington's second season under head coach Jimmy Lake features a staff that returns nearly entirely in tact from 2020, with just one change among the 10 full-time assistants, though several titles have changed as well. Bob Gregory, who has been on the UW staff since 2014, has been promoted to defensive coordinator ahead of the 2021 season. He will continue to also oversee the inside linebackers. Running backs coach Keith Bhonapha is also entering his eighth season on the UW staff, and has added special teams coordinator to his title in 2021. UW alum Ikaika Malloe, who lettered as a Husky from 1993 to 1996 and once worked as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, is back for his sixth season, including his second as co-defensive coordinator. He joined the staff after the 2015 season, coming to Seattle from Utah State, and has also moved from coaching the defensive line to outside linebackers. Fifth-year offensive line coach Scott Huff spent the previous 11 seasons at Boise State, his alma mater. Former USC safety Will Harris, in his fourth year on the UW staff, was elevated to defensive backs coach with Lake moving to head coach in 2020. Back for a third season at the UW is wide receivers coach Junior Adams, who came to Seattle after two seasons as offensive coordinator at Western Kentucky. John Donovan enters his second season as UW's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was offensive coordinator at Vanderbilt and Penn State before spending the previous four years in various roles with the Jacksonville Jaguars. Two other second-year coaches are tight ends coach Derham Cato and assistant defensive backs coach Terrence Brown. Cato, a former coordinator at Davidson, spent the previous four years as an offensive analyst at UW. Brown is a Stanford alum who spent the 2018 and 2019 at Vanderbilt, and was a graduate assistant at Washington from 2015 through 2017. The line new full-time staff member is defensive line coach Rip Rowan, who had been a defensive quality control coach for the Huskies since 2019. Two of four UW graduate assistant coaches are returners to their position: Daniel Segal (offense) and Jon Rowe (offense). They're joined by new GAs Austin Taylor (offense) and Jaylen Johnson (defense), a former UW defensive lineman.

HUSKIES vs. WOLVERINES HISTORY: UW and Michigan have played one another 12 times, with the Huskies winning five of those games. Four of those 12 meetings have come in the Rose Bowl game, with the two teams splitting those four games.

The two teams first met in 1953 and 1954, with the Wolverines notching shutouts in each: 50-0 in 1953 in Ann Arbor; and 14-0 the following year in Seattle. Michigan

won two more against Washington in 1969 (45-7 in Ann Arbor) and 1970 (17-3 in Seattle), but the Huskies have won five of eight since that 0-4 start to the series.

In Don James' first bowl game as Washington head coach, No. 13 UW won the 1978 Rose Bowl, 27-20, upsetting fourth-ranked Michigan. UW built a 27-7 lead behind two touchdown passes and one run from MVP Warren Moon, and held off a Rick Leach-led Michigan team for the win. Just three years later, No. 5 Michigan earned a 23-6 win over No. 16 Washington on New Year's Day in Pasadena.

The series returned to the regular season a few years later, with Washington winning a pair of early-season, non-conference meetings, 25-24 at Husky Stadium in 1983 and 20-11 the following season in Ann Arbor.

The 1983 game is remembered by Husky fans as one of the great regular-season, non-conference victories in program history, and the UW career highlight of quarterback Steve Pelluer, who finished the game with 14 straight completions, leading UW to a late victory. Pelluer completed eight straight on the game-winning drive, which culminated with a seven-yard TD pass to Mark Pattison, which cut the UM lead to 24-23. Then, the UW opted to go for two on the conversion, when Pelluer threw a strike to Larry Michael to wrap up the 25-24 win.

After those two mid-1980s meetings, the two programs next met at the 1992 Rose Bowl, where No. 2 Washington beat No. 4 Michigan, 34-14, to wrap up a 12-0 season and a share of the national championship. The next year, with UW in tumult, No. 7 Michigan handed the No. 9 Huskies a 38-31 loss in Pasadena.

The most recent meetings came in 2001 and 2002. In the first of those, played three days before the 9/11 attacks, 15th-ranked Washington edged Michigan, 23-18, thanks in large part to cornerback Omare Lowe, who blocked a field goal that was returned for a touchdown, then returned an interception for a score, all in less than one minute in the fourth quarter.

The following year at Michigan Stadium, the Wolverines got a last-minute, 44-yard field goal from Philip Brabbs to win, 31-29. The game-winning drive was famously helped along by an illegal participation (12 men on the field) penalty on the Washington defense that extended the drive.

HUSKIES vs. THE BIG TEN: Washington holds a 48-46-2 record all-time vs. current Big Ten opponents, a record that includes an 0-3 mark against Penn State (though the Nittany Lions were not members of the Big Ten at the time of two of those games against the UW) and 4-5-1 vs. Nebraska, also not a Big Ten member at the time of any of those games. Washington has played all 12 current Big Ten teams but have faced a Big Ten opponent only eight times since 2003 (the UW played Indiana in '03, Ohio State in '07, Illinois in 2013-14, Rutgers in 2016-17, Penn State in the 2017 Fiesta Bowl and Ohio State in the 2019 Rose Bowl). The Huskies have played Big Ten teams nine times in bowl games since 1990 (not counting Nebraska in the Holiday Bowl in 2010): Iowa in the 1990 Rose Bowl, Michigan in the 1992 and 1993 Rose Bowls, Iowa in the 1995 Sun Bowl, Michigan State in the 1997 Aloha Bowl, Purdue in the 2001 Rose Bowl, Purdue in the 2002 Sun Bowl, Penn State in the 2017 Fiesta Bowl and OSU the 2019 Rose Bowl. The Huskies went 4-5 in those games. Here's the UW's all-time record vs. current Big Ten teams: 7-4 vs. Illinois; 1-2 vs. Indiana; 3-3 vs. Iowa; 1-0 vs. Maryland; 5-7 vs. Michigan; 2-1 vs. Michigan State; 7-10 vs. Minnesota; 4-5-1 vs. Nebraska; 3-0 vs. Northwestern; 3-9 vs. Ohio State; 0-3 vs. Penn State; 7-2-1 vs. Purdue; 2-0 vs. Rutgers; 4-0 vs. Wisconsin.

TEAM NOTES

EXPERIENCE AND YOUTH: Thanks in part to the extended eligibility that resulted from the pandemic, Washington's 2021 roster is remarkable for both its youth and its experience, all at once. Washington returns 10 starters on offense and eight on defense, along with returning "starters" at kicker (both FG/PAT and kickoff), punter, holder and long snapper. Those numbers are all higher than average. What's more, the roster includes 17 individuals who have started at least one game on offense, and 13 on defense. All totaled, those 29 players (one of them, Alex Cook, has started on offense and defense) have started 212 games (129 on offense, 83 on defense).

All that said, the UW roster includes just six players in their final year of available eligibility: P Race Porter, OLB Ryan Bowman, QB Patrick O'Brien, C Luke Wattenberg, and TBs Sean McGrew and Kamari Pleasant. Of the 125 players on the current roster, 77 are listed as freshmen (55) or redshirt freshmen (22), while 31 more are sophomores. That means that 108 of 125 players (86 percent) have three or more years of eligibility remaining, entering the 2021 season. The roster includes just 11 juniors, five seniors and one grad transfer.

OPPONENTS 35-AND-UNDER: Washington hasn't allowed an opponent to score more than 35 points in a game since a 44-30 loss at UCLA in 2014. That's a streak of 76 games in a row that the Huskies' opponent has failed to score more than 35. In that 75-game stretch, Husky foes have scored 30 or more just 12 times (of those 12, five were exactly 30 points) and have been held to 14 or fewer points 31 times. In that same span of 75 games, the UW has scored more than 35 points on 30 occasions. No other team in the FBS has a current streak longer than 35 games (San Diego State).

DEFENSE vs. BIG PLAYS: Last year (albeit in only four games), Washington's defense allowed just one play from scrimmage for more than 40 yards, tied for fewest in the nation. In 2019, the Huskies gave up just seven such plays of 40 or more yards, the eighth-lowest total (tied) in FBS. The median for 40-plus yard plays allowed in 2019 was 14. Also in 2019, the Huskies allowed just two plays over 50 yards, the third-lowest (tied) total (the median was seven). The year before, the Huskies gave up just ONE scrimmage play of 40 or more yards all season. No other FBS team allowed fewer than four and 102 teams allowed 10 or more that year. In 2017, the UW also led the nation with fewest 40-yard scrimmage plays allowed (3) and were second in fewest 30-yard plays (14). They were tied for 5th and 2nd, respectively, in 2016. In the Huskies' opener vs. Montana, UW allowed just one play of more than 20 yards — a 37-yard run.

THE PAC-12: Prior to the 2011 season, the Pac-10 Conference added Utah and Colorado to expand to the Pac-12. Washington, which along with California is one of two schools who have been in the conference since its founding in 1915, plays in the Pac-12 North, along with the other three Northwest schools (Oregon, OSU, WSU) and Stanford and Cal. Under the current system, each school plays all five division rivals, plus four of six teams in the other division each season. The first two seasons, the Huskies did not face UCLA or Arizona State. In 2013 and 14, the Huskies didn't play Utah or USC. In 2015 in 2016, neither UCLA nor Colorado were on the UW schedule, while the Huskies didn't face USC and Arizona in 2017 or 2018. The 2019 season marked the start of a new cycle, moving the rotation back to where it started. Therefore, the Huskies 2019 and 2020 scheduled did not include UCLA and Arizona State. In 2021 and 2002, Washington will not play USC and Utah.

THE 100-YARD FACTOR: Since the 1947 season, Washington is 221-69-3 (.759) when a Husky player rushes for 100 yards in a game. The Huskies are 22-3 in such games dating back to the 2016 season.

HISTORY LESSON: Successfully rushing the football and winning go hand-in-hand for the Huskies. Since 1990, UW has rushed for 200 yards in a game 122 times. The Huskies' record stands at 105-16-1 (.865) in those contests.

HUSKY STADIUM RENOVATION: Husky Stadium underwent a major renovation over from Nov., 2011, through Aug., 2013, as the entire lower bowl and south upper deck were demolished and replaced. The new facility features a new, state-of-the-art football operations center (weight room, training room, locker room, meeting rooms, coaches' offices) in the west end, much more premium seating options and a new playing surface. Husky Stadium had featured a track up until 2011, so seats that were once far from the field, particularly in the west end, are much closer to the action. UW is 41-13 at home since the re-opening of Husky Stadium.

ALASKA AIRLINES FIELD AT HUSKY STADIUM: The Oregon game on Nov. 5, 2011, marked the final game in Husky Stadium prior to major renovations that were completed in summer, 2013. The Huskies re-opened their home field with a 38-6 win over then-No. 19 Boise State on Aug. 31, 2013. The 2018 season marks the 99th season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium stands at 397-182-21 (.679).
