ARIZONA NOTES & NUMBERS

» The Arizona Wildcats travel to Seattle to face the Washington Huskies on Saturday afternoon. Arizona is searching for their first Pac-12 road victory under head coach Jedd Fisch.

» Saturday's game will kick off at 2:30 p.m. MST with a television broadcast on Pac-12 Networks featuring Ted Robinson (PxP) and Yogi Roth (Analyst) on the call.

» The Wildcats trail the all-time series with the Huskies, 11-24-1, and have lost five games in a row. Arizona is 4-15 all-time in Seattle and has not beaten Washington on the road since 2007, a 48-41 decision.

» In the Wildcats victory over Colorado two weeks ago, Arizona quarterback Jayden de Laura tied the program single-game record with six passing touchdowns. His 484 passing yards were the fifth most in a single contest in school history.

» Wide receiver Jacob Cowing currently leads the Pac-12 and ranks among the top five FBS players in receiving TD (T-4th, 7), receptions per game (4th, 7.7), receiving yards (5th, 643), and receiving yards per game (5th, 107.2).

» Tight end Tanner McLachlan hauled in two receptions for 26 yards against the Ducks last weekend. He now has 19 receptions on the year, tied for eighth most in a single season by a Wildcat tight end and four shy of moving into the top five.

» The Wildcats were penalized just three times for 11 yards against the Ducks, marking their third game of the year with fewer than five penalties. Arizona recorded just one such game last year (BYU, 4) and just three total across the 2019 and 2020 seasons.

Head Coach Jedd Fisch is available twice weekly at press conferences each Monday and Thursday of game weeks during the regular season. VERSUS WASHINGTON: This is the 37th all-time meeting between the Arizona Wildcats and the Washington Huskies. Arizona trails the series 11-24-1. The Huskies have won five straight games dating back to Oct. 31, 2015. Arizona's last win in the series was a 27-26 result on Nov. 15, 2014, at Arizona Stadium. The Wildcats last victory in Seattle was a 48-41 win on Oct. 27, 2007. The Wildcats have lost five in a row and are 4-15 overall in Seattle. Arizona is 7-9-1 at home in the series.

ABOUT LAST WEEKEND: Bo Nix threw for 265 yards and ran for three touchdowns; Noah Whittington added an early 55-yard touchdown run and No. 12 Oregon rolled to a 49-22 victory over Arizona on Saturday night. The Ducks (5-1, 3-0 Pac-12) scored touchdowns on seven consecutive drives starting midway through the first quarter, building a 49-13 lead by late in the third. Oregon piled up 580 yards of total offense - including 306 yards on the ground - doing pretty much whatever it wanted against Arizona (3-3, 1-2). Nix was a great on the ground for a second straight game, scoring on a pair of 2-yard runs before breaking free for a 25-yard touchdown in the third quarter. He ran for a career-high 141 yards and two touchdowns last week against Stanford. The Ducks have won five straight since a season-opening loss to Georgia, scoring more than 40 points in every game. They built a 28-13 lead by halftime Saturday. Nix completed 13 of 14 passes for 187 yards as the offense racked up 346 total yards before the break. Arizona managed to stay within striking distance thanks to a 52-yard touchdown run by DJ Williams and a pair of field goals from Tyler Loop, including a 36-yarder as time expired in the second quarter. But the Ducks erased any doubt about the outcome in the third. Oregon opened the second half with an efficient eight-play, 75-yard drive, capped by Nix's second touchdown run for a 35-13 advantage. A few minutes later, Bucky Irving ran for a 22-yard touchdown and a 42-13 lead. Arizona's Jayden de Laura completed 24 of 42 passes for 241 yards, one touchdown and an interception. Oregon had to punt on its first offensive drive but quickly found its offensive rhythm. Whittington gave the Ducks a 7-3 lead late in the first quarter on a superb 55-yard touchdown run. The 5-foot-8, 194-pounder made one quick cut, evading a tackle, and then sprinted straight forward before blowing past Arizona defenders on his way to the end zone. The Ducks added to their momentum early in the second. Nix hit a diving Kris Hutson for a 42-yard gain that was just short of a touchdown. On the next play, Nix kept it himself for a 2-yard touchdown and 14-3 lead. Arizona had a promising first drive snuffed out at the Oregon 11 when de Laura and Jacob Cowing botched a handoff. Oregon's DJ Johnson was there to fall on the fumble. Oregon's Dontae Manning was called for targeting in the second quarter and ejected. He had a helmet-to-helmet hit on Arizona's Cowing.

GAME-CHANGER: The Arizona Wildcats finished the win against Colorado with two receivers recording over 100 yards receiving (Cowing 180 yards, Singer 163) for the second straight week following the 133-yard effort by Cowing and 103-yard performance by Singer at Cal on Sept. 24. Arizona has now notched two games with a pair of 100-yard receivers in a single season for the first time since 2014 (Cayleb Jones 186 & Austin Hill 127 vs. California; Austin Hill 110 & Samaje Grant 101 vs. UNLV). The Wildcats 673 yards of total offense in its 43-20 win over Colorado set a school record for most yards of offense in conference play as a member of the Pac-10/12 Conference. Cowing's 566 receiving yards are the third-most by an Arizona player through the team's first five games since 1996. Only Dennis Northcutt (629 yds, 1999) and Bobby Wade (581 yds, 2002) had more.

TOP RECEIVER: Junior wide receiver Jacob Cowing has made seven touchdown catches in his first six games with Arizona. He is two TD grabs away from moving into the top-10 in single-season touchdown receptions. Cowing is currently tied for 16th for a single season in program history. With three catches for 34 yards and a touchdown in the first quarter vs. Colorado, Cowing eclipsed the 3,000-yard mark for his collegiate career while catching his seventh touchdown of the season. He sits with 3,238-career yards after making six catches for 77 yards against No. 12 Oregon on Oct. 8. Cowing is 122nd in FBS history, moving past Arizona receivers Mike Thomas (3,231) and Dennis

QB1: Sophomore quarterback Jayden de Laura threw just one touchdown in the 49-22 loss to No. 12 Oregon last weekend. De Laura is one game shy of tying his career-best seven-game touchdown streak. He threw for a career-high 484 yards and six touchdowns against Colorado. 484 passing yards marked the most allowed by Colorado in school history. The six touchdown passes tie a school record set by Tom Tunnicliffe against Pacific on Oct. 23, 1982. De Laura led the Wildcats to a 43-20 win over Colorado and became the first Arizona QB with 400-plus passing yards in consecutive games since Matt Scott in 2012. De Laura's 484 yards marked a career high and the fifth most passing yards by a QB in Arizona history. He has set career-high marks in passing yards in back-to-back weeks. This performance comes on the heels of throwing for 401 yards at Cal to become the 19th quarterback in Arizona history to turn in a 400-yard passing performance. De Laura led a comeback 31-28 win after trailing by four entering the fourth quarter, 28-24, against North Dakota State. De Laura connected with Cowing on a 22-yard touchdown pass with 4:53 left in the fourth quarter to earn the win. De Laura threw for 229 yards and one touchdown and rushed for career-highs with 10 carries and 58 yards and a rushing touchdown against the Bison to help the Wildcats improve to 2-1. De Laura had a breakout first game with Arizona, throwing for 299 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Wildcats to a 38-20 win at San Diego State. He improved to 6-0 in his collegiate career when throwing three-plus touchdowns. De Laura's four touchdown passes are the most by an Arizona QB in their Wildcat debut since Anu Solomon threw four against UNLV in 2014. He completed 29-of-35 passes and connected with Jacob Cowing three times for touchdowns, as well as Tetairoa McMillan once for a TD. De Laura led Washington State to a 7-6 record and a berth in the Sun Bowl after throwing for 2,798 yards and 23 touchdowns on 227-for-359 passing. He was named 2021 All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention. De Laura threw multiple touchdown passes in eight games and led WSU to their first Apple Cup victory since 2012. He earned Rose Bowl Game Pac-12 Player of the Week honors after win over Oregon State in which he threw for a career-high 399 yards and three scores. As a first-year freshman in 2020 went 78-of-129 passing for 886 yards and five touchdowns in four games. De Laura prepped at powerhouse program St. Louis High School in Honolulu and helped lead program to two state championships. He went 11-0 and won state as a junior to earn second team All-Hawaii recognition. Followed that up with an undefeated season as a senior, steering the team to 12-0 finish and another state championship. De Laura was honored as a High School All-American according to MaxPreps. He was named 2019 Hawai'i Gatorade Player of the Year. De Laura, as a senior in 2019, threw for 3,452 yards and 29 touchdowns on 228-of-319 passing. Up for

a challenge? De Laura's full name is: Jayden pūkonakona ha'awi mai nā makua hā 'ele mai ka hiapo e wili 'ia me ke aloha de Laura.

LIMITED LAUNDRY: Against No. 12 Oregon, the Wildcats were penalized just three times for 11 yards, marking their third game of the year with fewer than five penalties. Arizona recorded just one such game last year (BYU, 4) and just three total across the 2019 and 2022 seasons. Arizona committed only one penalty for 15 yards against North Dakota State. The last time the Wildcats were flagged only once in a game was Oct. 5, 2019, against Colorado. In the game against NDSU, Arizona did not turn over the ball along with only one penalty. The last time the Wildcats had a turnover-free, one-penalty game was a 48-14 win over Washington on Oct. 4, 2008, at Arizona Stadium, a span of 167 games.

DEFENSIVE LEADERS: Safety Jaxen Turner made a career-high 13 tackles (8 solo, 5 assists). It marked the second time in his collegiate career that he finished a game with 10-plus tackles (first; 10 vs. UCLA, 10/9/21). Turner is third on the team with 37.0 total tackles. He has one of the Wildcats' two total interceptions. Linebacker Jerry Roberts reached double-digit tackles (10) against Mississippi State to achieve the feat in a second consecutive game. Roberts previously had one double digit tackle game in his career at Arizona (Utah 2021). Roberts is fifth in the Pac-12 with 7.7 tackles per game and is third in overall tackles (46.0). Senior defensive lineman Hunter Echols forced a fumble for the first time in his career and has set a new career high with 29.0 total tackles this season (14 solo, 15 assists). Senior Jalen Harris is well on his way to surpassing his career-high 44 tackles from 2021. Harris has 29.0 tackles (11 solo, 18 assists) through six games, averaging 4.83 tackles per game with 1.5 sacks.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING: Head Coach Jedd Fisch led the Wildcats to their first road victory under his leadership 38-20 over San Diego State on Sept. 3. Freshman wide receiver Tetairoa McMillan made the first touchdown reception of his collegiate career on a six-yard pass from de Laura. Junior wide receiver Jacob Cowing posted a career performance during his first game with the Wildcats, making eight catches for 152 yards and three touchdowns. It was the most receiving touchdowns in a debut for a Wildcat since Cayleb Jones hauled in three scores through the air against California on Sept. 20, 2014. It was the first time that a player making their Power Five debut scored three touchdowns since Texas Tech's Michael Crabtree in 2007. Redshirt freshman safety Dalton Johnson blocked a punt on SDSU's second drive, marking the first of his career. Last season, Arizona led the Pac-12 and ranked 17th nationally with two blocked punts. Running back DJ Williams set the tone on the ground in his first game with Arizona, gaining 88 yards and recording one touchdown.

HE'S GOING STREAKING: Junior wide receiver Jacob Cowing extended his streak of consecutive games with a catch to 38, which is the second-longest such streak in the nation (41, Chris Autman-Bell, WR, Minnesota). Through five games, Cowing is 5th in the nation with 643 receiving yards. He is also tied for fourth nationally in touchdown receptions with seven. Cowing recorded a career-high 180 receiving yards in his most recent outing against Colorado and he has caught a touchdown in each of his last five games. He made seven receptions for 133 yards at Cal, marking the second-most receiving yards in a single game this season. He has surpassed last year's top scoring threat through the air, running back Michael Wiley, who tallied four receiving TDs in 11 games played. He is three touchdown catches shy of breaking into the Arizona all-time top-10 and five off the single-season record of 11 touchdown catches held by six players. Cowing caught a touchdown with 4:53 remaining in the fourth quarter to put the Wildcats in front of North Dakota State 31-28, marking his third straight game with a reception (5 rec., 55 yards) and the first Wildcat player with touchdown catches in three straight games since Michael Wiley caught a touchdown in each of the final three games of the 2021 season. Cowing had a breakout game during his debut with Arizona. He made eight catches for 152 yards and three touchdowns to help the Wildcats to a season-opening 38-20 win at San Diego State. The junior from Maricopa, Cowing

LOOP THERE IT IS: Kicker Tyler Loop made three of three field goal attempts against No. 12 Oregon marking his second perfect kicking game on three-or-more field goal attempts this season. It also tied his career-high mark set in last year's Territorial Cup. He is now 20-for-22 on field goal attempts, remaining a perfect 17-for-17 from under 40 yards, and 32-for-32 on extra-points for his career. Loop is 20-for-20 on extra-point attempts and 8-of-10 on field goals so far this season. He made one of two attempts against North Dakota State, improving to 15-of-15 on his career prior to missing a 43-yard field goal attempt with 12:56 left the fourth quarter. Loop was one of four Pac-12 kickers to begin their collegiate career perfect in kicking at least 15 field goals including Arizona State's Thomas Weber, 17 straight from Sept. 1 to Nov. 3, 2007, Utah's Matt Gray, who made 14 straight from Aug. 31 to Sept. 22, 2017, and Nathan Villegas (Oregon), who made 14 straight to begin his collegiate career from Sept. 5 to Nov. 7, 1998.

TURNOVER SWORD: Arizona's defense has surpassed their 2021 turnover total just five games into the 2022 campaign. The Wildcats tied last year's mark (6) against North Dakota State in week three and surpassed it against Colorado in week five. The Wildcats now sit at seven turnovers after a fumble forced by Hunter Echols and recovered by Paris Shand in the fourth quarter against the Buffaloes.

BUILDING UNDER HEAD COACH JEDD FISCH: The Wildcats enter the second season of the Jedd Fisch era with a reenergized roster in tow. Coach Fisch and staff pulled in the No.21/No. 22 recruiting class nationally (per Rivals/247Sports) with key additions at multiple positions. That recruiting class ranked first (per Rivals) and third (per 247Sports) in the Pac-12 behind Oregon and Stanford. Fisch reeled in 23 commits

with five four-stars and 18 three-stars. Arizona landed the highest-ranked recruit in program history, wide receiver Tetairoa McMillan out of Servite High School. A five-star prospect that was ranked No. 5 at his position. McMillan was joined by teammates Keyan Burnett (TE), a four-star tight end, and Noah Fifita (QB) a three-star QB, out of Servite HS in Anaheim. The success in recruiting marked one of the top classes in program history.

STATE 48: The Wildcats roster features 29 players that call the state of Arizona home, including two players who stayed home in Tucson to continue their football careers. Arizona's 29 in-state players make up over 26% of the total roster. Among the notable Arizona natives are junior wide receiver Jacob Cowing, sophomore safety Jaydin Young, junior running back Drake Anderson, redshirt sophomore quarterback Gunner Cruz, redshirt junior wide receiver Jamarye Joiner, sophomore quarterback Will Plummer, sophomore running back Stevie Rucker Jr., redshirt senior defensive lineman Jalen Harris, freshman defensive lineman Russell Davis II, and junior offensive lineman Jordan Morgan.

I AM #1: Last season at the beginning of camp, Jedd Fisch began a new tradition of competition for the No. 1 jersey on both offense and defense. During 2021 fall camp, Jalen Harris won the No. 1 on defense and Stanley Berryhill III won No. 1 on offense. Harris carried over No. 1 for the defense into 2022. It was announced that wide receiver Anthony Simpson would don the No. 1 jersey. Simpson earned the jersey after his effort on special teams and offense during fall camp. "We made a decision that Anthony Simpson has done an incredible job on special teams," Head Coach Jedd Fisch said, "He's committed to being a four-core guy." In 2021, Harris finished fifth on the team in tackles (47) marking a career high, including six tackles for loss and four sacks.

WILDCATS IN THE NFL: The Wildcats are once again well represented in the National Football League this year with 10 former letterwinners active across the league. One of Arizona's most prestigious alumnus, tight end Rob Gronkowski, retired following the 2021 season after winning the fourth Super Bowl of his career. Gronk was a five-time Pro Bowl selection, a four-time First Team All-Pro selection, and was selected to the NFL's 2010s All-Decade Team and NFL 100th Anniversary All-Time Team. Over 11 seasons with New England and Tampa Bay, Gronkowski recorded 9,286 yards (5th all time) and 92 touchdowns (3rd all time). Quarterback Nick Foles is in his 11th NFL season after rewriting the Wildcats record books during his time in Tucson. RECAP

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Dylan Morris threw two second-half touchdown passes and Washington rallied to extend the nation's longest losing streak to 19 games with a 21-16 win over Arizona on Friday.

Washington (3-4, 2-2 Pac-12) stumbled through the first half and was down nine before rallying behind Morris in the fourth quarter. The Huskies' beleaguered quarterback hit Terrell Bynum on two long passes to set up two scores and Washington's defense shut down Arizona after being hit with big players earlier.

Arizona (0-7, 0-4) seemed to be on its way to ending its school-record losing streak, taking a 16-7 lead into the fourth quarter before imploding. The Wildcats' offense stalled and the defense buckled after dominating the first half, leaving them winless since December 2019.

Washington coach Jimmy Lake said this week he would stick with Morris at quarterback despite his ups and downs - eight touchdowns, eight interceptions - but freshman Sam Huard trotted out for the second series.

Morris played the rest of the first half, but didn't matter who was taking snaps. Washington had 65 yards in the first half and punted on six of its drives.

The Huskies snapped out of it in the second half.

Taking advantage of two long plays on third downs, Washington went 81 yards on eight plays on its opening drive. Bynum capped it by going over Arizona defensive back Jaydin Young's back and wrestling the ball from him for a 16-yard touchdown catch.

After an interception, Morris connected with Bynum on a 51-yard pass to set up Cameron Davis 9-yard TD run the next play that pulled the Huskies within 16-14.

Morris hit Bynum on another 51-yard pass and, with the help of a defensive holding penalty on third down, found Rome Odunze for an 8-yard touchdown to give the Huskies the lead.

The Wildcats stopped Washington on third down with 2:26 left, but were called for an illegal substitution, giving the Huskies a first down and a chance to all but run out the clock.

Arizona quarterback Will Plummer couldn't get much going in the first quarter - 17 yards - before orchestrating a 10-play, 64-yard drive. Receiver Jamarie Joiner scored on a 1-yard keeper and Lucas Havrisik's 50-yard field goal put the Wildcats up 13-0 at halftime.

The lead down to 16-7, Plummer threw an interception right to defensive lineman Tuli Letuligasenoa at Washington's 28-yard line and the Wildcats sputtered the rest of the way.

Veteran NFL and college coach Jedd Fisch was hired as the head coach of Arizona Football on Dec. 23, 2020. He enters his second season with the Wildcats in 2022. Fisch came to Arizona after eight years of coaching at the collegiate level, including stints in the ACC, Big Ten and Pac-12 and 13 years in the NFL, most recently with the New England Patriots.

Fisch's first year with the Wildcats in 2021 was highlighted by a marked defensive improvement, his first win at Arizona, and seven All-Pac-12 selections. Under his leadership, the Cats placed two players on the All-Pac-12 First Team for the first time in over a decade.

Under the guidance of Fisch and defensive coordinator Don Brown, the Wildcats defense finished the 2021 season ranked fifth in the Pac-12 in total defense, up from a 12th-place finish the year prior. Defensive linemen Kyon Barrs (second team) and Trevon Mason (HM), along with linebacker Anthony Pandey (HM) all earned All-Conference nods.

Fisch's first win at Arizona came in dramatic fashion, with a Michael Wiley rushing touchdown in the waning minutes sealing the Wildcats 10-3 victory over the visiting California Golden Bears.

Following his first season leading the Wildcats, Fisch and his staff successfully inked the nationally-lauded 2022 signing class. His first complete signing class, which included the first five-star player in program history, ranked second in the Pac-12 and 22nd nationally according to 247Sports. The 2022 class was headlined by five-star wide receiver Tetairoa McMillan, high school quarterback Noah Fifita, transfer quarterback Jayden de Laura, and numerous other highly-touted prep players and transfers. De Laura, who transferred to Arizona from Washington State, was named the 2021 Pac-12 Offensive Freshman of the Year after passing for 2,757 yards and 23 touchdowns with the Cougars.

The 44-year-old Fisch has been a part of championship seasons throughout his career, including with the Los Angeles Rams as a member of head coach Sean McVay's staff as the Rams won the NFC championship and appeared in Super Bowl LIII. Fisch's coaching pedigree also includes working under future NFL Hall of Famers Bill Belichick and Pete Carroll, as well as college football Hall of Fame member Steve Spurrier and Michigan's Jim Harbaugh.

Fisch has served on coaching staffs that reached five bowl games, highlighted by the 2016 Orange Bowl when he served as Michigan's passing game coordinator. His college coaching career began as a graduate assistant at Florida under Spurrier as the Gators advanced to the 2000 Citrus Bowl and the 2001 Sugar Bowl and won a SEC championship.

A widely-respected offensive mind, Fisch has helped guide top offenses in the NFL with three of his offenses finishing in the Top 10 in total offense, including the top-ranked offense with the Denver Broncos and the second-ranked offense with the Rams. While offensive coordinator at UCLA in 2017, Fisch guided the Bruins' offense to a top-three ranking in the Pac-12 before leading the Bruins in their final regular season game and to the Cactus Bowl as the interim head coach.

Fisch arrived in Tucson after spending the 2020 season as the quarterbacks coach for the New England Patriots. Prior to his position with the Patriots, Fisch spent two seasons as a member of McVay's offensive staff with the Rams as they posted the top offense in the NFL in 2018 with quarterback Jared Goff making back-to-back Pro Bowls.

Fisch's offense at Michigan produced the Big Ten's top scoring

and red zone offenses, as tight end Jake Butt won the Mackey Award and consensus All-America honors in 2016. Butt was one of 10 offensive players for Michigan to receive All-Big Ten honors that season. Fisch's impact was instant on the Wolverine offense as Jake Rudock became only the second quarterback in school history at the time to throw for more than 3,000 yards in a season.

In his second and third seasons as a college coach, the University of Miami's offense flourished under Fisch's quarterback tutelage. Stephen Morris set a single-season record for total offense with 3,415 yards in 2012 after Jacory Harris set a single-season Miami record with an efficient 65.0% completion for the season. Fisch first coached in a full-time capacity in college with the Minnesota Golden Gophers, serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks' coach in 2009.

Fisch broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the Houston Texans in 2001, serving as an assistant to head coach Dom Capers. He would go on to join the coaching staffs with the Broncos, Baltimore Ravens, Seattle Seahawks and Jacksonville Jaguars working for head coaches Mike Shanahan, Brian Billick, Pete Carroll and Gus Bradley respectively.

Fisch is a native of Livingston, N.J. and graduated from the University of Florida with a degree in Criminology in 1998. He earned his Master's degree from the University of Florida.

Fisch and his wife, Amber, have three daughters: Zaylee, Ashlee and Kendall.

RECAP

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Jayden de Laura threw four touchdown passes, three to fellow transfer Jacob Cowing, and Arizona beat San Diego State 38-20 on a sizzling Saturday to spoil the debut of Snapdragon Stadium.

The Aztecs (0-1) waited two years for their new stadium to be built next to where 70,000-seat SDCCU Stadium once stood, and then were embarrassed by the Wildcats (1-0) on a 100-degree day. SDSU announced a sellout of 34,046. Many seats were empty at kickoff and the east stands, totally exposed to the sun, were mostly empty by the fourth quarter.

Arizona avenged a 38-14 loss to SDSU in its home opener last year during a 1-11 season. De Laura, who transferred from Washington State, completed 22 of 35 passes for 299 yards. He was intercepted once. Cowing, a transfer from UTEP, had eight catches for 152 yards.

The Wildcats sacked transfer Braxton Burmeister on the first play from scrimmage, forced SDSU to punt and then scored the stadium's first points on Tyler Loop's 25-yard field goal.

De Laura, the Pac-12 Freshman Offensive Player of the Year at Washington State last season, hit Cowing for on a 17-yard pass for a 10-0 lead and then found freshman Tetairoa McMillan on a 4-yarder to make it 17-3 midway through the second quarter.

SDSU pulled to 17-10 on Burmeister's 11-yard pass to Tyrell Shavers. The Aztecs had a great chance to tie the game after Noah Tumblyn intercepted de Laura at the 40. Chance Bell rumbled into the end zone from 25 yards, but the play came back on a holding penalty. Jaxen Turner intercepted Burmeister on the next play and returned it 20 yards to set up de Laura's 4-yard scoring pass to Cowing with 28 seconds left in the first half.

Arizona took the opening kickoff of the second half and moved 75 yards in five plays, with Cowing pulling in a 25-yard scoring pass for a 31-10 lead.

SDSU scored 10 points in just more than three minutes to close to 31-20. Punting from his own end zone, Arizona's Kyle Ostendorp booted the ball into a lineman's backside and Jaylon Armistead recovered for a touchdown. Jack Browning kicked a 23-yard field goal.

THE TAKEAWAY

Arizona looked nothing like the team that staggered to a 1-11 finish in coach Jedd Fisch's first season. The Wildcats reloaded with 50 new players, including 11 from the transfer portal. De Laura transferred from WSU after throwing for 2,796 yards and 23 touchdowns, while Cowing moved over from UTEP after tallying 1,354 yards receiving.

RECAP

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Will Rogers threw for 313 yards and four touchdowns — two each to Austin Williams and Caleb Ducking — and Mississippi State beat Arizona 39-17 on Saturday night at Arizona Stadium.

It was a strange game for the Bulldogs, who looked like they were going to pull away multiple times before costly turnovers allowed Arizona to stay in the game. Ultimately, the defense was able to limit the damage from those miscues and Mississippi State was able to leave Tucson with a deceptively large advantage on the scoreboard.

Both teams finished with three turnovers.

Rogers finished 39-of-49 passing, completing 15 passes in a row at one point in the second half. Mississippi State finished with 426 total yards, including 106 on the ground.

Mississippi State (2-0) pushed ahead 25-10 early in the third quarter on a 5-yard touchdown pass from Rogers to Williams, capping an eight-play, 75-yard drive. It was one of many times that the Bulldogs clearly had the momentum.

But the Wildcats weren't done, taking advantage of a Mississippi State fumble to pull within 25-17 on the ensuing drive after a 2-yard touchdown pass from Jayden de Laura to Jacob Cowing.

Arizona was driving again later in the third quarter, but de Laura had a pass tipped at the line of scrimmage by Mississippi State's Tyrus Wheat. Teammate Nathaniel Watson plucked the ball out of the air and ran all the way to the Arizona 11. Four plays later, Rogers hit Williams for the pair's second touchdown of the night and a 32-17 lead.

De Laura — a transfer from Washington State — completed 23 of 45 passes for 220 yards, one touchdown and three interceptions.

It was the first meeting between the two programs.

Arizona (1-1) won the toss, elected to receive the kickoff, and that offensive confidence was rewarded with a quick touchdown drive. Michael Wiley ran 34 yards down the right sideline to the end zone for a 7-0 lead.

Mississippi State responded with the next 15 points and didn't trail again. The Bulldogs were helped by an ill-advised heave from de Laura, which turned into an interception and a touchdown on the ensuing drive.

Mississippi State took an 18-10 lead into halftime.

RECAP

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Jayden de Laura threw for 229 yards and a touchdown, ran for another score, and Arizona rallied to beat North Dakota State 31-28 on Saturday night.

The Wildcats snapped North Dakota State's FBS win streak at six games, dating to 2010. The Bison have won nine out of the past 11 national championships at the FCS level and boast several NFL alumni — including quarterbacks Carson Wentz, Trey Lance and Easton Stick.

Arizona was trailing 28-24 midway through the fourth quarter but got a crucial stop on fourth-and-2 at its own 23 to flip momentum. The Wildcats then drove the field and took a 31-28 lead on de Laura's perfectly placed 22-yard touchdown pass to Jacob Cowing in the corner of the end zone.

Arizona's defense did the rest, holding NDSU's previously prolific running game in check. De Laura finished 20-of-29 passing.

North Dakota State's Hunter Luepke scored three touchdowns — two on the ground and one through the air. He ran for 115 yards, leading the Bison's 283-yard rushing attack.

NDSU came into Saturday's game with six straight wins over FBS programs, knocking off Kansas, Minnesota, Colorado State, Kansas State, Iowa State and No. 11 Iowa.

Luepke looked like he was going to be the hero on Saturday, plowing through the line of scrimmage for a 38-yard touchdown to give the Bison a 28-24 lead late in the third quarter. The 236-pound fullback was so excited during the celebration that he even bowled over teammate Jake Lippe during the celebration before helping him up.

But Arizona had one more rally left in the back-and-forth contest.

The Wildcats led 17-14 on Tyler Loop's 36-yard field goal at the halftime buzzer.

Arizona jumped ahead 7-0 in the first quarter on Michael Wiley's 6-yard touchdown run. North Dakota State tied it at 7-all later in the first when Cam Miller found Luepke all alone for a 31-yard touchdown pass.

The Bison looked like they were about to grab the lead in the second quarter, but Hunter Echols strip-sacked Miller at the Arizona 17 and the Wildcats were able to recover the fumble. It was one of many examples of an opportunistic Arizona defense that gave up 407 yards but came up big at crucial moments.

Arizona took advantage of the turnover, driving the field and grabbing a 14-7 lead on de Laura's 7-yard touchdown run. Once again, the Bison responded with Miller's 2-yard run with 50 seconds before halftime tied it at 14.

RECAP

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP) — Jaydn Ott ran for 274 yards and three touchdowns and California opened Pac-12 play with a 49-31 victory over Arizona on Saturday.

Ott scored on a 73-yard run on the second play from scrimmage, an improbable 18-yarder in the third quarter after he had appeared to be stopped for a short gain, and then another 72-yarder to ice it late in the fourth.

Ott had the third most rushing yards in school history, trailing only Jahvid Best's 311 against Washington in 2008 and Jerry Drew's 283 against Oregon State in 1954.

Jack Plummer added three TD passes for the Golden Bears (3-1, 1-0), who won their sixth straight home game. It's their longest winning streak at Memorial Stadium since a nine-gamer in 2008-09.

Cal also ended a six-game skid against Arizona (2-2, 0-1) by beating the Wildcats for the first time since 2009.

Jayden de Laura threw for 401 yards and two touchdowns for the Wildcats (2-2, 0-1), who had no answers defensively and lost their 12th straight conference road game.

A year after Arizona beat COVID-depleted Cal 10-3 at home for its only win in 2021, the teams exceeded that point total after both teams scored touchdowns on the opening drive.

It was a back-and-forth, high-scoring affair in the first half with Ott scoring on a 73-yard run on the second play from scrimmage to set the tone.

The Wildcats scored on four of their first five drives of the game, getting two short TD runs by Jonah Coleman and Michael Wiley and a 24-yard TD pass from de Laura to Tetairoa McMillan.

Plummer threw a 16-yard TD pass to J. Michael Sturdivant in the second quarter and gave Cal the lead early in the third when he found Keleki Latu from 3 yards out on fourth-and-1.

Ott added his second TD midway through the third quarter. He ran into a group of defenders at the 13 yet managed to keep his feet and snuck out of the scrum to run it into the end zone to make it 35-24.

Ott added his second breakaway run late in the fourth quarter.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Jayden de Laura threw for 484 yards and tied a school record with six touchdowns, Jacob Cowing caught 12 passes for 180 yards and a touchdown and Arizona used that big night through the air to beat Colorado 43-20 on Saturday.

There were several offensive stars for Arizona, but it was a particularly good night for Dorian Singer, who made a pair of highlight-reel catches. The second - a fingertip catch in the back of the end zone for a 5-yard touchdown - gave the Wildcats a 19-7 lead.

Singer finished with nine catches for 163 yards.

Arizona (3-2, 1-1 Pac-12) is halfway to the six wins needed for bowl eligibility, one year after a dismal 1-11 campaign. The Wildcats rolled up 673 yards of total offense.

It was another lopsided loss for the Buffs (0-5, 0-2), who lost their first four games by at least 25 points and weren't much better against the Wildcats.

Colorado freshman Owen McCown completed 14 of 30 passes for 186 yards and a touchdown. He also ran for 43 yards and a touchdown.

The Wildcats took a 26-13 lead into halftime. The game could have been even more lopsided but Arizona couldn't convert on a few good opportunities. Among them: Singer's acrobatic one-handed grab for a 47-yard gain early in the second quarter put Arizona on Colorado's 3-yard line, but the Buffs stuffed the next four plays to keep the Wildcats out of the end zone.

De Laura threw for 273 yards and four touchdowns before halftime.

Arizona took an early 7-0 lead with a 75-yard touchdown drive on the opening possession. De Laura hit Michael Wiley for an 8-yard touchdown on the 11th play. Wiley finished with two touchdown catches.

The Buffs came right back with McCown orchestrating a nine-play, 70-yard drive. Colorado got close to the end zone on a 36-yard screen pass that caught Arizona in an all-out blitz and then McCown ran for a 1-yard touchdown on the next play.

Arizona would score the next 19 points and slowly pulled away.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — Bo Nix threw for 265 yards and ran for three touchdowns, Noah Whittington added an early 55-yard touchdown run and No. 12 Oregon rolled to a 49-22 victory over Arizona on Saturday night.

The Ducks (5-1, 3-0 Pac-12) scored touchdowns on seven consecutive drives starting midway through the first quarter, building a 49-13 lead by late in the third.

Oregon piled up 580 yards of total offense - including 306 yards on the ground - doing pretty much whatever it wanted against Arizona (3-3, 1-2).

Nix was a great on the ground for a second straight game, scoring on a pair of 2-yard runs before breaking free for a 25-yard touchdown in the third quarter. He ran for a career-high 141 yards and two touchdowns last week against Stanford.

The Ducks have won five straight since a season-opening loss to Georgia, scoring more than 40 points in every game. They built a 28-13 lead by halftime Saturday. Nix completed 13 of 14 passes for 187 yards as the offense racked up 346 total yards before the break.

Arizona managed to stay within striking distance thanks to a 52-yard touchdown run by DJ Williams and a pair of field goals from Tyler Loop, including a 36-yarder as time expired in the second quarter.

But the Ducks erased any doubt about the outcome in the third. Oregon opened the second half with an efficient eight-play, 75-yard drive, capped by Nix's second touchdown run for a 35-13 advantage. A few minutes later, Bucky Irving ran for a 22-yard touchdown and a 42-13 lead.

Arizona's Jayden de Laura completed 24 of 42 passes for 241 yards, one touchdown and an interception.

Oregon had to punt on its first offensive drive but quickly found its offensive rhythm.

Whittington gave the Ducks a 7-3 lead late in the first quarter on a superb 55-yard touchdown run. The 5-foot-8, 194-pounder made one quick cut, evading a tackle, and then sprinted straight forward before blowing past Arizona defenders on his way to the end zone.

The Ducks added to their momentum early in the second. Nix hit a diving Kris Hutson for a 42-yard gain that was just short of a touchdown. On the next play, Nix kept it himself for a 2-yard touchdown and 14-3 lead.

Arizona had a promising first drive snuffed out at the Oregon 11 when de Laura and Jacob Cowing botched a handoff. Oregon's DJ Johnson was there to fall on the fumble.
