

Post-Game Notes
Washington vs. Arizona
Husky Stadium, October 15, 2022

Michael Penix Jr. broke the UW's single-game passing yards record today, with a total of 516. The old record of 455 was set by Cody Pickett, vs. Arizona, in 2001. It is just the eighth 400-yard passing game in Husky history.

He also broke Marques Tuiasosopo's long-standing, single-game total offense record. Penix had 516 passing and 13 rushing yards for 529 yards of total offense. Against Stanford in 1999, Tuiasosopo rushed for 207 yards and passed for 302, for 509 total.

Penix also set the UW record for single-game completions, with 36, breaking Pickett's record of 35, which he accomplished twice: vs. Cal and WSU, both in 2002.

Penix had his fourth four-touchdown game of the season (passing, that is; he also rushed for one).

Penix is just the second Husky QB to reach 300 yards passing in seven straight games, tying Cody Pickett, who passed for 300 or more in the first seven games of the 2002 season (Pickett did not reach 300 yards in the final game of the 2001 season).

Penix's seven straight games of *200* or more yards are tied for second-most in UW history, behind only Cody Pickett (20, 2002-03), and tied with today's Husky Legend honoree Keith Price (7, 2011).

Only three UW quarterbacks have posted as many as 300-yard passing games, over their entire careers, as Penix has in his first seven games: Pickett (14), Jake Browning (9) and Price (7).

Through seven games, Washington has already surpassed its scoring total from all of last season, when the Huskies totaled 258 points (32 TDs, 11 FGs, 30 PATs) over 12 games. This year, the Huskies have scored a total of 295 points, on 38 TDs, 9 FGs and 36 PATs, including two two-pointers.

Washington has scored a touchdown on its first offensive possession in each game so far this season, a streak that continued today. By contrast, UW opponents are just 1-for-7 on game-opening drives, with ASU making a field goal last Saturday in Tempe.

In 2022, UW has scored a touchdown on 11 of 14 possessions that ended in the first quarter this year, despite going 1-for-2 today (the Huskies turned the ball over on downs on their second possession).

Rome Odunze, with 169 receiving yards today, is the first UW receiver in program history to record four consecutive 100-yard games. Reggie Williams was the last to have three straight, late in the 2003 season.

Odunze's 100-yard game was the seventh of the season by a UW player.

Sam Adams II scored his first career touchdown, on a four-yard pass from Michael Penix Jr. late in the second quarter.
