CALIFORNIA GOLDEN BEARS

BEARS HOST HUSKIES IN BERKELEY

ABOUT THE SERIES

- This will be the 101st all-time meeting between California and Washington.
- UW leads the all-time series, 55-41-4. The two teams have split the last six meetings since 2015, with the Bears winning twice in Seattle (30-24 in 2015, 20-19 in 2019) and once in Berkeley (12-10 in 2018).

YOU OTT-A KNOW

- Freshman running back Jaydn Ott has re-written the record books in his first six games at the collegiate level. The Chino, California native ran for 274 yards and three touchdowns on 19 carries in Cal's 49-31 win over Arizona on Sept. 24, the second-most in a game in the nation this season, trailing just Pittsburgh's Israel Abanikanda (320).
- Ott's 274 yards rushing were the most by a freshman in the FBS since Maryland redshirt freshman Anthony McFarland had 298 against Ohio State on Nov. 17, 2018, and were the most by a true freshman since Texas' Chris Warren III had 276 against Texas Tech on Nov. 26, 2015.
- Named a midseason true freshman All-American by On3, Ott currently ranks second in the Pac-12 and No. 22 nationally in rushing yards per game (96.7), third in the Pac-12 and No. 15 in the nation in rush yards per carry (6.5) and also third in the conference in overall rushing yards with 580, good enough for 29th nationally.
- Ott leads all Pac-12 freshmen and ranks second among freshmen in the country in rushing yards per game and all-purpose yards per game (116.2) and ranks third among first-year collegiate players in rush yards per carry. Ott stands fourth among true freshman in the NCAA with seven total touchdowns.

BEARS VS HUSKIES

- Cal has enjoyed a recent run of success against the Dawgs, earning victories over nationally-ranked Washington teams in both 2018 and 2019.
- The Bears beat the No. 15 Huskies in 2018 in Berkeley, 12-10, spurred by a 37-yard interception return for a touchdown from star linebacker Evan Weaver to highlight a brilliant defensive performance, holding Washington to just 250 yards of total offense as Weaver recorded 11 tackles.
- Making it two straight victories over the Huskies for the first time since 2005-06, the Bears pulled off a wild 20-19 win over No. 14 Washington in Seattle in 2019. After a 2 hour and 39 minute delay due to lightning and a 10:30 pm resumption of play, Cal got a 17-yard field goal from Greg Thomas with eight seconds remaining to pull off the victory as the game ended at 1:22 am on Sunday morning.

BEAR TERRITORY

- The Bears are riding a six-game home win streak after defeating Arizona on Sept. 24. Cal won the last three games of the 2021 season (Colorado, Oregon State, USC) and the first three tilts of 2022 (UC Davis, UNLV, Arizona).
- The last time Cal won more than six straight in Strawberry Canyon was in 2008 and 2009, when the Bears took nine straight victories. All seven games in 2008 and first two in 2009 before USC ended the streak on Oct. 3, 2009.
- Cal has won its first three home games for the first time since 2016 and hasn't started 4-0 in Bear Territory since the 2010 season.

TAKERS

- California has the longest streak of current games with at least one takeaway in the nation at 19.
- The Bears are third in the conference and 18th nationally with eight interceptions and are second in the Pac-12 and fourth nationally in turnover margin (1.33).
- Cal sits second in the Pac-12 conference and 34th nationally in scoring defense (21.7 ppg).

DAWG TURNED BEAR

- Cal Linebacker Jackson Sirmon is set to face his former team for the first time on Saturday after he played his first four collegiate seasons with the Huskies (2018-21).
- Joining his dad in Berkeley, Defensive Coordinator/Inside Linebackers coach Peter Sirmon for the 2022 season, Jackson played 33 career games and recorded 16 starts during his time in Seattle.
- Sirmon recorded 147 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss, one interception, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and a safety for the Huskies.

TOP OF THE PAC

- Jamieson Sheahan leads the Pac-12 and ranks No. 4 nationally with a punting average of 46.6 yards.
- Jeremiah Hunter is currently third in the Pac-12 with a 10.2 yards per punt return average, No. 18 in the NCAA.
- Hunter has been the primary target for quarterback Jack Plummer, sitting seventh in the Pac-12 in receiving yards per game (74.7), 10th in receiving yards (448) and eighth in receptions per game (5.0).
- On the defensive side of the ball, Jackson Sirmon has made his presence known in his first season as a Bear. The transfer from Washington is currently third in the Pac-12 and 44th nationally with 52 tackles.
- Dario Longhetto is second in the Pac-12 and 35th nationally in field goals per game (1.33).

LOTS OF NEW FACES

- Cal has 35 players in their first season with the Golden Bears including nine who have transferred after previously being on a roster at another four-year school.
- Xavier Carlton (Utah), Odua Isibor (UCLA), Demetric Jackson Jr. (Chattanooga), Tyler Jensen (Louisville), Spencer Lovell (Arizona State), Kenden Robinson Jr. (Northern Iowa), T.J. Session (Montana State), Jack Plummer (Purdue) and Jackson Sirmon (Washington).

2022 SCHEDULE

- Cal will host the 125th edition of the Big Game that will also serve as the 40th anniversary of The Play against Stanford on Nov. 19
- Cal has seven home games in 2022 beginning with non-conference contests against UC Davis (Sept. 3) and UNLV (Sept. 10) before later welcoming Pac-12 foes Arizona (Sept. 24, Homecoming), Washington (Oct. 22, Hall of Fame Game), Oregon (Oct. 29), Stanford (Nov. 19, 125th Big Game/40th Anniversary of The Play) and UCLA (Nov. 25, Senior Day/Joe Roth Game)
- Cal's 2022 road schedule includes a trip to Notre Dame that will be the first meeting between the teams in 55 seasons since they squared off in South Bend with the Fighting Irish the nation's No. 1 team on Sept. 23, 1967
- The Golden Bears will play conference road games at Washington State (Oct. 1), Colorado (Oct. 15), USC (Nov. 5) and Oregon State (Nov. 12)
- All regular-season games are on Saturdays other than a Friday contest against UCLA the day after Thanksgiving, while the Pac-12 Championship Game in Las Vegas is also on a Friday on Dec. 2

STARKEY'S FINAL PLAY

- Legendary Hall of Fame broadcaster Joe Starkey, best known for his "the band is out on the field" call of "The Play" in 1982, announced Thursday that he will retire as Cal's football radio play-by-play announcer following the 2022 campaign.
- In Starkey's 48th and final season on the mic, the 2022 Golden Bears will travel to Notre Dame to face the Fighting Irish for the first time in 55 years, celebrate the 125th Big Game and 40th anniversary of The Play in Berkeley, and host "Joe Starkey Day" for the regular-season finale in Strawberry Canyon against UCLA.
- Starkey has also had an array of broadcasting duties with professional sports organizations during his career that he mostly fulfilled in conjunction with his Cal duties, highlighted by a 22-year stint on the San Francisco 49ers' radio broadcast team (1987-2008) that included the final 20 campaigns as the play-by-play voice. The 49ers won their most recent three Super Bowls (XXIII, XXIV, XXIX) during Starkey's tenure with the team as he described plays for Pro Football Hall of Famers Joe Montana, Jerry Rice and Steve Young, among others.

PROMOS AND GIVEAWAYS

- Cal football fans will have plenty of exciting reasons to be in attendance at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium in 2022. The long list is highlighted by special giveaways, including a Cameron Jordan Bobblehead (Oregon) and Replica Axe for the first 10,000 fans through the gates for the 125th Big Game against Stanford.
- Special ticket offers are available to youth sports organizations for the regular-season finale against the UCLA Bruins.
- The home schedule also includes traditional events including Homecoming (Arizona), the Cal Athletics Hall of Fame Game (Washington), and the Joe Roth Game/Senior Day (UCLA).
- In addition, the Bears will celebrate the 40th anniversary of The Play and the 125th Big Game against Stanford as well "Joe Starkey Day" against UCLA - honoring longtime radio broadcaster Joe Starkey, who will retire at the end of the season after 48 years calling Cal games.

PLUMMER IS CAL'S FIRST NEW STARTING QB SINCE 2018

- Purdue transfer Jack Plummer has started each of Cal's first six games as the Golden Bears' first new starter at quarterback since Chase Garbers assumed the role during the 2018 campaign and started every game he didn't miss due to injury or illness through the 2021 season
- Plummer has completed 137-of-224 passes (61.2%) for 1509 yards with nine touchdowns and three interceptions for a 128.3 quarterback efficiency rating
- Plummer ranks fourth in the Pac-12 and 26th nationally in pass completions (22.63) and is coming off a Cal career-high 29 completions in a career-high 52 pass attempts at Colorado
- Plummer had thrown 137 consecutive passes over three full games and portions of two others without an interception until he was intercepted on his third pass attempt at Colorado (Cal's all-time record of 185 consecutive passes without an interception was set by Jared Goff in 2014)
- Plummer has played in 27 games with 18 starts in his collegiate career spanning four campaigns at Purdue (2018-21) and his first at Cal in 2022 and completed 456-of-716 passes (63.7%) for 4914 yards with 35 touchdowns and 13 interceptions for a 133.8 quarterback rating
- Kai Millner is the only other quarterback of the six on the Cal roster to have taken a collegiate snap with Milner getting in a pair of 2022 games in the season-opener against UC Davis and at Washington State when he connected with Keleki Latu on a seven-yard pass for the first completion of his career

JAYDN OTT RANKS AMONG PAC-12 AND NATION'S BEST

- True freshman Jaydn Ott ranks second in the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game (96.7, #22 NCAA) and third in rush yards per carry (6.5, #15 NCAA), overall rushing yards (580, #29 NCAA) and all-purpose yards per game (116.2, #42 NCAA), while he is tied for fourth in total touchdowns (7, #40T NCAA) and eighth in rushing touchdowns (5, #T63 NCAA)
- Ott leads all Pac-12 freshmen and ranks among the top freshmen in the country in rushing yards per game (#2 NCAA), all-purpose yards per game (#2 NCAA), overall rushing yards (#2 NCAA), rush yards per carry (#3 NCAA), total touchdowns (#4 NCAA) and rushing touchdowns (#T6 NCAA)
- Ott rushed for 274 yards and three touchdowns on the ground against Arizona on Sept. 24 with the rushing yards the second-most in an FBS game this season and the third-most ever by a Cal player to earn Off Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week honors among others
- Ott also picked up Pac-12 Freshman of the Week honors against Arizona as well as in each of the first two games of his Cal career against UC Davis (17-104 rush; 2-26-1TD receiving) and UNLV (7-52-1TD rush; 3-16-1TD receiving)

– Jeremiah Hunter (30-448, 2 TD) and J.Michael Sturdivant (29-341, 3 TD) have combined for totals of 59 receptions, 789 yards and five touchdown catches

– Hunter has been one of the top Pac-12 receivers all season and through Week 7 ranks among the league's receiving leaders in receiving yards per game (No. 7, 74.7), receptions per game (No. 8, 5.0) receiving yards (No. 10, 448)

– Sturdivant is tied ninth in the Pac-12 in receptions per game (4.8)

– Anderson and Hunter were both involved in the final play of the game in a 24-17 loss at Notre Dame in the Fighting Irish end zone when Anderson knocked the ball out of a Notre Dame player's hands before Hunter nearly came up with an acrobatic catch while lying on his back by managing to get his left hand on the ball as it was falling to the ground but was unable to pull it in before the ball fell to the ground for an incompletion after Anderson had knocked it loose

– Hunter had at least five receptions and 66 yards in each of his first five games including a career-high 109 yards receiving on a career-high-tying six receptions in his last full game at Washington State before coming out of the game at Colorado due to injury during the second quarter and not returning

– Sturdivant has at least four receptions and 45 yards receiving in each of his six contests including a career-high-tying six receptions on three occasions against UNLV, and at Washington State and Colorado, while his 71 yards receiving against the Cougars was a career best

– Mavin Anderson (18-160, 1 TD) registered career highs of six receptions and 61 yards receiving in his most recent contest at Colorado and is third on the team among wide receivers in both receptions and yards receiving

– Monroe Young (7-91), Mason Starling (3-21), Tommy Christakos (2-23) and Mason Mangum (1-31) also have at least one reception each with Starling making his Cal debut at Colorado after missing the first five games due to injury

NEW LOOK ON THE OFFENSIVE LINE

– After starting the same unit for each of the first three games, Cal switched up its offensive line prior to its fourth game of the campaign against Arizona with only LT Ben Coleman staying in the same position and it paid dividends with the Golden Bears racking up seven offensive touchdowns, 49 points, 354 yards rushing and 599 yards of total offense against the Wildcats

– Cal's seven offensive touchdowns against Arizona were its most since also picking up seven against Texas on Sept. 17, 2016, while its 49 points scored were the most since a 49-7 victory at Oregon State on Oct. 20, 2018, its 354 yards the most since rushing for a school-record 411 against Washington on Dec. 6, 2008, and its 599 yards of total offense the most since picking up 636 at Stanford on Nov. 20, 2021

– Coleman earned Pac-12 Offensive Lineman of the Week for his performance against Arizona when he played in all 70 offensive snaps, had the highest grade from the Cal coaches (93%) and three pancake blocks

– Cal's new-look offensive line that has also started the last two games at Washington State also includes RG Matthew Cindric, C Brian Driscoll, RT T.J. Session and RG Sioape Vatikani

– Session and Vatikani have both made their first three Cal starts in the last two contests against Arizona and at Washington State while Cindric moved from center to right guard and Driscoll from left guard to center

– Cal has nine different players on its 2022 roster who have combined to make 76 career starts on the offensive line for the Golden Bears in Cindric (33), Coleman (17), Brayden Rohme (9), Driscoll (6), Spencer Lovell (3), Session (3), Vatikani (3), Everett Johnson (1) and Bastian Swinney (1)

– Cindric is a semifinalist for the prestigious Campbell Trophy and was recognized for numerous 2022 preseason honors including All-Pac-12 third-team (Athlon), fourth-team (Phil Steele) and honorable mention (Pac-12 Media) as well as watch lists for the Rimington Trophy and Wuerffel Trophy

– In addition, Cindric is one of Cal's three team season captains and was one of two Cal representatives at Pac-12 Football Media Day

– Coleman was honored in the 2022 preseason as an All-Pac-12 third-team (Athlon, Phil Steele) and honorable mention (Pac-12 Media) pick.

– Cal bolstered its 2022 group up front with the additions of transfers Lovell (Arizona State) and Session (Montana State) with Lovell having played in 27 games with three starts for the Sun Devils from 2018-21 and Session starting each of the 10 games he played as a redshirt freshman for the Bobcats in 2021 to bring the number of collegiate starts by Cal's offensive linemen to 89

- Correia leads all defensive linemen with 19 tackles and started each of the first two games before coming off the bench in each of the last four with his most productive contest at Notre Dame when he registered a career-high six tackles
- Burrell has 11 tackles, one fumble recovery and one quarterback hurry
- Long Jr. made his first career start at Notre Dame and has contributed totals of four tackles, 1.0 tackle for loss (-4 yards) and one pass breakup while playing in five of six contests he has played
- Saunders, who is the only available player on the defensive line to have started at least one game prior to 2022, has contributed 15 tackles including a career-high-tying four at Notre Dame and in his most recent contest at Colorado, along with 0.5 tackles for loss and sacks (-5 yards)

- Cal has all three of its primary specialists together for the third consecutive season in 2022 in punter/holder Jamieson Sheahan (22), placekicker Dario Longhetto (28) and long snapper Slater Zellers (35), with the trio combining to play in 85 games during their Cal careers
- Sheahan leads the Pac-12 and is fourth nationally with a 46.6 yards per punt average through the first six games that is 1.0 yards per punt better than Bryan Anger's school-record 45.6 in 2010, as well as 13 punts of 50 or more yards among his 32 punts including a career-long 65-yarder against UC Davis
- Longhetto has made 8-of-12 field goals and all 16 of his extra points in 2022 to rank second on the team in scoring with 40 points and is Cal's active career scoring leader with 125 (23-32 FG, 56-57 PAT)
- Zellers has played in each of the past 35 Cal games over the last three-plus campaigns and is a member of the Patrick Mannely Long Snapper Award Preseason Watch List in 2022 for the first time in his career as well as the No. 1 draft-eligible long snapper for the 2023 NFL Draft according to Phil Steele
- Michael Luckhurst has played in each of Cal's first six games and kicked off all 14 times in the last two games, registering a 65.0 average and 10 touchbacks over those 14 kickoffs while he also averages 65.0 yards per kickoff and has 12 touchbacks on 16 kickoffs for the season
- Jeremiah Hunter has 11 punt returns for 112 yards including a career-high-tying three returns for a career-high 34 yards in his most recent contest at Colorado and ranks third in the Pac-12 (#18 NCAA) with a 10.2 yards per punt return average
- Justin Richard Baker had two punt returns for 37 yards including a 26-yarder that was Cal's longest of the season at Colorado
- Cal's 71 punt return yards in its most recent game at Colorado were its most since the Golden Bears had 78 against Idaho State on Sept. 15, 2018
- Mavin Anderson has all five of Cal's kickoff returns for 79 yards

Justin Wilcox is in his sixth season as the Travers Family Head Football Coach at Cal in 2022. Wilcox signed a contract extension through the 2027 campaign this past January.

"I appreciate the opportunity to be the head football coach at Cal and am excited about the future of our program," Wilcox said in the announcement of his extension. "I have thoroughly enjoyed every minute I have spent with the extraordinary young men who have been in our program. We are in a great position and strongly aligned with our university thanks to the leadership of Chancellor Carol Christ and our Director of Athletics Jim Knowlton. I thank both of them for their continued trust and confidence in me to lead a football program that will make the entire Cal community proud. We have very high expectations. I think we've earned the right to expect more, and that's exactly what we're going to do."

Wilcox has compiled a long list of accomplishments and signature wins in his first five-plus seasons as the head coach at Cal including landmark victories over Stanford and USC in the final month of his most recent full campaign in 2021. The victory over the Trojans in Cal's 2021 season finale was the Golden Bears' first home win over USC since 2003 but its' second in the last four seasons against the Trojans under Wilcox, who also led Cal to a road victory at USC in 2018. The back-to-back road wins in the Big Game at Stanford in 2019 and 2021 made Wilcox only the fifth Cal head coach to be victorious at least twice in a row on The Farm and, along with Jeff Tedford, one of only two in the last 70 years since Pappy Waldorf won three straight from 1947-51.

Cal's 3-3 start in 2022 has come in the midst of having one of the least experienced teams in the nation with 24 Golden Bears playing for the first time at Cal and 18 making their first start in Blue and Gold over the first six games of 2022. Cal's 2022 offense had its best performance of the season against Arizona the last time the team played in Berkeley with seven touchdowns, 49 points and 599 yards. Cal is fourth in the Pac-12 in scoring defense (21.7 ppg). Both sides of the ball have helped the Bears rank fourth nationally in turnover margin (+1.33).

The 2022 victory over Arizona in the Golden Bears' most recent home game extended Cal's current home win streak to six in a row dating back to the final three home contests of 2021. The last time Cal has won more than six straight in Berkeley came during a nine-game home win streak from Aug. 30, 2008 – Sept. 12, 2009 when the Bears followed up a 7-0 home record in 2008 by winning their first two games in Berkeley in 2009.

At the end of the 2021 campaign, Wilcox's team came on strong with four victories in its final six contests including arguably its most impressive performance of the season in a 41-11 Big Game win that marked Cal's largest margin of victory against Stanford since 2004. Cal had a Big Game-record 636 total yards in the contest including 352 on the ground that were the most rushing yards in a game by the Bears since a school-record 411 against Washington in 2008. The 2021 Cal offense was capable of producing big numbers that included over 500 yards of total offense three times and more than 200 yards rushing on four occasions. The Bears' 2021 offense also took tremendous care of the football with its 10 turnovers the fewest ever by a Cal team playing a full schedule with the previous low 13 by Wilcox's 2019 squad. Cal lost only two fumbles in 2021 to rank tied for second nationally and lead the Pac-12 for fewest fumbles. The Bears were also second in the Pac-12 and 11th nationally in turnover margin (+10, 0.83), while their 10 total turnovers lost were second in the Pac-12 and tied for seventh nationally. Wilcox's defense shone in the second half of the 2021 season by holding four of its final six opponents to 14 points or less. The Bears finished the campaign second in the Pac-12 in scoring defense (22.2 ppg), fourth in total defense (366.7 ypg) and fourth in rushing defense (137.2 ypg).

Wilcox's 2020 squad was just getting on track when COVID ended the often-delayed season after four games with the Bears' final performance including a second-half shutout of eventual Pac-12 champion Oregon in an inspiring 21-17 home victory over the Ducks.

Wilcox began the 2019 season with four straight victories to move the Bears into the No. 15 spot in the AP Top 25 and No. 16 in the Coaches Poll. The victories included road wins at then-No. 14/12 Washington and Ole Miss, with the latter the first road triumph by a Pac-12 school at an SEC foe since 2010. The two signature victories helped the Bears to a 4-2 mark in true road games to give Cal back-to-back winning seasons on the road for the first time since 2004.

Wilcox guided the Bears to the Cheez-It Bowl and a 7-6 overall record in his second campaign in 2018 with the bowl appearance Cal's first in three seasons and first in a Pac-12 affiliated bowl since 2011. Cal reached a high point of 7-4 after winning four of five Pac-12 games during one stretch highlighted by signature victories over eventual Pac-12 champion and then-No. 15/13 Washington, as well as at USC, with the victory over the Trojans clinching bowl eligibility. Cal also started the season with a 3-0 mark and in Week 5 made its first appearance since 2015 in the AP Top 25 at No. 24.

The highlights of Wilcox's first season as the head coach in Berkeley in 2017 included a 3-0 start and non-conference wins over Power 5 programs North Carolina and Ole Miss, as well as a 37-3 victory over then No. 8/9 Washington State in an ESPN nationally-televvised Friday night home game. The victory against the Cougars snapped Cal's 17-game losing streak to top-10 teams, was the Bears' first victory against a top-10 team since 2003 and only its second top-10 win dating back to 1977. Cal added a Pac-12 victory over Oregon State and finished 5-7 overall.

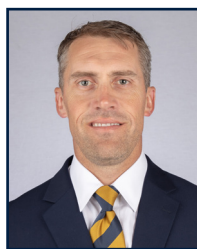

Bill Musgrave (OC/QB)

Musgrave is in his third season as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Cal in 2022, as well as his 16th campaign as an offensive coordinator and 25th in coaching at the NFL and collegiate ranks. Cal's offense registered its best performance of the 2022 season against Arizona when the Golden Bears scored seven touchdowns, had 599 yards of total offense and 354 rushing yards. The offense also had several strong games during Musgrave's first full season at Cal in 2021 (his first campaign in 2020 was shortened to four games by COVID-19) and played a key role in the Golden Bears' second-half surge in 2021 when Cal won four times in its final six contests including arguably its most impressive performance of the season in a 41-11 Big Game win over Stanford. Cal had a Big Game-record 636 total yards in the contest including 352 on the ground. Cal has also taken tremendous care of the football under Musgrave with its 10 turnovers in 2021 the fewest ever by a Cal team playing a full schedule and only four turnovers over the first six games of 2022.

**Peter Sirmon (DC/ILB)**

Sirmon is in his fifth season at Cal and his third campaign as the team's defensive coordinator in 2022, while he also continues to work with the inside linebackers for the fifth consecutive campaign. Sirmon started at Cal in 2018 as the Golden Bears' inside linebackers coach before adding co-defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator duties to his role in 2019. He also served as the team's recruiting coordinator for three seasons from 2019-21. Sirmon's has a knack for taking the ball away and currently has at least one takeaway in each of its last 19 games for the longest streak in the country by an FBS team. His 2021 defense improved throughout the season in his first full campaign as the team's defensive coordinator (his first season in the role in 2020 was shortened to four games by COVID) and finished the campaign second in the Pac-12 in scoring defense (22.2 ppg). Through the first five games in 2022, his defense has cut 0.5 points per game off its average (20.7 ppg) and is fourth in the conference in scoring defense.

**Terrence Brown (DB)**

Brown is in his first season at Cal in 2022 and shares duties with Tre Watson coaching the Golden Bears' defensive backs. Brown was among a group of 30 coaches on 247Sports' 30Under30 list in both 2019 and 2020.

**Andrew Browning (DL)**

Browning is in his fourth season as the defensive line coach at Cal in 2022 and his fifth campaign with the program having also served in a quality control role on the defensive side of the ball in his first season with the Golden Bears in 2018.

**Geep Chryst (TE)**

Chryst is in his second season as the tight ends coach at Cal in 2022 after having spent the majority of the previous three decades coaching in the NFL most recently as the tight ends coach with Denver (2017-18).

**Angus McClure (OL)**

McClure is in his third season as the offensive line coach at Cal in 2022, as well as in his 26th campaign of collegiate coaching and 31st year in the coaching profession. McClure began at Cal in 2020 after previous experience in the collegiate ranks at UCLA, Nebraska, Nevada, Buffalo and Sacramento State.

**Vic So'oto (OLB)**

So'oto is in his first season as the outside linebackers coach at Cal in 2022 after spending the previous two seasons in 2020 and 2021 on the USC coaching staff following a prior four-year stint at Virginia (2016-19).

**Aristotle Thompson (RB)**

Thompson is in his third season as the running backs coach at Cal in 2022 after spending the previous 11 campaigns in the same role at Cal Poly. Cal's run game has shown moments of brilliance under the guidance of Thompson highlighted by 354 yards rushing in a 49-31 win against Arizona this season including 274 from freshman running Jaydn Ott that were the third-most in school history. Ott ranks second in the Pac-12 in rushing yards per game (96.7); third in rush yards per carry (6.5), overall rushing yards (580) and all-purpose yards per game (116.2); tied for fourth in total touchdowns (7) and eighth in rushing touchdowns (5).

**Burl Toler III (WR/RC)**

Toler III is in his eighth season on the coaching or football staff at his alma mater Cal in 2022, as well as his fifth as a full-time assistant coach and fourth working with the wide receivers. He is also in his first campaign as the team's recruiting coordinator in 2022. Toler is working with a talented wide receiver group in 2022 led by the duo of Jeremiah Hunter and J. Michael Sturdivant, who have combined for 59 receptions, 789 yards and five touchdown catches.

**Tre Watson (DB)**

Tre Watson is in his second season as a defensive backs coach at Cal in 2022 and shares the duties with first-year defensive backs coach Terrence Brown. In 2020, Watson was among a group of 30 coaches listed in 247Sports' "30Under30".

**Brian Johnson (AP)**

Johnson is in his second season at Cal in 2022 after spending the previous 11 campaigns on staffs at FBS schools and in the NFL. Johnson has coached 76 players that have been selected in the NFL Draft including 11 first rounders.

GAME 1: CAL PUTS AWAY UC DAVIS FOR SEASON-OPENING WIN

BERKELEY – AJack Plummer threw three touchdown passes in his debut for California and Craig Woodson returned an interception for a score to lead California to a 34-13 victory over UC Davis on Saturday.

The Golden Bears (1-0) shook off a rough start on offense with minus-1 yard in the first quarter to improve to 11-0 all-time against the Aggies (0-1).

"Getting out there on the field the first time, I'm sure there was a little bit of nerves going on," Cal coach Justin Wilcox said. "A good thing was, as we talked about on the sideline after the first quarter was over, it was like, 'Guys, it probably couldn't have gone too much worse. ... We got that out of us and then settled down and moved the ball down the field.'"

Plummer threw TD passes of 3 yards to Jeremiah Hunter and 8 yards Jaydn Ott in the second quarter, and a 14-yarder to Mavin Anderson in the fourth quarter of his first appearance since transferring from Purdue.

Plummer finished 23 for 35 for 268 yards.

"I think we just got into a little bit of rhythm, did a little tempo," Plummer said. "I think once we started to kind of see ourselves move that kind of gave us a little confidence and got them on their heels a little bit."

Woodson helped take control of the game when he intercepted Miles Hastings on the opening drive of the second half and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown that made it 24-7.

Hastings threw a 4-yard touchdown pass to Chaz Davis in the first quarter Ulonzo Gilliam Jr. scored on a 60-yard run in the third quarter for the Aggies.

Hastings finished 32 for 50 for 242 yards with two interceptions.

"It's not about being perfect, it's about being excellent," coach Dan Hawkins said. "But we played hard. Guys battled. Thought we had a good camp. But it's a tough road so we got to learn from it, flush it and move on."

GAME 2: LATE STAND LEADS BEARS PAST UNLV

BERKELEY – Jaydn Ott scored two touchdowns, one on the ground and one through the air, and California's defense stiffened late to lead the Bears to a 20-14 victory over UNLV on Saturday.

Cal (2-0) made three fourth-down stops in the second half, including a fourth and goal opportunity for the Rebels from the Cal 8 with 2:46 remaining that preserved Cal's six-point lead.

UNLV got the ball back one more time with 1:03 remaining, but Isaiah Young intercepted UNLV quarterback Doug Brumfield deep in Cal territory on the game's final play. That clinched the Bears' first 2-0 start since 2019 as they turn their attention to next week's game at Notre Dame, the marquee opponent on Cal's schedule.

"I think it's huge for us, giving us a little bit of confidence and momentum going into a tough game," Cal safety Daniel Scott said. "We've got to keep building. At the end of the day, we're 2-0 and that's the best part about it."

Jack Plummer threw for 278 yards and a touchdown as the Golden Bears got off to a fast start on offense. But after taking a 20-7 lead on a Dario Longhetto field goal midway through the third quarter, Cal's offense stalled and UNLV (1-1) grabbed momentum.

Aidan Robbins rushed for 84 yards for UNLV, including a 31-yard score in the third that brought the Rebels to within 20-14.

Three times Cal drove to UNLV's 10-yard line or deeper and didn't get touchdowns. The Bears settled for two field goals and Plummer was intercepted on the third drive.

"The goal, No. 1, is to win the game, and it carries more weight than any other goal," California coach Justin Wilcox said. "We also recognize where we need to be better."

After being held to minus-1 yard of offense in the first quarter last week against UC Davis, the Bears led 14-0 after the first on Saturday. Plummer completed his first eight passes and found open receivers against a UNLV secondary that also was called for pass interference three times in the game.

Ott scored on a 2-yard run and added a 12-yard touchdown catch later in the first, taking a short pass in the flat and making a leaping dive into the end zone on fourth-and-2 to give Cal a 14-0 lead.

Kyle Williams got UNLV on the board with an 11-yard touchdown catch on the first play of the second quarter, but Dario Longhetto's 20-yard field goal gave Cal a 17-7 lead at halftime.

GAME 3: BEARS FALL SHORT TO NOTRE DAME IN SOUTH BEND

SOUTH BEND, Ind. – Drew Pyne passed for two touchdowns and 150 yards in his first career start and Notre Dame overcame numerous mistakes to beat California 24-17 Saturday to give Irish coach Marcus Freeman his first victory.

The Irish (1-2) outscored Cal (2-1) 10-0 in the fourth quarter to avoid becoming just the third Notre Dame squad to start a season 0-3. The Irish (1-2), who started the season ranked No. 5, had blown leads three times, made sure there was no second-half letdown this time.

It wasn't over until the last play as officials overturned two plays that appeared to be game-clinching turnovers for the Irish, giving the Bears a last-second shot. On fourth-and-13 from the Notre Dame 35, Cal's Jack Plummer threw the ball into the end zone. The ball bounced off several players and Bears receiver Jeremiah Hunter nearly pulled it in, but the ball landed on the grass.

It was a familiar feeling for the Bears, who had five losses by seven points or less last season.

The Irish opened a 24-17 lead with 9:16 remaining on a 6-yard pass from Pyne to Michael Mayer, just Mayer's second catch of the day. The touchdown was set up when Pyne threw a short pass to tailback Audric Esitime, and he sprinted for a 36-yard gain before tripping at the 6-yard line.

The Bears drove to the Notre Dame 22 midway through the fourth quarter but couldn't get any closer. Plummer threw three straight incompletions, then was sacked by Isaiah Foskey for a 10-yard loss with 6:30 left.

Cal got the ball again on their own 7-yard line, but on third-and-10 Jack Plummer was sacked for a 5-yard loss. It looked as though Notre Dame had put the game away when cornerback Clarence Lewis picked off a pass from Plummer, but the Bears got one more chance when J.D. Bertrand was called for targeting.

Pyne, playing because Tyler Buchner sustained a season-ending shoulder injury last week, was 17-of-23 passing. In addition to the scoring pass to Mayer, Pyne threw a 21-yard TD pass to Tyree. Tyree, who had only 12 touches through the first two games, rushed for 64 yards on 17 carries and had five catches for 44 yards. Estime added a 1-yard run and 76 yards rushing on 18 carries.

Plummer was 16 of 37 for 184 yards passing, including an 18-yard TD pass to J. Michael Sturdivant. Jaydn Ott was held to 33 yards on 13 carries.

GAME 4: OTT LEADS CAL TO 49-31 WIN OVER ARIZONA

BERKELEY – Jaydn Ott ran for 274 yards and three touchdowns and the Cal football team opened Pac-12 play with a 49-31 victory over Arizona on Saturday at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium.

Ott scored on a 73-yard run on the second play from scrimmage, an improbable 18-yarder in the third quarter after he had appeared to be stopped for a short gain, and then another 72-yarder to ice it late in the fourth.

"Every time I touch the ball, I feel like I'm going to score," Ott said. "That's my mentality."

It was the most rushing yards in a single game by an FBS player this season and the third-most in Cal history, trailing only Jahvid Best's 311 against Washington in 2008 and Jerry Drew's 283 against Oregon State in 1954.

"That's explosive," Travers Family Head Football Coach Justin Wilcox said. "We've been talking about it for a long time. You've seen it in flashes. We saw it a bunch today. He's a dynamic guy and has the ability to take it to the house from a lot of spots."

Jack Plummer added three touchdown passes for the Golden Bears (3-1, 1-0), who won their sixth straight home game. It's their longest winning streak at Memorial Stadium since a nine-gamer in 2008-09.

Cal also ended a six-game skid against Arizona (2-2, 0-1) by beating the Wildcats for the first time since 2009.

A year after Arizona beat COVID-depleted Cal 10-3 at home for its only win in 2021, the teams exceeded that point total after both teams scored touchdowns on the opening drive.

It was a back-and-forth, high-scoring affair in the first half with Ott scoring on a 73-yard run on the second play from scrimmage to set the tone.

The Wildcats scored on four of their first five drives of the game, getting two short TD runs by Jonah Coleman and Michael Wiley and a 24-yard TD pass from de Laura to Tetairoa McMillan.

Plummer threw a 16-yard TD pass to J. Michael Sturdivant in the second quarter and gave Cal the lead early in the third when he found Keleki Latu from 3 yards out on fourth-and-1.

Ott added his second TD midway through the third quarter. He ran into a group of defenders at the 13 yet managed to keep his feet and snuck out of the scrum to run it into the end zone to make it 35-24.

Ott added his second breakaway run late in the fourth quarter.

PULLMAN, Wash. – Wide receiver Jeremiah Hunter had six receptions for a career-high 109 yards but the Cal football team fell to Washington State 28-9 on Saturday afternoon.

J. Michael Sturdivant also had a career-high in receiving yards with 71 and quarterback Jack Plummer completed 23 of 33 passes for 273 yards for the Bears (3-2, 1-1 Pac-12).

After a scoreless first quarter, Washington State scored a touchdown early in the second before Cal answered with a 42-yard field goal by Dario Longhetto. The Cougars extended their lead to 14-3 early in the third quarter but the Bears came right back again, stringing together a 90-yard touchdown drive that culminated on Jaydn Ott's 2-yard run. Cal's two-point conversion failed and it was 14-9 early in the fourth period.

Washington State added two fourth-quarter touchdowns to pull away.

The Bears' defense held the Cougars to just 103 yards of offense in the first half. It marked the fourth time in five games this season Cal has held its opponent to just seven first-half points.

Ott, who ran for 274 yards and three touchdowns last week against Arizona, had 69 yards on the ground against the Cougars but set career-highs with seven catches for 41 yards.

Cal's defense also had its 18th straight game with at least one takeaway, which is tied for the longest active streak in FBS. Safeties Craig Woodson and Daniel Scott each had interceptions for the Bears.

BOULDER, Colo. - J.T. Shrout threw a 22-yard touchdown pass to Montana Lemonious-Craig in overtime, powering Colorado to a 20-13 upset of California in interim coach Mike Sanford's debut Saturday.

Jack Plummer had Mason Starling wide open for the score on first-and-goal from the 10 on Cal's ensuing possession but strong safety Trevor Woods arrived just after the pass and popped the ball loose.

When Plummer's fourth-down pass fell incomplete, the students stormed the field to celebrate Colorado's first win of the season.

Sanford inherited a team that was off to just the fourth 0-5 start in school history, one that cost Karl Dorrell his job. Sanford placed an immediate emphasis on physicality and takeaways, which paid off on Colorado's first defensive series with Tyrin Tyler's sliding interception, the Bears' first turnover in four games.

Dario Longhetto, who was wide left on field-goal tries going both ways, missing from 54 yards in the first quarter and 48 in the second, was good from 34 yards as time expired in the fourth quarter to send the game to overtime. Cal (3-3, 1-2 Pac-12) won the toss and chose to start out on defense.

The Buffs (1-5, 1-2) were setting up for Cole Becker's 40-yard field goal in the extra period when a prolonged review showed that Lemonious-Craig's right cleat was down just before he was shoved out of bounds by nickel back Collin Gamble.

Instead, Becker lined up for the extra point and gave Colorado its biggest lead at 17-10.

The only scoring in the first half came on Becker's 31-yard field goal with four minutes left in the second quarter following a penalty that wiped out Jordan Tyson's 11-yard touchdown catch from Owen McCown.

Shrout replaced McCown on Colorado's fourth possession after halftime and drove the Buffaloes to their first touchdown, a 1-yard run by Anthony Hankerson with 14:25 remaining that gave CU a 10-7 lead.

The big play on the drive was Jordan Tyson's 37-yard heave to Lemonious-Craig on a trick play.

J. Michael Sturdivant's diving 14-yard touchdown catch from Plummer had put the Bears up 7-3 with 5:49 left in the third quarter.

Colorado's defense limited the Bears to 103 yards of offense in the first half after allowing Arizona to pile up 400 yards by halftime in their last game.

Lemonious-Craig finished with eight catches for a game-high 119 yards.

FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium is located along Piedmont Avenue between Bancroft Way and Stadium Rim Way on the University of California campus in Berkeley. For GPS purposes, use 2227 Piedmont Avenue in Berkeley for the address. Public transportation is highly recommended when visiting and there are multiple options. Visit bart.gov, actransit.org and 511.org for more information.

All credentials for 2022 Cal football home games must be requested online through sportssystems.com/CalFootball. Only media who cover the Golden Bears on a regular basis will be considered for season credentials. Note that it is not always possible to accommodate all requests, and no one under 18 years of age will be issued a credential without prior approval. All single-game requests should be made as far in advance as possible to help ensure space availability both in the press box and on the field. Credentials requested within seven days of a game, as well as all field photo passes, will be held for pick up at Media Will Call. Any questions about Cal football credentials can be directed to Kyle McRae.

INTERNET ACCESS

Both wireless and wired ethernet connections are available in the press box and field-level photographer work room. Wireless service is available through the Cal Visitor wireless network (no password required).

MEDIA GROUP TEXT AND EMAIL LISTS

Contact Kyle McRae to be placed on the Cal football media group text and email lists to receive relevant and updated Cal football information.

MEDIA PARKING (GAMEDAY)

The Underhill Garage located near the corner of Channing Way and College Avenue serves as the football gameday media parking location. Entrances are off either Channing Way or Haste Street, just west of College Avenue. The lot is about four blocks from FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium. Media can either take the short walk to Media Will Call near Gate 5 or use a media shuttle that begins three hours before game time. A media shuttle is also available postgame from the corner of Bancroft Way and Warring Street (south end of Warring Alley near Gate 5) to the Underhill Garage. Parking passes must be requested in advance through sportssystems.com/CalFootball and can be emailed directly. They are not available for pick up on gamedays. Television broadcast crews should order parking passes in advance by sending the Special Event Parking Arrangements form found on the University of California website (pt.berkeley.edu). Request the Underhill Garage for football gamedays and the Witter Lot (just east of FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium) for set days.

MEDIA PARKING (NON-GAMEDAY)

For media covering Cal football on non-gamedays, see the parking/public transportation options listed below. Parking in the vicinity is limited and available on a first-come, first-served basis. Please be sure to read all signs at each parking location for further information.

Stadium Parking Garage – Paid parking near the corner of Gayley Road (where Piedmont Avenue becomes Gayley Road) and Stadium Rim Way just north of the stadium

Street Parking – Paid and two-hour free parking may be available on streets near the stadium

Witter Lot – Paid parking near the corner of Centennial Drive and Stadium Rim Way just east of the stadium

Underhill Garage – Paid parking on corner of Channing Way and College Avenue

Public Transportation – Public transportation (BART, AC Transit) is detailed earlier in this section.

MEDIA WILL CALL

Media Will Call is located adjacent to Gate 5 at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium. It opens four hours before kickoff and remains open through the end of the first quarter. Identification is required to pick up credentials or tickets. Media who arrive after the end of the first quarter should contact Kyle McRae or Keeler McJunkin.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Field photographers/videographers must wear a photo vest at all times, in addition to a photo credential. Photo credentials are not distributed in advance and must be picked up on the day of the game at Media Will Call. Photo vests are also distributed at Media Will Call and should be returned following use to the receptacle on the field behind the visitor (west) bench and near the entrance to the photographers work room in front of Section EE.

NCAA rules limit photographers/videographers to shooting outside the restraining line surrounding the playing field and restrict photographers from entering the team areas inside the 20-yard lines.

In addition, photographers and videographers are welcome to use the photo deck located on level six of the Peter E. Haas Press Box and work from the main press area on level seven.

PHOTOGRAPHERS WORK ROOM

A photographers work room is available on the field level at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium (entrance on west side at approximately the 20-yard line on the north end of the field). Power and ethernet access are available, as well as limited desk space on a first-come, first-served basis. Additional photographer work stations are available on level seven of the press box. Pregame meals and drinks for photographers and videographers are available on the south end of level seven in the press box.

PHOTOS

Requests for photos can be made through the Athletic Communications Office. Photos of all 30 teams can also be purchased through Cal's official photographer by visiting klcfotos.com/calbears.

PLAYER/COACH/STAFF INTERVIEWS

Weekly updates are normally distributed each Monday throughout the season.

The media level of the Peter E. Haas Press Box at FTX Field at California Memorial Stadium is on the seventh floor. The photo deck is on level six.

TELEPHONE/VISITING RADIO PHONE LINES

ISDN and dial lines, as well as dry pairs to the visiting team locker room and visiting team interview room, are available for complimentary use for the official visiting team radio network. All other telephone lines, both in the press box and inside the television compound, must be requested at least one week in advance through Kyle McRae.
