

Post-Game Notes
Washington at Oregon
Autzen Stadium, Nov. 12, 2022

With 408 passing yards tonight, Michael Penix Jr. has thrown for 3,640 yards this season, moving past Jake Browning (3,430 in 2016) for the No. 2 spot in Washington single-season history. Only Cody Pickett, who passed for 4,458 yards in 2002, has totaled more pass yards in a season than Penix.

Penix, who reached 300 yards passing in each of the first eight games this season (before passing for 298 last week vs. Oregon State) had 408 tonight. Only Pickett, with 14, had more 300-yard passing games in his UW career. Browning also had nine.

With 25 touchdown passes this season, Penix is tied for No. 4 on the UW single-season list.

UW senior Petyon Henry, whose 43-yard field goal with 51 seconds remaining was the game-winner, missed a 37-yard attempt on the final play of regulation the last time the Huskies played in Eugene. That missed kick, which was attempted with the score tied at 24-24, sent the game into overtime, where the Ducks prevailed, 30-27.

Henry also made a game-winning field goal, a 22-yarder with just 0:08 left, to beat Oregon State last week, also breaking a tie (21-21; UW won, 24-21, vs. OSU).

Jalen McMillan had his second 100-yard receiving game of the season, finishing tonight's game with 122 yards. It's also the ninth 100-yard game from a UW receiver this season.

Washington scored a touchdown on its first offensive possession for the eighth time in 10 games this season. The Huskies have scored (8 TDs, 1 field goal) on their opening drive in nine of 10 games this year.

By contrast, UW opponents have scored just one touchdown on 10 opening drives this year. Today's game marked just the second time that a Husky foe had finished an opening possession with a field goal, meaning that Husky opponents have scored on just three of 10 such drives this year.

After Cameron Davis scored on a three-yard rush in the third quarter – his 11th rushing TD of the season – the Huskies had scored, at that point, 23 rushing and 23 passing TDs on the season. The Huskies went on to pass for two more TDs after Davis scored.
