#15/15 WASHINGTON vs. COLORADO Dawgs Wrap Up Home Season vs. Buffaloes

THE GAME: The Washington football team (8-2 overall, 5-2 Pac-12) plays its final home game of the year this Saturday as Colorado (1-9, 1-7) travels to Alaska Airlines Field at Husky Stadium. Game time on Saturday is 6:00 p.m., on Pac-12 Network. The Huskies return home after a 37-34 win at then-No. 6 Oregon, which has moved the Huskies up to No. 15 in both the AP Top 25 and the coaches' poll. The Huskies close out the regular season the following Saturday, Nov. 26, with the Boeing Apple Cup at Washington State.

QUICK HITTERS: Washington is 3-0 vs. ranked teams in 2022 ... Michael Penix Jr. broke multiple UW records in the win over Arizona, including most notably, the marks for single-game passing yards (516), completions (36) and total offense (529) ... Penix enters this week No. 1 in the nation in passing yards and passing yards per game; and No. 2 in total offense and completions per game ... Penix has passed for 300 or more yards in nine of 10 games this season (and 298 in the other) ... Penix is No. 2 in UW history in single-season passing yards, with 3,640 ... WR Rome Odunze notched four straight 100-yard receiving games this year (games 4-7), making him the first in UW history to do that ... he got a fifth 100-yard game (non-consecutive) vs. OSU ... through nine games, the Huskies have had nine 100-yard receiving performances, from four different players: Rome Odunze (5), Jalen McMillan (2), Giles Jackson, & Ja'Lynn Polk ... UW has scored on its first possession in nine of 10 games this season ... UW has gone 3-and-out just 10 times in 108 offensive possessions this year ... six true freshmen have played for the UW this season: DL Jayvon Parker, CB Jayvion Green, PK Grady Gross, WR Denzel Boston, S Tristan Dunn & EDGE Lance Holtzclaw ... UW enters the Colorado game first in the NCAA-FBS in passing offense, as well as No. 8 in total offense and No. 13 in scoring offense ... the UW offense is also No. 3 in the nation in third-down conversion percentage and No. 4 in first downs ... the Huskies are first in fewest fumbles lost, third in sacks allowed and fourth in turnovers lost ... Washington has far surpassed last year's 12-game, season totals for both points and touchdowns ... UW has 384 points and 48 TDs in 2022, after compling just 258 and 32, respectively, last year.

TELEVISION: The UW-Colorado game will air on Pac-12 Network, with Ted Robinson and Yogi Roth calling the action. Fans with the proper subscription can also watch at Pac-12.com/live.

RADIO: All Washington football games will air on the Washington Sports Network from Learfield, with Tony Castricone (play by play), former Husky tight end Cameron Cleeland (analyst) and former UW basketball player Elise Woodward (sidelines) on the call. Radio coverage begins four hours before kickoff on the network's flagship station — Seattle's SportsRadio KJR 93.3 FM — with "Husky Gameday" live from The Zone for Husky home games. Statewide coverage on the 12-station Washington Sports Network begins two hours before kickoff. The entire broadcast is available worldwide on the Huskies Gameday mobile app and the Varsity app. The UW broadcast of this game will also air on SiriusXM channel 98 or 198. Additionally, the Husky Football Coaches Show airs each Wednesday during the season, at 6:00 p.m. PT.

KALEN DeBOER HEAD COACH First Season at UW

Success has come consistently and quickly at every stop in the career of Washington football coach Kalen DeBoer. On Nov. 29, 2021, DeBoer took his next step, when he was named the 30th head football coach in UW history.

DeBoer, 47, came to Montlake from Fresno State, where during the 2021 season, he led the Bulldogs to a 9-3 regular-season record in his second year in charge.

Over his seven seasons as a head football coach,

DeBoer has compiled a 79-9 (.898) record. During his 25 years in coaching, he has consistently prospered at multiple levels and in different roles, helping to build and revitalize programs while establishing a diverse network of contacts, in both coaching and recruiting, across the country.

In two years at Fresno State, which included the pandemic-shortened 2020 season, DeBoer's teams made great strides on both sides of the ball.

In 2021, Fresno State finished first in the MWC and 14th in the nation in total offense (464.8 yards per game) and second in the conference and 26th in FBS in scoring (30.5 points per game). The Bulldogs' passing offense ranked second in conference and ninth in the country, with 326.7 yards per game.

The offense, and passing game in particular, also flourished in 2020, as it produced a conference-best 479.3 yards total offense per game, and the league's second-highest points per game total (32.8). Fresno State also led the Mountain West in passing yards per game, and ranked fifth in the FBS in that category, with 356.3 per game. The Bulldogs generated over 400 yards total offense in all six games in 2020.

In DeBoer's two seasons in Fresno, the defense also made vast improvements in nearly every team defensive category over the 2019 season, the year before his arrival.

The Bulldogs' defense went from 82nd in the national in scoring defense and 88th in total defense in 2019, to No. 20 and No. 31 in the FBS in 2021, respectively – improvements of 62 and 57 places. In terms of NCAA-FBS national ranking, the run defense improved from 71st to 24th while the pass defense leapt from 107th to 58th. Fresno State also improved its national ranking by 45 or more places in yards allowed per play, opponent first downs, sacks, TFLs, third-down percentage defense, and fourth-down percentage defense.

In 2021, Fresno State ranked among the top 25 in the nation in scoring defense, tackles for loss, takeaways, fumble recoveries, third-down conversion defense, and fourth-down conversion defense.

Immediately prior to leading Fresno State's program, DeBoer was on staff at Indiana University, as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. After helping to guide the Hoosiers to an 8-5 record and a berth in the Gator Bowl, DeBoer returned to Fresno State, taking over for Jeff Tedford, who resigned for health reasons following the 2019 season.

The Hoosiers' eight victories in 2019 matched their highest wins total in 26 seasons, and IU ranked No. 3 in the Big Ten in total offense. Six different members of the Indiana offense earned some level of AII-Big Ten recognition.

In 2017, Tedford, in his first season as head coach at Fresno State, hired DeBoer as his offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. In two seasons in that role, DeBoer helped the Bulldogs to overall records of 10-4 (2017) and 12-2 (2018), along with two division titles, two bowl game victories and the Mountain West Conference Championship in 2018.

DeBoer's two years as the Bulldogs' offensive coordinator concluded with a Mountain West Championship and Las Vegas Bowl win to cap a 22-6 run during the 2017-18 seasons. Those two seasons included double-digit winning seasons each year, coming off a 1-11 campaign in 2016, the year prior to Tedford's (and DeBoer's) arrival. Fresno State was the first program in FBS history to record back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

Fresno State reached unprecedented heights in year No. 2 with DeBoer as the OC as the Bulldogs posted a school-record 12 victories, and finished ranked No. 18 in both polls.

The offense ranked 26th nationally in scoring offense (34.6) and 29th in passing offense (267.1), and produced five all-conference honorees. The Bulldogs finished eighth nationally in team passing efficiency (156.58), tied for 15th in turnovers lost (14), tied for 19th nationally in red zone offense (89.5 percent) and 25th in third-down conversions (44.6). Up front, the Bulldogs' offensive line ranked in the top six nationally in fewest sacks and tackles for loss allowed per game in 2018 (6th, 5th).

Under DeBoer's coaching, quarterback Marcus McMaryion completed 62.1 percent of his passes, third-best in the Mountain West. With just five interceptions on the year, Mc-

Maryion finished the season with the seventh-lowest interception percentage in Bulldog history at 1.42. The Bulldogs threw for 237.9 yards per game, fourth-most in the MW, with McMaryion accounting for 3,094 total yards and 18 TDs.

A school-record setting wide receiver at the University of Sioux Falls (S.D.), DeBoer later led his alma mater to three NAIA National Championships in five seasons as head coach, winning the title in 2006, 2008 and 2009, while also finishing as runner-up in 2007 and making the semifinals in his first season as head coach, in 2005.

During his five seasons at Sioux Falls, DeBoer compiled a 67-3 overall record, including a 49-1 mark in Great Plains Athletic Conference play. In two seasons at Fresno State, he had a 12-6 overall record, giving him a career record of 79-9. He was NAIA National Coach of the Year in each of his three championship seasons at USF.

DeBoer coached three NAIA National Players of the Year winners in quarterbacks Lorenzo Brown (2009) and Chad Cavender (2007), and running back Nick Kortan (2002). During his time at USF, he helped develop 25 first-team All-Americans.

After the 2009 season, he took a job at Southern Illinois as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach from 2010 through 2013. He moved to Eastern Michigan as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2014 through 2016, helping the Eagles to their third-ever bowl-game berth in 2016. That year, the Eagles posted their first .500-or-better season since 1995 and tied the Football Bowl Subdivision mark for biggest turnarounds in 2016, improving on its one-win season in 2015.

DeBoer's offense shattered the school record for total yards, with 5,917. School records were also set for points scored (385), passing yards (3,849), touchdown passes (25), first downs (303), pass completions (309), plays (999), as well single-game plays (99).

In his four seasons (2010-13) as offensive coordinator at Southern Illinois, the Salukis beat 10 Top-25 opponents. In 2013, the SIU offense led the Missouri Valley Conference with 231.8 passing yards per game, fourth-highest total in school history. SIU's 25 passing touchdowns on the season tied for the third-highest total in school history. Under DeBoer's tutelage, tight end MyCole Pruitt was named to the 2013 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) FCS All-America team while John Lantz developed into an All-MVFC receiver.

During the 2011 campaign, the Salukis ranked third in the nation with an average of 183.1 rushing yards a contest. Bryan Boemer also developed into the Rimington Award winner, which is presented to the nation's premier center.

As a student at Sioux Falls, DeBoer set records in both football and baseball. During his football career, he compiled 3,400 yards and 33 touchdowns on 234 career receptions — all school records at the time — and played on the 1996 NAIA Division II National Championship team, which beat Western Washington in the final. He also played baseball for the Cougars, batting .520 (still a school record) as a senior in 1998. His career average of .492 is still best in USF history as are his 37 career homers, and .944 slugging percentage.

A 1998 graduate of the University of Sioux Falls with a degree in secondary education, DeBoer and his wife, Nicole, are the parents of two daughters, Alexis and Avery.

COACHING STAFF: With new head coach Kalen DeBoer having taken over the UW program at the end of the 2021 season, the coaching staff for 2022 is, as expected, mostly new. Nine of the Huskies' 10 full-time assistant coaches are new to the program, with six of them having worked at Fresno State under DeBoer, including all of the coordinators. On the offensive side, Ryan Grubb will serve as coordinator and quarterbacks coach, having held both of those titles last season at Fresno State, where he spent the last four seasons. A former assistant at Sioux Falls under DeBoer, the two also worked alongside one another at Eastern Michigan. UW will have two co-defensive coordinators in 2022: Chuck Morrell and Wiliam Inge. Morrell was a teammate of DeBoer's at Sioux Falls, and later served as his defensive coordinator there as well. In the interim, he spent nine seasons as head coach at Montana Tech before working as safeties coach at Fresno State the last two years. Inge, who played against the UW in the 1995 Sun Bowl as a defensive end for Iowa, first worked with DeBoer at Indiana in 2019. He then joined DeBoer's staff in Fresno, where he was defensive coordinator and linebackers coach the last two seasons. Special teams coordinator and edges coach Eric Schmidt handled special teams and the d-line at Fresno State the last two years. A standout player at North Dakota, he first worked alongside De-Boer at Southern Illinois (2010-13). Cornerbacks coach Julius "Juice" Brown also comes to Seattle from Fresno, where he coached the Husky position and was recruiting coordinator under DeBoer. Like Brown, Lee Marks is former Boise State player. Early in his coaching career, he spent a season as a GA at Sioux Falls (after DeBoer's departure), but spent the last two seasons as running backs coach for the Bulldogs under DeBoer. Tight ends coach Nick Sheridan, a former Michigan quarterback, held the same title at Indiana in 2019, the year DeBoer was the Hoosiers' offensive coordinator. Sheridan was OC and quarterbacks coach in Bloomington the last two seasons. Three UW assistants are working with DeBoer for the first time: offensive line coach Scott Huff, wide receiver coach JaMarcus Shephard, and defensive line coach Inoke Breckterfield. Huff, a former teammate of Marks and Brown at Boise State, returns for his sixth season as the Huskies' o-line mentor. Shephard comes to Washington after a very successful stint as receivers coach at Purdue the last five years. Breckterfield, a standout defensive lineman at Oregon State, most recently worked in the same role at Vanderbilt, but has also worked at Wisconsin, Pitt and UCLA, among others.

HUSKIES vs. BUFFALOES HISTORY: Washington and Colorado have squared off 19 times in their history and the Huskies hold the edge with 12 wins, seven losses and one tie. Washington had won nine straight games vs. the Buffaloes, a streak that dated back 20 years, before losing the last two (2019 and 2021). UW is 7-2 vs. Colorado since the Pac-10 Conference expanded to become the Pac-12, including six wins in the regular season and one in the 2016 Pac-12 Championship game.

The series began way back in 1915 when a Gil Dobie-coached UW team wrapped up a 7-0 season with a 46-0 win over the Buffs at Washington's Denny Field. Nearly 40 years later, the Huskies opened the 1953 season with a narrow 21-20 loss at Husky Stadium. Jim Owens' first game as Husky head coach, on Sept. 21, 1957, came against Colorado and that game ended in a 6-6 tie in Seattle. Two seasons later, the Huskies made their first trip to Boulder for yet another season-opener and beat the Buffaloes, 21-12.

The next meeting didn't come until 1976 in Seattle when Colorado beat Don James' second Husky squad, 21-7. The two teams next met in the 1985 Freedom Bowl in Anaheim. The Huskies won, 20-17, behind sophomore QB Chris Chandler.

In 1989, shortly after the untimely death of their former CU quarterback Sal Aunese, the Buffs handed the Huskies a 45-28 loss at Husky Stadium. Colorado rushed for 420 yards despite not having a single back over 100 yards. Colorado made it two wins in as many seasons the following year at Folsom Field, handing a 12th-ranked UW team a 20-14 loss. Eric Bieniemy ran for 143 yards and Darian Hagan scored a pair of TDs in the win. Colorado picked up a third straight win over the Huskies in the 1996 Holiday Bowl, winning 33-21.

In 1999, first-year UW head coach Rick Neuheisel, who'd left Colorado for Seattle during the offseason, got his first win at Washington in week three of the season. Marques Tuiasosopo hit Chris Juergens with a nine-yard TD pass with 3:17 remaining to break a tie and forge a 31-24 win. The following year in Boulder, a Rose Bowl-bound Husky team won, 17-14.

In 2011, in the two teams' first meeting as Pac-12 rivals, the Huskies won 52-24 in Seattle. Keith Price led the way for the UW, completing 21-of-28 passes for 257 yards and four touchdowns. In 2012, Price had another big game in a 38-3 win in Boulder, throwing for a school-record-tying five TDs. Price was 22-for-29 for 248 yards while Bishop Sankey rushed for 139 yards. In 2013 in Seattle, the Huskies won their fifth in a row in the series as the Dawgs rolled up 628 yards of total offense in a 59-7 victory. Price completed 22-of-29 for 312 and two scores while rushing for two more.

In 2014, erstwhile linebacker Shaq Thompson starred on offense for the Huskies, rushing for 174 yards on just 15 carries in 38-23 Husky win. Sefo Liufau passed for 314 yards and two TDs for Colorado. In 2016, the UW and Colorado met in the Pac-12 Championship game in Santa Clara, the first title game for both teams. Washington got 100-yard rushing performances

TEAM NOTES

from Myles Gaskin (159 yards) and Lavon Coleman (101) and two key interceptions from game MVP Taylor Rapp, one of which he returned 35 yards for a score on the first play of the second half, as Washington won, 41-10. Jake Browning threw TD passes to Darrell Daniels and John Ross while the UW defense held the Buffaloes to 163 yards and nine first downs.

In 2017 in Boulder, Myles Gaskin rushed for 202 yards and two TDs and the Huskies picked off three passes (Myles Bryant returned one 35 yards for a score) in a 37-10 win. In 2018 in Seattle, the UW held Colorado scoreless in the second, stretching a 14-13 halftime lead, to a 27-13 win. CU totaled just 86 yards of offense in the second half. In 2019 in Boulder, the Buffs stymied the UW offense for a 20-14 win to break the Huskies' win streak in the series. UW rushed for just 32 yards.

Last year, the Huskies suffered a frustrating loss in Boulder, 20-17, despite out-gaining CU, 426-183, and holding Colorado to just nine first downs. An 88-yard fumble return for a score was a key for the Buffaloes, who forced four turnovers.

PENIX MAKING HIS MARK: Ten games through the regular season, UW quarterback Michael Penix Jr. has already made numerous impressions in the Husky football record book. 100-YARD RECEIVERS: Washington has had four different receivers record a 100-yard game this season, and it happened over the span of just three games — games two, three and four vs. Portland State (Jalen McMillan, 127; Giles Jackson, 105), Michigan State (Ja'Lynn Polk, 153) and Stanford (Rome Odunze, 161 ... Odunze also had 116 at UCLA; 115 at ASU; 169 vs. Arizona; and 102 vs. Oregon State). Including this season, only 19 times in UW history have the Huskies had four, 100-yard receiving games over the course of a single season, but in 15 of those cases, those performances were by three or fewer different players. Only four times in UW history have four different players posted a 100-yard receiving game in a single season. Among those four years (1949, 2001, 2002 and 2011), on only one occasion did four different players record a 100-yard game over a three game stretch, in the middle of the 2001 season. They were:

EXPERIENCE AND YOUTH: Thanks in part to the extended eligibility that resulted from the pandemic, Washington's 2021 roster is remarkable for both its youth and its experience, all at once. The roster includes 18 individuals who have started at least one game on offense, and another 18 on defense. All totaled, those 35 players (one of them, Alex Cook, has started on offense and defense) have started 248 games (147 on offense, 101 on defense). And, that doesn account for the handful of veteran transfers who were mulit-year starters at their previous school, and also doesn't account for specialists, who are also seasoned starters at their positions.

All that said, the UW roster includes just 12 players in their final year of available eligibility: CB Jordan Perryman, LB Cam Bright, EDGE Jeremiah Martin, S Alex Cook, WR Brennan Holmes, PK Peyton Henry, OL Jaxson Kirkland, OL Henry Bainivalu, OL Corey Luciano, P Kevin Ryan, LB Kristopher Moll and RB Wayne Taulapapa. Of the 114 players on the current roster, 55 are listed as freshmen (17) or redshirt freshmen (38), while 27 more are sophomores. That means that 82 of 114 players (72 percent) have three or more years of eligibility remaining, entering the 2022 season.

THE PAC-12: Prior to the 2011 season, the Pac-10 Conference added Utah and Colorado to expand to the Pac-12. Washington, which along with California is one of two schools who have been in the conference since its founding in 1915, plays in the Pac-12 North, along with the other three Northwest schools (Oregon, OSU, WSU) and Stanford and Cal. Under the current system, each school plays all five division rivals, plus four of six teams in the other division each season. The first two seasons, the Huskies did not face UCLA or Arizona State. In 2013 and 14, the Huskies didn't play Utah or USC. In 2015 in 2016, neither UCLA nor Colorado were on the UW schedule, while the Huskies didn't face USC and Arizona in 2017 or 2018. The 2019 season marked the start of a new cycle, moving the rotation back to where it started. Therefore, the Huskies 2019 and 2020 scheduled did not include UCLA and Arizona State. In 2021 and 2002, Washington are not scheduled to play USC and Utah.

HUSKY STADIUM RENOVATION: Husky Stadium underwent a major renovation over from Nov., 2011, through Aug., 2013, as the entire lower bowl and south upper deck were demolished and replaced. The new facility features a new, state-of-the-art football operations center (weight room, training room, locker room, meeting rooms, coaches' offices) in the west end, much more premium seating options and a new playing surface. Husky Stadium had featured a track up until 2011, so seats that were once far from the field, particularly in the west end, are much closer to the action. UW is 49-16 at home since the re-opening of Husky Stadium.

ALASKA AIRLINES FIELD AT HUSKY STADIUM: The Oregon game on Nov. 5, 2011, marked the final game in Husky Stadium prior to major renovations that were completed in summer, 2013. The Huskies re-opened their home field with a 38-6 win over then-No. 19 Boise State on Aug. 31, 2013. The 2021 season marks the 101st season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium stands at 405-185-21 (.680).
