

Post-Game Notes
Washington vs. Colorado
Husky Stadium, Nov. 19, 2022

Washington's nine victories this year are the most in program history in a head coach's first season in charge. The previous high came in 2014, when Chris Petersen led the Huskies to an 8-6 record (aided by an additional game, at Hawai'i, which the Huskies won). Jim Lambright, Steve Sarkisian and Rick Neuheisel each won seven games in their first season on Montlake.

UW's 54 points tonight marked Huskies' highest points total since a 63-7 win over Montana in 2017. The 54 points were the most vs. a conference opponent since a 66-27 win at Cal in 2016.

Washington scored a touchdown on its first offensive possession for the ninth time in 11 games this season. The Huskies have scored on their opening drive in 10 of 11 games this year (9 TDs, 1 field goal).

By contrast, UW opponents have scored just one touchdown on 11 opening drives this year. Husky foes have two opening-drive field goals, so have thus scored on just three of 11 such drives this year.

Peyton Henry broke the UW career scoring record, finishing tonight's game with 384 points. He broke the record held by fellow placekicker Jeff Jaeger (380, 1983-86).

Henry also now holds UW PAT record with 180. The record was actually broken at Oregon last Saturday. Cameron Van Winkle (2013-16) held the record, with 171

With 229 passing yards tonight, Michael Penix Jr. has thrown for 3,869 yards this season, good for the No. 2 spot in Washington single-season history. Only Cody Pickett, who passed for 4,458 yards in 2002, has totaled more pass yards in a season than Penix.

With 26 touchdown passes (one tonight) this season, Penix is No. 4 on the UW single-season list. Next on the list, at No. 3, is Cody Pickett, who had 28 in 2002. The record is 43 (Jake Browning, 2016).

With 107 yards tonight, Husky senior Wayne Taulapapa had his second 100-yard game of the season, and the second of his career (counting his time at Virginia). Earlier this year vs. Stanford, he rushed for 120 yards.

Cameron Davis rushed for two touchdowns tonight, giving him 13 rushing TDs for the season. That ties him for ninth on the UW single-season list for rushing TDs, alongside Hugh McElhenny (1951) and Jake Locker (2009). Corey Dillon holds the record, with 24 in 1996.
