Washington at Washington State
Martin Stadium, Nov. 26, 2022

With 485 passing yards tonight, Michael Penix Jr. has thrown for 4,354 yards this season, good for the No. 2 spot in Washington single-season history. Only Cody Pickett, who passed for 4,458 yards in 2002, has totaled more pass yards in a season than Penix. Penix is the second Husky ever to pass for 4,000 or more yards in a season.

With 29 touchdown passes (three tonight) this season, Penix is No. 3 on the UW single-season list. Next on the list. Only Jake Browning (43, 2016) and Keith Price (33, 2011) are ahead of him.

Rome Odunze became the ninth Husky ever to record 1,000 receiving yards in a season. With 157 tonight, he has 1,088 for the year, good for sixth in UW single-season history.

Odunze had his sixth 100-plus-yard game of the season.

Jalen McMillan joined Odunze with a 1,000-yard receiving season. With 150 tonight, he has 1,040 for the season. He and Odunze are the ninth and 10th Huskies ever to reach 1,000 receiving yards in a season.

McMillan and Odunze are the first UW duo ever to reach 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Today's game was the 100th as head coach for UW's Kalen DeBoer, who previously served five years as head coach at Sioux Falls, and two at Fresno State. His record over those 100 games is 89-11.

Washington's 10 victories this year are the most in program history in a head coach's first season in charge. The previous high came in 2014, when Chris Petersen led the Huskies to an 8-6 record (aided by an additional game, at Hawai'i, which the Huskies won). Jim Lambright and Rick Neuheisel each won seven games in their first season on Montlake.

Washington's 703 yards of total offense were third-most in school history.

The 84 combined points scored tonight marked the highest-scoring UW-WSU game in history. In 1976, the teams combined for 83 points in a 51-32 Husky win in Spokane.

Washington punted on its first drive for just the second time all season (vs. Oregon State was the other). The Huskies scored on their opening drive in 10 of 12 games this year (9 TDs, 1 field goal).

By contrast, UW opponents have scored just one touchdown on 12 opening drives this year. WSU's field goal to begin the game was the third opening-drive field goal against UW this season, meaning UW foes scored on their opening possession in four of 12 games this season.

Peyton Henry added to his Washington career records for most made PATs and for scoring. He now as 186 PATs and 393 career points

Washington's one-play, 75-yard "drive" to open the second half is the 33rd one-play drive in recorded school history. It's tied for the 10th-longest one-play drive ever at UW.

Washington suffered a lost fumble for just the second time all season, and for the first time since the season opener vs. Kent State. That fumble vs. KSU was on special teams, meaning that tonight's lost fumble was the first by the UW offense all year.

Wayne Taulapapa rushed for 126 yards, for the third 100-yard game of the season and of his career, including his time at Virginia.

Washington didn't allow a sack of starting quarterback Michael Penix for the ninth game out of 12 this season. Penix has suffered just five sacks this season.
