

Post-Game Notes
Washington vs. Oregon State
Husky Stadium, Nov. 4, 2022

Tonight's game marked the first time this season, in nine games, that the UW didn't score on its first offensive possession of the game. Washington had scored seven touchdowns and one field goal through the first eight games' opening drives.

By contrast, Oregon State as the first UW opponent this season to score a touchdown on its opening possession, and just the second team to score on its first drive (ASU got a field goal in Tempe). UW opponents are just 2-for-9 on game-opening drives.

Washington linebacker Edefuan Ulofoshio, who had missed the first eight games of the season due to an injury, made his 2022 debut in OSU's second offensive possession.

The last two UW games prior to tonight did not have any turnovers, by either team (Arizona and Cal). That run was stopped late in the second quarter when OSU's Easton Mascarenas-Arnold returned an interception for a touchdown.

Jack Westover's 24-yard touchdown catch in the third quarter marked his first touchdown of the season. It was his 22nd reception.

Michael Penix Jr. had his streak of eight consecutive 300-yard passing games snapped, as he fell just two yards short of 300 tonight. He was the first Husky QB to reach 300 yards passing in eight straight games, beating a record held by Cody Pickett, who passed for 300 or more in the first seven games of the 2002 season (Pickett did not reach 300 yards in the final game of the 2001 season).

Only two UW quarterbacks have posted more 300-yard passing games – over their entire careers – as Penix has in his first eight games: Pickett (14) and Jake Browning (9).

Penix has passed for 3,232 yards this season, already good for THIRD on the UW single-season passing yards list, trailing only Cody Pickett (4,458 in 2002) and Jake Browning (3,430 in 2016).
