KENT STATE at WASHINGTON Huskies Kick Off 2022 Season vs. Golden Flashes

THE GAME: The Washington football team opens the 2022 season this Saturday, Sept. 3, with the program's first-ever game vs. Kent State. The game also marks the beginning of the Kalen DeBoer era at UW, as the 30th Husky head coach makes his Montlake debut. Kickoff for the season opener at Alaska Airlines Field at Husky Stadium is 7:30 p.m. PT. The game will air on FS1 television. The Huskies open the 2022 season with four straight home games, as this Saturday's game is followed by visits from Portland State on Sept. 10 and Michigan State on Sept.17, before the Pac-12 opener on Sept. 24.

QUICK HITTERS: Washington's next home-game victory will mark the program's 400th win at the 102-year old Husky Stadium ... other than the pandemic-shortened 2020 season – when due to cancellations, the entire UW schedule consisted of just four games, all at home – the last time the Huskies opened a season with four consecutive home games was in 1976, when the Dawgs opened vs. Virgina, Colorado, Indiana and Minnesota ... the current UW rosters includes players who list hometowns from 16 different states ... the Husky roster includes 31 newcomers in 2022; here's a breakdown: 20 freshmen, two junior college transfers, and nine four-year college transfers ... of the 114 players on the roster, 55 are listed as freshmen (17) or redshirt freshmen (38), with an additional 27 sophomores ... that means that 82 of 114 players (72 percent) have three or more years of remaining eligibility entering the 2022 season ... Washington has 12 players who have just one remaining year of eligibility.

HOME OPENERS: The Huskies are 96-29-5 in home openers (whether the first game of the season or not), a percentage of .758. Washington did not play any home games in the 1890 or 1893 seasons. That mark includes a 28-game streak of home-opener wins that ran from 1908 to 1935. Before falling to Air Force in the 1999 home opener, Washington had won 13 straight such games since having fallen to Oklahoma State on Sept. 7, 1985. The Huskies had won their last 11 home openers, dating back to a loss to No. 11 LSU in 2009, prior to a loss to Montana in last season's debut.

TELEVISION: The Washington-Kent State game will air on FS1, with Alex Faust and Petros Papadakis calling the action. Fans with the proper subscription can also watch at FoxSports.com.

RADIO: All Washington football games will air on the Washington Sports Network from Learfield, with Tony Castricone (play by play), former Husky tight end Cameron Cleeland (analyst) and former UW basketball player Elise Woodward (sidelines) on the call. Radio coverage begins four hours before kickoff on the network's flagship station – Seattle's SportsRadio KJR 93.3 FM – with "Husky Gameday" live from The Zone for Husky home games. Statewide coverage on the 12-station Washington Sports Network begins two hours before kickoff. The entire broadcast is available worldwide on the Huskies Gameday mobile app and the Varsity app. The UW broadcast of this game will also air on Sirius channel 83 and XM channel 83. Additionally, the Husky Football Coaches Show airs each Wednesday during the season (starting Aug. 24), at 6:00 p.m. PT.

KALEN DeBOER HEAD COACH First Season at UW

Success has come consistently and quickly at every stop in the career of Washington football coach Kalen DeBoer. On Nov. 29, 2021, DeBoer took his next step, when he was named the 30th head football coach in UW history.

DeBoer, 47, came to Montlake from Fresno State, where during the 2021 season, he led the Bulldogs to a 9-3 regular-season record in his second year in charge.

Over his seven seasons as a head football coach,

DeBoer has compiled a 79-9 (.898) record. During his 25 years in coaching, he has consistently prospered at multiple levels and in different roles, helping to build and revitalize programs while establishing a diverse network of contacts, in both coaching and recruiting, across the country.

In two years at Fresno State, which included the pandemic-shortened 2020 season, DeBoer's teams made great strides on both sides of the ball.

In 2021, Fresno State finished first in the MWC and 14th in the nation in total offense (464.8 yards per game) and second in the conference and 26th in FBS in scoring (30.5 points per game). The Bulldogs' passing offense ranked second in conference and ninth in the country, with 326.7 yards per game.

The offense, and passing game in particular, also flourished in 2020, as it produced a conference-best 479.3 yards total offense per game, and the league's second-highest points per game total (32.8). Fresno State also led the Mountain West in passing yards per game, and ranked fifth in the FBS in that category, with 356.3 per game. The Bulldogs generated over 400 yards total offense in all six games in 2020.

In DeBoer's two seasons in Fresno, the defense also made vast improvements in nearly every team defensive category over the 2019 season, the year before his arrival.

The Bulldogs' defense went from 82nd in the national in scoring defense and 88th in total defense in 2019, to No. 20 and No. 31 in the FBS in 2021, respectively – improvements of 62 and 57 places. In terms of NCAA-FBS national ranking, the run defense improved from 71st to 24th while the pass defense leapt from 107th to 58th. Fresno State also improved its national ranking by 45 or more places in yards allowed per play, opponent first downs, sacks, TFLs, third-down percentage defense, and fourth-down percentage defense.

In 2021, Fresno State ranked among the top 25 in the nation in scoring defense, tackles for loss, takeaways, fumble recoveries, third-down conversion defense, and fourth-down conversion defense.

Immediately prior to leading Fresno State's program, DeBoer was on staff at Indiana University, as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. After helping to guide the Hoosiers to an 8-5 record and a berth in the Gator Bowl, DeBoer returned to Fresno State, taking over for Jeff Tedford, who resigned for health reasons following the 2019 season.

The Hoosiers' eight victories in 2019 matched their highest wins total in 26 seasons, and IU ranked No. 3 in the Big Ten in total offense. Six different members of the Indiana offense earned some level of AII-Big Ten recognition.

In 2017, Tedford, in his first season as head coach at Fresno State, hired DeBoer as his offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. In two seasons in that role, DeBoer helped the Bulldogs to overall records of 10-4 (2017) and 12-2 (2018), along with two division titles, two bowl game victories and the Mountain West Conference Championship in 2018.

DeBoer's two years as the Bulldogs' offensive coordinator concluded with a Mountain West Championship and Las Vegas Bowl win to cap a 22-6 run during the 2017-18 seasons. Those two seasons included double-digit winning seasons each year, coming off a 1-11 campaign in 2016, the year prior to Tedford's (and DeBoer's) arrival. Fresno State was the first program in FBS history to record back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

Fresno State reached unprecedented heights in year No. 2 with DeBoer as the OC as the Bulldogs posted a school-record 12 victories, and finished ranked No. 18 in both polls.

The offense ranked 26th nationally in scoring offense (34.6) and 29th in passing offense (267.1), and produced five all-conference honorees. The Bulldogs finished eighth nationally in team passing efficiency (156.58), tied for 15th in turnovers lost (14), tied for 19th nationally in red zone offense (89.5 percent) and 25th in third-down conversions (44.6). Up front, the Bulldogs' offensive line ranked in the top six nationally in fewest sacks and tackles for loss allowed per game in 2018 (6th, 5th).

Under DeBoer's coaching, quarterback Marcus McMaryion completed 62.1 percent of his passes, third-best in the Mountain West. With just five interceptions on the year, Mc-

Maryion finished the season with the seventh-lowest interception percentage in Bulldog history at 1.42. The Bulldogs threw for 237.9 yards per game, fourth-most in the MW, with McMaryion accounting for 3,094 total yards and 18 TDs.

A school-record setting wide receiver at the University of Sioux Falls (S.D.), DeBoer later led his alma mater to three NAIA National Championships in five seasons as head coach, winning the title in 2006, 2008 and 2009, while also finishing as runner-up in 2007 and making the semifinals in his first season as head coach, in 2005.

During his five seasons at Sioux Falls, DeBoer compiled a 67-3 overall record, including a 49-1 mark in Great Plains Athletic Conference play. In two seasons at Fresno State, he had a 12-6 overall record, giving him a career record of 79-9. He was NAIA National Coach of the Year in each of his three championship seasons at USF.

DeBoer coached three NAIA National Players of the Year winners in quarterbacks Lorenzo Brown (2009) and Chad Cavender (2007), and running back Nick Kortan (2002). During his time at USF, he helped develop 25 first-team All-Americans.

After the 2009 season, he took a job at Southern Illinois as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach from 2010 through 2013. He moved to Eastern Michigan as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2014 through 2016, helping the Eagles to their third-ever bowl-game berth in 2016. That year, the Eagles posted their first .500-or-better season since 1995 and tied the Football Bowl Subdivision mark for biggest turnarounds in 2016, improving on its one-win season in 2015.

DeBoer's offense shattered the school record for total yards, with 5,917. School records were also set for points scored (385), passing yards (3,849), touchdown passes (25), first downs (303), pass completions (309), plays (999), as well single-game plays (99).

In his four seasons (2010-13) as offensive coordinator at Southern Illinois, the Salukis beat 10 Top-25 opponents. In 2013, the SIU offense led the Missouri Valley Conference with 231.8 passing yards per game, fourth-highest total in school history. SIU's 25 passing touchdowns on the season tied for the third-highest total in school history. Under DeBoer's tute-lage, tight end MyCole Pruitt was named to the 2013 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) FCS All-America team while John Lantz developed into an All-MVFC receiver.

During the 2011 campaign, the Salukis ranked third in the nation with an average of 183.1 rushing yards a contest. Bryan Boemer also developed into the Rimington Award winner, which is presented to the nation's premier center.

As a student at Sioux Falls, DeBoer set records in both football and baseball. During his football career, he compiled 3,400 yards and 33 touchdowns on 234 career receptions — all school records at the time — and played on the 1996 NAIA Division II National Championship team, which beat Western Washington in the final. He also played baseball for the Cougars, batting .520 (still a school record) as a senior in 1998. His career average of .492 is still best in USF history as are his 37 career homers, and .944 slugging percentage.

A 1998 graduate of the University of Sioux Falls with a degree in secondary education, DeBoer and his wife, Nicole, are the parents of two daughters, Alexis and Avery.

COACHING STAFF: With new head coach Kalen DeBoer having taken over the UW program at the end of the 2021 season, the coaching staff for 2022 is, as expected, mostly new. Nine of the Huskies' 10 full-time assistant coaches are new to the program, with six of them having worked at Fresno State under DeBoer, including all of the coordinators. On the offensive side, Ryan Grubb will serve as coordinator and guarterbacks coach, having held both of those titles last season at Fresno State, where he spent the last four seasons. A former assistant at Sioux Falls under DeBoer, the two also worked alongside one another at Eastern Michigan. UW will have two co-defensive coordinators in 2022: Chuck Morrell and Wiliam Inge, Morrell was a teammate of DeBoer's at Sioux Falls, and later served as his defensive coordinator there as well. In the interim, he spent nine seasons as head coach at Montana Tech before working as safeties coach at Fresno State the last two years. Inge, who played against the UW in the 1995 Sun Bowl as a defensive end for lowa, first worked with DeBoer at Indiana in 2019. He then joined DeBoer's staff in Fresno, where he was defensive coordinator and linebackers coach the last two seasons. Special teams coordinator and edges coach Eric Schmidt handled special teams and the d-line at Fresno State the last two years. A standout player at North Dakota, he first worked alongside DeBoer at Southern Illinois (2010-13). Cornerbacks coach Julius "Juice" Brown also comes to Seattle from Fresno, where he coached the Husky position and was recruiting coordinator under DeBoer. Like Brown, Lee Marks is former Boise State player. Early in his coaching career, he spent a season as a GA at Sioux Falls (after DeBoer's departure), but spent the last two seasons as running backs coach for the Bulldogs under DeBoer. Tight ends coach Nick Sheridan, a former Michigan quarterback, held the same title at Indiana in 2019, the year DeBoer was the Hoosiers' offensive coordinator. Sheridan was OC and quarterbacks coach in Bloomington the last two seasons. Three UW assistants are working with DeBoer for the first time: offensive line coach Scott Huff, wide receiver coach JaMarcus Shephard, and defensive line coach Inoke Breckterfield. Huff, a former teammate of Marks and Brown at Boise State, returns for his sixth season as the Huskies' oline mentor. Shephard comes to Washington after a very successful stint as receivers coach at Purdue the last five years. Breckterfield, a standout defensive lineman at Oregon State, most recently worked in the same role at Vanderbilt, but has also worked at Wisconsin, Pitt and UCLA, among others.

HUSKIES vs. THE MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE: Washington has never faced Kent State in the two programs' long history. In fact, the Huskies have very little experience vs. teams from the Mid-American Conference. The UW has won all three of its games against the current members of the MAC (all three were members at the time of their games against UW as well). All three UW games vs. MAC teams came during a nine-year stretch between 1984 and 1991, and all were comfortable Husky home-game victories. The Huskies beat Miami (Ohio), 55-7, in 1984; Bowling Green, 48-0, in 1986; and Toledo, 48-0, in 1991.

Washington does have one very strong connection with the Kent State football program in that Don James had spent four seasons as the Golden Eagles' head coach (1971-74) before beginning his legendary, 16-year career as Washington's head coach (1977-1992). Longtime former UW athletic director Mike Lude was AD at Kent State when James was coach, and eventually followed the Dawgfather to Montlake, serving as AD for 14 yards (1976-1991).

EXPERIENCE AND YOUTH: Thanks in part to the extended eligibility that resulted from the pandemic, Washington's 2021 roster is remarkable for both its youth and its experience, all at once. The roster includes 18 individuals who have started at least one game on offense, and another 18 on defense. All totaled, those 35 players (one of them, Alex Cook, has started on offense and defense) have started 248 games (147 on offense, 101 on defense). And, that doesn account for the handful of veteran transfers who were mulit-year starters at their previous school, and also doesn't account for specialists, who are also seasoned starters at their positions.

All that said, the UW roster includes just 12 players in their final year of available eligibility: CB Jordan Perryman, LB Cam Bright, EDGE Jeremiah Martin, S Alex Cook, WR Brennan Holmes, PK Peyton Henry, OL Jaxson Kirkland, OL Henry Bainivalu, OL Corey Luciano, P Kevin Ryan, LB Kristopher Moll and RB Wayne Taulapapa. Of the 114 players on the current roster, 55 are listed as freshmen (17) or redshirt freshmen (38), while 27 more are sophomores. That means that 82 of 114 players (72 percent) have three or more years of eligibility remaining, entering the 2022 season.

SEASON OPENERS: Washington is 89-37-6 all-time in season openers, good for a mark of .697. Since 1989, Washington has posted an 19-13 record in season openers — 12-2 at home, 7-9 on the road, 0-2 neutral site. In the 31-season span dating back to 1989, the Huskies have opened vs. a ranked team 13 times (5-8): vs. No. 15 Stanford in 1993 (W, 31-14), at No. 17 USC in 1994 (L, 24-17), at No. 20 Arizona State in 1996 (L, 45-42), vs. No. 19 BYU in 1997 (W, 42-20) at No. 8 Arizona State in 1998 (W, 42-38), vs. No. 11 Michigan in 2001 (W, 23-18), at No. 12 Michigan in 2002 (L, 31-29), at No. 2 Ohio State in 2003 (L, 28-9), at No. 21 Oregon in 2008 (L, 44-10), vs. No. 11 LSU in 2009 (L, 31-23), vs. No. 19 Boise State in 2013 (W, 38-6), at No. 23 Boise State in 2015 (L, 16-13), neutral vs. No. 9 Auburn in 2018 (L, 21-16).

HOME vs. NON-CONFERENCE: Washington has been very tough to beat in home, non-conference games over the last several decades. Going back to (and including) the 1981 season, the Huskies have posted a 72-14 record against non-Pac-10/Pac-12 foes in Husky Stadium. Those 14 losses have come to Montana (2021), Nebraska (2010), LSU (2009), BYU (2008), Oklahoma (2008), Ohio State (2007), Notre Dame (2005), Fresno State (2004), Nevada (2003), Air Force (1999), Nebraska (1997), Notre Dame (1995), Colorado (1989) and Oklahoma State (1985). Notable wins wins during that stretch include victories over No. 19 Boise State in 2013, No. 22 Boise State in 2007, No. 11 Michigan in 2001, No. 4 Miami in 2000, and No. 12 Nebraska in 1992. Prior to the 2004 loss to Nevada, Washington hadn't lost a home game to a non-league opponent since falling to Air Force, 31-21, on September 18, 1999. The Huskies had won 10 such games before that Nevada loss. UW had a 20-game home, nonconference win streak broken last year.

THE PAC-12: Prior to the 2011 season, the Pac-10 Conference added Utah and Colorado to expand to the Pac-12. Washington, which along with California is one of two schools who have been in the conference since its founding in 1915, plays in the Pac-12 North, along with the other three Northwest schools (Oregon, OSU, WSU) and Stanford and Cal. Under the current system, each school plays all five division rivals, plus four of six teams in the other division each season. The first two seasons, the Huskies did not face UCLA or Arizona State. In 2013 and 14, the Huskies didn't play Utah or USC. In 2015 in 2016, neither UCLA nor Colorado were on the UW schedule, while the Huskies didn't face USC and Arizona in 2017 or 2018. The 2019 season marked the start of a new cycle, moving the rotation back to where it started. Therefore, the Huskies 2019 and 2020 scheduled did not include UCLA and Arizona State. In 2021 and 2002, Washington are not scheduled to play USC and Utah.

HUSKY STADIUM RENOVATION: Husky Stadium underwent a major renovation over from Nov., 2011, through Aug., 2013, as the entire lower bowl and south upper deck were demolished and replaced. The new facility features a new, state-of-the-art football operations center (weight room, training room, locker room, meeting rooms, coaches' offices) in the west end, much more premium seating options and a new playing surface. Husky Stadium had featured a track up until 2011, so seats that were once far from the field, particularly in the west end, are much closer to the action. UW is 43-16 at home since the re-opening of Husky Stadium.

ALASKA AIRLINES FIELD AT HUSKY STADIUM: The Oregon game on Nov. 5, 2011, marked the final game in Husky Stadium prior to major renovations that were completed in summer, 2013. The Huskies re-opened their home field with a 38-6 win over then-No. 19 Boise State on Aug. 31, 2013. The 2021 season marks the 101st season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium stands at 399-185-21 (.677).
