# #5/5 WASHINGTON at #10/10 OREGON STATE Dawgs Travel South For 108th All-Time Meeting Vs. Beavers

**THE GAME:** The Washington football team (10-0, 7-0 Pac-12) travels south to Corvallis, Ore., to face Oregon State (8-2, 5-2), with both teams' Pac-12 title game hopes still on the line. A UW win would clinch a place in Las Vegas on Dec. 1. The game is the 108th between the two, old rivals, who first met on the gridiron in 1897. In none of those previous 107 games were both teams ranked in the top-10 in Associated Press poll, as they are now. In fact, on only three prior occasions have they both both in the AP Top 20/25 at the time of the game. Kickoff at Reser Stadium is at 4:30 p.m. and the game will air on ABC-TV. The following week, the Dawgs close out the regular season at Husky Stadium, with the 115th Apple Cup, vs. Washington State.

QUICK HITTERS: Washington is 21-2 overall under head coach Kalen DeBoer, whose career head coaching record is now 100-11 ... UW is 10-0 for just the second time in school history ... the Huskies lead the nation in passing offense and are No. 6 in total offense ... UW is also No. 2 in the nation in punt return defense (-0.5 per return) and rank No. 6 in kick return defense (14.7 per return) ... over just 23 games as a Husky, Michael Penix Jr. has notched five of the top-10 single-game passing yards marks in UW history, including his first three games this season (473 vs. Michigan State - 3rd; 450 vs. Boise State - 6th; 409 vs. Tulsa -10th) ... in less than two seasons, Penix is up to third in UW history in career TD passes, with 59 ... he has thrown multiple TDs in 18 of his 23 games at UW ... his 8,174 career yards rank him 4th at UW ... through 10 games, Penix is No. 1 in FBS passing yards and pass yards per game, No. 2 in total offense, No. 4 in pass TDs and No. 8 in pass efficiency ... four different UW receivers – Jalen McMillan, Rome Odunze, Ja'Lynn Polk and Germie Bernard (2) - have scored a rushing TD so far this season ... prior to this season, UW had had just eight games in its history in which two players had 100 receiving yards (including two last year) ... this season, that has happened in 5 of 10 games ... Penix is currently No. 1 in the nation in pass plays of 10-plus (141 plays) ... UW enters the week with the nation's second-longest active winning streak among FBS teams, with 17 victories in a row ... only Georgia, with a 27-game run, has a longer active streak ... the win streak is the third-longest in UW history, after 40 (1908-16) and 22 (1990-92) ... not counting the 4-game 2020 season, the Huskies have won 10 or more games in 5 of the last 7 seasons.

**TELEVISION:** The Washington-OSU game will air on ABC, with Chris Fowler, Kirk Herbstreit and Holly Rowe calling the action. Fans will with the proper subscription can also stream at espn.com/live.

**RADIO:** All Washington football games will air on the Washington Sports Network from Learfield, with Tony Castricone (play by play), former Husky tight end Cameron Cleeland (analyst) and former UW basketball player Elise Woodward (sidelines) on the call. Radio coverage begins four hours before kickoff on the network's flagship station — Seattle's SportsRadio KJR 93.3 FM — with "Husky Gameday" live from The Zone for Husky home games. Statewide coverage on the 17-station Washington Sports Network begins two hours before kickoff. The entire broadcast is available worldwide on the Huskies Gameday mobile app and the Varsity app. The UW broadcast of this game will also air on Sirius/XM channel 138 or 197. ESPN Radio will also have a national radio broadcast with Mark Kestecher, Kelly Stouffer and Ian Fitzsimmons.

### KALEN DeBOER **HEAD COACH** Second Season at UW

Success has come consistently and quickly at every stop in the career of UW football coach Kalen DeBoer. On Nov. 29, 2021, DeBoer took his next step, when he was named the 30th head football coach in UW history. His first season was an undisputed success.

DeBoer, 48, came to Montlake from Fresno State, where during the 2021 season, he led the Bulldogs to a 9-3 regular-season record in his second year in charge. In his first year at UW, he led the Huskies to a,

11-2 overall record, including a 3-0 mark against ranked teams, and a win over Texas in the Valero Alamo Bowl. His Huskies swept its three Northwest rivals, finished in a tie for second in the Pac-12, and he was named Pac-12 Co-Coach of the Year. He was also the Associated Press Pac-12 Coach of the Year and, at the 88th annual Seattle Sports Star of the Year Awards in Feb., 2023, earned the inaugural Seattle Sports Leader of the Year Award.

Not only were 11 wins in 2022 three more than any first-year coach in UW history had ever compiled, DeBoer was the first Husky coach ever to win a bowl game in year one.

Over his eight seasons as a head football coach (through 2022), DeBoer has compiled a 90-11 (.882) record. During his 26 years in coaching, he has consistently prospered at multiple levels and in different roles, helping to build and revitalize programs while establishing a diverse network of contacts, in both coaching and recruiting, across the country.

In two years at Fresno State, which included the pandemic-shortened 2020 season, DeBoer's teams made great strides on both sides of the ball.

In 2021, Fresno State finished first in the MWC and 14th in the nation in total offense (464.8 yards per game) and second in the conference and 26th in FBS in scoring (30.5 points per game). The Bulldogs' passing offense ranked second in conference and ninth in the country, with 326.7 yards per game.

The offense, and passing game in particular, also flourished in 2020, as it produced a conference-best 479.3 yards total offense per game, and the league's second-highest points per game total (32.8). Fresno State also led the Mountain West in passing yards per game, and ranked fifth in the FBS in that category, with 356.3 per game.

In DeBoer's two seasons in Fresno, the defense also made vast improvements in nearly every team defensive category over the 2019 season, the year before his arrival.

The Bulldogs' defense went from 82nd in the national in scoring defense and 88th in total defense in 2019, to No. 20 and No. 31 in the FBS in 2021, respectively – improvements of 62 and 57 places. In terms of NCAA-FBS national ranking, the run defense improved from 71st to 24th while the pass defense leapt from 107th to 58th. Fresno State also improved its national ranking by 45 or more places in yards allowed per play, opponent first downs, sacks, TFLs, third-down percentage defense, and fourth-down percentage defense.

In 2021, Fresno State ranked among the top 25 in the nation in numerous categories. Immediately prior to leading Fresno State's program, DeBoer was on staff at Indiana University, as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. After helping to guide the Hoosiers to an 8-5 record and a berth in the Gator Bowl, DeBoer returned to Fresno State, taking over for Jeff Tedford, who resigned for health reasons following the 2019 season.

The Hoosiers' eight victories in 2019 matched their highest wins total in 26 seasons, and IU ranked No. 3 in the Big Ten in total offense.

In 2017, Tedford, in his first season as head coach at Fresno State, hired DeBoer as his offensive coordinator and QBs coach. In two seasons in that role, DeBoer helped the Bulldogs to overall records of 10-4 (2017) and 12-2 (2018), along with two division titles, two bowl game victories and the Mountain West Conference Championship in 2018.

DeBoer's two years as the Bulldogs' offensive coordinator concluded with a Mountain West Championship and Las Vegas Bowl win to cap a 22-6 run during the 2017-18 seasons. Those two seasons included double-digit winning seasons each year, coming off a 1-11 campaign in 2016, the year prior to Tedford's (and DeBoer's) arrival.

Fresno State reached unprecedented heights in year No. 2 with DeBoer as the OC as the Bulldogs posted a school-record 12 victories, and finished ranked No. 18 in both polls.

The offense ranked 26th nationally in scoring offense (34.6) and 29th in passing offense (267.1), and produced five all-conference honorees. The Bulldogs finished eighth nationally in team passing efficiency (156.58), tied for 15th in turnovers lost (14), tied for 19th nationally in red zone offense (89.5 percent) and 25th in third-down conversions (44.6).

Under DeBoer's coaching, quarterback Marcus McMaryion completed 62.1 percent of

his passes, third-best in the MWC. With five interceptions on the year, McMaryion finished the season with the seventh-lowest interception percentage in Bulldog history at 1.42.

A school-record setting wide receiver at the University of Sioux Falls (S.D.), DeBoer later led his alma mater to three NAIA National Championships in five seasons as head coach, winning the title in 2006, 2008 and 2009, while also finishing as runner-up in 2007 and making the semifinals in his first season as head coach, in 2005.

During his five seasons at Sioux Falls, DeBoer compiled a 67-3 overall record, including a 49-1 mark in Great Plains Athletic Conference play. In two seasons at Fresno State, he had a 12-6 overall record, giving him a career record of 79-9. He was NAIA National Coach of the Year in each of his three championship seasons at USF.

DeBoer coached three NAIA National Players of the Year winners in quarterbacks Lorenzo Brown (2009) and Chad Cavender (2007), and running back Nick Kortan (2002). During his time at USF, he helped develop 25 first-team All-Americans.

After the 2009 season, he took a job at Southern Illinois as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach from 2010 through 2013. He moved to Eastern Michigan as OC and QBs coach from 2014-2016, helping the Eagles to their third-ever bowl-game berth in 2016. That year, the Eagles posted their first .500-or-better season since 1995 and tied the FBS mark for biggest turnarounds in 2016, improving on its one-win season in 2015.

DeBoer's offense shattered the school record for total yards, with 5,917. School records were also set for points scored (385), passing yards (3,849), touchdown passes (25), first downs (303), pass completions (309), plays (999), as well single-game plays (99)

In his four seasons (2010-13) as offensive coordinator at Southern Illinois, the Salukis beat 10 Top-25 opponents. In 2013, the SIU offense led the Missouri Valley Conference with 231.8 passing yards per game, fourth-highest total in school history. SIU's 25 passing touchdowns on the season tied for the third-highest total in school history. Under DeBoer's tutelage, tight end MyCole Pruitt was named to the 2013 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) FCS All-America team while John Lantz developed into an All-MVFC receiver.

During the 2011 campaign, the Salukis ranked third in the nation with an average of 183.1 rushing yards a contest. Bryan Boemer also developed into the Rimington Award winner, which is presented to the nation's premier center.

As a student at Sioux Falls, DeBoer set records in both football and baseball. During his football career, he compiled 3,400 yards and 33 touchdowns on 234 career receptions - all school records at the time - and played on the 1996 NAIA Division II National Championship team, which beat Western Washington in the final. He also played baseball for the Cougars, batting .520 (still a school record) as a senior in 1998. His career average of .492 is still best in USF history as are his 37 career homers, and .944 slugging percentage.

A 1998 graduate of the University of Sioux Falls with a degree in secondary education, DeBoer and his wife, Nicole, are the parents of two daughters, Alexis and Avery.

**COACHING STAFF:** All 10 of UW's full-time assistants from the 2022 season are back in 2023. Nine of the Huskies' 10 were new to the program last year, with six of them having worked at Fresno State under DeBoer, including all of the coordinators. On the offensive side, Ryan Grubb serves as coordinator and guarterbacks coach, having held both of those titles in 2021 at Fresno State, where he spent the previous four seasons. A former assistant at Sioux Falls under DeBoer, the two also worked alongside one another at Eastern Michigan. UW has two co-defensive coordinators: Chuck Morrell and Wiliam Inge. Morrell was a teammate of DeBoer's at Sioux Falls, and later served as his defensive coordinator there as well. In the interim, he spent nine seasons as head coach at Montana Tech before working as safeties coach at Fresno State in 2020 and 2021. Inge, who played against the UW in the 1995 Sun Bowl as a defensive end for lowa, first worked with DeBoer at Indiana in 2019. He then joined DeBoer's staff in Fresno, where he was defensive coordinator and linebackers coach in 2020 and 2021. Special teams coordinator and edges coach Eric Schmidt handled special teams and the d-line at Fresno State in 2020-21. A standout player at North Dakota, he first worked alongside DeBoer at Southern Illinois (2010-13). Cornerbacks coach Julius "Juice" Brown also comes to Seattle from Fresno, where he coached the Husky position and was recruiting coordinator under DeBoer. Like Brown, Lee Marks is former Boise State player. Early in his coaching career, he spent a season as a GA at Sioux Falls (after DeBoer's departure), but spent the 2020 and 2021 seasons as running backs coach for the Bulldogs under DeBoer. Tight ends coach Nick Sheridan, a former Michigan quarterback, held the same title at Indiana in 2019, the year DeBoer was the Hoosiers' offensive coordinator. Sheridan was OC and guarterbacks coach in Bloomington for two seasons before coming to Seattle. Three UW assistants were working with DeBoer for the first time in '22: offensive line coach Scott Huff, wide receiver coach JaMarcus Shephard, and defensive line coach Inoke Breckterfield. Huff, a former teammate of Marks and Brown at Boise State, returns for his seven season as the Huskies' o-line mentor in 2023. Shephard came to Washington after a very successful stint as receivers coach at Purdue the previous five years. Breckterfield, a standout defensive lineman at Oregon State, most recently worked in the same role at Vanderbilt, but has also worked at Wisconsin, Pitt and UCLA, among others.

**STAFF CONTINUITY:** Washington's entire full-time coaching staff remained in tact following the 2022 season, which was coach Kalen DeBoer's first at the UW. He, along with all 10 full-time assistants, are back in 2023. That's actually rare in UW history as the coaching staffs have gone unchanged over two or more seasons only three times before (UW records for coaching staffs go back to the mid-1950s): 1989-90, 2009-11, and 2014-15.

**HUSKIES vs. BEAVERS HISTORY:** Washington holds a 68-35-4 record in the all-time series against Oregon State, having broken a nine-game win streak in 2021. UW has won 26 of the last 35 meetings and 36 of the last 46, dating back to 1975. The series against the Beavers is the second-longest (to Stanford) active series in Washington football history in terms of years and third-longest in terms of total meetings (to Oregon and WSU).

The teams first met on Dec. 4, 1897, with Oregon State earning a 16-0 home win. That game was Washington's second-ever against a major college. The next OSU-UW game didn't come until 1902, a 16-6 UW win.

Last year in Seattle, UW scored 10 points in the final quarter to win, 24-21, capped by a 22-yard field goal from Peyton Henry with just 0:08 on the clock. In 2021 in Corvallis, OSU kicked a 24-yard field goal on the game's final play to earn a 27-24 win. In 2020, one of UW's four games was a 27-21 win over Oregon State, in the Huskies' season-opener, Nov. 14, 2020. Sean McGrew, Kamari Pleasant and Dylan Morris all rushed for TDs in the win. Two years ago, Washington won a low-scoring game, 16-7, behind two field goals from Petyon Henry and two touchdown runs from Salvon Ahmed. In 2018 in Seattle, the Huskies built a 28-3 halftime lead and won, 42-23. The year before in Corvallis, Dante Pettis caught three TD passes from Jake Browning in a 42-7 UW win. In 2016 in Seattle, Washington opened a 21-0 lead in the first quarter and won, 41-17. Myles Gaskin rushed for 128 yards and a TD while both John Ross and Pettis topped 100 yards receiving. Browning was 14-for-28 for 291 yards and four scores. In 2015 in Corvallis, the Huskies won 52-7 as Browning also threw four TD passes and Gaskin rushed for 127 yards.

In 2014, Cyler Miles led UW to a 37-13 win, completing 18-of-23 passes for 253 yards and two TDs. In 2013 in Corvallis, Washington rushed for 537 yards and seven TDs en route to a 69-27 win. Three Husky backs ran for 100 yards (Bishop Sankey, 179; Deontae Cooper, 166; Dwayne Washington, 141). In 2012 in Seattle, Washington handed a 6-0 OSU squad its first loss in a 20-17 victory at CenturyLink Field. The winning score came on a 30-yard field goal from Travis Coons with 1:20 remaining. In 2011 at OSU, the Beavers upset the UW with a 38-21 victory. In 2010 in Seattle, UW won 35-34 in two OTs, denying a two-point conversion for the win. Jake Locker tied a then-school record with five TD passes, four to Jermaine Kearse.

In 2009 at OSU, the Beavers got 159 rushing yards from Jacquizz Rodgers to roll to a 48-21 win. In 2008 in Seattle, James Rodgers rushed for 110 yards on only three carries and Lyle Moevao was 18-for-22 for 191 yards to lead OSU past the UW, 34-13. The 2007 game in Corvallis was memorable for an injury to Locker, controversial calls from referees and five Alexis Serna field goals in a 29-23 Beavers win. In 2006 in Seattle, OB Isaiah Stanback's college career came to an end with a devastating foot injury and the Huskies lost, 27-17. In 2005, the Beavers got six field goals from Serna in an 18-10 win. In 2004 at Husky Stadium, OSU picked up its second win in four seasons against the UW with a 29-14 win, the Beavers first at Husky Stadium since 1985. Serna kicked a then-school-record five field goals to provide the winning margin. In 2003 in Corvallis, Charles Frederick piled up a school-record 371 all-purpose yards, scoring three touchdowns, as the Huskies cruised to a 38-17 win.

The Beavers' next-most recent win (prior to 2004) in the series came in Corvallis on Nov. 10, 2001, when the Beavers broke a 13-game losing streak to the Huskies. That day, an unranked OSU team trounced No. 8 Washington, 49-24, the first Beaver win (home or away) since the 1985 Husky Stadium game. Several other recent meetings have come down to the wire. In 2000, Ryan Cesca missed a game-tying field goal in the closing seconds as the Huskies held on for a 33-30 win. In 1998, the Beavers went for a two-point conversion with no time left. The pass attempt was batted down by Husky safety Nigel Burton and the Huskies won, 35-34.

**DAWGS AND THE NORTHWEST:** Washington's most-played rivalries are against the other three other northwest Pac-12 schools. The Huskies have faced Washington State 114 times, Oregon in 115 games and Oregon State on 107 occasions. Washington owns the advantage in all three series. The Huskies lead the Ducks 62-48-5,

### TEAM NOTES

Washington State 75-33-6 and Oregon State 68-35-4. Combined, Washington has a 205-116-15 (.632) record against its northwest rivals. Washington has played all three of the Northwest teams in a season on 93 prior occasions. Over those 93 seasons in which Oregon, OSU and WSU were all on the UW schedule, the Dawgs have swept all three 31 times. In the meantime, the Huskies have lost to all three in the same season on only eight occasions.

**SPECIAL TEAMS EXCELLENCE:** Through 10 games, Washington is No. 2 in the nation in punt return defense, having allowed minus-1 yards in returns over the season. UW is also No. 6 in FBS in kick return defense (14.7 yds. per return), while kicker Grady Gross is No. 18 in field-goal percentage.

**EXPERIENCE AND YOUTH:** Washington's current roster includes a total of 34 players – 17 each on offense and defense – who have started at least one game for the Huskies prior to 2023. Entering the year, the 17 offensive players had totaled 145 starts in the Purple & Gold, while the 17 defensive players (which includes former offensive line starter Ulumoo Ale) had 156 starts between them. Tight end Devin Culp entered the 2023 season with the highest total of starts under is belt among offensive players, with 18, while safety zx0Asa Turner, with 23 career starts entering 2023, led the defensive side. The list of Dawgs with starting experience doesn't take into account the 10 current Huskies who transferred to UW after having started at another four-year college, nor does it account for starting "specialists." Washington 119-man roster entering the year included just 15 players in their final year of eligibility, along with 29 true freshmen, 15 redshirt freshmen, 35 sophomores and 25 juniors. Potentially, 104 current Huskies could return for 2024, while 79 enter the 2023 season with three or more years of eligibility remaining.

**GRADUATED DAWGS:** The 2023 Washington football roster includes 23 players who have earned their bachelor's degree. **LONG PLAYS:** Washington has notched 71 scrimmage plays of 20 or more yards over its first 10 games, the third-highest total in the nation. UW is also No. 3 in the nation with 35 plays of 30 yards or more. Those totals include 57 passes of 20 or more yards, and 27 of 30 or more, from quarterback Michael Penix Jr. Those totals are No. 2 and 3 in the nation. Penix also leads FBS with 141 completions of 10 yards

or more, 20 more than the next closest QB. Additionally, Rome Odunze is second in the nation with 44 receptions of 10-plus and is second with 21 of 20-plus yards, while Ja'Lynn Polk has 16 20-plus yard receptions (10th in the nation). Meanwhile, UW's defense has allowed 40 plays of 20 or more yards this season, 31 fewer than the Husky offense has had. UW has allowed just four rushing plays of 20-plus yards.

Last year, Washington finished the season with 62 passing plays for 20 or more yards, tied for eighth-most in the nation (five teams that ranked higher played more games than UW's 13). Washington led the nation last year with 193 pass plays for 10 or more yards.

**10-0 START:** Washington is 10-0 for just the second time in school history. The only other 10-0 start came in 1991, when the Huskies went 12-0 and won the national title. UW had a number of unbeated and untied seasons in its early history, but in none of those seasons did Washington play as many as 10 games.

**TWO 100-YARD RECEIVERS IN A GAME:** Prior to the start of this season, Washington had had just eight games in its history with two players finishing with 100 or more receiving yards (including two such games last year). So far this season, UW has had two players with 100 receiving yards in five of 10 games:

vs. Boise State: Rome Oduzne (132) & Ja'Lynn Polk (101) vs. Tulsa: Jalen McMillan (120) & Odunze (107)

at Michigan State: Odunze (180) & Polk (118)

vs. California: Polk (127) & Odunze (125)

vs. Oregon: Odunze (128) & Polk (118)

Additionally, last year, Odunze was the first Husky ever to record four straight 100-yard games. In the first four games of 2023, he matched that streak.

**CONFERENCE MOVES:** Along with USC, UCLA and Oregon, the Huskies will move to the Big Ten Conference after this coming academic year (2023-24) and will play a Big Ten schedule in 2024. Four other current Pac-12 programs — Arizona, Arizona State, Colorado and Utah — will join the Big 12 Conference in 2024-25; while Stanford and California will join the ACC. Washington has been a member of what is now the Pac-12 since the inception of the league, in 1915. Only the UW and California have/had been members in every year since. The UW football team has won a league title in every decade since the 1910s, other than the 2020s — the Dawgs will have one last chance to extend that streak this year.

**ALASKA AIRLINES FIELD AT HUSKY STADIUM:** The Oregon game on Nov. 5, 2011, marked the final game in Husky Stadium prior to major renovations that were completed in summer, 2013. The Huskies re-opened their home field with a 38-6 win over then-No. 19 Boise State on Aug. 31, 2013. The 2023 season marks the 103rd season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium stands at 412-185-21 (.684). Washington is 56-16 in home games since the stadium re-opened in 2013. The Huskies have won their last 13 at home.
