Post-Game Notes Washington at Oregon State Reser Stadium, Nov. 18, 2023

Washington is 11-0 for just the second time in school history. The only previous time was in 1991, when the Huskies ran the table and finished 12-0 (11-game regular season, followed by a win over Michigan in the 1992 Rose Bowl).

With the win, UW has clinched a place in the 2023 Pac-12 Football Championship Game, Dec. 1 in Las Vegas. It will mark the Huskies' third appearance in that game, after wins over Colorado in 2016 and Utah in 2018.

Washington has won 18 straight games, the second-longest active streak in the country, behind Georgia, and the third-longest in Husky history (longer UW streaks: 40 straight wins 1908-16; 22 straight wins 1990-92).

Jabbar Muhammad had two interceptions tonight, making him the first Husky with two picks in a game since Asa Turner had two in the 2022 season opener vs. Kent State. UW has 13 interceptions as a team in 2023, after recording just seven all of last season.

Michael Penix Jr. scored a rushing TD in his third straight game. He'd never rushed for more than two scores in any one season during his college career.

With two touchdown receptions tonight, Rome Odunze has 11 this season and 22 in his career. Those totals tie him for fifth on the single-season UW top-10 list, and tied for fourth on the career list.

UW receiver Rome Odunze notched the seventh 100-yard receiving game of the season, finishing the game with seven catches for 106 yards, and two touchdowns. For the season, Odunze now has 1,206 yards, third in UW history.

Washington head coach Kalen DeBoer is now 101-11 as a head coach, and is 22-2 at UW.
