THE GAME

The No. 18 University of Utah Football team is set to take on its fifth ranked opponent of the season, traveling to Seattle, Wash., to battle the No. 5 Washington Huskies on Saturday, Nov. 11. The game will kickoff at 1:30 p.m. MT, airing on FOX.

IN THE PAC-12

Utah has played in 110 games in the Pac-12 with a 64-46 overall (.581) record since joining the league in 2011. The Utes are 142-168-6 all-time against current Pac-12 members.

- Utah is in its 13th season in the Pac-12.
- In the first six seasons of their membership, the Utes were 25-29 in the league with three seasons with a winning record in conference play. Since then, Utah is 39-17 with five winning records in conference play.
- The Utes are 30-8 in conference games since 2019.
- Utah currently has a winning record against Arizona (26-9-2), Colorado (34-32-3), Stanford (7-4-0) and Washington State (11-9-0).

THE NUMBERS

- Head Coach Kyle Whittingham is set to coach in his 364th overall game at Utah and his 238th as head coach on Saturday.
- Utah leads the FBS in time of possession this season, holding the ball for 34:19 per game.
- Utah is holding opponents to 282.3 yards per game, which ranks first in the Pac-12 (9th in FBS).
- Utah and Washington haven't played each other since 2020.

UTAH FOOTBALL: NEED TO KNOWS

- Utah is currently ranked 18th in the College Football Playoff Poll, 13th in the AP Poll and 14th in the Coaches Poll. Utah has ranked inside the top-25 in the AP and Coaches polls for 32 straight weeks – which also included 14 consecutive weeks in the top-15 (Oct. 16, 2022 to Sept. 24, 2023).
- Through nine games, Utah is one of four teams in the FBS that rank in the top-10 in rushing defense, scoring defense and total defense (Penn State, Michigan, Air Force).
- Utah leads the Pac-12 in 14 different statistical categories.
- The Utes have only committed six turnovers this season, which ranks fifth in the FBS and second in the Pac-12.
- The Utes have posted a winning record in nine straight seasons, dating back to 2014. Utah has finished with a winning season in 16 of Kyle Whittingham's 18 years as head coach.
- Utah is the third team in Pac-12 Conference history to win back-to-back conference championship games (2021, 2022).

HEAD COACH KYLE WHITTINGHAM

Record at Utah: 161-76 (19th year)

Kyle Whittingham, the longest-tenured coach in the Pac-12 Conference and the second-longest tenured head coach at the same school in the NCAA FBS, is in his 19th season at the helm at Utah in 2023, where he boasts a 161-76 record as the all-time wins leader.

- Including 11 seasons as a Ute assistant coach, he has contributed to more victories (246) than any coach in program history.
- He has coached in 363 games at Utah and 237 as the head coach.
- His 161 career wins, which passed Ike Armstrong (141-55-15 in 211 games from 1925-49) for the all-time wins number, is third among active FBS coaches at the same school and 13th among active FBS coaches overall (most in the Pac-12).
- Utah has finished with a winning record in 16 of his 18 years as head coach, including in nine straight.

Whittingham has led the Utes to back-to-back Pac-12 titles (2021, 2022) with the Utes also winning at least a share of the Pac-12 South four times (2015 – shared, 2018, 2019, 2021) before divisions were dissolved in 2022.

- He has won three National Coach of the Year recognitions – two in 2008 and one in 2019. He was the AFCA Coach of the Year and Bear Bryant Award winner in 2008, and the Dodd Trophy Coach of the Year in 2019.
- In 2019 he won AFCA Regional Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the AFCA Coach of the Year and Bear Bryant Award.
- He has also won Pac-12 Coach of the Year twice in the last five seasons (2019, 2021).
- In 2021, Whittingham was a finalist for the Bear Bryant Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

The Utes appeared in every weekly CFP top-25 for the first three years of the system (2014-16) and have tied for the seventh-most appearances of any school with 42 total.

- Utah has finished in the CFP top-25 in seven seasons: No. 22 in 2014 and 2015, No. 19 in 2016, No. 17 in 2018, No. 11 in 2019, No. 11 in 2021 and its highest-ever ranking at No. 8 in 2022.
- The Utes have also made the final AP top-25 seven times and the final Coaches' poll eight times under Whittingham.
- Whittingham's teams have also performed well against AP top-25 teams, recording 23 wins against ranked opponents, including top-10 victories over No. 4 Alabama (2009), No. 5 Stanford (2013), No. 8 UCLA (2014), No. 4 Oregon (2021, regular season), again when the Ducks were ranked No. 10 in the Pac-12 Championship game, vs. No. 7 USC (2022, regular season) and again against the Trojans when they were ranked No. 4 in the 2022 Pac-12 Championship game.

TEAM NOTES
THE UTAH MAN Head coach Kyle Whittingham is in his 19th year at the helm as the longest-tenured coach in the Pac-12 and the second-longest tenured coach at the same school in the NCAA FBS. He is 161-76 overall at Utah, becoming the all-time wins leader at Utah in 2021. He passed Ike Armstrong (141-55-15 in 211 games) with Utah's historic win over No. 3 Oregon on Nov. 20, 2021 in Rice-Eccles Stadium. He has coached in 363 games at Utah (11 seasons as an assistant) and 237 as the head coach. • He has contributed to more victories than any coach in program history (246), including his 11 seasons as an assistant coach (1994-2004). • His 161 career wins as the head coach of the Utes is third among active FBS coaches at the same school and is 13th among active FBS coaches overall (most in the Pac-12). • Whittingham has led Utah to back-to-back Pac-12 titles in 2021 and 2022, also leading the Utes to at least a share of the Pac-12 South title four times overall prior to the league dissolving divisions. • He has won three National Coach of the Year recognitions: AFCA Coach of the Year and Bear Bryant Award winner in 2008, and the Dodd Trophy Coach of the Year in 2019. • Whittingham was also Pac-12 Coach of the Year in 2019 and 2021. • He has had 34 players make All-America teams, including 18 that have made major All-America teams (those determining NCAA's consensus team) with nine earning consensus or unanimous honors.
U WERE, U ARE, UTAH The notion of family has long been a hallmark of the Utah Football program, and the makeup of the coaching staff embodies that. Five members of the Utes' full-time coaching staff are alums of the program; it's tied for the most of any Power Five program in the 2023 season. • Utah's five alums on the coaching staff include Luther Elliss (DT), Quinton Ganther (RB), Lewis Powell (DE), Morgan Scalley (DC/S) and Sharrieff Shah (STC/CB). • Four other Power Five programs have five alums on staff. Clemson and Iowa had five alumni assistants, while Georgia and Michigan's alums included the head coach and four assistants. • In some capacity, head coach Kyle Whittingham directly tutored four of the five of the alums now on his staff. Sharrieff Shah missed Whittingham by just one season; he concluded his playing career in 1993 before Whittingham was named defensive line coach in '94. • Several more coaching, support and administrative staff working with the team also hold degrees from the U.
THEY CAME, THEY SAW, THEY STAYED Entering the 2023 season, the 10 Utah assistant coaches are averaging 7.4 seasons with the Utes. Six different Utes assistants are entering at least their eighth season on staff; it's the most this season within the same FBS program. • Morgan Scalley (16), Sharrieff Shah (12), Jim Harding (10), Andy Ludwig (9), Lewis Powell (9) and Freddie Whittingham (8) all boast eight-plus-year coaching tenures at Utah entering 2023. • Ludwig's nine seasons are spread across two stints under head coach Kyle Whittingham; he was with the Utes from 2005-08 before returning to Salt Lake City in 2019. • Iowa and Oklahoma State have five assistants entering their eighth season or more and four teams have four such assistants.

- Keaton Bills (Family, Community & Human Development, summer 2022), JaTravis Broughton (Sociology, spring 2023), Chris Curry (Communication, fall 2022), Falcon Kaumatule (Business Administration, fall 2022), Brant Kuithe (Communication, spring 2022), Sataoa Laumea (Business Administration, spring 2023), Johnny Maea (Family, Community & Human Development, Health & Kinesiology, summer 2023), Munir McClain (Sociology, spring 2023), Cameron Rising (Criminology, spring 2021), Miki Suguturaga (Criminology, fall 2022), Devaughn Vele (Communication, fall 2022), Charlie Vincent (Health & Kinesiology, spring 2023) and Thomas Yassmin (Mathematics, Quantitative Analysis of Markets & Organizations, summer 2022) are all graduates of Utah.
- Briton Allen (Journalism, USC, spring 2023), Miles Battle (Integrated Marketing Communication, Ole Miss, fall 2022), Chase Carter (Biology, Morningside University, summer 2023), Levani Damuni (Science, Technology & Society, Stanford, spring 2023), Mycah Pittman (Communication, Florida State, summer 2023) and Emery Simmons (Liberal Studies, Indiana, spring 2023) joined the team this season as graduate transfers.

HOME SWEET HOME

Utah is 117-37 (.759) in Rice-Eccles Stadium (1998-present) and is 89-26 in RES during the Kyle Whittingham era.

- The Utes have five undefeated home seasons under Whittingham (2022, 6-0; 2021, 6-0; 2019, 7-0; 2009, 6-0; 2008, 6-0) with the Utes winning 30 of their last 32 home games, which included a streak of 18 in a row from Dec. 5, 2020-Oct. 28, 2023.
- It was the second-longest streak in the Whittingham era with the longest streak taking place Sept. 15, 2007 to Oct. 23, 2010 (21 games).
- Utah has sold out Rice-Eccles Stadium in 82 consecutive

games, dating back to the 2010 season opener.

THE POLLS

Utah has become a staple in the AP, Coaches and the College Football Playoff polls, coming off the 2022 season where it held its highest-ever finish in the CFP with its No. 8 final ranking.

- Utah ranked No. 14 in the preseason AP Poll, marking the fifth straight season the Utes have ranked inside the top-25 in the preseason poll.
- Utah is currently ranked 13th in the AP and 14th in the Coaches poll, the 32nd straight week that the Utes have ranked inside the top-25 in both polls.
- Since the CFP Poll was introduced in 2014, Utah has earned a top-25 ranking in the first poll of the season every year except for three (2017, 2020, 2021). The Utes earned a No. 18 ranking in the first CFP Poll that came out on Oct. 31.
- Utah appeared in every weekly CFP Top 25 for the first three years of the system (2014-16) and have the seventh-most appearances of any school with 42 total.
- The Utes have also appeared in the final CFP Poll in seven seasons (No. 8 in 2022, No. 11 in 2021, No. 11 in 2019, No. 17 in 2018, No. 19 in 2016, No. 22 in 2015, No. 22 in 2014).
- Utah is 78-27 when ranked in the AP Poll during the Kyle Whittingham era.
- Utah is 26-16 in games when ranked in the CFP Poll.
- In the Whittingham era, Utah has 23 wins against ranked opponents, including top-10 victories over No. 4 USC (Pac-12 Championship game, 2022), No. 4 Oregon (regular season, 2021), No. 4 Alabama (Sugar Bowl, 2009), No. 5 Stanford (regular season, 2013), No. 7 USC (regular season, 2022), No. 8 UCLA (regular season, 2014) and No. 10 Oregon (Pac-12 Championship Game, 2021).

THE MOMENT OF LOUDNESS

In 2021, the Utah Football program started a tradition to honor the legacy of Aaron Lowe and Ty Jordan with The Moment of Loudness, that takes place during the third quarter break of each home game. It is a tradition that has now turned into a way of life for the Utah family. To live the way that they did - to smile, to be infectiously optimistic, and to be 22-percent better every day. Each third quarter break, we invite the entire Utah community to let their voices ring from the mountains to the heavens in a moment of loudness, exuberance and joy.



OFFENSIVE NOTES

THE MASTERMIND

Known as the mastermind and conductor of the Utah offense, Andy Ludwig is in his fifth year of his second full-time stint with the Utes as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. After returning in 2019, Ludwig has helped lead the offense to heights unrivaled in recent history.

- Ludwig spent the 2015-18 seasons as Vanderbilt's offensive coordinator following a two-year run at Wisconsin (2013-14), two years at San Diego State (2011-12) and two years at California (2009-10), all since helping Utah to a 13-0 record in 2008 and a Sugar Bowl win over Alabama.
- In the five seasons since his return, the Utah offense has eclipsed 450 yards of total offense in 26 of the 56 games he has coached in, also scoring 30-or-more points in 38.
- Utah's 55 points in its win over Arizona State this season was the most since scoring 63 at Colorado in 2022 with the 52-point margin of victory counting as the largest for the Utes in a Pac-12 game. It was also the fifth time since Ludwig's return in 2019 that Utah has eclipsed the 50-point mark in a game.
- The Utes also put up 513 yards of total offense against Arizona State, the most since its 533 yards vs. USC in the 2022 Pac-12 Championship game and the 13th time since 2019 that Utah has had 500+ yards in a game.
- Utah has produced 1,875 points (33.5 per game), 224 touchdowns and 23,796 yards of total offense (424.9 per game) through the 56 games he has coached in since 2019, only committing 65 turnovers in that time span.
- Since 2019, Utah has only been held to under 300 yards of total offense in just five games.
- A proponent of a balanced attack, he has coached a 1,000-yard rusher 17 times in his FBS coaching career with the Utes finishing in the top-three in the Pac-12 in passing efficiency in 2019 and 2021.
- In the last 56 games under Ludwig, Utah has reached the 200-yard rushing mark in 30 games, including in five this season.
- Since 2021, Utah has scored 89 rushing touchdowns, including breaking the school record in single-season rushing touchdowns in back-to-back years (38 in 2022, 37 in 2021).
- In 2021 and 2022, the Utes produced two of the highest rushing yard totals in program history with Utah's 3,047 yards in 2022 ranking second and its 3,035 yards in 2021 ranking third all-time.
- In 2022, Utah led the Pac-12 and ranked second in the FBS in first downs offense, producing 365 first downs for an average of 26.1 per game.
- Utah's 38.6 points per game in 2022 ranked 11th in the FBS, scoring 30+ points in 10 of its 14 games.

KEEPING TIME

Through nine games in 2023, Utah leads the FBS in time of possession, holding the ball for an average of 34:19 with the Utes and Liberty (34:03) currently the only two teams in the country holding possession for over 34:00 per game this season.

- Entering the 2023 season, Utah had led the Pac-12 in time of possession in four straight seasons, also ranking in the top-10 in the FBS in three of those four seasons.
- Utah has won the time of possession battle in seven of its nine games this season (at Baylor, vs. Weber State, vs. UCLA, vs. Cal, at USC, vs. Oregon, vs. Arizona State).

- In seven of the nine games this season, Utah has held the ball for 30:00+, including in four straight.
- Utah has played 36 quarters of football this season and has held possession for 10+ minutes in seven.
- The Utes are holding the ball for an average of 10:02 in the second quarter this season.
- Against Weber State, Utah held the ball for 40:05, compared to the Wildcats' 19:55. It was the most possession time for the Utes since their game against Cal on Oct. 1, 2016 when they held the ball for 42:01.
- Utah's 40:05 possession time against Weber State was the fourth time that the Utes have had 40 minutes or more possession time since 1996, with three of the four being in the Pac-12 era.

UNDERCLASS HEROES

It has been no secret that the Utes have had to rely on new or different personnel each week with their "Next Man Up" mentality stretching to the youth on the offensive side of the roster.

- Out of the 1,734 rushing yards produced this season, underclassmen have accounted for 1,450 through nine games (83%)
- On the offensive line, Utah has had four underclassmen start in games this season (Jaren Kump, Center, Sophomore; Michael Mokofisi, Right Guard, Sophomore; Spencer Fano, Left Tackle, Freshman; Kolinu'u Faaiu, Center, Sophomore).
- Through nine games, true freshman Mikey Matthews ranks second on the team in total receptions (25), recording 229 yards with 9.2 yards per catch.
- Three underclassmen lead the Utes in all-purpose yards with Ja'Quinden Jackson (So., RB) leading the way with 619 yards (598 rush, 21 rec), followed by Mikey Matthews (Fr., WR) with 554 yards (4 rush, 229 rec, 64 PR, 257 KR) and Sione Vaki (So., S/RB) with 405 (243 rush, 144 rec, 16 KR, 2 IR).

QUARTERBACK NOTES

THE QBs

As the Utes enter Week 11 with seven quarterbacks on the roster, the room is full of real game experience and a diverse set of skills that has given Utah depth hitting the field each and every week.

- Junior Bryson Barnes is in his fourth season with the program, having seen action in 21 games with seven starts. He has played in both Rose Bowls along with starting against Washington State in 2022 and in six games in 2023. He is also known for his activities off the field which include raising roughly 12,000 pigs in Southern Utah.
- Redshirt freshman Nate Johnson made a splash as a newcomer in 2022, showing off his speed in the run game while also throwing his first-career passing touchdown against Stanford. He has played in 10 career games, scoring six rushing touchdowns and four through the air, starting three times for the Utes this season (vs. Weber State, vs. #22 UCLA, at #19 Oregon State).
- Senior captain Cameron Rising announced he would redshirt the remainder of the season having played in 27 career games, including 25 starts. He is a two-time All-Pac-12 selection, earning first-team in 2021 and is currently tied for fifth all-time at Utah in starting quarterbacks wins (18).

NEXT MEN UP

The culture and motto of Utah Football has always been “next man up” and the dynamic duo of quarterbacks Bryson Barnes and Nate Johnson have done just that. Whether it is coming in during big game situations, or finding out last minute that they are the starter – Barnes and Johnson have been integral in Utah's offensive success.

- Both Barnes and Johnson have started in 2023 with Barnes going 5-1 as the starter this season (vs. Florida, at Baylor, vs. Cal, at USC) and Johnson holding a 2-1 record as the starter (wins vs. Weber State, UCLA, loss at Oregon State).
- Barnes has started seven games at Utah with a 6-1 overall record as a starting quarterback.
- Barnes has been no stranger to dramatics in his career with three of his game appearances including coming into both Rose Bowls for an injured Cameron Rising, including tying the 2021 game 45-45 with 1:54 to go on a 15-yard pass, also earning his first start against Washington State in 2022 - finding out just mere minutes before kick that he would be the starter.
- Johnson, a redshirt freshman, has only played in 10 games at Utah, but has amassed 10 total touchdowns (6 rush, 4 pass) during his time with the Utes. He has played in six games this season.
- Johnson leads the Utes this season in explosive plays, racking up 11 plays of 20 yards or longer (8 pass, 3 rush).
- He came to Utah as a four-star dual-threat quarterback out of Clovis HS, rated the No. 16 quarterback nationally.

PRINCE OF PIGS

From playing 1A football in Beaver County, to being announced as “The Pig Farmer” on national TV during the Rose Bowl, quarterback Bryson Barnes' journey as a Ute has been one for the books. Entering Saturday's game, he holds a 6-1 record as the starter at Utah – while also holding the attention of football fans across the country.

- Barnes came to Utah from Milford, Utah, as a walk-on after being named a three-time all-state selection and the 1A MVP in 2018.
- He set the Utah state record for career touchdown passes at Milford High School, throwing 137.
- His senior year in high school, Barnes passed for 3,533 yards and 39 touchdowns, but hadn't received any Division I football offers.
- When not playing on the gridiron, he was on the baseball diamond, earning 2A MVP and first-team all-state all while leading Milford to a state title in 2019.
- At Utah, Barnes has played in 21 games with seven starts, recording 1,383 passing yards (125-of-205) for 13 touchdowns, adding 70 carries for 310 yards (4.4 ypc) and three rushing scores.
- He has thrown for seven of his eight touchdowns this season in two of the last three games, throwing three in Utah's win at No. 18 USC and a career-high four touchdown passes against Arizona State.
- His four touchdowns against Arizona State tied for 10th all-time at Utah for single-game TD passes, also tying for the most by a Utah QB in the Whittingham era. It was also the most thrown in a Pac-12 game by a Ute since 2018 (Tyler Huntley vs. USC).
- He recorded 116 rushing yards in 2022 through 10 games and has 184 in eight games this season.
- Barnes has put up 167 of his 184 rushing yards in the last four games, averaging 4.9 yards per carry during that span.
- Barnes averaged 5.9 yards per carry against Cal and USC, scoring two of his three rushing touchdowns in those two games.

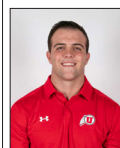

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES

HARDING'S LINE

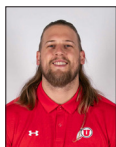
Assistant head coach and offensive line coach Jim Harding is in his 10th season at Utah in 2023, firmly establishing the Utes' front five as one of the best in the country. Harding has coached eight first-team All-Pac-12 selections and has had six offensive linemen selected in the NFL draft.

- OBlock greats under Harding include Garrett Bolles, Jordan Agasiva, Jackson Barton, Darrin Paulo, Nick Ford, Braeden Daniels and Sataoa Laumea, who have all earned first-team All-Pac-12 honors.
- He has had two Morris Trophy winners in Isaac Asiata (2016) and Nick Ford (2021), which honors the best offensive lineman in the conference by vote of the league's starting defensive linemen.
- Harding's linemen have blocked for a 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last nine seasons.
- Prior to coming to Utah, Harding spent five seasons at Wyoming as the offensive line coach (2009-13).

THE OBLOCK

Nine games into the 2023 season, Utah has seven offensive linemen on the roster that have started at least two games in their careers (Keaton Bills, 33 starts; Spencer Fano, 8 starts; Jaren Kump, 16 starts; Sataoa Laumea, 41 starts; Johnny Maea, 3 starts; Michael Mokofisi, 22 starts; Kolinu'u Faaiu, 4 starts).

- Physicality and versatility are the name of the game on Utah's offensive line with the current starters having started at multiple positions on the line. Mokofisi has started at both right guard and left guard, Maea has seen action at center and right guard, Kump has played at right tackle, left tackle, right guard and center while Laumea has started at both right guard and right tackle.
- Utah's current offensive line's 125 combined starts leads the league and ranks in the top-10 among Power Five programs.
- In 2022, Utah's offensive line was known for its physicality and controlling the line of scrimmage, only allowing 1.07 sacks per game, which ranked 16th nationally. The 2022 line also ranked 10th in the FBS in tackles for loss allowed per game (4.00) while blocking for the No. 11 rushing offense in the country.
- Since Harding took over in 2014, Utah has held teams to just 1.0 sack or less in 59 games, including zero sacks allowed in 26.
- Last season, Utah had six games with zero sacks allowed. The Utes didn't allow a sack in their season opener against Florida, ranking as one of four Pac-12 teams and 33 in the FBS that didn't allow a sack in week one, also not allowing a sack against Cal.
- During the 2021 season, Utah's offensive line ranked No. 4 in the FBS and first in the Pac-12 in sacks allowed (0.93) and was also No. 12 in tackles for loss allowed (3.86).

TIGHT END NOTES

TIGHT END U

Utah Football, also known as "Tight End University" or "Tight End U", brings back tight ends coach and leader Freddie Whittingham for his eighth season. Whittingham, who is also the recruiting coordinator for the program, has helped develop Utah's roster for 12 seasons after also serving as director of player personnel from 2012-15.

- Whittingham has been integral in developing one of the most successful offensive stretches in recent program history, prompting the Utes to deploy a two, and sometimes even a three-tight end formation much of the time.
- Out of the 12,190 yards produced through the air since 2019, Utah's tight ends have accounted for 34% (4,142) of the production with a tight end leading the Utes in receiving yards in three of the last four years.
- With Whittingham's tight ends being hybrid players, the tight end group has also been key in helping the Utes finish three of the last four seasons atop the Pac-12 in rushing offense.
- Utah's tight ends have also accounted for 46 total touchdowns since 2019.
- A Utah tight end has caught at least one pass in 80 of the last 81 games, which included 77 straight dating back to Utah's win over West Virginia on Dec. 26, 2017.
- In 2022, the tight end room finished the year with four different players scoring at least one touchdown with the group accounting for 18 of Utah's 31 receiving scores.

RUNNING BACK NOTES

GANTHER GATHERS THE BEST

In his second season as the Utes' running backs coach in 2023, Quinton Ganther is set to continue the legacy of the Utah running back room through the versatile talent in this year's group.

- In his first season at Utah, Ganther coached the Utes to the No. 11 rushing offense in the FBS with the Utes currently ranking 24th in the FBS and third in the Pac-12 with 192.7 yards per game.
- Since joining the staff, Utah has rushed for over 200 yards on offense in 12 games (7 in 2022, 5 in 2023), including four games for 300+ (306 vs. Arizona, 2022; 383 at Colorado, 2022; 317 vs. Cal, 2023; 352 vs. Arizona State, 2023).
- Utah rushed for 200+ yards in back-to-back games (317 vs. Cal, 247 at USC) for the second time this season (224 at Baylor, 231 vs. Weber State) and the fifth time since Ganther joined the staff in 2022.
- Utah has scored eight of its 14 rushing touchdowns this season in the last four games.
- Ganther spent the 2021 season with the Jacksonville Jaguars as the offensive quality control coach after leading the Weber State running backs room from 2013-20.
- While with Weber State, he saw the Wildcats earn three straight Big Sky titles along with four consecutive trips to the FCS Playoffs. He coached Josh Davis who earned All-America in 2018 and 2019, also earning National Freshman of the Year in 2018.
- Ganther was a seventh round NFL draft pick to Tennessee in 2006, spending six years in the NFL. He was a two-time All-Mountain West RB at Utah after transferring from Citrus Junior College as a JUCO All-American.
- As a senior at Utah in 2005, he rushed for 1,120 yards and seven touchdowns under current offensive coordinator Andy Ludwig.

WE CALL THEM RUNNING BACKS

In back-to-back seasons (2021, 2022), Utah's running back room has produced two of the highest rushing yard totals and rushing touchdown numbers in program history while finishing both seasons ranked in the top-15 in the FBS in rushing offense.

- Since 2021, Utah has eclipsed the 200-yard rushing mark in 18 of the 34 games, which includes four 300-yard games (306 vs. Arizona, 2022; 383 vs. Colorado, 2022; 317 vs. Cal, 2023; 352 vs. Arizona State, 2023) and a 400-yard game (441 vs. Stanford, 2021).
- Utah has scored 92 rushing touchdowns since 2021, breaking the school record in single-season rushing touchdowns in back-to-back years (38 in 2022, 37 in 2021).
- Utah finished the 2022 season with 3,047 rushing yards, which ranks second all-time while its 3,035 yards in 2021 ranks third.
- The Utes finished the 2021 season ranked No. 13 in the FBS and first in the league in rushing offense (216.8 yards per game), also ranking 11th in the FBS and second in the Pac-12 in 2022 (217.6).
- In 2022, Utah's 38 rushing touchdowns ranked fourth in the FBS and ranked fifth in 2021 (37 TDs), leading the Pac-12 in both years.

AN ATHLETE

Quarterback turned running back Ja'Quinden Jackson has proven his versatility and physicality on the field, and while his primary position heading into 2023 is running back – he wants fans to know that he can still do it all.

- Coming to Utah as a quarterback transfer out of Texas, Jackson played in three games in 2021 as a redshirt freshman. He was a high school All-American and four-star recruit out of Duncanville High School, rated the No. 2 overall recruit in the state of Texas.
- He has played in 24 career games at Utah, seeing action at quarterback, running back and on special teams. He has started in eight games at running back in 2023.
- He has five career 100-yard rushing games (117 at Colorado, 2022; 105 vs. USC, P12CG, 2022; 129 at Baylor, 2023; 117 at USC, 2023; 111 vs. Arizona State, 2023).
- He broke the 1,000 rushing yards mark with his 117 at USC in 2023 and now has 1,159 through 24 games.
- His career-high 129 rushing yards at Baylor in 2023 was the most by a Pac-12 player in week two of the season.

- Had back-to-back games with 20+ carries, including 22 against Cal and a career-high 26 at USC.
- His career-high 26 carries against the Trojans was the most by a Utah running back since 2020 when Ty Jordan had 27 against Oregon State (167 yds, 1 TD).
- The Dallas, Texas, native made the official switch to running back in week four of the 2022 season. He finished the year with 78 carries for 531 yards and nine rushing touchdowns.
- He rushed for over 100 yards in back-to-back games against Colorado (117 yds) and USC (105 yds) in the Pac-12 Championship game in 2022.
- In the final five games of 2022, he averaged 84.6 rushing yards and scored seven of his nine rushing touchdowns.

LIKE A GLOVE

In just 18 career games at Utah, sophomore running back Jaylon Glover has found his spot in the offensive scheme, racking up 719 yards on 172 carries, scoring six rushing touchdowns.

- He broke the 500 career rushing yards mark with his career-high 25 carries for a career-best 86 yards against UCLA in game four this season. He needs 281 yards to get to 1,000.
- His 94 carries and 359 yards ranks second on the team this year, needing one more yard to tie his season total from 2022 (360).
- Glover scored in back-to-back games in 2023 (1 rush TD at Baylor, 1 rush TD vs. Weber State), the first time in his career that he has scored in back-to-back games. His rushing touchdown against Baylor was his first game-winner.
- Glover made an immediate impact for the Utes in 2022 as a true freshman, scoring two rushing touchdowns in his collegiate debut against Southern Utah.

VALIANT VAKI

The word valiant is defined as "possessing or showing courage or determination." It fits in Utah's "next man up" culture with sophomore starting safety Sione Vaki showing determination as the Utes' newest two-way player.

- Vaki has played in 23 career games with 14 starts at safety, including starting all nine games in 2023 while most recently playing at both RB and safety in four of the last five games.
- In the last five games, Vaki has recorded 30 carries for 243 yards (8.1 ypc) and two rushing touchdowns, along with six catches for 144 yards and two receiving touchdowns.
- Vaki recorded a career-high 158 rushing yards on 15 carries with two touchdowns against Cal. It was the first time that a Utah defensive back had scored two rushing touchdowns in a game since Eric Weddle punched in two against Air Force in 2006.
- His 158 rushing yards are the most by a Pac-12 defensive back in the league's recorded history.
- The 158 rushing yards are the fourth-most by any Pac-12 player this season.
- He had a 72-yard rushing touchdown against the Bears as well, the longest rush by a player in the Pac-12 this season.
- It marked the 35th time in Utah's Pac-12 era that a player has rushed for 150+ yards in a game.
- Seven of his carries against Cal went for first downs.
- His 149 receiving yards and two touchdowns was the most by a Ute this season, while his 53-yard touchdown catch is the longest by a Utah defensive player in recorded history.

WHITTED WITH THE WIDEOUTS

In his first season at Utah, Alvis Whitted is coaching the Ute wide receivers after spending the past three seasons at Wisconsin, helping the Badgers to three bowl wins during his time in Madison.

- In 2022, Whitted developed receivers Chimere Dike, Skyler Bell and Keontez Lewis to average over 14.0 yards per catch with Dike finishing first on the team and in the top-10 in the Big Ten in total receiving yards (689).
- During the 2021 season, he also coached Kendric Pryor and Danny Davis along with Dike to combine for 83 catches, 1,166 yards and six touchdowns.
- Prior to his time with Wisconsin, he served as WRs coach for the Green Bay Packers in 2019, developing Pro Bowl pick Davante Adams, who set the franchise playoff record with his 160-yard, two-touchdown performance against Seattle in the NFC Divisional Round.
- He also mentored All-Americans and Biletnikoff Award finalists Rashard Higgins and Michael Gallup during his seven seasons at Colorado State.
- Whitted played in 122 NFL games with 24 starts, playing in two AFC Championships and Super Bowl XXXVII after being a two-sport athlete at North Carolina State. He was a return specialist for the football team and was a two-time All-American and five-time ACC champion on the track.
- Whitted finished sixth in the 200 meters at the 1996 U.S. Olympic Trials, competing in the final with U.S. greats Carl Lewis and Michael Johnson, who set a world record in the race.

BIG PLAY VELE

After starting his career at Utah in 2019 as a walk-on, Devaughn Vele has turned into one of the most dangerous weapons in the Pac-12. He has played in 45 career games with 26 starts at Utah, and has 1,433 receiving yards on 109 catches (13.1 ypc) and eight touchdowns.

- He has caught at least one pass in 33 of his 45 career games, including in nine straight that he has appeared in, dating back to last year's Rose Bowl game.

- Since the beginning of 2022, Vele has had 27 receptions counting for 15 yards-or-more.
- He has finished with a career-high in receptions three times, recording seven catches against Oregon State in 2022 (94 yds) and vs. Oregon (80 yds) and Arizona State (56) in 2023.
- Known for his go up and get it skills, Vele earned All-Pac-12 in 2022 as an honorable mention pick, ranking second on the team in receptions (55) with 695 receiving yards (5 TDs). He was also Utah's primary punt returner with 26 returns for 246 yards.
- He notched his first-career 100-yard receiving game in the Rose Bowl last season, finishing with 100 yards on five catches vs. Penn State.

ON THE MONEY

With the weapons Utah has at its disposal on a game-by-game basis, Utah's skill positions have to make the most of the reps they get – and junior wide receiver Money Parks has done just that.

- Parks has 50 receptions for 670 yards in 35 games played – averaging 13.4 yards per catch.
- He has caught a pass in 20 straight games for the Utes, dating back to Sept. 24, 2022.
- Of his 50 catches, Parks has nine catches for 20+ yards, including three that are for 40+ (70 vs. Florida, 2023; 45 vs. USC, 2022 regular season; 57 vs. USC, 2022 P12 Championship).
- His 70-yard touchdown catch in Utah's season-opening win over Florida was the longest of his career and his only catch of the game. It marked the second time in his career that his only catch of the game was a touchdown (1 catch, 12 yds, TD at USC, 2021).

LIKE MIKEY

A four-star recruit out of Mission Viejo High School in Irvine, Calif., true freshman wide receiver Mikey Matthews has wasted no time in making an impact for the Utes through eight games this season.

- Through nine games, Matthews has 25 receptions for 229 yards, averaging 9.2 yards per catch.
- He ranks second on the team in all-purpose yards with 554 (4 rush, 229 rec, 64 PR, 257 KR).
- He has led the Utes in receptions in four of the nine games, recording a career-high seven catches against Cal.
- Matthews has caught at least two passes in seven of the nine games this season.
- His seven receptions against Cal is the fourth-most by a freshman in the FBS in 2023. It was also the most by a Utah freshman since at least 1996.
- Matthews is the first freshman wide receiver to lead the Utes in receptions in a game since 2018 (Jaylen Dixon vs. Northwestern).
- Out of his 25 receptions this season, 11 have accounted for first downs.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

R.S.N.B.

A Salt Lake City native and Utah alumnus, defensive coordinator Morgan Scalley is in his 16th season on the Utes' coaching staff and eighth as defensive coordinator. One of the brightest minds in the business, Scalley has well-established the R.S.N.B. identity among his defense: relentless, smart, nasty, ballhawks. He continues to coach the safeties, a role he has held since first joining the coaching staff in 2008.

- Despite Scalley's defense missing several key pieces this year, Utah has locked it down with 282.3 total yards and 15.9 points allowed per game—both are the best marks in the Pac-12 and ninth in FBS.
- Those numbers are made up of the nation's fifth-best rushing defense (81.2 ypg), including five Utah opponents being held under 100 rushing yards. It puts the Utes as one of just 18 Power Five programs in that category.
- The Utes have also been tough to solve through the air with their pass efficiency defense (111.40) checking in at 11th nationally. Under Scalley, Utah has led the league in pass efficiency defense twice and finished top-three in four different seasons.
- The Utes held Arizona State to 83 total yards in Week 10 and Weber State to 127 yards in Week 3—the fourth and fifth times with Scalley as DC that Utah has held a team under 130 total yards of offense. ASU's total of 83 yards (1.4 yards per play) was tied for the fifth-lowest allowed in a game by Utah all-time.
- Including a pair of Power Five opponents (Baylor and Florida), Utah's three-game non-conference schedule saw the defense allow 31 total points. It was the fewest for the team in non-league play since 2019.
- Six of Utah's opponents have been held to 14 points or less, tying for fourth-most in Power Five football this season. It trails only Michigan (9), Ohio State (7) and Iowa (7). Of the aforementioned teams, Utah was the only one to play two Power Five opponents in non-conference.
- Prior to the USC game, Utah allowed no more than 21 points against its first six opponents; it was the first time under Scalley and second under head coach Kyle Whittingham (since 2005) that the Utes have accomplished such a feat.
- Utah has finished in the top-half of the Pac-12 in total defense six times in the past eight seasons, including the 2019 season where the team placed nationally and first in the league. The team averaged 334.1 yards against in 2022—ranking second in the Pac-12 and No. 18 among the Power Five.
- Rushing defense has long been a point of pride for Utah under Scalley; in his seven prior seasons as coordinator, Utah has led the Pac-12 five times in rushing defense (2016, '18, '19, '20 and '21). It includes ranking third in the nation in 2019 when Scalley was a Broyles Award finalist.
- The Utes have finished atop the conference both in sacks and tackles for loss in back-to-back years and three times under Scalley. Entering Week 11, Utah owns 57 TFL (third in Pac-12) and 29 sacks (third in Pac-12).

- Scalley has sent 29 protégés to the NFL, highlighted most recently by unanimous All-American and 2023 first-round NFL draft pick Clark Phillips III, as well as another first rounder the year prior in linebacker Devin Lloyd. Across the entire defense, he has coached 10 All-Americans, 17 First Team All-Conference picks and four Freshmen All-Americans.
- He is a renowned recruiter and helped Utah's 2023 class earn a No. 21 national rank from 247Sports.
- As a player, Scalley came to the Utes out of nearby Highland High School—which sits less than four miles from Rice-Eccles Stadium. He arrived on the scene in 2001 and went on to captain the 2004 squad, earn All-America and Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and guide the Utes to an undefeated season and Fiesta Bowl victory as a senior.
- Last year's Rose Bowl Game marked the fourth time that Scalley was part of what now comprises the New Year's Six: he had three tackles in Utah's 2005 Fiesta Bowl win over Pittsburgh, the 2009 Sugar Bowl win over Alabama capped his first season as safeties coach, and he was on the sidelines for both of the Utes' Rose Bowl appearances.
- Both of Scalley's parents are alumni of the U, including his father, Ford "Bud" Scalley, who lettered as a halfback from 1960-62.

GUARDING AGAINST THE GROUND GAME

R.S.N.B. football arguably has been best on display through Utah's rushing defense (81.2 ypg), the fifth-best in FBS. The Utes have a long-standing reputation of locking it down on the ground, with the most recent example in Week 4 when UCLA mustered just nine rushing yards (0.3 yards per attempt). It ranked tied for eighth-fewest against Utah for a single game.

- Utah also allowed just 13 rushing yards to Florida in the season opener. It marked the first time since 2002 that the Utes have held multiple opponents under 15 rushing yards in the same season.
- Although USC eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark in Week 8, Utah held the Trojans to just 45 yards in the final three quarters after surrendering 100 in the first period. It included a minus-three-yard ledger on the ground for USC during the second quarter.
- In the Utes' back-to-back Pac-12 Championship seasons of 2021 and '22, the defense averaged 338.8 total yards allowed per game. It led the Pac-12 and ranked 14th among Power Five programs during the two-year span.
- Since Morgan Scalley took on coordinator duties in 2016, the Utes have allowed 108.9 rushing yards per game and 96 touchdowns. Both are the best marks in the Pac-12 dating back to 2016, ranking fourth and seventh respectively among all Power Five programs.

- Utah has held five of its nine opponents under 100 rushing yards this season. It comes on the heels of a 2022 season in which the Utes kept seven different opponents under 100 rushing yards, highlighted by the Pac-12 Championship Game (USC - 56).
- In Utah's 95 games since 2016, the Utes have a Pac-12-leading 48 performances allowing 100 yards or less on the ground—33 have come in conference games. Overall, the Utes are 40-8 in those 48 games, with wins in 18 of the last 19.

- Under Scalley, the Utes have led the Pac-12 in rushing defense five times (2016, '18, '19, '20 and '21) and placed second in the league during '22. Nationally, the squad tabbed third in 2019 and fifth in 2018.

THIRD DOWN'S THE CHARM

Utah has a long-running reputation as one of the toughest teams in FBS to convert against on third down, finishing in the top-three of the Pac-12 each year since 2018 and leading the league three times in that span. Teams so far in 2023 are converting against the Utes an FBS-low 25.2% of the time.

- It correlates with Utah's 121 first downs allowed ranking as fewest in the Pac-12 and third-fewest in FBS. Only Michigan (102) and Penn State (118) sit ahead of the Utes.
- In Week 1, the Utes stopped Florida on its first nine third-down opportunities did not allow a conversion until the fourth quarter.
- Then, in Utah's Pac-12 Conference opener vs. UCLA, the Bruins were 3-of-17 on the day and converted just one of their final 12 third-down opportunities. Last week's matchup with Arizona State saw the Sun Devils unable to convert on their first eight third-down opportunities.
- Partly a byproduct of having a stingy third-down defense, Utah leads the nation in time of possession per game (34:19). The Utes have won the time of possession battle in four straight games and seven times this season.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

PICK-SIX CITY

Lander Barton's 23-yard interception return touchdown vs. Weber State extended Utah's FBS-leading active streak to 20 consecutive seasons with a pick-six. It dates back to 2004, when current defensive coordinator Morgan Scalley was a senior and played safety on the Utes' Fiesta Bowl-winning team.

- This run of annual interceptions returned for a touchdown is the longest active streak in FBS football, and is tied with Arizona State (20 seasons from 2000-19) for the longest dating back to at least 1996.
- During the 20-season span since 2004, Utah has totaled 45 pick-sixes, tying Alabama for the most in FBS in that span.
- Linebacker Karene Reid added a pick-six of his own in Week 4 vs. UCLA. It came on the very first play from scrimmage and marked Utah's first pick-six on the first play of a game six 2016 (Sunia Tauteoli vs. BYU).
- Jonathan Fanene and Steve Fifita scored Utah's pick-sixes in 2004 to begin the streak.

DEFENSIVE LINE NOTES

LEADING THE GUYS UP FRONT

For the second year in a row, the Utah defensive line is mentored by a pair of program alumni in defensive tackles coach Luther Elliss and defensive ends coach Lewis Powell. Elliss is in his second season with the program and played for the Utes from 1991-94, while Powell enters year nine on the coaching staff after donning the Utah uniform from 2001-03.

- Powell has coached five first team All-Pac-12 players and sent eight Utes to the NFL, including five draft picks. Three more of his alumni of the defensive ends room signed with NFL teams as undrafted free agents.
- Elliss returned to his alma mater after five seasons on the coaching staff at Idaho, where his defensive linemen earned seven All-Conference awards.
- Utah's reputation as one of the nation's top rushing defenses has been earned thanks in part to the defensive line. The Utes led the Pac-12 in TFL and sacks in their back-to-back Rose Bowl seasons. Both TFL totals (98 in 2021, 90 in 2022) rank among the top-nine in program history for a single season.
- Powell was the 2003 Liberty Bowl Defensive Player of the Game in a 17-0 Utah victory over Southern Miss, capping off a 10-2 season for the Utes.
- Elliss, the 1994 WAC Defensive Player of the Year, was a consensus All-American defensive end in his final season. He was selected 20th overall in the 1995 NFL Draft and enjoyed a 10-year playing career.

INTRODUCING THE MAYOR...

Longtime followers of the Utah Football program spotted a familiar name in 2021 when Jonah Elliss—son of Luther Elliss—joined the team and elected to wear the same No. 83 as his father. Jonah was recruited to the U as a linebacker, moving to defensive end ahead of the 2022 season.

- The second-generation Elliss has received national praise entering the second half of the season, being named a Lombardi Award semifinalist, Lott IMPACT Trophy quarterfinalist and a watch list honoree for the Chuck Bednarik Award. He has also earned Midseason All-America selections from the AP, The

Athletic, ESPN and The Sporting News.

- With 11.5 sacks on the season, Elliss leads Power Five football and ranks second overall in FBS. Three of his 11.5 sacks have come on either third or fourth down. In conference play, he's totaled 9.5 sacks, which includes at least 1.0 in five of six contests.
- His 15.5 TFL are the third-most a Power Five defensive lineman. The junior has at least 1.0 TFL in six of Utah's last seven games.
- Elliss had a career day vs. UCLA in which he had 3.5 sacks (tied for eighth in program history) and 5.0 TFL (tied for fourth in program history). Prior to that performance, no Pac-12 player had produced a 3.5-sack game since 2017, nor had a player in the league amassed 5.0 TFL since 2021.

...OF SACK LAKE CITY

Elliss' season up front has been complemented by 13 combined starts for tackles Van Fillinger and Junior Tafuna, plus fellow end Connor O'Toole. Though the defensive line has been impacted by injuries throughout the season, the group has embraced the "next man up" mantra and continues to boast depth, speed and size.

- Through nine games Utah owns 29 sacks (24.5 from the DL) and 57 tackles for loss (36 from the DL). The sack total breaks down to 3.22 sacks per game which rank the Utes top-11 in FBS.
- In the first seven games prior to Oregon, Utah racked up 25 total sacks, the most for the team through seven games since 2014 (35 sacks through seven games).
- In the win over UCLA, Utah totaled seven sacks (for 58 yards); it was the most for the team since last year's Pac-12

Championship. Five sacks against Florida were the most sacks by Utah in a regular season P5 non-conference game since 2011 (six at Pitt).

- After missing the first five games due to injury, O'Toole made his season debut vs. Cal and first start of the year vs. Arizona State. He has contributed 3.5 TFL since returning, ranking second on the team in that timespan; O'Toole also owns 2.5 sacks and a pass breakup on the year.
- Tafuna was named to the preseason watch lists for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Lombardi Award and Outland Trophy. A two-time Pac-12 All-Conference pick and 2021 Pac-12 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year, Tafuna has played in 34 games as a Ute with starts in his last 32 games played.
- Keanu Tanuvasa and Tevita Fotu have taken on larger roles at defensive tackle in 2023. Tanuvasa has made nine starts this season after playing in just four games total a year ago; he ranks second on the defensive line with 6.0 TFL and has contributed 21 tackles. It's a great stride forward for the redshirt freshman, who had just six stops and 1.5 TFL during 2022.
- Fillinger (34 GP, 24 GS) returned in 2023 after suffering a season-ending injury eight games into last year. He has earned 10 tackles (2.5 sacks) during Utah's last four games, and led all Pac-12 freshmen in sacks (5.5) in 2021.

LINEBACKER NOTES

LINEBACKERS AND LASSOS

Now in his fifth season on the Utah coaching staff, linebackers coach Colton Swan has guided his group as one of the most productive in the Pac-12 with seven First Team All-Conference selections and three Utah proteges in the NFL.

- He helped Devin Lloyd become a finalist for the Butkus Award both in 2020 and '21, with Lloyd ultimately being selected by the Jacksonville Jaguars with the 27th pick in the 2022 NFL Draft. A consensus All-American, Lloyd is in his second season with the Jaguars in 2023. Francis Bernard and Nephi Sewell (who played alongside Lloyd at Utah) each signed free agent contracts after being tutored by Swan.
- Tasked with replacing an NFL pair of linebackers in Lloyd and Sewell, Swan's room contributed 32.5 tackles for loss last season—it was part of a Pac-12-leading 90 for the team which ranked ninth in program history.
- A man of many talents, Swan initially attended Weber State on a rodeo scholarship before walking on to the football team and transforming into an All-Big Sky linebacker. Nevertheless, Swan maintains a passion for the sport of rodeo to this day and occasionally competes during the football offseason.

BACKERS BACK, ALRIGHT

The Utah linebacker room has a local flavor with an array of in-state talent, headlined by Karene Reid and Levani Damuni. The Utes also received tremendous leadership and contributions from Lander Barton before Barton sustained a season-ending injury at USC.

- Reid (45 tackles) is a Butkus Award Watch List honoree and started all eight games he has appeared in this season. He sparked the Utes right out of the gate vs. UCLA, grabbing an interception on the first play from scrimmage and returning it 21 yards for a pick-six. He has a pair of nine-tackle games this season, coming against ranked foes in UCLA and Oregon. Against the Bruins, Reid also had an assisted TFL and two pass breakups. His four total PBUs lead the linebacker room.
- As a starter at the rover position in all 14 games last season, Reid led the linebacker room with 72 tackles (9.5 TFL, 5.0 sacks) on the way to Pac-12 All-Conference laurels. In his 32 career games at

- Utah, Reid has put together six performances with nine or more tackles. His breakout game came as a freshman vs. Washington State in 2021, when Reid made 15 stops and had an interception.
- One of the most prolific tacklers in recent Pac-12 history, Damuni owns 255 career stops between his time at Stanford (2019-22) and coming home to Utah—it ranks top-50 of all active FBS players. Damuni led the Utah linebacker room with eight tackles vs. Florida, and is coming off back-to-back performances with 11 takedowns. At 6.4 career tackles per game, he ranks second among active players with at least 25 appearances in Pac-12 games. Damuni's 6.0 third-down stops this season trail only Cole Bishop (8.5) for the team lead.
- Damuni captained the Stanford squad in 2022, capping off a career with the Cardinal where he played in 31 games (15 starts).
- Returned missionary Sione Fotu is back with the Utes for 2023, after playing in all five games during the pandemic-shortened 2020 season. He made seven stops in Week 1 vs. Florida.
- Barton (10 career starts) led the linebacker room with 34 tackles at the time of his injury. As a freshman in '22, Barton's 46 tackles, eight TFL and 4.5 sacks all led rookies on the team on the way to earning Freshman All-America honors.
- Barton (Cottonwood Heights), Fotu (West Jordan) and Reid (American Fork) all grew up within a 40-minute drive of Rice-Eccles Stadium, while Damuni was raised about an hour away in the Cache Valley city of Providence, Utah.

SAFETY DANCE

Cole Bishop and Sione Vaki continue to lead an experienced safety group composed of both youth and returners. Nate Ritchie also has made strides after returning from a church mission and true freshman Johnathan Hall adds depth both on defense and on special teams.

- Bishop (46) and Vaki (45) have formed the primary duo at safety this season, ranking as two of the team's top four tacklers. The pair have combined for seven passes defended, with Bishop logging two interceptions and three breakups while Vaki has one pick and one breakup.
- Bishop is a Jim Thorpe Award Semifinalist as well as a watch list selection for the Bednarik Award and Bronko Nagurski Trophy. He was among the unsung heroes in the Week 2 win at Baylor, contributing four tackles (2.0 TFL), and his second career interception. With the score tied and less than two minutes remaining in regulation, his pick gave Utah perfect field position for a 29-yard game-winning touchdown drive.
- His team-leading 11 stops in Week 1 marked Bishop's second career 10-tackle game; both have come vs. Florida (he had a career-high 12 in The Swamp last season).
- Bishop's 83 tackles a year ago led Utah and his six TFL were the most in the secondary.
- Due to the pandemic, Bishop was unable to visit Utah during the recruiting process and signed with the Utes sight unseen. Bishop has since appeared in 33 games with 27 starts and been voted a captain by his teammates. The preseason All-American averages 5.6 tackles per game in his career; it leads active Pac-12 secondary players (minimum 10 Pac-12 games played).
- Vaki is enjoying great success as a sophomore. In addition to recently playing both ways, he ranks eighth in the Pac-12 with 6.5 TFL during conference play. Vaki saw action in all 14 games last year, with a breakout night in his first career start at Washington State. He has three career nine-tackle games, including in back-to-back weeks against UCLA and Oregon State. He has earned 14 starts as a Ute and contributed eight-plus tackles in five games.
- Before departing on his mission, Ritchie started at strong safety in all five games in 2020. His 28 total tackles that year were the most in the secondary. Ritchie has played in eight games this season, making his first start in the win at USC.

Over the years Sharrieff Shah has become synonymous with the Utah defense, first playing safety from 1990-93 and now in his 12th season coaching the cornerbacks. Shah also is in his fifth year as special teams coordinator, previously serving as co-coordinator from 2016-18.

- Named by ESPN in 2014 as one of "10 coaches who adapt and thrive," Shah has developed five cornerback converts into NFL players. Ten of his players have been named Pac-12 All-Conference, highlighted by unanimous All-America choice and Jim Thorpe Award finalist Clark Phillips III in 2022.
- A four-year letterman and three-year starter, Shah served as a captain on then-head coach Ron McBride's squad. Shah was an All-WAC honorable mention pick in 1991 and '92 and starred in indoor track.
- After his playing career Shah took a unique path into coaching, serving as a practicing attorney, certified agent through the NFLPA and as the Utes' sideline reporter on radio and television during the team's Mountain West era.

CORNERBACKS NOTEBOOK

The cornerbacks room returns experience on both sides in JaTravis Broughton and Zemaiah Vaughn. Adding to the depth and talent are the returning Faybian Marks, Ole Miss transfer Miles Battle and four-star true freshmen CJ Blocker and Smith Snowden.

- Broughton (25 tackles) has started all but one game this season and contributed three-plus tackles in four games. His eight stops vs. Florida were the most in the cornerbacks room. The 2020 Pac-12 All-Conference pick has played in 43 games as a Ute with 26 starts.
- Opposite him is the former walk-on Vaughn who has amassed 40 career games played. The Beaumont, Texas native has started 15 straight contests dating back to last season and tied his career-high with five tackles in the USC game. Vaughn has defended six passes on the season (5 PBU, 1 INT), including a pair of PBUs against Cal.
- Another Texas native, Miles Battle, brings experience to the group as a transfer out of Ole Miss. Originally out of Houston, Texas, the past Reese's Senior Bowl Watch List member played in 45 games with the Rebels from 2018-22; he racked up 61 tackles, two picks, a fumble recovery and 16 PBUs. He arrived in Oxford as a four-star WR and switched to cornerback in 2020.
- Battle recorded his first interception as a Ute during the Arizona State game and returned it for 24 yards.
- Former wide receiver Tao Johnson continues to make strides in a nickelback role. The Idaho native has started all nine games this season, after primarily playing wide receiver and on special teams during 2022. He recovered a fumble and made a career-high four tackles vs. UCLA, matching that total against Oregon.
- Snowden grew up in nearby Lehi, Utah, and won a state championship in 2022 inside Rice-Eccles Stadium. The three-time All-State and All-Region selection was a four-star recruit and finished his high school career with 26 interceptions. Against ASU, he made three stops.

Utah has prided itself for years on developing high-caliber specialists, and this year the group welcomed back punter Jack Bouwmeester and snapper JT Greep, while adding transfers Cole Becker and Chase Carter to share kicking duties.

- Bouwmeester, named to the Ray Guy Award watch list, is the latest in a line of talented Australian punters to play at Utah. With an average punt of 46.2 yards this season, he leads the Pac-12 and ranks 12th in the country.
- In his second year as Utah's starting punter, the native of Bendigo has booted 14 punts for at least 50 yards and three for 60-plus yards. He had both a 61- and 64-yard punt vs. Florida, becoming is the first Utah punter since 2014 to record multiple 60-yard punts in the same game.
- Becker was named the lead kicker entering the season, earning a game ball for his 38-yard field goal as time expired to defeat USC. He missed three games due to injury, returning to action on PATs and field goals vs. Cal. He took over kickoffs again beginning with the Arizona State game.
- Becker departed the Buffaloes ranking seventh in program history with 25 field goals made. He contributed 120 points (25 FG, 45 PAT) in his two seasons and became the 10th fastest player to score 100 points all-time at CU.
- He immediately came on the scene at Utah with a 51-yard field goal vs. Florida; it was his fourth career make of 50-plus yards and is tied for sixth-most among active Power Five kickers.
- Iowa native Chase Carter has manned kickoff duty in six games, booting 25 kickoffs. He transferred to Utah from Morningside University in the NAIA, where he was tabbed All-America and helped the team to an NAIA Football Championship in 2021.
- During his three seasons at Utah, Greep has provided 278 total snaps (96 punt, 40 FG, 142 PAT).
