KICKING OFF

KEY STORYLINES: No. 3-ranked Indiana men's soccer will host a top-10 matchup with No. 9 Washington on Friday in the second match of the adidas/IU Credit Union Classic. Ohio State and Seton Hall will play in the first match at 5 p.m.

IU is coming off of a 2-0 victory over DePaul in its home opener, in which the Hoosiers outshot their opponents 31-1. Indiana picked up its fourth consecutive home shutout going back to the 2022 NCAA Tournament. Freshman forward **Collins Oduro** scored in his second straight start, followed by a fantastic curling finish from distance by senior midfielder **Quinten Helmer**.

IU and Washington last met in the 2022 NCAA Tournament Round of 16, which the Huskies won 3-2 on golden goal - Washington's first win of the five-match all-time series.

The No. 9-ranked Huskies are the first ranked opponent on IU's schedule, which is packed with teams that made the NCAA Tournament last year - seven in total. Indiana finished 8-4-1 against ranked opponents last season and will try to turn another challenging slate into another long run in the NCAA Tournament.

PLAYERS OF THE YEAR

The MAC Hermann Trophy is annually presented to the nation's top collegiate soccer player. Indiana men's soccer has a rich tradition of producing the most excellent players in the country, with seven players winning the trophy a combined eight times.

Indiana also boasts three Soccer America Player of the Year winners: Paul DiBernardo (1984), Aleksey Korol (1999) and Grant Lillard (2017).

NOTE: The MAC Player of the Year Award and the Hermann Trophy merged in 2002, allowing for multiple winners between 1986-2002. The Soccer America award was discontinued following the 2019 season.

50TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION: In May, Indiana men's soccer celebrated its Tradition of Excellence with a 50th anniversary celebration on the campus of Indiana University. 2023 marked 50 years since the IU Board of Trustees voted to grant men's soccer its varsity status, and, since then, the program has set the standard for NCAA men's soccer.

That weekend, May 19-21, the program welcomed over 325 guests - national champions, hall-of-famers, and those who love the program. Festivities included a golf outing, reception, kickaround, celebration dinner and tours of the athletic facilities.

FAMILY MATTERS: So many families have made Bloomington their second home while joining the greater Indiana men's soccer family, creating a special environment in and around the program.

The Yeagley family has set this pattern - **Jerry Yeagley** lobbied for men's soccer to become a varsity sport at IU in 1973 and, as head coach, went on to win six national championships. The Yeagley family's involvement in the program now spans three generations, as **Todd Yeagley**, an IU player under his father from 1991-94, has led the team since 2010 and coached his two sons, Ben and Grant, the latter of which is a current player.

Five members of the current squad are part of family legacies within the program.

Luka Bezerra: Brother, Victor, was an All-America forward from 2019-2021 before signing an MLS Homegrown Contract with Chicago Fire.

Joey Maher: Brother, Jack Maher, was an All-America defender from 2018-19 and now plays for MLS club Nashville SC.

Grant Yeagley: Brother, Ben, was teammate for two seasons and player from 2019-2022; Father, **Todd**, is current head coach and played from 1991-94; Grandfather, Jerry, was head coach from 1973-2003.

Assistant Coach **Tanner Thompson:** Brother, Tommy, was teammate in 2013 and now plays for MLS club San Jose Earthquakes; Father, Gregg, played between 1978-82 and scored winning goal in Indiana's first national championship.

#PROIU: Combining Major League Soccer Draft picks (48), MLS Supplemental Draft picks (4) and MLS Homegrown selections (8), the Indiana men's soccer program has seen 60 Hoosiers selected into the top flight of American soccer. Additionally, 19 Hoosiers have earned United States Men's National Team caps.

BIG TEN DOMINANCE: With 32 total conference trophies, Indiana has consistently set the standard for Big Ten men's soccer. Owning a 140-33-28 (.770) record in league play all-time, IU is one of two program's owning 100 Big Ten wins, followed only by Penn State's 102.

Indiana has totaled 117 All-Big Ten first team selections all-time, 55 more than the next-best program (Penn State, 62). IU boasts five of the last six Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year awards.

Additionally, Jerry Yeagley and Todd Yeagley are two of the top three winningest coaches in Big Ten history, by percentage.

THREADED WITH HISTORY: The Hoosiers debuted new uniforms for their 50th season that express the program's Tradition of Excellence. In July 2022, the program released its cream and crimson jerseys for the 2022 campaign, a fresh take on some of the old styles of the team's storied past. The team will wear the uniforms again during its 2023 season.

Indiana's crimson kit features stripes, a popular choice across IU athletics and in the program's 2010s designs. The stripes are alternating shades of crimson with the eight-star logo sitting on the left chest like a crest, the player number centered on the torso and an adidas logo aligned high on the right.

On the back, like many modern IU shirts, an "INDIANA" nameplate floats above the player number. Gracing a cream collar, "Never Daunted" lies in reference to the school fight song, "Indiana, Our Indiana."

The cream kit is a distinct reference to the styles of the 1970s and early '80s, the first decade of varsity soccer at IU. One decoration graces a white front; the left chest has the Indiana script mark on top of the player number. Indiana's first national championship teams in 1982 and 1983 wore kits with similar designs.

Indiana's eight-star mark is prominent atop the back of the cream jersey. "Tradition of Excellence" graces the hem of the shirt, a reminder of the program's proud history and drive to continue it for many years to come.

EIGHT STARS

1982: After being denied in the NCAA College Cup final three times (1976, 1978 and 1980), the Hoosiers won the program's first NCAA National Championship via a 2-1, eight-overtime marathon victory over Duke.

1999: IU won the treble for a second straight season, capping the century with its fifth national title. After surviving a four-overtime victory over UCLA the day before, Indiana bested Santa Clara, 1-0, in the title match.

1983: Following an overtime loss in the season opener the Hoosiers went undefeated the rest of the way (21-1-4 overall) including a 1-0, overtime win in the national championship match. IU won back-to-back titles for the first time in program history.

2003: Jerry Yeagley retired following the 2003 season after once again leading IU to a championship treble. On a snowy day in Columbus, Ohio, the Hoosiers scored two-first-half goals to bury St. John's, 2-1, in the championship match.

1988: Ken Snow tallied 22 goals and seven assists to lead IU back to the mountaintop in 1988. In a matches played at IU's home, Bill Armstrong Stadium, the Hoosiers won 1-0 decisions versus Portland and Howard to win their third title.

2004: Indiana won back-to-back NCAA Championships for the third time in program history as former Hoosier All-American Mike Freitag led IU in his first season as head coach. After a 1-1 full-time result, the Hoosiers beat UC-Santa Barbara, 3-2, on penalties.

1998: Indiana captured its first of three championship trebles in program history, winning the Big Ten regular season and tournament titles in the same year. IU outscored its two NCAA College Cup opponents 7-1 to win its first title in a decade.

2012: It took Todd Yeagley just three seasons to continue the family legacy and win his first national title as head coach. The No. 16 national seed in the NCAA Tournament, IU beat four national seeds and allowed just one goal in its title run.

SERIES NOTES: Friday's matchup between Indiana and Washington marks just the second time the teams have met in the regular season - the remaining four all took place in the NCAA Tournament.

The programs last met in the 2021 NCAA Tournament Round of 16, a thriller that ended in a 3-2, overtime victory for the hosting Huskies. From a historical perspective, the Hoosiers can't feel too sore, having eliminated Washington from three previous tournaments.

That includes the 1999 NCAA Tournament Second Round, when Jerry Yeagley's Hoosiers defeated Washington 2-0 on the road to their second-straight national title and No. 5 of eight overall. Aleksey Korol, who will be inducted into the Indiana Athletics Hall of Fame later this month, scored the winning goal in that match.

Current IU head coach Todd Yeagley participated in the first matchup in 1992, another 2-0 tournament second round victory for the Hoosiers.

TEAM NOTES

OUR INDIANA HOME: The passionate IU fans and lively Hoosier Army student section create a unique atmosphere at Bill Armstrong Stadium that is rarely rivaled. The Hoosiers hold a 355-70-52 (.799) record all-time at "The Bill."

Since 2016, Indiana owns an 67-6-11 record on its home ground, posting 53 shutouts in those 84 matches. IU was 9-3-1 at home last season, earning seven shutouts in those matches.

50 YEARS, THREE STRIPES: As Indiana hosts the annual adidas/IU Credit Union Classic, it should be noted that the men's soccer program - despite athletic department apparel changes - has worn adidas every season since receiving varsity status in 1973.

BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH: Three Hoosiers were named Big Ten Players to Watch in the conference's season preview.

Patrick McDonald

Mainstay in midfield, appearing in 24 matches in 2022 while collecting two goals and two assists. Scored in NCAA National Championship match.

Collins Odure

Pennsylvania Gatorade Player of the Year after scoring 39 goals for The Phelps School as a senior.

Samuel Sarver

Totaled 30 points on 11 goals and eight assists through first two seasons. All four goals last season came against ranked opponents.

COACH YEAGLEY CONTINUES WINNING CULTURE: IU head men's soccer coach **Todd Yeagley** is carrying on the Tradition of Excellence and winning culture of IUMS into his 14th season as leader of the program.

Since taking over the IU job in 2010, Yeagley is the winningest coach in NCAA Division-I men's soccer and is the only one to guide his program to five College Cups in that span.

2022 SEASON RECAP: After playing one of the nation's toughest regular season schedules, Indiana marched to the national championship match with four consecutive clean sheets in the NCAA Tournament. IU beat Saint Louis (1-0), Marshall (1-0) and UNC Greensboro (2-0) to advance to the NCAA College Cup, where it won in convincing fashion, 2-0, over Pittsburgh, in the semifinal round. IU fell to first-time champion Syracuse in the title game via penalty shootout.

RETURNERS: Of IU's 29 players that saw minutes in 2022, 17 returned for the 2023 season.

Statistically, Indiana returns 62 percent of its goals scored (27 of 44) and 64 percent of its assists (28 of 44) from last campaign, which saw IU make a run to the national title match.

Defenders **Joey Maher** and **Brett Bebej**, who each appeared in 24 of IU's 25 matches and helped the team keep nine clean sheets, return to anchor the back-line.

In midfield, **Patrick McDonald** and **Jack Wagoner** started together in 11 of IU's final 12 matches - the lone exception being its matchup with Division-III Trine.

Tommy Mihalic and **Samuel Sarver** earned two of IU's top point tallies, collecting 16 and 12, respectively. Mihalic's seven goals were second on the team, and both showed dynamism with four assists apiece.

ODURO INTRO: Freshman **Collins Odure** was named a Big Ten Player to Watch as well as a Top Drawer Soccer Preseason Freshman Best XI selection.

In his collegiate debut, a start at Notre Dame in IU's season opener, Odure scored a game-tying goal after a nice bit of combination play with Samuel Sarver. Odure darted through Notre Dame's defense and won his one-on-one with the keeper to pull Indiana even.

Odure then brought his tally to two goals in his first two games with the breakthrough score in the 2-0 win over DePaul. His 67th-minute free header at the back post gave Indiana a 1-0 lead on the way to victory. He had six shots, three on frame in the match.

Odure scored 39 goals in his 2022 senior season at The Phelps School and was named the Pennsylvania Gatorade Player of the Year.

HERE'S HUGO: Senior **Hugo Bacharach**, a transfer from Fairleigh Dickinson, has racked up a laundry list of preseason awards ([see sidebar](#)).

The Spanish defender was a first-team All-Northeast Conference performer at FDU and the conference's defensive player of the year last season as a junior.

This summer, Bacharach played in USL League Two for the Flint City Bucks, helping them keep seven clean sheets. For his contributions, Bacharach was named the USL League Two Defender of the Year.

BRETT THE VET: Senior defender **Brett Bebej**, Indiana's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honoree, has been nicknamed the "Swiss Army Knife" for his ability and willingness to play multiple positions, seeing minutes at center back, outside back, center mid and on the wings through four seasons.

Bebej scored three goals last season and recorded a goal contribution in two of IU's four NCAA Tournament matches. Bebej scored a match-winning header against Marshall and had the assist to **Maouloune Goumballe**'s go-ahead score at UNC Greensboro.

AMAZING ALEKSEY: In August, the Indiana Department of Intercollegiate Athletics announced six new members to its Athletics Hall of Fame. One of the six was Aleksey Korol, a two-time NCAA Champion as an Indiana men's soccer student-athlete.

Korol was a dominant offensive force during arguably the greatest four-year stretch in IU Men's Soccer history (1996-99). Indiana went 82-9-3 during Korol's four years with the program, a run that included Big Ten titles each year, Final Four berths in his final three seasons, and NCAA championships in his final two.

As a senior he was named Soccer America's National Player of the Year and Big Ten Player of the Year after becoming one of only seven IU players to score 20 goals in a single season. Korol was at his best when it mattered most, as his 12 career goals and five assists in 17 NCAA Tournament contests made him the all-time leading scorer in NCAA Tournament history.

He ranks fourth in IU history in scoring with 149 points on 57 goals and 35 assists. He was also named to Soccer America's Team of the Decade for the 1990s, one of five IU soccer players to earn a spot on an All-Decade team.

Korol is the eighth men's soccer player to enter the IU Athletics Hall of Fame and will be inducted later this month.

SUMMER AT THE SOCCER TOURNAMENT: In June, Hoosier Army, a team made up of Indiana men's soccer alumni, participated in The Soccer Tournament (TST), a seven-versus-seven competition in Cary, North Carolina, for a \$1 million dollar prize.

Hoosier Army was the first college soccer alumni team to enter the TST field, and its roster featured players from the last 18 year of IU men's soccer. Kevin Noschang was the most senior Hoosier on the squad, representing the 2005-08 squads. He played alongside Ryan Wittenbrink, who was part of Indiana's run to the NCAA College Cup last season. Five players featured on the roster played in the 2012 NCAA National Championship squad. Current IU men's soccer associate head coach **Kevin Robson** served as the team's head coach.

The Indiana alumni played in and won the tournament's inaugural match against a team representing German Bundesliga giant Borussia Dortmund. Despite winning its first two of three group play matches, Hoosier Army was ousted on goal differential.

KEVIN ROBSON: Indiana men's soccer associate head coach **Kevin Robson** is in his 10th season on Todd Yeagley's coaching staff, further extending his successful run as a coach and player at IU.

Following each of the last three seasons, Robson has been named a Top Assistant Coach by College Soccer News - an award given to the top 16 assistants in the country. Since Robson became recruiting coordinator in 2017, the Hoosiers have brought in top-12 signing classes in each year.

STREAKING: Indiana carries several notable active streaks into the 2023 season. Each streak listed below represents an NCAA record:

- The Hoosiers have reached the NCAA Tournament in each of the last 36 seasons.
- Indiana has earned a national seed in nine consecutive seasons.
- IUMS is one of two programs (Wake Forest) to advance to the third round of the NCAA Tournament in each of the last eight seasons.

SURGING MLS ALL-STAR: 21-year old Aidan Morris is having a breakthrough professional season after bursts of success and an All-America and Big Ten Freshman of the Year campaign for IU in 2019.

Morris signed a Homegrown contract with Columbus Crew SC following that season and immediately helped his club win the MLS Cup, becoming the youngest player to start in the league final at 19. After missing the 2021 MLS season, he made his way back into the rotation and became a fixture in the Crew's starting 11 in 2022.

2023 has been a culmination for the rising star. In January, Morris received his first call-up to the United States Men's National Team before earning his first cap against Serbia that same month. Since, he's earned two more roster calls, including a spot on the USMNT's Gold Cup roster, and has made four appearances for the national team.

In MLS play, Morris is establishing himself as one of the top midfielders in the league, among the leaders in tackles won, passing accuracy and interceptions. In June, he was named an

MLS All-Star and played against Premier League side Arsenal alongside the best talent in MLS.

800: During the 2022 season, Indiana men's soccer earned its 800th win all-time. Coming within 50 seasons, it is the quickest ascent to 800 wins in NCAA Division-I men's soccer history - 10 years better than the next-fastest program.

With a 808-194-113 record all-time, Indiana is the winningest program in NCAA DI men's soccer history by percentage (.775).

BOUNCING BACK: Indiana has gone 148 consecutive matches without back-to-back regular season losses. The streak spans 3,589 days (9 years, 10 months) in total dating back to November 1, 2013.

NATIONAL SEED KNACK: Indiana earned its ninth consecutive national seed in 2022, extending an NCAA record. No other program has owned a streak lasting longer than seven straight seasons.

IU has earned a national seed in 13 of the last 14 seasons, 19 of the last 21 seasons and 23 of the 29 NCAA Tournaments that have utilized national seeding. The next-best program, Stanford, has earned 20 national seeds.

1995-96, when only four national seeds were given, was the last time a two-year period passed without IU earning a national seed.

After a standout playing career for the Hoosiers, Todd Yeagley was named Indiana head men's soccer coach on December 18, 2009. Since then, no NCAA Division-I men's soccer head coach has more wins (178) or College Cup appearances (5) than Yeagley.

In 2023, Yeagley begins his 14th season at the helm of the Hoosier program. Yeagley is a four-time Big Ten Coach of the Year, has led the region staff of the year three times and in 2012 was named Soccer America Coach of the Year.

Indiana has earned a national seed and NCAA Tournament first-round bye in an NCAA record nine seasons and in all but one season of the Todd Yeagley era. The program's recent excellence has been in part due to Yeagley's emphasis on defense – in each of the last seven seasons, IU has ranked top-eleven nationally in clean sheets, totaling 87 shutouts in that span.

2012 NCAA National Championship

• In just his third season as head coach, Yeagley led Indiana to the 2012 NCAA title, the eighth championship in IU men's soccer history. The Hoosiers became the first No. 16 seed to win the championship, compiling victories over Xavier, at No. 1 Notre Dame, at No. 9 North Carolina, versus No. 12 Creighton and against No. 3 Georgetown during their tournament run.

• Yeagley was named 2012 Soccer America Coach of the Year as he and his father, Jerry, became the first father-son duo to have won Division I men's soccer championships.

2022 Season

The Hoosiers returned to the NCAA College Cup in 2022, where they finished as the national runner-up after a thrilling championship match that ended in a penalty shootout. Indiana earned the No. 13 national seed and then marched to the national final via four consecutive clean sheets in the NCAA Tournament as well as the

program's NCAA-record 100th tournament victory in the College Cup semifinal against Pittsburgh. Yeagley and the Hoosiers also achieved the program's 800th victory during the regular season, making Indiana the fastest NCAA Division I men's program to reach that mark (50 seasons). Playing one of the toughest schedules in the nation, IU finished 14-4-7 and 8-3-2 against ranked opponents. For the second year in a row, Daniel Munie was named an All-American and the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year. Three Hoosiers were selected in the 2023 MLS SuperDraft, with Munie going No. 10 overall to the San Jose Earthquakes and forwards Herbert Endeley (No. 24) and Ryan Wittenbrink (No. 53) hearing their names called by FC Dallas.

Playing Career

• As a player, Yeagley was a four-time All-American at Indiana (1991-94) and in 1994 was named the Missouri Athletic Club National Player of the Year. During his stint as a student-athlete in Bloomington, Yeagley was a two-time Academic All-Big Ten honoree. He led the Hoosiers to three Big Ten titles (1991, 1992, 1994) and a 79-9-5 overall record.

• He remains third on IU's career assists list with 40 and shares the Big Ten single-season assists record with the 14 he recorded in 1993.

• After his playing days at Indiana, Yeagley also enjoyed a successful seven-year professional career in Major League Soccer with the Columbus Crew. Columbus advanced to the MLS Playoffs in five of Yeagley's seven seasons with the team and won the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup in 2002 – the first trophy in club history.

Honors

• Since returning to his alma mater, Yeagley has coached 17 Major League Soccer Draft picks, seven MLS Homegrown signees, 32 first team All-Big Ten honorees, 12 Big Ten Player of the Year selections and six Big Ten Freshman of the Year picks.

• In 2015, Jack Griffith was given the prestigious Jack D. Tichenor Award, which is given annually to IU's top male and female student-athletes that hold the highest individual cumulative GPA among the entire Department of Athletics. Griffith is the fourth men's soccer student-athlete to earn the Tichenor Award, joining Barry T. Margolin (1987), Christopher Munroe (2005) and three-time winner Tyler McCarroll (2010-12).

• In 2016, Femi Hollinger-Janzen was presented the Spirit of Indiana Director's Award, given by Vice President and Director of Athletics Fred Glass to two student-athletes that best represent The Spirit of Indiana: 24 Sports, 1 Team.

• Yeagley is a member of the Indiana Soccer Hall of Fame and in 2013 was inducted into the Monroe County Hall of Fame and the IU Athletics Hall of Fame.

• Yeagley earned a Bachelor of Science degree in sociology from Indiana in 2002. He and his wife, Suzy, have three children: Ben, Grant and Jay.

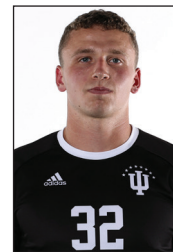

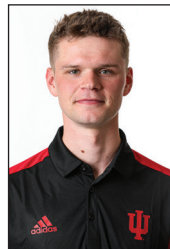
