Dawgs Headed To Desert For Night Game vs. Wildcats

THE GAME: The Washington football team (4-0, 1-0 Pac-12) heads out on its first conference road trip of the season, heading to Tucson to face Arizona (3-1, 1-0) Saturday night at 7:00 p.m. PT. The Huskies are off to a roaring start, winning their first four games and scoring 40-plus in each. UW moved up one spot in the latest AP Top 25, to No. 7, while staying No. 8 in the coaches' poll. UW got a first-place vote in each, for the first time since 1997. Following the Arizona trip, the Huskies will have an off week before hosting Oregon.

QUICK HITTERS: UW leads the nation in passing offense, total offense and sacks allowed; and is No. 3 in scoring offense ... UW's defense has 7 interceptions, matching 2022's season total ... over just 17 games as a Husky, Michael Penix Jr. has notched six of the top-10 single-game passing yards marks in UW history, including his first three games this season (473 vs. Michigan State – 3rd; 450 vs. Boise State – 6th; 409 vs. Tulsa – 10th) ... Penix is up to sixth in UW history in career TD passes, with 47 ... he has thrown multiple TDs in 14 of his 17 games at UW ... his 6,277 career yards rank him 6th at UW ... through 4 games, Penix is No. 1 in FBS in total offense, passing yards, passing yards per game and passing TDs; and No. 2 in pass efficiency ... four different UW receivers – Jalen McMillan, Rome Odunze, Ja'Lynn Polk and Germie Bernard – have scored a rushing TD so far this season ... prior to this season, UW had had just eight games in its history in which two players had 100 receiving yards (including two last year) ... this season, that has happened in all four games ... through four games, UW has had 39 scrimmage plays of 20 yards or more, most in FBS ... UW's defense has allowed just 15 ... Penix is currently No. 1 in the nation in pass plays of 10-plus (62 plays), 20-plus (32 plays) and 30-plus (18 plays) yards ... Washington enters the week with the nation's second-longest active winning streak among Power 5 teams, with 11 victories in a row, which is the sixth-longest in UW history ... only Georgia, with an 21-game run, has a longer active streak among P5 programs ... Washington has scored 40-plus points in the first four games, the first time that UW has scored 40-plus in four straight in the same season since 1944, when the Huskies did it with two lopsided wins each over Willamette and Whitman (UW was the only major college in the Northwest to field a team in 1944) ... not counting the four-game 2020 season, the Huskies have won 10 or more games in four of the last six seasons.

TELEVISION: The Washington-Arizona game will air on Pac-12 Network, with Ted Robinson and Yogi Roth calling the action. Fans will with the proper subscription can also stream at pac-12.com/live.

RADIO: All Washington football games will air on the Washington Sports Network from Learfield, with Tony Castricone (play by play), former Husky tight end Cameron Cleeland (analyst) and former UW basketball player Elise Woodward (sidelines) on the call. Radio coverage begins four hours before kickoff on the network's flagship station – Seattle's SportsRadio KJR 93.3 FM – with "Husky Gameday" live from The Zone for Husky home games. Statewide coverage on the 17-station Washington Sports Network begins two hours before kickoff. The entire broadcast is available worldwide on the Huskies Gameday mobile app and the Varsity app. The UW broadcast of this game will also air on Sirius/XM channel 83. Additionally, the Husky Football Coaches Show airs each Wednesday during the season at 6:00 p.m. PT.

HEAD COACH

Second Season at UW

Success has come consistently and quickly at every stop in the career of UW football coach Kalen DeBoer. On Nov. 29, 2021, DeBoer took his next step, when he was named the 30th head football coach in UW history. His first season was an undisputed success.

DeBoer, 48, came to Montlake from Fresno State, where during the 2021 season, he led the Bulldogs to a 9-3 regular-season record in his second year in charge.

In his first year at UW, he led the Huskies to a 11-2 overall record, including a 3-0 mark against ranked teams, and a win over Texas in the Valero Alamo Bowl. His Huskies swept its three Northwest rivals, finished in a tie for second in the Pac-12, and he was named Pac-12 Co-Coach of the Year. He was also the Associated Press Pac-12 Coach of the Year and, at the 88th annual Seattle Sports Star of the Year Awards in Feb., 2023, earned the inaugural Seattle Sports Leader of the Year Award.

Not only were 11 wins in 2022 three more than any first-year coach in UW history had ever compiled, DeBoer was the first Husky coach ever to win a bowl game in year one.

Over his eight seasons as a head football coach (through 2022), DeBoer has compiled a 90-11 (.882) record. During his 26 years in coaching, he has consistently prospered at multiple levels and in different roles, helping to build and revitalize programs while establishing a diverse network of contacts, in both coaching and recruiting, across the country.

In two years at Fresno State, which included the pandemic-shortened 2020 season, DeBoer's teams made great strides on both sides of the ball.

In 2021, Fresno State finished first in the MWC and 14th in the nation in total offense (464.8 yards per game) and second in the conference and 26th in FBS in scoring (30.5 points per game). The Bulldogs' passing offense ranked second in conference and ninth in the country, with 326.7 yards per game.

The offense, and passing game in particular, also flourished in 2020, as it produced a conference-best 479.3 yards total offense per game, and the league's second-highest points per game total (32.8). Fresno State also led the Mountain West in passing yards per game, and ranked fifth in the FBS in that category, with 356.3 per game.

In DeBoer's two seasons in Fresno, the defense also made vast improvements in nearly every team defensive category over the 2019 season, the year before his arrival.

The Bulldogs' defense went from 82nd in the national in scoring defense and 88th in total defense in 2019, to No. 20 and No. 31 in the FBS in 2021, respectively – improvements of 62 and 57 places. In terms of NCAA-FBS national ranking, the run defense improved from 71st to 24th while the pass defense leapt from 107th to 58th. Fresno State also improved its national ranking by 45 or more places in yards allowed per play, opponent first downs, sacks, TFLs, third-down percentage defense, and fourth-down percentage defense.

In 2021, Fresno State ranked among the top 25 in the nation in numerous categories.

Immediately prior to leading Fresno State's program, DeBoer was on staff at Indiana University, as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. After helping to guide the Hoosiers to an 8-5 record and a berth in the Gator Bowl, DeBoer returned to Fresno State, taking over for Jeff Tedford, who resigned for health reasons following the 2019 season.

The Hoosiers' eight victories in 2019 matched their highest wins total in 26 seasons, and IU ranked No. 3 in the Big Ten in total offense.

In 2017, Tedford, in his first season as head coach at Fresno State, hired DeBoer as his offensive coordinator and QBs coach. In two seasons in that role, DeBoer helped the Bulldogs to overall records of 10-4 (2017) and 12-2 (2018), along with two division titles, two bowl game victories and the Mountain West Conference Championship in 2018.

DeBoer's two years as the Bulldogs' offensive coordinator concluded with a Mountain West Championship and Las Vegas Bowl win to cap a 22-6 run during the 2017-18 seasons. Those two seasons included double-digit winning seasons each year, coming off a 1-11 campaign in 2016, the year prior to Tedford's (and DeBoer's) arrival.

Fresno State reached unprecedented heights in year No. 2 with DeBoer as the OC as the Bulldogs posted a school-record 12 victories, and finished ranked No. 18 in both polls.

The offense ranked 26th nationally in scoring offense (34.6) and 29th in passing offense (267.1), and produced five all-conference honorees. The Bulldogs finished eighth nationally in team passing efficiency (156.58), tied for 15th in turnovers lost (14), tied for 19th nationally in red zone offense (89.5 percent) and 25th in third-down conversions (44.6).

Under DeBoer's coaching, quarterback Marcus McMaryion completed 62.1 percent of

his passes, third-best in the MWC. With five interceptions on the year, McMaryion finished the season with the seventh-lowest interception percentage in Bulldog history at 1.42.

A school-record setting wide receiver at the University of Sioux Falls (S.D.), DeBoer later led his alma mater to three NAIA National Championships in five seasons as head coach, winning the title in 2006, 2008 and 2009, while also finishing as runner-up in 2007 and making the semifinals in his first season as head coach, in 2005.

During his five seasons at Sioux Falls, DeBoer compiled a 67-3 overall record, including a 49-1 mark in Great Plains Athletic Conference play. In two seasons at Fresno State, he had a 12-6 overall record, giving him a career record of 79-9. He was NAIA National Coach of the Year in each of his three championship seasons at USF.

DeBoer coached three NAIA National Players of the Year winners in quarterbacks Lorenzo Brown (2009) and Chad Cavender (2007), and running back Nick Kortan (2002). During his time at USF, he helped develop 25 first-team All-Americans.

After the 2009 season, he took a job at Southern Illinois as offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach from 2010 through 2013. He moved to Eastern Michigan as OC and QBs coach from 2014-2016, helping the Eagles to their third-ever bowl-game berth in 2016. That year, the Eagles posted their first .500-or-better season since 1995 and tied the FBS mark for biggest turnarounds in 2016, improving on its one-win season in 2015.

DeBoer's offense shattered the school record for total yards, with 5,917. School records were also set for points scored (385), passing yards (3,849), touchdown passes (25), first downs (303), pass completions (309), plays (999), as well single-game plays (99).

In his four seasons (2010-13) as offensive coordinator at Southern Illinois, the Salukis beat 10 Top-25 opponents. In 2013, the SIU offense led the Missouri Valley Conference with 231.8 passing yards per game, fourth-highest total in school history. SIU's 25 passing touchdowns on the season tied for the third-highest total in school history. Under DeBoer's tutelage, tight end MyCole Pruitt was named to the 2013 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) FCS All-America team while John Lantz developed into an All-MVFC receiver.

During the 2011 campaign, the Salukis ranked third in the nation with an average of 183.1 rushing yards a contest. Bryan Boemer also developed into the Rimington Award winner, which is presented to the nation's premier center.

As a student at Sioux Falls, DeBoer set records in both football and baseball. During his football career, he compiled 3,400 yards and 33 touchdowns on 234 career receptions – all school records at the time – and played on the 1996 NAIA Division II National Championship team, which beat Western Washington in the final. He also played baseball for the Cougars, batting .520 (still a school record) as a senior in 1998. His career average of .492 is still best in USF history as are his 37 career homers, and .944 slugging percentage.

A 1998 graduate of the University of Sioux Falls with a degree in secondary education, DeBoer and his wife, Nicole, are the parents of two daughters, Alexis and Avery.

COACHING STAFF: All 10 of UW's full-time assistants from the 2022 season are back in 2023. Nine of the Huskies' 10 were new to the program last year, with six of them having worked at Fresno State under DeBoer, including all of the coordinators. On the offensive side, Ryan Grubb serves as coordinator and quarterbacks coach, having held both of those titles in 2021 at Fresno State, where he spent the previous four seasons. A former assistant at Sioux Falls under DeBoer, the two also worked alongside one another at Eastern Michigan. UW has two co-defensive coordinators: Chuck Morrell and William Inge. Morrell was a teammate of DeBoer's at Sioux Falls, and later served as his defensive coordinator there as well. In the interim, he spent nine seasons as head coach at Montana Tech before working as safeties coach at Fresno State in 2020 and 2021. Inge, who played against the UW in the 1995 Sun Bowl as a defensive end for Iowa, first worked with DeBoer at Indiana in 2019. He then joined DeBoer's staff in Fresno, where he was defensive coordinator and linebackers coach in 2020 and 2021. Special teams coordinator and edges coach Eric Schmidt handled special teams and the d-line at Fresno State in 2020-21. A standout player at North Dakota, he first worked alongside DeBoer at Southern Illinois (2010-13). Cornerbacks coach Julius "Juice" Brown also comes to Seattle from Fresno, where he coached the Husky position and was recruiting coordinator under DeBoer. Like Brown, Lee Marks is former Boise State player. Early in his coaching career, he spent a season as a GA at Sioux Falls (after DeBoer's departure), but spent the 2020 and 2021 seasons as running backs coach for the Bulldogs under DeBoer. Tight ends coach Nick Sheridan, a former Michigan quarterback, held the same title at Indiana in 2019, the year DeBoer was the Hoosiers' offensive coordinator. Sheridan was OC and quarterbacks coach in Bloomington for two seasons before coming to Seattle. Three UW assistants were working with DeBoer for the first time in '22: offensive line coach Scott Huff, wide receiver coach JaMarcus Shephard, and defensive line coach Inoke Breckterfield. Huff, a former teammate of Marks and Brown at Boise State, returns for his seven season as the Huskies' o-line mentor in 2023. Shephard came to Washington after a very successful stint as receivers coach at Purdue the previous five years. Breckterfield, a standout defensive lineman at Oregon State, most recently worked in the same role at Vanderbilt, but has also worked at Wisconsin, Pitt and UCLA, among others.

STAFF CONTINUITY: Washington's entire full-time coaching staff remained in tact following the 2022 season, which was coach Kalen DeBoer's first at the

UW. He, along with all 10 full-time assistants, are back in 2023. That's actually rare in UW history as the coaching staffs have gone unchanged over two or more seasons only three times before (UW records for coaching staffs go back to the mid-1950s): 1989-90, 2009-11, and 2014-15.

HUSKIES VS. WILDCATS HISTORY: Washington holds an 25-11-1 edge in the series against Arizona, with the Huskies taking 18 of the last 26.

Last year at Husky Stadium, the Dawgs won a shootout, 49-39, in a game that was separated by just three points (42-39) inside the final six minutes. Both teams compiled 31 first downs and both rolled up more than 500 yards of offense. UW QB Michael Penix Jr. set a new school record with 516 passing yards.

In 2021 in Tucson, the Huskies trailed 16-7 in the fourth quarter, but a nine-yard run from Cameron Davis and an eight-yard pass from Dylan Morris to Rome Odunze, gave the UW a 21-16 win. In 2020 in Seattle, Washington built a 37-0 lead and won, 44-27, in Seattle. In 2019, Washington posted its highest points total of the conference season in a 51-27 win over the Wildcats in Tucson. The Cats led, 17-13, at halftime, but the Huskies outscored them 14-0 in the third quarter and 24-10 in the fourth. Prior to that, the two teams hadn't met since the 2016 season, when the Huskies won, 35-28 in overtime, in both teams' Pac-12 opener. Tied at 28-28 at the end of regulation, the Huskies got a 4-yard TD pass from Jake Browning to Dante Pettis, and then batted down a fourth-down pass to end it. The year before, on a stormy Halloween night at Husky Stadium, the UW won, 49-3. Jake Browning was 16-for-24 for 274 yard and four scores while the UW defense forced four turnovers. In 2014 in Tucson, Arizona got a last-second, 47-yard field goal from Casey Skowron to beat the Dawgs, 27-26. A year prior in a late-September rainstorm at Husky Stadium, the Huskies pulled away from an 11-6 halftime advantage to win, 31-13. Bishop Sankey ran for 160 yards on a school-record 40 carries to lead the way for the Dawgs.

In 2013 in Tucson, the Wildcats rolled to a 52-17 win over the Huskies, with Ka'deem Carey rushing for 172 yards. In 2011, the UW beat Arizona, 42-31, as Chris Polk scored five TDs, rushed for 144 yards and caught four passes for 100 yards. In 2010 in Tucson, Wildcats backup QB Matt Scott led his team to a 44-14 win, completing 18-of-22 passes for 233 yards and two TDs. The year before in Seattle resulted in a stunning Husky win as linebacker Mason Foster intercepted a Nick Foles pass that deflected off the foot of an Arizona receiver and returned it 37 yards for a score with only 2:37 left. Washington won, 36-33, as the 'Cats' final drive was cut short by a Desmond Trufant interception.

In 2008 in Tucson, Arizona TE Rob Gronkowski tied a school record with three touchdown receptions as the Wildcats won, 49-19. In 2007 in Seattle, the Wildcats, behind quarterback Willie Tuitama, completed an impressive comeback and beat the UW 48-41 despite Jake Locker rushing for 157 yards and passing for 336. In 2006 in Tucson, the Huskies took a 21-3 lead in the second quarter and won, 21-10. In 2005, also in Tucson, Isaiah Stanback's dramatic, 69-yard bomb on the last play of the first half and 200 rushing yards from James Sims led the Huskies to a 38-14 win.

The six UW-Arizona games prior to 2005 were decided by a total of 31 points, with the most lopsided result (a 31-21 Arizona win) coming in 2004. That year, the Wildcats overcame a 13-9 halftime deficit, out-scoring the Huskies, 14-0, in the second half for the win. In 2003, Arizona snapped a string of 13 straight home losses in conference play by pulling out a late, 27-22 victory. In 2002, it was the Huskies who rallied late when Reggie Williams scored on an 80-yard reception with only 2:03 remaining in the game. In 2001, Cody Pickett ran in from three yards out with 13 seconds left to cap an amazing day. Only two weeks after separating his right

(throwing) vs. USC, Pickett broke the UW record with 455 passing yards as the Huskies won, 31-28. Also included in the close contests are Washington's come-from-behind, 35-32 win in 2000 in Seattle (Marques Tuiasosopo scored with 1:10 left for the win a week after Curtis Williams was injured at Stanford), and the 1998 31-28 'Cats win, which may be the most memorable game in the series' history. Trailing 28-24 to Washington with under a minute to play, Arizona quarterback Ortege Jenkins flipped head over heels over three Husky defenders, landing on his feet in the end zone for the winning score.

EXPERIENCE AND YOUTH: Washington's current roster includes a total of 34 players – 17 each on offense and defense – who have started at least one game for the Huskies prior to 2023. Entering the year, the 17 offensive players had totaled 145 starts in the Purple & Gold, while the 17 defensive players (which includes former offensive line starter Ulumoo Ale) had 156 starts between them. Tight end Devin Culp entered the 2023 season with the highest total of starts under is belt among offensive players, with 18, while safety Asa Turner, with 23 career starts entering 2023, led the defensive side. The list of Dawgs with starting experience doesn't take into account the 10 current Huskies who transferred to UW after having started at another four-year college, nor does it account for starting "specialists." Washington 119-man roster entering the year included just 15 players in their final year of eligibility, along with 29 true freshmen, 15 redshirt freshmen, 35 sophomores and 25 juniors. Potentially, 104 current Huskies could return for 2024, while 79 enter the 2023 season with three or more years of eligibility remaining.

GRADUATED DAWGS: The 2023 Washington football roster includes 23 players who have earned their bachelor's degree. LONG PLAYS: Washington has notched 39 scrimmage plays of 20 or more yards over its first four games, the highest such total in the nation. UW also leads the nation with 23 plays of 30 yards or more, four more than any other program. Those totals include 32 passes of 20 or more yards, and 18 of 30 or more, from quarterback Michael Penix Jr. Both of those totals are also tops in the nation. Penix also leads FBS with 62 completions of 10 yards or more, eight more than anyone else. Additionally, Rome Odunze leads the nation with 24 receptions of 10-plus and 13 of 20-plus yards, while Ja'Lynn Polk is fourth in the nation with nine 20-plus yard receptions. Meanwhile, UW's defense has allowed just 15 plays of 20 or more yards this season, 24 fewer than the Husky offense has had.

Last year, Washington finished the season with 62 passing plays for 20 or more yards, tied for eighth-most in the nation (five teams that ranked higher played more games than UW's 13). Washington led the nation last year with 193 pass plays for 10 or more yards.

TWO 100-YARD RECEIVERS IN A GAME: Prior to the start of this season, Washington had had just eight games in its history with two players finishing with 100 or more receiving yards (including two such games last year). So far this season, Washington has had two players with 100 receiving yards in all four games:

vs. Boise State: Rome Odunze (132) & Ja'Lynn Polk (101)
 vs. Tulsa: Jalen McMillan (120) & Odunze (107)
 at Michigan State: Odunze (180) & Polk (118)
 vs. California: Polk (127) & Odunze (125)

Additionally, last year, Odunze was the first Husky ever to record four straight 100-yard games. In the first four games of 2023, he's already matched that streak.

CONFERENCE MOVES: Along with USC, UCLA and Oregon, the Huskies will move to the Big Ten Conference after this coming academic year (2023-24) and will play a Big Ten schedule in 2024. Four other current Pac-12 programs – Arizona, Arizona State, Colorado and Utah – are also departing, as those four will join the Big 12 Conference in 2024-25. Washington has been a member of what is now the Pac-12 since the inception of the league, in 1915. Only the UW and California have/had been members in every year since. The UW football team has won a league title in every decade since the 1910s, other than the 2020s – the Dawgs will have one last chance to extend that streak this year.

ALASKA AIRLINES FIELD AT HUSKY STADIUM: The Oregon game on Nov. 5, 2011, marked the final game in Husky Stadium prior to major renovations that were completed in summer, 2013. The Huskies re-opened their home field with a 38-6 win over then-No. 19 Boise State on Aug. 31, 2013. The 2023 season marks the 103rd season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium stands at 409-185-21 (.682). Washington is 53-16 in home games since the stadium re-opened in 2013.
