THE STORYLINES . . .

- The two teams opened the 2023 season with convincing wins last week ... Tulsa had a 42-7 win over Arkansas-PB on Thursday and Washington defeated Boise State 56-19 on Saturday.
- Tulsa is in its 127th season of football in 2023.
- The first year of Tulsa football, known then as Henry Kendall College, was in 1895 ... Washington's first year of football was six years earlier in 1889.
- Tulsa has the smallest FBS enrollment with of 3,777, while Washington has a student enrollment is 48,482.



THE SERIES . . .

- This is the first meeting on the gridiron between Tulsa and Washington.
- Tulsa has played four current Pac-12 members previously and has a 4-4 record in those games, but three of those teams were not league members at the time.
- Tulsa played Arizona in 1958 and 1960, Colorado in 1969 and Utah in 1943 and 2006 ... Arizona became a league member in 1978, Colorado and Utah in 2011.
- Only Oregon, who joined the league in 1915, was a conference member when Tulsa and the Ducks played in the 1989 Independence Bowl ... Oregon won the contest by a score of 27-24.

QUICK HITS . . .

- Tulsa amassed 500+ yards of total offense and 40+ points in the season opener vs. UAPB with 517 yards and 42 points.
- Defensively, the Hurricane held UAPB to 252 total yards, 102 on the ground and 150 passing.
- Tulsa had a 100-yard rusher (Jordan Ford) and 100-yard receiver (Marquis Shoulders) in the opener.
- Freshman redshirt QB Cardell Williams became only the third freshman in school history to throw for 3 TDs in a game, joining true freshman T.J. Rubley in 1987 (Temple) and RS-freshman Braylon Braxton last year at Houston.
- For his performance, Williams was named to the AAC weekly honor roll.
- Tulsa had 2 players with 10 stops– Ben Kopenski and Kendarin Ray– vs. UAPB.
- The 7 points Tulsa allowed vs. UAPB was the fewest for a Tulsa opponent since a 19-6 win at Navy on Dec. 5, 2020.
- Tulsa's 35-point victory was the largest win margin since a 37-point win vs. JAX State in the third game of the 2022 season.

NEWCOMERS . . .

- A total of 20 first-year players saw action for Tulsa in the season opener.
- The number included 11 transfers and 9 true freshmen, as six of those newcomers were in the starting lineup against UAPB.
- On offense, transfer WR Braylin Presley and true freshman TE Luke McGary each started ... Presley had 13 rushing yards on 3 carries, while McGary had 27 receiving yards on 2 receptions.
- Defensively, transfers DE Ben Kopenski, CB Demarco Jones, LB Julien Simon and LB Coleton Smith were in the starting lineup and combined for 17 tackles and 3 TFL for -14 yards.



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KEVIN WILSON IN FIRST YEAR LEADING TULSA FOOTBALL PROGRAM . . .

- Kevin Wilson (North Carolina '84) was introduced as The University of Tulsa's 34th head football coach on December 6, 2022.
- With Tulsa's season opening 42-7 win over UAPB, Wilson's opening day record improved to 6-1 as a head coach.
- He spent the past six seasons as the offensive coordinator and tight ends coach at The Ohio State University.
- Before his stint at Ohio State, Wilson spent six years as the Indiana head coach.
- He posted a 26-47 record at Indiana and led the Hoosiers to two straight bowl games.
- He also coached at Oklahoma, Northwestern, Miami (Ohio), North Carolina A&T, Winston Salem and his alma mater, North Carolina, as a graduate assistant.
- Wilson has been a part of 13 seasons with 10 or more victories and has coached in four national championship games, including three at Oklahoma and one with Ohio State.



OFFENSIVE PLAY CALLING RECOGNITION . . .

- Last year, as the offensive coordinator at Ohio State Kevin Wilson was selected as one the inaugural recipients of the GRAPHITE Award.
- The GRAPHITE Award recognizes excellence in Offensive Play Calling Efficiency, presented by RII Sports Technology.
- His Play Calling Efficiency Rating (PCER) of 80.2% during the 2022 campaign was the highest in the Big 10 Conference and ranked in the 96th percentile among all FBS programs.

BEN & OWEN CREATE HAVOC . . .

- The entire defensive unit put in a solid season-opening performance, but the duo of Ben Kopenski and Owen Ostroski caused havoc in the UAPB backfield.
- The pair combined for 16 tackles and 5.5 TFL for -29 yards, including 3.5 for-25 yards coming on QB sacks.
- Kopenski shared the team-lead with 10 tackles, and among those were 2.5 TFL for -13 yards, including 2 sacks for -12 yards ... the 10 stops is the OSU transfers career-high.
- Ostroski tallied a career-best 6 tackles, as well as a career-high 3 TFL for -16 yards, including 1.5 sacks for -13 yard.

WILLIAMS STARS COMING OFF THE BENCH . . .

- Redshirt freshman QB Cardell Williams came off the bench for an injured Braylon Braxton and starred in his first career game for the Hurricane.
- Williams was sacked twice on his first collegiate possession in the 1st quarter, but in the second period he led Tulsa on four straight scoring drives.
- He finished the first half completing 9-of-9 passes for 169 yards and 3 TDs ... his TD passes covered 80, 15 and 19 yards.
- For the game, Williams finished 13-of-14 for 233 yards and 3 TDs ... he converted on 13 straight passes before his first incomplection.
- His 80-yard TD pass to Marquis Shoulders tied for the 10th longest pass in school history... it was the longest pass since an 88-yarder in the fourth game of the 2021 season.

RUNNING BY COMMITTEE . . .

- Five running backs had at least one carry in the 42-7 opening win over UAPB, while averaging 5.3 yards per carry.
- Leading rusher Jordan Ford had 19 carries for 110 yards, while Tulsa got 137 yards by its other 4 running backs.
- Anthony Watkins added 69 yards (7.7 avg per carry), Bill Jackson 54 (7.7 avg), Tahj Gary 12 (6.0 avg) and true freshman Cam Crooks 2 yards (2.0 avg).

GOING FOR A HUNDRED ...

- In the season opener, Tulsa had a 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver, as it was the first in each of their careers.
- RB Jordan Ford rushed for a career-high 110 yards and one TD ... it bettered his previous career-best of 7 yards against SMU in 2022.
- WR Marquis Shoulders, who had only one previous career game with a reception, had career-highs of 5 receptions for 132 yards and 2 TDs.

BROTHERS FIND HOME IN TULSA ...

- The Simon brothers find themselves on the field together for the first time since high school in 2018.
- Jayden Simon found his way to Tulsa last year after three seasons and eight games at Colorado.
- This year, Jayden's younger brother, Julien, enrolled at Tulsa for the spring 2023 semester, after two years at Southern Cal.
- The brothers were each in the starting lineup for the season opener ... Jayden tallied 5 tackles and 0.5 TFL for -1 yard from his defensive line position, while Julien started at linebacker and had 3 stops and 0.5 TFL for -1 yard.
- The opener was the first time the brothers were on the field together since the 2018 season at Lincoln High School in Tacoma Washington ... Jayden's last prep season was 2018, while Julien's was 2020.

K-RAY GETS ANOTHER 10+ TACKLE GAME IN OPENER ...

- Safety Kendarin Ray entered the 2023 season with 222 career tackles.
- After his eighth career double-digit tackle game in the season opener, Ray now has 232 career stops in 40 games and 27 starting assignments.
- He had 5 solos and 5 assists for 10 tackles against UAPB
- In his career, Ray has added 13 pass breakups, four forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and one interception.
- He had a career-high 13 stops and his first career pickoff for a 23-yard return against No. 19 Tulane.
- Ray's three forced fumbles in 2022 tied for second in the AAC with an 0.25 average.

SOLID OUTING FOR A FIRST TIME PERFORMANCE ...

- Tulsa freshman punter Angus Davies played Australian Rules Football from ages 5-19, and made his first performance in American Football in the season opener.
- Davies punted 3 times for an average of 45.0 yards per punt with a long of 54 yards.
- He dropped all three of his punts inside the 20-yard line at the 5, 12 and 12-yard lines.

BRAXTON GOES 2-1 IN 2022 STARTING ASSIGNMENTS ...

- Braylon Braxton began his sophomore season in the starting lineup in the opener against UAPB, but was sidelined with an injury late in the first quarter, thus missing the remainder of the game.
- Braxton made a number of appearances throughout the 2022 season and took over the starting spot for the final three games, posting a 2-1 record with wins over South Florida and Houston.
- Braxton set a new freshman passing record with two 300+ yard passing games on the year, coming against USF and Houston.
- His 302 yards vs. USF was the first 300-yard passing game for a Tulsa freshman since T.J. Rubley's 386 yards against Oklahoma State in the 1987 season opener.
- A week later, he became the only freshman in a Tulsa uniform to throw for two 300+ yards with 316 against Houston in the season finale.

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COMEBACK WINS . . .

- Since 2015, Tulsa has had 26 games in which the Hurricane has trailed and come back to win ... in 2016, Tulsa had its biggest come-from-behind win in school history and second-biggest in NCAA Division I history (now 3rd), trailing 31-0 at Fresno State in the second quarter and winning 48-41 in overtime ... the next largest comeback win was 21 points in 2020 against SMU.

RACKING UP THE MILES . . .

- This year's schedule has the Golden Hurricane traveling to both coasts and racking up the miles.
- Tulsa goes west 1,998 miles for the first road game of the season against the Huskies.
- The third road contest, Tulsa travels its second farthest distance with a 1,402-mile trip to Boca Raton, Fla., to play AAC opponent FAU.
- Tulsa wraps up the season with its sixth and final road game on Nov. 24/25 against East Carolina, a distance of 1,235 miles from Tulsa.
- In all, those three trips total 4,635 miles while Tulsa's three other road opponents – Northern Illinois, SMU and Tulane – combine for a distance of only 1,563 miles.

THE GRADUATES . . .

- Tulsa's roster has 19 players who have already earned their undergraduate degrees.
- Joe Anderson, Chester Baah, Bryce Bray, Mitchell Kulkin, Jaise Oliver, Kendarin Ray and LJ Wallace earned their bachelor's degree at Tulsa.
- Twelve players earned their degrees at other universities before transferring as graduate students to Tulsa.
- Those players include Izuchukwu King Ani (Mississippi State), Donte Burton (Wisconsin), Will Farniok (Nebraska), Zaid Hamden (Ohio State), Kai-Leon Herbert (Miami, Fla.), Demarco Jones (Oklahoma State), Ben Kopenski (Oklahoma State), Xavier Lanier (UAB), Austin Ortega (Nevada), Darrell Simpson (Oklahoma), Coleton Smith (Southwest Baptist) and Kanion Williams (Oklahoma State).

THE TRANSFERS . . .

- A total of 30 players on the Tulsa roster are transfers, including 26 with FBS experience, one FCS, two NCAA Division II and one NAIA.
- Among 14 transfers this year, 12 are scholarship transfers... included in that group are 4 players from Oklahoma State (Demarco Jones, Ben Kopenski, Braylin Presley and Kanion Williams) ... one each from FIU (Rey Burnett), Penn (Chase Meyer), Nevada (Austin Ortega), Arkansas (Keaun Parker), USC (Julien Simon), UAB (Xavier Lanier), SIU/Ohio State (Zaid Hamden) and DII Southwest Baptist (Coleton Smith).

SCHEDULE FEATURES THREE TOP-25 TEAMS . . .

- The 2023 Golden Hurricane schedule features three of the nation's preseason top-25 teams, including two non-conference foes.
- Tulsa will face two of the three in the first three weeks of the season, including No. 10-ranked Washington and #20 Oklahoma ... Washington is now ranked xx, OU xx and Tulane xx.
- AAC opponent Tulane came into the season ranked 24th in the AP poll.
- Washington ended the 2022 season with an 11-2 record and a Valero Alamo Bowl win over Texas.
- Despite a losing record at 6-7 in 2022, the Sooners look to get back to its stronghold on the Big 12 Conference before its switch to the SEC.
- Tulane finished the 2022 season with a 12-2 record, including a Cotton Bowl win over USC.

NEW LOOK LEAGUE . . .

- The American Athletic Conference gets a new look in 2023 as six new teams join the league.
- Out is Cincinnati, Houston and UCF.
- In is Charlotte, Florida Atlantic, Rice, North Texas, UAB and UTSA.
- The Hurricane will play four of those new opponents this year as Tulsa hosts Rice, Charlotte and North Texas, while traveling to FAU.



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TULSA RANKED SIXTH IN FBS FOR CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS ...

- Tulsa has won the sixth-most conference championships among FBS schools with a total of 35 league titles.
- Oklahoma (50), Nebraska (46), Michigan (44), Ohio State (39) and Southern Cal (37) are the only schools with more than Tulsa (35). Alabama (33), Texas (30), Fresno State (29) and Utah (28) round out the top 10 teams.
- Tulsa has played in the Oklahoma Collegiate Conference (1914-28; 5 titles), Big Four Conference (1929-32; 3 titles), Missouri Valley Conference (1935-85; 25 titles), Western Athletic Conference (1996-2004; 0 titles), Conference USA (2005-13; 2 titles) and the American Athletic Conference (2014-present; 0 titles).

NFL EXPERIENCE ON COACHING STAFF ...

- Tulsa has six members of its coaching staff who at one time were on an NFL roster ...
- Associate Head Coach/Defensive Line Coach **Ron Burton** was signed by the Dallas Cowboys as an undrafted free agent after the 1987 NFL Draft ... he spent four seasons in the NFL ... Burton was converted to LB from a college defensive lineman ... led the team as a rookie with 19 special teams sacks ... started at left OLB in 1988 and had 74 tackles ... in 1989, he was with the Phoenix Cardinals and in 1990 signed as a free agent by the LA Raiders.
- Defensive Pass Game Coordinator/Cornerbacks Coach **Michael Hunter** was first signed by the New York Giants as an undrafted free agent in 2016. He spent time with the Giants and five other NFL teams from 2016-19 — New York Jets, Denver Broncos, Buffalo Bills, Houston Texans and Kansas City Chiefs ... he totaled 4 tackles.
- Offensive Line Coach **Ryan Stanchek** signed with the Atlanta Falcons as an undrafted free agent after the 2009 NFL Draft ... he played for the Arena Football League's Cleveland Gladiators in 2010.
- Receivers Coach **Ryan Switzer** was a 2017 fourth round draft choice by the Dallas Cowboys and was with the Oakland Raiders, Pittsburgh Steelers and Cleveland Browns ... he completed his career with the Cleveland Browns in 2021 ... he had career totals of 50 receptions for 321 yards, 1,910 return yards and two touchdowns.
- Defensive Quality Control Coach **Dominique Franks** was a fifth-round draft (135th overall) choice by the Atlanta Falcons in 2010 ... Franks spent four seasons (2010-13) with the Falcons and part of the 2014 season with the Baltimore Ravens ... he ended his career with 48 tackles, 14 pass deflections and 3 INTs.
- Offensive Quality Control Coach **Lance Dunbar** was signed as an undrafted free agent by Dallas in 2012 and spent five seasons (2012-16) with the Cowboys ... he spent the 2017 campaign with the Rams and finished his pro career with the Dallas Renegades of the XFL in 2020 ... Dunbar finished his NFL career with 473 rushing yards, 647 receiving yards and 2 total TDs.



BACK-TO-BACK FIRST ROUND DRAFT PICKS ...

- **ZAVEN COLLINS** was selected by the Arizona Cardinals with the 16th pick of the first round in the 2021 NFL Draft.

GOLDEN HURRICANE IN TULSA?

A year ago (2022) Tulsa celebrated the 100th anniversary of adopting the school's nickname of Golden Hurricane.

In 1922, first-year coach Howard Acher saw great potential in his team and wanted to publicize it by creating a new identity with a new nickname. Sports writers and others had called the school by any number of names from the Presbyterians to the Orange and Black, to the Kendallites.

After an opening day win against a strong Texas Christian University team in 1922, Acher put his mind to work. The press had claimed that the Tulsa football team blew through its opponents like a tornado. So, it figured that Tornadoes, would be the nickname with "golden" added to identify the color of the uniforms. However, it was later found that Georgia Tech had claimed that name, so from tornado it was evolved meteorologically to a hurricane. Thus the squad voted, and the name "Golden Hurricane" became the new team moniker with the gold added because of the jersey color.

TU lived up to its nickname as the Golden Hurricane blew through the Texas A&M defense in the next game with pass after pass from QB Rex Thomas. TU won its first game as the Golden Hurricane by a score of 13-10.

Tulsa 42, Arkansas-Pine Bluff 7

Aug. 31, 2023 • H.A. Chapman Stadium

TULSA, Okla. — Tulsa opened the Kevin Wilson era Thursday night with a 42-7 win against Arkansas-Pine Bluff in front of 17,529 fans at H.A. Chapman Stadium.

Playing in his first career game, Tulsa redshirt freshman quarterback Cardell Williams completed 13-of-14 passes for 233 yards and three touchdowns after coming in for an injured Braylon Braxton in the first quarter.

Williams completed all nine passes in the first-half for 169 yards and his three TDs. He went on to complete his first 13 passes before misfiring on his first pass early in the fourth quarter.

Jordan Ford had his first career 100+ rushing game with 110 yards, while Marquis Shoulders' 132 receiving yards and two TDs were career highs for the third-year sophomore.

After a slow start in the first quarter, the Hurricane offense scored on all four of its second quarter possessions to take a 28-7 lead into halftime. Tulsa suffered a three-turnover first quarter but settled down and turned in a dominate second period for a 21-point lead.

The Hurricane offense amassed 517 yards for an average of 7.4 yards per play, as 17 of Tulsa's 69 offensive snaps went for double-digit yards. The defense turned in a solid outing throughout, holding the Lions to 252 total yards, 102 on the ground and 150 passing, while totaling 12 tackles for 54 lost yards.

Ben Kopenski and Kendarin Ray shared the team-lead with 10 tackles, while Kopenski, the transfer from Oklahoma State had two TFL for -13 yards. Owen Ostroski had three TFL for -16 yards among his six total stops.
