

Post-Game Notes – 2024 Allstate Sugar Bowl / College Football Playoff Semifinal
Washington vs. Texas
Caesars Superdome, New Orleans, Jan. 1, 2024

Tonight's game was played on the 100th anniversary of UW's first-ever bowl game, a 14-14 tie vs. Navy in the 1924 Rose Bowl.

Washington has reached 14 wins for the first time in program history, having already broken the school record with its 13th win, vs. Oregon in the Pac-12 Championship Game. Twice before, UW has won 12 games – 12-0 in 1991 and 12-2 in 2016.

Washington has won 21 straight games, the longest active streak in the country, and the third-longest in Husky history (longer UW streaks: 40 straight wins 1908-16; 22 straight wins 1990-92).

UW has won its last 12 games that have been decided by one score or less.

Rome Odunze, who had his 10th 100-yard game of the season broke Reggie Williams' 2002 record for single-season receiving yards. Odunze now has 1,553 yards this year (breaking Williams' mark of 1,454), and 3,185 for his career, behind only Williams' 3,598.

Michael Penix Jr. is the first FBS quarterback to pass for 4,500-plus yards in back-to-back seasons since Patrick Mahomes did it in 2015 and 2016 at Texas Tech.

The 77-yard completion from Michael Penix Jr. to Ja'Lynn Polk early in the first quarter was the second-longest pass play in College Football Playoff history. The record is an 80-yarder from Jake Fromm to Mecole Hardman for Georgia in the 2018 title game.

Dillon Johnson scored two touchdowns to give him 16 for the season. That total is fourth in UW single-season history.

Prior to this season, Washington had had two receivers total 100 yards in the same game just eight times in program history. Tonight, it happened for the seventh time this season alone, as Ja'Lynn Polk had 122 and Odunze had 125.

This season, over 14 games, Washington has never trailed by more than seven points. The Huskies never trailed at all in eight of 14 games, including tonight vs. the Longhorns. Over a total of 840 minutes this season (14 games x 60 minutes = 840 minutes), the Huskies have trailed for just 101 minutes, five seconds, meaning they've been tied or ahead for 738 minutes. 44 seconds.

Washington has allowed a total of just 41 fourth-quarter points over its last nine games, and just 27 points in the fourth over the last six.

Washington head coach Kalen DeBoer is now 104-11 as a head coach, and is 25-2 at UW, including 14-0 at home. He is also 18-2 as a head coach in playoff games and 10-0 vs. ranked teams.
