

Post-Game Notes
Washington at Indiana
Memorial Stadium, Oct. 26, 2024

For the eighth time in eight games this year, Washington out-gained its opponent in terms of total offensive yards. This time, the Huskies racked up 318 yards to the Hoosiers' 312.

Washington's Jonah Coleman carried the ball season-high 19 times today, surpassing his previous high of 18, vs. Michigan. His career high, 22 carries, came last season vs. USC, when Coleman played for Arizona.

Coleman also recorded his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the season, finishing the game with 105 yards.

Washington sixth-year senior receiver Giles Jackson scored on a six-yard rush in the second quarter, the first rushing TD of his Washington career. As a true freshman at Michigan in 2019, he scored a 22-yard rushing TD vs. Ohio State.

UW punter Jack McCallister's first punt of the day traveled 62 yards, marking a career long for him. That punt also resulted in a 3-yard loss on the return. McCallister's average of 53.8 yards on four punts was the fifth-highest average in UW single-game history (minimum three punts).

The 67-yard interception return for a touchdown from Indiana's D'Angelo Ponds marked the first time this season that the UW had given up a touchdown after a turnover (whether on the actual play, or on the ensuing drive). On six prior turnovers, UW had allowed three field goals and no TDs on ensuing drives.

Indiana's 19-play, 62-yard drive that resulted in a field goal on the final play of the first half was the fourth-longest opponent drive in UW history, in terms of plays. Three times in UW history (Oregon 2002, Arizona State 2021 and Kansas State 1999) has a Husky opponent had a longer scoring drive.

UW freshman QB Demond Williams Jr. scored the first rushing TD of his career on an eight-yard carry early in the third quarter.

Washington senior captain and linebacker Alphonzo Tuputala set a new career high with 14 tackles in the game. Safety Makell Esteen also far surpassed his previous high of four tackles, with 13 vs. the Hoosiers. Esteen entered today's game with 14 tackles for the season, and nearly doubled that total.
