Washington vs. Rutgers

Husky Stadium, Oct. 10, 2025

Washington quarterback Demond Williams Jr. became just the 16th quarterback in NCAA-FBS history (and first in UW history) to pass for 400 or more yards, and rush for 100 or more, in the same game. He's also just the second Big Ten QB ever to do it, and for that matter, the first player among former Pac-12 schools to accomplish the feat.

Williams also set new career highs for passing yards and rushing yards. His previous highs were 374 passing (vs. Louisville in the 2024 Sun Bowl) and 88 rushing (at Washington State, in 2025).

Williams' 538 yards of total offense were a new school record, breaking the mark of 529, set by Michael Penix Jr. vs. Arizona in 2022.

A Husky quarterback had rushed for 100-plus yards just 11 times prior to tonight's game, with Jake Locker (four times) and Denny Fitzpatrick (three) accounting for seven of those 11.

Jonah Coleman entered the week as the NCAA-FBS leader in rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns, total points and points per game. He added to his touchdown total his 11th rushing TD of the season, his 12th overall. Coleman is now just two rushing TDs shy of the UW single-season top-10 for rushing touchdowns, and just four short of the total touchdowns top-10.

Freshman receiver Dezmen Roebuck notched a career high with 108 receiving yards. It was the first time a UW freshman has topped 100 receiving yards since Hunter Bryant had 121 vs. California in 2017. Bryant, coincidentally, was UW's honorary captain tonight.

Washington true freshman linebacker Zaydrius Rainey-Sale, who had missed the start of the season due to an injury suffered in high school, saw his first action of the season tonight vs. Rutgers.

UW outscored Rutgers, 28-6, in the second half, and 7-0 in the fourth quarter. On the season, the Huskies have outscored opponents, 142-51, in the second half, and 80-10 in the fourth quarter.

Luke Dunne's 56-yard punt in the second quarter tied a career long.

While Washington's 22-game home winning streak was broken two weeks ago, the Huskies have now won 23 of their last 24 home games.
