Washington at Maryland

SECU Stadium, Oct. 4, 2025

Today's win marked just the seventh time in UW history that the Huskies won a game after trailing by 20 or more points. It's the first such game since 2020, when the Huskies trailed Utah (at Husky Stadium), 21-0, and won, 24-21. It's the first such win on the road since the UW's famous victory at California in 1993, when Washington trailed 20-0, and 23-3, and won, 24-23. Here are the seven UW games in which the Huskies have overcome a 20-point deficit to win:

Washington outscored Maryland 21-0 in the fourth quarter, UW has now outscored opponents 73-10 in the fourth quarter this season.

UW sophomore tight end Decker DeGraaf set new career highs with six receptions for 62 yards. Jonah Coleman set a new career high with eight receptions. Demond Williams Jr. set new career highs in both completions (28) and attempts (41).

Williams Jr. threw his first interception of the season on the game's first drive. He'd thrown 70 passes this season before his first pick and, dating back to last season, he'd had 96 straight pass attempts without an INT. His lone interception last year came very early in the Sun Bowl.

Washington's touchdown on a three-yard pass from Williams to Denzel Boston 37 seconds into the fourth quarter broke a streak of seven full quarters without a TD for the Huskies, which had last found the endzone late in the win at Washington State. The Huskies scored another TD (a 34-yard pass from Williams to Dezmen Roebuck) 2:51 of game time later.

Today's game was the Huskies' first ever at SECU Stadium, and just the second-ever Washington-Maryland football game. The only previous game between the Huskies and Terrapins came in the inaugural Aloha Bowl on Christmas Day, 1982, a 21-20 Husky win.

Washington has played only two games further east than today's game: two at Syracuse (1977 and 2007) and two at Rutgers (2016 and 2024).

Today's game was announced as a sellout, making it the Huskies' eighth straight sellout in true road games (i.e., not counting the Sun Bowl, nor the Washington State game at Lumen Field last season).
