

**Post-Game Notes**  
**Washington at UCLA**  
**Rose Bowl, Nov. 22, 2025**

Tonight's victory over UCLA was just the fourth by the Huskies at the Rose Bowl in 16 meetings in Pasadena (UCLA played home games at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum until 1982). It was also just the second road win over UCLA over the last 11 such games. UW had beaten the Bruins just once in Pasadena (in 2018) since 1995.

The Huskies' margin of victory of 34 points was its biggest vs. the Bruins since a 61-20 victory over UCLA, at Husky Stadium, in 1970.

Jonah Coleman scored his 14<sup>th</sup> rushing touchdown and 16<sup>th</sup> overall touchdown (he has two receiving TDs), tying him for seventh in UW history in single-season rushing touchdowns, and in a tie for ninth for total touchdowns.

Alex McLaughlin's 59-yard fumble return for a touchdown on a UCLA fake field-goal attempt was the first fumble returned for a touchdown by a Husky since Bralen Trice did it vs. Arkansas state early in the 2021 season.

It was the first fumble recovery of McLaughlin's career, at UW or in the two previous seasons at Northern Arizona. It was his second career touchdown, following a interception return for a touchdown earlier this year vs. Washington State.

Husky edge rusher DeShaun Lynch batted down his seventh pass of the season, tops in the nation according to Pro Football Focus stats (the NCAA doesn't keep that statistic).

UW QB Demond Williams Jr. is now fourth on both the single-season and career quarterback rushing yards lists at UW. He has 568 yards this season and 850 in his career.

Washington's defense allowed just 10 first downs today, the fewest the Huskies have allowed since a game at Colorado on Nov. 20, 2021.

The last time Washington recovered three opponent fumbles in a game was on Oct. 12, 2019, at Arizona. UW won that game, 51-27.
