Post-Game Notes Washington vs. Oregon Husky Stadium, Nov. 29, 2025

Demond Williams Jr. finished the regular season with 565 rushing yards in 2025, which gives him 877 for his career. His season total ranks fourth on the UW top-10, while his career total already ranks third.

Williams, playing in his 13<sup>th</sup> home game as a Husky, threw his first interception at Husky Stadium, late in the first quarter of today's game. He threw just one as a freshman in 2024 (in the Sun Bowl vs. Louisville) and the six previous interceptions he'd thrown in 2025 were all on the road.

Husky wide receiver Denzel Boston caught his 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> career touchdowns today, moving him into sole possession of eighth on the UW career receiving touchdowns list. Austin Seferian-Jenkins is seventh, with 21. His 10 touchdowns this season are a career high and rank tied for seventh in UW single-season history.

It was the sixth game of Boston's career in which he has caught multiple touchdown passes. The last was earlier this season vs. Rutgers. It's his third multi-TD game this season (Washington State was the other).

Sophomore running back Adam Mohammed notched his second career 100-yard rushing game with 105 yards on just 14 carries. It was also his second in a row, as he ran for 108 last Saturday at UCLA.

For the first time in program history, Washington has three players who have rushed for 500-plus yards in a season. Jonah Coleman finished the regular season with 673 yards; Williams is second with 565; and Mohammed has 517.

With a total of 40 points scored (26-14), today's game was the lowest-scoring UW-Oregon game since the Ducks beat the Dawgs, 31-6, in 2004.
