Post-Game Notes Washington at Wisconsin Camp Randall Stadium, Nov. 8, 2025

Washington held Wisconsin to just 48 passing yards, fewest by a Husky opponent since Michigan passed for 44 in a 31-10 Husky loss in Ann Arbor on Sept. 11, 2021.

The Badgers completed just six passes, fewest by a Husky opponent since 2010, when UCLA went 6-for-25 in a 24-7 loss to Washington, Nov. 18, 2010. In terms of passing yards, Wisconsin's leading passer in today's game was its punter, who accounted for 24 of his team's 48 passing yards.

In terms of total yardage, Washington out-gained the Badgers 251-205, and had 15 first downs to the Badgers' 12.

UW linebacker Anthony Ward blocked a punt in the second quarter. It was the first blocked punt by a Husky since Edefuan Ulofoshio blocked one vs. Texas in the 2022 Alamo Bowl.

Washington and Wisconsin had not met on the gridiron since 1992, and the Huskies had not paid a visit to Camp Randall Stadium (one of only a handful of FBS stadiums that is older than Husky Stadium) since 1968.
