NCAA Championships: Washington finished seventh in team standings, highest ever for a Husky team. Participants: Mike Downer (118), Randy Berg (126), Lyle Ballew (134), Larry Owings (142), Hajime Shinjo (150), Ken Latimer (167), Bill Murdock (177) and Bill Allen (190). Larry Owings became the first Washington national wrestling champion when he defeated Dan Gable of Iowa State in the finals. Gable had been undefeated through high school and college and had a win string of 181 matches, including 108 pins. Because of his victory, Owings was named the tournament's Outstanding Wrestler; he also had the fastest average pin time.

Of Washington's six other contestants, only Bill Murdock(167) survived the first round; he won his first two. Of those six, only Scott Cahoon(118) got to wrestle in the consolation bracket; he lost his first match there. Pleasant and Shinjo both made it to the semifinals; Pleasant lost an overtime referees' decision, Shinjo lost 3-2 to the eventual champion, Carl Adams of Iowa State. Owings lost the championship he had won as a sophomore when Darrell Keller of Oklahoma State beat him in the final, 16-12. It was Owings' first loss after 28 straight victories. Of Washington's nine-member team, only one (Ballew) was a senior.

Other honors: In team ratings published by Amateur Wrestling News, Washington was ranked third nationally late in the season; that was the highest a team from the West has ever been ranked.

Jim Smith was one of the two coaches of the West team in the annual East-West All-Star match.

Larry Owings wrestled on the United States team that met the Russian national team in Chicago in March.

Washington was selected host team for the 1972 Pacific-8 meet and the 1973 NCAA meet.

The Pac-8 meet also was the Far West regional qualifying meet for the NCAA; the top 5 qualified. Washington qualified nine of a possible 10; their wrestlers' regional standing: Cahoon 4th, Kaveny 5th, Ballew 5th, Owings 1st, Pleasant 1st, Shinjo 2nd, Murdock 3rd, Maras 4th, Allen 1st.

NCAA Championships(at Auburn, Ala.): Washington was eighth with 30 points; that was second to Oregon State(43) among western schools. The Huskies had three placewinners, the first time they have ever had more than one in this tournament: Larry Owings(142) was 2nd, Don Pleasant(150) 5th and Hajime Shinjo(158) 6th.

Season highlights: Washington had its highest national ranking ever(third preseason, third midseason, fifth pre-tournament), its most NCAA points and highest NCAA finish ever. In the NCAA, it had its most placewinners ever(4) and its second individual champion(Bill Murdock). The Huskies also won their second consecutive Pac-8 team championship. In 1973, the Pac-8 will be in Corvallis and the NCAA in Seattle. But the biggest moment of the season was when an overflow crowd(lines were six blocks long waiting to get in and the match was delayed 40 minutes to get them in) saw the Huskies give Iowa State its first dual-meet loss in two years(after 33 straight wins) 17-16. The crowd of 8,148 was the third-largest ever to see a college dual meet(10,100 in Ames, Iowa, and 8,200 in Stillwater).

Larry Owings, certainly Washington's greatest wrestler, graduated with yet another disappointment at the end of his career as he lost his second straight NCAA final, this time 8-4 to Tom Milkovich, Michigan State. He finished his career 52-1 in dual matches(the only loss 7-5 to two-time NCAA champ Mike Grant, Oklahoma, as a sophomore) and 87-4 overall(one loss each year, the last 3 all to NCAA champions). Of his 52 dual wins, 29 were by falls. Of his 87 total wins, 47 were falls. In wrestling from the mat, he was turned only once(by Grant for a predicament). He won 21 times from NCAA placewinners: Bob Bergen, Portland State(4); Phil Parker, Iowa State(1); Carl Adams, Iowa State(1); Mike Jones, Oregon State(1); Kim Snider, Oregon State(2); Bob Tomasovic, Oregon State(1); Bob Stites, Oklahoma State(3); Jay Arneson, Oklahoma State(1); Kelly Trujillo, Arizona State(1); Lee Torres, Cal Poly(2); Lee Whitaker, Cal State-Pa.(1); Keith Lowrance, Michigan State(1); Rhondo Fehlberg, BYU(1); Silbaugh, Wyoming(1), and Dan Gable, Iowa State(1). He pinned Adams, Arneson, Trujillo, Whitaker, Lowrance, Fehlberg and Silbaugh.

Statistical leaders were Shinjo, 67 takedowns; Downer, 13 reverses and 20 predicaments; Owings, 28 near-falls, 13 pins and 27 victories; and Murdock, 21 points' riding time.

Team season statistics: (236 matches) takedowns 303-164, reverses 94-74, escapes 224-242, near-falls 91-19, predicaments 86-35, riding time 76-44, pins 36-6, won-loss 163-67-6(.703 pct).
