

Post-Game Notes
Colorado State at Washington
Husky Stadium, Aug. 30, 2025

The following 22 players made their UW debut today vs. Colorado State: WR Kevin Green Jr., CB Rahshawn Clark, LB Buddah Al-Uqdah*, S CJ Christian, CB Dylan Robinson, WR Raiden Vines-Bright, CB Tacario Davis*, LB Xe'ree Alexander, DL Ta'ita'I Uiagalelei, S Alex McLaughlin, WR Justice Williams, S Rylon Dillard-Allen, LS Ryan Kean, PK Ethan Moczulski, TE Kade Eldridge, P Luke Dunne, OL Carver Willis*, EDGE Devin Hyde*, DL Anterio Thompson*, OL John Mills*, DL Simote Pepa, WR Dezmen Roebuck. Among that group, six true freshmen made their Husky debut: Robinson, Vines-Bright, Dillard-Allen, Hyde, Mills and Roebuck.

UW quarterback Demond Williams Jr. set a new career high with 68 rushing yards, and also passed for more than 200 yards (226) for the third time in as many college starts.

UW running back Adam Mohammed's second-quarter, one-yard score was the first touchdown of his Husky career.

Husky running back Jonah Coleman notched the sixth 100-yard rushing game of his UW career, and the eighth of his college career (he had two at Arizona). He finished the game with 24 carries for 177 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Coleman was two yards short of his career-high, 179 (vs. Colorado, while with Arizona, in 2023).

Tight end Kade Eldridge lined up as a fullback and scored from one-year out. The third-year sophomore who transferred to UW from USC this past offseason, had not scored a college touchdown prior to tonight. It was also the first carry of his college career. He did rush for 545 yards and seven scores as a senior at Lynden (Wash.) Christian High in 2022.

Makell Esteen's third-quarter interception was the fourth of his UW career, and his first since the 2023 Apple Cup.

UW's 509 yards of total offense are the Huskies' second most in 14 games under Jedd Fisch. UW's 283 rushing yards are the most under Fisch, and the most since UW rushed for 316 at USC in 2023.

Washington won its 21st straight home game, dating back to a loss to Washington State in the final game of the 2021 season. The Huskies have also won nine straight non-conference home games, dating back to the 2021 season-opener, as well as 29 of their last 30 against non-conference foes at Husky Stadium.

UW's 21-game home win streak is the second-longest active home streak in the nation and the longest in UW history since Washington won 45 home games in a row between 1908-1917.

Today's game was the first-ever Washington-Colorado State game. The Huskies will take on a first-time opponent again next Saturday, when UC Davis comes to Husky Stadium. Last season, Washington also opened with back-to-back games vs. first-time opponents, Weber State and Eastern Michigan.
