Washington Head Coach Jedd Fisch

Opening Statement

Appreciate y'all being here so late - hopefully this is our latest game that we have the rest of the year. That'll be our goal. But that was a fun game for the University of Washington. I thought our crowd was great. Though our crowd was loud. We had a couple of false starts due to crowd noise, delay of game, causing time outs. So that was awesome. It was awesome to see our crowd get into this game. It's awesome to have a 22 game home win streak. That's pretty cool. And now we're going to focus on getting the Apple Cup back... Really, proud with the way we played tonight, I thought really overall as a team, we couldn't have done many things better than we did. Probably could have taken the ball away one or two more times. We had some chances. A couple penalties kept two drives alive. Outside of that, scoring on special teams, taking the ball way on defense, getting an amount of stops, keeping a team under 225 yards, and then also the fact that on offense - to be able to score on nine drives, nine touchdowns. So excited about the team. Excited about where we're at and obviously, I know, it's time to start focusing on trying to get that Apple Cup back.

Do you have an update on Rashid Williams?

Yeah, we'll know better tomorrow after we get an MRI and an X-ray, but it didn't look great. So we'll just kind of wait and see what that means, but, you know, I would assume he'll be out at least for the next few weeks.

How do you evaluate your game like this, against a team where you guys have kind of a big talent advantage?

Make sure that you play to the talent advantage would be the most important thing. We've all seen these games. They did some great things, and there's some stuff that we didn't play well enough to play a team that level and paid for it the hard way. I'm proud of our team. We got a lot of guys into the game. We got out healthy for the most part. Now our real season starts. We'll come back. It's been a brutal three games. We've flown to Alabama, flown to Utah, flown to Washington, got home at 3 a.m. three Sundays in a row. Found a way to still win two games in my mind and be ready to go try to win a championship. this game has no bearing on anything we want to accomplish. It's a one night, one-hit game that sometimes you can make a special memory, like we did 20 years ago, but for the most part, it's going to be realistic in a lot of those situations and tonight was one of those nights.

Despite the result, you talk about getting everybody in, what's the positive you can take in getting a lot of guys into games just to kind of get them on tape, see some of those backups play, in an atmosphere like this that you may not see the during the season?

With the new red shirt rule that they started years back, you can play guys in four games, and so you get a chance to get guys like Kameron Totton out there playing a lot more and I told the team that when I think about this game years from now, I'll think about Cole Batson. That'll be the guy that I think about. He was out there, played the whole second half for Rex (Connors). He's on every special teams. He's making every tackle, but he had been through a war. A bye week allows you extra practice time, so hopefully you can put together a good plan where we can eliminate the mental errors and go play ball. That's been something in the first three games that showed up multiple times, which starts with me and our staff, making sure we get these guys ready to play.
