## Post-Game Notes Colorado State at Washington Husky Stadium, Sept. 6, 2025

UW running back Jonah Coleman scored five rushing touchdowns today, tying the modern school record, held by Hugh McElhenny (vs. Washington State, 1950) and Corey Dillon (vs. UCLA, 1996). The only UW player ever to score more was Ervin Daily, with seven vs. Whitman in 1919 (a 120-0 UW victory).

Washington's eight rushing touchdowns were the most for the Huskies since the 1951 game vs. Oregon, when they also had eight.

Coleman also surpassed 2,500 career rushing yards, finishing the night with 2,584. He entered the game with 2,473 career rushing yards, good for eighth-most among active FBS players entering the weekend.

Denzel Boston scored his first punt return touchdown, with a 78-yarder in the second quarter. It was the first by a Husky since Rome Odunze scored on a punt return vs. California in 2023. It also tied for the 14<sup>th</sup>-longest punt return TD in school history.

Washington has had 12 punt return TDs over the last 12 seasons (2014-25, inclusive), as many as the Huskies had in the 44-season span prior to that (1980-2013). UW had no punt return TDs from 2004 through 2013.

Demond Williams Jr. has passed for 200-plus yards in all four of his college starts so far, with 254 tonight. He has also completed a touchdown pass in all four. Williams is now 116-for-154 passing in his career, a .753 completion percentage. He's also thrown 10 TD passes with just one interception.

UW's 34 first downs were second-most in single-game history, behind only the 2002 Wyoming game (36).

Washington scored 28 points in the second quarter and 42 in the first half. The 28 points tied for third-most ever in a second quarter by a Husky team, while 42 points were tied for eighth-most in a first half ever at UW.

The Huskies' 70 points tied for most in modern UW history (post-WWII), matching their total at Oregon in 2016 (70-21).

The last time UW totaled 300-plus passing and rushing yards in the same game was also that win at Oregon in 2016. Tonight, UW rushed for 325 and passed for 304. At Oregon in '16, the Dawgs notched 378 rushing yards and 304 through the air.

Tonight's attendance was 65,421, the largest crowd in UC Davis program history.

Washington won its 22<sup>nd</sup> straight home game, dating back to a loss to Washington State in the final game of the 2021 season. The Huskies have also won 10 straight non-conference home games, dating back to the 2021 season-opener, as well as 30 of their last 31 against non-conference foes at Husky Stadium.

UW's 22-game home win streak is the second-longest active home streak in the nation and the longest in UW history since Washington won 45 home games in a row between 1908-1917.

Today's game was the first-ever Washington-UC Davis game. This marks the second year in a row in which UW faced two teams for the first time ever in the first two weeks of the season. Last year, Washington played its first-ever games vs. Weber State and Eastern Michigan. Last Saturday, the Huskies opened the 2025 season vs. Colorado State, who they'd never faced before.
