BOEING APPLE CUP: #17/19 WASHINGTON vs. WASHINGTON ST. Dawgs Kick Off 2026 Season With Sunday Game vs. Cougars

THE GAME: The Washington football team, entering its third season under head coach Jedd Fisch, opens the 2026 campaign with the Boeing Apple Cup – the 118th meeting between Washington and Washington State. The first-ever UW-WSU game played as a season opener will kick off this Sunday, Sept. 6, at 1:00 p.m. PT and air on NBC television. The Boeing Apple Cup marks the first of four straight home games in the month of September for the Dawgs along with non-conference tilts vs. Utah State (Sept. 12) and Eastern Washington (Sept. 19), followed by the Big Ten opener vs. Minnesota on Sept. 26. The Dawgs enter the season ranked No. 17 in the preseason AP Top 25, and No. 19 in the USA Today coaches poll.

EARLIEST BOEING APPLE CUP: This year's Boeing Apple Cup will be the third in a row to be played in September, but the first-ever UW-WSU game played in a season opener, and the earliest-ever game between the two in-state foes. Washington and Washington State first played one another in 1900. Throughout the first half of the 20th century, the mostly-annual game was played at various times in the schedule, though mainly in mid-to-late October and November. Until 1949, it was rarely the last game of the season. But, in 1949, UW-WSU was the season finale, and it remained the final regular-season game for UW until 2001, when Washington's game at Miami (Fla.) was moved to the week after the Apple Cup due to the September 11 attacks (UW was to have played at Miami on Sept. 15). Since then, UW twice played California after the Apple Cup, and in 2007, UW finished the season at Hawai'i.

HOME OPENERS: The Huskies are 100-29-5 in home openers (whether the first game of the season or not), a percentage of .765. Washington did not play any home games in the 1890 or 1893 seasons. That 100-29-5 mark includes a 28-game streak of home-opener wins that ran from 1908 to 1935. Before falling to Air Force in the 1999 home opener, Washington had won 13 straight such games since having fallen to Oklahoma State on Sept. 7, 1985. The Huskies had won their last 11 home openers, dating back to a loss to No. 11 LSU in 2009, prior to a loss to Montana in the 2021 debut. Washington has won its last four home openers, including a victory over Colorado State to open the 2025 season.

TELEVISION: The Boeing Apple Cup will air on NBC, with Paul Burmeister, Yogi Roth and Zora Stephenson on the call. For more on how to watch online, go to www.nbcsports.com/watch.

RADIO: All Washington football games will air on the Washington Sports Network from Learfield, with Elise Woodward (play by play), former Husky tight end Cameron Cleeland (analyst), and Dave Mahler (sidelines) on the call. Radio coverage begins four hours before kickoff on the network's flagship station – Seattle's SportsRadio KJR 93.3 FM – with "Husky Gameday" live from The Zone for Husky home games. Statewide coverage on the 17-station Washington Sports Network begins two hours before kickoff. The entire broadcast is available worldwide on the Huskies Gameday mobile app and the Varsity app. The UW broadcast of this game will also air on Sirius/XM channel 82.

HEAD COACH

Third Season at UW

Washington coach Jedd Fisch, who enters his third season with the Huskies in 2026, has continued to burnish his reputation as an innovative football mind and highly effective leader during his time in Seattle.

Fisch, who had spent the previous three seasons (2021-23) restoring the football program at the University of Arizona and bringing it to its highest level in decades, accepted the position at UW on Jan. 14, 2024.

After arriving in Seattle, he wasted no time in making his mark on a Husky program that had experienced an unprecedented amount of turnover, leaving Fisch and his staff to quickly re-assemble a team that returned just two starters on defense and none on offense. In his first season, 2024, Fisch's Huskies stretched their home winning streak to 20 games (longest-ever at Husky Stadium) and earned a berth in the Sun Bowl.

In the meantime, Fisch began building for the long term, recruiting some of the top-ranked recruiting classes in history, while also firmly embracing the new realities of college football in the era of the portal, revenue sharing and NIL. And, in spring of 2025, his team compiled a cumulative grade point average of 3.27, highest in program history.

In 2025, the program continued to make clear and noteworthy steps forward, finishing the season with a 9-4 overall record and a convincing win over Boise State in the L.A. Bowl. Fisch, who calls the offensive plays, oversaw a team that made huge improvements in key statistical categories on both sides of the ball. The Husky offense, for one example, went from 104 in the nation in scoring offense, to 17th. Washington's red-zone offense improved from No. 104 to No. 7, and from 101st to 10th in third-down conversions. Additionally, Washington's defense also made great strides, finishing the season in the top-15 in the FBS in both rushing and scoring defense, never allowing more than 26 points in any one game in 2025.

Fisch's efficacy as a leader also showed up in other ways as Washington broke its program record for team GPA once again, finishing the fall academic quarter with a cumulative 3.31 grade point average. A total of 43 Huskies earned a place on the Big Ten All-Academic Team, four Huskies were named Academic All-District, and Johan Coleman (who was also a finalist for both the William V. Campbell Trophy and the Paul Horung Award) earned first-team Academic All-America.

Additionally, Fisch led a staff that proved itself among the country's top recruiters, as the Huskies' class of freshmen ranked No. 13 in the nation, the highest-rated class in UW history.

Fisch, 50, came to Seattle with a long, dynamic history of coaching in college and the NFL.

Fisch's Wildcats went 10-3 in 2023, his last year in Tucson, beating Oklahoma in the Alamo Bowl and finishing No. 11 in the final AP Top 25 poll. The Wildcats outscored opponents, on

average, 36.1 to 21.1 over the season, relying on an offense that averaged 448 yards a game.

A total of 12 Wildcat players earned some level of All-Pac-12 honors. Arizona's stingy defense registered 34 sacks and led the conference in the red zone.

He garnered national acclaim in 2023 and was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, presented annually to the nation's top head coach.

Prior to Arizona, Fisch served as the quarterbacks coach with the New England Patriots under Head Coach Bill Belichick. He previously served as an offensive coordinator, quarterbacks coach or assistant with the Los Angeles Rams, UCLA, the University of Michigan, Jacksonville Jaguars, the University of Miami, Seattle Seahawks, the University of Minnesota, the Denver Broncos and the Baltimore Ravens, and as a quality control coach with the Houston Texans. He got his start at the collegiate level serving as a graduate assistant at the University of Florida under Steve Spurrier.

In addition to Belichick and Spurrier, other mentors include Pete Carroll, Brian Billick and Jim Harbaugh.

Fisch is a native of Livingston, N.J. and graduated from the University of Florida with a bachelor's degree in criminology in 1998. He also earned his master's degree, in sports management in Gainesville, in 2000.

Fisch and his wife, Amber, are parents to three daughters: Zaylee, Ashlee and Kendall.

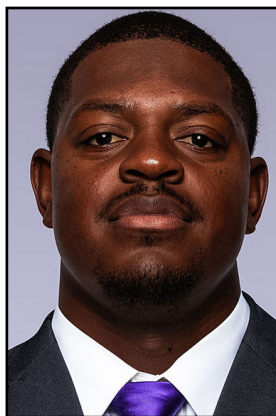

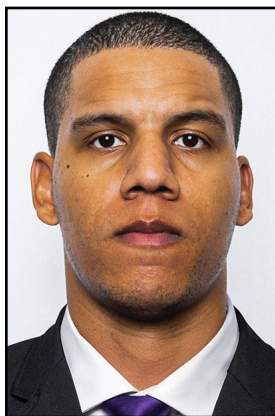

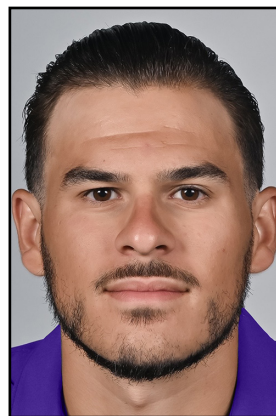

COACHING STAFF: Washington's coaching staff for the 2026 season returns nearly in tact from the previous year, with just one change and one addition. The current season's staff includes seven assistants who came to Seattle from Arizona, where Jedd Fisch was head coach from 2021-23. The two biggest changes were the addition of senior offensive assistant Matt Cavanaugh, a longtime NFL player and coach, and the promotion of JP Losman to quarterbacks coach. The former first-round draft pick out of Tulane was on the Husky staff as a quality control coach in 2025. On offense, the returners are running backs coach Scottie Graham, receivers coach Kevin Cummings, offensive line coach Michael Switzer and tight ends coach Jordan Paopao. Graham has added the role of assistant head coach while Cummings is now also the passing game coordinator. Washington's defensive staff is unchanged from the previous year, led by defensive coordinator Ryan Walters, the former Illinois defensive coordinator and Purdue head coach. The two defensive staff members who came to UW from Arizona are defensive running game coordinator and defensive line coach Jason Kaufusi and secondary coach John Richardson. They are joined by former USC and NFL safety Taylor Mays, a Seattle native who serves as safeties coach, and Brian Odum, a very experienced coach at Big 12, Big Ten and SEC programs, who is the linebackers coach. They both joined the staff prior to the 2025 season. Aaron Van Horn, who served as a quality control assistant in 2024, was promoted to outside linebackers coach ahead of 2025, while the Huskies also welcome back special teams coordinator Chris Petrilli.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS: Washington's football players have continued to perform at the highest academic levels, as the program continues to post impressive cumulative team GPAs. Last school year (2024-25), the UW football team achieved a team grade-point average of 3.31 in both the fall and winter quarters, and then wrapped up the year with a 3.27 in the spring quarter. In the spring quarter, a whopping 31 members of the UW roster earned a place on the Dean's List, and 49 of the players on the 2026 roster were on the Dean's List at least once in 2025-26 (most of them multiple times): Deji Ajose, X'e'ee Alexander, Buddah Al-Uqdah, Aiden Anderson, Dash Beierly, Elijah Brown, Jace Burton, Quaid Carr, D'Aryhian Clemons, Derek Colman-Brusa, Lowen Colman-Brusa, Charlie Crowell, Parker Cross, Decker DeGraaf, Kolt Dieterich, Luke Dunne, Kade Eldridge, Soane Faasolo, Jake Flores, Hunter Green, Kayden Greene, Kodi Greene, Landen Hatchett, Devin Hyde, Justin Hylkema, Ksani Jiles, Jacob Lane, Jayden Limar, Jacob Manu, Kai McClendon, Hunter McKee, Julian McMahan, Bodpegn Miller, John Mills, Ryken Moon,

IN THE CFP ERA: The era of the four-team College Football Playoff is gone, but that 10-season stretch (2014-2023) is instructive in terms of illustrating the teams that operated at the top level of the sport during that timespan, and Washington is one of those teams. Over that 10-year stretch, only 15 different programs earned a berth in the CFP semifinals, and only eight reached the tournament more than once. With two CPF berths in the four-team era (2016 and 2023), Washington is one of those eight. Only six teams made more than two appearances: Alabama (8), Clemson (6), Ohio State (5), Oklahoma (4), Georgia (3) and Michigan (3). For what it's worth, six more teams made their CFP debut in the 12-team bracket in 2024, and another five were first-time selections in 2025, but UW remains one of just 11 teams to have appeared in the CFP more than once, when counting the latest data.

BIG TIME: As has been well documented over the last couple of years, Washington officially joined the Big Ten Conference ahead of the 2024-25 school year, effective on Aug. 2, 2024. The Huskies were joined by fellow former Pac-12 programs Oregon, UCLA and USC in making the move to the BIG, which now includes 18 schools. Washington was one of four founding members of the Pacific Coast Conference (along with Cal, Oregon and Oregon State), and, along with Cal, was one of just two teams that were a part of that league (which changed names to the AAWU, Pac-8, Pac-10 and Pac-12) for the entirety of its full-fledged existence from 1915 to 2024.

HOME VS. NON-CONFERENCE: Washington has been very tough to beat in home, non-conference games over the last several decades. Going back to the 1981 season, the Huskies have posted an 81-14 record against nonconference foes at home. Those 14 losses have come to Montana (2021), Nebraska (2010), LSU (2009), BYU (2008), Oklahoma (2008), Ohio State (2007), Notre Dame (2005), Fresno State (2004), Nevada (2003), Air Force (1999), Nebraska (1997), Notre Dame (1995), Colorado (1989) and Oklahoma State (1985). Notable wins during that stretch include victories over No. 11 Michigan State in 2022, No. 19 Boise State in 2013, No. 22 Boise State in 2007, No. 11 Michigan in 2001, No. 4 Miami in 2000, and No. 12 Nebraska in 1992. Prior to the 2004 loss to Nevada, Washington hadn't lost a home game to a non-league opponent since falling to Air Force, 31-21, on September 18, 1999. The Huskies had won 10 such games before that Nevada loss. UW had a 20-game home, non-conference win streak broken in 2021, but have won 10 in a row since that loss.

SEASON OPENERS: Washington is 93-37-6 all-time in season openers, good for a mark of .706. Since 1989, Washington has posted an 23-13 record in season openers - 16-2 at home, 7-9 on the road, 0-2 neutral site. In the 37-season span dating back to 1989, the Huskies have opened vs. a ranked team 13 times (5-8): vs. No. 15 Stanford in 1993 (W, 31-14), at No. 17 USC in 1994 (L, 24-17), at No. 20 Arizona State in 1996 (L, 45-42), vs. No. 19 BYU in 1997 (W, 42-20) at No. 8 Arizona State in 1998 (W, 42-38), vs. No. 11 Michigan in 2001 (W, 23-18), at No. 12 Michigan in 2002 (L, 31-29), at No. 2 Ohio State in 2003 (L, 28-9), at No. 21 Oregon in 2008 (L, 44-10), vs. No. 11 LSU in 2009 (L, 31-23), vs. No. 19 Boise State in 2013 (W, 38-6), at No. 23 Boise State in 2015 (L, 16-13), neutral vs. No. 9 Auburn in 2018 (L, 21-16).

CAPTAINS: The following players have been named captains for the 2026 season: Drew Azzopardi, Elinneus Davis, Landen Hatchett, Jacob Manu, Alex McLaughlin, John Mills and Demond Williams Jr. Hatchett and Williams were also captains in 2025.

TEAM NOTES

FUTURE SCHEDULES: In October, 2023, the Big Ten revealed 18 football teams' home and away, conference opponents for the next for the following five seasons (2024-28). Here are the UW's home and road, Big Ten games, for the coming two years:

HUSKIES vs. COUGARS HISTORY: The Washington-Washington State series dates back to 1900, when the teams played to a 5-5 tie in Seattle. Washington holds a commanding 77-34-6 edge in the 117-game series, including a 44-18 record in Apple Cup games (1963-present). The UW is 43-17-5 against WSU in games played in Seattle (all venues), Washington is 14-7 in games played in WSU's Martin Stadium as the first UW-WSU game wasn't played there until 1982. UW is 34-15-1 in away games in the series, including games played in both Spokane and Pullman. The Huskies have won 20 of the last 27 Apple Cups, and had a seven-game win streak broken in 2021. No Apple Cup was played in 2020 due to the pandemic. It was the first break in the series since World War II, when WSU didn't field a team for two seasons (1943-44).

In 2025 in Pullman, Washington pulled away, scoring 28 points in the final quarter, to win 59-24. UW QB Demond Williams Jr. went 16-for-19 for 288 yards and four touchdowns while rushing for another 88 yards and a TD. In 2024 at neutral Lumen Field, WSU edged the Huskies, 24-19, essentially ending the game with a goal-line stand late in the fourth. In 2023 at Husky Stadium, a 42-yard field goal from UW's Grady Gross with 0:00 on the clock gave the Huskies a 24-21 win. In 2022 in Pullman, UW out-scored WSU, 16-0, in the fourth quarter in a 51-33 win. Michael Penix Jr. passed for 485 yards and three TDs, while Wayne Taulapapa rushed for 126. In 2021 in Seattle, the Cougars broke a seven-game losing streak in the series, with a 40-13 win at Husky Stadium. In 2019 in Seattle, an efficient Washington offense led the way in a 31-13 Husky win. Jacob Eason was 15-for-22 for 241 yards and a TD. WSU passed for 308 yards and gained 27 first downs, but rushed for only 31 and scored just one touchdown. In 2018, Washington won, 28-15, in snowy Pullman, limiting the high-flying WSU offense to just 237 yards. Myles Gaskin's 80-yard TD run was the highlight. In 2017 in Seattle, the Huskies built a 34-0 lead en route to a 41-14 win as Gaskin rushed for 192 yards and four TDs on 25 carries. In 2016 in Pullman, Jake Browning completed 22-of-29 passes for 292 yards and three TDs and the UW led 28-3 after one quarter, in a 45-17 UW win. In 2015, Gaskin ran for 138 yards and two TDs, and the Huskies got interception returns for scores from Sidney Jones and Azeem Victor in a 45-10 win.

In 2014 in the Palouse, Dwayne Washington rushed for 135 yards, including TD runs of 60 and 51 yards, to lead the UW to a 31-13 win. The Huskies held the Cougars scoreless until five minutes into the fourth quarter. In 2013 in Seattle, the Huskies overcame a 10-3 halftime deficit in a 27-17 victory. Bishop Sankey led the Dawgs with 200 rushing yards on 34 carries while Keith Price completed 15-of-20 for 181 yards.

In 2012 in Pullman, WSU overcame an 18-point deficit in the fourth quarter to force overtime, then won 31-28 in OT. In 2011 at CenturyLink Field, the UW won, 38-21, behind 291 yards and three TD passes from Price. In 2010, Washington beat the Cougars, 35-28, in a tightly-contested game in Pullman. The winning score came on a 27-yard pass from Jake Locker to Jermaine Kearse with 44 seconds remaining. In 2009, the Huskies posted the first Apple Cup shutout

since 1964 with a 30-0 win over the Cougars at Husky Stadium, breaking a two-game losing streak in the series.

In 2008 in Pullman, the Cougars prevailed, 16-13, in double overtime. The year before at Husky Stadium, Alex Brink passed for 399 yards and hit Brandon Gibson with a pair of fourth-quarter TDs to lead WSU to a 42-35 win. The Huskies broke another two-game losing streak with a 35-32 win in Pullman in 2006. In 2005 at Martin Stadium, the Cougars beat the Dawgs, 28-25, behind a solid performance from Brink, who threw for two TDs and ran for another.

Before that, in 2003, UW pulled a third-straight upset (by AP ranking) in the series when an unranked Husky team notched a 27-19 win over No. 8 Washington State. In 2002 in Pullman, in a game that surely ranks as one of the most memorable ever in the series, Washington shocked the No. 3 Cougars with a triple-overtime, 29-26 win, despite trailing by 10 with only 4:30 to play. In 2001, when the two teams met at Husky Stadium, the 16th-ranked Huskies upset the No. 9 Cougars with a 26-14 win.

APPLE CUP FACTS: A few notes on the Boeing Apple Cup:

- This year's game will be the 118th meeting between UW and WSU. The Huskies lead 77-34-6. The series began in 1900, when the teams played to a 5-5 tie.
- The UW-WSU game wasn't called the "Apple Cup" until 1963. Prior to 1963, the two teams played for the Governor's Trophy (1931-62).
- Washington has played just 12 overtime games in its history (overtime didn't start until 1996 in college football). Four of those 12 games have come against WSU: 1996 (UW win), 2002 (UW win), 2008 (WSU win), 2012 (WSU win).
- The last seven times that the Cougars were ranked in the AP top 25 heading into an Apple Cup, the Huskies have won the game (2001-02-03-15-16-17-18).
- The Huskies have never lost more than two games in a row to WSU. On the other hand, UW has had 9 streaks of three or more wins in the series.
- From 1955 through 1981, the Apple Cup was played in Seattle (odd-numbered years) or Spokane (even-numbered years), rather than Seattle and Pullman.
