#17/19 WASHINGTON vs. UTAH STATE Huskies Host Pac-12 Foe For Second Straight Week

THE GAME: The Washington football team, 1-0 following a 24-10 win over Washington State in the Boeing Apple Cup last Sunday, takes on Utah State this Saturday at 12:30 p.m. PT, at Husky Stadium. The game will air live on Big Ten Network. The Aggies, in their first season in the reconfigured Pac-12 Conference, opened their slate with a 29-17 loss to Idaho State Saturday. The UW-Utah State game is the second of four straight home games in September for the Huskies, who will play host to Eastern Washington on Sept. 19 before welcoming Minnesota for the Big Ten opener on Sept. 26. New polls won't come out until Tuesday this week, but UW was ranked No. 17 in the preseason Associated Press Top 25, and No. 19 in the preseason USA Today coaches poll.

QUICK HITTERS: Washington will open the season with four straight home games for the first time since 2022 and just the second time since 1976 ... all four games will be played in September ... in '22, UW played host to Kent State, Michigan State, Portland State and Stanford to begin the year, followed by a September game on the road, Sept. 30 at UCLA ... in '76, the Huskies opened with Virginia, Colorado, Indiana and Minnesota, but seasons started later in those days, and that Minnesota game was played on Oct. 2 ... four straight home games to begin the season was relatively commonplace a century ago ... in the 2026 season opener, UW held Washington State to no successful third-down conversion attempts, in 11 tries (WSU did convert its lone fourth-down attempt) ... the last time a Husky opponent failed to convert a single third-down conversion in a game was in the Huskies' memorable, 16-13 win over USC in 2009 ... Washington started four first-year players in the WSU game, three on defense (edge Ramzak Fruean, defensive tackle Derek Colman-Brusa and nickelback Jeron Jones) and one on offense (left tackle Kodi Greene) ... UW QB Demond Williams surpassed 5,000 career yards of total offense vs. WSU and finished the game with 5,231 yards ... he needs just 17 more yards to reach the UW's career top-10 list ... Williams also currently has 954 career rushing yards, just 46 shy of 1,000. Only two Husky QBs have rushed for 1,000 career yards: Jake Locker (1,939) and Marques Tuiasosopo (1,495).

TELEVISION: The UW-Utah State game will air on Big Ten Network, with A.J. Kanell, Marcel Reece and Alyssa Charlston on the call. For more on how to watch online, go to <https://bigten.org/btn/watch-live/>.

RADIO: All Washington football games will air on the Washington Sports Network from Learfield, with Elise Woodward (play by play), former Husky tight end Cameron Cleeland (analyst), and Dave Mahler (sidelines) on the call. Radio coverage begins four hours before kickoff on the network's flagship station - Seattle's SportsRadio KJR 93.3 FM - with "Husky Gameday" live from The Zone for Husky home games. Statewide coverage on the 17-station Washington Sports Network begins two hours before kickoff. The entire broadcast is available worldwide on the Huskies Gameday mobile app and the Varsity app. The UW broadcast of this game will also air on Sirius/XM channel 83.

Third Season at UW

Washington coach Jedd Fisch, who enters his third season with the Huskies in 2026, has continued to burnish his reputation as an innovative football mind and highly effective leader during his time in Seattle.

Fisch, who had spent the previous three seasons (2021-23) restoring the football program at the University of Arizona and bringing it to its highest level in decades, accepted the position at UW on Jan. 14, 2024.

After arriving in Seattle, he wasted no time in making his mark on a Husky program that had experienced

an unprecedented amount of turnover, leaving Fisch and his staff to quickly re-assemble a team that returned just two starters on defense and none on offense. In his first season, 2024, Fisch's Huskies stretched their home winning streak to 20 games (longest-ever at Husky Stadium) and earned a berth in the Sun Bowl.

In the meantime, Fisch began building for the long term, recruiting some of the top-ranked recruiting classes in history, while also firmly embracing the new realities of college football in the era of the portal, revenue sharing and NIL. And, in spring of 2025, his team compiled a cumulative grade point average of 3.27, highest in program history.

In 2025, the program continued to make clear and noteworthy steps forward, finishing the season with a 9-4 overall record and a convincing win over Boise State in the L.A. Bowl. Fisch, who calls the offensive plays, oversaw a team that made huge improvements in key statistical categories on both sides of the ball. The Husky offense, for one example, went from 104 in the nation in scoring offense, to 17th. Washington's red-zone offense improved from No. 104 to No. 7, and from 101st to 10th in third-down conversions. Additionally, Washington's defense also made great strides, finishing the season in the top-15 in the FBS in both rushing and scoring defense, never allowing more than 26 points in any one game in 2025.

Fisch's efficacy as a leader also showed up in other ways as Washington broke its program record for team GPA once again, finishing the fall academic quarter with a cumulative 3.31 grade point average. A total of 43 Huskies earned a place on the Big Ten All-Academic Team, four Huskies were named Academic All-District, and Johan Coleman (who was also a finalist for both the William V. Campbell Trophy and the Paul Horung Award) earned first-team Academic All-America.

Additionally, Fisch led a staff that proved itself among the country's top recruiters, as the Huskies' class of freshmen ranked No. 13 in the nation, the highest-rated class in UW history.

Fisch, 50, came to Seattle with a long, dynamic history of coaching in college and the NFL.

Fisch's Wildcats went 10-3 in 2023, his last year in Tucson, beating Oklahoma in the Alamo Bowl and finishing No. 11 in the final AP Top 25 poll. The Wildcats outscored opponents, on

average, 36.1 to 21.1 over the season, relying on an offense that averaged 448 yards a game.

A total of 12 Wildcat players earned some level of All-Pac-12 honors. Arizona's stingy defense registered 34 sacks and led the conference in the red zone.

He garnered national acclaim in 2023 and was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, presented annually to the nation's top head coach.

Prior to Arizona, Fisch served as the quarterbacks coach with the New England Patriots under Head Coach Bill Belichick. He previously served as an offensive coordinator, quarterbacks coach or assistant with the Los Angeles Rams, UCLA, the University of Michigan, Jacksonville Jaguars, the University of Miami, Seattle Seahawks, the University of Minnesota, the Denver Broncos and the Baltimore Ravens, and as a quality control coach with the Houston Texans. He got his start at the collegiate level serving as a graduate assistant at the University of Florida under Steve Spurrier.

In addition to Belichick and Spurrier, other mentors include Pete Carroll, Brian Billick and Jim Harbaugh.

Fisch is a native of Livingston, N.J. and graduated from the University of Florida with a bachelor's degree in criminology in 1998. He also earned his master's degree, in sports management in Gainesville, in 2000.

Fisch and his wife, Amber, are parents to three daughters: Zaylee, Ashlee and Kendall.

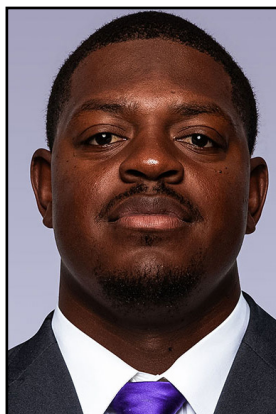

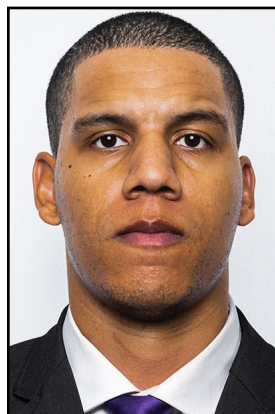

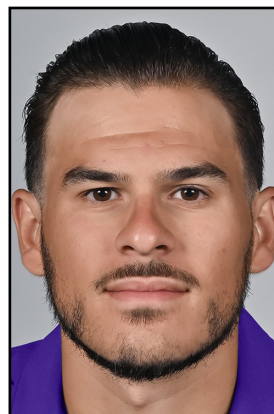

COACHING STAFF: Washington's coaching staff for the 2026 season returns nearly in tact from the previous year, with just one change and one addition. The current season's staff includes seven assistants who came to Seattle from Arizona, where Jedd Fisch was head coach from 2021-23. The two biggest changes were the addition of senior offensive assistant Matt Cavanaugh, a longtime NFL player and coach, and the promotion of JP Losman to quarterbacks coach. The former first-round draft pick out of Tulane was on the Husky staff as a quality control coach in 2025. On offense, the returners are running backs coach Scottie Graham, receivers coach Kevin Cummings, offensive line coach Michael Switzer and tight ends coach Jordan Paopao. Graham has added the role of assistant head coach while Cummings is now also the passing game coordinator. Washington's defensive staff is unchanged from the previous year, led by defensive coordinator Ryan Walters, the former Illinois defensive coordinator and Purdue head coach. The two defensive staff members who came to UW from Arizona are defensive running game coordinator and defensive line coach Jason Kaufusi and secondary coach John Richardson. They are joined by former USC and NFL safety Taylor Mays, a Seattle native who serves as safeties coach, and Brian Odom, a very experienced coach at Big 12, Big Ten and SEC programs, who is the linebackers coach. They both joined the staff prior to the 2025 season. Aaron Van Horn, who served as a quality control assistant in 2024, was promoted to outside linebackers coach ahead of 2025, while the Huskies also welcome back special teams coordinator Chris Petrilli.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS: Washington's football players have continued to perform at the highest academic levels, as the program continues to post impressive cumulative team GPAs. Last school year (2024-25), the UW football team achieved a team grade-point average of 3.31 in both the fall and winter quarters, and then wrapped up the year with a 3.27 in the spring quarter. In the spring quarter, a whopping 31 members of the UW roster earned a place on the Dean's List, and 49 of the players on the 2026 roster were on the Dean's List at least once in 2025-26 (most of them multiple times): Deji Ajose, Xe'ree Alexander, Buddah Al-Uqdah, Aiden Anderson, Dash Beierly, Elijah Brown, Jace Burton, Quaid Carr, D'Aryhian Clemons, Derek Colman-Brusa, Lowen Colman-Brusa, Charlie Crowell, Parker Cross,

IN THE CFP ERA: The era of the four-team College Football Playoff is gone, but that 10-season stretch (2014-2023) is instructive in terms of illustrating the teams that operated at the top level of the sport during that timespan, and Washington is one of those teams. Over that 10-year stretch, only 15 different programs earned a berth in the CFP semifinals, and only eight reached the tournament more than once. With two CPF berths in the four-team era (2016 and 2023), Washington is one of those eight. Only six teams made more than two appearances: Alabama (8), Clemson (6), Ohio State (5), Oklahoma (4), Georgia (3) and Michigan (3). For what it's worth, six more teams made their CFP debut in the 12-team bracket in 2024, and another five were first-time selections in 2025, but UW remains one of just 11 teams to have appeared in the CFP more than once, when counting the latest data.

BIG TIME: As has been well documented over the last couple of years, Washington officially joined the Big Ten Conference ahead of the 2024-25 school year, effective on Aug. 2, 2024. The Huskies were joined by fellow former Pac-12 programs Oregon, UCLA and USC in making the move to the BIG, which now includes 18 schools. Washington was one of four founding members of the Pacific Coast Conference (along with Cal, Oregon and Oregon State), and, along with Cal, was one of just two teams that were a part of that league (which changed names to the AAWU, Pac-8, Pac-10 and Pac-12) for the entirety of its full-fledged existence from 1915 to 2024.

HOME VS. NON-CONFERENCE: Washington has been very tough to beat in home, non-conference games over the last several decades. Going back to the 1981 season, the Huskies have posted an 82-14 record against nonconference foes at home. Those 14 losses have come to Montana (2021), Nebraska (2010), LSU (2009), BYU (2008), Oklahoma (2008), Ohio State (2007), Notre Dame (2005), Fresno State (2004), Nevada (2003), Air Force (1999), Nebraska (1997), Notre Dame (1995), Colorado (1989) and Oklahoma State (1985). Notable wins during that stretch include victories over No. 11 Michigan State in 2022, No. 19 Boise State in 2013, No. 22 Boise State in 2007, No. 11 Michigan in 2001, No. 4 Miami in 2000, and No. 12 Nebraska in 1992. Prior to the 2004 loss to Nevada, Washington hadn't lost a home game to a non-league opponent since falling to Air Force, 31-21, on September 18, 1999. The Huskies had won 10 such games before that Nevada loss. UW had a 20-game home, non-conference win streak broken in 2021, but have won 11 in a row since that loss.

TEAM NOTES

CAPTAINS: The following players have been named captains for the 2026 season: Drew Azzopardi, Elinneus Davis, Landen Hatchett, Jacob Manu, Alex McLaughlin, John Mills and Demond Williams Jr. Hatchett and Williams were also captains in 2025.

FUTURE SCHEDULES: In October, 2023, the Big Ten revealed 18 football teams' home and away, conference opponents for the next for the following five seasons (2024-28). Here are the UW's home and road, Big Ten games, for the coming two years:

2027: home – Maryland, Michigan State, Nebraska, Oregon, USC

HUSKIES vs. AGGIES HISTORY: Washington's history vs. Utah State on the gridiron is limited to just three games, but the history between the two goes back well over a century. Washington is 3-0 all-time vs. the Aggies, with wins in 1904, 1994 and 2015. Here's a look at those three contests:

October 22, 1904 – Washington 45, Utah Agricultural College 0

Washington took on the Aggies at Madison Park in Seattle on Oct. 22, 1904, led by stars Dode Brinker, Hunky Shaw and Fred McElmon, but without leader Enoch Bagshaw, the future UW coach, who was injured in a game vs. Oregon State the previous week. UW was coached by James Knight, the former Princeton and Michigan player, in his third year in Seattle, while the 2-1 Aggies were led by former Harvard player George Campbell. Shaw, who would appear in one game for the Pittsburgh Pirates of 1908, scored three touchdowns and McElmon added two more as Washington rolled to a 45-0 win. That margin was considered surprising as the Utah State squad had a significant size advantage over the Seattleites.

October 10, 1998 – Washington 53, Utah State 12

The Huskies and Aggies met for the first time in modern history in the middle of the 1998 season. Washington rolled to a 53-12 victory at Husky Stadium in a game that featured a number of unusual stats. The Huskies led 22-0 after one quarter, 39-0 at half and were up 53-0 before Utah State scored 12 points in the final quarter. The Huskies were only 1-for-10 on third down and leading rusher Jason Harris rushed for just 52 yards in the win, while QB Marques Tuiasosopo was only 11-for-21 for 194 yards. But, the Huskies sacked USU quarterbacks 13 times, the Aggies fumbled eight times (losing four) and also committed 19 penalties for 159 yards. Utah State also led the time of possession by nearly 13 minutes (36:24 to 23:36). Harris, Tuiasosopo and Willie Hurst scored two rushing TDs each and Joe Jarzynka kicked a pair of field goals.

September 19, 2015 – Washington 31, Utah State 17

The most recent of the three UW-USU games came in week three of the 2015 season, as freshman QB Jake Browning and the Huskies won, 31-17, in a game that was close until the Huskies scored a pair of TDs in the third quarter. An 81-yard passing TD from Browning to running back Dwayne Washington was the highlight of the first half, as UW went into halftime up 17-10. But UW pulled away in the third as Browning connected with Washington on a 33-yard score and hit tight end Drew Sample with a three-yard touchdown pass. Utah State narrowed the gap in the fourth on a 96-yard fumble return from Jon Rocquemore. Browning finished 23-for-31 for 368 yards and three TDs.

HUSKIES vs. THE NEW PAC-12: Washington has played all but one of the eight football programs that form the new Pac-12 Conference for the 2026 football season. Of course, Washington and Oregon State were both early members of the old Pacific Coast Conference, and Washington's rivalries with OSU and Washington State date back to 1897 and 1900, respectively. But the Huskies have also played games (multiple games, in all but one case) against all of the other Pac-12 teams besides Texas State. Washington is 5-2 vs. Boise State; 1-0 vs. Colorado State; 3-1 vs. Fresno State, 69-25-4 vs. Oregon State; 3-0 vs. San Diego State; 3-0 vs. Utah State; and 78-34-6 vs. Washington State. All totaled, the Huskies have posted an all-time record of 162-62-10 vs. current Pac-12 football teams. As a side note, and not included in the above total, UW was also 3-0 vs. new Pac-12 (non-football) member Gonzaga, but the Bulldogs haven't had varsity football since the start of World War II.

ALASKA AIRLINES FIELD AT HUSKY STADIUM: The Oregon game on Nov. 5, 2011, marked the final game in Husky Stadium prior to major renovations that were completed in summer, 2013. The Huskies re-opened their home field with a 38-6 win over then-No. 19 Boise State on Aug. 31, 2013. The 2026 season marks the 106th season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium stands at 423-187-21 (.687). Washington is 69-18 (.793) in home games since the stadium re-opened in 2013.
