

Series: K-State leads 21-11 (14-2 in Manhattan); Last: Dec. 5, 2021 in Wichita (KSU, 65-69) Jerome Tang: 1st Season at KSU (6-1), Same Overall // Isaac Brown: 3rd Season at WSU (35-21), Same Overall

- » Two in-state rivals collide Saturday night when the Wichita State Shockers take on the Kansas State Wildcats at 8 p.m. CT on ESPNU.
- » Last year's meeting at INTRUST Bank Arena a 65-59 Wildcat victory – was the first in 18 years between the schools and tipped off a four-year series that will continue next year at Kansas City's T-Mobile Center and in 2024-25 at Charles Koch Arena.
- » An untimely injury to point guard Craig Porter Jr. derailed the Shockers, who led by seven points with under 15 minutes to play but went the next 7:26 without scoring. Markquis Nowell supplied 16 points for K-State, including a deep three-pointer that broke a 54-all tie with 1:35 to play.
- » WSU makes its first appearance at Bramlage Coliseum since Dec. 10, 2003. Shocker teams are 2-14 all-time against the Wildcats in Manhattan but had won two of their last four visits prior to the series' long hiatus.
- » WSU has won its last eight non-conference true road games going back to March 2019. Six have come against "Power-5" opponents. A victory Saturday would tie a 68-year-old school record. From Dec. 1953 to Jan. 1955 the Shockers, led by All-American Cleo Littleton, won

Isaiah Poor Bear-Chandler F 6-9 Sr*-3L Omaha, Neb.

- » WSU fell in overtime to Missouri on Tuesday, 88-84. Jaykwon Walton (14 points, 10 rebounds) and Porter (14 points, 3 blocks) led the way offensively. WSU shot 54.1% from the field and made a season-high 12 three-pointers but went just 6-of-14 at the free throw line and committed 20 turnovers.
- Porter is one of just two Shockers who saw minutes last season. He leads the team in points (13.9), rebounds (7.1), assists (4.0), blocks (2.3) and steals (1.7) and ranks among the nation's top-25 in blocks.
- » Third-year head coach Isaac Brown rebuilt the roster via the transfer portal. 11 of the 13 WSU players who have seen action this year are newcomers, led by Walton (13.3 ppg, 6.1 rpg).
- WSU is holding opponents to 36.9% from the field (24th nationally) and 25.8% from deep (25th).
- Offensively, the new-look Shockers are a work in progress. They're averaging 68.1 points on 43.8% accuracy but have topped 80 in each of the last two games and shot better than 50% in each of their last four halves.
- Southeastern Louisiana grad transfer Gus Okafor has had a hand in that surge. Over the past two games he's averaged 19.0 points and 8.0 rebounds off the bench

- » The Shockers have a full week off before meeting Longwood in the first of four straight games in Wichita.
- » The Lancers (26-7 last year) have four starters back from a team that steamrolled to the Big South regular season and tournament titles and reached the NCAA tournament for the first time in 18 seasons at the Division I level.
- » WSU senior transfer Gus Okafor began his career at Longwood before stops at Miami Dade College and Southeastern Louisiana.
- » Longwood is one of four first-time Shocker opponents on this year's schedule, along with Richmond (W, 56-53), Grand Canyon (W, 55-43) and Mississippi Valley State.

AND THEN: MISSISSIPPI VALLEY ST.

- » WSU has faced 18 of the 23 Division I HBCU's at some point in its history, and MVSU will make 19. Only Alabama State, Bethune Cookman, Morgan State and North Carolina A&T remain.
- » George Ivory the school's all-time assist leader – begins his first full season as head coach at his alma mater.
- » MVSU has a trailblazer in Trasity Totten a former Arkansas Pine-Bluff and Grambling standout who becomes the SWAC's first female assistant men's basketball coach.
- » Delta Devil opponents averaged 83.0 points last season (second-most nationally).

THE SHOCKS, IN SHORT

- » With every challenge comes opportunity.
- » Wichita State must replace over 80 percent of its points and minutes after on off-season that saw leading scorer **Tyson Etienne** leave early for the pros and seven other lettermen hit the transfer portal.
- » However, a near total roster reset also offers a fresh start following a disappointing season that saw the Shockers (15-13, 6-9) slip to seventh in the American Athletic Conference standings and miss out on the postseason for the first time since 2008.
- » Head coach Isaac Brown has the luxury of a fifth-year senior point guard in Craig Porter Jr. and promising sophomore big man Kenny Pohto to ease the transition.
- » They're the only returning players from last year's active roster, although 6-foot-7 guard Jalen Ricks and 6-9 forward Isaac Abidde each have a redshirt year in the system, and 6-9 senior center Isaiah Poor Bear-Chandler is back after a season at Omaha.
- » Brown offset the loss of eight lettermen with the addition of eight scholarship transfers (seven of whom have played at the Division I level). The Shockers don't have a single true freshman on scholarship.
- » Porter may be the most well-rounded player in college hoops with the ability to score and distribute. Defensively, he's a ballhawk who can rebound and even protect the rim. His backup is 6-2 sophomore point guard **Shammah Scott**, who was part of Northwest Florida State's NJCAA national championship team last spring.
- » A pair of sophomore transfers have played most of the minutes at shooting guard with the explosive **Jaron Pierre Jr.** (Southern Miss) complimented by cerebral shooter **Xavier Bell** (Drexel).
- » 6-7 junior Jaykwon Walton has been an impact addition on wing. The former top-100 recruit started his career at Georgia and has thrived in his first opportunity for extended playing time.
- » Senior transfers James Rojas (Alabama) and Gus Okafor (1st Team All-Southland at Southeastern La.) have split time at the 4.
- » At the 5, Pohto is the ideal pick-and-pop big with his ability to screen and knock down perimeter shots. The 24-year-old Poor Bear-Chandler is an experienced backup. Sophomore 7-footer Quincy Ballard (Florida State) has also been part of the center rotation, and Rojas can also play the 5 in smaller lineups.
- » Another potential impact guard, Colby Rogers, ranked among the nation's top-10 in three-point percentage last year at Siena but is sitting out under NCAA transfer rules. He has two seasons of eligibility remaining.

- » 1955 Wichita hosted Utah in the first varsity basketball game played inside the brand-new WU Fieldhouse (now Charles Koch Arena). More than 9,000 fans turned out to see it. Leo Carney scored the first Shocker basket in the new building.
- » 1996 -- Wichita State defeated Kansas State in Manhattan for the first time ever, 74-59. Shocker teams were 0-12 prior to that. Freshman guard Jason Perez scored 20 points off the bench on 4-of-4 three-point shooting.

- » Noah Carter scored 12 of his game-high 20 points in the final 5:00 of the second half plus OT to help Mizzou storm back from a 10-point deficit and continue its unbeaten start under new coach Dennis Gates.
- » Craig Porter Jr. and Jaykwon Walton had 14 points apiece for WSU, which shot 54.1% with 12 three-pointers but also committed a season-high 20 turnovers and missed 8-of-14 free throw attempts.
- » MU entered the day as the national leader in steals (13.9) and turnover margin (+10) and improved on those numbers with 16 thefts and a +12 differential.
- » MU forced 13 first-half turnovers and led 43-36 at the intermission but managed just one more in the first 14 minutes of the second half.
- » WSU held the Tigers without a point for more than 6:00 during a 16-0 run to a flip a nine-point deficit into a seven-point advantage.
- » MU made 6-of-17 threes in the first half but just 1-of-16 the rest of the night.
- » WSU led 56-46 at the 5:12-mark, but Mizzou scored 19 points over the next five minutes. **D'Moi Hodge** tied it with a free throw at 9.7 seconds, and Porter missed a would-be-winner on the opposite end.
- » WSU also missed three free throws in final 62 seconds of regulation and three more to begin the extra period.
- » MU scored the first six overtime points to pull away.

TRENDIN

- » Craig Porter Jr. has 14 blocks over his last four games. That's the most by a Shocker in a four-game stretch since the 2012-13 season when 7-footer Ehimen Orukpe swatted 18 against UNI (2), Drake (2), Bradley (5) and Southern Illinois (9).
- » The 6-foot-2 Porter begins the week as the American Athletic Conference leader in total blocks (16) and blocks-per-game (2.29). Nationally, there are 20 players averaging more, but they're all 6-foot-7 or taller.
- » Porter is one of just two players nationally with both a five-steal and five-block game under his belt (Kobe Clark, Southeast Missouri State).
- » Porter has scored at least nine points in all seven games.
- » Saturday against Tarleton, Gus Okafor became the fifth different Shocker to take a turn as leading scorer (Porter, Jaykwon Walton, Xavier Bell, Kenny Pohto).
- » Okafor is the third Shocker to top 20 points this year, joining Walton (twice) and Porter.
- » Walton has posted double-doubles in two of the last three games.
- » Shammah Scott saw little court time in the first five games (roughly 8.0 mpg) while backing up Porter at the point, but head coach Isaac Brown has been experimenting with ways to get both of his point guards on the floor at the same time. Scott's minutes have jumped to 18.5 over the last two games. Last Saturday against Tarleton he handed out three assists with just one turnover in 18 minutes against Tarleton and had his best game as a Shocker against Mizzou when he finished with nine points on 4-of-5 shooting and handed out five assists over 21 minutes.
- » Xavier Bell is showing signs of shaking out of an shooting slump. He made just 1-of-15 threes over the first six games but bagged 2-of-5 against Mizzou. Bell was a 37.5% three-point shooter in his two seasons at Drexel.
- » WSU has topped 50% from the field in back-to-back games to raise its season percentage from .399 to .438.
- » WSU's 54% shooting day against Tarleton snapped a string of 47-straight games in which the team had failed to make more than half of its field goal attempts. The last came in a Jan. 2, 2021 win at Ole Miss when the Shockers made 52% from the field.
- » WSU lost to Mizzou on Tuesday despite shooting a Brown Era-best .541 from the field. It marked the first time the Shockers have lost while hitting at least half of their shots since Jan. 17, 2018 (83-78 to SMU), snapping a 12-game winning streak.
- » WSU lost for the first time when scoring 80+ points since Feb. 23, 2019 against Memphis (85-88), ending a 21-game streak.
- » The Shockers lost for only the second time under Isaac Brown when scoring 70+ points in regulation (23-2) and for only the fifth time when outshooting their opponent from the field (23-5).
- » WSU topped 20 turnovers in a game for the first time since a double-overtime contest at UConn on Jan. 12, 2020 (21).
- » 88 points tied the Brown Era high for a WSU opponent. The Shockers defeated UCF 93-88 in overtime on Jan. 30, 2021.
- » Mizzou's 16 steals were the most by a Shocker opponent since Feb. 28, 1994 (16 at Drake).

DOING IT WITH DEFENSE:

- » WSU has frustrated foes into some lengthy scoring funks. Over the first seven games, opponents have had 11 different scoring droughts of at least four minutes. Seven of them have resulted in double-digit Shocker runs.
- » That includes scoreless stretches of 6:08 and 9:10 by GCU and 7:29 against San Francisco. The Shockers held Mizzou scoreless for 6:13 on their way to a 16-0 run.
- » Tarleton is the only WSU opponent to avoid a spell of more than 4:00.

» WSU has twice held opponents to less than 20 points in a half this year. Nov. 17 at Richmond, the Shockers led 28-19 at halftime. They held Grand Canyon to 19 second-half points in their Nov. 21 win in Kansas City.

IN WITH THE OLD

- » WSU's front court got a lift on Nov. 16 when Isaiah Poor Bear-Chandler received a 4-4-4 transfer waiver from the NCAA granting him immediate eligibility.
- » The 6-9 senior finished with four points and two rebounds in eight minutes in his Nov. 17 debut at Richmond
- » Poor Bear-Chandler played his first three seasons for the Shockers and was back-up center on the 2021 American Athletic Conference championship team. He transferred to Omaha for the 2021-22 season to be closer to home but returned to WSU this summer to continue working toward his undergraduate degree. In June, he approached head coach **Isaac Brown** about the possibility of walking on. Brown jumped at the opportunity to add another experienced big — especially one with knowledge of his system.
- » Poor Bear-Chandler's 77 games of Division I experience are second-most on the team behind **Gus Okafor** (87).
- » Poor Bear-Chandler celebrated his 24th birthday on Sunday, Nov. 20. He's the oldest Shocker on the roster by nearly six months. James Rojas turns 24 in May.

CHEMISTRY EXPERIMENT:

- » The challenge of bringing in 14 newcomers extends beyond the playbook. Isaac Brown spent the summer working to create chemistry and culture within his new roster.
- » The team met weekly this summer for a meal and group discussion, diving into five H's heritage, hero, highlight, heartbreak and hope.
- » Bonding activities ranged from the familiar (pickleball, bowling and dinners) to the peculiar, such as a workout at a local boxing gym or a trip to McConnell Air Force Base to participate in a battlefield training exercise.

THE SERIES WITH K-STATE

- » K-State leads the all-time series, 21-11. The Shockers are 9-7 against the Wildcats in Wichita but just 2-14 in Manhattan. This will be the Shockers' first visit in 19 years (Dec. 10, 2003).
- » Last year's matchup at INTRUST Bank Arena in Wichita ended an 18-year series hiatus. The schools are scheduled to meet again next season at Kansas City's T-Mobile Center and the following year at Koch Arena.
- » The most notable series meeting came in the 1964

- Midwest Regional Final, played inside the Roundhouse. Dave Stallworth (37 points, 16 rebounds) outdueled fellow All-American Willie Murrell (28 pts, 10 reb), but the Wildcats escaped Wichita with a 94-86 win.
- » A year later, WSU again advanced to the regional final round, this time defeating Oklahoma State to punch its first Final Four ticket. That game was played at K-State's Ahearn Fieldhouse
- For years it was WSU's lone bright spot in Manhattan. The Shockers lost its first 12 road games at K-State before finally breaking through in 1996 and again in 2001. A win on Saturday would be their third in five trips.

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

- » KSU is under new management with former Baylor assistant Jerome Tang taking over following the retirement of Bruce Weber.
- » Like WSU, K-State has a new-look roster with 13 newcomers and just two returning lettermen.
- » K-State was picked last out of 10 teams in the Big 12 preseason poll but is out to a 6-1 start. The Wildcats own a road win at California and notched three neutral court victories last week in the Caymon Islands over Rhode Island, Nevada and LSU. Their lone loss came

- Wednesday night at Butler.
- » K-State's top returner is Markquis Nowell (15.0 ppg, 1.8 spg), a 5-8 senior who started his career at Little Rock. He ranks third nationally in assists-per-game (7.9) and sports a 3.24 assist-to-turnover ratio (37th).
- » Former Florida Gator Keyontae Johnson, a 6-6 forward, is the team's leading scorer (18.0) and rebounder (6.9). He was 9-for-9 from the field in Wednesday's game at Butler and is shooting 60% for the year.
- The Wildcats are shooting free throws at an impressive .791 clip and the defense has forced an average of 18.3 turnovers-per-game.

MATCHUP MASHUP:

- » New WSU Athletic Director **Kevin Saal** is a Manhattan native and former K-State staffer (2000-05). He spent a year as aadministrative assistant for the K-State men's and women's golf and rowing programs before transitioning into an event management role.
- WSU Director of Player Development, **Nick Jones** was as a KSU student manager for five seasons (2009-14).
- K-State Executive Associate A.D. Casey Scott began his career in 1985 as WSU's Sports Information Director before being demoted into a senior administrator role.

- » Morris Udeze scored a season-high 19 points on 7-of-8 shooting, but WSU otherwise struggled to put the ball in the basket in its first meeting with KSU since 2003.
- » Markquis Nowell scored 16 points for K-State, including a deep three that broke a 54-all tie with 1:35 to go.
- » WSU saw a 12-game Wichita winning streak snapped and lost downtown for the first time since 2017.
- » Tyson Etienne added 11 points but made just 4-of-20 from the field, including 1-of-11 from three.
- » WSU shot 35.2% to KSU's 33.9. The Shockers had won 36-straight when out-shooting their opponent, last losing Jan. 19, 2019 to Cincinnati.
- » K-State committed just seven turnovers to WSU's 14. Shocker opponents had averaged 17.7 coming in.
- » The Wildcats limited the Shockers to just three second-chance points on six offensive rebounds.
- » WSU enjoyed a fast start, building leads of 11-2 and 17-5 at the 12:15 mark of the first half. KSU responded with a 12-0 run and took a 32-30 lead into halftime.
- » WSU jumped back out to a seven-point lead near the 14:00-mark but went scoreless over the next 7:00.
- » The lead changed hands four more times. Ricky Council IV made a short pull-up jumper for a 51-50 Shocker lead with just under 4:00 showing and tied the game at 54 on a three-pointer with 2:02 to go. Nowell responded with a deep three then added a pair of free throws on the next trip. Mark Smith iced it with a steal and transition dunk.

SHOCKER HISTORY LESSON

- » Five Shockers have jersey numbers in the rafters: #13 Cleo Littleton ('51-55), #42 Dave Stallworth ('61-65), #54 Cliff Levingston ('79-82), #35 Antoine Carr ('79-83) and #44 Xavier McDaniel ('81-85).
- » Teammates on WSU's first NCAA Tournament team in 1964, Stallworth and Nate Bowman teamed up again to help the 1970 New York Knicks to an NBA title.
- » McDaniel, Levingston and Carr all played more than a decade in the NBA. Levingston was a member of the Chicago Bulls' first two NBA Championship teams while playing alongside Michael Jordan. Carr helped the Utah Jazz to a pair of runner-up finishes in 1997 and 1998.
- » A member of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, Ralph Miller won 220 games in 13 years on the Shocker bench (1951-64) and led the Shockers to their first NCAA Tournament in 1964. When Miller retired from Oregon State in 1989, at the close of a 38-year career, he was the eighth-winningest coach in NCAA history (674-370). In 1997, Miller was honored with the NABC Golden Anniversary Award, given to NABC members who have devoted at least 50 years of outstanding service to the game of basketball.

HONORING "DAVE THE RAVE" STALLWORTH

- » On Dec. 1, 2018, WSU formally dedicated a life-size, bronze statue of All-American **Dave Stallworth** near the southwest doors of Charles Koch Arena. Former teammates helped raise \$200,000 toward the project.
- » Stallworth -- a three-time All-American who led the Shockers to their first NCAA Tournament in 1964 -passed away in March, 2017.

WHAT'S A WUSHOCK?

» Legend has it, the name "Shockers" first appeared in 1904 on a poster advertising a football game between Wichita State (then known as Fairmount College -and the Chilocco Indiana. The team's manager chose the name because many of the players earned money during the off-season harvesting (or "shocking") wheat in the surrounding fields. When it came time to bring the name to life, student's created WuShock, a big, band, muscle-bound bundle of wheat whose name id derived from a period in time when the school was simply Wichita University or "WU".

OF MICS AND MEN

- » Play-by-play voice **Mike Kennedy** is in his 43rd season with the team. The 74-year-old began calling Shocker hoops full time during the 1980-81 Elite Eight season. He's missed just two games during that span (both in January, 2021 while quarantining.
- » Kennedy and his home broadcast partner **Dave Dahl**, are now in their 42nd year together and are Division I college basketball's longest-tenured duo. Dahl, a three-year varsity letterman at WSU from 1968-71, missed the 2011-12 season during a successful campaign for district court judge, but the tandem has otherwise been in place since 1980-81.

PROLIFIC SHOCKERS

- » 23 former Shocker alumni are active in the professional ranks, including two in the NBA.
- » Fred VanVleet is in his seventh season with the Toronto Raptors and the third of a four-year, \$85 million deal. It's the largest contract in NBA history for a player who went undrafted out of college. VanVleet helped lead the Raptors to the 2019 NBA title.
- » In October, 2022 fifth-year guard Landry Shamet signed a lucrative contract extension of his own with the Phoenix Suns that will pay him \$43 million over four years. The sharp-shooter and former first round pick was traded to Phoenix prior to the 2021-22 season. Before that he played for the 76'ers, Clippers and Nets.
- » 2020 graduate Jaime Echenique became the NBA's first Colombian-born player on Dec. 29, 2021 when he made his debut with the Washington Wizards. Echenique has otherwise been a force with the club's G-League affiliate, the Capital City Go-Go.
- » After a strong showing in the Vegas Summer League, rookie guard **Tyson Etienne** made the Atlanta Hawks' 2022 preseason roster and opens the season with the G-League's College Park Skyhawks.
- » Since 2013, seven different Shockers have appeared in an NBA regular season game. In addition to Echenique, VanVleet and Shamet, **Ron Baker** played parts of three seasons with the Knicks and Wizards (2016-19) before retiring due to mounting injuries. **Toure' Murry** saw time with the Knicks, Jazz and Wizards from 2013-15, **Cleanthony Early** was drafted by the Knicks and played for two years in New York (2014-16) and Mekel did tours with the Mavericks and Pelicans (2013-15).

AMERICAN OUTLOOK

- » Wichita State was picked eighth out of 11 teams in American Athletic Conference preseason poll.
- » WSU teams have met or exceeded preseason expectations in four of the five seasons since joining the league, most notably in 2020-21 when a similarly overhauled roster was picked seventh in the preseason but went on to win the regular season title.
- » Led by AAC preseason player of the year, Marcus Sasser (also an AP preseason first team All-American), Houston is a unanimous favorite to defend its 2022 title, earning 10 first-place votes (coaches could not select their own team or players). Freshman forward Jarace Walker was a unanimous pick for rookie of the year.
- » Memphis has a pair of first-teamers in DeAndre Williams and SMU transfer **Kendric Davis**, the league's reigning player of the year. The Tigers (87 poll points) edged out Cincinnati (82) for the runner-up spot.
- » Fourth-place Tulane (74) landed a league-best three players on the preseason all-conference squad, including first-teamer Jalen Cook.
- » Damian Dunn grabbed the final first-team spot for Temple, which checked in fifth with 66 points.

One of college basketball's best feel-good stories, **Isaac Brown** begins ninth season at Wichita State and his third as head coach.

Thrust into an interim role just eight days before the start of the 2020-21 college basketball season, Brown earned the head coaching job on a permanent basis after leading a Shocker team picked seventh in the preseason to its first American Athletic Conference regular season title, as well as an at-large berth to the NCAA tournament. He was a unanimous choice for the league's coach of the year award.

Known around the game as a player's coach and all-around people person, Brown has also proved himself resourceful in guiding the Shockers to a 31-19 record in his first two go-arounds.

Under Brown's watch, several Shockers have made impressive strides in their

development. **Tyson Etienne** went from a reserve guard to a two-time all-conference selection, earning American co-Player of the Year honors in 2021. He signed a contract with the Atlanta Hawks in the summer of 2022 and earned a spot on the team's preseason roster.

Guards **Dexter Dennis** and **Ricky Council IV** earned major awards in 2022 as The American's Defensive Player and Sixth Man of the Year, respectively.

The 2021-22 Shockers battled untimely injuries and illness during a 15-13 season, highlighted by a pair of non-conference road wins over Missouri and Oklahoma State. Two of the team's most-memorable performances came in overtime losses to eventual No. 1 seed Arizona and Elite Eight participant Houston.

Brown's 2020-21 team opened the year 1-2 while playing and practicing shorthanded due to the COVID-19 protocol, but then quickly took off, winning 14 of their next 16 games, including an upset of sixth-ranked and Final Four-bound Houston on Feb. 18. Shortly after, Brown's interim tag was replaced with a five-year contract.

On Mar. 1, 2021, Brown was formally introduced as the 26th full-time head coach in Shocker history and the state of Kansas' first black head men's basketball coach.

WSU went on to finish 16-6 (11-2 AAC). With its berth in the First Four, Brown became the first rookie head coach to lead a team to the Big Dance since Wisconsin's Greg Gard in 2016.

Brown was tabbed NABC District Coach of the Year and was a finalist for a handful of national honors, including the Jim Phelan Award (national coach of the year), Joe B. Hall Award (top first-year head coach) and the Ben Jobe Award (top minority coach).

Shocker guards thrived in Brown's system with Etienne earning the conference's co-player of the year honor. In addition, UConn graduate transfer **Alterique Gilbert** wrote a storybook ending to an injury-plagued career. The former McDonald's All-American led the team in assists and earned third team all-conference honors.

Brown, 53, is in his ninth season overall at WSU -- the first six as an assistant under **Gregg Marshall** -- and his 21st at the Division I level, having also served as an assistant at Louisiana Tech (2011-14), Arkansas State (2010-11), Arkansas (2007-10) and South Alabama (2002-07).



Combined Brown helped lead those five programs to 11

20-win seasons in 18 years with eight conference regular season titles, two conference tournament championships and 10 postseason appearances. Along the way he coached 58 all-conference selections and six NBA players.

The Shockers' 2021 American Athletic Conference title gives Brown championship rings from five different leagues (AAC, WAC, C-USA, MVC, Sun Belt).

WSU won over three-quarters of its games during Brown's time as a Shocker assistant (2014-20), going 157-50 (.758), highlighted by four-straight NCAA tournament bids (2014-18) and a run to the 2019 NIT semifinals.

In addition to Marshall, Brown has learned from a number of college basketball's top minds, including current Florida head coach **Mike White** at Louisiana Tech (2011-14). At Arkansas State he worked with a pair of Final Four coaches in head coach **John Brady** (LSU, 2006) and assistant coach Richard Williams (Mississippi State, 1996). Brown also spent eight years under **John Pelphrey** at South Alabama (2007-10).

The Pascagoula, Miss. native is a member of the Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College Hall of Fame and went on to play at Texas A&M and Northeast Louisiana (now Louisiana-Monroe). He earned his bachelor's in health and physical education from ULM in 1995.





- » Craig Porter Jr. scored 16 of his career-high 22 points in the first half, and new-look Wichita State opened its new season with a 79-55 win over Central Arkansas.
- 10 of the 12 players that checked in for WSU (1-0) did so for the first time in a Shocker uniform, breaking the school record for most debuts. The old mark of nine was set during the 1979 and 2018 openers.
- Porter one of just two holdovers from last year's active roster - looked like an entirely different player, as well, hunting shots and more-often-than-not sinking them. He finished 9-of-11 from the field and added four assists and three steals.
- The Shockers scored the game's first 11 points and mounted another 20-2 run just before halftime to pull away. They led by as many as 28 down the stretch.
- Quincy Ballard scored 10 of the Shockers' 38 bench points on 4-of-5 shooting and blocked a pair of shots.
- Camren Hunter and Johannes Kirisipuu scored 13-each for UCA, which made just 4-of-30 threes and finished the night at 30.1% from the field.
- WSU shot 43.8%, sinking 6-of-21 threes. The Shockers outscored the visitors 17-7 at the foul line and won the turnover (10-14) and rebounding battles (47-42).
- WSU has won 28 of the last 30 openers, including all three under Isaac Brown.

- Craig Porter Jr. and Xavier Bell scored 14 points each and Jaykwon Walton added 10 for WSU, which held GCU to 27% from the field – lowest by a Division I Shocker opponent in nearly six years.
- Noah Baumann supplied 10 points for GCU, which trailed 36-32 at the 14:55-mark but missed 14-consecutive shots during a nine-minute scoring drought.

- » Gus Okafor busted loose for 27 points to help WSU put an end to a dubious shooting streak.
- » Okafor, a graduate transfer from Southeastern Louisiana, averaged less than five points in his first five games as a Shocker but made 9-of-11 shots against Tarleton and grabbed eight rebounds.
- The Shockers likewise found the cure for their offensive ailments, sinking 24-of-50 (.540) field goal attempts to break the 50% barrier for the first time in 48 games.
- Kenny Pohto added 13 points and nine rebounds to go with Craig Porter's 11 points and five blocks.
- Jakorie Smith put up 19 points for Tarleton, which was coming off a win over Boston College.
