Series: WSU leads 6-0 (3-0 in Wichita); Last: Mar. 5, 2022 in Wichita (WSU, 70-62)

Michael Schwartz: 1st Season at ECU (9-5), Same Overall // Isaac Brown: 3rd Season at WSU (38-25), Same Overall

- » A New Year's Eve date with East Carolina tips off the home portion of WSU's American schedule.
- » WSU defeated ECU 70-62 in the 2022 regular season finale at Charles Koch Arena behind 15 points and 10 rebounds from **Craig Porter Jr.** That's the only time the teams have met in the past two seasons, thanks to three different rounds of COVID-19 cancellations. The Shockers lead the all-time series, 6-0.
- » WSU is 32-11 in AAC home games (3-0 vs. ECU).
- » Both sides are coming off losses in their respective AAC openers. Playing without Porter (ankle) WSU fell 52-45 at UCF. **Melvin Flanagan** (11 points) became the first Shocker walk-on in the NCAA's 13-scholarship era (1993-94 to present) to earn high-scoring honors.
- » ECU fell at home to Temple, 59-57, despite **Brandon Johnson's** league-best seventh double-double (11 points, 18 rebounds). The sophomore is also the conference's top rebounder (9.8 rpg).
- » Picked last in the AAC preseason poll, the Pirates are out to a 9-5 start under new coach **Michael Schwartz**.
- » ECU averages over 15 points at the foul line on a league-best 23.3 attempts (26th nationally). However, WSU is the conference's least-penalized team, averaging

league-lows for fouls (14.4) as well as opponent free throws (9.9) and attempts (13.9).

- » Overall, WSU has been one of the nation's stingiest defensive units, ranking 36th in efficiency, per KenPom.
- » The Shockers are one of just 20 teams that are surrendering less than 60-points-per-game (59.7).
- » WSU also ranks eighth nationally in field goal percentage defense (.363). The Shockers have held all six December opponents under 40% from the field (.356 collectively). That streak is tied for the fifth-longest by a WSU team in the shot clock era (1985-86 to present).
- » One of the nation's most-versatile performers, Porter is WSU's leading scorer (12.8 ppg) and ranks among the AAC leaders in blocks (3rd, 1.75), assists (5th, 3.9), steals (7th, 1.67), field goal % (4th, .512), rebounds (13th, 6.1).
- » One of 10 transfers on the WSU roster, junior wing **Jaykwon Walton** averages 11.9 points and a team-best 6.7 rebounds (AAC #10). He's posted three double-doubles.
- » **Isaac Brown** has used seven different starting lineup combos in the last nine games. Wednesday at UCF, **Shammah Scott** become the ninth different Shocker to take a turn in the starting five when he replaced the injured Porter.

- This is the final American Athletic Conference regular season game between the schools. WSU will not travel to Cincinnati this year and the Bearcats are set to depart this summer for the Big 12.
- Cincinnati -- picked third in the preseason -- is 9-4 under second-year head coach Wes Miller.
- The Bearcats have won nine of the 11 AAC era matchups against the Shockers and swept last year's home-and-home.

AND THEN: @ SOUTH FLORIDA

Sunday, Jan. 8 | Noon CT (1 p.m. ET) | ESPN+
Tampa Fla. | Yuengling Center

- USF went 7-6 in non-conference play but finished strong with wins in five straight and seven of its last eight.
- The Bulls were picked ninth out of 11 teams in the AAC preseason poll -- one notch behind WSU.
- The Shockers have won the last six meetings and lead the all-time series 7-1.
- WSU won the lone 2022 matchup (Feb. 12, 2022 in Wichita), 73-69, with help from Craig Porter Jr.'s 11 points, seven rebounds and six assists.
- This will be the Shockers first visit to Tampa since a wild, 82-77 overtime win on Dec. 22, 2020. They're 2-1 at the Yuenling Center.

THE SHOCKS, IN SHORT

- With every challenge comes opportunity.
- Wichita State must replace over 80 percent of its points and minutes after on off-season that saw leading scorer **Tyson Etienne** leave early for the pros and seven other lettermen hit the transfer portal.
- However, a near total roster reset also offers a fresh start following a disappointing season that saw the Shockers (15-13, 6-9) slip to seventh in the American Athletic Conference standings and miss out on the postseason for the first time since 2008.
- Head coach **Isaac Brown** has the luxury of a fifth-year senior point guard in **Craig Porter Jr.** and promising sophomore big man **Kenny Pohto** to ease the transition.
- They're the only returning players from last year's active roster, although 6-foot-7 guard **Jalen Ricks** and 6-9 forward **Isaac Abidde** each have a redshirt year in the system, and 6-9 senior center **Isaiah Poor Bear-Chandler** is back after a season at Omaha.
- Brown offset the loss of eight lettermen with the addition of eight scholarship transfers (seven of whom have played at the Division I level). The Shockers don't have a single true freshman on scholarship.
- Porter may be the most well-rounded player in college hoops with the ability to score and distribute. Defensively, he's a ballhawk who can rebound and even protect the rim. His backup is 6-2 sophomore point guard **Shammah Scott**, who was part of Northwest Florida State's NJCAA national championship team last spring.
- A pair of sophomore transfers have played most of the minutes at shooting guard with the explosive **Jaron Pierre Jr.** (Southern Miss) complimented by cerebral shooter **Xavier Bell** (Drexel).
- 6-7 junior **Jaykwon Walton** has been an impact addition on wing. The former top-100 recruit started his career at Georgia and has thrived in his first opportunity for extended playing time.
- Senior transfers **James Rojas** (Alabama) and **Gus Okafor** (1st Team All-Southland at Southeastern La.) have split time at the 4.
- At the 5, Pohto is the ideal pick-and-pop big with his ability to screen and knock down perimeter shots. The 24-year-old Poor Bear-Chandler is an experienced backup. Sophomore 7-footer **Quincy Ballard** (Florida State) has also been part of the center rotation, and Rojas can also play the 5 in smaller lineups.
- Another impact guard, **Colby Rogers**, ranked among the nation's top-10 in 3-point percentage last year at Siena but is sitting out under NCAA transfer rules.

ON THIS DATE: DEC. 31

- WSU is 8-6 all-time on New Year's Eve. The last was a 67-47 home win over Drake in 2015.
- 2014 -- WSU overcame travel issues and a scrappy Drake team for a 66-58 win in its Missouri Valley Conference opener. The team departed for Des Moines on the eve of the game via charter plane but quickly returned to Wichita's Eisenhower Airport due to a malfunctioning landing gear sensor. The Shockers boarded a new plane on the morning of the game and arrived in time for their regular pregame shoot around. Hours later, they finished off Drake behind 23 points from Ron Baker. It was victory No. 19 in a 27-game MVC winning streak.

- Minus its go-to-guy, WSU struggled to get much going offensively in its AAC opener.
- Walk-on **Melvion Flanagan** finished with a team-high 11 points for WSU, which struggled in the absence of point guard and leading scorer **Craig Porter Jr.** (ankle), scoring a season-low 45 points on 35% shooting.
- Timely three-pointers (7-of-20) and another gritty defensive effort kept the Shockers in the game. **Jaron Pierre Jr.**'s trey pulled them to within a point, 46-45, at the 4:50-mark of the second half, but WSU came up empty on each of its last seven offensive possessions to finish the game.
- Both teams came in ranked among the nation's top-40 in defensive efficiency, per KenPom, and played a slow tempo to boot (just 53 offensive possessions). 19 WSU possessions ended with points, 19 with missed shots and 15 on turnovers.
- The Knights overcame their own offensive struggles. They shot 35.8% and went the final 8:16 without a field goal, but **Darius Johnson** (game-high 15 points) made six-straight free throw attempts in the last two minutes to secure the victory.
- UCF won the rebounding (34-27) and turnover (15-9) battles and held WSU to just one second-chance point.
- UCF jumped to an 18-11 lead and never trailed. The Shockers scored the last five points of the first half to pull within 26-23 and narrowed the margin to a single point on three different occasions in the second half.

TEAM TRENDING

- » Porter's **60.5%** success rate on two-point field goal attempts is tops among AAC guards.
- » Wednesday's game at UCF marked the first time in **63** games under **Isaac Brown** that WSU hasn't recorded at least one block. WSU had done so in **75**-straight going back to the 2019-20 season. Notably, the Shockers faced the Knights without the services of **Craig Porter Jr.** and **Quincy Ballard**. Both players rank among the nation's top-100 in blocks.
- » The Shockers are **3-3** in December. All three losses came in games where the opposition scored less than 60 points.
- » 45 points against UCF marked WSU lowest offensive output since a 76-43 loss at No. 25 Houston on Feb. 9, 2020.
- » WSU reserves are averaging a league-best **25.2** points.
- » Both Brown and UCF coach **Johnny Dawkins** were content to let the air out of the ball. WSU finished with just **53** offensive possessions -- its fewest since Jan. 25, 2015 when it also had 53 chances in a 58-47 win over Loyola Chicago.
- » WSU managed just 14 baskets but posted its highest assist rate this season (.643). **Kenny Pohto** had three of the Shockers' nine assists (a career-high).
- » WSU has made incremental progress with its passing over the last few weeks, posting a 50.4 assist rate over its last five games (up from 38.5 over the first eight).
- » WSU has held its last **six** opponents under 40% from the field. That's happened just seven other times in the NCAA's shot clock era (1985-86 to present). It's the longest Shocker streak since a nine-gamer that began against Clemson, Indiana and Lipscomb in the 2019 NIT and continued through the first six games of the 2019-20 season.

Shot Clock Era (1985-86 to Present)

- » The Shockers are **25-2** under **Isaac Brown** when scoring 70+ points in regulation and **26-6** when out-shooting their opponent from the field.
- » WSU is **1-3** in games decided by five points in either direction. The Shockers have been one of the nation's most-unfortunate teams, according to KenPom, ranking 328th out of 363 teams in "Luck" -- a metric that compares a team's expected record to its actual mark. Based on its statistics, KenPom would expect WSU's winning percentage to be more than 100 percentage points higher (.641 up from .538).
- » Dec. 10 against Longwood **Jaron Pierre Jr.** became the **fourth** different Shocker to reach the 20-point plateau, joining Porter and Jaykwon Walton (twice).
- » Porter sat the last 18 minutes of the Dec. 22 game against Texas Southern with an injured ankle and finished with a season-low two points. It ended a string of nine-straight games with double-figure points.
- » Porter ranks 48th nationally in blocks at 1.75. Per RealGM, Porter's average is second-highest among the nation's point guards.

SECRET WEAPON UNLEASHED

- » In a span of three weeks, 5-10 walk-on **Melvion Flanagan** has gone from invisible to indispensable
- » The sophomore transfer played just two minutes in the first month of the season before exploding for 14 points in the Dec. 10 win over Longwood. He made his first career start Dec. 22 against Texas Southern (the first WSU walk-on to do so since 2008) and led the scoring with 11 points at UCF on Dec. 28 (the first WSU walk-on to claim high scoring honors in the 30 years since the NCAA moved to a 13-scholarship limit).
- » Flanagan is the son of one of head coach **Isaac Brown's** former college teammates at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College, **Melvin Flanagan**.
- » The younger Flanagan turned down Division I offers for a chance to play for Brown at WSU.
- » Flanagan is averaging a team-best **21.6** points-per-40-minutes. While he doesn't have enough minutes to qualify for KenPom's national rankings, his 132.1 O-Rating would otherwise be the nation's highest among players with at least a 24% usage rate.

DOING IT WITH DEFENSE:

- » WSU has frustrated foes into some lengthy scoring funks. Over the first 13 games, opponents have had **21** scoring droughts of at least four minutes.
- » That includes scoreless stretches of 6:08 and 9:10 by GCU and 7:29 against San Francisco. The Shockers held Mizzou in check for 6:13 during a season-best 16-0 run.

- » Wichita State's Charles Koch Arena, is often referred to as "the Roundhouse" for its unique circular shape. The building opened in December, 1955 and the 2022-23 season marks its **67th** season of use. The Shockers have won over three-quarters of their games there all-time.
- » CKA was named one of the **10-best environments in college basketball** by CBS Sports during its 2022 Candid Coaches series. "Win, lose or draw, there will be 10K in there," one coach responded. "Fans are loud. Have to use play card, players can't hear. And very knowledgeable of the game."

- » If visiting teams feel like the fans are right on top of them, it's because they pretty much are. Every seat is within 140 (horizontal) feet of center court, and in recent years just about all of them have been full. Since the start of the 2013-14 season, the Shockers have played in front of **83** capacity crowds and put together an incredible **124-17** record on campus.
- » In summary: Large groups of loud people packed into a little space with a lot to cheer about. But don't forget the fifth "L." --- the lid. The arena's circular and highly-reflective dome roof amplifies sound and funnels it downward toward center court, raising the volume from ear-splitting to deafening with readings as high as 120 db.
- » WSU's rise to national relevance began in 2003 with the completion of the Roundhouse Renaissance. A \$25 million dollar construction project turned an aging Henry Levitt Arena into one of college basketball's best and most-intimidating venues. The building reopened as Charles Koch Arena for the start of the 2003-04 season.
- » In the 20 seasons since the renovation, the Shockers are **252-50** on campus.
- » A streak of **244**-consecutive regular season crowds of 10,000+ ended during COVID when local health restrictions forced the Shockers to cap capacity. The streak lasted just shy of 16 years (Dec. 2004 to Dec. 2020).
- » WSU's longest-standing tradition (pun intended) happens at the start of each half when fans remain on their feet, clapping in unison until the opposing team scores its first field goal.

SCOUTING THE PIRATES

- » ECU has a new coach (former Tennessee assistant **Michael Schwartz**) and an almost entirely new cast.
- » The Pirates returned just one starter and five total let-termen from last year's 15-15 squad that finished ninth in the AAC standings at 6-11.
- » That's not to say the cupboard was completely bare. A trio of sophomore returners form this year's nucleus:
- » 6-2 **Javon Small** ranks among the AAC leaders in scoring (16.6 ppg, 6th), assists (5.5, 3rd) and minutes (34:47, 2nd) and can beat opponents from the perimeter (2.1 threes-per-game) or at the foul line (71/85, .835).
- » 6-8 forward **Brandon Johnson** (12.5 ppg) is the AAC leader in rebounds (9.8) and double-doubles (7).
- » 6-3 guard **RJ Felton** is the team's top returning scorer from a season ago (6.1 ppg). He's nearly doubled his production this year, averaging 11.5 points.
- » That trio has combined for 55.7% of the ECU points and 52% of the shots.

MATCHUP MASHUP:

- » This is the seventh chapter of the "War on I-35 to I-435 to I-70 to I-775 to US-525 to I-40E to I-264E." Wichita and Greenville, N.C. are separated by 1,300 miles; an easy 20-hour drive (pit stops not included).
- » **Isaiah Poor Bear-Chandler** is the lone holdover from WSU's last visit to Greenville four years ago. **Craig Porter Jr.** and **Kenny Pohto** are the only other Shocker who have faced ECU.
- » Former Shocker **Gabe Blair** — a starter on the 2011 NIT

Championship team — played his first two collegiate seasons at ECU before transferring to WSU.

THE SERIES:

- » WSU and ECU had never played prior to the Shockers joining the league in July, 2017, and they haven't had many encounters since then, either. This is only the seventh game in six seasons.
- » The Shockers are 6-0 (3-0 Wichita).
- » Half of the six meetings came in 2018-19 when WSU swept the home-and-home and defeated ECU in the first round of the AAC tournament in Memphis.
- » The teams met just once in 2017-18 and 2019-20 due to the league's unbalanced schedule. Both 2020-21 dates were canceled due to COVID-19. The Shockers traveled to Greenville for the 2021-22 AAC opener, but that contest was called off just hours before tipoff.
- » WSU is 2-0 at ECU's Minges Coliseum but hasn't played a game there since Feb. 6, 2019.

WSU-ECU GAME-BY-GAME

» Mar. 5, 2022 | Wichita | WSU 70, ECU 62

The one-two scoring punch of **Craig Porter Jr.** and **Ricky Council IV** helped knock out ECU in the 2022 regular season finale. The win gave WSU the No. 7 seed in the AAC tournament and knocked ECU down to No. 9. A Pirate win would have flipped those seeds... Council and Porter combined for 25 of the last 30 WSU points, beginning with Council's go-ahead layup at the 14:00-mark of the second half. Up 56-55 with 5:00 left, Porter and Council each drove for dunks to set off a 10-0 run... **Tristen Newton** supplied 16 points, 11 rebounds and six assists to lead ECU... The win was WSU's 750th all-time at the Roundhouse.

» Jan. 1, 2020 | Wichita | #24 WSU 75, ECU 69

An all-around effort from **Erik Stevenson** (17 points, 9 rebounds, 5 assists, 5 steals, 1 block) helped WSU survive an ECU upset bid... **Jayden Gardner** scored 20 of his 29 points after halftime and the Pirates led 45-44 with less

than 13:00 to play before WSU took control.

» Mar. 14, 2019 | Memphis, Tenn. | WSU, 73-57

Markis McDuffie scored 15 points on 11-of-12 foul shooting to lead the sixth-seeded Shockers past No. 11 seed ECU in the first round of the AAC tournament... The Shockers led 39-27 at the break and by 26 near the 12:00-mark before resting the regulars... WSU outscored ECU 14-2 off turnovers and 23-4 on second-chances, helped by 17 offensive rebounds. WSU was +12 on the glass and its three centers combined for 27 points and 18 rebounds... **Jayden Gardner** led ECU with 16 points, six boards.

» Mar. 5, 2019 | Wichita | WSU, 72-55

Using depth and defense, the Shockers overcame a cold shooting performance to win on senior night... McDuffie scored 16 points in his final home game... **Isaac Fleming** had 17 for ECU and **Rico Quinton** posted a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds... WSU shot 39% but held ECU to 36% on 3-of-15 three-point shooting and out-rebounded the Pirates 47-37... WSU used a 14-4 surge to go up 32-18 late in the first half and coasted.

» Feb. 6, 2019 | Greenville | WSU, 65-49

Samajae Haynes-Jones hit his first seven shots on his way to a team-high 18 points, and WSU out-rebounded ECU by 19... **Asbjorn Midtgaard** grabbed a career-high 11 rebounds and **Jaime Echenique** provided 10... The Shockers won despite shooting just 39.7% but held ECU to 34.6%... They led 34-20 at halftime and extended the margin to as many as 21 points late in the second half.

» Jan. 11, 2018 | Greenville | #5 WSU 95, ECU 60

WSU recorded 32 assists on 38 baskets to win the first-ever meeting between the programs. **Landry Shamet** finished with 11 points and a career-high 11 assists with just one turnover. Rauno Nurger scored a team-high 14 points. WSU shot 59.4% including 70% (21-of-30) after halftime. The Shockers trailed 14-9 at the 12:06-mark but outscored ECU 36-9 over the remainder of the first half. They led by as many as 41 points down the stretch.

STARTING ANEW

- » Per KenPom, the 11 WSU newcomers have accounted for **81.2%** of the minutes this season -- second-most among AAC schools. Quite the contrast from a year ago when newcomers accounted for 38.1% (third-fewest).

IN WITH THE OLD

- » WSU's front court got a lift on Nov. 16 when **Isaiah Poor Bear-Chandler** received a 4-4-4 transfer waiver from the NCAA granting him immediate eligibility.
- » The 6-foot-9 senior played his first three seasons for the Shockers and was back-up center on the 2021 American Athletic Conference championship team. He transferred to Omaha for the 2021-22 season to be closer to home but returned to WSU this summer to continue working toward his undergraduate degree. In June, he approached head coach **Isaac Brown** about the possibility of walking on. Brown jumped at the opportunity to add an experienced big with knowledge of his system.
- » Poor Bear-Chandler, who turned 24 on Nov. 20, is the oldest Shocker by nearly six months. **James Rojas** turns 24 in May.

ANOTHER BIG CONTRIBUTOR

- » Florida State transfer **Quincy Ballard** was 6-foot-1 when he started playing basketball as a high school freshman but grew 11 inches over the next four years. He credits his mother for helping motivate him to put in the time to improve his game during high school.
- » That motivation is still on display at WSU. Ballard chose the Shockers in part because of its track record of developing big men.
- » Ballard -- who wears a size 17 shoe -- is the seventh 7-footer to play for WSU.

WUNDERKENNY

- » **Isaac Brown** has another big building block for the future in **Kenny Pohto**. The 6-foot-11 sophomore gives the Shockers a weapon in the pick-and-roll with his size, mobility and deft three-point shooting touch. His ability to run the floor opens up additional opportunities on fast breaks.
- » Like most kids in Sweden, Pohto grew up playing soccer. He credits his time as a goalkeeper for helping him learn footwork and angles necessary to defend without fouling.

WORKING OVERTIME

- » The Nov. 29 loss to Mizzou was WSU's third-straight overtime setback and just the 11th OT game in the 20 seasons since Charles Koch Arena's renovation. The Shockers are **6-5** in those games.
- » The Shockers have dropped three straight overtime games going back to last season when they fell to Houston at home in double-OT (Feb. 20, 2022) and to Arizona in Las Vegas (Nov. 19, 2021).
- » The Shockers are **2-3** in OT games under **Isaac Brown**.

RIGHT ON POINT

- » **Craig Porter Jr.** is looking to continue a tradition of excellent point guard play at Wichita State.
- » WSU has had an all-conference point floor general in nine of the last 13 seasons -- most recently **Alterique Gilbert** in 2021. Eight of those Shocker teams advanced to the NCAA tournament.
- » Junior college transfers **Clevin Hannah** (2010 MVC 1st Team) and **Joe Ragland** (2012 MVC 1st Team) started that run. **Malcolm Armstead** (2013 MVC HM), a senior transfer from Oregon, led the Shockers to the 2013 Final Four in his lone season. WSU had a pair of future NBA guards at the controls from 2013-16 with **Fred VanVleet** and 2016-18 with **Landry Shamet**.

A GOOD SIGN FOR THE FUTURE

- » In November, Mississippi high school standout **Makhi Myles** became the first member of WSU's 2023 recruiting class when he signed a National Letter of Intent.
- » The 6-foot-6 guard out of Starkville High enters his senior season as the state's No. 2 recruit and is a three-star prospect, per 247sports.
- » "Makhi is a long, athletic wing with a high basketball IQ and a winning pedigree," WSU head coach **Isaac Brown** said. "He has the tools to be a big-time defender, and he can really shoot the ball. I can't wait to get him on campus."
- » As a junior, Myles was third team All-Mississippi (all classes) after averaging 24 points, 11 rebounds and four blocks for a team that finished 20-5 and reached the second round of the 6A state playoffs.

SHOCKER HISTORY LESSON

- » Five Shockers have jersey numbers in the rafters: #13 **Cleo Littleton** ('51-55), #42 **Dave Stallworth** ('61-65), #54 **Cliff Livingston** ('79-82), #35 **Antoine Carr** ('79-83) and #44 **Xavier McDaniel** ('81-85).
- » Teammates on WSU's first NCAA Tournament team in 1964, Stallworth and **Nate Bowman** teamed up again to help the 1970 New York Knicks to an NBA title.
- » McDaniel, Livingston and Carr all played more than a decade in the NBA. Livingston was a member of the Chicago Bulls' first two NBA Championship teams while playing alongside Michael Jordan. Carr helped the Utah Jazz to a pair of runner-up finishes in 1997 and 1998.
- » A member of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, **Ralph Miller** won 220 games in 13 years on the Shocker bench (1951-64) and led the Shockers to their first NCAA Tournament in 1964. When Miller retired from Oregon State in 1989, at the close of a 38-year career, he was the eighth-winningest coach in NCAA history (674-370). In 1997, Miller was honored with the NABC Golden Anniversary Award, given to NABC members who have devoted at least 50 years of outstanding service to the game of basketball.

OF MICS AND MEN

- » Play-by-play voice **Mike Kennedy** is in his 43rd season with the team. The 74-year-old began calling Shocker hoops full time during the 1980-81 Elite Eight season. He's missed just two games during that span (both in January, 2021 while quarantining).
- » Kennedy and his home broadcast partner **Dave Dahl**, are now in their 42nd year together and are Division I college basketball's longest-tenured duo. Dahl, a three-year varsity letterman at WSU from 1968-71, missed the 2011-12 season during a successful campaign for district court judge, but the tandem has otherwise been in place since 1980-81.

WHAT'S A WUSHOCK?

- » Legend has it, the name "Shockers" first appeared in 1904 on a poster advertising a football game between Wichita State (then known as Fairmount College -- and the Chillico Indiana. The team's manager chose the name because many of the players earned money during the off-season harvesting (or "shocking") wheat in the surrounding fields. When it came time to bring the name to life, student's created WuShock, a big, band, muscle-bound bundle of wheat whose name is derived from a period in time when the school was simply Wichita University or "WU".

HONORING "DAVE THE RAVE" STALLWORTH

- » On Dec. 1, 2018, WSU formally dedicated a life-size, bronze statue of All-American **Dave Stallworth** near the southwest doors of Charles Koch Arena. Former teammates helped raise \$200,000 toward the project.
- » Stallworth -- a three-time All-American who led the Shockers to their first NCAA Tournament in 1964 -- passed away in March, 2017.

AMERICAN OUTLOOK

- » Wichita State was picked eighth out of 11 teams in American Athletic Conference preseason poll.
- » WSU teams have met or exceeded preseason expectations in four of the five seasons since joining, most notably in 2020-21 when a similarly overhauled roster was picked seventh but went on to win the title.
- » Led by AAC preseason player of the year, **Marcus Sasser** (also an AP preseason first team All-American), Houston is a unanimous favorite to defend its 2022 title, earning 10 first-place votes (coaches could not select their own team or players). Freshman forward **Jarace Walker** was unanimous pick for rookie of the year.
- » Memphis has a pair of first-teamers in DeAndre Williams and SMU transfer **Kendric Davis**, the league's reigning player of the year. The Tigers (87 poll points) edged out Cincinnati (82) for the runner-up spot.
- » Fourth-place Tulane (74) landed a league-best three players on the preseason all-conference squad, including first-teamer **Jalen Cook**.
- » **Damian Dunn** grabbed the final first-team spot for Temple, which checked in fifth with 66 points.

PROLIFIC SHOCKERS

- » **23** former Shocker alumni are active in the professional ranks, including **two** in the NBA.
- » **Fred VanVleet** is in his seventh season with the Toronto Raptors and the third of a four-year, \$85 million deal. It's the largest contract in NBA history for a player who went undrafted out of college. VanVleet helped lead the Raptors to the 2019 NBA title.
- » In October, 2022 fifth-year guard **Landry Shamet** signed a lucrative contract extension of his own with the Phoenix Suns that will pay him \$43 million over four years. The sharp-shooter and former first round pick was traded to Phoenix prior to the 2021-22 season. Before that he played for the 76'ers, Clippers and Nets.
- » 2020 graduate **Jaime Echenique** became the NBA's first Colombian-born player on Dec. 29, 2021 when he made his debut with the Washington Wizards and represented his home country in this summer FIBA World Cup qualifying. In late December he was traded to the Detroit Pistons G-League affiliate, the Motor City Cruise.
- » After a strong showing in the Vegas Summer League, rookie guard **Tyson Etienne** made the Atlanta Hawks' 2022 preseason roster and opens the season with the G-League's College Park Skyhawks.
- » Since 2013, seven different Shockers have appeared in an NBA regular season game. In addition to Echenique, VanVleet and Shamet, **Ron Baker** played parts of three seasons with the Knicks and Wizards (2016-19) before retiring due to mounting injuries. **Toure' Murray** saw time with the Knicks, Jazz and Wizards from 2013-15, **Cleanthony Early** was drafted by the Knicks and played for two years in New York (2014-16) and **Gal Mekel** did tours with the Mavericks and Pelicans (2013-15).
- » **Austin Reaves**, who played his first two collegiate seasons at WSU (2018-20) is in his second seasons as a member of the Los Angeles Lakers.

Head Coach ISAAC BROWN

One of college basketball's best feel-good stories, **Isaac Brown** begins ninth season at Wichita State and his third as head coach.

Thrust into an interim role just eight days before the start of the 2020-21 college basketball season, Brown earned the head coaching job on a permanent basis after leading a Shocker team picked seventh in the preseason to its first American Athletic Conference regular season title, as well as an at-large berth to the NCAA tournament. He was a unanimous choice for the league's coach of the year award.

Known around the game as a player's coach and all-around people person, Brown has also proved himself resourceful in guiding the Shockers to a 31-19 record in his first two go-arounds.

Under Brown's watch, several Shockers have made impressive strides in their development. **Tyson Etienne** went from a reserve guard to a two-time all-conference selection, earning American co-Player of the Year honors in 2021. He signed a contract with the Atlanta Hawks in the summer of 2022 and earned a spot on the team's pre-season roster.

Guards **Dexter Dennis** and **Ricky Council IV** earned major awards in 2022 as The American's Defensive Player and Sixth Man of the Year, respectively.

The 2021-22 Shockers battled untimely injuries and illness during a 15-13 season, highlighted by a pair of non-conference road wins over Missouri and Oklahoma State. Two of the team's most-memorable performances came in overtime losses to eventual No. 1 seed Arizona and Elite Eight participant Houston.

Brown's 2020-21 team opened the year 1-2 while playing and practicing shorthanded due to the COVID-19 protocol, but then quickly took off, winning 14 of their next 16 games, including an upset of sixth-ranked and Final Four-bound Houston on Feb. 18. Shortly after, Brown's interim tag was replaced with a five-year contract.

On Mar. 1, 2021, Brown was formally introduced as the 26th full-time head coach in Shocker history and the state of Kansas' first black head men's basketball coach.

WSU went on to finish 16-6 (11-2 AAC). With its berth in the First Four, Brown became the first rookie head coach to lead a team to the Big Dance since Wisconsin's Greg Gard in 2016.

Brown was tabbed NABC District Coach of the Year and was a finalist for a handful of national honors, including the Jim Phelan Award (national coach of the year), Joe B. Hall Award (top first-year head coach) and the Ben Jobe Award (top minority coach).

Shocker guards thrived in Brown's system with Etienne earning the conference's co-player of the year honor. In addition, UConn graduate transfer **Alterique Gilbert** wrote a storybook ending to an injury-plagued career. The former McDonald's All-American led the team in assists and earned third team all-conference honors.

Brown, 53, is in his ninth season overall at WSU -- the first six as an assistant under **Gregg Marshall** -- and his 21st at the Division I level, having also served as an assistant at Louisiana Tech (2011-14), Arkansas State (2010-11), Arkansas (2007-10) and South Alabama (2002-07).

Combined Brown helped lead those five programs to 11 20-win seasons in 18 years with eight conference regular season titles, two conference tournament championships and 10 postseason appearances. Along the way he coached 58 all-conference selections and six NBA players.

The Shockers' 2021 American Athletic Conference title gives Brown championship rings from five different leagues (AAC, WAC, C-USA, MVC, Sun Belt).

WSU won over three-quarters of its games during Brown's time as a Shocker assistant (2014-20), going 157-50 (.758), highlighted by four-straight NCAA tournament bids (2014-18) and a run to the 2019 NIT semifinals.

In addition to Marshall, Brown has learned from a number of college basketball's top minds, including current Florida head coach **Mike White** at Louisiana Tech (2011-14). At Arkansas State he worked with a pair of Final Four coaches in head coach **John Brady** (LSU, 2006) and assistant coach Richard Williams (Mississippi State, 1996). Brown also spent eight years under **John Pelphrey** at South Alabama (2007-10).

The Pascagoula, Miss. native is a member of the Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College Hall of Fame and went on to play at Texas A&M and Northeast Louisiana (now Louisiana-Monroe). He earned his bachelor's in health and physical education from ULM in 1995.

- » **Craig Porter Jr.** scored 16 of his career-high 22 points in the first half, and new-look Wichita State opened its new season with a 79-55 win over Central Arkansas.
- » 10 of the 12 players that checked in for WSU (1-0) did so for the first time in a Shocker uniform, breaking the school record for most debuts. The old mark of nine was set during the 1979 and 2018 openers.
- » Porter – one of just two holdovers from last year's active roster – looked like an entirely different player, as well, hunting shots and more-often-than-not sinking them. He finished 9-of-11 from the field and added four assists and three steals.
- » The Shockers scored the game's first 11 points and mounted another 20-2 run just before halftime to pull away. They led by as many as 28 down the stretch.
- » **Quincy Ballard** scored 10 of the Shockers' 38 bench points on 4-of-5 shooting and blocked a pair of shots.
- » **Camren Hunter** and **Johannes Kirsipuu** scored 13–each for UCA, which made just 4-of-30 threes and finished the night at 30.1% from the field.
- » WSU shot 43.8%, sinking 6-of-21 threes. The Shockers outscored the visitors 17-7 at the foul line and won the turnover (10-14) and rebounding battles (47-42).
- » WSU has won 28 of the last 30 openers, including all three under **Isaac Brown**.

- » Former Shocker **Trevin Wade** scored a game-high 14 points to lead Alcorn State to a stunning upset.
