The Wingate University Sports Network will partner with Stretch Internet for video and audio broadcasts during the 2014-15 academic year. The Network will cover football, volleyball, soccer, basketball, baseball, softball, tennis, swimming and lacrosse during the 2014-15 academic year.

2014-15 OUTLOOK

The 2014-15 Wingate University Bulldogs will have 13 freshmen and sophomores to go along with a pair of upperclassmen in the starting back court. Wingate went 14-13 during the 2013-14 season, posting an 11-11 mark in league play. The Bulldogs won SAC Tournament titles in 2012 and 2013, making a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. Wingate advanced to the regional semifinals both years.

"I've been very pleased with our guys effort," head coach **Brian Good** says about the preseason. "We are young and will make mistakes, but their energy has been great, especially on the defensive end. They have also bought into the "team first" concept, which makes them very enjoyable to coach."

Back Court:

The backcourt will have a pair of established upperclassmen in the starting lineup. Senior **Ryan Daye** is a preseason first team All-SAC selection. He averaged a team-best 17.5 points per game last year, earning second team all-conference honors. "Ryan has me very excited about the maturity level he has shown," Good says. "We put a lot on his plate last season, maybe too much, but I know it has made him a better all-around player. He has impressed me the most with his defense. He is taking pride on that end and it shows."

Junior **Xavier Griffin** will be the starting point guard for the second straight year. Griffin averaged 8.4 points per game during his sophomore season, ranking in the top seven in the SAC in assists per game and assist-to-turnover ratio. "Xavier is as tough of a kid as I've coached," Good says. "We had a hard time taking him off the floor last season. Fortunately, we got him some help at point guard and I expect it to make him even better. He has also worked hard to improve his jump shot, which will make him more difficult to defend."

The Bulldogs will have several newcomers contribute off the bench in the backcourt. Freshmen **Zeriq Lolar** and **Bryan Rouse**, along with sophomore transfers **Kerigan Farley** and **Anthanee Doyle** will all see plenty of time at the guard spots during the season. "Our newcomers will provide the added depth that we lacked last season and then some," Good says. "I will not be surprised to see them challenge for starting roles as the season goes forward."

Wings:

The main players on the wing for the Bulldogs will be a pair All-SAC Freshman selections from last year. Reigning SAC Freshman of the Year **Isiah Cureton** contributed 9.4 points and 6.5 rebounds per game last year, finishing fifth in the league with 1.6 steals per contest. Classmate **Josh Dominguez** was third on the team with 9.7 points per game, shooting 39.7 percent from three-point range. Sophomores **Terrill Hilliard** and **Dustin Dodd** will add some depth to the wing position. Hilliard appeared in 22 games, scoring 4.1 points per contest, while Dodd appeared in 20 games as a freshman, knocking down nine triples on the season.

"Isiah and Josh both made great strides physically and it shows," Good says. "I'm confident their added strength will make the game easier for them this season. Isiah plays hard every possession and rebounds the ball as well as anyone. Josh is becoming a very dependable offensive threat and is working hard to be a great defender."

Front Court:

Sophomore **Keith Griffin** will take over the starting center spot for the Bulldogs. Both of Wingate's starting big men from last season signed pro contracts in Europe over the summer. Griffin appeared in 26 games during his freshman season, playing 13.2 minutes per contest while contributing 3.7 points and 3.7 rebounds per game. He will be joined in the front court by freshman **Lee McCall** and junior transfer **Herbert Harrison**.

"Keith will be very important to us as we continue to be a post-up oriented team," Good says. "He has worked hard to improve his ability to score around the basket. Maybe most pleasantly, he now is much more vocal."

Schedule:

The Bulldogs will once again play 22 conference games during the 2014-15 season. Wingate continues to play one of the toughest non-conference slates in the league. The Bulldogs open the season Friday, Nov. 14, hosting Limestone in the OrthoCarolina Tip-Off Challenge. The 'Dogs will host Belmont Abbey the following day in Cuddy Arena.

The league schedule starts with four consecutive road games. The Bulldogs do not play a home conference contest until Dec. 20, when they host Anderson. Wingate will also host a non-conference game against Johnson C. Smith in December, while traveling to UNC Pembroke and Mount Olive.

HEAD COACH BRIAN GOOD



Wingate University men's head basketball coach **Brian Good** enters his seventh season at Wingate. Good led the Bulldogs to a 14-13 record during the 2013-14 season, with an 11-11 mark in league play. Senior **Deion Turman** and junior **Ryan Daye** earned All-SAC honors. During the summer, Turman and **Jeff Parker** both signed contracts to play professionally in Europe. Good has compiled a 102-74 record during his six seasons at Wingate.

Good led the Bulldogs to a 22-9 record in the 2012-13 season, culminating with Wingate's second consecutive Food Lion SAC Tournament title. The Bulldogs earned their second consecutive bid to the NCAA Tournament, while advancing to the NCAA regional semifinals for the second consecutive year.

The Bulldogs finished second in the SAC during the 2012-13 season, going 14-4 in league play. Wingate seniors **Paidrick Matilus** and **Odell Turner** earned second team All-SAC honors, while Matilus was named the MVP of the SAC Tournament. Turner finished as the league's all-time leader in career rebounds and offensive rebounds. His classmate **Ethan Kincaid** is ranked seventh on the league's all-time assists chart. Wingate finished at the top of the league in field goal percentage and field goal percentage defense during conference games, while also leading the SAC in blocks and ranking second in rebounding margin.

Good led the Bulldogs to the 2011-12 SAC Tournament title, which was Wingate's first since the 2006-07 season. The Bulldogs won 11 of their last 13 contests in the 2011-12 season. They were led by first team All-SAC selection **Jaime Vaughn**. Wingate led the league in blocked shots, thanks to having three players ranked in the top five in the league. Turner finished third in the SAC, followed by Turman in fourth and Parker in fifth. Wingate also had the league leader in three-point shooting in junior guard **Eddie Lewis**.

Good led the Bulldogs to a 19-10 overall record during the 2010-11 season. Wingate finished second in the South Atlantic Conference regular season and tournament races.

In 2010-11, Turner was named first team All-SAC, while junior guard Vaughn was an All-SAC second team honoree. The Bulldogs led the SAC in team three-point field goal percentage. In 2010-11, Turner earned SAC Freshman of the Year laurels. Matilus and **Quan Alexander** joined Turner on the SAC All-Freshman team, while Vaughn was selected to the All-SAC second team.

Good brings playing and/or coaching experience in all three NCAA divisions to the table. Prior to taking the Wingate position, Good spent four seasons as head men's basketball coach at Queens University of Charlotte. He led the Royals to a 72-45 overall record, helping Queens make back-to-back NCAA appearances in his final two campaigns. A member of the Conference Carolinas, the Royals posted a 51-29 league slate during Good's tenure.

During the 2007-08 campaign, the Queens University of Charlotte Royals were 21-10 overall. In 2006-07, Queens completed the season 20-10 overall. The Royals lost in the 2007 NCAA Division II East Region quarter-finals to eventual national champion (and fellow league member) Barton College.

In addition to his coaching duties at Queens, Good spent three-and-a-half years as the school's NCAA Compliance Coordinator. On the hardwood, Good has 15 years of head coaching experience. Prior to his arrival in the Queen City, Good was the head men's basketball coach and associate athletic director at Milwaukee School of Engineering.

Milwaukee School of Engineering (MSOE) is one of the nation's top engineering schools. Good helped the basketball program make great progress, as he led the Raiders to the 2002-03 Lake Michigan Conference tournament championship and a trip to the NCAA Division III post-season tournament.



Good was an assistant coach at the University of South Dakota for two seasons, guiding the Coyotes to the 1994 Elite Eight. USD won the North Central Regional and the North Central Conference tournament championship to earn the trip to the Elite Eight. During the 1992-93 season, Good was an assistant at Edgewood (Wis.) College. The Eagles captured the Lake Michigan Conference championship during the 1992-93 campaign.

In addition to his collegiate coaching experience, Good has led several teams in international competition. As the head coach for USA Athletes International, Good has led tours to Barbados and Italy. Twice his teams captured the Friendship Games championship in Barbados. Good led his USA Athletes International team to an undefeated record while in Italy.

During his time as a basketball student-athlete at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, Good was a four-year letter winner and Big Ten Conference free throw champion. A native of Rossville, Ind., Good received a M.A. degree in Athletic Administration from the University of South Dakota in 1995. He earned a B.S. degree in Agricultural Economics at the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1993. Good and his wife **Mary** have two children: daughter **Zoe** (14) and son **Carter** (8).





MARCUS KIRKLAND Assistant Coach

Marcus Kirkland begins his fourth season as a member of the Wingate University men's basketball coaching staff. The 2014-15 season will be his second as the number one assistant coach on the Bulldog staff. In his first two years on staff, Kirkland helped lead the Bulldogs to a pair of SAC Tournament titles and two NCAA Tournament appearances. Wingate advanced to the NCAA regional semifinals in each of Kirkland's first two years.

Kirkland has specialized in working with the Bulldog post players. Wingate led the league in blocked shots during Kirkland's first season, thanks to having three players ranked in the top five in the league. **Odell Turner** finished third in the SAC, followed by **Deion Turman** in fourth and **Jeff Parker** in fifth. In conference play, the Bulldogs were second in rebounding and number one in scoring defense.

In the summer of 2014, Turman and Parker signed contracts to play basketball professionally in Europe.

During the 2012-13 season, Turner earned second team All-SAC honors, averaging 11.7 points and 9.4 rebounds per game. He also finished his career as the league's all-time career leader in rebounding. Turman averaged 9.1 points and 7.4 rebounds per game in the 2012-13 season, shooting a league-best 63.5 percent from the field. Parker added 5.5 points per game on 64.8 percent shooting from the field, adding a team-best 41 blocks.

Kirkland brings a wealth of experience to his position. In addition to college and AAU coaching stops, Kirkland has trained post players from the NBA to high school.

Kirkland spent seven years as the head coach for the Hoop Nation AAU team. He was a volunteer assistant coach for one year at Livingstone College. Kirkland served two years as an assistant coach at Reading College.

A Hampton University graduate, Kirkland played professionally for five years in Italy. Kirkland has extensive camp coaching background, including seven years at NBA and University of Connecticut standout **Donyell Marshall's** camp.

Kirkland and his wife **Renee** have a daughter (**Kerri**, 18) and a son (**Marcus, Jr.**, 14). Kirkland's dad (**Wilbur**) was a two-time college All-American and an NBA draft pick. A 10-year Italian professional league veteran, Wilbur Kirkland played one season each for the Philadelphia 76ers and the ABA's Pittsburgh Pipers. His mom (**Elaine**) was a high school principal and educator for 30 years. She holds a Doctor of Education degree.



Odell Turner Assistant Coach

Odell Turner begins his second season on the Wingate coaching staff in the 2014-15 season. A four-year starter for the Bulldogs, Turner earned SAC Freshman of the Year honors during his first season at Wingate in the 2009-10 season. He earned All-SAC honors during his sophomore and senior seasons, while being named a preseason All-American as a junior.

Turner finished his career as the all-time leading rebounder in South Atlantic Conference history. He grabbed 956 rebounds, adding 1,507 career points. Turner broke the rebounding record during Wingate's SAC Tournament semifinal win against Anderson during his senior season.

Turner played in the SAC Tournament championship game each of his final three seasons at Wingate. The Bulldogs won the SAC title during his junior and senior seasons, earning two trips to the NCAA Tournament. The Bulldogs advanced to the NCAA regional semifinals both years.

2013-14: Ryan Daye earned second team All-SAC honors during his junior season...Led the team with 17.5 points per game, ranking ninth in the conference...Added 3.4 rebounds and 2.4 assists per game to go along with 23 steals...Knocked down a team-best 65 threes, ranking 11th in the SAC...Ranked ninth in the league in free throw shooting (82.8 percent)...Scored in double figures in 22 of 26 games, scoring 15 points or more 17 times...Scored 35 points in season opener, adding six rebounds while hitting 10-of-11 free throws...Had 35 points at Tusculum on 12-for-16 shooting...Registered 19 points and five assists against Lenoir-Rhyne...Had 32 points in overtime win at Anderson, including game-winner in final seconds, hitting six-of-10 shots from beyond the arc...Had 33 points in overtime win at Johnson C. Smith, adding four assists while going six-for-10 from three-point range...Scored 23 points in win against Queens, followed by a 22-point effort in Tusculum win...Finished the season by scoring double figures in last 10 games, including 22-point effort at Newberry, a 19-point, four-assist game in the win over Anderson and a 22-point performance in win at Brevard.

2012-13: Started 23 of Wingate's 31 games during his sophomore season...Averaged 11.9 points per game, 1.6 rebounds per game, and 1.7 assists per game...Ended his season shooting 76.9 percent from the free throw line...Had three games with 20+ points: at Mount Olive (22), Tusculum (23), at Mars Hill (26) with two of the three resulting in a win...Had four games with four or more made three-pointers (Clayton State, Tusculum, at Mars Hill, at Brevard) all four resulting in a win.

2011-12: Appeared in 30 games during his freshman season at Wingate, averaging 1.5 points per game...Scored season-high seven points against Johnson C. 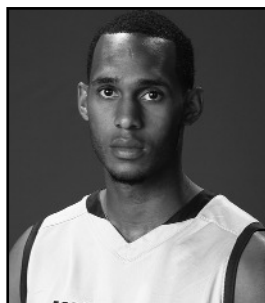

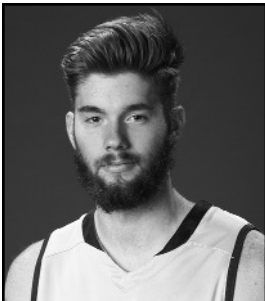

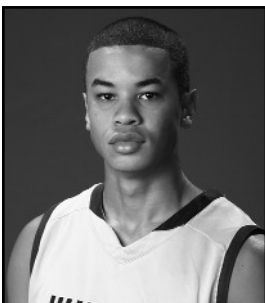

Wingate wins eighth consecutive SAC Athletic Excellence Award

Rock Hill, S.C.----For the eighth consecutive year, Wingate University is the winner of the South Atlantic Conference Echols Athletic Excellence Award, which annually recognizes the athletic department with the highest point total based on cumulative final standings in each of the conference's 18 sports. Wingate piled up a record-breaking 184 points in the 2013-14 year, winning by an incredible 44 points. It is the highest margin of victory ever, shattering Wingate's record from 2010-11, when the Bulldogs won by 29 points.

The eighth consecutive victory ties a record set by Elon, which lasted from 1989-97. In Wingate's eight-year run, the Bulldogs have accumulated 200.5 points more than the next closest school. Wingate has won by 20 or more points in each of the past four years, starting with the previous record 29-point win in 2010-11. The Bulldogs won by 20.5 in 2011-12, while winning by 20 last year. Before Wingate's 29-point win, the highest margin of victory was 12.5 set by Elon in 1996-97. The Bulldogs now have more Excellence Cup Awards (eight) than the other 11 current conference schools combined (five).

Excellence Cup points are based on final regular season standings in all conference sports except men's cross country, women's cross country, men's golf, women's golf, men's track & field and women's track & field, where tournament standings are used. The trophy is presented at the SAC Annual Business Meeting at the conclusion of each academic year. The trophy is named in honor of former SAC Commissioner Doug Echols.

Wingate got off to a quick start, winning conference titles in volleyball and women's cross country in the fall. Both teams would also go on to win regional championships. The women's soccer team finished second in the regular season, then went on to win the Food Lion SAC tournament and the NCAA regional title, advancing to the Elite Eight. The men's soccer team was also second, while the football team finished in a tie for fourth.

The Bulldogs piled up spring championships in men's tennis, women's tennis, women's golf, baseball and men's track & field. The men's golf team and women's track & field teams finished second, while the softball team finished third.



Lenoir-Rhyne finished second with 140 points, two points ahead of third-place Queens. Carson-Newman was fourth, followed by Anderson and LMU. Wingate put up more points in the spring sports (105.5) than seven schools collected during the entire 2013-14 year.

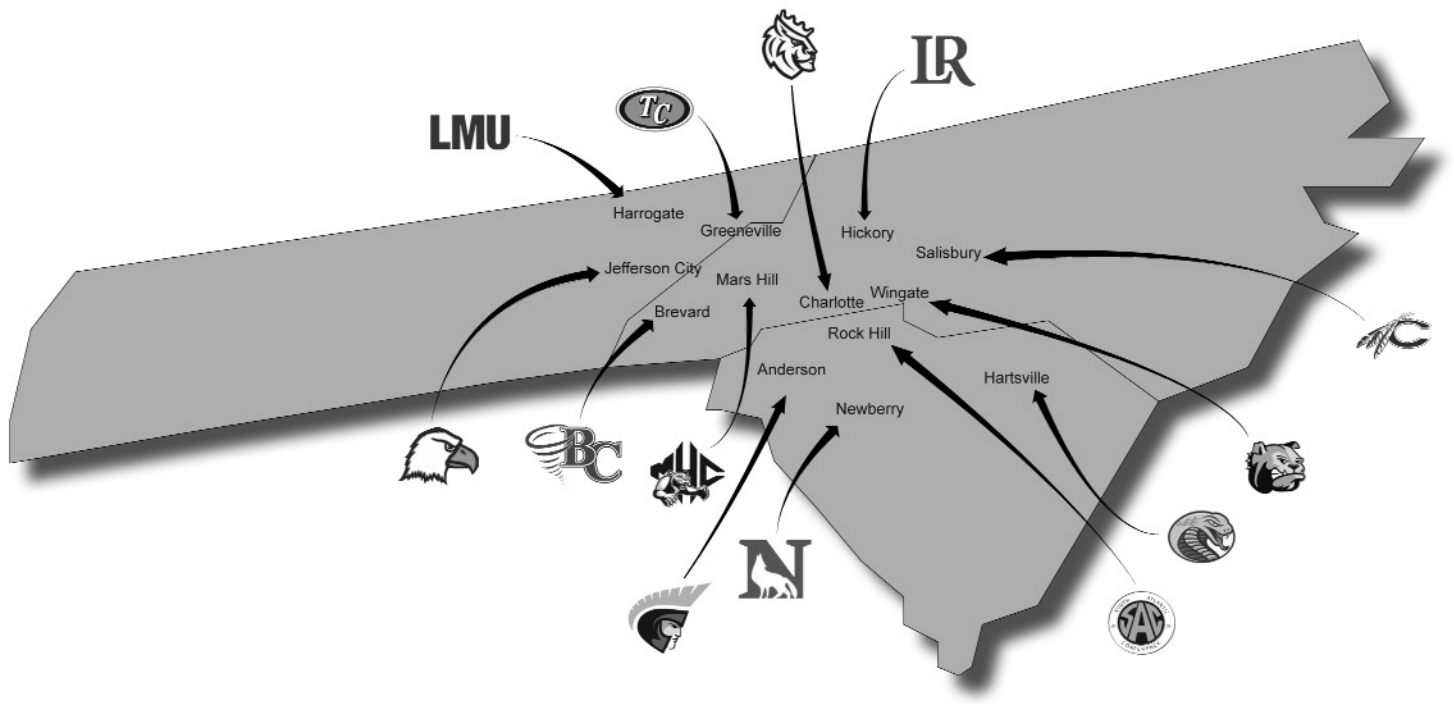
