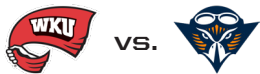

NOTING THE GAME

WKU and UT Martin have played four times in their head-to-head series, all from 1997-2000. The Hilltoppers are 4-0 with a combined score advantage of 196-to-17. Since a 71-0 win over the Skyhawks in 2000, WKU has only eclipsed the 70-point mark once – an 87-0 victory over West Virginia Tech on Sept. 8, 2007. By the time the programs square off for their 2021 contests, it will have been 7,663 days since matching up against each other.

SEASON #103

WKU is playing its 103rd season of football this fall. The program played its first game in 1913. The Hilltoppers celebrated their 100th season of football in 2018 and, uniquely enough, it was also the 100th season of men's basketball and baseball on The Hill. To celebrate, WKU voted on and named an All-Century Team (**PAGE 9**) and wore a commemorative patch on the team's jerseys.

"WHITE OUT"

WKU will be wearing white jerseys with white pants against UT Martin for the team's annual "White Out" home game. The Hilltoppers will be wearing white cleats for the first time since Tyson Helton took over as head coach prior to the 2019 season, while also debuting a white helmet with an all-red stripe and a white "Tops" script logo with a red outline (top left of this page). Since 2013, WKU is 13-10 while wearing white jerseys with white pants, including 6-1 in home games (**PAGE 9**).

STAFF SHUFFLE

Of WKU's 10 full-time assistant coaches, only one (special teams coordinator and safeties coach Andy LaRussa) has the same role as last season. Four have new roles: Maurice Crum (linebackers → defensive coordinator), Bryan Ellis (now co-offensive coordinator and inside receivers coach), Kenny Baker (defensive ends → defensive line) and Stephen Hamby (quality control → offensive line). Five are new faces: Zach Kittley (offensive coordinator and quarterbacks), Pat Bastien (linebackers), Josh Crawford (outside receivers), Keynodo Hudon (cornerbacks) and Carlos Locklyn (running backs).

THE PORTAL

Of the 108 players on WKU's 2021 roster, 28 of them (26%) are incoming transfers. Of the 28, 16 are coming directly from FBS programs – 10 from Power Five programs and six from Group of Five teams. Of the 28, eight are from FCS programs – including four from the Houston Baptist offense. Of the 28, four are from the JuCo ranks, however three of those spent a year on Power Five teams.

ZERO TO 10,004

WKU returns zero passing yards from the 2020 season. Enter graduate transfer quarterback Bailey Zappe, whose 10,004 career passing yards at Houston Baptist from 2017-20 leads all active Division I passers. The next closest is Utah's Charlie Brewer, who had 9,700 for Baylor over the past four years and transferred over the offseason to play for the Utes.

ELIGIBILITY NOTE

WHEN LOOKING AT CLASS/ELIGIBILITY

Any player WKU has listed as a freshman has 4 years of playing eligibility remaining. Sophomores have 3 years, etc. The only exceptions are seniors C.J. Marria, Cole Spencer and Matthew Smith, who each have 2 years of eligibility remaining.

Tyson Helton was named Western Kentucky University's 21st head football coach on November 27, 2018. The 2021 campaign will be his third season at the helm of the Hilltopper program after producing a 14-11 mark (including 10-5 in C-USA play) and reaching two bowl games in his first two years.

WKU finished the 2020 campaign with a 5-7 overall record, including a 39-21 loss to Georgia State in the 22nd Annual LendingTree Bowl. The Hilltoppers were only 1-of-16 college football teams in the nation to play in 12 or more games during the COVID-19-affected year.

In his first season as head coach at WKU, Helton led the Hilltoppers to one of the best turnarounds in the nation. With a 9-4 overall record in 2019, WKU tripled its 2018 win total (3-9) and matched the number of victories from the previous two years combined (9-16).

The Hilltoppers' six-win improvement from 2018-to-2019 tied for the third-best in FBS, behind only Navy (8) and Central Michigan (7). WKU was voted to finish fifth in the East in the preseason Conference USA poll, but concluded the year tied for second with a 6-2 league record.

Because of the team's success, Helton was voted 2019 C-USA Coach of the Year, the first Hilltopper head coach since Jack Harbaugh was the Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 2000. It was only the sixth conference Coach of the Year honor in program history, with the previously-mentioned Harbaugh, Jimmy Feix (1973, 1978 and 1980) and Nick Denes (1963) as the only other WKU head coaches to earn the recognition.

Tyson and his father Kim (at Houston in 1996 – with Tyson on the team as a freshman), are the only father-son duo to each be named Coach of the Year in C-USA's 25-year history in any sport. The Heltons are the first father-son duo to each be named Coach of the Year in any FBS league since the Bowdens – Tommy (Clemson in 2003) and Bobby (Florida State in 1993 and 1997) – in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

WKU's 2019 season boasted notable wins over five bowl teams (9-5 UAB, 7-6 Southern Miss, 7-6 Charlotte, 7-6 Western Michigan and 6-7 FIU) as well as only 1-of-3 C-USA victories over a Power Five opponent this season; a 45-19 statement win at Arkansas in which the Hilltoppers led 35-7 at half time. The Hilltoppers also claimed a 17-8 win over Army, a game in which WKU "out-Armyed Army" – winning the time of possession battle 38-to-22 and out-rushing the Black Knights 225-to-137.

A direct reflection of coaching and discipline, the Hilltoppers were only called for 53 penalties all season long which ranked third in FBS. Also, WKU's time of possession was 23rd in the nation, with a 32-to-28 advantage on average.

Helton returned to WKU three years removed from the 2015 football season which ended with the Hilltoppers' final Associated Press ranking of 24 – the highest in school history – and a school-record 12 victories, including the first-ever FBS conference championship. Helton's previous tenure coincided with quarterback Brandon Doughty's astronomical ascension up the NCAA's career record book and total rewriting of the program's own offensive records.

During his three years away from the program, Helton spent two seasons at the University of Southern California as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach under head coach Clay Helton. Helton developed quarterback Sam Darnold into an All-Pac-12 First Team quarterback and the No. 3 overall selection in the 2018 NFL Draft by the New York Jets.

In that same draft class, another of Helton's protégés, WKU's Mike White, was also selected in the fifth round by the Dallas Cowboys.

Helton's work with Darnold and the Trojan offense was instrumental in the team's run to a thrilling 52-49 victory over Penn State in the 2017 Rose Bowl following the 2016 season. Darnold was named the game's offensive MVP after throwing a game-record five touchdown passes and accounting for 36 points. Darnold's 473 yards of total offense were also a new individual record for the Rose Bowl, one of the nation's oldest and most prestigious postseason college football games. The 101 combined points scored was also a new game record. Following the 2017 season in which the Trojans won the Pac-12 Conference Championship with a 31-28 victory over Stanford, Helton and Darnold helped lead the Trojans back to the postseason with a berth in the 2017 Cotton Bowl.

Immediately prior to his return to The Hill as head coach, Helton was Tennessee head coach Jeremy Pruitt's first hire on his initial coaching staff as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2018. In just one season in Knoxville, Helton developed quarterback Jarrett Guarantano into one of the Southeastern Conference's most formidable signal callers. The redshirt sophomore followed an up-and-down freshman campaign by becoming the No. 5 ranked SEC quarterback in passing efficiency (147.8) and completion percentage (64.5). His 144 consecutive pass attempts without an interception set a new school

record, and he enjoyed new career highs for completions (27), attempts (39), passing touchdowns (2), and passing yards (328) under Helton's tutelage.

Guarantano enjoyed a week of national awards following Tennessee's 30-24 victory over No. 21 Auburn after he threw for 328 yards on 21 of 32 passing with two touchdowns. For his efforts, Guarantano was named the Maxwell Award National Player of the Week, SEC Co-Offensive Player of the Week, Manning Star of the Week, and PFF College National Team of the Week.

All of this before even mentioning Helton's otherworldly success as WKU's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2014 and 2015 under then-head coach Jeff Brohm. WKU's offensive numbers ranked among the nation's elite during Helton's two years on the staff and featured the first-ever 4,500-yard passer (Brandon Doughty) and 1,500-yard rusher (Leon Allen) in the same season in FBS history in 2014.

WKU broke more than two dozen school offensive records under Helton, including the points scored record in each of his two years. The Hilltopper offense was in the national Top 10 in 2015 in passing efficiency (1st, 177.4), scoring (3rd, 44.3), passing (4th, 372.2), first downs (8th, 349) and total yards (9th, 526.4).

In 2014, WKU became the first NCAA program with a 4,500-yard passer and 1,500-yard rusher while winning the Bahamas Bowl to finish 8-4. That season, they were second nationally in passing (374.3), fourth in total offense (534.6) and sixth in scoring offense (44.4) and first downs (351).

Helton was among four finalists for the 2015 FootballScoop.com Offensive Coordinator of the Year Award. He coached quarterback Brandon Doughty to back-to-back Conference USA MVP honors as he threw 97 touchdown passes in 2014 and 2015 (the most in NCAA history in consecutive seasons). Doughty led the nation in 2015 in completion percentage (71.9), passing touchdowns (48), passing yards (5,055) and points responsible for (304) while ranking second in passing efficiency (176.5). FALL CAMP FEATURE: WIDEOUTS PUTTING EMPHASIS ON BIG PLAYS

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. — It's no secret that WKU Football will be sporting a new-look offense in 2021. It's also no secret what the Hilltoppers' wide receivers are focused on: Making big plays.

"Something I talk to our guys about all the time is if you look at it statistically, yards per play is a big determiner of W's," assistant coach Josh Crawford said. "Both teams can have a lot of yards of offense, but statistically the team that has the greatest yards per play is typically the team that will come out and win."

"Our success Saturday-in and Saturday-out and in our practices day-in and day-out is really going to be judged about how well we do making big plays on the outside."

Wide receiver Craig Burt, Jr. echoed that sentiment: "Coach Crawford every day he preaches to make the big play. The offense is going to go how we go; if we make big plays, the offense is going to go. It's really just keying in on the small things, making sure we go high-point the ball and catch everything that's possible. Of course sometimes the defense is going to have good plays in there, but next-play mentality, and when we have another chance, make the play."

Crawford – who comes from a coaching background of working with some of the best high school offenses in the state of Georgia over the past decade – is tasked with working with the outside receivers, while Bryan Ellis is coaching the inside receivers. There are 18 total wideouts on the 2021 WKU roster, with a good mix of returners and newcomers, all of which hope to put their talent on display this fall in offensive coordinator Zach Kittley's offense.

A trio of incoming transfers who came from Houston Baptist with Kittley and quarterback Bailey Zappe – Jerreth Sterns, Josh Sterns and Ben Ratzlaff – might seemingly have a leg-up on the ins and outs of the offensive scheme, but they say it has been a group effort getting each other ready to roll.

"A lot of the dudes are kind of older and they've played a lot of college football," Jerreth explained. "They kind of just hit us up like about the concepts, but they actually help us on how to run the routes. There are things that we didn't know and they know, and things that we know that they didn't know. So I think the knowledge from both sides kind of just helps everybody get better honestly."

The wide receiver group is another deep one. There are experienced returners in Burt, Malachi Corley, Dalvin Smith, Dakota Thomas, Mitchell Tinsley and Dayton Wade. And they're now joined by the HBU transfers plus other newcomers Kendall Abdur-Rahman, Daewood Davis, B.K. Smith and DeAngelo Wilson.

Kittley dialed up 215 pass attempts for Zappe in HBU's four 2021 contests (54 per game), so there will likely be a lot of targets to go around. In Fall Camp, the coaches are challenging the players to step up and earn those targets, and it's making for lots of healthy competition between teammates.

"This is something that I've told these guys from Day 1, and I always use the cheetah and the gazelle analogy," Crawford said. "The great thing about our room is we've got depth, so on a daily basis it requires each one of them to come out on this field and give their best. Because if you come out here and you don't have a great day, there's a guy who's right behind you that's capable."

However the personnel pans out for the Hilltoppers, know that they'll be operating at one speed: Fast.

Davis – a redshirt junior transfer from Oregon – may just be the fastest player on the team, and a main selling point of him coming to WKU was the high-tempo style of play, which he thinks will be a weapon for the offense this year.

"I feel our tempo is going to help us the most in getting big plays, because as soon as a play's gone, we can get back on the ball and we can go," Davis said. "The defense isn't going to be ready and that's a chunk shot right there. We just gotta keep practicing it and keep getting better at it."

Also take the word of Jerreth, who has three years of experience playing in Kittley's system: "We like to push the ball, push the tempo a lot. We'll do whatever it takes to score a lot of points, as long as it's fast."

SWISS ARMY MAN

Returning to his home city of Louisville to face the Cardinals in WKU's 2020 season opener on Sept. 12, senior defensive back Omari Alexander had one of the most unique performances you will ever see on a football field. He racked up a fumble recovery on a muffed punt, a blocked punt, an interception, a tackle for loss and 5 total tackles (3 solo, 2 assisted).

According to ESPN Stats & Info, Alexander was only 1-of-2 FBS players (Tyler Murray of Charlotte) with an interception, fumble recovery and tackle for loss in the same game in the first two weeks of 2020, while only 10 players did that in all of 2019. Note: ESPN Stats & Info has difficulty researching any individual games with blocked punts.

In addition, he was the first Hilltopper to block a punt since A.J. Brathwaite, Jr. on Oct. 19, 2019 vs. Charlotte.

OUT-ARMYED ARMY

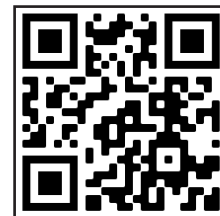
WKU's 17-8 victory over Army in 2019 was one of the most impressive games played against the Black Knights' triple-option offense in a very long time. Some notable numbers from that game:

- WKU's defense held Army to only 10 first downs, their fewest in 35 games.
- WKU's defense held Army to only 137 rush yards, their fewest in 45 games.
- WKU's defense held Army to only 208 total yards, their fewest in 40 games.
- WKU's defense held Army to only 1 play of 15+ yards for the entire game.
- WKU's held Army in single-digit scoring for the first time in 29 games.
- WKU held Army scoreless for the first 58:19, the deepest into a game the Black Knights had been shut out since Sept. 13, 2014 in a 35-0 loss at #15 Stanford.
- WKU had a 38-to-22 advantage in time of possession, Army's worst showing in the statistic in 55 games.

It has become an annual ritual every year for Hilltoppers to get the opportunity to pursue their NFL dreams. WKU currently has 10 former Hilltoppers signed with NFL teams, and one free agent in tight end Deon Yelder.

THE 100TH SEASON

WKU celebrated 100 seasons of football on The Hill in 2018. The program began in 1913, but due to program stoppages during World War I (1917-1919) and World War II (1943-45), the 2018 team is WKU's 100th team. Uniquely enough, it was also the 100th season of men's basketball and baseball.

To celebrate, WKU voted on and named an All-Century team and wore a patch on the jersey all year. The team is comprised of 12 offensive players, 12 defensive players, 4 specialists, and one all-purpose leader. The co-head coaches of the team are Jimmy Feix, the winningest head coach in program history at 106-56-6, and Jack Harbaugh, leader of WKU's 2002 national championship team.

Talking POINTS

CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Two WKU Football student-athletes were voted 2020-21 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, it was announced on July 12. Punter John Haggerty III earned First Team honors while Juwuan Jones garnered Second Team distinction.

Haggerty and Jones are the seventh and eighth CoSIDA Academic All-Americans in program history, and the first since defensive back Brian Lowder in 2002. It is the first time the Hilltoppers have ever had multiple Academic All-Americans in the same season.

WKU's six previous Academic All-Americans are defensive back Brian Lowder, 2002; center Patrick Goodman, 1999; guard Brian Bixler, 1995; guard Mark Fatkin, 1985; defensive end Tim Ford, 1981; and linebacker Jim Barber, 1971.

There were 51 total Division I football student-athletes recognized on the First and Second Teams. Of the 41 schools that had at least one representative, Stanford had the most with four players, while WKU was only 1-of-7 programs with two.

The only other Conference USA player to be a 2020-21 Academic All-American was defensive end Tyriq Harris of Charlotte. Meanwhile, there were zero other players from Kentucky schools.

Haggerty's first two seasons playing American football have been the two best punting seasons in WKU's 102-season program history. The Sydney, Australia, native averaged 45.9 yards on 45 punts in 2019, then followed it up with an average of 45.7 yards on 56 punts in 2019. Of his 101 total punts, 37 have been 50-plus yards and 37 have been inside the opponent's 20 yard line, while only six have gone for touchbacks.

In the classroom, Haggerty has a perfect 4.0 GPA in his Organizational Leadership graduate program. He has been on WKU's President's List all five semesters and earned the C-USA Academic Medal in each of the past two years.

Jones, meanwhile, has been a consistent impact player for the Hilltoppers after redshirting the 2017 campaign to make the switch from high school linebacker to collegiate defensive end. Over the past three seasons, the Sugar Hill, Ga., native has played in all 37 games while starting 32 games – including 28 consecutively. He has racked up 135 total tackles – including 23.5 for loss – and 14 sacks, along with 19 quarterback hurries.

In the classroom, Jones earned a bachelor's degree in Sport Management in only three years – graduating with a 3.75 GPA – and is currently working on a master's degree in Teaching with a focus in Special Education. He was voted to the 2020 C-USA All-Academic Team.

NON-CON SUCCESS

After going 0-12 against non-conference foes in their first three years as an FBS team (2009-11), WKU has turned it around against teams from Group of Five or FCS conferences, going 20-7 against them since 2012.

From 2012 through the 2017 regular season, the Hilltoppers posted a 16-1 record against such teams, but since the 2017 Cure Bowl, WKU has a 4-6 mark in the past 10 such games. The Hilltoppers are 12-3 in home games against non-conference Group of Five or FCS teams in that time frame.

4TH QUARTER DEFENSE

In four stright games, the 2019 Hilltopper defense silenced the opposition late in the contest, keeping points off the scoreboard in the fourth quarter against FIU, Louisville, UAB and Old Dominion.

The Panthers didn't score for the last 21:03, the Cardinals for the last 16:26, the Blazers for the last 24:17 and the Monarchs for the last 44:56 of the game. Since 2007, it was the first WKU defense to post scoreless fourth quarters in four-consecutive games. If not for a Army touchdown with 101 seconds left in the final frame, the Hilltoppers would have had a six-game scoreless fourth quarter streak from Game 2 to Game 7.

GREATEST COMEBACKS

Trailing LA Tech 49-24 with 8:01 remaining in the third quarter in Week 6 of the 2016 season, the Hilltoppers mounted a furious rally that was a drive away from potentially being the largest comeback in school history before ultimately falling 55-52. WKU's largest rally in program history is 17 points all-time and 14 points in the FBS era, coming in back-to-back games to cap the 2015 season.

DAVID CARTER PASSES AWAY

WKU Athletics Hall of Famer and All-American center David Carter passed away on July 10 at the age of 67.

Carter was a four-year starter for the Hilltoppers from 1973-76 while also serving as the team's snapper on special teams. As a senior in 1976, he was chosen as a team captain and went on to earn AP Second Team All-American honors. He was named WKU's Athlete of the Year for the 1976-77 campaign.

Carter was inducted into the WKU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1996. He was also named to the Hilltopper Football All-Century Team prior to the 2018 campaign. In his four seasons, WKU had a combined 34-11-1 record, including Ohio Valley Conference titles, Grantland Rice Bowl championships and NCAA Division II National Runner-Up finishes in both 1973 (12-1, 7-0 OVC) and 1975 (11-2, 6-1 OVC).

Carter went on to produce a nine-year NFL career, in which he played in 121 games and started 42. He and Dale Lindsey (played for the Cleveland Browns from 1965-73) have the longest NFL playing careers of any Hilltopper; the 2021 season will be Jack Doyle's ninth as a professional.

2021 RULE CHANGES

Overtime

Teams will be required to run a 2-point conversion play after a touchdown when a game reaches a second overtime period. Previously, a 2-point attempt was required after the third overtime period.

Also, if the game reaches a third overtime, teams will run alternating 2-point plays, instead of starting another drive at the opponent's 25-yard line. This is a change from the previous rule, which started to use 2-point plays in the fifth overtime period.

Team Area

The Playing Rules Oversight Panel approved the team area being permanently extended to the 20-yard lines, starting in the 2021 season. Previously, the team area extended to the 25-yard lines, but this area was expanded to the 15-yard lines last season to create more spacing due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Unsportsmanlike Tactics

In an editorial change to the rules book, video board and lighting system operators have been included in those personnel who may not create any distraction that obstructs play.

Feigning Injuries

The panel supported the Football Rules Committee proposal to provide a framework to allow a school or conference to request a postgame video review about questionable actions through the NCAA secretary-rules editor/national coordinator of officials.

Points of Emphasis

- For the 2021 season, it will be a point of emphasis for officials to penalize any taunting action directed toward an opponent. Committee members think these actions reflect poorly on the game and can lead to unnecessary confrontations.
- Officials are directed to be alert to players who are significantly in violation of uniform rules and to send violators out of the game to correct the issue. This will include specifically the pants, jerseys and T-shirts that extend below the torso.
- Coaches should not enter the field of play or leave the team area to debate officiating decisions. Those who do so will have committed an automatic unsportsmanlike conduct foul."

ZAPPE'S KEY NOTES

- On December 27, 2020, college football's leading passer announced that he was coming to The Hill. A transfer from Houston Baptist, quarterback Bailey Zappe joined four other recent Huskies-turned-Hilltoppers in offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Zach Kittley, as well as star wide receivers Ben Ratzlaff, Jerreth Sterns and Josh Sterns.
- In an abridged 2020 season, the success of HBU's Air Raid passing offense made headlines throughout the country. In only four games, the Victoria, Texas, native completed 141-of-215 passes (65.6%) for 1,833 yards, with 15 touchdowns and one interception.
- At 458.3 yards per game, Zappe's average led all of college football and ranked 101.3 yards above the leading FBS passer (Dillon Gabriel of UCF - 357 yards per game) in 2020. Zappe and the Huskies put up 480 pass yards and three scores at North Texas, 406 and five scores at LA Tech, and 380 and three scores at Eastern Kentucky, but the most notable performance was against Big 12 opponent Texas Tech.
- In Lubbock, Texas, against the Red Raiders, Zappe completed 30-of-49 passes for 567 yards with four touchdowns, as HBU dropped a 35-33 heartbreaker even though they entered the game as 40-point underdogs. The 567 pass yards were the most ever for an FCS player against an FBS defense.
- Zappe has 2,178 yards and a 16-2 TD-INT ratio in 6 career games against FBS teams (LA Tech, Texas Tech and North Texas in 2020; UTEP in 2019; SMU in 2018; Texas State in 2017)

OTHER HBU TRANSFERS' KEY NOTES

- Jerreth Sterns had 220 receptions for 1,971 yards and 18 touchdowns in 27 career games over three seasons for the Huskies. His 220 receptions led all active FCS players, while his 1,971 ranked third. Boasts single-game bests of 18 receptions, 138 yards and three touchdowns. Has 10 double-digit catch performances and eight 100-yard games. In four games as a junior in 2020, led the Huskies with 47 receptions for 454 yards and five touchdowns; his 11.8 receptions and 113.5 yards per game topped the FCS rankings.
- Josh Sterns played four games for Houston Baptist in 2020, recording 13 receptions for 403 yards and four touchdowns. Led the FCS with 31 yards per reception (the next-closest was 19.6 yards per catch) and ranked second with 100.8 yards per game (brother Jerreth was the leader with 11.5 yards per contest).
- Ben Ratzlaff recorded 126 receptions for 1,538 yards and 15 touchdowns in 16 games for the Huskies. As a senior in 2020, averaged 7.7 catches for 116.7 yards in three games against FBS opponents with a 100-yard performance in each contest.
- Jerreth, Josh and Ratzlaff combined to produce 89 receptions (63.1% of Zappe's total) for 1,256 yards (68.5%) and 12 touchdowns (80%) in 2020.

MALONE'S KEY NOTES

- On Nov. 7, 2020 at Florida Atlantic, he had a career-high 12 tackles, along with two sacks – for 14 negative yards – and three quarterback hurries. For his efforts in Boca Raton, he was named C-USA Defensive Player of the Week for the second time in his career.
- In the following game on Nov. 14 vs. Southern Miss, he made two sacks – for 13 negative yards – pushing his career total to 25 and set the program's FBS Era (since 2009) record.
- The next week on Nov. 21 vs. FIU, he produced a career-high four quarterback hurries and his forced fumble in the third quarter led to a 24-yard defensive touchdown after the recovery by Roger Cray.
- Had a blocked field goal on Oct. 3 at Middle Tennessee and a blocked extra point in the LendingTree Bowl vs. Georgia State, becoming the first WKU player since Jared Clendinin in 2011 to have two in the same season.
- In 2019, Malone established himself as one of the most productive defensive players in the country, and one of the most dynamic defensive ends in recent memory. He became the first Hilltopper to be voted Conference USA Defensive Player of the Year since joining the league prior to the 2014 campaign.
- He produced 99 total tackles (54 solo, 45 assisted) – including 21 for loss (ranked fourth in the nation) – with 11.5 sacks (ranked 12th in the nation), 16 quarterback hurries and a fumble recovery returned for a touchdown.
- He set the WKU FBS Era record (dating back to 2009) in tackles for loss, while becoming only the fourth defender in all-time Hilltopper history with double-digit quarterback takedowns. His 11.5 sacks were the third-most ever in a single-season by a Hilltopper.
- His 99 total tackles were the third-most by an FBS defensive lineman in a single-season over the past decade (In 2017, Stanford's Harrison Phillips had 103 and Boston College's Zach Allen had 100 in 2017).
- He scored his first career defensive touchdown on Nov. 23 at Southern Miss, when he strip sacked the Golden Eagles' quarterback and scooped up the fumble himself and ran in for a five-yard score; it was WKU's first "fumble six" since Wonderful Terry's 95-yard score on Sept. 6, 2014 at Illinois. Malone was voted C-USA Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts in Hattiesburg, where he recorded seven tackles – including two for loss – and 1.5 sacks.
- His most notable performance of the season came on Oct. 5 at Old Dominion, where he recorded nine tackles – including a career-high four for loss – with a career-high three sacks along with three quarterback hurries.
- On Sept. 15, 2020 at Louisville, he recorded the first interception by a WKU defensive lineman since Derik Overstreet on Nov. 5, 2016 vs. FIU. Then on Nov. 24 at LA Tech, he sacked the quarterback in the end zone for a safety.

NARVESON'S KEY NOTES

- After transferring to WKU in the summer, Narveson won the starting kicking job during Fall Camp and didn't look back, producing one of the most accurate campaigns in WKU's 102-season program history.
- Made 13-of-14 field goal attempts and was a perfect 27-of-27 on extra point tries in 2020, scoring 66 total points in 12 games. His 93% field goal mark tied for third among all FBS kickers and ranked second for a single season all-time in WKU history to Garrett Schwettman's 15-of-16 (94%) mark in 2015. Was only 1-of-20 FBS kickers listed as a Lou Groza Award Semifinalist, the first Hilltopper to do so since Schwettman in 2015.
- Made 6-of-6 field goals in the 40-49 range and 5-of-5 from the 30-39 distance, while his 53-yarder on Oct. 3 at Middle Tennessee was the third-longest ever for a Hilltopper. Only miss was a 50-yard try in the first quarter on Nov. 7 at Florida Atlantic, but he did bounce back and make attempts of 32 and 49 yards later in the game against the Owls.
- Capped the regular season by going 3-for-3 on field goals and 4-of-4 on extra points on Dec. 6 at Charlotte. With a 13 points scored, became the first WKU kicker to reach that mark since Skyler Simcox had 16 points scored in the 2016 C-USA Championship Game vs. LA Tech.
