### QUICK HITS...

#### BOWLING AT THE BEACH

- James Madison is bowl bound for the second straight season, as it wraps up season three at the Football Bowl Subdivision level on Wednesday, Dec. 18 when it faces Western Kentucky in the Boca Raton Bowl on ESPN.
- The Dukes are seeking their first bowl-game championship.
- Kickoff from FAU Stadium is set for 5:30 p.m. and will be nationally televised on ESPN.
- Bowl coverage of JMU football is presented by Door Gorilla.

#### FIRST-TIME OPPONENT

- The Boca Raton Bowl will mark the inaugural meeting for the Dukes and Hilltoppers on the gridiron.
- It's also just the second meeting ever for JMU against a member of Conference USA.
- JMU is 1-0 against the CUSA, capturing a 44-7 win at home over Middle Tennessee on Sept. 3, 2022, in the program's first game in the FBS.
- The Dukes have previously faced other current CUSA squads in Liberty (12-6) and Sam Houston (1-1) while both programs were with JMU in the Football Championship Subdivision. JMU also matched up with Middle Tennessee as FCS foes in 1994, winning that game as well.

#### JMU'S POSTSEASON HISTORY

- JMU's invitation to the Boca Raton Bowl marks the program's 20th all-time postseason appearance.
- The Dukes were part of the FCS Playoffs on 18 occasions between 1987 and 2021 while this upcoming matchup is JMU's second bowl game in as many seasons.
- This is the first time JMU is technically eligible for Bowl Season, as the 2023 bowl berth was due to there not being enough eligible teams and JMU being in year two of reclassification to the FBS.
- Last season, JMU faced off with Air Force in the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl, falling 31-21.
- The Dukes hold a 24-17 all-time postseason record, winning two FCS (formerly Division I-AA) national championships in 2004 and 2016.

## JMU VS WESTERN KENTUCKY

12.18.24 | 5:30PM ET | BOCA RATON, FL







Bob Chesney is in his first season at the helm of the JMU football program, as former Director of Athletics Jeff Bourne introduced him to JMU Nation as the program's ninth head coach on December 7, 2023.

He was awarded a five-year contract to lead the Dukes, who began the 2024 season as a full-fledged member in the Football Bowl Subdivision.

Now in his 15th season as a collegiate head coach, Chesney led the Dukes to an 8-4 regular-season record and a berth in the program's second bowl-game appearance.

Chesney currently holds a 119-50 career record and brought in nearly a decade-and-a-half of experience to the Dukes at the other three NCAA levels.

He guides his previous programs to a combined seven conference titles and postseason appearances at the FCS, Division II and Division III ranks.

He takes over a JMU program that made a historic transition from the Football Championship Subdivision to the Football Bowl Subdivision, going 19-4 over the past two regular seasons. JMU finished atop the Sun Belt Conference East Division standings in both years with a combined 13-3 conference record, and the Dukes received a bid to the 2023 Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl for the program's first bowl game in program history. JMU has also sustained success spanning more than two decades, finishing with at least a .500 record in 21 straight seasons and finishing with a winning record in 10 straight.

Most recently, Chesney spent six seasons as head coach at Holy Cross (2018-23), guiding the Crusaders to unprecedented success with a program-record five consecutive Patriot League Championships since 2019 and an overall record of 44-21.



In 2022, he led Holy Cross to its third undefeated regular season and an FCS quarterfinal berth for the first time in nearly 40 years, finishing #6 in the final AFCA Coaches Poll. HC's stretch run from 2021-23 were the team's best three-year run since the 1989-91 seasons, going 29-8.

While at Holy Cross, Chesney recorded wins in back-to-back seasons against FBS opponents, defeating UConn, 38-28, in 2021 and Buffalo, 37-31, in 2022. During the 2023 campaign, the Crusaders dropped a pair of three-point contests to Boston College and Army West Point.







His 2023 squad featured a pair of Walter Payton Award finalists in quarterback Matthew Sluka and receiver Jalen Coker and a Buck Buchanan Award finalist in Jacob Dobbs. Dobbs additionally was a finalist for the prestigious Campbell Trophy, while Sluka was voted Patriot League Player of the Year.

Chesney is a three-time Patriot League Coach of the Year (2019, 2021, 2022) and twice was named the New England Football Writers Coach of the Year (2021, 2022). He was additionally honored as the AFCA FCS Region 1 Coach of the Year following Holy Cross' historic 2022 season.

Prior to Holy Cross, he was head coach at Division II Assumption College, going 44-16 from 2013-17. A two-time Northeast-10 Conference Coach of the Year, he led the Greyhounds to five straight winning seasons for a program that had posted just two winning records in the 17 years prior to his arrival. Chesney took Assumption to the NCAA Division II playoffs in each of his final three seasons, reaching the quarterfinal in 2017.

He began his head coaching career at Division III Salve Regina, posting a 23-9 record in three seasons at the helm from 2010-12. Chesney rebuilt a Salve Regina program with three consecutive winning seasons after it had gone through eight straight losing seasons. In 2011, he guided Salve Regina to the ECAC North-West Bowl, and in his final season in 2012, his team reached the New England Football Conference championship game.

Before becoming a head coach, Chesney had coaching stops as an assistant at Johns Hopkins (2005-09), King's College (2003-04) Delaware Valley College (2002) and Norwich University (2000-01).

A native of Kulpmont, Pa., Chesney was a four-year letterwinner as a defensive back at Dickinson College, where he earned his degree in 2000. He was a Second Team All-Centennial Conference selection in 1998 and 1997 and was the 1997 recipient of the team's Vincent Correal MVP Award.

Chesney and his wife Andrea have two daughters, Lyla and Hudson, and one son, Bo.

## HISTORY WITH KENTUCKY SQUADS

- JMU's showdown with the Hilltoppers marks the program's 14th meeting all-time against a school from the Bluegrass State.
- JMU is 10-3 all-time against Kentucky squads.
- The Dukes have faced Morehead State 11 times between 1979 and 2021, going 9-2 in those games, which includes an 8-0 mark at home.
- JMU most recently faced Louisville in the teams' inaugural meeting in 2022, with the Cardinals winning 34-10 on their home turf.
- JMU's matchup with WKU is not its first postseason bout with a Kentucky squad, as the Dukes won 20-17 at Eastern Kentucky on a walk-off field goal in the opening round of the 2011 FCS Playoffs.

## TURNOVER MARGIN LEADERS

- JMU won the turnover battle in each of the first 10 games and tied in the regular-season finale to lead the country in turnover margin (+1.42).
- JMU's defense has forced 26 turnovers this season, ranking sixth in the FBS.
- It's also fourth in the country in interceptions (17) and 22nd in fumble recoveries (9).
- On the offensive side of the ball, JMU is tied for second nationally in fewest interceptions thrown, with four, which is tied for the Sun Belt lead and first of teams not running the option.

## FLORIDA DUKES

- Five Dukes are returning to their home state to play in JMU's second bowl game.
- Starting cornerback Jordan Taylor, a native of Miami, played his high school ball at Miami Central, which is just 37 miles from FAU Stadium.
- Fellow Miamian and quarterback JC Evans played as a prep at Miami Central, which is just 43 miles from the site of the Boca Raton Bowl.
- Cornerback Trevell Mullen is closest to FAU, as the Fort Lauderdale native played just 15 miles away at Coconut Creek.
- Blake Kendall, a reserve QB who played high school in Maryland, grew up in Wellington, just 35 miles away.
- Finally, defensive lineman Lloyd Summerall III is from Winter Haven, playing at Lakeland, which is 192 miles away from the Boca Raton Bowl.

## PLAYERS' HISTORY IN BOWLS

- The 2024 bowl-bound Dukes have 26 student-athletes with playing experience in a bowl, including 20 with JMU last season.
- Of the 20 Dukes who appeared in the Armed Forces Bowl, seven were starters: Tanner Morris (C), Josh Toner (LT), Carter Sweazie (LG), Cole Potts (RG), Trent Hendrick (LB), Chauncey Logan (CB) and Jacob Thomas (S).
- Other players who played in JMU's first bowl game included wide receivers Omarion Dollison, Tajiri Hudson, Jayden Mines and Yamir Knight, tight ends Jordan Funk, Gabriel Hollingsworth, Josh Phifer and Kyi Wright, defensive linemen Immanuel Bush and Amar Thomas, linebacker Gannon Weathersby, nickel DJ Barksdale and punter Ryan Hanson.
- Of JMU's first-year players on the roster, six have previous bowl experience.
- Three Dukes - wide receiver Cam Ross, safety Chris Shearin and kicker Noe Ruelas - appeared in the 2022 Myrtle Beach Bowl while at UConn.
- Defensive lineman Lloyd Summerall III played in three bowl games while at Florida - 2019 Orange Bowl, 2020 Cotton Bowl and 2021 Gasparilla Bowl.
- Running backs George Pettaway and Ayo Adeyi also have also seen action in bowls, as Pettaway played in the 2022 Holiday Bowl with North Carolina, and Adeyi went to the 2021 and 2022 Frisco Bowls with North Texas.

## 11 STRAIGHT WINNING SEASONS

- JMU put together its 11th straight winning season under first-year head coach Bob Chesney in 2024.
- With this year's winning season, JMU has produced a .500 record or better now in 22 consecutive seasons.
- The Dukes are one of two Division I programs (FBS or FCS) to achieve the feat, joining Boise State out of the Mountain West.
- Since 2003, JMU has produced 20 winning seasons with a pair of 6-6 records added in.
- Success has heightened over the past 10 years, as JMU has gone 115-27 (.810), which includes eight wins in every season other than 2020-21, which JMU played just eight games (7-1).
- JMU claimed double-digit wins in four of those seasons, including 14 in both 2016 and 2017.
- Since moving up to FBS, JMU is also 27-9 (.750). Dating back to year one of the program in 1972, JMU has a winning record in 35 of 53 seasons.



## ALL-AMERICA STATUS FOR THREE

- Eric O'Neill and Terrence Spence were both named to the College Football Network FBS All-America Team.
- O'Neill took home Second Team All-America honors, while Spence was a Third Team selection.
- Additionally, O'Neill, Spence and Khairi Manns were tabbed HERO Sports Group of Five All-Americans for the 2024 season.
- O'Neill made the First Team, Spence was named to the Second Team and Manns claimed Third Team laurels.
- Entering Bowl Season, O'Neill is one of the nation's top edge rushers, as he ranks fifth nationally with 12.0 sacks and seventh with 17.5 tackles for loss.
- Spence is third in the FBS with five interceptions and fourth with a pair of blocked kicks.
- Manns also made a living in the backfield this year, as he is 22nd in the country with 8.0 sacks.

## BEST RECORD IN A TRANSITION

- JMU completed its reclassification from FCS to FBS with the best record in history.
- Over two seasons, JMU put together a 19-5 overall record while playing full FBS schedules in both years.
- That also included finishing atop the Sun Belt Conference East Division in each of those seasons, going a combined 13-3 in conference bouts.
- In 2023, JMU went 11-1 during the regular season and 7-1 in Sun Belt play, finishing with an 11-2 mark after facing Air Force in the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl.
- It was JMU's first Bowl Season berth, and despite going through reclassification and due to a lack of bowl-eligible teams, both JMU and Jacksonville State, both in year two of FCS to FBS, earned bids.
- Prior to last season, no team had ever won more than its first five games during a transition up to the FBS level, though JMU was one of those teams in 2022.
- The Dukes won 10 games over FBS opponents in 2023, which is a record for any year-two transitioning team.
- Georgia Southern previously beat eight FBS foes during the 2014 season.
- In 2022, JMU started 5-0 and became the inaugural first-year transition team to earn an AP Top 25 ranking.
- Last season, the Dukes were ranked in the AP Top 25 for seven straight polls entering the postseason and in the US LBM Coaches Poll for six of seven.

## BALL HAWKS

- JMU not only leads the country in turnover margin while ranking fourth in interceptions and sixth in total takeaways but also has 10 different players with an interception.
- Cornerback Terrence Spence paces the Dukes with five interceptions, while safety Jacob Thomas has three picks.
- DJ Barksdale, who plays nickel, has accrued two interceptions, while safety Chris Shearin and corners Justin Eaglin and Chauncey Logan have taken the ball away once through the air.
- JMU has been boosted in interceptions by four defensive linemen registering one, the only team with these many picks by a DL group.
- Eric O'Neill and Lloyd Summerall III have pick-sixes, and Christ Fitzgerald and Immanuel Bush have found interceptions in the interior.

## POTTS, JMU'S ALL-TIME STARTS LEADER

- Cole Potts is in a league of his own for JMU football, as he stands as the program's all-time starts leader, with 55.
- He made his record-breaking 51st start at right guard on Oct. 26 against Southern Miss, surpassing JMU Hall of Fame safety Tony LeZotte, who started 50 games from 2004-07.
- Potts has started all but one game, as he appeared as a reserve in JMU's 2020-21 spring opener against Morehead State.
- Since April 17, 2021, when he made his first start against Richmond, Potts has started every JMU game since then.

## BRIDGEFORTH TOP ATTENDANCES

- JMU has seen the two top season attendances at Bridgeforth Stadium in 2023 and 2024.
- Last season, JMU set a single-season attendance record, as a total of 152,234 spectators watched JMU football at Bridgeforth Stadium.
- That's an average of 25,372 per game, which is 102% of the stadium's capacity.
- This year, JMU welcomed 150,427 fans to Bridgeforth stadium for an average of 25,071.
- JMU has had 10 sellouts over the past two seasons.

## OUR STATE - 20 IN A ROW VS. VA TEAMS

- JMU's victory at ODU marked the program's 20th straight win against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia.
- The Dukes are now 3-0 versus ODU since moving up to FBS and 5-0 as a team over Virginia teams in the FBS era, adding in the 2023 win at UVA and the 2022 home triumph over Norfolk State.
- JMU has played 160 games all-time against Commonwealth foes, holding a 99-61 record (.619).
- The Dukes have faced 15 teams from Virginia, dating back to its 1972 inaugural season.
- The Dukes have played William & Mary (27-17) more than any other state team, at 44 games, and have faced Richmond (21-18) 39 times and Liberty (12-6) on 18 occasions.
- The Tribe was the last state team to beat JMU in a 44-41 triumph on Oct. 31, 2015, in Williamsburg.
- Next season, JMU has the opportunity to win game #100 against the state when it travels to Liberty on Sept. 20, 2025.

## QUITE THE ROSTER TURNOVER

- Coaching transition. The transfer portal. JMU's roster in 2024 is unlike any that preceded it.
- The Dukes returned just 62 players and only 38 letterwinners.
- A total of six starters are back from the 2023 squad, including offensive linemen Tyshawn Wyatt (LT), Tanner Morris (C) and Cole Potts (RG), cornerback Chauncey Logan, safety Jordan Thomas and punter Ryan Hanson.
- The 2024 edition features 58 newcomers, including 31 transfers.
- The breakdown of the roster is vast, with 21 total states represented, including representation from all Pacific Coast states.
- While half the roster hail from Virginia (36), Maryland (13) and North Carolina (11), through the portal, players made their trek to JMU from states such as Michigan, Texas, Alabama, Missouri, Washington, Oregon and California.
- Additionally 45 of 120 players are freshman or redshirt freshman.





### SPECIAL TEAMS TRICKERY

- JMU has successfully converted on all four non-traditional two-point conversions this season, with each coming in different fashions.
- After blocking a punt for a touchdown at UNC, JMU kicker Noe Ruelas took the snap and found long snapper Jack Mowrey on the two-point pass.
- After its second touchdown against Ball State, Mowrey snapped directly to Taylor Thompson, who ran it left in for the conversion.
- In the Coastal win, Mowrey once again snapped to Thompson, but this time, he found Josh Phifer on a pop pass for two.
- At ODU, Mowrey snapped right, this time to Gabriel Hollingsworth, who bulldozed in for two.
- In addition to the two pointers, Ruelas also converted an onside kick in the first quarter of the UNC game.
- Against Southern Miss, JMU blocked its second kick, this time on a point-after attempt, as Darold DeNgohe's block gave way for a 94-yard defensive PAT for Chris Shearin.

### BACK-TO-BACK DUBS VS. THE ACC

- JMU has now won games against Atlantic Coast Conference teams in back-to-back seasons.
- Both wins were also the two highest-scoring games for the Dukes versus a power-conference team.
- Before winning 70-50 at North Carolina on Sept. 21, the Dukes captured a 36-35 victory at Virginia back on Sept. 9, 2023, in Charlottesville.
- JMU also had a punt block for a touchdown in both games, as Terrence Spence had the block and Jayden Mines the return at UNC, while former Dukes Aiden Fisher and D'Angelo Ponds blocked it and scored in the UVA win.
- JMU is now 4-10 all-time against the ACC, with two wins over Virginia and one each over UNC and Virginia Tech.

### JMU NATIONAL TEAM OF THE WEEK

- James Madison's win at UNC on Sept. 21 earned it a national team distinction, as it was named the Cheez-It National Team of the Week.
- The award was selected by the All-America Committee of the FWAA.
- This is the first time JMU has earned the accolade from the FWAA, which originated in 2002.
- It's the first award for a Sun Belt Conference team since Sept. 10, 2022, when App State, Georgia Southern and Marshall all earned wins at power-conference opponents.

### ZO CLAIMS NATIONAL POTW

- Alonza Barnett's performance in JMU's win at North Carolina earned him numerous individual accolades, including a trio of national awards.
- He was first named Associated Press National Player of the Week and followed that up with the Walter Camp National FBS Offensive Player of the Week and the Davey O'Brien National Co-Quarterback of the Week honor.
- In addition to winning Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Week, Barnett was also honored as one of eight Manning Award Stars of the Week and the Davey O'Brien Award Great 8.
- By virtue of his honor from Davey O'Brien, Barnett has been added to the midseason watch list for the 2024 Davey O'Brien Award, honoring the nation's best quarterback.

### JMU THE FIRST HC TO START 4-0

- JMU Head Coach Bob Chesney is the program's first head coach to win his first four games at the helm and cap off a perfect opening month.
- Of JMU's nine coaches, Chesney was just the fourth head man to start 2-0, joining Mike Houston (2016), Alex Wood (1995) and Joe Purzycki (1985).
- With the UNC win, he became the first 3-0 first-year head coach for the Dukes.
- Four others lost their first game to power-conference opponents.

### JMU, THE EVERYTHING SCHOOL

- The 2023-24 athletics year saw JMU continue to raise the bar of success and achievement in intercollegiate athletics.
- JMU captured Sun Belt Conference titles in swimming and diving and in men's basketball, the first conference title in men's basketball for JMU in 11 years, leading to JMU's first trip to the Second Round of the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship in 41 years.
- Altogether, James Madison saw 10 teams represented in NCAA Championships, including five squads earning at-large bids (men's soccer, women's soccer, volleyball, baseball and lacrosse).
- Cross country participated in NCAA Regional Championships while swimming & diving and women's golf were each represented by individual competitors.
- The 10th team was football, which received the first bowl invitation in program history with an appearance in the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl during JMU's second year of FBS Reclassification.
- JMU finished second among the 14 Sun Belt schools in the Bubas Cup, the league's all-sports trophy, for the second straight year and registered a .609 winning percentage among all sports. That mark included a .652 rating among men's sports, the best for the department since 1994-95.
- James Madison finished 77th in the final LEARFIELD Director's Cup standings, which measures team qualification and advancement in NCAA Championships. JMU was first among Sun Belt schools (Arkansas State 89, Texas State 103) after scoring points in men's soccer, women's soccer, volleyball, football, men's basketball, lacrosse and baseball.
- JMU had 14 All-Americans, five conference players of the year, two coaches of the year and 36 Academic All-District selections.
- JMU also collected a 989 single-year APR score and earned the Sun Belt's top institutional academic honors for the second straight season.
- Altogether, six JMU squads were nationally ranked, including the first-ever AP ranking for men's basketball and second for football in as many years, both as high as No. 18.
- Men's soccer and lacrosse both also received rankings while volleyball and baseball received votes in national polls.
- During the football season, JMU hosted ESPN's College GameDay for the third time (2015, 2017, 2023) to become the first school outside the Power 5 to host on its campus a third time.
- The Dukes also captured the "Royal Rivalry Challenge" against Old Dominion for the second time in as many years with a 14-5-7.5 victory head-to-head among all sports.
- In his final year before retirement, Jeff Bourne was named an AD of the Year by NACDA and a finalist for AD of the Year by Sports Business Journal.

### JMU Dominates Second Half in Season-Opening Win at Charlotte

**CHARLOTTE, N.C.** – James Madison football picked up its first win of the Bob Chesney era with a second-half shutout and scored 27 unanswered points to upend Charlotte 30-7 in the season opener on Saturday night at Jerry Richardson Stadium.

Alonza Barnett III threw for two touchdowns in his second career start, guiding JMU back from a 7-3 deficit with four touchdown drives to bridge the halves. He finished the games 10-of-18 for 219 passing yards and two scores with an interception while also rushing for 89 yards.

Cam Ross was a factor both in the run and pass game, accruing 94 total yards, as he caught two passes for 53 receiving yards while also rushing for 41 yards, a career high. Omarion Dollison made two catches for 80 yards and a touchdown, while George Pettaway tallied 58 total yards with 25 rushing and a 33-yard touchdown catch. Ayo Adeyi also found the endzone for his first JMU touchdown, as he added 41 rushing yards.

Defensively, three Dukes had six tackles, led by Jacob Thomas who had 1.5 tackles for loss. Khairi Manns also had a half TFL, while Kye Holmes turned in his career-high tackles total. Jacob Dobbs and Trent Hendrick each had 1.5 TFL and a sack, while Chauncey Logan made three pass breakups, with one leading to an interception by Chris Fitzgerald.

JMU out-gained Charlotte by a 417-324 margin, which included 198-131 on the ground.

Charlotte was paced by Max Brown, who threw for 193 yards and a touchdown, while Terron Kellman led the 49ers with 76 rushing yards.

### HOW IT HAPPENED

- JMU took advantage of a three-yard shanked punt by Charlotte, setting up a short field, and Noe Ruelas drilled a 43-yard field goal to put JMU up 3-0 after one
- After a strip sack, Charlotte got on the board with a 26-yard touchdown, as Max Brown connected over the middle with Isaiah Myers to give the hosts a 7-3 lead with just over eight minutes before halftime.
- JMU regained the lead and took a 9-7 halftime lead after a wild two-play sequence late in the second. Logan batted a pass that was picked off by Fitzgerald for his first career interception. On the ensuing play, Barnett III connected down the far sideline for a 33-yard touchdown pass to Pettaway
- The Dukes extended the lead to 16-7 on the second play of the third quarter, as Barnett III found Dollison deep for a 73-yard touchdown pass.
- JMU opened the fourth capping off a 7-play drive, as Adeyi scampered into the endzone from eight yards out to make it 23-7.
- Charlotte threatened at the other end, but a fourth-down stop stymied the 49er offense, giving JMU the ball back with nine minutes to play.
- The Dukes forced another turnover over on downs later in the frame and turned the stop into points with a one-yard touchdown from Pettaway.

### GAME NOTES

- JMU improved to 3-0 all-time against Charlotte and remained unbeaten against American Athletic Conference teams, moving to 3-0 as well.
- On third downs, the Dukes went 3-for-11 (.273) while the 49ers converted on 7-of-19 (.368) opportunities.
- Charlotte recorded more tackles for loss (10-6) with JMU held the advantage in sacks (2-1).
- The 73-yard touchdown from Barnett III to Dollison was the longest play of both players' careers.

### Dukes Hold Off Runnin' Bulldogs in Home Opener

**HARRISONBURG, Va.** – James Madison football used big stops on the defensive side of the ball and held Gardner-Webb to three points in each half for a 13-6 victory in the home opener on Saturday night at Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Dukes moved to 2-0 on the year, while the Runnin' Bulldogs fell to 0-2 after suffering its second straight single-digit defeat.

JMU forced Gardner-Webb into two turnovers, both on interceptions, while also stopping the visitors twice on fourth down, including for the final time in the red zone with 2:32 remaining. An Alonza Barnett III first-down rush on the ensuing drive sealed the win.

Jacob Dobbs led the Dukes with a game-high 13 tackles, while Chris Shearin had nine, including four solo stops. Raymond Scott, Kye Holmes and Khairi Manns each tallies six tackles each. Chris Fitzgerald led the team with a pair of TFLs and a sack.

The running back tandem of George Pettaway and Tyler Purdy paced the offense, as the duo combined for 142 rushing yards and the game's only touchdown. Pettaway had a career night, turning in his first career games with over 100 total yards (116).

He rushed for a career-high 84 yards on 10 carries (8.4 avg.) while making a career-high four receptions for 32 yards. Purdy found the end zone for the first time at JMU, as he had a big second half to finish with 58 yards on 10 attempts (5.8 avg.).

Additionally, Barnett was 14-of-22 for 135 passing yards, finding six different pass catchers. Aside from Pettaway, Taylor Thompson and Cam Ross also made three catches each, combining for 49 receiving yards.

For Gardner-Webb, Tyler Riddell finished 17-of-30 for 160 passing yards and two interceptions, while Edward Saydee rushed for a game-high 87 yards. Camden Overton had five grabs for 65 receiving yards, while Trevor Moffitt paced the defense with 12 tackles, 2.5 TFL and a sack.

### HOW IT HAPPENED

- Teams traded turnover on downs in the opening stanza, leading to a scoreless tie after the opening quarter.
- Gardner-Webb struck first with 8:51 to play in the half on a 44-yard field goal by Jay Billingsley.
- JMU couldn't muster a scoring drive, gaining just 124 yards on 30 offensive plays in the first half, giving the visitors a 3-0 lead into the locker room.
- The Dukes finally got on the scoreboard on its first drive of the second half, as the ground game accounted for 51 of 58 yards, capped off by a Purdy one-yard touchdown scamper.
- Chauncey Logan recorded his third career interception on the ensuing drive, setting up a Noe Ruelas 48-yard field goal, extending the lead to 10-3 midway through the third.
- GWU threatened late in the third, getting to the JMU eight, but a defensive stand held the visitors to a 30-yard Billingsley field goal, making it 10-6 heading to the fourth.
- JMU's 12-play drive to bridge the third and fourth quarters was stopped in the red zone, as Ruelas converted his second field goal of the night from 26 yards out to extend the lead to 13-6.
- Gardner-Webb had one last chance to tie it in the closing minutes, but a Fitzgerald and Amar Thomas shared sack set up a fourth-and-long, and the pass was incomplete to allow JMU to run out the clock.

### GAME NOTES

- JMU out-gained GWU by a 285-269 margin, including 150-109 on the ground.
- JMU was 3-of-12 on third down, while GWU managed just 2-of-15.
- Fourth downs favored the visitors, as it finished 4-of-6, while JMU failed on both attempts.
- JMU scored on both trips to the red zone, while the Runnin' Bulldogs were 1-for-2.
- Gardner-Webb had six tackles for loss and three sacks, as opposed to JMU's four and two.
- Despite the win, JMU was out-possessed by Gardner-Webb, 33:58 to 26:02.
- The first-quarter interception by Jacob Thomas was the first of his career.
- JMU was shut out in the first half for the first time since Dec. 17, 2021, when it trailed 13-0 to North Dakota State in the 2023 FCS semifinals.

### Barnett Sets TD Record, JMU Drops 70 to Beat Carolina in Chapel Hill

**CHAPEL HILL, N.C.** – James Madison quarterback Alonza Barnett III set a single-game school record with seven touchdowns to lead the Dukes to a record-setting 70-50 non-conference football victory at North Carolina on Saturday afternoon at Kenan Stadium.

The Dukes improved the 3-0 on the season after notching their second straight win against an Atlantic Coast Conference team, while the Tar Heels fell to 3-1. JMU now owns four wins against the ACC and picked up its first victory at UNC in four tries.

Barnett III had a career afternoon, becoming the first player in history to record more than six total touchdowns in a single game, passing for a career-high five while rushing for two more. He finished the game 22-of-34 for 388 yards with no interceptions, while rushing for a career-best 99 yards on 13 carries (7.6 avg.).

His 487 total yards ranked third in JMU single-game history, while his 388 passing total was tied for seventh.

The Dukes set multiple team records, recording their most points in a game against a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent and as a member of the Sun Belt Conference. It nearly doubled the previous record of points scored against an autonomy five team, besting the 36 they scored at Virginia last season.

JMU lit up the scoreboard early, scoring a school-record 53 points in the first half, as the 70 it scored matched the most UNC had ever given up in a game. The 20-point win was also the largest margin of victory for JMU against the ACC.

In a game featuring over 1,200 combined total yards, the 120 points was the most points scored by both teams in a single game in JMU history, besting the 108 JMU and Richmond scored at Bridgeforth Stadium in 2015.

Two JMU players went over 100 receiving yards for the first time in 2024, as Cam Ross caught seven passes for 107 yards and a touchdown, while Omarion Dollison had three grabs for a career-high 125 yards and a score. Eight Dukes made at least one reception, as Yamir Knight recorded career bests of five catches and 81 receiving yards. Three others scored their first JMU touchdowns in Taylor Thompson, Logan Kyle and Dylan Williams.

On the ground, JMU averaged 5.7 per carry, accumulating 223 rushing yards as a team. Barnett aside, George Pettaway ran 16 times for a career-high 87 yards against his former team.

UNC's high-octane offense was paced by Jacyby Criswell, who was 28-of-48 for 475 passing yards and three touchdowns with a pair of interceptions. All-American Omarion Hampton rushed for 139 yards and a game-high three touchdowns.

Defensively, JMU was led by Terrence Spence, who had a pair of interceptions and a blocked punt, which resulted in a Jayden Mines touchdown. Trent Hendrick and DJ Barksdale each had seven tackles, as both tallied career highs of 2.0 tackles for loss each. Hendrick added a sack and forced fumble while recovering an onside kick. Eric O'Neill had season bests of 2.0 TFL and a sack.

### GAME NOTES

- Carolina just out-gained JMU by five total yards, at 616-611.
- Teams combined for 55 first downs, with UNC at 30 and JMU at 25.
- The Dukes out-rushed the Tar Heels, 223-141, while the hosts had a 475-388 edge through the air. However, JMU had 14 less passes and completed 6.3 percent more attempts.
- JMU averaged 8.4 yards per play, as opposed to 7.8 for Carolina.
- JMU forced UNC into five turnovers, with two interceptions and three fumble recoveries, while losing just one fumble.
- JMU had an 8-4 lead in tackles for loss and 3-2 edge in sacks.
- JMU has now scored on a blocked punt for a touchdown in consecutive seasons against an ACC opponent.
- The 50-yard field goal for Ruelas was the longest for JMU since Jason Pritchard's 51 yarder at Richmond on Oct. 11, 2008.
- The opening stanza featured teams combining for 39 points and 440 yards, as JMU took a 25-14 lead after the opening 15.
- JMU outscored UNC, 28-7, in the second quarter, making it 53-21 at the break. It was JMU's highest scoring half in school history, and the 28 points in the second matched the highest-scoring stanza in a road game ever.

### JMU Sets Two-Game Scoring Record in 63-7 Victory over Ball State

**HARRISONBURG, Va.** – James Madison dominated every phase, and Alonza Barnett III had another stellar performance, accounting for six total touchdowns, to lead the Dukes to a convincing 63-7 Family Weekend victory against Ball State on Saturday afternoon in front of a sold-out Bridgeforth Stadium.

The Dukes moved to 4-0 on the year, while the Cardinals fell to 1-3. It was JMU's first win over a Mid-American Conference team in its third attempt and the fifth straight season the program has started with at least a 4-0 record.

The second consecutive scoring outburst set JMU's two-game scoring record off 133 points, as the win follows JMU's 70-50 victory at North Carolina on Sept. 21. The 133 points over the past eight quarters surpassed the previous record of 131 points which JMU scored on Oct. 29, 2016 (84-7 vs. Rhode Island) and on Nov. 5, 2016 (47-43 at Richmond).

Barnett III tallied 324 yards and six touchdowns, as he was 20-of-28 for 280 yards and five touchdowns while rushing for 44 yards and a score. In his past two outings, he's combined for 13 total touchdowns (10 passing, 3 rushing) and 811 yards of offense, which includes 668 passing yards.

Four different Dukes caught touchdown passes, including Yamir Knight, who made four receptions for 44 yards and a career-high two touchdowns. Taylor Thompson made a career-best five catches for 91 yards and a score. Omarion Dollison caught four balls for 48 yards and a touchdown, while Cam Ross added a touchdown, making three grabs for 46 receiving yards.

The Dukes were strong in the ground game, accounting for 220 yards of rushing, averaging 6.5 per carry. Two players had at least 50 rushing yards, led by Wayne Knight, who had a career-high six rushes for 63 yards, with a long of 37. Jobi Malary tacked on 50 yards on just five carries, scoring his first JMU touchdown to complete the scoring output. George Pettaway added a touchdown after contributing 35 yards.

The Dukes scored eight times on offense and didn't punt one time, which was the first time since Dec. 7, 2019, the punt team didn't have a single snap. JMU out-gained Ball State by a wide margin, at 506-250, including 220-77 on the ground.

Defensively, JMU forced three interceptions, including one pick-six, and also stopped Ball State three times on fourth down. Terrence Spence made five tackles and had an interception to set a single-season career high with three after his two a week ago. Eric O'Neill made a season-best 2.0 sacks and returned an interception 27 yards to the house for his first career touchdown. Khairi Manns also registered a pair of sacks for a new career high, while DJ Barksdale produced his first career interception.

For the Cardinals, they were paced by Kadin Semonza, who was 22-of-35 for 168 yards and a touchdown with three interceptions. Braedon Sloan rushed for a game-best 72 yards.

### HOW IT HAPPENED

- JMU opened the game with scoring drives on its two opening drives, as Barnett III drove the length of the field, connecting with Yamir Knight on his first career touchdown on a 12-yard pass.
- After a Spence interception, JMU needed just 35 yards to score again, as Pettaway hit paydirt from 24 yards out for the score. Thompson rushed it in for two more points, making it 15-0 just over eight minutes in.
- Ball State answered with multiple chunk plays, and Semonza threw a dart to Tanner Koziol for the 15-yard touchdown, trimming JMU's lead to 15-7.
- JMU came back with another touchdown drive, converting a 30-yard pass on fourth down to Logan Kyle before Dollison caught a five-yard toss in the back corner of the endzone to make it 22-7 after one.
- Possessions were at a premium in the second, as Ball State ran nearly eight minutes off the clock to bridge the quarters, but sacks by O'Neill and Manns thwarted the drive.
- JMU made the most with its only full possession of the quarter, as Barnett III accounted for 46 of 59 yards, capped off by a 10-yard pass to Yamir Knight for the score, making it 29-7.
- Ball State threatened but a tipped pass interception by Barksdale, which was his first career pick, kept it a 22-point game at the break.
- The interception train continued into the opening minute of the second half, as O'Neill jumped a pass at the line of scrimmage and returned it for his first career pick-six, making it 35-7.
- JMU extended the lead to 49-7 with consecutive touchdown drives that ended with a Ross 26-yard touchdown catch and a Barnett III 18-yard rush.
- In the fourth Barnett III finished his day with a dime to Thompson from 22 yards out for the score, making it a 56-7 lead.
- Late in the game, JMU put together one more drive to the goal line, as Malary found a seam for a 32-yard touchdown scamper.

### GAME NOTES

- The Dukes averaged 8.3 yards per play, while Ball State was limited to 3.5 per snap.
- JMU turned in arguably its best third-down performance in recent memory, going 9-of-10 to extend drives. Ball State did a decent job on third down as well, finishing 7-of-16.
- On fourth down, JMU went 1-of-1, while Ball State was 2-of-5.
- JMU had five sacks, as opposed to the Cardinals' three. JMU also held an 8-3 lead on tackles for loss.
- After Ball State's touchdown drive, its final eight possessions consisted of two interceptions (one pick-six), three turnovers on downs and a pair of three-and-outs.
- The 63 points were the second-most points JMU has ever scored against an FBS opponent, trailing the 70 it scored just last week at UNC.
- Over the past two games, JMU has combined for 47 first-quarter points, as it had 25 at North Carolina on Sept. 21.
- JMU was out-possessed by a 33:41 to 26:19 in the game. Despite only having 2:09 of possession time in the third quarter, JMU outscored Ball State 20-0 in that stanza.

### JMU Drops Sun Belt Opener at ULM

**MONROE, La.** – James Madison and ULM put on a defensive slugfest, and the Warhawks overcame an early 10-point deficit for a 21-19 victory against the Dukes on Saturday night at Malone Stadium.

The Warhawks moved to 4-1 on the year and 2-0 in Sun Belt play, while the Dukes suffered their first setback of 2024, dropping to 4-1 overall and 0-1 in league games.

JMU took an early 10-0 lead after one quarter, but a pair of touchdowns, one by the ULM defense, gave the hosts a 14-13 lead at halftime. JMU moved the ball but was unable to finish off drives, while ULM extended its lead to 21-13 early in the fourth.

The Dukes eventually answered with a 15-play, 75-yard drive, however, the two-point conversion failed as they trailed 21-19 with 4:04 remaining. JMU regained possession with 0:32 on the clock but turned the ball over on downs to fall 21-19.

Aiden Armenta finished 17-of-30 for 147 passing yards and a touchdown with an interception to lead the ULM offense.

Ahmad Hardy rushed for a game-high 82 yards and a touchdown, while Jake Godfrey made seven catches for 60 yards and a score. ULM's defense combined for three sacks and was led in tackles by Wydett Williams Jr. with nine.

For JMU, Alonza Barnett III was 20-of-47 for 251 yards while rushing for 49 yards and a score. George Pettaway gained 62 yards on the ground, while Tyler Purdy recorded a rushing touchdown and chipped in with 16 yards. Taylor Thompson tied his career high of five catches for 59 yards. Yamir Knight led all receivers with 67 yards on four receptions.

Defensively, Khairi Manns made a pair of tackles for loss with a sack and pass breakup, as JMU has seven tackles for loss as a team. Jacob Thomas came away with an interception, 1.5 TFL and seven stops.

### HOW IT HAPPENED

- JMU opened the scoring on the opening drive, as Barnett III connected on a 29-yard pass to Knight before evading a sack and running it in from 27 yards out to make it 7-0 just over two minutes in.
- After a Thomas interception, JMU settled for three by way of a Noe Ruelas 48-yard field goal, giving JMU a 10-0 advantage through one.
- After converting on fourth down, Hardy hit a seam up the middle and scored untouched from 38 yards out, as ULM trimmed the JMU lead to 10-7 with 5:52 remaining in the first half.
- Late in the second, JMU had favorable field position off a muffed punt by ULM, but two plays in, Barnett III fumbled and Daniel Knudsen picked up the loose ball and returned it 82 yards for a scoop-and-score, giving the hosts a 14-10 lead.
- JMU drove into field-goal range in the final seconds of the half, and Ruelas converted from 39 yards out to get within a point, at 14-13, at the break.
- Neither team was able to muster points and combined for 127 total yards in the third, as JMU was stopped in ULM territory late in the stanza to keep it a 14-13 score heading to the fourth.
- ULM opened the fourth with the half's first score, converting a fourth down and a third and long, capping off the 11-play drive with a 12-yard touchdown pass from Armenta to Jake Godfrey. ULM led JMU 21-13 with 10:30 to play.
- The Dukes responded with a 1-yard rush from Purdy to cap off a 15-play, 75-yard scoring drive with 4:04 remaining. The two-point conversion failed with an incomplete pass as JMU trailed 21-19.
- James Madison forced a ULM punt and took over at their own 14 with 0:32 left to play. Facing a fourth down, an incomplete pass from Barnett resulted in a turnover on downs to hand the ball back to the Warhawks.

### GAME NOTES

- The loss snapped a nine-game win streak in conference openers for JMU (2015-23).
- The Dukes outgained the Warhawks 399-257.
- ULM held an advantage in time of possession by a margin of 31:04 to 28:56.
- JMU went 7-for-16 (.438) on third downs and converted on 1-of-5 (.200) tries on fourth.
- The Dukes came away with one interception and one fumble recovery, scoring three points off ULM turnovers.
- Thomas' first-quarter interception was the second of his career while Chase Regan notched his first career fumble recovery on a muffed punt.
- With his 48-yard field goal in the first quarter and a 39-yarder to close the first half, Ruelas has now made 22 field goals in his career.

### JMU Controls Coastal Carolina 39-7

**HARRISONBURG, Va.** – James Madison's white out turned out to be a wipeout.

Quarterback Alonza Barnett III threw for three touchdowns and the Dukes' defense took over the national lead in turnovers, blowing out visiting Coastal Carolina, 39-7, on Thursday night at Bridgeforth Stadium.

"It's great when you're playing on national TV and you play at the level we played at today," said linebacker Jacob Dobbs. "

In front of the ninth largest crowd in stadium history -- 25,622, many clad in white for the Dukes' annual Brighten the Lights of Madison game – JMU outgained the Chanticleers 421-181 to pick up its first Sun Belt victory of the season.

Running back George Pettaway rushed for 89 yards on 13 carries and caught a 9-yard touchdown pass, as the Dukes racked up 222 yards on the ground.

JMU (5-1 overall, 1-1 SBC) shook off last weekend's loss at ULM in impressive and dominant fashion, jumping out to a 29-7 halftime lead on its way to a fourth straight blowout of Coastal Carolina.

"Obviously that was disappointing last week for all of us," Barnett said of the previous game. "But just the continued confidence we have in each other will take us a long way."

In their three FBS meetings with the Chanticleers, the Dukes have now outscored them 142-28. Thursday, it stifled the conference's No. 2 scoring offense, holding Coastal Carolina to its lowest point and total yard marks this season.

"You had everybody playing within the framework of the defense, doing their one eleventh," said Dobbs, who posted a team-high nine tackles. "And the D-line, I thought, just dominated the game. They wrecked the game."

The offense was creative, unpredictable and – for much of the night – unstoppable. The defense continued its dynamic play, not only holding the Chanticleers to a 3 for 14 showing on third downs, but also taking over the nation's lead in turnovers with 17.

That included defensive tackle Lloyd Summerall III's 35-yard pick-6 in the second quarter.

"It's still surreal for me right now," Summerall said. "Just seeing the ball in the air and took it to the crib. It was a great feeling."

Five days after struggling offensively on the road at ULM, the Dukes had no trouble moving the ball against the Chanticleers, as offensive coordinator Dean Kennedy's diverse and deceptive game plan kept Coastal (4-2, 1-1) on its heels all night.

JMU got on the board first, scoring on a nifty red zone play where it motioned Pettaway out into a bunch formation, then threw him a bubble screen. Tight end Josh Phifer opened space for Pettaway to juke up field, and wide receiver Dylan Williams threw the final block, at the 2-yard line, to get Pettaway into the end zone for a 7-0 lead with 6:51 left in the first quarter.

After Coastal responded with a big play of its own, a 40-yard touchdown pass from Ethan Vasko to Jameson Tucker, JMU dialed up some more offensive creativity.

Barnett took a shotgun snap and gave the ball to Pettaway, who shuffled it to wide receiver Omarion Dollison on a reverse. Dollison flipped it back to Barnett who fired down field to an open Taylor Thompson for 33 yards.

That set up a 25-yard touchdown grab by Thompson, who made a leaping catch on a well-placed ball by Barnett to put the Dukes – who picked up the 2-point conversion – ahead 15-7.

Summerall's interception return, the first of his career, put JMU ahead 22-7 and signaled that the rout was on.

JMU improved to 20-3 following its first regular-season loss since 2000 and coach Bob Chesney won his 10th straight game following a defeat, a streak that dates back to his years at Holy Cross.

### Dukes Drop First-Place Battle at Georgia Southern

**STATESBORO, Ga.** – Georgia Southern jumped out to an early 21-0 lead, and James Madison's offense struggled to find a rhythm on offense, as it fell 28-14 on Saturday evening at Allen E. Paulson Stadium.

The Eagles remain in first place in the Sun Belt Conference East Division, improving to 5-2 on the year and 3-0 in league play, while the Dukes fell to 5-2 on the year and 1-2 in SBC games. GS also moved to 6-0 all-time against JMU in games played at Paulson Stadium.

Georgia Southern dominated the yards category, out-gaining JMU by a 405-253 margin, including 190-67 on the ground. JC French finished 24-of-33 for 215 passing yards and three touchdowns with three interceptions. Jalen White rushed for 134 yards, averaging 5.8 per carry, while David Mbadinga added 38 yards and a score.

Jacob Dobbs led the way for JMU on defense, recording a season-high 17 tackles, including eight solo, and a fumble recovery. Jacob Thomas grabbed his third interception of the season and finished with eight stops and a career-high 2.0 tackles for loss, while Darold DeNgohe chipped in with a career-best 2.0 TFL. The defense also produced interceptions by Immanuel Bush and DJ Barksdale, with the latter resulting in JMU's fourth pick-six of the season.

Offensively, Alonza Barnett III was 22-of-41 for 186 passing yards while George Pettaway ran for 63 rushing yards. Cam Ross (five catches) and Yamir Knight (four catches) combined for nine receptions for 78 yards. Omarion Dollison hauled in three receptions for a team-best 51 yards.

### HOW IT HAPPENED

- JMU forced a pair of first-quarter turnovers with a tipped-pass interception by Bush, and a fumble recovery by Dobbs, but the Dukes weren't able to produce points off either takeaway.
- Georgia Southern converted a third-and-long and a play later, Mbadinga had a wide-open seam down the near sideline, going 29 yards for the score to make it 7-0 Eagles after one.
- Southern doubled its lead to 14-0 with 3:48 to go before halftime on a five-yard pass from French to Derwin Burgess Jr., scoring on a GS-record, 18-play drive that stretched 96 yards and 9:14 off the clock.
- After another 3-and-out by JMU, the Eagles needed just five plays to score again, this time on a 15-yard pass from French to Tyler Fromm, giving the hosts a 21-0 halftime lead.
- JMU got on the board midway through the third quarter, to climb within 21-7, as Barksdale jumped the route at the line of scrimmage and returned it 10 yards for a pick-six.
- GS responded with a one-yard touchdown toss from French to Elijah Walton for his first career touchdown, giving the Eagles a 28-7 lead after three.
- Barnett connected with Dollison for a 35-yard touchdown to make it 28-14 with 14:32 remaining in the final frame.
- Still trailing 28-14, the Dukes took over at their own eight-yard line at the 4:43 mark and drove deep into Georgia Southern territory, but failed to register points before time expired.

### Defense, Special Teams Boost Dukes to Bowl Eligible in 32-15 Win

**HARRISONBURG, Va.** – A trick play got James Madison going in the second quarter Saturday against Southern Mississippi. And once the Dukes got going, they just kept on going.

George Pettaway and Wayne Knight combined to rush for 180 yards, JMU's defense racked up a season-high nine sacks and Cam Ross ran the opening kickoff in the second half back 94 yards for a score as the Dukes rolled past the Golden Eagles, 32-15.

"Those sparks are what you need at moments," JMU coach Bob Chesney said. "We just have to continue to do that, move that ball down the field, take some chances, take some risks, put some exciting plays together."

The win made JMU bowl eligible in its first official year reclassified as an FBS program. The Dukes (6-2 overall, 2-2 Sun Belt) had been transitioning from the FCS since 2022.

Pettaway ran for a career-high 119 yards and a score on 16 carries, for his first career 100-yard effort. Knight contributed 61 rushing yards and another 41 on receptions.

Ross, opened the fourth quarter with a 7-yard touchdown reception to go with his explosive special teams play.

The Dukes, coming off last weekend's loss at Georgia Southern again showed the ability to bounce right back. In front of a homecoming crowd of 25,399, JMU's defense led the way, hitting season highs in sacks and tackles for losses and adding two more turnovers to their nation-leading total.

"From the beginning of the game, the coaches just told us, 'We have to win upfront. We have to win the battle on the line of scrimmage,'" said defensive lineman Darold DeNgohe, one of eight Dukes involved in a sack on the day. "We were just trying to dominate, get some penetration."

JMU got itself, and its capacity homecoming crowd, going late in the second quarter. A trick play that saw Barnett sling the ball out to Taj Hudson, who threw downfield to Wayne Knight, kicked the Dukes into another gear.

The play was one the team practiced all week, but it didn't unfold exactly as the Dukes planned. Southern Miss actually bumped Knight off his route and Hudson had to throw a different pass than the one he had prepared for.

Hudson's background as a high school quarterback in Georgia certainly helped in that moment.

Two plays later, Pettaway scored JMU's first touchdown of the game, a 4-yard carry that put JMU ahead 10-3 with 5:45 left in the half.

From there, the Dukes took over. Terrence Spence's fifth interception of the season set up Alonza Barnett's 10-yard scoring strike to tight end Taylor Thompson less than a minute later, positioning JMU to keep Southern Miss (1-7, 0-4) at arm's length for the rest of the game.

"I thought our guys did enough to win this game," Chesney said. "They've got to do a whole lot more and we're going to have to do a whole lot more as we move forward to win a whole bunch more."

Leading 17-9 at the break, JMU got another big play to open the second half.

Ross took the kickoff back 94 yards for the touchdown and a 23-9 advantage. As Ross zipped up the Southern Miss sideline, he had one defender to beat. A pair of teammates, Gabriel Hollingsworth and Khairi Manns, made sure that happened, delivering a sandwich block that got Ross to the end zone with the team's first kickoff return score since 2021 against Towson.

Even when the Golden Eagles scored in the second half, JMU turned it into points for itself. After a Southern Miss touchdown in the third quarter, Dukes defensive tackle Darold DeNgohe blocked the extra point kick. Chris Shearin scooped it up and returned it 92 yards for two points for the home team.

The Golden Eagles, playing their first game under interim coach Reed Stringer, committed eight penalties for 93 yards.

The Dukes now have their second open date, then host Georgia State on Nov. 9. The kickoff time for that game will be announced Monday.

The victory kept JMU – which played in a game back of first place in the Sun Belt East. And, a year after playing in the Armed Forces Bowl when not enough FBS teams earned eligibility – the Dukes now are bowl worthy without any asterisk.

"I'm happy that we got the bowl game. It was a great time last year," said senior offensive lineman Cole Potts. "But we've got higher expectations than that and higher goals."

### GAME NOTES

- JMU out-gained Southern Miss by a 357-319 margin, including 199-141 in the run game.
- Cole Potts made his 51st career start Saturday, setting the JMU program record for starts. He surpassed Tony LeZotte, who started in 50 games for the Dukes.
- Terrence Spence's second-quarter interception was his fifth of the season in just his eighth game with the program. He now has nine for his career, as he produced four in 35 career games at Holy Cross (2020-23).
- JMU finished the game with season bests of 11 tackles for loss and nine sacks, resulting in a loss of 40 yards for the Golden Eagles.
- Eight different Dukes recorded at least a half sack, led by Jacob Dobbs, who had a season-high two. Eric O'Neill and Mychal McMullin each had 1.5 sacks, with it being a career high for McMullin.
- JMU broke up six passes, which marked the third time in four home games JMU has had at least six PBU.
- Cam Ross's 94-yard kickoff return was a career-long return for Ross and JMU's first kickoff for a touchdown since Nov. 20, 2021.
- JMU blocked an extra point for the first time since Oct. 9, 2021, and subsequently Chris Shearin returned it 93 yards for a defensive PAT, marking the first such play since Vidal Nelson on Nov. 29, 2009.
- The win secures JMU playing in its second bowl game in 2024 and its first as a fully reclassified program.

### JMU Cruises Past Georgia State 38-7

**HARRISONBURG, Va.** – On its first offensive drive, James Madison used a balanced drive to march for the opening touchdown. The second time they had the ball, the Dukes went explosive, scoring a quick-strike 7 on a 52-yard pass play.

There wasn't much the JMU offense couldn't do Saturday against Georgia State.

"That's one thing we've been emphasizing for the past couple of weeks – getting off to a fast start," quarterback Alonza Barnett III said. "Once this offense is clicking, it's dangerous."

Coming off an open date, Barnett III played one of his sharpest games of the season and the Dukes scored touchdowns on their first three drives as the home team rolled to 38-7 Sun Belt Conference win over the Panthers.

Barnett threw for 241 and three scores and running back George Pettaway ran for 95 and a touchdown. It was his fifth game with over 80 rushing yards this season.

Barnett went 20 for 30 passing, didn't throw an interception and effectively adjusted offensive line protections. That was especially important after starting center Tanner Morris left the game with an injury in the second quarter.

Barnett's teammates and coaches said he had especially strong practices the past two weeks, and that was on display Saturday.

"It was fun to watch. The confidence was there," Chesney said. "We'll go how he goes. And his confidence and his ability to lead showed up. He stood in that pocket and delivered in crucial moments, the o-line protected and then guys made plays downfield."

Running back Wayne Knight scored the first two touchdowns of his career, one rushing and one receiving, and six players caught at least three passes for the Dukes, and three had scoring receptions.

"When I put the ball in my playmakers' hands, they make it easy for me and they do the rest," Barnett said.

After struggling on third down, going 2 for 12 against Southern Mississippi its last time out, JMU converted its first seven third downs, helping it score at least 30 points for the sixth time this season. It has won all six of those outings.

Defensively, playing without injured Jacob Dobbs, the unit's leader, JMU stifled Georgia State from the onset. Defensive lineman Eric O'Neill had a pair of sacks and the Dukes dropped Panthers quarterback Zach Gibson four times.

"We were able to play fast and play how we wanted to play because we knew what they were doing," O'Neill said. "We were playing free and it helped a lot."

The Dukes (7-2 overall, 3-2 SBC) also got a pair of big plays on special teams. Terrence Spence blocked a Panthers' field goal try to end the first half, and Tyler Brown recovered a muffed punt in the third quarter, the game's only turnover.

The 10th straight sellout crowd at Bridgeforth Stadium – 25,709 showed up Saturday, the ninth largest attendance total in stadium history – saw JMU waste no time taking control of the game.

After forcing a punt on Georgia State's first possession, the Dukes moved the ball 68 yards on nine plays, getting the scoring started with Pettaway's 1-yard touchdown run.

Following a second Panthers' punt, Barnett fired a 25-yard pass downfield to Omarion Dollison, and Dollison took it another 27 to the end zone for a 14-0 lead 11:41 into the contest.

After Georgia State (2-7, 0-5) put up its first points, JMU responded with two more touchdowns before halftime and went to the locker room ahead 28-7.

The Panthers had the chance to trim that margin, but Spence came flying off the edge to record the eighth career kick block for Spence. It was his second of the season. "They could have stolen three there and a little momentum," Chesney said. "It was a big deal for him to knock that down."

Knight's 18-yard touchdown reception and a 38-yard field goal from Noe Ruelas extended JMU's lead to 38-7 through three quarters.

That was how it ended.

JMU has now won back-to-back games, keeping itself in contention for the Sun Belt East Division title and gaining momentum for a pivotal stretch run. The Dukes visit rival Old Dominion next weekend, then play at App State before finishing at home Nov. 30 against Marshall.

### JMU Wins Road Thriller at Rival ODU

**NORFOLK, Va.** — James Madison used a big second half from its defense, rushed for a season-high 233 yards and Alonza Barnett III produced three total touchdowns en route to a thrilling 35-32 victory at Old Dominion in Sun Belt Conference football action Saturday evening at S.B. Ballard Stadium.

The Dukes won their third straight to improve to 8-2 on the year and remained alive in the Sun Belt East Division picture with a 4-2 conference mark. The loss dropped the Monarchs to 4-6 on the season and 3-3 in league play.

JMU also improved to 3-2 all-time against ODU, having now won all three meetings at the FBS level and in the Sun Belt.

JMU found itself in a 24-21 hole at halftime after a big second quarter by the Old Dominion offense and special teams. JMU seized the lead back late in the third quarter on a 68-yard bomb from Barnett to Yamir Knight, who finished the game with his first career 100-yard game. He hauled in career bests of eight receptions for 121 yards in the win.

His older brother Wayne Knight, also had a career day, rushing for 70 yards on 13 carries (5.4 avg.) with a touchdown. The game marked the first time both Knights found the endzone in the same game since the 2021 Delaware state championship game during Wayne's senior season at Smyrna High School.

In the fourth and clinging to a 28-24 lead, JMU used a hard count on fourth-and-inches to draw ODU offside to extend the drive. After a 13-yard completion to Yamir Knight, Pettaway gained 21 yards on the next two rushes to move JMU into the redzone. On a third-and-goal from the eight, Barnett kept it, running in untouched for the game-sealing score.

ODU drove downfield and scored while converting a two-point conversion with 58 seconds remaining to make it 35-32, but the hosts onside kick was recovered by Logan Kyle to secure the Dukes' win.

George Pettaway rushed for 36 of his team-high 82 rushing yards in the fourth quarter, leading to JMU's game-winning scoring drive in his return to the 757. Barnett finished the game with 262 total yards, as he was 18-of-27 for 192 passing yards and a touchdown while rushing for 70 more yards and two scores. That included a career-long 50-yard touchdown scamper in the first half.

On the defensive side of the ball, JMU's defense came up big in the fourth quarter, as it had limited ODU to just 67 second-half yards before the final touchdown drive. In the fourth alone prior to the 75-yard drive, ODU had -9 total yards on six plays, allowing JMU to gain the 11-point advantage.

Khairi Manns was a force in the backfield, registering a career-high 2.5 sacks. JMU had five sacks as a team on its six tackles for loss, as Eric O'Neill finished with a season-high nine stops with 1.5 sacks. Immanuel Bush also had a sack and a career-high tying six total tackles. Jacob Thomas made nine stops with a pair of big pass breakups, while Chris Shearin tallied six tackles, one TFL and his first interception of the season.

ODU was led by Colton Joseph, who threw for 189 yards with an interception while rushing for 35 yards and career-high tying three rushing touchdowns. Aaron Young also rushed for a career-high 116 yards with a score.

JMU remains out on the road next Saturday, Nov. 23 when it travels to Boone, N.C., to face App State. Kickoff from Kidd Brewer Stadium is set for 2:30 p.m. on ESPN+.

### App Uses Big Second Quarter to Upend Dukes

BOONE, N.C. – App State used a 24-point spurt in the second quarter to overcome an early two-score deficit and held off James Madison in the second half to down the Dukes, 34-20, on Saturday afternoon at Kidd Brewer Stadium.

The Mountaineers improved to 5-5 on the year and 3-4 in Sun Belt play, while the Dukes fell to 8-3 overall and 4-3 in league matchups. It was also App's second straight win against JMU.

The Dukes held App to just 11 yards in the first and jumped out to an early 14-0 lead in the second quarter, but a 24-point App State surge, which included a 64-yard touchdown pass and a blocked punt for a score, gave the hosts the lead for good.

Makai Jackson sparked the App offense with a career-high 162 receiving yards and a touchdown on five catches. Joey Aguilar overcame a slow start and finished with 216 passing yards and a pair of scores through the air. Ahmani Marshall had a strong second half, scoring a third-quarter touchdown and finishing with 108 rushing yards.

For JMU, Alonza Barnett III was 21-of-36 for 232 passing yards and two touchdowns. The tandem of George Pettaway and Wayne Knight combined for 143 rushing yards, as Pettaway had a team-high 82 rushing yards, while Wayne Knight added 61 yards.

After halftime, Noe Ruelas, who made two field goals, connected from 52 yards to bring JMU within 24-20. But App answered with a 76-yard drive, and Marshall rumbled in to make it 31-20 heading to the fourth.

JMU turned it over in its territory, and App extended its lead to 34-20 on a Michael Hughes 41-yard field goal. With just over nine minutes to go, Barnett looked deep down the far sideline, but Jason Chambers came away with his first career interception to give the ball back to App. It was just the third interception of the season by JMU.

The Mountaineers, who are the first team this season to win the turnover battle against JMU (2-0), made a red zone stop with 2:41 remaining to hold on for the 34-20 win.

Defensively, Eric O'Neill was active in the backfield, finishing with nine tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss and a sack with a pair of hurries. Khairi Manns made seven stops, including a team-high four solo, while Taurus Jones added six tackles and 0.5 sacks.

For App, Michael Fletcher came away with a pair of sacks. Brendan Harrington and Kyle Arnholt each registered 11 tackles, while Santana Hopper finished with 2.5 tackles for loss.

JMU closes the regular season for Senior Day on Saturday, Nov. 30 against Marshall. Kickoff at Bridgforth Stadium is set for 8 p.m. on ESPNU.

### Dukes Fall in Double Overtime to Marshall on Senior Day

**HARRISONBURG, Va.** – James Madison closed the regular season with a 35-33 double-overtime setback to Marshall for Senior Day on Saturday night at Bridgeforth Stadium.

JMU (8-4, 4-4 Sun Belt) surged to a 17-0 lead at halftime, but touchdowns by Marshall (9-3, 7-1 Sun Belt) separated by seven seconds tied the game heading to the fourth. After teams traded touchdown drives in the fourth, Marshall's potential game-winning field goal was snuffed by a bad hold to force overtime.

Field goals by both teams sent the game to double overtime, where JMU reclaimed the lead, at 33-27, on an Alonza Barnett III touchdown pass to Wayne Knight. The two-point try was no good, and on Marshall's possession, a third-down conversion set up a Tyshawn Chapman 10-yard touchdown run.

With the game on the line, Braylon Braxton found Charles Montgomery for the two pointer to give Marshall the win and the Sun Belt East Division title.

The win sends Marshall to the 2024 Sun Belt Conference Football Championship, where it will face West Division champion Louisiana (10-2, 7-1 Sun Belt). The Dukes await their postseason fate for Bowl Season, with that game being announced no later than Sunday, Dec. 8 by the bowl committee.

JMU out-gained Marshall by a 382-261 margin, which included a 244-141 advantage in the run game. Marshall used excellent field position, coupled with a pick-six in the third quarter to tie the game, setting up the thrilling finish.

JMU was led by senior Jobi Malary, who rushed for a season-best 106 yards and a touchdown, averaging 6.6 per carry. It was the Portland State transfer's first 100-yard game with the Dukes and the fourth of his career.

Two others ran for at least 50 yards, as Knight had 61 yards while Pettaway tallied 53 with a touchdown. Knight also caught two passes for 20 receiving yards and a touchdown, which occurred in double OT.

Barnett finished 14-of-19 for 138 passing yards and two touchdowns with an interception while rushing for 24 more. Senior Omarion Dollison caught a game-high four passes for 46 yards and his team-leading sixth receiving touchdown.

The defense was paced by Eric O'Neill's season-best 2.5 sacks, as he closed the regular season with a team-leading 12 sacks on the year. Senior Khairi Manns led all players with a season-high 10 tackles, to go with 1.0 tackle for loss, while senior Taurus Jones also turned in a season-best eight total stops with a TFL. Jacob Thomas added eight tackles while Immanuel Bush registered his first solo sack of the season. JMU also had six pass breakups, led by two each from seniors Terrence Spence and Jordan Taylor.

For Marshall, Braxton was 13-of-24 for 120 yards and a touchdown but was limited to just 15 rushing yards and a score. Jordan Houston ran for 50 yards, and Toby Payne's lone catch was a 16-yard touchdown reception. Defensively, AG McGhee and Jaden Yates each had nine tackles, while the FBS sack leader, Mike Greene, added one sack to finish the regular season with 16.0.

JMU opened the game with three straight scoring drives, which included touchdown drives of 75 and 90 yards to grab a 17-0 lead midway through second quarter. The Dukes out-gained Marshall by a 269-51 margin in the first half, which included 111-29 on the ground.

After rushing for 64 yards as a team on the opening possession, which included an explosive rush by Knight punched it in from five yards out to open the scoring. After a stop, JMU went 90 yards, as Barnett found Dollison on a nine-yard pass, making it 14-0 with 4:17 remaining in the first.

The Dukes extended the lead to 17-0 at halftime, as they drove it 83 yards into the redzone before Noe Ruelas converted a 23-yard field goal, for his 13th field goal of the year.

Marshall got right back into with a dominant third quarter, tying the game at 17 apiece.

After being held to a field goal on its opening drive of the second half, the Herd used solid field position to pull within 17-10, as Braxton connected on a 16-yard touchdown pass to Payne with 2:18 remaining in the third. Seven seconds later, Jadarius Green-McKnight picked off Barnett for a 25-yard pick-six to square the ballgame at 17-17.

Malary sparked JMU's offense into the fourth quarter, as he gained 46 yards himself and capped off a 65-yard drive with a seven-yard rushing score, giving the locals a 24-17 advantage. Marshall answered, punching it in on a Braxton one-yard keeper with 5:04 left.

The Herd stopped JMU and drove in field-goal range, but a fumble by the holder on regulation's final play sent the game to overtime.
