# "COACH" KNUEPPEL RETIRES AND REFLECTS

## COACH HAS RETIRED.

He's known by some campus colleagues and in the surrounding community as Paul Knueppel. His title – vice president of student affairs – only hinted at the magnitude of responsibility and leadership his position at Wisconsin Lutheran College represented for 18 years.

But to almost everyone else on campus, especially students, players and those on the student affairs staff, his name is simply...Coach.

Throughout his teaching, coaching, counseling and administration career, Knueppel believed in strong Christian principles, with one emerging above the rest – people should care about other people.

"I always tried to hire people who cared about other people," he says. "And I've always enjoyed working with students, with athletes, and in the case of the college, with the resident assistants; teaching them, and emphasizing the importance of doing the right thing."

"The Good Lord and his Word are bigger than anyone's particular situation or

problem," Knueppel adds. That belief, and his background and experiences before arriving at Wisconsin Lutheran, help explain his reputation as an excellent organizer and manager of people and time.

Knueppel contends he received most of his organizational skills from his earlier years in teaching, first from his work with Native American high schoolers from 1964-68 in Frazer, Montana, and from 1968-72 in Valier, Montana. He built on those experiences, teaching a year in Echo, Minnesota, followed by 14 years at Winnebago Lutheran Academy in Fond du Lac.

In 1987, Knueppel took the call to Wisconsin Lutheran to serve as its first full-time athletic director.

When he arrived, there were six sports – three men's and three women's. Under his direction, WLC began participation in the Lake Michigan Conference, competing against other four-year colleges for the first time. Today, the college boasts 15 varsity sports in addition to a well-developed intramural program.

"From the beginning, I had the support of the college president, Gary Greenfield," Knueppel says. "He allowed me to focus

on developing athletics, to dream about how far the program could go, without interfering. I always appreciated that."

In addition, Knueppel chaired the building committees for three of the campus' core facilities; the Recreation Complex, the Campus Center and the East and West Residence Halls. He led the administrators who directed all residence life, admissions, financial aid, athletics, career counseling, campus ministry, enrollment and retention, and student life programs, policies and activities. He also helped lead efforts for the acquisition of the recently developed athletic fields.


He directed the creation and mentored the implementation of the College 101 curriculum which allowed faculty and staff to work in concert with one another providing each fall's freshman class with a solid, realistic introduction to college life in its fullest sense and at its highest level.

One of Knueppel's greatest gifts to the campus was infusing that positive sense of what the culture could be like at a Christian liberal arts college.

"We hear comments on a regular basis about how we have a caring atmosphere here on campus," he says. "That's because of our people – our students."

"Our students are the culture," he continued. "They are the athletic teams, the Student Senate, the res life program. Our students actively participate. They do the work, run the organizations, show Christian leadership in so many ways. Out of our 700 students, more than 360 are student workers – campus employees."

"Through these positions, and other opportunities, they are being given the chance to participate, learn and lead. That's what we've always been about here."
